

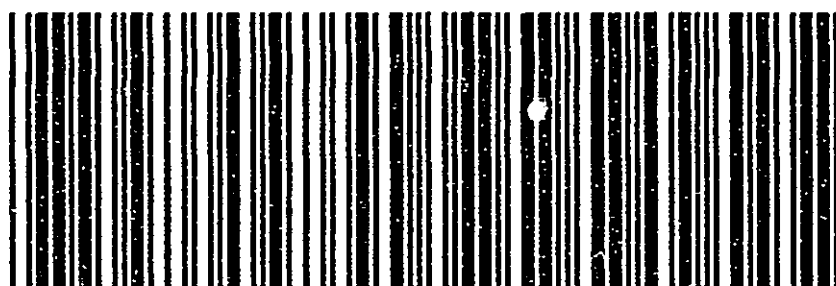

1. Approval has been given for the expansion of % HQs 7 and 8 Aust Base Sub Areas to full Type D establishments (WE IV/BE/2).
2. 1 Aust Base Sub Area will take action to effect the reorganization in accordance with instructions given hereunder.
3. Personnel
 - (a) Officers.
 - (i) Officers named in Appendix 'A' hereto will be detached from present posting and attached, as indicated, to HQs 7 and 8 Aust Base Sub Areas.
 - (ii) Recommendations have been submitted to LHQ for the appointment of such officers with the exception of NML2671 Maj J F BLAXLAND and VX4334 Capt J O TAIT who will be temporarily attached pending appointment by LHQ of officers to fill appointments.
 - (iii) LHQ has been requested to appoint officers to the remaining vacancies consequent upon the reorganization.
 - (b) Other Ranks.
 - (i) VX71506 S/Sjt W F WAINMAN and NML65570 S/Sjt K PROENSKIRE are to be detached from present unit to HQs 7 & 8 Aust Base Sub Areas respectively pending appointment by LHQ of Education Officers(Lt).
 - (ii) The remainder of the ORs named on the attached Appendix will be transferred as directed therein.
 - (iii) Additional other rank personnel to complete to WE will be posted to units by Det 2 Aust Adv 2 Ech as and when suitable unallotted personnel become available.
4. Equipment
 - (a) Personnel transferred will move with personal arms and equipment
 - (b) Portion of the additional vehicles will be provided by the transfer of eight (8) trucks $\frac{1}{2}$ ton 4x4 from HQ 1 Aust Base Sub Area in equal proportions to HQs 7 & 8 Aust Base Sub Areas. Balance of vehicles will be released by Ord when available.
 - (c) HQ 1 Aust Base Sub Area will ensure that vehicles transferred are in first class condition complete with VOL.
 - (d) HQ 1 Aust Base Sub Area will provide additional unit equipment where practicable and balance of requirements will be submitted to Adv LHQ.

5. Movement of personnel and equipment where not already effected, will be arranged forthwith.

6. (a) It is desired that where possible the additional commitment arising from the expansion of HQs 7 & 8 Aust Base Sub Areas be provided from HQ 1 Aust Base Sub Area.
- (b) Therefore no replacement of officers transferred from HQ 1 Aust Base Sub Area will be made without the approval of Adv LHQ.
- (c) Vacancies caused by transfer of other rank personnel will be shown on AFs W.3009 as not required except where replacement is considered by HQ 1 Aust Base Sub Area to be essential.
- (d) Vehicles released by HQ 1 Aust Base Sub Area will not be replaced except under authority of Adv LHQ.
7. (a) Adv LHQ AQ 231.311 of 9 May 45 approving the forming of B det 1 Aust Base Sub Area to be attached to HQ 8 Aust Base Sub Area is cancelled.
- (b) Personnel comprising B det 1 Aust Base Sub Area who are not disposed of in accordance with para 3 hereof will be returned to parent unit.
8. (a) HQ 1 Aust Base Sub Area will advise Adv LHQ when the reorganisation of 7 & 8 Base Sub Areas has been completed.
- (b) For purposes of implementing this instruction HQ 1 Aust Base Sub Area may communicate direct with HQs 7 & 8 Aust Base Sub Areas.

Adv LHQ Administrative Instruction No. 47

Subject : Disposal of Enemy PW.

