The transaction was on a purely commercial basis and did not come within the above categories and delivery of goods was not permitted.

(c) A serious view is taken by Customs of personnel who send down goods for sale under the guise of gifts and these goods are liable to forfeiture.

2. CLOTHING AND NECESSITIES.



For month of November 1946.

During the month a considerable amount of work and activity centered around the YMCA Building in Fukuyama.

Subject: Report of activities in 65 Bn for month of Nov 46.

General: During month the centre at FUKUYAMA was closed and all materials moved to ONOMICHI. The centre at ONOMICHI was not large enough for the amount of stores held; but at end of month another large room was provided by the Bn, and this will be for leather work and for reading. The centre also has a piano in it, but alterations are needed to make the attractive; also no facilities are provided for warming the rooms, so it is somewhat cold at night. A small centre containing approx. 400 books, magazines, and leathwork was opened at HQ coy FUKUYAMA and a permanent body attached from HQ coy to attend it. Troops at HACHIHOMMATSU were provided with approx 200 books, and a centre will be opened there soon. Centre at ONOMICHI was kept open seven days a week from 1000 hrs to 2200 hrs, and was used a great deal by approximately 60 personnel a day. The staff now consists of two librarians: Pte. ARMSTRONG at ONOMICHI, Pte BERRY at FUKUYAMA, Pte McNEIL leather-work instructor, Pte KNIGHT, projectionist, and Mr FUJII, interpreter and librarian.

Music: - Recital by Sgt MUNRO and Pte KETCHEN was attended by approximately 100 personnel at ONOMICHI. Two recitals were given by local Japanese artists, who played before films were screened. Party consisted of one violinist and three pianists. There were no recorded recitals. However, the gramophone-amplifier was used approximately four hours a day. Mostly light music was played, but demand for classical music was fair. During month, 88 new records, including 65 classical records were received. 112 new ones will be forthcoming in the near future. These records are provided by COLUMBIA Recording Company. Also on hand are 160 light records, and 200 classical records. Approximately 60 of these are V-discs, obtained from V-S Special Service.

Library: - 1550 books drawn from ONOMICHI, FUKUYAMA, and HACHIHOMMATSU.

Films: - 10 16-mm. Shows were screened at HACHIHOMMATSU (1 show), at ONOMICHI (4 shows), and at FUKUYAMA (5 shows). These were attended by approx 2000 personnel.

Correspondence Courses: - Four taken out during the month.

Leather-work: - 30 personnel made articles varying from wallets to writing-cases, picture frames, etc.

Conclusion: - Although ample stores are on hand in the Centre, lack of space, inadequate and cold premises have prevented a first-class centre being set up. Heating is badly needed in the Centre, and continual packing and shifting of stores have hampered AES work in this battalion.

Subject: War Diary Report for Month of Nov 46

This month's activities are very similar to last month's for the milage is extremely heavy owing to the Battalation being split up into (5) five Detachements.

As we have vehicles at all places in which there are Detachement the pressure of the work is very great and in some areas the vehicles are doing up to as much as 130 miles every day for the month.

This results in the standard of maintenance being very poor in some areas.

From this arises the high percentage of the vehicles admitted to Workshops for repairs for the month. For (8) eight Jeeps, one from last month, and (6) six three ton vehicles have benn sent to Workshops this month, for in most cases major repairs.

The roads in the areas in which our vehicles have to operate are the worst in the Brigade, so the total number of punctures and U.S. tyres and tubes at the end of a month make a formidable number.

No accidents have been reported this month, so on the whole the month has been satisfactory for Transport.

WATER-CRAFT

This month's work for the Water*Craft has been very light, due no doubt to the Battalation being split up into small Detachements through the area.

Very few patrols were carried out this month. Also the recreational trips were few owing to the weather conditions.

The "River Yarra" again has been causing a great deal of trouble with its engine. So a great deal of month was spent in Onomichi Shipyards where a new engine was fitted.

The second of the boats has been finished and the trials have been carried out satisfactory, and it is stationed at Onomichi.

The other two boats are still at the Shipyards waiting for a new engine to be fitted.

So the month has proved to be satisfactory for the craft and no mishaps have been reported of any kind.

