
Subject :- CANTEEN.



OBITUARY - NX 65738 SGT. GIBSON R.H.

The 2/19 Bn. was grieved to hear of the tragic death of our Bandmaster, Sgt. A.H. Gibson, who has been with us since November, 1940.

Sgt. Gibson accompanied the 2/19 Bn. Advance Party down to Singapore Island to prepare for the arrival of our sister units of the Division. During the days preceding their arrival Sgt. Gibson was attached to the 2nd Gordons for rations and during that time endeared himself to the members of the Sgts. Mess. His words of praise in regard to the hospitality shown to him speak eloquently of the warmth of his reception.

After an unfortunate accident Sgt. Gibson passed away at 5.15 P.M. on Sunday night, 17 Aug 41. The funeral which was very impressive showed the esteem in which he was held.

The C.O. of the 2nd Gordons showed the sincere sympathy of the Bn. by providing both the Brass Band and Pipe Band. The whole of the Sgts. Mess who were available attended the funeral. The escort and firing party were provided by an Australian Bn. for whose arrival Sgt. Gibson had helped to prepare. The Bearers were 7 Officers of the 22 Bde. and 27 Bde. A number of personnel of his own unit who were in Singapore were also in attendance and were led by Brig. D.S. Maxwell, who was the C.O. of Sgt. Gibson's Unit until very recently promoted. The hearse was covered with wreaths of orchids, frangipani and gladioli sent by Brig. Maxwell, Sgts. Mess, - Gordon Highlanders, 2nd Gordon Highlander Bn., Col. Anderson, the Band and 2/19 Bn. The coffin was draped with the Union Jack and the deceased's hat, belt and sidearms were on top of the cask.

The procession moved up Serangoon Rd. to No.1 Gate of Bidadari Cemetery in the following order:-

- The escort.
- Firing party
- Pipe Band
- Brass Band
- Deceased - the Pall bearers alongside.
- A.I.F. Personnel
- Gordon Highlanders.

The Brass Band played a funeral march. The procession marched along the road in slow time. The road was lined by people of all nationalities Europeans, Soldiers, Naval ~~officers~~ personnel, Chinese, Indians and Malays of all classes and creeds. The procession halted at the main gates.

The escort then lined the entrance roads of the cemetery. The firing party halted and presented arms while the deceased was being removed from the hearse. Both bands passed through the escort and counter marched on a side path. The procession then moved through the cemetery in the following order:-

- Officiating Clergyman - Padre McNeal, A.I.F.
- Deceased.
- Mourners.
- Firing Party.
- Bands.

The cortege moved through the cemetery of which this particular portion is filled with other brave men whose lives have been given for their country.

At the grave the Padre took up his position at the head, the officer-bearers on each side, the firing party on the right, the mourners on the left, the pipe band and brass band at the foot.

The ceremony at the grave-side was dignified and impressive. After the clergyman had completed his service and committed the body to the earth, the NCO in charge of the firing party gave the command to load, present and fire. The pipe band then played, "Points of War". The firing party re-loaded, presented and fired again. The pipe band and drums again played "Points of War". The firing party fired a third volley and the pipe band completed playing "Points of War". The firing party then fixed bayonets and presented arms. Massed buglers from the 2/Gordon Highlanders then played, "The Last Post". The Pipe Major played a lament, "Loch of Bard" which brought tears to everyone's eyes. The massed buglers then played "Reveille" and thus completed the impressive ceremony of committing the dust of a fine soldier to the earth whence it came.

His mortal remains rest in the company of other soldiers of all arms who have helped to keep our country secure in this strange land. His spirit will live on in the Unit where he was loved and in the hearts of those whom he left behind in Australia.

The heart-felt sympathy of the Bn. is extended to his wife and family in this time of stress and bereavement.



