

BRITISH COMMONWEALTH OCCUPATION FORCE65 AUSTRALIAN INFANTRY BATTALION.WAR DIARYCOMMANDING OFFICERS REPORT FOR MONTH OF MAY 48.

1. During the month of May, 65 Aust Inf Bn moved to new quarters at ETA JIMA, occupying as Adm. and Q. Block the rear building of BCOF HQ.
Troops were housed in BCOF troop housing block, Officers and Serjeants in "A" Officers Mess and BCOF Serjeants Mess respectively. This arrangement obtained until the end of May when both Messes became 65 Bn Messes.
The Pioneer Pl was placed in a building behind 130 AGH and transport lines near BCOF swimming pool.
2. On leaving FUKUYAMA Japanese officials expressed concern regarding possible action of unruly elements on the withdrawal of troops from the city but NO unusual incident has so far occurred.
3. The movement to ETA JIMA was carried out in three lifts, all by sea.
The advance party and families were lifted completely by 200 ton air-sea rescue craft and the remainder of personnel and stores by ARCL's and Japanese HASHIKAH's.
4. The move was entirely without incident, which reflects well on the good planning and execution of the Bn staff.
5. All ranks worked well in this move and great credit is due to the soldierly way in which it was carried out.
6. The Bn was visited by several personalities in May. Mr MASSEY, YMCA Commissioner and LtCol MARSON DSO ; Maj-Gen Lloyd and Mr MASSEY STANLEY on an investigation tour; Col CROMBIE ~~xxx~~ DPS spoke on ARA conditions in ALLEN HALL.
7. Morale is high. Troops are smartly turned out and move smartly, drawing numerous favorable comments in ETA JIMA. Morale was inclined to lower at leaving such a perfect barracks as VASEY BARRACKS is, but the Bn has quietly accustomed itself and morale is now at its usual high standard.
8. With the approach of the hot weather skin diseases are inclining to rise once again, apart from this health is ~~g~~ generally good.
9. Cricket is coming into its own and matches are played regularly on Wednesdays and Saturdays. Other popular forms of sport are swimming and tennis. The facilities at ETA JIMA lend themselves admirably to these latter.
10. Weather in May has been true spring - warm, clear days and cold nights with occasional rainstorms, a very good time of the year in Japan.
11. Religious observance has been good at FUKUYAMA, where the Bn had its own Chapel and Padre, but since the move when the same facilities do NOT exist a falling away in attendance is noticeable.
12. Training, apart from close order drill has been suspended owing to the move.
13. This month marks the end of a two and a half year period of occupation in the FUKUYAMA-ONOMICHI area. It is a milestone in the life of 65 Bn. The object of the Occupation has been carried out to its fullest extent in showing the Japanese

the democratic way of life. Many improvements in troop's conditions of life have come into being, which in turn are an outward demonstration to the Japanese.

It is with a feeling that a good job has been done in FUKUYAMA, often under difficult conditions that this period ends.

GENERAL

1. The move to ETA JIMA was confirmed and the advance party and main body moved on the 11 and 27 May respectively. The advance party was under the care of HQ BCOF RAP and RMO. The RMO, Sgt and one orderly moved with the main body leaving the corporal at FUKUYAMA with the rear party.

The PAC FUKUYAMA city was closed on the 20 May 48.

The ADS was closed on the 28 May 48 and moved with the main body of 65 Aust Inf Bn and the personnel returned to their HQ at HIRO.

The RMO assumed the duties of RMO Station Command ETA JIMA whilst the HQ BCOF RAP was taken over by 65 Aust Inf Bn.

The RAP excepting the remaining few troops at FUKUYAMA were attached to HQ BCOF RAP for the period 28 to 31 May 48.

HEALTH OF TROOPS

2. General health was satisfactory. There was a noticeable decrease in sick parade attendances after the departure of the advance party from FUKUYAMA, URTI has almost arrived at a nil level. Skin ~~dis~~ diseases were on the incline, which is to be expected with the weather gradually getting warmer.

3. Innoculations ~~XXXXXXXXXXXX~~

Japanese B Encephalitis innoculations were given to troops at FUKUYAMA and Det 1 Aust Armd Cmsqn at ZENTSUJI during the period 25 to 27 May.

4. VD

In FUKUYAMA area there were only a few cases of VD during the month. There was an increase amongst the advance party at ETA JIMA.

