COMMANDING OFFICER'S REPORT FOR MONTH OF MARCH 1948

After many rumours about a move for the Bn during the first weeks, a warning order was received on the 19th from Bde HQ advising that the Bn was to assume Station Command at ETA JIMA and concentrate there. NO move before the 8th of April.

While the move from FUKUYAMA will be regretted as the camp and area are as perfect as could be desired, at the same time the change to ETA JIMA will be welcome if only for the social angle. We have been based in this area for two years, our first elements moving here from KAITAICHI on 25-Mar 46.

The run down in strength continues as also do our officer and NCO cadres which are culminating in weapon classification practices at HARAMURA. Good results are expected.

We have had two concert parties this month, both of which were high in their praise of the theatre.

Sport continues to prosper and we expect to be in the grand final of all games next month. The Rugby League team suffered their first defeat since coming to JAPAN, at the hands of 66 Aust Inf Bn.

GENERAL

1. During this month approx 130 men from this Bn returned to Aust and one reinforcement was received. A further draft of about 80 will leave next month and reinforcements may be expected to be again negligible. The Bn strength, excluding attached units will then be about 200.

During next month also the Bn will move to ETA JIMA, but no date can be given as yet as to when the main body will be gone and therefore when the ADS may be closed and the RAP moved to ETA JIMA.

In view of the imminent move, plans for rebuilding the PAC in FUKUYAMA have been abandoned, and it will be closed as soon as the main body of troops leave.

The RAP at DOGOYAMA chalet has been taken over by an orderly from 20 Aust Fd Amb, and the equipment there is on charge to him on issue from this unit.

A field training cadre began at HARAMURA on Mar 29 and an orderly from this RAP was sent up with equipment to set up an RAP. There will be about 90 men from this Bn at HARAMURA for a period of a fortnight. A recce party inspected the area on 27 Mar, and barracks and hygiene arrangements were found to be satisfactory.

HEALTH OF TROOPS

2. General health very satisfactory. An increase in skin diseases, particularly furuncles and tinea, accounts for a slight rise in the number of sick parade attendances. URTI remains at a gratifyingly low level. Two further cases of infectious hepatitis have occurred. Two cases of penicillin urticaria occurred, one treated at 130 AGH one at ADS (Batch No ? 612)

A dependent child sustained a fatal stab wound when she fell on a bread knife.

VD

3. Incidence remained at a relatively satisfactory level. It is notable that most infections in this Bn are contracted outside the Bn area, while soldiers are on leave.

STORES

4. An 8 ton disinfectant arrived at the RTO during the month, but in view of the imminent move was sent back to HIRO.

HYGIENE

5. General hygiene is satisfactory. Minor alterations are adjusted by daily supervision.

TRAINING

6. In view of the unsettled state of the Bn, and the increasing proportion of adm staff who are difficult to muster, continuity of medical training cannot be achieved at present, and it would seem better to leave it until the move to ETA JIMA has been completed.

1. ACCOMMODATION

No major change from previous month. Certain items of furniture were expected during the month. Delivery was stopped when it was advised of the Unit's movement to ETA JIMA. The run down in strength leaves the unit with items of furniture surplus to present requirements.

2. CLOTHING and NECESSITIES

Generally satisfactory. Difficult to anticipate requirements two months in advance when no information is available on likely increases or decreases in strength.

3. WAR EQUIPMENT and M.T.

(a) Run down in strength has resulted in a restricted War Establishment for Mechanical Transport. Unit transport was reduced by 9 Trucks $\frac{1}{2}$ -ton 4 x 4 and 1 Truck 15-cwt. 4 x 4.

(b) Unserviceable stocks of Ammunition have been replaced.

4. RATIONS, FUELS, etc.

(a) Rations drawn for month totalled 11,270, and were generally good following the arrival of shipping from AUSTRALIA.

(b) Firewood received for the month 15 tons. Coal on hand 1,045 tons, plus BCOF Reserve of 421 tons. Daily consumption of coal is down to $4\frac{1}{2}$ tons following the cutting off of the steam about the middle of the month. One boiler now supplies the camp with hot water 24 hours a day.

GENERAL

1. Two drafts left the area during the month and with no reinforcements being received a considerable drop in all Edn activities has taken place.
2. During April this Bn will be moving to ETA JIMA and the Centre will be going with the Bn. At present it is not known if the Bn Edn Centre will take over the existing Centre or be supplementary to it.

CORRESPONDENCE COURSES

3. Only one course was taken out during the month and four personnel received first lessons for courses previously taken out. A number of personnel have received questionnaires from Base Edn in the last week. After the records are completed the questionnaires will be returned to Base Edn.

LIBRARY

4. Approximately 500 library books were issued during the month. Early in the month 269 Mobile Library books were received. These books are proving to be extremely popular and are in great demand.

