


## 4 INF BDE TRAINING INSTRUCTION 13

HQ 4 Inf Bde (AIF)  
27 Nov 45

### GENERAL

1. This instruction covers training for the month of December. A minimum period of three (3) hours for five days a week will be devoted to Route Marching, Weapon Training, Range Practices, Section Training and Platoon Training. Units will conduct a Potential NCO's Cadre during the period.

### ROUTE MARCHES

2. Minimum strength of personnel moving out on route marches will be one company. Rigid control will be exercised at all times and troops will march to attention through all camp areas. Units desiring to move outside the Australian area will advise this Headquarters of route to be taken at least eight clear days prior to the march.

### WEAPON TRAINING

3. Training will be carried out on all infantry weapons excluding specialist weapons. Thoroughness can be achieved by intense periods interspersed with questions designed to bring out detailed knowledge of the weapon being used. Instruction on Japanese Machine Guns and Tank Turrets as detailed in this Headquarters memorandum 65/38 of 19 Nov will continue.

### RANGE PRACTICES

4. All ranks (including administrative personnel) will fire rifle, LMG and SMG practices. In order to maintain interest, competition shoots will be arranged within each unit.

### SECTION AND PLATOON TRAINING

5. It is NOT intended that this phase of training should entail long periods in the jungle. Much tactical training can be covered by lectures and short exercises in the close country adjacent to unit camp areas. It will be appreciated that many low priority troops transferred to units from other arms will require intense training to fit them to take their place in an infantry section.

### POTENTIAL NCO CADRE

6. Units will conduct a Potential NCO Cadre 3 - 22 Dec inclusive. Instruction will be from 0830K to 1600K and will NOT be interrupted because of Educational classes. Detailed syllabi will be submitted to this Headquarters by 30 Nov. All NCO's transferred from other arms will attend the unit cadre.

### SYLLABI

7. Syllabi will be submitted to this Headquarters each Saturday showing company location, subject and period.




ORGANISATION AND CONTROL OF JAPANESE GROUP CAMPS

REORGANISATION - JAPANESE FORCES

1. As from 31 Dec 45 all Japanese in the RABAU area will be concentrated into 10 Group Camps and 4 Labour Camps and will be kept underguard at all times.
2. 4 Inf Bde is responsible for six Group Camps, units responsible for providing security guards and the names of Japanese officers appointed to command the Japanese within each camp are shown in Appendix "C" attached.

COMMAND OF JAPANESE

3. As from midnight 31 Dec 45, Headquarters South Eastern Japanese Forces ceases to exist as such and command will be exercised directly by Headquarters 11 Div through the Australian Camp Commandant of each Group Camp. A Japanese officer has been appointed to command the Japanese within each Group Camp and he will be responsible only to the Australian Camp Commandant.
4. Each group camp will be commanded by an Australian Camp Commandant appointed by Headquarters 11 Div who will assume command at midnight 31 Dec 45. Notes for the guidance of Australian Camp Commandants setting out their functions and responsibilities are being issued separately. Each Australian Camp Commandant will be responsible to and deal directly with Headquarters 11 Div.

SECURITY GUARDS

5. An Australian Security Guard of strength one company (NOT less than 100 other ranks) will be allotted to each camp.
6. The guards will be under command of the Australian Camp Commandant until such time as
  - (a) A major break becomes imminent or occurs
  - (b) Clashes with Australian troops or natives become imminent or occur

When the Camp Commandant will hand over operational control of all Australian troops in the camp area to the Commander Security Guard. However the Guard Commander will be responsible at all times for the security and tactical deployment of his troops.

