

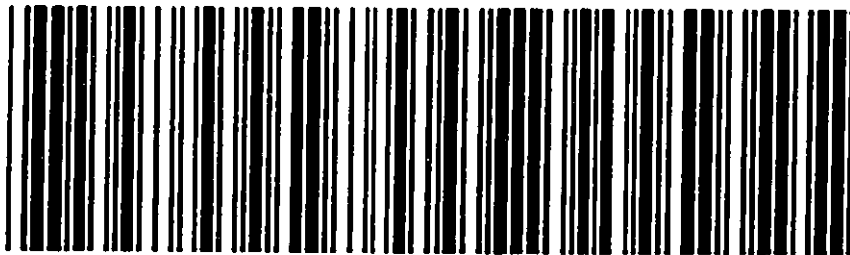

Administrative Instruction No. 82 of 27 Mar 45 (as amended 19 May 45) is amended by deleting para 2 (a) thereof and substituting the following sub-paragraph in lieu:-

"2(a) Recruits for enlistment in the PACIFIC ISLANDS Regiment will be over the age of 18 years and Medically Class A1. Such recruits must be not less than 5 feet 3 inches in height with a chest measurement of not less than 35 inches."

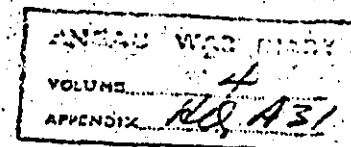

2. Until 3 Oct this HQ was continually engaged in receiving and allocating signals for HQ ANGAU and HQ Southern Region. Signals now appear to be routed correctly but it might be considered desirable by HQ ANGAU to ensure that formations in AUSTRALIA are fully aware of its new location.

3. **HQ AND CAMP AREA:**

Locations: HQ Rear Party - former Camp Comdt's office.
Finance - remaining Pay WO accommodated in former Transport office.
Marine - as before.
Civil Affairs - HQ Southern Region.
Finance - HQ Southern Region.

All accommodation and expense stores in the buildings occupied by Branches, Services and in Messes have, with the exception of those in use by Rear Party, been returned to S&S Section. Likewise all clothing and personal equipment ex "q" Store.

HQ buildings have all been cleaned and the area itself cleaned of all papers, rubbish, etc. which have been burned. Work in camp area proceeds and it is anticipated that it will be thoroughly cleaned and all surplus latrines filled in by 20 Oct 45.

Accommodation: Remaining officers of HQ Rear Party now quartered in Government House. All other ranks, including PCB staff, other than those living in Town area, are now concentrated in Sgts' Quarters and former Sgts' Mess.

Works Section: Are fully occupied in receiving, stacking, sorting and issuing timber to PCB, etc. and cleaning workshops.

4. **COMMUNICATIONS:**

Local telephone communications are literally chaotic. ANGAU switch closed down on 2 Oct 45 and remaining ANGAU and PCB installations in this area are connected to MORESBY switch. Southern Region installations are in general on Southern Region switch which replaced Central.

It has been found necessary, owing to state of telephone communications to use M.T. to transact business.

5. **TRANSPORT:**

It has been found that 1 jeep was inadequate for efficient admin with calls upon it for mails, RAP, communications, etc. 10 AOD have given this HQ another jeep on loan.

6. DEMORILISATION:

Papers in respect of all personnel under command and Postal, MORNBY, have now been completed.

7. CIVIL ADMINISTRATION:

Liaison has been maintained with Mr. MELROSE and at his request former "B" Base was made available for accommodation of returning Civil Administration staff. OC Rear Party was informed by Mr. MELROSE that he had discussed this with DA & QNS who was agreeable.

8. LEGAL:

Southern Region advised re indictable offences and routine legal matters - likewise 6 Aust Base Sub Area.

9. MEDICAL:

Medical Q.N. reports that Drs. MAY and WHITE (Civil Admin) consulted him concerning 20 bed hospital MORNBY and 10 bed hospital SAMARAI. Scales as per First Aust Army signal have been prepared and a detailed report will be forwarded to ADMS.