1. The procedure to be followed with regard to captured enemy PW is set out hereunder:
2. Separate instructions have been issued by DMI regarding the interrogation of enemy PW and the disposal of enemy documents.

Personnel to be classified as PW

3. (a) All captured members of the armed forces and camp followers of the enemy, whether Japanese, Koreans, or Formosans.
- (b) Captured natives regarded as hostile will NOT be classified as PW. They will be entirely segregated from PW and held in custody until handed over to either the appropriate British or Dutch authority.

PW Classification

4. At cages and hospitals PW will be classified by an ATIS representative as :-

Category A - PW having immediate operational significance.

Category B, C and D - PW with information of decreasing intelligence significance.

Accommodation

5. Pending evacuation PW will be held in a PW cage or, if necessary in hospital. Normally the cage will be controlled by the appropriate Base Sub Area.

Rations

6. PW will be issued with rations in accordance with the PW scale as set out in Appendix 'A' to this instruction.

Documentation

7. On arrival at PW cages, or, if admitted first to hospital at hospital PW will be registered with identification numbers allotted consecutively by the Det 2 Aust Adv 2 Ech in the respective area.
8. The following documents will be prepared and disposed of as shown for each PW arriving at a cage or hospital :

<u>Document</u>	<u>Disposal</u>
(a) AF W.3000 (Descriptive report and personal particulars of PW)	Part 1 - always accompanies PW Part 2 - units will forward to appropriate Det 2 Aust Adv 2 Ech in the respective area.
(b) AAF A.113 (Casualty return of PW)	Two copies will be forwarded to the relevant Det 2 Aust Adv 2 Ech, be serially numbered and be rendered for PW marching in, evacuation to Australia, and to and from hospital.

9. If time does not permit the compilation and rendition of the abovementioned forms, such data will be obtained from the PW on his arrival at MOROTAI. It is not the function of ATIS personnel to compile these records. If the documents referred to in para 7 above are not available full personal particulars and casualties affecting PW will be rendered in the most suitable manner.

Evacuation

10. (a) PW will be evacuated from the objective area to MOROTAI when returning shipping is available.
- (b) Category 'A' PW referred to in para 4 may be evacuated by more expeditious means to MOROTAI.
- (c) Sick and wounded PW may be evacuated by hospital ships.

Escorts and Nominal Rolls

11. (a) Escorts will be provided by the respective Base Sub Areas.
- (b) Field Security personnel will act as escort for important PW to ensure that they are sent back for interrogation as soon as possible, and act as escort during interrogation of PW by intelligence officers (vide LHQ Intelligence Instruction No. 3, para 6, (vii) (c) (i) and (ii)).
- (c) A nominal roll in duplicate, showing identification numbers, ranks and names will accompany all PW being evacuated. AF W.3000 Part 1 will be attached. Duplicate copy of the nominal roll will be receipted by the receiving authority and handed to OC escort. A further copy of the nominal roll will be forwarded to ATIS Adv Ech 1 Aust Corps.

Disposal of PWs Personal Effects

12. (a) PW will be permitted to retain in their possession personal effects after an examination of them by a representative of the Field Security Service or an Intelligence Officer.
- (b) Personal effects of sick and wounded enemy PW will, normally, after an examination of them by a representative of the Field Security Service or an Intelligence Officer, accompany the PW to the medical unit to which he is evacuated.
- (c) If the action indicated in para 12 (b) above is not practicable, the effects will be made up into a package, securely fastened, sealed and labelled with an AF W.11 (wounded enemy effects) and despatched to the medical unit to which the PW has been evacuated, if known.

Medical Arrangements

13. (a) A medical inspection of all PW will be made at the earliest opportunity, and invariably before evacuation from the area in which captured, for the following diseases - Smallpox, Plague, Epidemic-Typhus, Cholera and Yellow Fever. If any of these diseases are present, a report to Adv LHQ by signal will be made immediately. PW suffering from any of these diseases will be isolated and retained pending further instructions from Adv LHQ.

