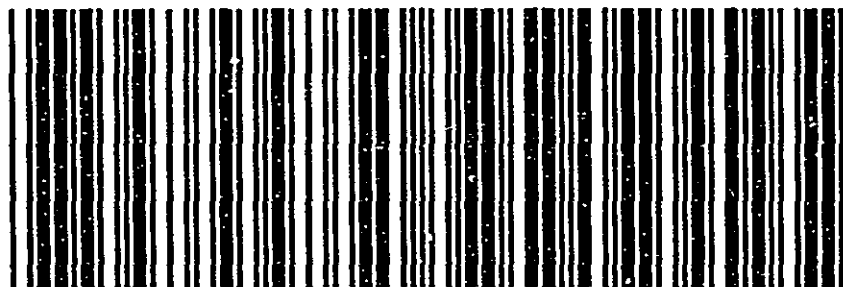

- (d) Vehicles will be issued later by HQ BCOF, after units arrive in JAPAN.

DISCHARGES ON OCCUPATIONAL GROUNDS

Ref HQ AMF 98477 of 26th Jul 45 and GRO 206/45.

1. The Government has decided that, in future, discharges from the Services on occupational grounds shall be strictly limited and that Manpower recommendations are only to be made in special cases where acceleration of discharge will be in the national interest.
2. All future recommendations from the Manpower Directorate for release on occupational grounds will be submitted to HQ AMF which will issue appropriate instructions regarding the individuals concerned.
3. No further "Occ R" forms will be issued. Action will be taken by HQ concerned to finalise urgently all "Occ R" forms on which action has not yet been completed.
4. For some time past, the Manpower Directorate has been embarrassed by the numbers of serving soldiers who make application for discharge on occupational grounds and support their applications by stating that they have been informed by their Officers that they will be released if the Manpower Directorate makes a suitable recommendation.
5. In the majority of such cases the Manpower Directorate is unable to recommend release, with the result that both Army and Manpower become subject to adverse criticism.
6. Officers will refrain from indicating that discharge will be granted if recommended by the Manpower Directorate. Personnel may continue to submit applications to the Manpower Directorate but should be advised that only in exceptional cases will accelerated discharge be approved.
7. Cancellation of GRO 206/45 may be anticipated.

1. It is advised that the attached Appendix "A" indicates the Commonwealth Seniority and strength of Warrant Officers of the Permanent Military Forces as at present recorded at HQ AMF and replaces Appendix "B" attached to LHQ 137063 of 4th October, 1944.

2. It will be noted that the names of T/WOsII enlisted in the PMF subsequent to 5 Oct 39, who have been discharged on appointment to commissioned rank or on enlistment in the AIF, have been omitted from the appendix. Members in this category, however, who have qualified at No.9 AIC Course or at HQ AMF S of Inf for appointment to WOII AIC, are recorded at HQ AMF as eligible for consideration in the post war PMF for appointment to that rank, providing they fulfil all other conditions appertaining to the post war PMF.

3. The names of T/WOsII remaining on the appendix are those who were enlisted in the PMF prior to 6 Oct 39 and those who enlisted subsequent to 5 Oct 39 and have not been discharged on appointment to commissioned rank or on enlistment in the AIF.

  - (b) Suitable ORs to be provided through normal channels.
7. Particulars of officers reposted as a result of action in accordance with para 5 will be forwarded to HQ AMF as soon as possible and in any case not later than 20 Apr 46.
8. Where a member who is otherwise suitable is precluded from absorption by reason of his/her present rank and the continued employment of the member is regarded as being desirable in the interests of the service, the member concerned may be carried supernumerary in rank to WE subject to prior confirmation by HQ AMF.

COMMONWEALTH OF AUSTRALIA AND UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

AGREEMENT RELATING TO CLAIMS ARISING OUT OF NEGLIGENT NAVIGATION OF  
VESSELS &c.

Treasury Circular No. 1946/G6 of 21 March 1946, is promulgated  
hereunder for information -

1. An Agreement, as per copy attached, was entered into at Canberra,  
on 8 March, 1945, between the Governments of the Commonwealth of  
Australia and of the United States of America regarding the  
provision of mutual aid in relation to certain problems arising  
out of marine transportation, and of litigation in connection  
therewith.

2. Generally speaking, the mutual aid provided for in the Agreement  
relates to -

- (a) The waiver of certain claims which a Government might  
ordinarily have against the other; and
- (b) The provision of legal assistance in the processing, settling  
&c. of claims made against one Government by a party other  
than the other Government.