2. SPECIAL GRANT RELIGIOUS FESTIVALS

Authority has been given for a grant of one shilling and six pence (Aust) in cash or kind per head to all troops of British Commonwealth Occupation Force for Christmas or another appropriate religious festival applicable to each of the non Christian section of British Commonwealth Occupation Force.

The authority allows for one religious festival only for each individual and expires on 31 Mar 47.

3. GIFT SHOP - HIRO

Personnel who through detachment, hospitalisation, etc have missed card purchases at the Gift Shop HIRO may receive a special card authorising purchases at Gift Shop KURE. This matter is under discussion and an early announcement may be anticipated.

4. DEPENDENTS HOUSING - FURNITURE AND FITTINGS

Recently Comd 34 Aust Inf Bde inspected the furniture and equipment for dependents housing which has just arrived in this area. In the main both the fittings and furniture are extremely satisfactory but there are some items which will require modification. Recommendations have accordingly been made suggesting alteration in design of some articles and reconstruction of other items. A display of furniture, fittings and equipment provided for dependents housing is being arranged as soon as sufficient stocks become available in order that all personnel interested can inspect same.

5. SUSPENSION OF UNIVERSITY COURSES

A case has come to notice of a member of 34 Aust Inf Bde taking an Australian University correspondence course through Education channels which has been cancelled without notification to the member concerned. It has also been reported that in some cases, text books and the necessary correspondence have not been forthcoming resulting in delay to such courses.

Any personnel who are taking any course of education through army Education channels who have NOT been receiving all the material required should immediately notify Unit Education Officers, who in turn will notify Education Officer HQ 34 Aust Inf Bde without delay of the details. Corrective action will then be taken as quickly as possible to ensure the earliest resumption of the course.

6. QUERIES - GIFT SHOP HIRO

In answer to queries raised at a recent Welfare Committee meeting, advice has been received from AACS relative to Gift Shop issues to members of the service, same discloses that whilst items are limited, quality has been maintained.

However, it is desired to assure all members that the quality in all lines leaves nothing to be desired; the values are carefully checked at three different points by experienced personnel and members may rely on items being good value at the prices quoted. Shops could be flooded with merchandise of doubtful quality and high price and proof that all care is being exercised to avoid doing so may be had by comparing Gift Shop prices with those ruling in Japanese shops.

It is interesting to note that various items from the range complained of have been sent to Australia for price comparison and in most cases were not procurable there, but were valued at twice to three times the Gift Shop prices. In addition, 2600 members in the HIRO area have found the shop worth visiting and have spent a total of ¥ 450,000 on this, the second issue.

7. PEN FRIENDS

In answer to requests published in a recent newspaper (NSW), Miss Valeria McCLOSKEY of 3 Carr Street, Chatswood, Sydney writes to say that she would be very pleased to correspond with members of the British Commonwealth Occupation Force. Miss McCloskey also advises that she has girl friends who would also like to correspond with members over here. This letter was written in a very serious vein and personnel can be assured that any letters written to Miss McCloskey and her friends will be very happily received and answered. Miss McCloskey is 18 years of age and is a stenographer in a New South Wales business house.

1. Formations and units will call for volunteers to serve in CSDIC from personnel who have studied the Japanese language and who may become qualified linguists after further training. Such personnel should have at least twelve months to serve in Japan.

2. Particulars of applicants are to be forwarded to CSDIC who will arrange for interviews. Selected applicants will be attached to CSDIC for training. After training, suitable linguists will be posted to CSDIC, others will be returned to their units.

414. ORDERS

1. All hotels in JAPAN except those shown under 2 (a) and (b) below are OUT OF BOUNDS to all occupation personnel both service and civilian.

2. The following hotels are within bounds to occupation personnel :-

- (a) Hotels operated by occupation forces.
- (b) Hotels officially placed "on limits" by US Forces and those which may be declared within bounds by HQ BCOF.

3. FUJIMOTOYA Hotel (map reference 39702365) is OUT OF BOUNDS to all personnel after 2130 hours daily.

415. DISCIPLINE - COURTS MARTIAL SENTENCES

1. A court martial held on HMAS "KANIMBIA" on the 31 Oct 46 tried two soldiers - one for unlawfully removing emergency rations from a raft on the ship during the voyage, and the other for being unlawfully in possession of a tin of milk, emergency rations.