13. Cont'd

- (b) As soon as possible after arrival at MOROTAI each PW will be medically examined thoroughly and a clinical and laboratory test made for the following diseases -- Dysentery, Typhoid Fever, TB, Leprosy, Leishmaniasis, VD, Helminthiasis and Leptospirosis.
14. The Base Sub Area in which PW are concentrated for movement will ensure that all PW are vaccinated against Smallpox before movement to the mainland of Australia. AF W.3000 Part 1 will be endorsed accordingly and will be signed by a medical officer.
15. PW will sleep under mosquito nets at all times and will be given 0.01 gms Plasmoquine thrice daily for three days under medical supervision, followed after one day's interval by suppressive atobrin 0.1 gms twice daily for 7 days and once daily thereafter.
16. Owing to the risk of dysentery infections, sanitation arrangements will be closely supervised during transit. All cases of diarrhoea will be referred at once to the appropriate medical authority.
17. If a PW is placed on the dangerously or seriously ill lists telegraphic advice will be forwarded to the appropriate Det 2 Aust Adv 2 Ech, with a weekly telegraphic progress report until the PW is removed from these lists.

Spiritual Welfare

18. Chaplains at hospitals through which PW are passing will be informed of any PW who are Christians. If a Christian PW is placed on SI or DI list, the appropriate Chaplain will be sent for as soon as possible.

Deaths and Burials

19. In the event of death, suitable arrangements for burial will be made by a representative of the War Graves Service. A Christian PW will be given a Christian burial. In the case of PW of Japanese native religious beliefs, opportunity will be given to other Japanese PW who are available to conduct a religious ceremony of the Cult professed by the deceased PW. Deaths subsequent to capture will be reported by signal to the appropriate Det 2 Aust Adv 2 Ech in the respective area.

Notification

20. (a) As at 0600 hrs each Saturday a report will be submitted by a formation or Base Sub Area holding PW to Adv LHQ as follows:
- PW Report (Date)
- (i) Number received at cage or hospital since previous report
(ii) Deaths
(iii) Number transferred to MOROTAI
(iv) Number transferred to BRISBANE
- Example: "PW Report 10 Jun (first) 5 (second) 1
(third) 10 (fourth) Nil."
- (b) In the event of no change in numbers during the week the signal report will be in the following form:
"PW Report 10 Jun - No Change."
- (c) HQ 7 and 8 Base Sub Areas will notify the evacuation of PW in the following manner - by message to 1 Aust Base Sub Area repeated for information to Adv LHQ.

Subject : Reception of PW and Civilians recovered
from the Enemy

GENERAL

1. (a) As operations in the SWPA extend further into enemy occupied territory it is to be expected that from time to time numbers of PW and civilians will be recovered from the enemy and come into the hands of the AMF.
- (b) Amendments No 3 of 24 May 45 to 1 Aust Corps Admin Orders Nos 4 and 5 outline the procedure to be followed on the recovery of PW and Civilians in forward areas.
- (c) 1 Aust Corps Amendments No 3 will be read in conjunction with this Admin Instruction.

EVACUATION TO MOROTAI

2. (a) Australian, British and Indian PW
All recovered Australian, British and Indian PW will be evacuated to MOROTAI by shipping or aircraft as soon as possible.
- (b) Allied PW
Allied PW will be evacuated to MOROTAI by the means set out in para 2(a) above, only if requested by the respective authorities controlling them.
- (c) Civilians
 - (i) Unless the Operational Commander in any special cases directs a civilian to remain, or approves of him remaining in the area of recovery, Australian and British civilians will be evacuated to MOROTAI by the means set out in para 2 (a) above.
 - (ii) If the respective authorities controlling them so request, similar action will be taken in respect of Allied Civilians.
- (d) A medical inspection of all recovered PW and civilians will be made prior to their evacuation from the area in which they are recovered for the following diseases : -
Smallpox, Plague, Epidemic-Typhus, Cholera and Yellow Fever.
If any of these diseases are present a report to Adv LHQ by signal will be made immediately. Recovered PW and civilians suffering from any of these diseases will be isolated and retained in the objective area pending further instructions from Adv LHQ.
- (e) Draft Conducting Officers and NCOs
A Draft Conducting Officer or NCO from the recovered PW will be appointed for each evacuation, and he will have in his possession a complete nominal roll of all recovered personnel in his draft, together with separate complete or partly completed interrogation pro forma set out in Appendix 'A' hereto for each recovered personnel. The draft conducting officer or NCO will be responsible for closely supervising sanitary arrangements during transit.