7. On arrival in Group Camps all weapons and ammunition now in possession of Japanese troops will be collected and handed over to the Australian Camp Commandant. No Japanese will be permitted to carry or possess firearms or explosives of any description after 31 Dec 45, and any Japanese infringing this order will be shot on sight.
8. Each compound will be patrolled by day and by night to prevent the unauthorised exit of Japanese and to detect any signs of organised outbreak.
9. A perimeter will be established (dug to weapon pit stage) providing for all round defence and all personnel including Camp Commandant and staff will be allotted an alarm post. Japanese labour will NOT be used to construct defences. The necessity for a reserve



counter attack force will NOT be overlooked. In the event of an organised outbreak the perimeter will be manned by the entire guard and will be held until reinforcements arrive

10. No member of the guard will speak to the Japanese except in the course of duty. Fraternisation or trading with the Japanese is strictly forbidden and the Guard Commander will exercise personal supervision to prevent it, and to discipline offenders.

11. A reserve of 7 days rations and ammunition (contact rates) will be maintained at each camp.

12. B Sqn 2/4 Armd Regt are remaining in Divisional reserve at present location and will maintain the following degree of readiness :-

(a) One troop ready to move at two hours notice

(b) Squadron less one troop ready to move at six hours notice

The role of the squadron will be to support the security guard at any Group Camp if required to do so, or to cooperate with other forces as ordered. The squadron will move only on orders from Headquarters 11 Div.

13. Arms and ammunition of own troops NOT being carried inside the perimeter will be under continuous guard. Personnel will carry arms and ammunition at all times when moving outside the Australian perimeter and full equipment will be worn.