CRAFTWORK

5. The crafts room has been used by a small number of troops but has not been in great demand. The main reason for this is believed to be the shortage of spare time the troops are having due to the strength of the Bn at present.

Subject: WAR DIARY FOR MONTH OF MARCH 1948

1. MILEAGE

Running mileage for month of March 24382 miles being greater than month of February by 1767 miles.

2. ACCIDENTS

Only one minor accident was reported for the month which involved a G M C and a Japanese Bus, no persons were injured and damage was slight.

3. MAINTAINANCE

Veh maintainance is still of a high standard as proved by a weekly maintainance check of VOLs and equipment.
Every Vehicle was given a non technical inspection and result entered on AAB406, minor repairs were carried out by LAD detachment attached to this Unit.

4. REPAIRS & SPARE PARTS

Some repairs cannot be carried out due to the shortage of spare parts such as springs, engine rubber mountings, oil seals, driving shafts and universal joints, 7 or 8 vehicles will be off the road until these parts come to hand, a shortage of grease nipples for replacement is causing unnecessary wear in universal joints.

5. DRIVERS

The shortage of trained drivers is still a problem, approx twelve more leave for Australia this month with no replacements in sight at the present moment. The D&M School at Camp Point is training approx two drivers per month which will help the situation to some extent.

6. ROADS

The road between Fukuyama and the Camp is getting worse and a definate strain on drivers, passengers, and vehicles as well as workshop personnel.

7. EVACUATIONS

Eight (8) vehicles were taken off strength this month and returned to Ord Veh Park to be placed in BCOF veh pool leaving a unit strength of 18x $\frac{1}{4}$ ton 4x4, 5x2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ton 6x6, 1 Passenger Bus, 1 Car D.S and 2 W/T 3 ton 4x4.

(iii) Military Police and members of the Town Picquet will confiscate all liquor found in possession of personnel outside the unit lines.

(b) Liquor obtained from canteens or any other source will NOT be taken into Barrack rooms or quarters.

80. SPEED LIMITS - FUKUYAMA AREA


The wearing of British pattern Battle Dress is NOT authorised

82. MARRIAGES IN JAPAN

(a) Members of the BCOF (including Women's Services) shall not marry without the written authority of one of the following officers.

Commander in Chief, BCOF (The authority of the C in C BCOF may be exercised by the Principal Administrative Officer)
Air Officer Commanding, British Commonwealth Air Group.
Commander 34 Australian Infantry Brigade Group.
Commander second New Zealand Expeditionary Force Japan.
Commander UK Army Component.

Approval will not be given for a marriage between a member of the BCOF and a Japanese national by any authority other than the Commander in Chief.

(b) In the event of an unapproved marriage being carried out by a chaplain, civilian clergyman, consular official or under Japanese law, all ranks are informed that -

- i. Disciplinary action will be taken.
- ii. Dependents and marriage allowance may be withheld and logistic support of the wife and family may not be accepted.
- iii. Australian Ministry of Immigration will not permit the entry of Japanese women into Australia either as wives or as fiancées.

(c) A civil marriage in Japan is merely an agreement between participants:- neither a license nor a ceremony being required for its completion. It becomes legally effective upon notification by the participants to the Japanese registrar who makes the appropriate entries in the census rolls of the ward or village. Japanese law does not require the issuance of a marriage certificate. It does, however require the support of witnesses in the notification to the Registrar, and in certain cases parental consent. Japanese registrars have been forbidden to accept a notification or to make an entry in a register of marriages in respect of any member of the force unless the registrar first gives thirty days notice to HQ BCOF through Military Government channels, and within that period, receives in writing, the authority of the Commander in Chief, BCOF. (FRO 7/48)

83. DETENTION BARRACKS

When Coys are notified that a member has been awarded Detention, the following procedure will be adopted.

- i. The soldier takes with him all clothing and necessaries including toilet and messing gear.
- ii. The soldier takes with him sufficient bedding for his needs according to the prevailing season

Razais :- May be taken if issued
Stretchers and mattresses :- Not to be taken.

The following documents are to be forwarded to the RSM for delivery to The Commandant Detention Barrack.

- i. Certified True Copy of field conduct sheet with current award correctly entered.
- ii. Kit inventory
- iii. Authenticated description of member
- iv. Paybook, Record of Service Book and personal documents

(PRO 8) 48

84. CONTROL OF BLACK MARKET ACTIVITIES

Members of the British Commonwealth Occupation Force and their dependents, and persons attached to, accompanying or employed by the Force shall not, except as prescribed in para (b) of this order, carry or cause to be carried any rations, foodstuffs or cigarettes, tobacco, liquor or other commodities originating in or obtained from any Canteen, service, organisation or establishment of the British Commonwealth Occupation Force.