1. TENT POLES, PEG BAGS ETC. ARE NOT TO BE USED AS MATS ETC. ALL TENTS AND TENT COVERS ARE A LEDGER CHARGE AND MUST BE ACCOUNTED FOR, THEY WILL BE COLLECTED AND RETURNED TO R.Q.M.S. STORE TO-DAY 5 SEP. 41.
2. BATHING. The troughs in ablution places are NOT to be used for swimming. Personnel will bathe Native fashion, that is by standing outside the trough and ~~not~~ dipping water from the trough and pouring it over themselves. Any person found in the trough will be the subject of disciplinary action. Pioneer Pl. will prepare a notice to this effect and affix one in each ablution place.
3. RUBBISH. Rubbish will be removed from messing areas twice daily and will be buried in holes prepared by a fitigue party in charge of Pte. J. Lynch, HQ Coy. Rubbish will NOT be buried in the camp area.
4. Coys. will proceed immediately to tidy ~~and~~ up and drain Coy. Lines. They will be prepared to supply working parties at any time.
5. LATRINES. Coys. have been instructed re digging and maintaining trench latrines until the correct latrine accommodation is available; strict attention will be paid to this duty; fouling the ground will be considered a serious offence.
6. PIG SWILL. Pig swill will be buried with other rubbish twice daily until arrangements are made with a contractor to remove same from lines.
7. MEDICAL. B Coy 2/9 Fd. Amb. will form CRS at MERSING as soon as practicable after their arrival. (Bde. Movement Order No. 1)
8. WATER. (a) Drinking- At KLUANG town water sup. is available and is suitable for all purposes. At new locations drinking water will be drawn only from pts. marked "DRINKING". Drinking from natural water-courses and ponds is forbidden.
At SEDILLY BOOM a well is located which is unsuitable for drinking. All water for drinking purposes will be drawn from KOTA TINGGI and delivered to MAWAI for transportation in pakhals to BEDILLI BOOM. Until 2/9 Fd. Amb. is established at KOTA TINGGI this will be the responsibility of 2/18 Bn.
Only 4 Gals. per man per day are available for drinking and cooking. Strict economy will therefore be observed. (Bde. Mov. Order No. 1)
- (b) ABLUTIONS. All ranks will have to do their ablutions Indian fashion, i.e. dip out from the trough and stand well away from the trough whilst soaping. Every care must be taken not to foul the water for subsequent users. The the time being units will be prepared to do their own washing. (Bde. Mov. Order. No. 1)
9. SANITATION. Asiatic type of latrine will be used for the time being where available. Otherwise trenches will be dug. (Bde. Mov. Order. No. 1)
Waste food will be buried as deep as the presence of water will permit.
10. UNIT SIGNS. Pioneers will prepare the following unit signs-
Drinking Water Ablution pts. Waste food pts.
Washing pts. Latrines. (Bde. Mov. Order. No. 1)
11. MALARIA. The new area is not yet entirely protected against Malazia, although work is being expedited. Anti-malarial precautions will therefore, be strictly enforced. Special attention must be paid to dress. Trousers and sleeves will be turned down between dusk and dawn and in shaded areas such as rubber plantations between 1630 hrs. and 0800 hrs.

MALAYA COMMAND INSTRUCTIONS REGARDING THE USE OF FORCE BY GUARDS AND SENTRIES.

The following copy of C.R.M.C. No.34460/1 (G) is forwarded for information:-

1. The following instructions apply to all military guards posted over fixed armament, defence works and installations, magazines, military headquarters and government or war department buildings (E.G. Govt. House and General Officer Commanding's Resident).
2. The duty of sentry and guard is to protect and prevent interference with the work or building over which the guard is mounted; in addition it is the duty of a sentry to summon the guard immediately he considers it is necessary to do so.
3. Sentries will normally be armed with a rifle with which to defend their persons and the installation, building or guard over which they are mounted; but there are occasions where a sentry can fulfill his role better if he is lightly equipped and armed only with a heavy stick. A sentry armed with rifle and bayonet will normally have his bayonet fixed.
4. (1) The Penal Code of the Colony confers on all persons including a sentry (or any other soldier) the legal right at all times to use force if it is necessary to defend his own body or the body of any other person against an offence affecting the human body. This right of defence also extends to the use of force in the defence of property against theft, robbery, mischief, criminal trespass or attempts at any of these.