HYGIENE

5. General hygiene at VASEY BARRACKS was very satisfactory. The hygiene at ETA JIMA is only fair and is NOT up to the standard that it should be. Residual spraying with DDT of the barracks has been completed. There was noticeable increases in mosquitoes but flies are NOT prevalent.

STORES

6. Medical stores were generally supplied as required.

TRAINING

7. No ~~xxx~~ medical training was carried out during the month owing to the movements of the Bn. It is hoped to be able to do ~~some~~ some training during the coming month.

1. ACCOMMODATION

The month of May saw the evacuation of VASEY BARRACKS, FUKUYAMA and the subsequent occupation of barracks at ETA JIMA. While the barracks in the present area are NOT comparable to VASEY BARRACKS, the accommodation generally can be considered satisfactory. All furniture on charge at FUKUYAMA was transferred to 25 Infantry Division USA. Furniture in the ETA JIMA buildings is being checked for transfer from H.Q., B.C.O.F. to 65 Aust Inf Bn.

2. CLOTHING AND NECESSITIES

Generally satisfactory. Bulk indent received during May well supplied, except for Chevrons Badge of Rank, Anklets Web Size 3, and Boots A.B. Size 9/5.

3. WAR EQUIPMENT and M.T.

Rundown in strength resulted in surpluses in Arms and Equipment being held in Tech. Store. Is anticipated that authority will be forthcoming for the disposal of Stores and Eqpt. surplus to present requirements.

A further decrease in Unit. M.T. is anticipated.

4. RATIONS, FUELS, ETC.

(a) Rations drawn for the month totalled 4,477 and were generally good.

(b) Coal on hand at the end of May 702 tons plus BCOF reserve of 421 tons. With the close down of VASEY BARRACKS, Unit was made responsible for the movement of the coal to HIRO. Work is proceeding - likely to go on for approximately three weeks.

(c) No wood received during the month. Wood on hand was transferred with Stores to ETA JIMA. Wood supply for April, May and June, 45 tons from contractor at FUKUYAMA, NOT available for movement by the end of May. Wood will be railed to BASCO, HIRO, and 65 Bn. will draw as required.

5. LOAN 'A' STORES

Stores returned to 75 D.C.R.E. Refrigerators removed by Engineers.

6. GENERAL

Movement of Unit Stores from FUKUYAMA to ETA JIMA was carried out by sea, all without incident of any kind.

1. MILEAGE
Running mileage for month of May was 23,927, being greater than that for month of April by 2,314.
2. ACCIDENTS
There was (1) accident this month. Minor damage was caused to jeep 158841. Jeep has been evacuated to 346 LAD, not owing to accident but to mechanical defects present prior to accident.
3. MAINTENANCE
Maintenance has been good up to the last week of month, when the majority of vehicles were moved from FUKUYAMA to ETA JIMA.
Owing to lack of ramps and other facilities, maintenance is now not of a high standard, but should be back to usual high standard on completion of ramps, water point & other facilities essential to the care of vehicles.
4. REPAIRS
There has been some improvement of the availability of spare parts, which has enabled LAD Det. to carry out considerable work this month.
5. DRIVERS
The shortage of trained drivers is still prevalent and it has been necessary to utilise surplus NCOs from companies as drivers in order to keep vehicles on the road.
6. ROADS
FUKUYAMA roads are still bad. There has been some improvement due to the personal efforts of the transport platoon. Roads in ETA JIMA area are very satisfactory.

(iii) Mosquito repellent and gaiters for night wear are optional but personnel on duty as sentries will wear gaiters and will apply repellent lotion every 2 hours.

(iv) Personnel engaged in active physical sports, e.g. night basketball or tennis may wear appropriate clothing while actually playing sports, but will don clothing as laid down in sub para (i) immediately on finishing playing.

(v) Freon aerosol bombs will be used in all quarters and barrack rooms.

- (b) All OR personnel must be in possession of a Leave or Duty Pass when travelling to KURE or to any other island.