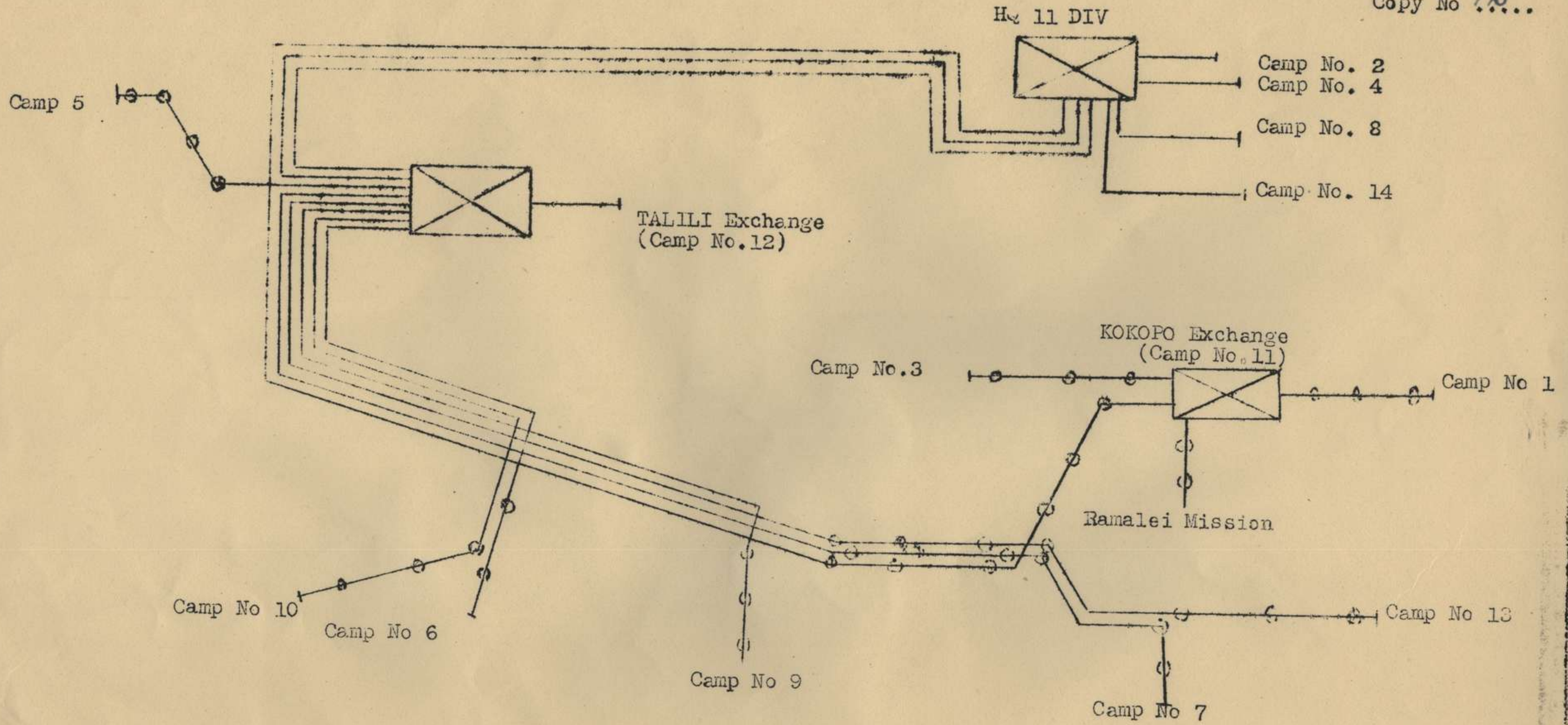

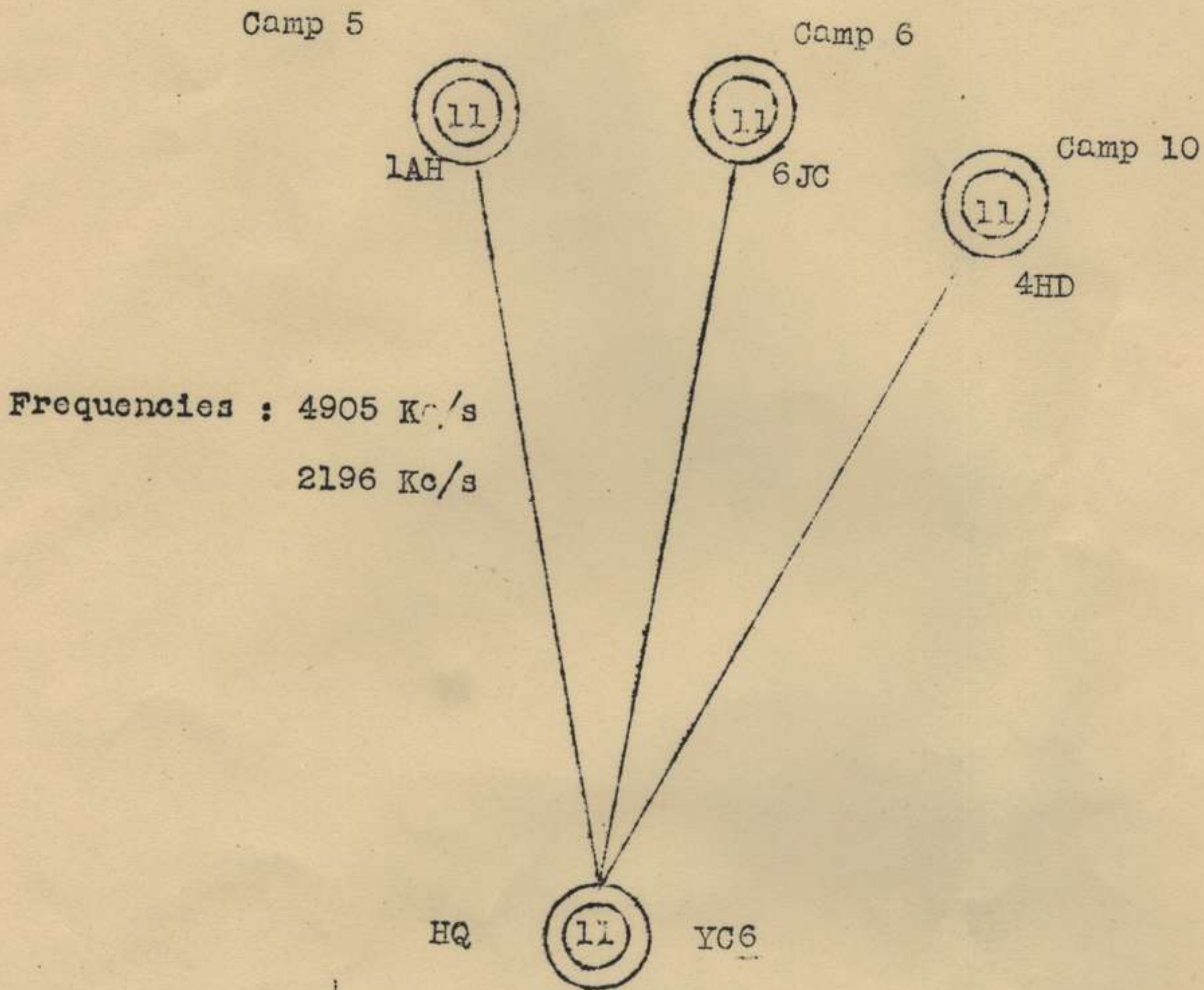


GROUP CAMP WIRELESS DIAGRAM

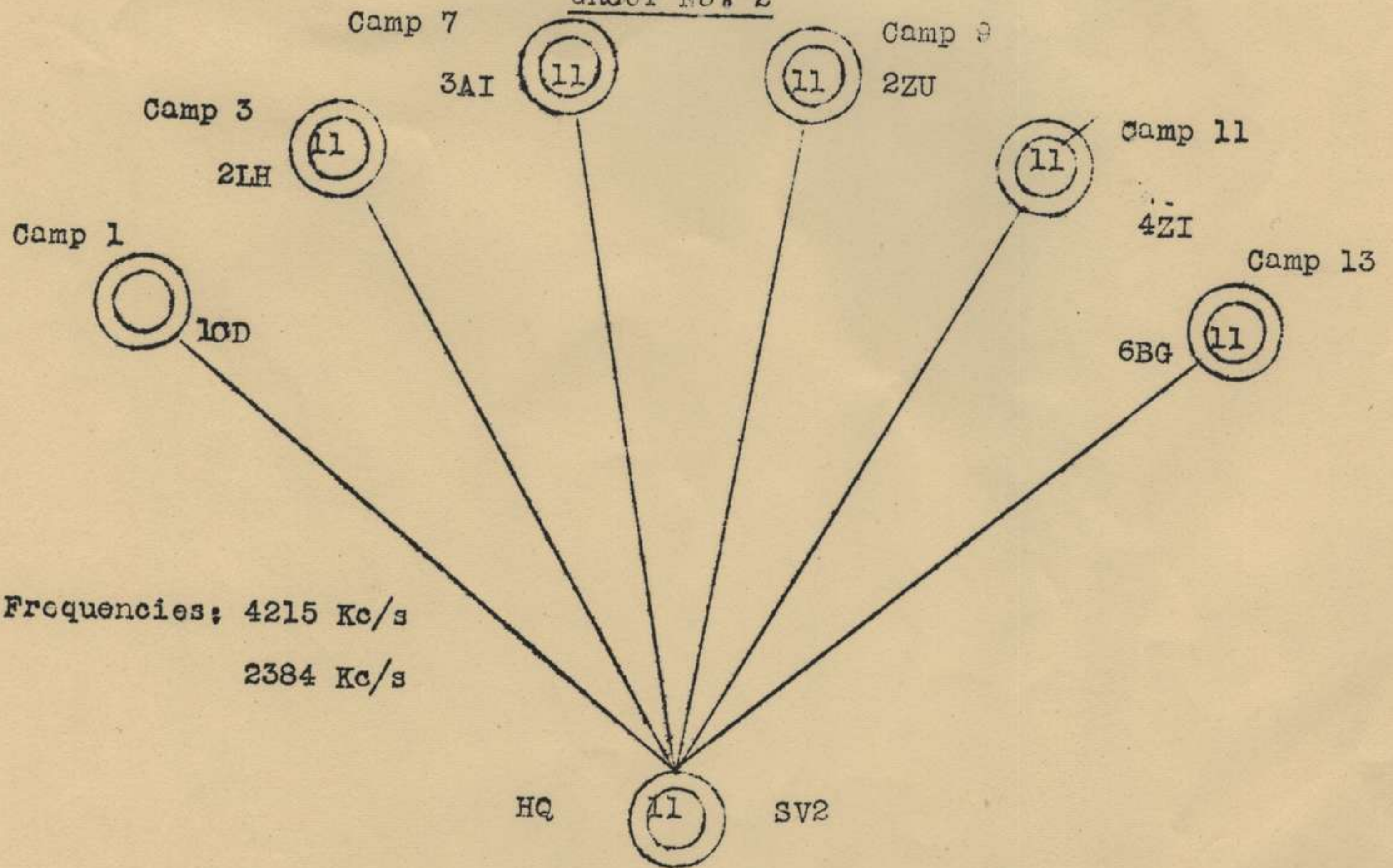

1. This order deals with Adm arrangements in connection with care of surrendered Japanese personnel in Gp Camps and rec of remaining surrendered Japanese stores, eqpt, vehs etc.
2. The order is divided into two parts namely :-

Part I - Raising of Camps Staffs.

Part II - Gen Adm Arrangements.

PART I

ORG

3. Each camp will be controlled by a Gp Camp Comd with a staff consisting of the following :-

Camp Comd (Maj or Senior Capt)

Adjt (Lt)

2 Clerks

2 Batmen

4 Gen Duties

4 Dvrs MT

Names of Offrs appointed as Gp Camp Comds and Adjts and unit responsible for provision of staffs of ORs are detailed in Appx "A".

Camp Staffs are to be distinct from Security Gds and will be organized to function independently.

SELECTION OF PERSONNEL

4. Personnel with 160 or more demob pts, other than those deferred, WILL NOT be included in either Camp Staffs or Security Gds.