2. The accused were convicted and each sentenced to undergo detention for 90 days, these sentences were duly confirmed.

416. "GIFT - DUTY FREE" - PARCELS TO THE UK

1. Consequent upon revised custom import regulations, the conditions under which gift parcels may be sent to the U.K. have been revised by Customs Import Regulations and are now as under :

(a) Weight - Maximum - 22 lbs gross.

/ (b) Number

- (b) Number - No limitation on number of parcels which may be sent to any one addressee.
- (c) Contents - No limitation on the weight of foodstuffs in a parcel up to the maximum of 22 lbs. The limit of 2 lbs of any one kind of foodstuff has been lifted.
- (d) Duty - The liability to customs duty and/or purchase tax continues. However "Duty Free" labels (AFW5192 series) may now be used on "Gift" parcels within the present annual limit of £12 Stirling

2. AFW 5192 will be amended before issue as follows :-

- (a) Delete 5 lbs and insert 22 lbs.
- (b) Delete condition which limits weight of foodstuffs to 2 lbs.

417. PUBLIC ANNOUNCEMENTS



419. IBESS

- (a) It has been noted that in some cases badges collar copper oxidised have been polished.
- (b) Approval has NOT been given for the polishing of any AMF badges or buttons with the exception of badges hat. Coys will therefore take immediate action to ensure that, where collar badges and/or buttons have been polished, that they are restored to their original condition.

420. POSSESSION OF UNAUTHORISED WEAPONS

- (a) Several recent cases have disclosed that certain personnel have been in possession of unauthorised weapons. Coys are advised that such personnel may hand them into the QM Store for safe custody pending the owner's return to AUSTRALIA.
- (b) Disciplinary action will be taken against anyone, who, after 20 Dec 46, is found to be in possession of an unauthorised weapon.
- (c) It is to be noted that NSW Civil Police have been conducting a rigid campaign to prevent the importation of pistols and machine carbines to AUSTRALIA and that, unless the holder is in possession of the necessary Civil Licence, these types of weapons are subject to confiscation.

421. VICE SQUAD

- (a) Several reports have reached 34 Bde HQ that some troops of 34 Bde are threatening members of the 34 Aust Inf Bde Pro Coy who are engaged on Vice Squad activities.
- (b) Personnel are reminded that the object of the Vice Squad is to reduce VD in the area by arresting infected Japanese females and should therefore receive the maximum support from all personnel.

422. BICYCLES

NO member of 65 Aust Inf Bn may possess a bicycle, except where a bicycle is issued to a member by the Army.

423. DETACHMENT COMMANDERS

(a) Pursuant to AMR and O 389 (4) the powers of a Detachment Commander are hereby vested in QX 36514 Capt G A COLLYER in his capacity of Comd ETA JIMA det 65 Aust Inf Bn.

(b) Capt COLLYER will be directly responsible to HQ BCOF for all operational matters.

(c) Bn RO 383 of 3 Nov 46 is cancelled.

424. ELECTRIC LIGHT GLOBES

- (a) The risk of contracting syphilis has become very great in the past three months as the incidence of syphilis is now 75 per cent to 80 per cent of all admissions to the Mil Gov Hosp KURE.
- (b) Owing to inadequate space, these women can only be treated in hospital for 6 weeks. Following this they become out patients and attend for treatment twice weekly until cured.
- (c) It is probable that they will attempt to resume their former profession while still under treatment. Troops are warned against having any dealings with these women. They are easily identified as they do NOT carry the usual health card but only have a paper slip stating that they are undergoing treatment for syphilis.

430. CARRYING OF ARMS, AMMUNITION AND UNIT EQUIPMENT BY MEMBERS OF THE AIF IN TRANSIT

1. Definition: For the purpose of this instruction, "unit equipment" means all items of arms on issue to members and equipment which remains on unit charge and which is on temporary issue only to members.

2. The carrying of arms, ammunition and unit equipment by any member of the AIF in transit is prohibited, except in the following circumstances :-


- (i) when on direct transfer from one unit to another;
- (ii) when in transit to a personnel depot for reallocation;
- (iii) when in transit to or from an army school for which the relevant joining instructions require a member to be in possession of arms or unit equipment;
- (iv) when granted leave from his unit during a movement of that unit;
- (v) when proceeding from his unit to a personnel depot for leave, prior to transfer to another unit, prior to reallocation, or on completion of a school or course prior to return to his unit;
- (vi) when the member's CO or the CO of the unit responsible for administering the member considers it essential that a member should carry arms or unit equipment for any other reason.