2. Cont'd...

(f) Advice of Movement

Signal advice will be sent to Adv LHQ and 1 Aust Base Sub-Area concerning each separate movement of the abovementioned personnel to MOROTAI, and such advice will include expected date of departure, expected date of arrival at MOROTAI, numbers, composition and medical categories of those concerned.

- (g) During the assault phase 1 Aust Corps will be responsible for the movement of PW and Civilians from the operational area and thereafter responsibility will pass to Base Sub areas.

RECEPTION

3. 1 Aust Base Sub Area will be responsible for arranging the reception of all recovered personnel evacuated to MOROTAI and for their subsequent marching in to 1 Aust PW and Internee Reception Unit or admission to hospital, if required, in the MOROTAI area.

LOCAL ADMINISTRATION

4. 1 Aust PW and Internee Reception Unit will be under command of 1 Aust Base Sub Area for local administration from the date of arrival at MOROTAI.

GENERAL FUNCTIONS OF 1 AUST PW AND INTERNEE RECEPTION UNIT

5. 1 Aust PW and Internee Reception Unit will be responsible for arranging -
- (a) Reception at unit lines.
 - (b) Medical examination as provided in para 7 of this order and additional medical attention and hospitalisation where necessary.
 - (c) Modification and amplification of nominal rolls.
 - (d) Augmenting of clothing, and special issues where necessary in accordance with the provisions of para 9 of GRO 112/45.
 - (e) Liaison with Naval and Airforce authorities in connection with the issue of clothing and equipment to recovered RN, RAN, RAF and RAAF personnel.
 - (f) Accommodation and rationing and, where necessary, the issuing of special rations as directed by medical authorities. The issue of rations to recovered Indian Army personnel will be on the scale set out in Appendix 'E'.
 - (g) Special philanthropic and Red Cross issues.
 - (h) Pay, postal, amenities and canteen facilities.
 - (i) An Enquiry Bureau to furnish information concerning pay, uniforms, service chevrons, medals, and generally to assist the recovered personnel to inform themselves of world developments during their period of captivity.

INTERROGATION.

6. (a) Intelligence Interrogation

At the request of Intelligence Branch Adv LHQ, 1 Aust PW and Internee Reception Unit will make recovered personnel available for interrogation as required.

- (b) Adjutant General's Branch Interrogation

1 Aust PW and Internee Reception Unit, with the assistance of attached officers, will complete and amplify the interrogation of recovered personnel in the terms set out-

6. (b) Cont'd ...

- (i) in Appendix 'A' hereto - Personal history and particulars of treatment during period in enemy custody ;
- (ii) in Appendix 'B' hereto - Particulars of pay of Aust PW during period in enemy custody ;
- (iii) in Appendix 'D' hereto - Particulars known relating to other PW or British and Australian civilians in enemy custody.

MEDICAL ARRANGEMENTS

7. 1 Aust PW and Internee Reception Unit will arrange as soon as possible after arrival at MOROTAI for all recovered personnel to be thoroughly medically examined and a clinical and laboratory test made for the following diseases : - Dysentery, Typhoid Fever, T B, Leprosy, Leishmaniasis, V D, Helminthiasis and Leptospirosis.

PAY ARRANGEMENTS - Service Personnel and Merchant Seamen

8. (a) Members of the Armed Forces of the British Commonwealth (including members of the RAN, AMP and RAAF) and Merchant Seamen PW recovered from the Japanese will receive, in appropriate currency, advances of pay at the following rates:-

- (i) A lump sum advance to be made at such time as the local Formation, & HQ determines between date of release from the enemy and date of embarkation -
All ranks - £6.5.0. Aust.
- (ii) During the subsequent period whilst they remain in the area where they are released and during all voyage periods-
Armed Forces

Officers above the rank of Lt.Col
and corresponding ranks in the

SURRENDER OF CAMP TOKEN MONEY AND/OR FOREIGN CURRENCY

9. (a) After arrival at 1 Aust PW and Internee Reception Unit, all
recovered Australian service personnel will be asked to
surrender any camp token money and/or foreign currency in
their possession received before coming under Allied Military
Control.
- (b) Each member surrendering camp token money and/or foreign currency
will make a declaration in the form of Appendix 'C' hereto. A
duplicate copy of the declaration duly certified by an AAPC rep-
resentative will be given to the member surrendering the camp
token money and/or foreign currency.