SWIMMING POOL

4. (a) The dangers of contracting diseases in uncontrolled swimming pools must be realized by all. The most common of these are:-
- (i) CONJUNCTIVITIS
 - (ii) OTITIS EXTERNA and MEDIA
 - (iii) Infections of the upper respiratory system.
 - (iv) Various skin diseases - of these fungus infections of the feet are very common.
 - (v) Gastro - intestinal infections (including TYPHOID FEVER in several instances).
5. The following rules will therefore, be observed by all personnel using the swimming pool at ETA JIMA:
- (a) (i) Urinate before entering swimming pool.
 - (ii) Take a shower before entering the pool.
 - (iii) Dip your feet in a solution in foot baths provided
 - (iv) Nose blowing and spitting will be done only into a gutter or into spitting receptacles.
 - (v) You are advised to plug your ears with cotton wool, and dispose of it after swimming, into containers provided.

/(vi)

- (vi) If you suffer from any skin disease, running ear, inflammation of eyes, diarrhoea or any disease of the upper respiratory tract, do NOT swim.
 - (vii) Do NOT interchange swimming costumes.
 - (viii) Do NOT allow children to run in and out of swimming pool boundaries.
 - (ix) Dogs are NOT allowed in the vicinity of the pool.
- (b)
- (i) Japanese nationals are forbidden to use the pool.
 - (ii) The pool will NOT be used outside the following hours - 0600 hrs to 1900 hrs.
 - (iii) The pool will be OUT OF BOUNDS between 0800 - 1200 hrs on each Monday, Wednesday and Saturday during cleaning and refilling.
 - (iv) An outer garment(s) will be worn over costumes when moving to and from the pool.

DOGS

36. Dogs are to be registered and inoculated and have tags. FRO 156 of 19 Sep 47 refers.
DOGS NOT permitted in barrack rooms, kitchens or messes. Kennels to be sited in approved places. Kennels and surrounds to be kept clean and sprayed with 5% solution of DDT in kerosene monthly or dusted with 10% DDT in talc.

WATER

7. (a) All water for whatever purpose used will be sterilized before use.
Water from reticulated tap supply will NOT be regarded as sterile unless specifically certified so by RMO or hygiene representative.
Where sterilization is NOT effected in bulk, hand super chlorination and detasting is to be done.
- (b) Reserve supplies of W.S.P. and detasting tablets are to be kept in reserve in case of failure of water supply in reticulated areas.
- (c) Swimming is NOT to be permitted in reservoirs or any fresh water.
Vide FRO 278 of 31 Aug 46.
8. Showers and shower-rooms are out of bounds from 0800 hrs to 1200 hrs daily unless special permission is granted for their use.

DISCIPLINE - OUT OF BOUNDS

9. The following list of Japanese buildings are placed out of bounds:-

10. All ~~allied~~ Japanese trains except the Allied coaches, trams and vehicles are placed OUT OF BOUNDS.
11. Should any officer or other rank require to enter buildings etc placed OUT OF BOUNDS by this order, he will obtain written authority from his CO or JO to do so.

DEW DROP INN


12. All ranks will conduct themselves in an orderly manner while inside the Dew Drop Inn.
13. Any requests made by the staff of the Dew Drop Inn will be complied with at once.
14. No foodstuffs or beverages will be taken from the Dew Drop Inn for consumption elsewhere.

FIRE

15. Prevention

It should be unnecessary to stress the great risk of fire which is constantly prevalent in JAPAN. The following points will be noted and acted upon in order to minimise fire risk:-

- (a) Untidiness Do NOT leave waste, rubbish, packing material etc lying round.
 - (b) Smoking Butt your cigarette properly when finished. Do NOT smoke in bed, where you may fall asleep with a lighted cigarette in your hand. Do NOT place a lighted cigarette down and forget it. Be sure your match is out before putting it in the rubbish bin etc.
 - (c) Electricity Do NOT overload electrical appliances. Do NOT tamper with leads and leave them exposed. Turn off all electrical appliances when you have finished using them.
 - (d) Naked Flame Should you be using an oil lamp, candle or an open fire of any sort, do NOT leave it unattended, Extinguish it when you have finished using it.
 - (e) Inflammable Liquids These must be stored separately away from other materials, especially those of a combustible nature. Do NOT smoke or throw matches with 50 feet of petrol, oil and other inflammable liquids.
16. Familiarize yourself with the location and distribution of fire fighting appliances and how to use them, and the means of escape from buildings. It will pay dividends in case of fire.
 17. Do NOT interfere with or empty drums and appliances used and installed for the purpose of fire fighting.
 18. In case of fire:-
 - (a) The person discovering the fire will attempt to extinguish same, at the same time giving the alarm and shouting FIRE.
 - (b) One man will immediately phone for the Fire Unit, No 769
 - (c) The senior person will take charge until the arrival of the Fire Unit. He will ensure that all personnel are clear of the burning installation before attempting to save official papers etc and personal property.
 - (d) Upon the arrival of the Fire Unit, the OC or senior member of the Fire Unit will take charge of all operations to combat the fire, save life and property.
 - (e) All personnel will assemble on Bn parade ground in front of BHQ.