DUTIES OF GP CAMP COMDS

5. (a) See Appx "A" to 11 Div Adm Instr 106 of 23 Dec 45 Issued separately to Gp Camp Comds.  
(b) Gp Camp Comds will take over comd of gp camps at midnight 31 Dec 45.

MOV

6. (a) Gp Camp Comds, Staffs and Security Gds will move to camps on following dates :-

Camps 1, 7, 13 - 30 Dec 45

Camps 3, 9, 11 - 31 Dec 45

- (b) Units will submit requests for tpt for all personnel to this HQ by 1400K hrs 26 Dec 45, together with time, place of reporting.

PART II

SUPS

7. (a) Japanese

- (i) Japanese will be responsible for maintaining themselves.
- (ii) All rations held by Japanese have been divided proportionately and delivered to Gp Camps.
- (iii) Garden areas are under cultivation adjacent to each Gp Camp. Until such time as these gardens are producing, Japanese personnel will be permitted to work present gardens.

(b) Aust

- (i) Camp Comd and Staff and Security Gd will move to respective Gp Camps with 14 days rations constituting first 7 days maint and 7 days res stocks. Units responsible for supplying Security Gd will submit indents to ASC Offr 4 Inf Bde immediately for these rations for all personnel at respective Gp Camps (incl Camp Staffs). 7 days res will NOT be consumed without approval HQ 11 Div.
- (ii) Aust Security Gd will be responsible for rationing Camp Comd and Staff.
- (iii) AASC 11 Div is est DP at VUNAPOPE for resup of Gp Camps numbers 1, 3, 7, 9, 11, 13. DP will open at times and dates to be notified. Indents for rations will be submitted to DP
- (iv) Collection of rations from DP will be responsibility of Gp Camps.
- (v) Local arrangements may be made for the purchase of fresh fruit, vegetables etc from ANGAU.

POL

8. (a) Japanese

- (i) Japanese POL has been moved to each Gp Camp for use in Japanese vehs.
- (ii) Gp Camp POL will be replenished from dump VULCAN CRATER every fourteen days. Gp Camps will submit demands for POL to VULCAN CRATER dump. Tpt from respective Gp Camps will be used.

