BATTALION IN ATTACK.

GENERAL IDEA.

The German High Command, after many long and arduous conferences, decided it was due time an invasion of England was carried out. They were fast losing superiority in the air and in some manner had to gain prestige.

It was thought that if the invasion was attempted between CLACTON and WEST MERSEA and the advance continued North to COLCHESTER, resistance would be weak as the only support available was a few Australian troops equipped with boomerangs and presumably empty beer bottles. An added attraction would be experience gained in bridging the RIVER COLNE, thereby exercising Regts. which would in future be utilized for a crossing to AMERICA.

The invasion was carried out in the early hours of 5 Nov. 40 and landings were effected at MARTELLO TOWER 6131, COLNE POINT 5430, and WEST MERSEA 4630.

During the whole of that day fierce fighting took place. The forces which landed EAST of the RIVER COLNE did not have sufficient bridging materials to cross the marshes and were obliterated. The enemy at WEST MERSEA were more successful and managed to advance. By nightfall the forward elements were reported to be in the vicinity of ABBERTON 4537. The strength of this force was estimated at a Bde. and were accompanied with light tanks and Arty.

An attempt was also made to land air-borne troops in a general area NORTH of COLCHESTER with a view to hindering traffic and destroying communications. Due to a new secret weapon which Britain had been developing since the outbreak of war the results were rather disastrous. This weapon proved to be a complicated mechanical gadget having the effect of contracting scales on maps and consequently the air-borne troops were considerably cut in their estimation.

The majority of these troops descended in a reservoir WEST of ABBERTON and were drowned. A large percentage landed in close proximity to the brewery and decided the war need not be further continued; others were mystified by the strange odour when in contact with the glue and other factories. Amongst these members was an eminent German chemist who failed to classify this new and terrifying war gas. Several efforts were made to establish a gas cleansing centre but this was unsuccessful and all members were advised to surrender. Twelve were found frizzling and frying on the high voltage wires and two Germans even had the misfortune to land in the slit trenches in HYDERABAD. They were immediately buried on impact. This was indeed an unfortunate day for air-borne troops.

The 41 Cudlechester Regt. had been pushed back to a general line NORTH of ABBERTON along the ROMAN RIVER.

The G.O.C. Australian Force issued orders at 1900 hrs. that night for 18 Mxd. Bde. with 2/3 Fd. Regt. and 3 Fd. Coy. under cmd. to reinforce the 41 Cudlechester Regt.