I. Marine Section activities for the week ending 5 Oct 45 have consisted of :

- (a) Routine Administration, consolidation of Monthly Reports, Freights, etc., and investigating A.N.G.P.C.B. Claims.
- (b) The question of expediting repairs to vessels held at 7 Aust W/c W/Shops ARME was discussed with Maj. Wakeman DADME 6 Aust Base Sub-Area and Capt Broadbent CC of the Workshops.
Both Maj. Wakeman and Capt Broadbent assure me that every effort is being made to bring vessels into commission, but they are concerned at the anticipated loss of native labour from the Workshops after the 15 October, which they state will reduce the efficiency of the Workshops.
- (c) Native Crews have been contacted in regard to signing on after the 15 October, but the results show that crews will not be available after that date.
It is considered, however, that local Tatana and Hanuabada natives MAY be willing to remain as ships crews, so as to enable the larger vessels to be used for the repatriation of natives to the more distant districts.
These local natives are not willing to sign but may work as casual labour for a limited time. This matter is being discussed with the DADNL. Action is being taken to personally interview these natives but lack of transport at this HQ's restricts movement to a minimum.
- (d) 7 Aust W/C W/Shops ARME came under command Moresby Base Sub Area as from the 4 Oct 45.
- (e) Approval has been given by HQ ANGAU for Lt R.M. Crooke to proceed to Brisbane to take delivery of the vessel ASI790. Arrangements are being made for Lt Crooke's departure by Air and he has been given the necessary authority and relevant papers in order to bring the vessel to LAE.
- (f) A number of natives have been applying for passage on ANGAU vessels and are willing to pay their own fare.
All such applications have been referred to the DO Moresby.
- (g) No advice has as yet been received regarding the handover to Civil Administration, and the result of the Conference on Shipping held at Canberra on 29 Sept is still awaited.
- (h) The bulk of ANGAU Shipping tonnage is at present in W/Shops as the Daphne, AK96 and AK94 have all been under repair. The estimated dates of completion of repairs of the vessels are:

AK94	Abel Tasman	26 Oct 45
AK96	Arga	20 Oct 45

No work is being done to the other ANGAU vessels at W/Shops due to lack of skilled labour and facilities.