3. A member who, while in possession of his arms or unit equipment, has marched into a personnel depot for any of the reasons set out in para 2 of this instruction will not be marched out or released on leave from that depot in possession of his arms or unit equipment except on direct movement from that depot to another depot, or to a unit or army school. Any such member, prior to being marched out from a personnel depot on leave, will deposit his arms and unit equipment with the quartermaster of that depot for safe custody during the period for which the member is on the holding strength of or staging at that depot. The quartermaster will issue a temporary receipt for the articles deposited. On return from leave, the articles withdrawn from the member will be re-issued and the temporary receipt destroyed.

4. In no circumstances, will any arms or unit equipment be deposited at any cloakroom or with any other person, nor will they be left unattended in any hotel, restaurant, cafe or similar place.

5. A member in transit will not carry ammunition except when required to carry out a specific military duty for which ammunition is allotted. Such ammunition will be withdrawn from the member by the first unit by which he is administered immediately after completion of such specific duty.

Subject: MEDICAL REPORT FOR MONTH OF DECEMBER

1. Throughout December, A Coy remained at HIRO, under the medical care of 20 Fd Amb. D and B Coys were at POINT CAMP and C Coy at ONOMICHI until 15 Dec when B and C Coys moved to ETA*JIMA and D Coy returned to ONOMICHI. Medical orderlies were sent to ETA-JIMA with A and C Coys who were instructed to supervise VD records of the detachment.
2. HYGIENE
In the first week of December the standard of cleanliness and maintenance of latrines at ONOMICHI barracks fell markedly. This emphasises the need for constant vigilance in hygiene. This applies to Japanese latrines in particular. This situation was corrected. HQ Coy hygiene at FUKUYAMA was highly satisfactory throughout.
3. On 21 December an earth-quake occurred in the early hours of the morning. The probability of subsequent disturbances resulted in the shifting of some RAP stores and personnel to a small detached building, where they could function in the event of a disaster.
4. In the last week of December the preparation of medical papers for the leave and discharge draft entailed much clerical work.
5. General health was satisfactory throughout the month although the VD rate was above what is considered satisfactory level. However only a quarter of the infections were caught in the FUKUYAMA- ONOMICHI area.

This month for Transport in Japan has been the worst that the Battalion has ever experienced since it's formation. In one regard it has been satisfactory, that is as far as mileage is concerned, it is abnormally low considering we are serving detachments in four widely spread areas.

On the other hand it is the most disastrous we have ever had, for there were four major accidents resulting in three deaths to Japanese Nationals, and six were injured to such an extent that they may be crippled for life.

While on our side there was one three ton truck smashed up and is badly damaged.

This month only five jeeps and two three ton vehicles were admitted to work shops for repairs, and only of a minor nature.

The problem of spare parts and replacements is ever increasing, and it is such that at this stage jeeps will be grounded owing to the shortage of tubes and tyres.

In conclusion we hope that the next month brings a brighter future, as regards the accidents that have occurred.

Water Craft.

This month's work for water craft is the same as last month, and it went by very satisfactory indeed.

All the boats are at Onomichi except the "Rose Marie" which is kept at Fukuyama for the use of H.Q. Coy. the third boat has successfully completed her trials after being refitted at the ship yards, so this brings our water craft strength up to three boats and two barges, ready to meet any situation that may demand their use.

The work at Onomichi ship yard is proceeding along well, and is of a surprising high standard.

So in conclusion we are perfectly satisfied in all regards with the condition under which the water craft are operating.