100. WEAPONS

(a) Members of the BCOF, and their dependents, persons attached to or accompanying the Force and civilians employed by the Force will not have in their possession any lethal weapon otherwise than in the course of duty, except -

(i) Shotguns of not exceeding 12 Gauge for the purpose of authorised hunting or game shooting provided the weapon is duly registered at the office or head of the Provost Service or Service Police of the Formation concerned.

(ii) Non-military private firearms for the protection of their families and homes in Japan provided the retention of such weapon is authorised by a Formation Comd or officer duly authorised by him and the weapon is duly registered as prescribed in sub para (i).

(b) All other non-service private weapons will be surrendered by holders and held by Units in safe custody. These weapons will be returned to owners on embarkation from Japan.

(c) When firearms are registered under para (a) (i) the registering authority shall issue the owner a permit showing the type, make, calibre, and number of the weapon and the name and address and regimental particulars of the owner.

Copies of the permit will be distributed as follows :

- Original - Owner
- Duplicate - DPM BCOF
- Triplicate - Retained by issuer.

(d) "Lethal Weapon" includes firearms of any description, explosives swords and daggers, knives having a blade longer than three inches, truncheons and knuckle dusters, for the purpose of this order.

65 Aust Inf Bn Routine Order Part 1 No 240/47 is cancelled.

101. SECURITY OF MT VEHICLES

(a) Inside Unit Lines

(i) When not in use MT Vehicles are to be parked in the Unit Transport lines.

(ii) No vehicle is to be allowed to leave the Transport Lines without the driver first reporting to the Security Post or Transport Office.

(iii) All drivers returning to the transport lines will book in their vehicles at the office. Any driver found in the charge of a service vehicle without written authority is liable to be arrested for suspected theft or improper possession and the vehicle impounded.

(b) Outside Unit Lines

(i) A Service MT vehicle will not be left unattended in any public place or public car parks other than in the most exceptional circumstances, for which the driver will be required to give a full justification if loss occurs.

(ii) If a driver (irrespective of rank) considers his duty will necessitate leaving the vehicle unattended, a male person in addition to the driver will be carried.

(iii) Should an emergency arise whereby the driver has to leave his vehicle unattended, the vehicle is to be immobilised in accordance with instructions contained in sub paras (d) and (e).

(c) Service Car Parks

Vehicles may be left in Service Car parks under the following conditions :-

(i) When the park is guarded by Provost or other personnel.

(ii) The custody of the vehicle is handed only to the guard.

(iii) The vehicle is immobilised in accordance with sub para (d) and (e)

(d) IMMOBILISING MT VEHICLES

MT vehicles are to be immobilised in the following manner when not in use or left unattended :-

(i) Remove HT lead - Coil to Distributor, and

(ii) Where keys are fitted, lock Ignition and remove Ignition Keys;

(iii) Any other additional means directed by Unit or Formation Comds.

(e) Drivers are to ensure that the steering wheels on vehicles parked in any unguarded area are to be locked by means of a strong chain and padlock.

(f) Duty Runs

Drivers are on duty at all times when out with a service vehicle and will remain with such vehicle throughout. The driver may arrange for a suitable relief during the waiting time on the condition that the relief does not leave the vehicle until the return of the driver.

102. APPLICATIONS FOR SERVICE WITH REGULAR ARMY SPECIAL RESERVE

Members desiring service with RASR are required to submit applications in writing to Coy Commander of the Coy with which they are serving. Warrant Officers and NCOs are required to complete Pro Forma at present in use for application for service with ARA.

Coys will submit nominal roll of applicants, to Bn HQ by 1200hrs on Thursday of each week until further notice.

103. FLY CONTROL

103. INTRODUCTION OF GOODS INTO JAPAN - RESTRAINT OF

(a) The following classes of goods manufactured, produced or obtained outside Japan shall not be brought into the BCOF area of occupation by service personnel, their dependents or civilian employees of BCOF, by sea, land, air, or through postal or other service channels, except for bona fide personal use.