WAIVER OF CLAIMS -

3. Each Government agreed to waive all claims -

- (a) Arising out of or in connection with negligent navigation or  
general average in respect of any cargo or freight owned by  
it, and in respect of any vessel (including naval vessel)  
owned by it;
- (b) For salvage services rendered by it or by any organisation  
owned or controlled by it;
- (c) For loss of or damage to cargo owned by it and arising out  
of the carriage thereof; and
- (d) For loss of or damage to any cargo or vessel owned by it and  
caused by the shipment or carriage of cargo owned by the  
other Government,

where such claims are against the other Government, its servants  
or its agents, or where that other Government represents that such  
claims if made would ultimately be borne by it.

4. It has been agreed that in each case of the waiver of a claim the waiver will be evidenced by the issue of an appropriate Certificate. Each of such Certificates will be signed on behalf of each Government, the Authorized Commonwealth signatory being the Deputy Crown Solicitor, Sydney, whose address is Box 27270, G.P.O., Sydney. (Mr. W.J. Roberts of that Deputy Crown Solicitor's Staff, will also be an authorised certifying officer on behalf of the Commonwealth.)

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Agreement provides that in certain cases claims which normally would be waived will not be waived, but that an adjustment would be arranged between the Governments as will give effect to the general purpose of the waiver provisions of the Agreement. For example, the waiver procedure will not be followed where, because of claims by third parties, it may be necessary, in proceedings taken for the limitation of liability, that claims be marshalled. The question whether or not the waiver procedure will be followed will (so far as the Commonwealth is concerned) be determined by the Deputy Crown Solicitor, Sydney.

6. The Agreement provides that a vessel owned by either Government includes a vessel on bare boat charter to that Government or requisitioned by it on bare boat terms or otherwise in its possession.

7. The Agreement came into force on 8th March 1945, but it applies not only to claims arising on or after that date but also to claims which arose before that date if they were unsettled on that date.

#### ARTICLE 4 OF THE AGREEMENT :

8. This Article relates to the release of vessels from judicial proceedings and for each Government, upon request, to furnish legal assistance and to settle or compromise any suit brought against the requesting Government, or to assert or settle and compromise any claim to which the requesting Government may be entitled.

9. By an exchange of notes between Ministers which accompanied the Agreement, settlements under Article 4 were to be accounted for under Lend-Lease and Reciprocal Lend-Lease respectively. On 10th October, 1945, the U.S. Secretary of State notified that the arrangements for the implementation of Article 4 under Lend Lease would apply only in those cases where a claim arose prior to the expiration of sixty days following 12.01 a.m., V-J Day (September 2nd, 1945), i.e. before 12.01 a.m., 1st November, 1945. Under a Mutual Aid Arrangement entered into with the U.S. Forces, the Commonwealth agreed to the continuation of similar assistance to the United States as "mutual aid" until 31st December, 1945.

10. Any payments made by the Commonwealth under Article 4 will be made by the Deputy Crown Solicitor, Sydney, in accordance with instructions from the Treasury.

#### PROVISION OF LEGAL ASSISTANCE:


11. It is unnecessary here to discuss in detail the nature of the provisions of the Agreement whereby legal assistance is provided by the contracting Governments.

12. The Crown Solicitor for the Commonwealth, acting through the Deputy Crown Solicitor, Sydney will (in effect) act as Solicitor for the United States, or the appropriate United States Authority, with respect to a claim, of the nature described in the Agreement, where such claim is prepared in the Commonwealth by a claimant other than the Commonwealth.

13. Should a case arise where it is desired that legal assistance should be provided in the United States, complete details of the matter should be referred to the Treasury, Canberra.

ACTION REQUIRED BY EACH DEPARTMENT :

14. It is required of each Department that, as soon as possible, it will send to the Deputy Crown Solicitor, Sydney, complete details of all matters in respect to which claims (of the nature indicated in this circular) could, apart from the Agreement, be asserted both by and against the Commonwealth."
2. The information required vide paragraph 14 of the Treasury Circular should be furnished to this HQ as soon as possible. Should no claims be involved, a Nil Return should be furnished.

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The Government of the Commonwealth of Australia and the Government of the United States of America being desirous of defining, in so far as certain problems of marine transportation and litigation are concerned, the manner in which shall be provided mutual aid in the conduct of the war including the aid contemplated by the Exchange of Notes between the Australian Minister at Washington and the United States of America, Secretary of State, on the 3rd September, 1942, have agreed as follows :-

ARTICLE 1.