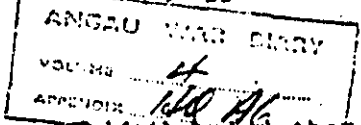

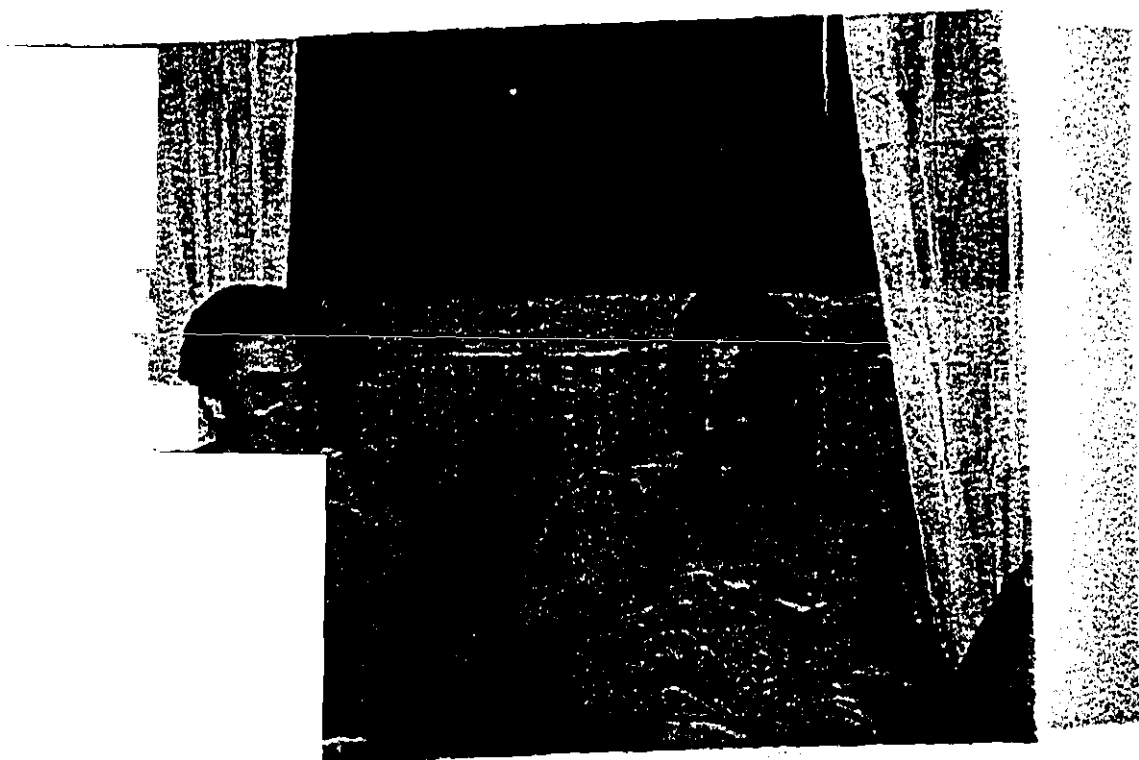

1. First Aust Army A24579 of 28 Sep 45 advises that approval is given for the discharge or finalisation of appointment in New Guinea of Army personnel at present in First Aust Army Area subject to the following provisions:-
 - (a) Personnel electing discharge must be Papuan or New Guinea enlistments or former residents of the islands.
 - (b) Personnel must elect in writing to be discharged in New Guinea (See Appx "A").
 - (c) Such discharge is recommended by ANGAU.
 - (d) An authority to reside in the Territory as a civilian is obtained from the Department of External Territories.
2. Subject to para 1, personnel may be discharged at either PORT MORESEY or LAE.
 - (a) MEDICAL EXAMINATION. In accordance with para 150 of "Orders for Demobilisation of the AMF" 1945 (hereafter referred to as "Orders for Demob"). If, however, a final Medical Board is necessary this HQ will be advised and arrangements will be effected in the following manner:-
 - (i) For personnel being discharged at LAE. Medical Board at Lae Base Sub Area.
 - (ii) For personnel being discharged at MORESEY, at Moresby Base Sub Area.
 - (b) DENTAL EXAMINATION. In accordance with para 149 of "Orders for Demob".
 - (c) ARMS, EQUIPMENT AND CLOTHING will be returned at the respective discharge depots and the appropriate entry will be made in Form 12 of AAB 87 and AAF's 25 issued. If necessary Kit Stoppage sheets will be prepared and together with kit clearances will be forwarded to Depot Cash Office.
 - (d) DOCUMENTATION. The following documents will be required by this HQ for submission to FIRST AUST ARMY:-

Upon receipt of documents by First Aust Army a period of approximately 30 days will elapse before 2nd Ech & Rec and District Accounts Office finalise documents and accounts respectively. Further instructions will emanate from this HQ as to whether necessary Discharge Certificate and a credit for Army earnings, deferred pay, etc., may be forwarded by post to his address.

4. CO, 6 Aust Base Sub Area, Moresby, and CO, NGDD Lao, will confirm discharges of members at the respective Discharge Depots.
5. HQ have appointed a Rehabilitation Officer to be made available for assisting the Confirming Officers and he will advise on all matters relating to Civil Re-establishment. First Aust Army will advise 6 Aust Base Sub Area and Lao Base Sub Area when this service is available from time to time.
6. The Repatriation Commission have agreed to accept the findings of the Final Medical Board in respect to personnel, but reserves the right to record decisions inconsistent with the findings and opinions of the Service Medical Board, should that course be warranted. War Pension Claims are to be completed and are referred to in para 2 (d) (xiii).
7. Appendix "B" details personnel on Leave without Pay in PAPUA and NEW GUINEA. (The instructions contained herein apply only to those personnel desiring discharge in PAPUA and NEW GUINEA. In respect to those personnel who were enlistments in, or were residents of the territories pre-war who do not elect discharge in the Territory, separate instructions will issue, not to all addressees).
8. As an anticipatory action, ANG Production Control Board (hereinafter referred to as PCB) will take immediate steps to:-
 - (a) Arrange for applications (in terms of Appx "A" Pro Forma) for those members concerned after completion of para 3 of the Appendix by PCB to be forwarded to this HQ.
 - (b) Notify this HQ date the member will be available for movement to Dispersal Centre for discharge.
9. On receipt of the Pro Forma Appx "A" from the members, this HQ will immediately DDCA ANGAN (hereinafter referred to as CA) of those members desiring release and such advices will be immediately referred by CA to Department of External Territories for authority for the member to reside in the Territory.
10. It is stressed that any action in respect to the discharge of the member is dependent on the authority to reside in the territory, from the Department of External Territories and therefore CA will ensure that applications are dealt with expeditiously.
11. Personal documents, i.e. AGS and AEB33 will be completed as far as possible by the HQ from which the member proceeded on Leave without Pay. They will be forwarded to the GDO from which the member is being discharged.
12. It will be ensured that personnel affected by these orders report to the HQ from which he proceeded on Leave without Pay for the action detailed in para 11.
13. Appendix "C" applies to those personnel whose authority for release has been approved by FIRST AUST ARMY. For those members requiring release in PAPUA or NEW GUINEA, action will be taken forthwith in terms of paras 8, 9 and 10.
14. No action will be taken to march out for discharge any of the personnel detailed in Appendices "B" & "C" without authority of this HQ.