(ii)(a) A person commits mischief when he with intent to cause or knowing that he is likely to cause wrongful loss or damage to the public or any person, causes the destruction of any property, or any such change in any property, or in the situation thereof, as destroys or diminishes its value or utility, or affects it injuriously.
(b) A person commits criminal trespass when he enters into or upon property in the possession of another with intent to commit an offence or to intimidate, insult or annoy any person in possession of such property; or having lawfully entered into or upon such property; unlawfully remains there with intent thereby to intimidate, insult or annoy any such person or with intent to commit an offence.
5. The right of defence extends to causing death:-
(a) When there is an assault causing reasonable fear of death or grievous hurt;
(b) when there is an assault with intent to kidnap or abduct;
(c) when it is absolutely necessary in order to defend property against robbery, housebreaking by night, or mischief by fire, or attempts at any of these.
6. The right of defence extends to causing harm other than death:-
(a) when the threatened offence does not cause fear of death or grievous hurt, and
(b) when the offence - or attempt - against property is theft, mischief or criminal trespass not of such a character as to cause fear of death or grievous hurt.
7. In no case does the right of defence of person or property extend to the inflicting of more harm than is necessary to inflict for the purpose of defence.
8. A sentry is at all times subject to the provisions of paras 4,5,6 and 7 above. His powers of defence, however, are reasonably wide and in exercising this right he is "not expected to weigh in golden scales the minimum force necessary for his protection".

/9.....

9. The preceding paragraphs summarize the legal rights of guards and sentries to use force in the execution of their duties. The following paragraphs contain the definite orders which authorise guards and sentries once posted, to act in defence of their charge.

10. The following instructions will be observed by sentries²-

- (a) Any person approaching a post will be challenged-
"HALT, WHO GOES THERE" and "BERENTI" (The latter being the Malay word for "stop".)

The sentry must be perfectly certain that his challenge is given in the loudest possible manner, so that even those who may be dull of hearing can have the chance of responding - "FRIEND".
(or giving some similar indication regarding his identity.)

- (b) A person having responded to the challenge in this way is expected to remain halted. The sentry will then call out -

"ADVANCE ONE - TO BE RECOGNISED"

"SATU ORANG MARI" (Malay for "One man come here").

By "one" one person is meant. If the party challenged comprises more than one person, the sentry will repeat this order for each member of the party and only one will advance in response to this order. If the credentials of the person who approaches the post are in order, he will be allowed to pass but if not he will be detained and the guard turned out.

- (c) If a person who is challenged under (a) does not halt, he will then be challenged again by the sentry -

"HALT, OR IF FIRE".

"BERENTI, KALAU TIDAK SAYA TEMBAK" (Malay for "Stop. If not I fire.")

- (d) If a person does not halt after this warning, he will be challenged once again in the same manner. If he does not halt and if no means are available to stop him, it is then the duty of the sentry to use his rifle and shoot - aiming low to hit but not to kill. The sentry must remember that it is his duty to stop a person from advancing further should he fail to respond to the challenge and warning.

- (e) If a person can be stopped in any other way, for example, by calling to the guard to assist, then the sentry will not shoot. The sentry must use his intelligence and sense of responsibility to decide whether he will shoot or not.

- (f) At night or in a thick fog, a sentry must not allow himself to be rushed and he must be well on the alert, more so than in the daylight, and ready to take such action as is necessary to prevent any person who refuses to respond to his challenge and warning from approaching his sentry post further.

- (g) During daylight, when the actions of intruders can be clearly seen, or during darkness when there is no shadow of doubt that damage is about to be done, sentries and guards are entitled without waiting to challenge, to use every endeavour (including in the last resort shooting to kill) to prevent death or grievous hurt, robbery, housebreaking by night or mischief by fire. These orders empower them to act in such circumstances.

11. (a) All sentries and all members of the guard will carry 5 (five) rds. of S.A.A. in the magazine of their rifle but none in the chamber.