BRITISH CIVILIANS

10. Arrangements have been made for dots of the British Borneo Civil/
Unit to pay all British civilian nationals other than Australians.
Payments will be made by this unit to such liberated persons whether they
remain in BORNEO or are to be evacuated to AUSTRALIA. Further advances
will be made to such personnel if such payments are needed whilst staging
en route to AUSTRALIA.

Affairs

POSTAL ARRANGEMENTS

11. (a) From the earliest possible stage, recovered personnel will be given opportunities to write letters to their families and friends. Such letters will be despatched by air from forward areas to the Aust Army Base Postal Office MOROTAI in bags marked "PW MAIL". Adv LHQ will ensure that such mail is despatched by air to AUSTRALIA at the earliest date after next of kin have been notified of recovery by OZE.
- (b) Until the recovered personnel reach MOROTAI, their letters to persons in AUSTRALIA will not contain information about casualties, but will be confined to personal matters.
- (c) Initially the address for mail addressed to recovered personnel will be care of 1 Aust PW and Internee Reception Unit. LHQ has arranged for next of kin to be so informed.
- (d) Correspondence lodged by recovered personnel will indicate Army Number, Rank and Name in full of the sender on the back of the covers of all such correspondence.

RECORD ARRANGEMENTS

12. Final amplification of nominal rolls and advice to LHQ through Echelon channels, together with all other relevant information required by para 11 (g) of GRO 112/45 will be implemented by Adv LHQ.

EVACUATION TO AUSTRALIA

13. (a) Under no circumstances will recovered personnel be moved to AUSTRALIA before the expiration of 14 days after their recovery from the enemy.
- (b) Australian, British and Indian PW, and Australian and British Civilians.
All recovered Australian, British and Indian PW and Australian and British Civilians will be evacuated to AUSTRALIA from MOROTAI by means of shipping and aircraft. Liaison will be effected and completed with RAN and RAAF authorities before RN, RAN, RIN, RAF, RIAP, and RAAF recovered personnel are so evacuated.
- (c) Allied PW and Civilians
Action will be taken to evacuate Allied PW to AUSTRALIA from MOROTAI by the means set out in para 13(b) above, if the authorities controlling them so desire.

ACTIVITIES OF THE AUST RED CROSS SOCIETY

14. For the purpose of providing funds and relief for personnel recovered from Japanese custody, the Aust Red Cross has provided funds for distribution. The procedure for using these funds will be as set out hereunder : -

(a) Funds for distribution in cash to civilians in forward areas

- (i) As soon as possible after liberation a uniform per capita gift of up to £1.(Aust) will be made on behalf of the Society to each man, woman and child within the following category - White people of British descent and white citizens of the USA.
- (ii) The provision will be applied to recovered persons released by the AMP or handed over to the AMP in a forward area after release.
- (iii) The total distribution will not exceed £5000 (Aust.) i.e. £1 to each of 5000 people.
- (iv) If recovered personnel are held outside AUSTRALIA for more than 30 days after liberation, a further uniform per capita gift of up to £1 may be made to such persons. The total amount so distributed will not exceed £5000 (Aust.).
- (v) If circumstances warrant, advice should be forwarded to Adv LHQ recommending that the Aust Red Cross Society authorize a greater per capita distribution. Explicit reasons supporting the recommendation will be given.

14. Cont'd ...

(b) Funds for application for civilians and PW -

In order to supplement supplies made available in accordance with paras 9 and 10 of GPO 112/45, the Aust Red Cross Society has provided a sum of £10,000 (Aust.) which may be used for the purchase of local supplies of foodstuffs, comforts and amenities not available from the abovementioned resources. Items so purchased will be used for recovered civilians and PW irrespective of nationality.

- (c) Adv LHQ will sub-divide and allocate the funds to Formations &c as may be deemed necessary.
- (d) To the greatest extent possible the services of Aust Red Cross personnel will be used to assist in the application of these funds.
- (e) All concerned will be particularly scrupulous in expending and accounting for Aust Red Cross Funds in order to safeguard the reputation of the AMF and of the Society. Separate accountancy instructions will be issued.

18. Limitation to Activities of the Aust Red Cross Society.

15. Until LHQ has received full casualty advices, no information will be sent to AUSTRALIA by or through AUST RED CROSS PERSONNEL.