- (b) This Order does not prohibit :
- i. The carriage of any goods specified in para (a) of this order by personnel in the course of their duty.
 - ii. The bona fide carriage of such goods by personnel from the place of purchase or issue, directly to their living quarters, messes or barracks.
 - iii. Personnel from carrying, within their Camp area, or living quarters, a reasonable quantity of foodstuffs, cigarettes and tobacco for their own bona fide use and consumption from time to time.
 - iv. Personnel who are proceeding outside their Camp area, barracks or living quarters on leave or duty, and are in possession of a leave pass or duty pass, as the case may be, from carrying a reasonable quantity of food, cigarettes and tobacco for their own bona fide use and consumption during the period of their authorised leave or duty. Personnel proceeding on leave or duty outside their Camp area, barracks or quarters for periods of less than 48 hours shall not carry in excess of 50 cigarettes, or 2 oz of tobacco.

(c) Military and service Police are authorised to stop and search personnel found committing or reasonably suspected of committing an offence against this Order, and the vehicles in which such personnel are travelling. In the case of Air Force personnel the provisions of MR and ACI para 827 must be observed. Military and Service Police will make surprise checks from time to time of personnel travelling on ferries, trains, and buses and at suitable places.

(d) Military and Service Police are authorised to impound any article carried by personnel in quantities in excess of those allowed by this order. In doubtful cases goods may be impounded pending the production of proof that such goods are intended for bona fide purposes. In all cases a receipt for the goods impounded will be given.

84. WATERCRAFT - SECURITY

Personnel in charge of Unit Watercraft will ensure that such craft are rendered secure from use by unauthorised persons

85. OUT OF BOUNDS

(a) Residential areas in HIRO village have been placed out of bounds and sign posts have been erected. Personnel will NOT proceed beyond these sign posts.

(b) The STAR DANCE HALL is placed out of bounds.

86. INOCULATION AND VACCINATION PROCEDURE

Part I - Service Personnel

(a) Record of Service Books (A.B 85) will be checked on or about 20th of every second month, i.e. 20 Feb, Apr, Jun, Aug, Oct and 15 Dec and a list prepared of all who require inoculations by the end of the succeeding month, i.e. end of Mar, May, Jul, Sep, Nov and Jan. In the case of Dec, arrangements should commence about 15th so that inoculations may be completed before Christmas.

(b) Units whether or NOT carrying out their own inoculations will forward a list showing members requiring each separate inoculation or vaccination before 25 of each month or before 20 Dec to the officer in medical charge who will place the necessary requisitions with 20 Aust Rd Amb, between 20 and 25 of every second month, or, in the case of Dec, 15-20.

(c) Medical officers have been instructed to carry out inoculations during the last week of Feb, Apr, Jun, Aug, Oct and between 20 and 25 Dec. Personnel will be paraded to them at these dates, the exact time being arranged with the medical officer concerned.

(d) No other routine inoculations or vaccinations whatever will be given except as in para(c) whether for drafts, reinforcements or otherwise unless specifically authorised by SMO or by direction of DDMS BCOP.

(e) The unit clerical staff will enter up dates, types of inoculations and doses of personnel requiring them in accordance with para (a) and the following schedule :-

i. Refresher (booster) doses

Smallpox vaccination - A certified successful vaccination within 12 months or three successive certified negatives. In order to assess the result, the site of vaccination will be inspected by a medical officer on the second, fourth and sixth days following revaccination. A member showing a negative result will be revaccinated at least twice to ascertain whether a successful result can be obtained. The type of reaction (negative, immediate, accelerated or classical) to be entered and signed by MO. An entry without a signed result will be disregarded.

- T.B $\frac{1}{2}$ cc annually
- TT 1 cc at end of first year only
- Typhus 1 cc 6 monthly
- Cholera 1 cc 4 monthly
- Influenza A and B 1 cc, NO routine dose. Only when ordered by DDMS
- B Encephalitis 1 cc NO routine dose. Only when ordered by DDMS

ii. Initial Courses (Recruits are mainly concerned)

- Smallpox vaccination - A certified successful vaccination as above.
- T.B - 3 doses of $\frac{1}{4}$, $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{1}{2}$ cc at three weekly intervals
- TT 2 doses of 1cc each at 6 weekly intervals repeat at end of first year only
- Typhus 3 doses of 1cc each at 1 weeks interval
- Cholera 2 doses of 1cc each at two weeks interval
- Influenza A and B 1cc dose of 1cc each when ordered only
- B Encephalitis 3 doses of 1cc each at 7-10 days intervals when ordered only.

(f) Record of Service Books will be presented to the medical officer for signature before the parade disperses.

