



Circumstances of Original Formation & Titles Etc.

The Reserve Brigade Australian Artillery (formerly the Australian Artillery Training Depot) was formed in Egypt, after the evacuation of Anzac and landed in England in Hune 1916. It was then commanded by Major A.F.Roberts-Thomson, 1st Divisional Artillery, and occupied No.1 Camp, Parkhouse, Wiltshire. The Command of the Training Depot was taken over on the 15th November 1916 by Lieut. Colonel W. Mailer, 3rd Divisional Artillery, formerly commanding 8th Field Artillery Brigade.

On the 28th November 1916, the Depot was re-organised and designated "Reserve Brigade Australian Artillery" (C.R.S.C.157836 A.4.) Etc. with Lieut.Colonel Mailer as C.O. and Lieut. G. Waddingham, 16th Battery A.F.A. as Adjutant. As the establishment laid down for the R.B.A.A. was considerably larger than that of the Artillery Depot, further accommodation was found to be necessary, and Camps 20 & 21 Lark Hill were made available and occupied on the 6th December 1916, and later further accommodation was provided by the addition of Camp 26 Lark Hill.

The Brigade then consisted of 4 mounted Batteries and 1 dismounted Battery, the latter being formed and commanded by Lieut. G. Light, 1st Divisional Artillery, for the purpose of taking the overflow of trained Personnel from the other Batteries, this leaving them free to carry on the continuous roll of instruction, each mounted Battery consists of a Permanent Cadre, which were taken from Reinforcements recently arrived in the United Kingdom, and were not trained for their appointed duties more than other ranks which joined for the purpose of instruction.

The Batteries were organised into 6 Gun Batteries of 3 Sections each. The Dismounted Battery (No.5) was organised on the 6 Gun basis to comply with the formation of a Battery in the Field, and was composed of trained men, a special Section being formed for men other than "A" Class which was kept clear of the other Sections for disciplinary reasons.

There are 11 British Officers (R.F.A.) and 14 N.C.O's (R.F.A.) attached for instructional purposes, in all Artillery Subjects..

Lieut.Colonel W. Mailer, admitted to Hospital on 5th June 1917., the Command of the Brigade devolved on Lieut.Colonel F. O'Mahony, 3rd Divisional Artillery, who proceeded overseas to France on the 5th August 1917. The Command of the Brigade then devolved on Major C.H.Spurge, 1st Divisional Artillery, who commanded it until the arrival of Lieut.Colonel G.H.M.King C.M.G.

The Brigade was inspected by H.R.H. The Duke of Connaught on the 20th August 1917, who announced that it was with great pleasure that he inspected the troops and that their appearance and discipline was highly satisfactory.

The Brigade exacuated Camps 20, 21 & 26 Lark Hill, under orders from Headquarters, A.I.F.Depots in the United Kingdom, on the 16th October 1917, and occupied Camps, 1,2,3 & 4 Heytesbury, Wilts, where it is now encamped, the accommodation is good and plentiful, the rationing arrangements are excellent.

Details of Instruction carried out are attached here to.

On the 27th September 1917 the dismounted Battery (No.5) was demobilised and drafted to Nos.1,2,3, & 4 to Batteries, except that portion attending the Signalling School, which now forms the Signal Section of the Brigade and in accordance with C.R.A.I.F. 15126 (A) the Brigade was reorganised as follows:

No.1 Battery, Howitzer, to train for all Howitzer
Batteries in the A.I.F.

No.2 Battery, 18 pdr. Q.F. training for :
Right Half Bty. Ast. Div. Arty.

Left " 2nd Div. Arty.

No.3 Battery, 18 pdr. Q.F. training for:Right Half Bty. 3rd Div. Arty.
Left " " 4th Div. Arty.

No.4 Battery, 18 pdr.Q.F. training for :Right Half Bty. 5th Div.Arty.
Left " Army Field Arty.

Signal Section - Training for all Artillery in A.I.F.

Drafts from New South Wales to be allotted normally to No.2 Battery, drafts from Victoria to No.3 Battery and Drafts from other States to No.4 Battery., Men from France to the half-Battery representing the Division to which they belong.

The Batteries were divided into two Sections each of two Subsections, each Section to be commanded by a Subaltern of the Permanent Cadre, with the necessary N.C.O's to assist, from this date the Battery Commanders are held responsible for the training of their Batteries, and a Subaltern of the Permanent Cadre's will perform all Administrative duties of the Batteries, who will be changed every two months. Certain N.C.O's were detailed for Administrative duties, so as to prevent Instructors being taken from Classes for routine work.

The British Instructional staff is distributed equally within the four Batteries., Lieut. Colonel Washington, R.F.A. becoming Chief Instructor, and carries out the duties of Staff Officer to the C.O., R.B.A.A.

The discipline of the Brigade has on the whole been good, there has been no necessity for any change in the Establishment as it has stood all tests made.