(b) At all times sentries must be provided with an effective means of summoning the guard, by bell, whistle or some other means.

(c) When lighting is inadequate, every sentry must be provided with an electric torch. A sentry should normally post himself where he can see without being seen.

12. The above forms of challenge by sentries supersede those laid down in the Manual of Elementary Drill (All Arms) where they are at variance with the above.

13. COMMANDING OFFICERS WILL ENSURE THAT ALL GUARDS ARE AWARE OF THE PROVISIONS OF PARAGRAPHS 2 to 7 AND THAT THE PROVISIONS OF PARAGRAPH 10 ARE EMBODIED IN "ORDERS FOR GUARDS".

2. CLEANLINESS OF LINES. Coys. are responsible for the cleanliness of their own lines, messh huts, cookhouses, field latrines and the vicinity thereof. Transport will visit lines and cookhouses twice daily for the collection of rubbish etc. Coys. are responsible for washing out rubbish bins thoroughly after emptying. Rubbish will not be buried within camp area. Newspapers will NOT be placed in garbage bins but will be burned under Coy. arrangements.

The Sanitary Cpl. of the week will be responsible for the cleaning of permanent latrines, ablution places and the camp area outside Coy. lines. Duty Coy. will detail one NCO and 6 ORs to report to Sanitary Cpl. at Bn. HQ at 0815 hrs. daily.

All ranks will be warned of the necessity of latrine cleanliness, lowering of lids after use etc.

3. HOSPITALS. Personnel admitted to KLUANG Hospital will take only towel pyjamas, shaving gear, eating utensils, tooth brush, comb, writing paper. No clothing other than that worn on admittance will be taken. Balance of clothing and equipment will be stores by CQMS.

2. PERSONNEL CONVEYED IN M.T. Cases have occurred of personnel standing up when being conveyed in vans or lorries. This practice is prohibited and disciplinary action will be taken against offenders. (Bde.RO 80)

3. PAYBOOKS. (a) All ranks must take special care of their paybooks to prevent loss. (b) Comds. will take disciplinary action against the owner in the event of loss of paybook, unless such owner establishes that the loss was due to circumstances beyond his control and also that he took all possible care of his paybook. (c) The appropriate charge is "Neglecting to obey a Routine Order in that he at.....on.....failed to take proper care of his Paybook and lost it, contrary to AIF Malaya Routine Order No.46, para 6 (AA 11)." (Bde. R.O. 80)

4. ORDNANCE CLOTHING AND EQUIPMENT. Ordnance clothing and equipment has been offered for sale in places near military camps. Units will ensure by frequent kit inspections and checks in stores that any leakages are stopped. (Bde. RO 80)

5. MT VEHICLES. No MT vehicles will leave the Administrative Area without first obtaining approval from Bde. HQ.

6. TRAFFIC CONTROL POST. A traffic control has been posted at Kota Tinggi Bridge to check all vehicles proceeding to Singapore.

7. NOMENCLATURE. As from 4 Sep 41 22 Bde.Coy AASC will be known as No.1 AASC Coy" and 27 Bde Coy AASC will be known as "No.2 AASC Coy" (Bde. RO 81)

8. "X" LIST AND EVACUATION OF PERSONNEL AND REINFORCEMENTS. With the establishment of the General Base Depot, the following procedure will be adopted in connection with compilation of Strength Returns (AFW 3008 and 3009) and evacuation of personnel.

(a) Personnel evacuated from their units on medical grounds beyond R.A.P. will be placed on "X" list and struck off the strength of their units and will be immediately replaceable by reinforcements.