ABSORPTION OF NORTHERN REGION BY HQ ANGAU

1. INFORMATION.

HQ Northern Region will cease to function as at 131200K and from that time and date all it's commitments will become the responsibility of HQ ANGAU.

2. METHOD.

- (a) As from 131200K all correspondence for HQ Northern Region will be routed to HQ ANGAU.

- (e) All ordnance stores will be returned to RSD and necessary clearance certificates obtained.
- (f) Any ammunition will be returned to AAD (Sec of 10 ADD).

3. REGIMENTAL FUNDS.

- (a) Bulk Purchases Amenities Fund will be returned to HQ ANGAU.
- (b) Northern Region Canteen will be closed. Stores will be transferred to HQ ANGAU Canteen.
- (c) Canteen Profits will be paid into HQ Northern Region Regimental Trust Fund Account.
- (d) Credit Balance of HQ Northern Region Trust Fund Account will be transferred to HQ ANGAU Regimental Fund.
- (e) All advances to District Canteens will be transferred by book entries to HQ ANGAU.
- (f) Audited Statement of HQ Northern Region Trust Fund will be submitted to this HQ.
- (g) HQ Northern Region Officers' & Sergeants' Messes will be closed and such furnishings and Mess property in possession will move with personnel to the respective messes at HQ ANGAU.
- (h) Statements of the financial position of the Messes on completion will be duly audited by HQ Northern Region Auditors and forwarded to this HQ.
- (i) Certificates will be submitted for each Mess showing:-
 - (1) Any accounts outstanding.
 - (ii) Details of any indebtedness to the Mess by members.
- (j) A certificate will be submitted showing that no accounts are outstanding from Regimental Fund purchases.

4. AMENITIES.

All Amenities material held by Northern Region HQ will be transferred to HQ ANGAU, accompanied by regimental property book and records.

5. SIGNALS.

Pending arrangements being completed at HQ ANGAU, the Signal Sec will remain in situ, and will be rationed and quartered by OC, ANGAU Civilian Transit Camp.

6. PERSONNEL.

HQ ANGAU will arrange reception of, and quartering for 18 Officers and 120 Other Ranks.

A132 GRO 233/1945 - MEDALS - CAMPAIGN STARS AND CLASPS AND DEFENCE MEDAL - CONDITIONS OF AWARD.

LHQ memo 127463 of 25 Sep 45 is promulgated for information of all ranks:-

1. Cases have come to notice where members have worn the ribbons of Campaign Stars, particularly the Pacific Star, without proper approval having first been obtained.
2. Attention is invited to GRO 233/45 in regard to qualifications necessary and the method of obtaining approval in each individual case as in Section (II) and para 92 of Section (V).
3. Members who are clearly entitled to Stars will obtain the approval of their Commanding Officer on the appropriate pro forma given in Section (V) and will not wear the ribbon until such written approval has been obtained. In the case of members whose eligibility partly or wholly depends on attachments for duty or visits etc., referred to in para 4 of Section (II), applications will be submitted to the Adjutant-General (DPS LHQ) through the usual channels, and these applications will be decided by the Commander-in-Chief.
4. No member will wear a ribbon until written approval is given either by his Commanding Officer under Section (V) or by A.G.'s Branch LHQ on the decision of the Commander-in-Chief under sub-paras 4.(b) and (c) of Section (II).