1. The following is an extract from HQ BCOF AG338.1 of

- (a) "Leave granted to TOKYO Leave Centre or to a formation Rest Camp should not be taken into consideration when determining a members eligibility for six days leave annually in a BCOF Holiday Hostel. Vacancies at TOKYO Leave Centre and BCOF vacancies in Formation Rest Camps are allotted to Formations on a per capita basis except that special arrangements for TOKYO may be approved from time to time to enable personnel to attend ceremonies in connection with the guard Bn.
- (b) Special arrangements may also be made in BCOF Holiday Hostels for extended leave for members who are married in Japan.
- (c) Although Leave granted within Japan does not count against leave which may accrue to a member in accordance with the National Orders of the various contingents of the Force, it is desirable that a record should be readily available wherever the member may be located in order that his eligibility and priority for leave within Japan may be accurately determined without delay.
- (d) Accordingly all Formations will institute a form of record of local leave exceeding 24 hours for each member, to be kept as a Regimental document. In the event of a member being transferred from one unit or Formation to another his record of local leave will be forwarded without delay."

2. Coys will ensure that a copy of the attached proforma is made out for all personnel who have had local leave, and for all personnel who take local leave in the future.

GEN

1. This instr sets out the policy which will govern trg within 34 Aust Inf Bde during the period 1 Dec 46 to 30 Nov 47 and outlines the main principles to be observed in implementing this policy.
2. Objectives are
 - (a) To est a high standard of morale, discipline, turnout and self reliance in all ranks to fit them for their role in an occupation force.
 - (b) To attain the standard of mil trg and efficiency required - in sub units, units and 34 Aust Inf Bde as a whole - to undertake active ops.
3. The trg period will be carried out in two main phases.
 - (a) Individual trg period 1 Dec 46 to 15 Apr 47.
 - (b) Collective trg period 16 Apr 47 to 30 Nov 47.

INDIVIDUAL TRG

4. Scope

- (a) The scope of individual trg will vary considerably throughout the units of arms and services within the bde. The variety and complexity of modern arms and eqpt to be maint and emp, the numerous specialist tasks to be performed, the incidence of leave to Aust and the relatively short term of service of all ranks may preclude a proportion of individuals in any unit being interchangeable. Current trg will therefore aim at giving every individual a thorough gen mil grounding followed by specialist trg for the task which will be allotted him in his unit.
- (b) The degree to which gen mil trg will be carried out prior to the commencement of specialist trained to fill vacancies in the shortest possible time. In many cases specialist trg and basic mil trg may have to proceed at the same time.
- (c) Individual trg during the period allotted will be devoted to
 - (i) Basic trg of rfts
 - (ii) Additional trg of the soldier
 - (iii) Additional trg of the offr
 - (iv) Introduction of a compulsory edn scheme

5. Basic trg of rfts

In many instances this will be the individual's initial experience of army life in an org unit, therefore it is important that his reactions to the trg he receives - which will last throughout his army life - are both correct and complete,

....Trg will/

Trg will be thoroughly org, and executed with the best facilities units can muster. It will aim at giving each individual a basic knowledge of his duties and responsibilities, the care and handling of his personal weapons and eqpt, and instilling in him a sense of self reliance, confidence and discipline. Excellence of turn out, smartness of bearing and alertness will be demanded at all times and none but the highest standards of cleanliness, efficiency and punctuality accepted.

6. Additional trg of the soldier

(a) This will normally fall into three phases

- (i) Refresher instr in subjects already learnt
- (ii) Instr in new weapons, eqpt and duties
- (iii) Instr in specialist and tech subjects

(b) The degree to which each of the above is developed is dependent upon standards reached in previous periods of individual trg and immediate requirements for unit specialists to carry on normal maint responsibilities. Each case will be considered by the comd concerned and trg will proceed on lines designed to bring the unit to the highest state of efficiency in the time allowed.

(c) It is not intended to enumerate all the subjects to be covered by all arms and services during the individual trg period but the following are listed as a guide.

- (i) physical trg and correct posture
- (ii) weapons and eqpt
- (iii) fieldcraft and battle drills
- (iv) tactics
- (v) map reading and visual trg
- (vi) hyg
- (vii) interior economy
- (viii) occupational responsibilities
- (ix) refresher basic trg
- (x) specialist trg

7. Additional trg of offr

(a) Gen

It is considered that many of the offr who will be remaining within the bde will form the offr nucleus of the future PMF offr. Trg will therefore be devoted to increasing the gen professional knowledge of all offr, especially in the junior ranks. Instr in the following subjects will be carried out

- (i) Discipline, mil law, courts of inquiry and investigations.