Note (a) The introduction into Japan of tobacco and cigarettes is restricted to 3 lbs and 1000 cigarettes at any one time respectively.

Note (b) These items will only be imported on the authority of a BCOF Medical Officer.

Note (c) The maximum number of cameras which may be imported by an individual during his service with BCOF is one still and one cine camera.

Note (d) Fire arms other than sporting guns and rifles and authorised equipment will NOT be imported into Japan.

Such goods will not be sold or bartered except with the written approval of a Formation Commander.

(b) Authority is given for personnel duly appointed as commanders at ports, airports, and other points of entry, to carry out searches for goods and require the declaration of goods brought by individuals entering Japan. In doubtful cases and where goods are found to be in excessive quantities, searchers are empowered to impound goods pending the production of proof that such goods are intended for a bona fide purpose. In all such cases a receipt for the goods impounded will be given.

104. RESTRICTIONS ON WATER TRAVEL ON INLAND SEA

All Japanese civilian ferry services are "Out of Bounds" to BCOF personnel for Duty or Non-duty travel with the following exceptions :-

- (b) MIYAJIMA-MIYAJIMA GUCHI Ferry. From Monday to Saturday between 0530 hrs and 1700hrs daily.
- (c) When Formation Commanders approval has been obtained for duty travel when other suitable means of transport is NOT available.

105. MEDICAL- INOCULATION PARADE

A parade for inoculation against Japanese 'B' encephalitis will be held at unit RAP at 1000hrs on Wednesday 16 June 1948.

- (iii) Personal guests of unit members (this will NOT exceed 4 to each mess)
- (iv) Staff and patients.
- (v) Hospital Sisters and Nurses under special arrangements by HQ 34 Aust Inf Bde.

(b) All requests for permission to visit 116 Con Depot are to be made to this HQ for forwarding to HQ 34 Aust Inf Bde.



SUMMARY OF RECENT AUST PRESS REPORTS

Prepared by Public Relations HQ BCOF 6 Jun 48

The Australian Army Minister (Mr CHAMBERS) has recently released two reports which reflect great credit upon Australian members of BCOF in Japan.

Three Chaplains General of the Australian Military Forces said in their report that there was " widespread resentment at the

irresponsible accusations so widely publicised in Australia, which we discovered to have been grossly unjust and unfair".

The Chaplains General said also that the Character and conduct of the men serving in BCOF were equal to the tradition and of the AIF at its best and that in BCOF Australia had a force of which it might justly be proud.

An independent report, by Major-General C E M LLOYD and Mr MASSEY STANLEY, stated the following conclusions:-

Living Conditions :- Living standards in barracks and in married quarters are uniformly high, in many cases luxurious, but perhaps expensive for married other ranks. Amenities and services are on a scale unprecedented in the British Services.

Housing No families of troops serving abroad are better housed. The decision to charge rent from the date of notification instead of the date of occupancy has removed all substance from complaints that houses were occupied on the understanding that no rent would be charged.

Discipline and Morale : Morale is high and discipline good.

Venereal Disease :- The high incidence of VD in the civil population and their moral deterioration as the result of post-war economic and social conditions has meant a high VD rate in the Allied Occupation Forces in Japan. BCOF incidence was very high in 1946 but has been materially reduced. Incidence is, however still ~~very high~~ far too high. The Commander in Chief BCOF (Lt-Gen HCH ROBERTSON) has vigorously implemented all control measures known to current British practice, but the rate still persists.

Black Marketing Allegations of wide spread black marketing by the troops are without foundation. It is very easy to unearth unsavoury individual cases in any military force serving abroad, particularly in Occupation Forces. The BCOF record is conspicuously clean, having regard to other occupation forces in the world today.

These reports received the fullest and widest publicity in the press throughout Australia. They appeared under headings such as "Black Marketing claim 'unfounded'", "Reports exonerate JAPAN troops" "BCOF troops vindicated" "Disservice to BCOF troops" "Record is clean, report says".

Under the heading 'The good name of our forces in Japan' the Melbourne Age said in a leading article :-

"Exoneration of the Australian Troops in Japan from a number of unsavoury charges will be received with gratification, though not with surprise, by the people of Australia generally.....Most of the allegations made against them, according to the frank report by the Committee of Investigation, proved to be unwarranted. Those that had some foundation of fact were found to be grossly exaggerated....."