A133 POST-DISCHARGE MALARIA.

GRO A237/45 is promulgated for information of all ranks:-

1. (a) The Repatriation Commission will accept responsibility for providing any treatment necessary in respect of the first attack of malaria suffered by an ex-member of the AMF after his discharge from the Army.
(b) During such treatment, the Commission will institute inquiries as to eligibility or otherwise for the treatment of any subsequent attacks of malaria.
2. On the first occasion after his discharge that an ex-member becomes ill with malaria, he should -
 - (i) if resident in a capital city - report to the Repatriation Department's branch office or general hospital, either in person or by telephone, when immediate examination and treatment will be arranged;
 - (ii) if resident in the country - report to and request treatment from the nearest Repatriation local medical officer, who will send a report to the Repatriation Department. It will be necessary for the ex-member to identify himself by production of his discharge certificate.

3. (a) If it is not possible so to report, the ex-member should consult and request treatment from his local civilian doctor, and, provided prompt advice is sent by the doctor or the ex-member to the Repatriation Department, the Commission will assume full responsibility for the payment of medical fees, hospital fees and the cost of drugs.

(b) Arrangements for any further treatment will be notified to the ex-member by the Repatriation Commission as soon as possible.

4. Information regarding the treatment of malaria, with particular reference to ex-service personnel, has been sent by the Commonwealth Department of Health to civil medical practitioners.

5. In view of the foregoing, it is unnecessary for any member to be examined by a final medical board at the time of his discharge merely on account of a history of malaria. If the member has had an attack during his service, it will be on record in his medical history. Whether or not the member has had an attack during his service, he will be cared for by the Repatriation Commission should he develop an attack of malaria after his discharge. "

A134 CONSERVATION OF ATABRIN.

HQ First Aust Army memo A24548 of 27 Sep 45 is promulgated for information of all ranks:-

- "1. This instruction will be read in conjunction with GRO 321/44.
2. The supply of atabrin has become a matter of difficulty throughout the world. Unless the strictest economy is exercised it will not be possible to supply urgent requirements to Australian personnel serving in malarious areas.
3. In consequence of this position, the following instructions will be strictly enforced IMMEDIATELY:-
 - (a) Atabrin will be issued only to members of Australian and Allied Services.
 - (b) No member will consume more than one tablet per day.
 - (c) Issues to individuals will not exceed requirements for 14 days, except in the case of those proceeding on leave, when the provisions of GRO 321/44, para 28, will be observed.
 - (d) No tablets in excess of requirements for consumption to next date of issue will be retained by individuals.
 - (e) Units will not hold stocks in excess of requirements to next issue date.
 - (f) Issues to natives in Army employ will be restricted to those from regions where malaria does not occur.
4. Officers commanding units will be responsible for policing the above instructions and for the return to issuing Depots of any excess quantities held or discovered.

WAR SCALES OF CLOTHING AND NECESSARIES FOR ALL RANKS (MALE) ON FULL TIME DUTY - AMF - PUGAREES.

1HQ MGO Memo B64064 of 10 Sep 45 is promulgated for information of all ranks:-

- "1. Approval is hereby given for the free initial issue of puggarees in lieu of Bands, hat, khaki, to all male members of the AMF on full time duty on a basis of one per member. Stocks are limited, consequently units will indent for sufficient to provide an initial issue only and unit reserves will not be carried.
2. The types of puggarees have been produced as follows:-

- (a) Puggarees, hat, six-fold, 24 inch - Vocab No.1292.

This item is 24" in length and can be fitted to the hat and stitched by the individual.

3. Indents will be submitted for the latter item by sizes and where these are not available Puggarees, hat, six-fold, 24" will be issued in lieu.

4. Action is being taken to amend MGO Equipment Order No.2 [old No. Clo-Gen /1) as follows:-

Page 5. In the "article" column, delete the item "Hats, khaki, fur, with band and chinstrap" and insert in its stead the following:-

"Hats, khaki, fur, with puggaree, 6-fold and chinstrap."