- (ii) Duties in connection with the inspection and maint of
MT
weapons
arm
clothing
unit stores and eqpt
- (iii) Store accounting and management
- (iv) Mil writing and verbal expression
- (v) A study of mil hist will be commenced. It is anticipated that necessary.ref.books will be made available.

(b) Tactical instr

Two main tactical phases will be studied, the adv and encounter, and def, with particular ref to terrain conditions encountered in JAPAN. Initially, discussions and model exercises will be conducted by bde to aly down the gen policy to be followed by units.

(c) Air aspect

A special feature will be made of air-coop with ground forces. During the latter stages of the individual trg period BCAIR teams will be made available to assist units in this aspect of their trg.

(d) Arty and inf coop

Owing to terrain conditions in JAPAN, inf offr will be called upon to observe arty fire in the absence of arty offr. A Fd Bty will provide instrs to inf units for trg inf offr in the engagement of arty targets and the correction of arty fire.

(e) Scientific development

Efforts will be made to obtain lectures to acquaint offr with some of the more important developments affecting weapons of the future.

8. Edn

- (a) Compulsory attendance at edn classes will be introduced during the individual trg period and continued throughout collective trg. A minimum of 6 hrs instr per week will be incl in the normal trg programme and will aim at improving the normal edn standard of all personnel.

- (b) AHQ MELBOURNE have been requested to forward details of the pre war certificates of edn used in the PMF, and, if suitable, a similar scheme will be used within the bde. Details of this edn scheme will be issued in another instr.

COLLECTIVE TRG

9. Gen outline for collective trg period 16 Apr 47 to 30 Nov 47 is as follows

- (a) 16 Apr - 31 May
Sec and pl trg
- (b) 1 Jun - 31 Jul
Coy trg
- (c) 1 Aug - 31 Aug
Bn trg
- (d) 1 Sep - 30 Sep
Bn gp tr
- (e) 1 Oct - 31 Oct
Bde trg
- (f) 1 Nov - 30 Nov

Additional bde trg to extent possible.

The above are given as a forecast only at this stage. Final allocation of periods is dependent upon incidence of gd duties to be performed in TOKYO and will be confirmed as soon as possible.

10. Units will org their individual trg period in accordance with the above instrs. One copy of unit trg instr will be forwarded to this HQ.
11. One copy showing summary only of unit weekly trg syllabi will be forwarded to reach this HQ by the Sat of each preceding week.



5. You will act as Duty Officer at Bn HQ until 2300 hrs. You will maintain a log of all messages and hand it to the Adjt at 0830 hrs.
6. You will be at all times near a telephone, and inform the Sig office of your location.
7. A telephone extension will be placed in the Orderly Officers sleeping quarters for use after 2300 hrs.
8. You will receive Tattoo reports at 2245 hrs from Coy Orderly Officers, reporting any irregularities to the Adjt at 0830 hrs.
9. You will report to Bn HQ by 0830 hrs and remain in that area unless engaged on a specific task.
10. You will ensure all lights, with the exception of those in Adm Offices and Sgts Mess, are out at 1100 hrs.
11. You will carry out a complete camp inspection at 1030 hrs each morning.
12. You will inspect the Regimental Quarter Guard, once by day, and once by night.
13. You will act as Chief Fire Control Officer in the event of a fire and you will ensure that the procedure laid down in Standing Orders for Fire-ONOMICHI BARRACKS-~~78~~ followed.
14. You will periodically visit the Regimental Canteen, ensuring that good order and discipline is maintained.
15. You will take charge of all monies paid into the canteen on the night of your tour of duty and hand them to the Canteen Officer by 0900 hrs next morning.
16. You will submit a written report on your tour of duty by 0830 hrs next morning.

STANDING ORDERS FOR FIRE - ONOMICHI BARRACKS

1. APPLICATION OF THE ORDERS

These orders apply to all ranks in ONOMICHI Barracks and will be put into effect as from the promulgation of this instruction.

2. GENERAL PRECAUTIONS AGAINST FIRE

(a) Fires will NOT be lit in any building unless proper facilities exist, e.g. Oil Stoves, converted petrol drums, heaters or heaters of civilian design will be installed.

(b) Inflammable liquids, petrol etc, will be stored in buildings apart from main buildings in the area.

(c) Smoking is prohibited near inflammable stores.

(d) Coys and other sub-units having such stores will arrange for prominent notices to be displayed to this effect.