The Melbourne Herald said in a leading article :-

"It is now clear that the charges of immorality which were made against Australian members of the BCOF in Japan have dwindled under independent investigation.....Unfortunately the publicity given to the charges derived from the fact that they were received some backing from spokesmen in responsible positions. The Legion of ex-servicemen considered that there was some substance in the allegations to justify such an inquiry and publicly identified itself with the matter. The lesson is that such bodies should exercise great caution in taking up charges of this kind....."

112. "Q" STORE PROCEDURE FOR MEMBERS MARCHING OUT OF UNIT ON TRANSFER OR DETACHMENT

- (a) Personnel leaving this unit on transfer MUST report to the QM store prior to movement. Unless special arrangements are made with the QM for the transfer of F12 items, such items will be returned prior to marching out.
- (b) Personnel leaving the unit on detachment will report to QM store prior to movement. In some cases personnel moving on detachment may retain their F12 items, subject to the nature of the detachment. If a member on detachment is ultimately transferred, then the return of F12 items to the issuing unit is necessary, unless arrangements for the transfer of the items are made with the QM.
- (c) From the point of view of Stores Accounting it is absolutely necessary that the QM be advised of all movements of personnel, either on transfer or detachment.

113. USE OF BICYCLES

Bicycles will NOT be ridden after dusk unless equipped with headlight and tail light or reflector of the same standard as required in Australia.

(34 Aust Inf Bde AG3268)

114. UNLAWFUL POSSESSION OR DISPOSAL OF FIREARMS AND EXPLOSIVES

- (a) In this instruction, "explosives" means explosive substances of any kind and includes any ammunition containing a propellant, or explosive filling or live cap.
- (b) A member in possession of firearms or explosives, unless such are on issue to him as part of his authorised army equipment, is amenable as regards such possession to the laws of the State or ordinances of the Territory in which he is serving.
- (c) Attention is drawn to DA 79. Ex-enemy equipment, other than personal effects of captured enemy personnel, is Commonwealth property, and, unless a member has been duly authorised to retain it as a souvenir, its retention is an offence against the Defence Act.
- (d) Except when acting in the course of his duty, a member will not deliver or transmit to, or attempt to deliver or transmit to, any other person, or acquire in any way from or attempt to acquire in any way from, any other person, any firearms or explosives, the property of the Commonwealth.
- (e) To ensure that unauthorised firearms and explosives are not brought back to Australia from overseas, adequate arrangements will be made by the despatching authority for the examination at the latest practicable moment prior to embarking or emplaning, of the kit and baggage of every member, and the removal therefrom of unauthorised firearms and explosives. Before acceptance of unaccompanied baggage for despatch to Australia from overseas, an inspection of such baggage will be made by the MFO or other officer accepting baggage for

despatch, and any unauthorised firearms and explosives removed.

(f) When any member is charged with an offence in respect of any act, conduct or omission forbidden by this instruction, such offence will not be dealt with summarily without the approval of superior authority.

115. OUT OF BOUNDS

All Guard Rooms in 65 Aust Inf Bn Area are out of bounds to other ranks except when on Guard or other authorised duty.

118. FIRE PRECAUTIONS- OIL BURNING KITCHEN RANGES



6. Social.


An officer of the Bn on seconded duty celebrated his marriage in TOKYO to an American Citizen.

Minor damage was caused to Trucks $\frac{1}{2}$ ton 4X4 160341, 157534 and 158890 all of which were involved in slight accidents in the Tokyo area.

3. MAINTENANCE

The maintenance is up to date on all vehicles with the unit at Eta Jima. No reports have been received from those on detachment up till the present time.

4. REPAIRS

Spare parts are still hard to obtain, but repairs are very satisfactory.

5. DRIVERS

N.C.O. drivers are still being employed also a percentage of Japanese, the latter being highly satisfactory both in their driving ability and the manner in which they apply maintenance to their vehicles.

6. ROADS

Roads in the Eta Jima area and Kure area are a big improvement to those on which the unit vehicles were employed in the past (in the Fukuyama area).

7. GENERAL

The general appearance and mechanical condition of all vehicles in this area is very satisfactory at the present time, the majority have received a general overhaul and repainting which has improved their serviceability and appearance considerably.