1. The following allocation of Red Cross Funds is made for use by Comd 9 Aust Div for providing funds and relief for civilians recovered from Japanese custody :

(a) Under authority GA/492/GA 1.

One thousand pounds Aust. (£1000) to provide a uniform per capita gift of up to one pound Aust. (£1) to be made on behalf of the Society to each civilian man, woman and child who are white people of British Commonwealth descent, and white people who are citizens of the USA.

(b) Under authority GA/492/A 1.

One thousand pounds Aust. (£1000) for local purchase of foodstuffs, comforts and amenities to supplement supplies made available in accordance with GRO 112/45 paras 9 and 10 or to provide supplies not available from those sources. Items so purchased may be used for recovered civilians and PW irrespective of nationality.

2. In all instances the initial authorisation for actual use of these funds is to be given by Comd 9 Aust Div. 8 Aust Base Sub Area will be responsible for advising Comd 9 Aust Div when expenditure from the fund is desired and for supervision of distribution and expenditure of the funds.

3. The services of Aust Red Cross personnel will be used to the greatest extent to effect distribution and to assist in the application of funds.

4. All expenditure incurred in accordance with the above will be supported by individual acquittances for funds distributed to civilians, and vouchers for funds used for purchase of local supply of foodstuffs, comforts and amenities. The appropriate authority reference will be endorsed on all vouchers.

5. Chief Paymaster 1 Aust Corps will issue to Paymasters concerned service instructions to ensure correct accounting for expenditure from these allocations.

6. It is desired that Chief Paymaster 1 Aust Corps furnish a return to this HQ by the 10th of each month showing expenditure incurred under these allocations during the previous month.

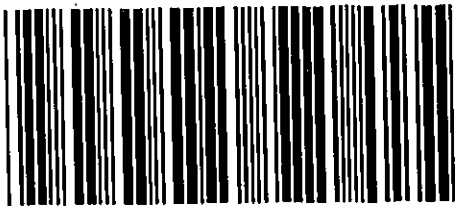

SPECIAL MESSING ALLOWANCE FOR AMF OFFICERS IN US MESSSES

2. The following signals despatched to LHQ refer.
Early advice on this matter would be appreciated.

Portland AG 2039 of 12 Jun
 Landops AG 890 of 17 Jun
 Portland AG 2911 of 19 Jun
 Landops AG 932 of 26 Jun

3. An extract of relevant paragraphs from USAFFE circular 66 of 7 Jun 45 is as under-

"(5). Australian military, naval and air officers on duty where United States Army units or consolidated messes are available are authorized to be subsisted at such messes.

(a) Mess Officers furnishing meals to those officers will render a report, in triplicate, monthly to the Finance Officer, Base 3 USAFOS, APO 923, showing the name of each such officer furnished with meals, the date, number of meals, and the total cost in separate columns, i.e. 25 ¢ for each meal which is reimbursable to the United States.

(b) The Finance Officer, Base 3, USAFOS, will process a Lend Lease charge against the Commonwealth Government in the sum of 25 ¢ for each meal so furnished as shown by such reports pursuant to the provisions of USAFFE Regulations 23-10."

4. It is understood that HQ Pacific Feh RAAP (whose attached cash office is servicing AMF personnel at Feh Feh) has acted on the instruction issued by USAFFE under authority given in memo 172948 of 25 May from Finance Warber Air Board. Paragraph of that memo reads -

"The question of obtaining messing under lease land is again being taken up with the department of the Treasury, but in the meantime the basic mess charges not exceeding \$0.75 per diem American may be paid from Public Funds, members to retain Field Allowance and pay all other mess charges."

/2.

REINFORCEMENTS AAFPC.