(e) All Barrack Rooms, adm offices, stores, messes, recreation and education huts will be provided with buckets filled with sand into which matches and cigarette butts will be placed.

3. SHIELDING OF HEATING STOVES

(a) All stoves installed within buildings will be adequately screened from contact with wooden floors, walls and ceilings.

(b) Oil stoves will be mounted on a framework containing sand. Wood stoves will be mounted on an iron or tin sheet.

(c) Walls in close proximity to stoves will be screened with sheet metal and/or asbestos sheeting, and all outlet vents in roof will be provided with a metal flashing. All flues will be checked to ensure that they protrude sufficiently above the roof level to prevent sparks falling back on th the roof.

4. FIRE DRUMS AND BUCKETS

(a) Coys will ensure that at least two 44 gallon drums will be kept in each corridor. Beside each drum and in each barrack room will be at least one 4 gallon tin bucket.

(b) Coys and sub-units will ensure that all fire drums and buckets are kept filled with water.

5. ELECTRICAL APPLIANCES

(a) All electrical appliances will be checked weekly by the Signal Platoon, under direction of the Sig Officer.

(b) No unauthorised persons will interfere in any way with electrical fittings. Any repairs or maintenance to electric light installations will be done by the Signal Platoon.

/(c)

(c) No electric lights, appliances, heaters or oil stoves will be left burning in unoccupied barrack rooms.

6. DUTY PERSONNEL

(a) At NO time will barrack rooms or other regimental buildings be left unoccupied.

(b) Coys will ensure that a fire picquet of 1 NCO and 6 men are kept in the camp area at all times. Orders for fire picquets will be issued separately.

7. ALARMS

(a) A Regimental Fire Alarm is mounted outside Bn HQ. This consists of a bell mounted on a wooden frame.

(b) In addition, a fire will be announced by repeated short rings on the electric buzzer, situated in the main barrack block. The bell push for this buzzer is in the Cadre Coy Orderly Room.

8. EXITS

In the case of a fire becoming uncontrollable, the senior member present will order the evacuation of the building by the nearest exits. Ropes and ladders are hung from the windows of barrack rooms as additional exits.

9. ACTION IN EVENT OF FIRE

(a) The person or persons discovering the outbreak will immediately call "FIRE" in a loud voice and endeavour to extinguish the blaze.

(b) The Regimental and Auxillary Fire Alarms will be sounded.

(c) The Regimental Quarter Guard will turn out and remain turned out until ordered in by the Adjt or Regimental Orderly Officer.

(d) The Orderly Officer will be immediately notified.

(e) The Orderly Officer or senior man present will detail a party to fight the fire. All other personnel will muster on the parade ground.

(f) The Orderly Officer or the senior man present at the outbreak of fire, will ensure that the local fire brigade is notified through one of the interpreters.

(g) Particulars of the person reporting the fire will be obtained.

10. FIRE DRILL

(a) All ranks will be given fire drill at least once monthly.

(b) Drill will include manning of fire fighting appliances; evacuation of hut or huts on fire; standing to of Coy fire picquets and turning out of the Regimental Quarter Guard.

TEMPORARY HEATING APPLIANCES - FIRE PRECAUTIONS

1. GENERAL

(a) This instruction will be posted beside "Standing Orders for Fire - ONOMICHI Barracks.

(b) Fire precautions to be observed with heating appliances set out here under.

2. ELECTRIC HEATERS.

(a) Electric heaters being issued this winter are of two types namely box types, which consists of a sheet iron box containing a non illuminating element, and open type which consists of a reflector and exposed illuminating element. Neither type constitutes a fire risk provided that adequate precautions are taken when the radiators are installed.

(b) These precautions consist in:-

- (i) Careful checking of wiring for load (min 20 amps)
- (ii) Adequate insulation of wiring from building
- (iii) Adequate fusing

(c) Electric radiators will NOT be installed without Careful consideration of all the factors in para 3.

3. OIL BURNING STOVES

(a) Oil burning stoves being issued this winter may be kerosene or heavy oil burning.

(b) All oil burning stoves are a constant fire risk owing to the danger of leaking oil igniting.

(c) All oil burning stoves will be mounted on sand trays of minimum dimensions, 3 feet x 3 feet x 4 inches deep.