(g) Full use should be made of the vaccinations and inoculations continuation leaflet A.B 83 pp 38 and B available from SMO 34 Aust Inf Bde.

(h) Half Yearly Inoculation Return

Following the inoculations and vaccinations at the end of Jun and Dec and before 7 Jul and 7 Jan, units will render a half yearly inoculation return to this HQ as follows :-

If the parades for the end of Jun and late Dec are carried out properly results will approximate 100%

Part II - Wives and Families of members of BCOF and other Australian Civilians in J.A.S.M

(j) i. Adults over 15 years of age

Will be inoculated and vaccinated in the same way as troops except that inoculation against B Encephalitis will be on a voluntary basis. If they have NOT been vaccinated against smallpox within 6 months of embarkation for JAPAN or inoculated against typhus within 60 days of embarkation for JAPAN they will be immunised on arrival against the so diseases.

ii. Children (15 years of age and under)

Will be immunised in the same way as adults, but doses will be scaled down in accordance with age. Children between the ages of six months and 14 years will be also inoculated against Diphtheria in accordance with the medical officer's directions. Evidence of previous immunisation will be accepted. Inoculations against whooping cough will be done on a voluntary basis.



MONTHLY REPORT BY RMO

GENERAL

A further two drafts totalling approx 70 men returned to Australia this month.

Remarks in last month's report re the movement of the Bn to ETA JIMA have now been confirmed; the move is on and a party of about fifty men has already moved there on guard duty, and will probably become the advance party, leaving about 200 troops in the FUKUYAMA area. There is still no date for the movement of the main body, on which depend closure of the ADS, and of the PAC and movement of the RAP. RMO HQ BCOF is temporarily responsible for the health of the advance party, whose medical records will be made available to him from our files.

With the completion of the Cadre at HARAMURA, the RAP orderly there returned with stores to this unit.

Two troops (29 men) of 1 Aust Armd Car Sqn moved into barracks at ZENTSUJI, SHIKOKU, this month, for field trg exercises and become the medical responsibility of RMO 65 Aust Inf Bn.

HEALTH

Very satisfactory. Skin infections and sports injuries account for most sick parade attendances. A survey of 80 men for presence of intestinal parasites (worms) showed that about 3% have a light infestation with ascaris lumbricoides. These men were treated.

VD

The VD rate remains at a steady low level, but a sharp rise in PAC attendances before the departure of the last draft, and the fact that two cases of VD were contracted in FUKUYAMA, gave reason to suspect entry of one or two infected prostitutes into the city, and every effort is being made to deal with this situation.

STORES

Two monthly inoculation of troops have been held up by the non-arrival to date of vaccines requisitioned for.

HYGIENE

General hygiene in VASEY BARRACKS is satisfactory. Measures for mosquito control are being instituted from the end of this month, Fly proofing os messes, kitchens etc has become ineffective through wear and tear during the winter, but it does not appear feasible to carry out the extensive replacements of wire necessary in view of the imminent move, and the limited dollar supply for work of this kind. All possible efforts must be made, however, to prevent contamination of food by flies while open Japanese latrines remain in the camp area.

At the ZENTSUJI barracks, flyproofing was again poor, and disposal of garbage inadequate, but the barracks were otherwise excellent and steps are being taken to remedy these defects.

STAFF

Standard of work remains good, Cpl RICKARD received his promotion from the rank of Pte this month to fill an existing vacancy on RAP staff

90. SHAVING OF TROOPS BY JAPANESE BARBERS

- (a) It is considered an unnecessary risk to health to have troops shaved by any razors but their own whether inside or outside the camp.
- (b) The occasional occurrence of Secondary Syphilis alone would justify this observation, and other skin diseases such as impetigo may be transmitted or aggravated.
- (c) Therefore :-
- (i) Camp barbers are prohibited from shaving troops, except the shaving of the neck which is an essential part of a haircut -
- (ii) Furthermore, Troops will NOT be shaved by ANY Japanese barbers.
- (d) 65 Aust Inf Bn Routine Orders Part 1 No 14 of 1947 is cancelled.

91. DISCIPLINE - DRESS

Working Dress, Olive Drab or Green will only be worn when ordered, for occasions set out hereunder -

- (a) By persons engaged in handling oils, greases, paints etc,
- (b) For training when on Rifle Ranges, Field Firing or other training when ordered by Coy Commander,
- (c) Working or fatigue parties, when ordered by this Hq
- (d) When worn by NCOs at any time, badges of rank will be worn.
- (e) Olive drab or green will only be worn when persons are actually engaged in any of the abovementioned duties and will not be worn as an all day dress.

- (a) Summer dress will be taken into use on and from 1 May 48.

- b. Skating is still held regularly on two nights a week, and the occasional game of hockey on skates is enjoyed.