Page 6. In the "Remarks" column, opposite the new item "Hats, khaki, fur, with puggaree 6-fold and chinstrap" add the following remarks:-

"Puggarees, hat, 6-fold will be issued in lieu of bands, hat, khaki.

5. This amendment may be anticipated."

1. HQ ANGAU will establish a civilian Transit Camp (hereinafter referred to as ANGAU CTC) on the site at present occupied by HQ Northern Region ANGAU. Civilians will be quartered in this Camp pending movement to their authorised destinations.
2. HQ Northern Region ANGAU will vacate the site on 13 Oct 45.
3. ANGAU CTC will be under supervision of the Camp Comdt, ANGAU. OC CTC will prepare CSO's and submit same to this Hq for approval.
4. ANGAU CTC will be staffed as under:-

5. DUTY PERSONNEL.

One offr, WO or NCO will be available on calls to CTC Hq at all times.

6. TRANSPORT.

1 x $\frac{1}{2}$ ton 4 x 4 and 1 x 15 cwt 4 x 4 GS, MT will be made available for the use of OC Camp and Camp maintenance.

7. COMMUNICATIONS.

1 Telephone to First Aust Army Switchboard.
DRLS, Camp-HQ ANGAU, 3 times daily.

8. POSTAL.

All postal facilities will be through HQ ANGAU as arranged by ANGAU Postal Soc.

9. MEDICAL.

ADMS ANGAU will arrange sick parades and any other medical requirements of the Camp.

10. DENTAL.

As arranged with Dental Officer HQ ANGAU.

11. BANKING.

Arrangements can be effected with DO Lae for Commonwealth Savings Bank facilities.

12. OUT OF BOUNDS.

ANGAU CTC is out of bounds to all service personnel except those authorised on a specific duty, or a written authority from ANGAU to be in the area.

13. RPC.

RPC will allocate sufficient constables to exercise a 24 hours tour of duty as detailed by OC ANGAU CTC (4 employed per tour of duty).

14. RECORDS.

A master roll of all civilians will be kept showing:-

- (a) Name and postal address
- (b) Name and address of next of kin.
- (c) Sex
- (d) Nationality
- (e) If ex-internee
- (f) Civilian avocation
- (g) Date and where marched in from and destination.
- (h) Civilian Identity Card number.
- (i) Index of authority (from CA) to reside in or visit the Territory of NG or Papua.
- (j) Signature of civilian on arrival.

15. RETURNS.

A daily strength return will be submitted to HQ ANGAU.

On the date of a civilian marching out, this HQ will be advised (3 copies) showing name, destination, time and means of movement.

A55's (Indent for rations) to this HQ 4 days in advance of the date the rations are required for consumption.

A55(a) (Indent for expense stores) as required, and according to the scale of issue.

W3809 (Daily Strength State) 2 copies.

W3810 (Weekly Summary of Ration Strength) 2 copies.

All returns will be submitted by the first daily DRLS.

16. QUARTERING.

Facilities will provide for:-

- (a) Quarters - huts adapted in separate areas for males and females.
- (b) Messing - separate messes and kitchens for male and females.
- (c) Hygiene - ablutions and latrines with necessary privacy.
soyer stoves and tubs, washing, for laundering of garments.

17. ANGAU PERSONNEL will use messing and quartering facilities of the male personnel.

18. HYGIENE.

OC Camp will ensure that hygiene of latrines and ablutions are carried out at regular times to be advised to civilian personnel.

19. ACCOMMODATION STORES.

Accommodation Stores will be drawn on a separate indent for ANGAU CTC and taken on charge of HQ ANGAU. They will then be taken on charge of HQ ANGAU CTC, from HQ ANGAU.

20. INTERNAL ACCOUNTING.

AQMG and FO ANGAU will detail the methods of accounting required for:-

- (a) messing and Quartering.
- (b) Use of Transport (MT).
- (c) Movement charges.

21. No movement will be effected without the authority of HQ ANGAU. A clearance certificate must be submitted with the request for movement, freeing the person concerned from any liability to the Army, either in the form of a receipt, or approved arrangement for settlement.