(b) Such personnel on "X" List will on discharge from hospital proceed to either 2 Con Depot or General Base Depot, except in the case of personnel being discharged from either A.D.S. or M.D.S. who will, at the discretion of the Medical Officer in charge, be returned direct to their units. 9. MEDICALLY RECLASSIFIED PERSONNEL. (a) Personnel reclassified as Permanently Unfit for service on discharge from Medical establishments, will be transferred to General Base Depot and held ready for embarkation on short notice. (b) Personnel in postings open to Class 1 Personnel only, but classified as Fit for Duties other than Active-Service in Field Formation, will be transferred to General Base Depot. General Base Depot will post such personnel to a pool pending appointment to suitable postings. (c) Other cases will be referred to HQ AIF for instructions. (Bde RO 81)

10. DENTAL TREATMENT. Dental Treatment shall include extractions, scaling of teeth, prophylaxis, fillings (root, amalgum and carent), treatment of pyorrhoea and the supply, replacement and repair, of vulcanite dentures. The new locations in which units are or will be situated, has greatly increased the danger of malaria. The strictest enforcement of all anti-malarial measures is essential.

It should be emphasized to all ranks that each case of infection provides a further source of infection of others, and renders the task of Malarial prevention increasingly difficult. It should be brought home to each individual that it is not only his own individual health that is at stake, but the health of all his comrades.

An undue incidence of Malaria reduces the efficiency of the unit as a whole, and casts a reflection on discipline and leadership, and whilst it is realised that in certain areas some incidence of Malaria may occur, any attitude which takes Malaria for granted would be fatal to the well-being of the forces.

Such circumstances call for vigour and initiative to combat the danger.

RED CROSS POSTAL MESSAGE SCHEME :-Arrangements have been made by the British Red Cross Society and Order of St. John of Jerusalem for ~~twenty~~ twenty two word messages for friends and relations in enemy, or enemy occupied territory, including Germany, Austria, Czecho-slovakia, German occupied Poland, Norway, Denmark, Holland, Belgium, Italy, the Channel Islands and occupied France, to be despatched by the Red Cross Postal message scheme at Red Cross Postal Message Bureaux. The nearest Bureaux to Malaya are as follows:-
Australia- Australian Red Cross Society Spring St, Melbourne.
Burma- Burma Red Cross Society, Office of Director of Public Health Burma Secretariat.
India- Indian Red Cross Society. 20 Talkatora Rd. New Delhi.
The following are extracts from a circular letter issued from the War Office.
"You should bring or send a copy of your message, clearly written in block capitals, to the Bureau and the workers will transcribe it on to official forms. Do not write more than twenty words, excluding the name and address of the addressee.
If possible write in English, French, German or Italian. If the addressee does not understand one of these languages you may write in Norwegian, Danish, Dutch or Polish with an English translation. If possible, written underneath.
Give full name and address of the person to whom you are writing. Enclose an envelope with your name and address so that Bureau can forward reply to you.
Enclosed one shilling postal note which will cover cost of message and reply. Do not feel unduly anxious if you do not receive an answer for some time. Postal communications are very delayed and are liable to be suspended altogether from time to time.

2. SECURITY. The attention of all ranks will be drawn to M.R. Para 547 (a) which states:-

"An officer or soldier is forbidden to publish in any form whatever, or communicate, either directly or indirectly, to the Press, any military information, or his views on any military subject, without special authority; and he will be held responsible for all statements contained in communications to his friends which may subsequently be published in the Press or otherwise."

Regulations for the Army in India, Rule 333, also refers. (Bde. RO 85 para 5.)

3. POSTAL. Postal Cpl. has a supply of surcharged envelopes for use with Air Mail envelopes. Owing to shortage of stamps, the Post Office is unable to supply 25 cent stamps and all ranks will have to use these envelopes.

Local Mail. Postal Regulations prescribe that letters addressed to any part of Malaya, other than colonies forming part of the S.S. shall have postage stamps affixed. The rate is 8 cents per ounce.

- (d) Use of disinfectants.
- (e) Dryness of all areas.
- (f) Cleanliness, disinfection and rigid sanitation discipline in all latrines.

The climatic conditions of this area would make an outbreak of dysentery a disaster to the force. Care and cleanliness of all camps will prevent such a disaster."

7. INCOMPLETE ADDRESSES ON CABLES TO AUSTRALIA. The cable Coy. complains that many cables addressed to towns and capital cities in Australia are delayed because the sender omits to add the name of the suburb as well as the street address.