(1) Each contracting Government agrees to waive all claims arising out of or in connection with negligent navigation or general average in respect of any cargo or freight owned by such Government and in respect of any vessel (including naval vessel) owned by such Government against the other contracting Government or any cargo, freight or vessel (including naval vessel) owned by such other Government or against any servant or agent of such other Government or in any case where such other Government represents that such claim if made would ultimately be borne by such other Government.

(2) Each contracting Government agrees on behalf of itself and or any organisation which is owned or controlled by it and operating for its account or on its behalf to waive all claims for salvage services against the other contracting Government or against any cargo, freight or vessel (including naval vessel) owned by such other Government or in any case where such other Government represents that such salvage claim if made would ultimately be borne by such other Government.

(3) Each contracting Government agrees to waive all claims for loss of or damage to cargo owned by such Government and arising out of the carriage thereof or for loss of or damage to any cargo or vessel owned by one contracting Government and caused by the shipment or carriage of cargo owned by the other contracting Government against such other Government or against any servant or agent of such other Government or against any vessel (including naval vessel) owned by such other Government or in any cases where such other Government represents that the claim if made would ultimately be borne by such other Government.

(4) Each contracting Government undertakes not to make any claim in respect of any vessel or cargo insured by it to which it may be entitled by virtue of any right of subrogation either -

(a) directly against the other contracting Government; or

(b) in any case where such other Government represents that such claim if made would ultimately be borne by such other Government.

(5) Each contracting Government agrees to extend the principles of this Agreement to such other maritime claims as may from time to time be agreed between them.

ARTICLE 2.

Where in any case claims arise which are not required to be waived by this Agreement in addition to or in conjunction with claims which are so required to be waived and it is necessary in any proceedings including proceedings for the limitation of liability that claims be marshalled or for the proper assessment of any salvage or general average that values should be estimated, the provisions of this Agreement shall not apply but claims which would otherwise be required to be waived under this Agreement shall be asserted. Any recoveries, however, shall be waived by the Government entitled to such recoveries as against the other or by mutual arrangements between the two Governments shall be dealt with in such other way as will give effect to the purposes of this Agreement.

ARTICLE 3.

(1) For the purpose of this Agreement the expression "vessel owned by a contracting Government" includes a vessel on bare boat charter to a contracting Government or requisitioned by a contracting Government on bare boat terms or otherwise in the possession of a contracting Government (except to the extent that the risk of loss or liability is borne by some person other than either contracting Government).

(2) In order to carry out the full intention of the provisions of Article 1 of this Agreement each contracting Government will so arrange in connection with bare boat charters to it that the owners or persons interested through such owners shall not have or assert any claims of the character specified in Article 1.

ARTICLE 4.

Each contracting Government upon the request of the other will provide undertaking for the release of vessels or cargo owned by the other contracting Government from judicial proceedings in Courts in the United States of America or in the Commonwealth of Australia as the case may be where such release will promote the war effort and the requesting Government so represents, upon compliance with the following conditions -

- (a) upon the tender of such request due authority will be conferred by the Government interested in such vessel or cargo upon the law officers of the Government furnishing the undertaking to appear on their behalf and to conduct the defence of such proceedings in so far as such vessel or cargo is concerned, to settle or compromise any such suit, to assert or settle and compromise any claim to which the requesting Government may be entitled in respect of the subject matter of the suit and to make and receive payments in respect thereof; and
- (b) the requesting Government upon tendering such a request will assure the other Government of its full co-operation in making defence to such suit and asserting such claims including the making available of witnesses and evidence and including preparation for trial.

Unless otherwise agreed, each contracting Government will reimburse or account to the other for any payment made or received by the one Government on behalf of the other.

ARTICLE 5.

Nothing in this agreement shall be construed as a waiver of the right of either contracting Government in appropriate cases to assert sovereign immunity.

ARTICLE 6.

(1) This Agreement, which shall come into force on the date of signature, shall apply in respect of all claims arising before the date of this Agreement but remaining unsettled at such date, which may arise during the currency of this Agreement.

(2) This Agreement shall remain in force until the expiration of six months from the date upon which either of the contracting Governments shall have given notice in writing of their intention to terminate it.

IN WITNESS whereof the undersigned, duly authorized to that effect by their respective Governments, have signed the present Agreement and have affixed thereto their seals.

DONE in Canberra in duplicate, this 8th day of March, 1945.

Text of Suggested Exchange of Notes between the  
signatories to the Mutual Waiver Agreement

United States Note to Australia.