(d) Flue pipes will not be run within 6 inches of any inflammable surface.

(e) In the case of stoves having separate fuel tanks such tanks will, where possible, be placed outside the building. The connecting hose will be fitted with taps at both ends and will pass through the wall within a length of conduit projecting 12 inches on both sides. A sand tray twelve inches wide and three inches deep will be placed beneath the connecting hose inside the building to catch any oil that may drip from the hose.

(f)/

(f) Where fuel tanks have to be placed within the building they will be mounted above four inch sand trays of adequate dimensions to catch any oil that may drip from the tank.

(g) Oil burning stoves will be attended at all times while alight.

(h) A minimum of one bucket of sand will be placed beside each oil burning stove.

(i) Water buckets will NOT be placed beside oil burning stoves.


4. SOLID FUEL BURNING STOVES

(a) Solid fuel burning stoves will be mounted on sheet metal or sand filled bases of minimum dimensions three feet x three feet.

(b) Flue pipes will not be run within six inches of any inflammable surfaces.

(c) One bucket of water and one of sand will be provided adjacent to every two stoves or less.

(d) Solid fuel burning stoves will be attended at all times while alight.


Subject: DRILL TO BE ADOPTED BY GUARDS OF HONOUR

1. The following procedure is laid down in MBI 147 and will be adopted as from the receipt of this memo.
2. DRILL
 - (a) The centre rank numbers off before reaching the inspection ground.
 - (b) The guard is halted and turned to the front in three as usual.
 - (c) The command 'Form two deep' is given. Odd numbers of the centre rank take a pace to the left with the left foot and a pace forward with the right foot. Even numbers of the centre rank take a pace to the left with the left foot and a pace to the rear with the right foot.
 - (d) The command 'Right Dress' is given. The guard will dress shoulder to shoulder.
 - (e) Before marching off, the command 'Form threes' is given. Odd numbers of the original centre rank (who are now in the front rank) take a pace to the rear with the left foot and a pace to the right with the right foot. Even numbers of the original centre rank (who are now in the rear rank) take a pace forward with the left foot and a pace to the right with the right foot.
 - (f) The command 'Right dress' is given. The guard will dress in threes in the normal manner.

1. Subtended are extracts from a report received from the 34 Aust Inf Bde Vice Squad. Coys will insure that the widest publicity is given to this report.

" I have to report for your information that the vice squad consisting of myself and driver HODGES from this unit and Cpl HARRINGTON from 24 Pro Pln, KURE, investigated all cases of VD which come through the 92 IGH KURE for the week ending 10/11/46.

There has been a big drop in number of VD cases in KURE in the last two weeks, we have made special raids on girls who have no cards, many of these girls are the cause of the VD figures being so high. The regular prostitutes are a big help to us in picking up these girls.

The syphilis rate is still high amongst the girls and is rising amongst the soldiers. Many more men are coming in with venereal sores now than a few weeks ago, one girl at YOSHIURA has been responsible for 7 men going in with venereal sore. This girl has three positive signs of syphilis.

While picking up the above girl my driver was threatened by two soldiers from 65 Aust Inf Bn. These soldiers were going to use their web belts, this kind of thing is becoming much too frequent lately in KURE. I have been threatened on several occasions by soldiers.

Six girls from KAGOSHIMA and two from KOBE were picked up in HIRO during the week, all girls had VD and were admitted to hospital. These girls will be sent back to their home towns by the civil police when their treatment is finished.

1. According to BCOF STANDING ORDERS FOR HYGIENE ---
No Japanese will be permitted to work as food handlers (ie
Waiters, Cooks, Ration Store Assistants) unless they have
been medically examined and certified suitable. The examin-
ation must include bowel tests at four monthly intervals.
2. It is impossible to have specimens tested by Army
facilities in the unit area. Japanese Hospitals have co-
operated and have carried out tests for parasites, typhoid,
dysentery and cholera, on all food handlers.
3. Since the last tests in August food handlers have
been employed without preliminary bowel testing.
4. After the completion of bowel test at present in
progress at ONOMICHI INFECTIOUS HOSPITAL, NO Japanese food
handlers will be employed without first being bowel tested
under arrangements with RMO. NO examinations made by Japane-
se Doctors under outside arrangements will suffice.
