The 2/8 Fd Amb sq 446890. 10 coy AASC in area BIR EL SADI sq 448889 whilst the rec sec Ord Fd Pk and LAD in area sq 447891. B Coy 2/2 MMG Bn wwas with 2/15 Bn. The last elements moved into posn at approximately 2000 hrs.

Brig WINDEYER and Lieut GEMMEL-SMITH Bde IO left at 0615 hrs to make a recce arriving at destination at 0900 hrs. The move of the 2/17 Bn was very good as they selected firm route throughout, the other units went direct and had much trouble due to bogging in the sand. The navigation throughout was good.

At 1430 hrs Brig comd 69 British Bde arrived and informed Brig WINDEYER that 69 Bde was along the rd weiting to relieve the 20 Aust Inf Bde. This was the first intimation of a relief except a rather cryptic message from EIGHTH Army by R/T via a LO that on relief the 260 Bty was to pass to comd the incoming Bde. Our Bde had experienced much difficulty moving in due to loose sand and the area was very congested with MT. Brig Comd 69 Bde required 20 Bde to move out before the 69 Bde would move in. Arrangements were immediately made for the move to commence Zero for the move was 1730 hrs. 10 coy AASC moved on time but were halted by Capt ELLIOTT (BASCO) EIGHTH ARMY was contacted through R/T by an army LO and orders were received that the relief was to be made on the ground. Lieut SHENDON (LO) was sent ot contact comd 69 Bde ENN but could not find him. This was made more difficult as the message received named the comd of 69 Bde as Brig HASSEL and NOT Drig Condo 69 Bde and the attack developed to the west along RUWEISAT RIDGE, Brig WINDEYER order the return of 10 coy AASC which had stopped 10 miles to the east. It was considered the amm may be required. By derk the attack had been beaten off and a quiet night followed except when arty and MMGs of 5 Indian Bde engaged a party of GERMANS employed in recovering demaged trucks.

PREPARATION FOR PURSUIT

General

Our ability to pursue the enemy relentlessly and inflict the maximum destruction will depend largely on our operating on 'hard scale' with only those units which are fully equipped and mob as possible, and on our leaving behind all non-essential personnel and equipment to lessen the strain on maintenance and tpt:

The policy regarding the carriage and dumping of gas clothing will be issued shortly.

- 1. 24 Aust Inf Bde (2/28 Aust Inf Bn) will now capture its objective by oloo hrs 27 Jul.
- 2. 2/43 Aust Inf Bn will NOT move beyond the starting line until orders are issued for this attack to proceed. Arty sp fo this attack will be at call.



1. Secrecy:-

- "ritten orders for ops covered by these notes will NOT be issued by bn comds.
- (b) Every effort will be made to obtain security for this op.
- The enemy has recaptured Pt 63 87602794 and DEIR EL SHEIN 875280. 2.

The enemy is experiencing a shortage of amn. His reinforcements are approx 700 a day.

Estimated tk strength 1st light 24 Jul - German 60 Italian 100 to 120.

- 30 Corps is attacking during night 26/27 Jul -
- (a) 9 Aust Div to secure the ridge from 87372906 to 87532897.
- (b) 69 Inf Bde to secure the QATTARA rd from K 13 to K 16 and 1000 yds west of this line at daylight 27 Jul. Dy 0450

The object of the attack is to provide a passage for 1 Armd Div to pass through the enemy line to attack his rear areas.

1 SA Div is clearing minefields during night 26/27 Jul to facilitate the adv of 1 -rmd Div.

- 1 Army Tk Bde is placed under comd 9 Aust Div.
- 5. 24 Aust Inf Bde will capture and secure the area west of the GATTARA rd from 87372906 to 87532897 and then establish a post on the QATTARA rd in the area Pt 30 87542896.
 - Objective to be captured not later than 0200 hrs.
- 69 Inf Bde is attacking from approx the 878 eastern grid to secure the QATTARA rd within the limits given in para 3(b) by 0430 hrs and at daylight is securing the area 1000 yds to the west.

FREPARATION FOR PURSUIT.

1. General.
This limstn is issued so that the Bde Gp may be in readiness to take part in a pursuit if at any time circumstances of our ops make pursuit of the enemy possible.

Our ability to pursue the enemy relentlessly and inflict the maximum destruction will depend largely on our operating on 'hard scale' with only those units which are fully equipped and mob as possible, and on our leaving behind all non-essential personnel and eqpt to lessen the strain on maintenance and tpt.

The policy regarding the carriage and dumping of gas clothing will be issued shortly.

- 4. RAF Co-operation.
 (a) RAF rely on ST ANDREWS crosses and roundels for recognising the posn of our own tps. Units will clean these markings at periods throughout the day so that they can be easily seen.
 - (b) To keep RAF informed of the approx progress of our adv, the leading unit, or units, will arrange to burn one gp of smoke candles for 15 mins at 0630,0930,1230,1530 and 1830 hrs daily. Leading tps need NOT halt for this period.
 - (c) Enemy aircraft or captured LGs will be made non-airworthy immediately by damaging the fuselage, e.g., by running a veh into the tail. Aircraft will NOT be burnt, and instruments will NOT be removed.
- 5. Surplus Eapt.
 The units will move as lightly equipped as possible, all surplus items will be left in "B" Ech areas.
- 6. Picks and Shavels.
 (a) Full WE scale will be carried in "A" Ech vehs, together with surplus as detailed.
 - (b) One bruck from 10 Coy AASC loaded with picks and shovels will be att to and move with 2/3 Aust Fd Coy.
- 7. Personnel.
 Units will NOT take into battle rifle secs of more than 1 NCO and 7 ORs. In the allocation of personnel provision must be made for:-

(a) Escorting of prisoners.

(b) Assistance to Engr Demolition Dets.

(c) Gds on special pts.

8. Adm instns will be issued separately, and will deal with hard scales allotment of mines and disposal of units and personnel not incl in battle gps.