(b) Aust

KOKOPO post at number 11 camp consisting of MO and OR. This post will be responsible for camps 1, 3, 7, 11, 13.

VUNAKANAU post at airstrip consisting of MO and OR. This post will be responsible for camp 9.

(c) Emergency Hosp Treatment

Each post is to be prepared to hold up to 10 cases in extreme emergency.

(d) Evac

Requests for evac will be made from Camps direct to responsible med post. HQ 2 Fd Amb is arranging evacs from med posts to RABAU as required.

(e) Med Sup

Med sup to camps will be from parent unit. 2 Fd Amb or med post may be called upon to sup urgent requirements.

(f) Inspection of Camps

(i) Particular attention will be paid to anti-malarial and anti-mite measures. Clothing and blankets will be treated with anti-mite fluid prior to initial move into camps and thereafter as laid down in First Army AGO Chap 16 Appx "C" and 5 Div A4747 of 19 Jul 45.

(ii) Personnel will be warned of the local reservoir of malaria in the camp. Japanese river-fever is known to exist in TAPU area.

(g) Japanese med personnel in each camp will be responsible for med attention and sup of med stores for Japanese personnel. However, as Japanese hosps in camps have varying capacities, transfer of patients between camps will be necessary from time to time and will be arranged by Aust Camp Comds on request from Japanese.

ORD

10.

(a) Provision and replacement of ord stores for Aust Security Gd personnel will be responsibility of parent unit.

(b) Indents for initial ord stores for camp Cmd and Staff will be submitted to Ede Ord Offr 4 Inf Bde by units providing Security Gd by 1800 hrs 26 Dec 45. Replacements of ord stores for Camp Cmd and Staff will be responsibility of parent unit of Security Gd.

EME

- 11. (a) 264 LAD (AIF) will provide one Mob Sec (WE II (8c)2) to be located at number 11 camp KOKOPO and be responsible for Aust vchs of Camps 1, 3, 7, 9, 11, 13. Sec will move 31 Dec 45. Will be rationed by Security Gd number 11 camp.
- (b) Japanese Forces have been instructed to provide adequate repair facilities for Japanese vchs within Gp Camps.

- (b) No amenities will be given to the Japanese.

EDUCATION

- 14. (a) No educational facilities will be made available at Gp Camps.
- (b) Approval has been given for Japanese to carry out an educational programme from within their own resources but this programme will in no way hinder the internal working of the camp, the production of foodstuffs or Aust lab parties.

PAY

- 15. (a) Under arrangements parent unit.
- (b) All bulk finance has been removed from Japanese. Only funds approved to remain in Japanese possession is that held by individuals as their own money.

POSTAL

- 16. Will be re-addressed by units and delivered to camps through AASC 11 Div. Times and places to be delivered by units will be notified later.



CANTEENS

- 17. (a) Delivery of canteen stores is to be arranged by AASC 11 Div. Times and places of delivery by units will be notified later.
- (b) Liquor will NOT be delivered to or consumed in camps. Units may draw ration for those personnel of camp staffs and security gd and retain until completion of tour of duty.

DRESS

- 18. Tps will present best possible appearance at all times. Slovenliness will NOT be tolerated.

DISCIPLINE

- 19. Gp Camp Comds and OG Security Gds will have powers only of Coy Comd, NOT those of det comd.

  - (i) On completion conc Japanese personnel surrendered Japanese stores and eqpt is to become responsibility of respective Heads of Arms and Services.
  - (ii) On recommendation of Head of Arm or Service concerned, Gp Camp Comds will be instructed to conc stores in question. Provision of necessary tpt and lab will be responsibility of HQ 11 Div.

- (b) Tpt

All surrendered Japanese vchs and wksp eqpt will have been moved Gp Camps by 31 Dec 45. Disposal instrs later.