With reference to Article IV of the Agreement signed today between the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia, and the Government of the United States of America relating to certain problems of maritime transportation and litigation, I have the honour to state that for the present and until further notice it is the intention of my Government that the accounting contemplated by that Article will be accomplished under the Act of Congress of March 11, 1941, to the extent authorized under that Act.

Accordingly, the Government of the United States will in appropriate cases make such payments as are necessary in the course of operations under the Agreement according to its procedure in the administration of that Act and will receive any moneys which may accrue in the course of such operations as a benefit under that Act and under the Exchange of Notes between the Australian Minister at Washington and the Secretary of State of the United States of America on the 3rd September, 1942.

Australian Note to the United States.

I have the honour to acknowledge receipt of your note of today's date referring to Article IV of the Agreement signed today between our two Governments relating to certain problems of marine transportation and litigation. In reply I wish to state that for the present and until further notice my Government intends that the accounting required by Article IV shall be on the same basis as the payments contemplated in your note and that the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia will make any payments required by the Agreement and receive any moneys accruing under its reciprocal aid according to the terms of the Exchange of Notes between the Australian Minister at Washington and the Secretary of State of the United States of America on the 3rd September, 1942.

MARRIED FEMALE OFFICERS (AMC, AANS, AWAS, AAMWS etc)  
PLACEMENT UPON RETIRED LIST

I am directed by the Adjutant-General to  
inform you that:-

- (a) all married female officers of any Corps or Service of the AIF who would otherwise be eligible to be transferred to the Reserve of Officers on demobilization, vide GRC 210/44, para 39, will be placed upon the Retired List instead of being transferred to the Reserve of Officers;
- (b) all married female officers at present on the Reserve of Officers or in course of transfer thereto will be placed upon the Retired List;
- (c) any single female officer now on the Reserve of Officers or who may be transferred thereto, who marries whilst on the Reserve of Officers will thereupon be placed upon the Retired List.

2. For the purposes of this instruction, the term "married female officer" will include a widow or divorcee with dependant child or children. A widow or divorcee without dependant child or children will be treated as a single female officer.

3. Regarding officers mentioned in para 1.(a), arrangements are in course for the AIF A277, which is submitted to AFQ by Ech 2 Rec, to have indicated thereon whether such female officer is married or single bearing in mind the terms of para 2, when appropriate action for her disposal, either to the Reserve of Officers, Retired List or retirement, will be taken by AFQ.

4. Formations will take action to check the present marital state of all female officers now on the Reserve of Officers, and where necessary, will submit recommendation to AFQ forthwith in accordance with the principles set out in paras 1 and 2 hereof.

5. Regarding officers referred to in para 1 (c), Formations will instruct all single female officers either now on the Reserve of Officers or when they are transferred to that List, that, should they marry whilst on the Reserve, such fact should be notified by them to the Military Headquarters of the State in which they reside, which will then submit an appropriate recommendation to AFQ for the placement of such officer on the Retired List.

6. In view of the foregoing, action is in course to amend GRC 220/44, and the "Obligations and Status of Officers after termination of War Services" (issued with AFQ 134031 and 9503, of 13/10/45 and 20/1/46 respectively).

NATIONAL DEFENCE CONTRIBUTIONS.

The following instruction has been issued by the Department of the Treasury relative to the procedure to be observed in dealing with requests received from donors for the return or replacement of equipment &c. loaned or donated to the Commonwealth for war purposes -

A. Throughout the period of the war, it was Commonwealth policy to accept from philanthropic bodies, and other organisations and the public generally, gifts of money, land, equipment and supplies, which gifts were to be applied for some purpose associated with or arising out of the war.

All monetary donations have been accounted for through Trust Fund - National Defence Contributions Account, which account has been under the control of the Treasury.

B. Gifts other than of money were made direct to Service Departments, and were taken on charge and otherwise accounted for in accordance with procedures promulgated within each Department.

C. The question has now arisen as to whether under any circumstances, land equipment or stores donated to the Commonwealth may at the request of the donor be returned to him when the property is no longer required for Commonwealth purposes.

D. In order that there may be uniformity of procedure in dealing with requests from donors for the return of equipment &c. provided by them, the following arrangements are notified for observance by Service Departments and other Departments concerned -

(i) Land, stores, or equipment of any kind donated to the Commonwealth for war purposes remain the property of the Commonwealth and except as provided in sub-paras. (ii), (iii), (iv) & (v) hereunder, shall not be returned, nor any replacement made to the donor whether or not a request for such return or replacement is received from the donor.