5. The reinforcement programme prepared by this HQ and submitted to LHQ made provision for 8 AAFPC general reinforcements to be sent forward to this area in two batches of 4. The first batch was originally 3, as was advised to Chief Pw and DFO Brisbane on 30 Mar 45, but this was reduced to 4 and a further requirement of 4 added.
6. Landops signal A138 of 8 Apr advised LHQ that 4 AAFPC reinforcements were required by 9 May. This information was passed to Q'land Ech and Rec in LHQ (OAS) memo 09298 of 9 Apr.
7. Landops signal A668 of 31 May advised LHQ that a total of 8 AAFPC reinforcements (including the 4 already requested) were required. LHQ (OAS) memo 12/42316 of 3 Jun advised Q'land Ech and Rec the outstanding composition of reinforcement requirements which included 4 AAFPC.
8. No AAFPC reinforcements have arrived in this area, although the total of general reinforcements provided in the reinforcement programme have arrived. The reason for their non arrival is not known. Further action is being taken through staff channels to obtain these reinforcements, but with limited shipping and restricted air service to this area this may take some time and cause embarrassment to Chief Paymaster.
9. In addition to these 8 general reinforcements it is proposed to obtain a further 7 AAFPC of personnel for 1 Aust Corps Accounts Office. Chief Paymaster will advise DFO Brisbane of requirements and composition by return.

ORGANIZATION - 1 AUST CORPS ACCOUNTS OFFICE.

10. The C-in-C has approved of 1 Aust Corps Accounts Office (AIF) being reorganized as Chief Paymaster's Office AIF BWPA, with same OE, and of transfer to command of Adv HQ.
11. Approval has also been given for Audit Det 1 Aust Corps to be transferred and reorganized as Audit Det Adv HQ.
12. Reorganization will be carried out on receipt of authority from 'A' Ech LHQ.

AUST RED CROSS FUNDS FOR CIVILIANS AND PW RECOVERED FROM JAPANESE CUSTODY FINANCE AUTHORITY CASES.

13. The following allocation of Aust Red Cross Funds has been made to 9 Aust Div under Finance Authority CA493 -

Funds for distribution in cash	£1000.
Funds for application	£1000.
14. No allocation has been made to formations under command First Aust Army.
15. Chief Paymaster and DFO New Guinea have been suitably advised. Copies of instructions issued have been forwarded to LHQ for CVO.
16. Attached for information is spare copy of Adv HQ AC402 of 14 Jun and Administrative Instruction No.43 issued 14 Jun.

RECEPTION OF PW AND CIVILIANS RECOVERED FROM THE ENEMY.

17. The pay interrogation statements forwarded with CFO memo 72426 of 30 May 45 have been included in Adv IER Aca Instruction 45 with other statements required to give a comprehensive instruction on this subject.

18. Stocks of forms have been prepared and made available to PW Reception unit.

19. AAFU personnel will be attached to PW Reception unit as and when required for issue of pay-books and pay and assistance in completion of interrogation statements.

20. PW recovered to date in CBOE operations total 292, of this number 146 have arrived at HURUTAI, 42 being hospital patients and 104 held by reception unit; with the exception of 2 Aust PW all are Indian personnel.

21. Reference is made to para 8 of report for May 45. It is anticipated that it will be necessary for the requirement mentioned in that para to be provided in the near future. This matter will be discussed with Chief Paymaster and when firm information is available Paymaster-in-Chief will be further advised. It is anticipated that the unit will be required in Fed Ech area and evacuation of personnel would be direct to AUSTRALIA and NOT to this area. At this stage it is thought that pay requirements will approximate the equivalent of an "A" Grade Cash Office and perhaps an additional officer for supervision and liaison.

MALAYAN CURRENCY - USE BY US FORCES.

22. No advice has yet been received in reply to Portland Signal AG2820 of 8 Jun to Landforces wherein Washington requested C-in-C SWPA obtain agreement of AUST GOVERNMENT to repurchase excess Straits Dollars held by US at the same rate at which purchased from the ANP.

23. With reference to Lendings Signal AG847 of 14 Jun on this Subject, appended hereunder is an extract from advice recently received from Forward Echelon :-

"2. The Fiscal Directorate APPAC have now requested verbally that "an unequivocal guarantee" be given by the Australian Government to repurchase surplus Straits Settlements currency from US forces "at the rate at which it was purchased".

3. It is understood that the Fiscal Directorate are quite happy with the present arrangement vide Lendings Signal AG847 of 141926I Jun, but that the Legal Branch consider the guarantee necessary for Washington.

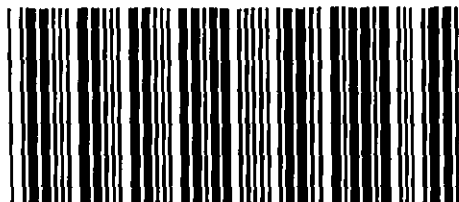