OC ANGAU OTO will submit request for movement, giving full particulars of weights of person, and baggage, together with Air Ticket bearing the signature of the person to be moved.

(Personnel and baggage may be weighed at S & S Store).

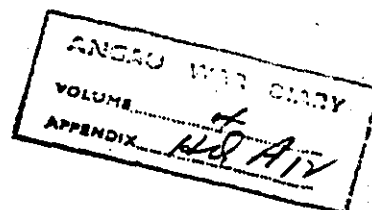

At the time of the first Japanese landing at SALAMANA in March 1942 Sgt-Major POGANAU was the senior N.C.O. in the area, where he remained for some time as a scout, later making his way to HAU where he joined our forces.

In February 1943 during the battle of HAU, POGANAU by his example and devotion to duty prevented the last 200 native carried in the area from deserting, thereby contributing considerably to the success of our operations.

During April 1943 attempts were made to induce the enemy to attack PORT MORESBY by air by spreading false rumours as to the anti-aircraft defences. To assist in spreading this false information POGANAU penetrated enemy lines in the MARKHAM VALLEY and remained there until he knew that the information had reached the Japanese at LAE.

During the landing on MANUS ISLAND in March 1944, POGANAU took charge of all native police and agents on the island where with skill, courage and initiative above the average, he played a great part in the successful operations against the enemy. Since joining our forces at HAU, POGANAU has worked continually as a member of Far Eastern Liaison Office, being loaned to A.I.B. and A.N.G.A.U. for special work.

Sgt-Major POGANAU had had 19 years service and has not previously been decorated.

From 30 Mar 45 to 9 Apr 45 in MONGIMARA Mission Area, NEW GUINEA. Constable ANGEL was attached to 2/3 Aust Inf Bn and was engaged in extensive patrolling of enemy held territory. On 30 Mar 45, while a recon patrol was patrolling enemy territory, a party of kanaka sentries was located. While enemy sentries were searching within 100 yds of him, ANGEL, at risk of his own life remained in a commanding position until the patrol had withdrawn to safety. On 2 Apr 45, a two coy patrol was sent to locate and destroy HQ 29 Jap Div. For four hours ANGEL led a line of natives who had been working with the enemy the previous day, through unknown country with the forward scouts, thus preventing them being ambushed. ANGEL moved with the recon party, leading them to within 15 yds of the Jap HQ. In the ensuing attack, despite intense fire from four LMGs and numerous rifles, ANGEL coolly moved forward and sniped enemy snipers from the flank, killing three. The next day a native sentry located three armed Japs in heavy pit. ANGEL rushed the position firing his rifle, dispersing the enemy and killing one. On 1 Jun 45, ANGEL observed two Japanese in a well concealed position south of MONGIMARA Mission and although under fire and at personal risk, rushed forward causing the enemy to flee and allowing the patrol to proceed without casualties. On all these occasions ANGEL displayed courage far above the call of duty and his outstanding bravery undoubtedly not only contributed to the success of the actions but was instrumental in saving life.

During the period 30 Mar 45 to 9 Apr 45, Const. DANGADANG was attached to 2/3 Aust Inf Bn, patrolling in FONGINARA Mission Area, NEW GUINEA. On 31 Mar 45, DANGADANG commanded a native patrol and located the enemy L of C which he traced for 2000 yds, in spite of it being strongly picqueted. The enemy opened fire on the patrol and DANGADANG approached the enemy, hurling two grenades and at great risk of his own life, charged and killed 3 enemy. On 3 Apr 45, his patrol prevented use of enemy L of C for 2 days and killed 6 enemy while doing so. On 5 Apr 45, DANGADANG led a platoon, unobserved, to the headwaters of FONGINARA Cr., where it ambushed 6 enemy. On 11 Apr 45, DANGADANG led a platoon and located 10 Japanese and by skillful and daring scouting found their sentries, his platoon being approximately 50 yds from the enemy position. In the ensuing attack DANGADANG, at personal risk of his life, personally killed 3 of the enemy. The patrol accounted for entire enemy force, capturing all equipment without casualties. During the whole period DANGADANG displayed courage and devotion to duty of the highest order and his bravery and skill largely contributed to clearing the enemy from that sector of the unit responsibility.