All such equipment &c. shall so long as required, be retained for use by the Department to which it was donated. When no longer required by such Department, it shall be declared to the Commonwealth Disposals Commission for disposal in the usual manner.

(ii) Where application for return of the equipment is made by the donor and it is clearly established that the equipment &c. provided by the donor was in the nature of a loan to the Department, return of the equipment &c., in good order or condition or a suitable replacement thereof, may be made upon the approval of the Minister.

(iii) Where the donor has made a gift on the understanding that such gift be returned to the donor at the end of the war, if available and in good order, the following will apply -

- (a) Where the item is available and in good order, arrangements be made for its return to the donor on request, or alternatively, a suitable replacement to be effected from local sources in order to avoid costly transport of the item;
  - (b) In special circumstances where the item is available but not in good order the request for the return to be processed through the Commonwealth Disposals Commission which shall determine the conditions under which return or replacement shall be effected.
- (iv) Where a donor has requested return of the equipment provided by him and there is some evidence that it may have been made available on the understanding that it would be returned when no longer required, but such evidence is not conclusive, decision as to whether the equipment &c., shall be returned shall rest with the Minister.
  - (v) Where in any instance not covered by (ii), (iii) & (iv) above, return of equipment &c. is requested by the donor and there are exceptional circumstances which might justify return of the equipment without charge, such request shall be treated as an application for a free gift of Commonwealth property and shall be processed to the Commonwealth Disposals Commission for Treasurer's approval, in accordance with Treasury Instruction No. 252 and Disposals Commission's Circular No. 130 of 14 Sept. 1945.

2. To implement this direction, the following action will be taken by H.Q., Commands &c. -

- (i) Applications received from donors will be thoroughly investigated in order to establish that the equipment &c. was in effect received by Army and to determine the conditions under which such equipment was provided.
- (ii) Applications in respect of cases to which the provisions of para. 1(D), sub-paras. (ii), (iii), (iv) or (v), are considered to apply will be referred to A.H.Q. with full information and covering recommendation in support of such determination.
- (iii) Applications in respect of cases for which consideration in accordance with the provisions of para. 1(D), sub-paras. (ii), (iii), (iv) or (v) is not recommended, should not be referred to A.H.Q. but the respective applicants should be notified that the return or replacement of the gifts cannot be effected.

3. Recommendations received by A.H.Q. from H.Q., Commands, will, if approved, be processed in accordance with the relative provisions of para. 1, and suitable instructions will be issued when such matters are finalised.

#### 4. EXCEPTIONS -

The above procedure will not apply to requests received in respect of Binoculars or any other specific items for which separate instructions may be issued by A.H.Q.

RETENTION OF HIGH PRIORITY PERSONNEL

1. I am directed by the Adjutant-General to draw attention to the present serious position regarding numbers retained against their wishes.

2. Total retained at 28 JUN 48.

Medical personnel, both male and female, account for 1,113 of the total shown in sub-para (a) above.

3. Personnel retained over 4 months.

By AMI memo 154357 of 17 DEC 48, a retention period of 4 months was introduced to allow sufficient time for replacement of all but highly skilled personnel, such as medical staffs, etc, for whom it was appreciated replacements could not be trained in that time.

The Adjutant-General is very concerned at the large numbers of non-skilled and semi-skilled personnel, such as clerks, cooks, drivers, general duties personnel, etc, who are being retained for more than 4 months.

4. Personnel retained less than 4 months.

The impracticability of discharging every non-skilled man as soon as he becomes High Priority is fully realised.

However, the Adjutant-General is not satisfied that it is necessary to retain as many as 10,000, particularly as a large number of them are unskilled or replaceable and already approaching the completion of the 4 month retention period.

3. Points level - kept as high as possible.

To relieve the retention problem generally, and particularly the non-skilled portion thereof, it is of advantage both to the Army and the individual to keep the points level as high as practicable.

Variations in the points level are based on -

- (a) the numbers required to be discharged in any one period; and
- (b) the information supplied by Co. ends of the number of volunteers and retained personnel who can be released without replacement during the same period.

4. Action required.

The Adjutant-General fully appreciates the personnel difficulties inherent in the Army's present period of rapid reduction, but in order to retain the principle of discharge by points priority until generalization is completed, and thus ensure the fairest possible treatment to all concerned, desires that Commands -

- (a) make every possible effort to reduce the numbers retained against their wishes, especially those who are non-skilled or replaceable; and
- (b) discharge the required number from the next available Low Priority list, if it is found that the necessary reduction for the month cannot be effected from High Priority personnel.