Subject: RMO'S REPORT ON THE DEATH OF NX178691, CPL NK SMALL.

During the tour of duty in TOKYO, the death occurred in a most unfortunate manner of Cpl SMALL. He was evacuated to MEGURO Hospital on 4 July with the diagnosis of acute appendicitis. When told that an operation would be necessary he said that he thought he was a "bleeder".

The operation had therefore to be delayed until tests could be made to determine whether he was in fact a "bleeder", and if so, to ensure he would not bleed to death as a result of the operation. By the time results of these tests were to hand, the operation had been delayed 18 hours. The tests showed that there was no great danger of bleeding. By this time the inflammation of his appendix had progressed somewhat, though his condition remained good.

The operation, necessarily carried out in the heat of the day and necessarily taking longer because of the more advanced inflammation and the need to tie every small bleeding point, progressed without incident to near completion. At this stage the patient suddenly developed convulsions and stopped breathing. All resuscitative measures were unsuccessful.

This was a rare condition known as "ether convulsions", due to the anaesthetic ether. Its exact causation is a mystery, but long anaesthesia and overheating are believed to be contributing factors which were unavoidably present in this case.

Thus a most unlucky combination of chances brought about this tragically sudden death.

143. SECURITY - NAVAL ACADEMY

Under NO circumstances will Japanese be permitted to remove from the Academy Area any Materials, Timber, Foodstuffs or any other unauthorised articles unless the Japanese is in possession of clearance issued and signed by the Station Commander or his SO 'A' & 'Q'.

Chits signed by servicemen, dependents or any other personnel apart from abovementioned will NOT be accepted as lawful authority for removal of articles from the area.

In any such case the article will be confiscated and together with the chit submitted to HQ Station Command SO 'A' & 'Q' or RSM.

144. SLOWING DOWN OF MT

The practice of approaching at high speed and then changing down to a lower gear while still at comparatively high speed, in order to obtain the necessary deceleration when slowing down for any purpose e.g. stopping, entering gateways etc, or negotiating sharp curves, corners or intersections is forbidden. This practice produces excessive and unnecessary strains on the whole transmission and causes excessively high engine revs.

146. OUT OF BOUNDS AREA - BCOF COMBINED DETENTION BARRACKS

BCOF COMBINED DETENTION BARRACKS and the area to a depth of 200 yards from boundary fences, including all roads, are "OUT OF BOUNDS" to all BCOF personnel and vehicles unless reporting to Detention Barracks on duty.

147. PRIVATELY OWNED ELECTRICAL APPLIANCES - INSTALLATION OF

(a) Before privately owned electrical equipment is installed in Unit Messes, Living Quarters, Dependant Housing etc, the following action will be taken :-

- (i) Application will be made to OC of unit, or in case of Dependants, to SSO for permission to use and instal equipment.
- (ii) OC or SSO will inform the local Engr organization who will examine the equipment for technical faults, and also in relation to the proposed usage points.
- (iii) Engrs will, if the equipment is satisfactory, issue to the owner the following certificate:-

- (iv) If equipment is unsatisfactory, either technically or for usage at a given point, no certificate will be issued and the OC in the case of a unit, will be responsible that the equipment is not connected. If the applicant is a dependant or the head of a family, the SSO will inform him or her that the equipment is unsatisfactory, and it will be the responsibility of the head of the family to ensure that it is not connected to the electric circuit.

148. IMPORTATION OF GOODS, MERCHANDISE AND MATERIAL INTO JAPAN

- (a) The purpose of this order is to curb black market activities and the illegal or unauthorised importation into the BCOF area of occupation in Japan of goods, merchandise and material by sea, land or air, or through postal channels.
- (b) Members of the British Commonwealth Occupation Force, their dependants, persons attached to or accompanying the Force, or civilians employed by the Force shall not bring, import or introduce into Japan any goods, merchandise, or materials classified in this paragraph either by land, sea or air or through postal channels, except as expressly authorised in this order :-
- (i) Tobacco and cigarettes. The introduction into Japan of tobacco and cigarettes is absolutely restricted to 4 oz of tobacco or 200 cigarettes at any one time by any one adult person for his personal use.
- (ii) Intoxicating liquor, which expression means spirits, wines, ale and beer and any other liquor capable of producing intoxication is prohibited.
- (iii) Penicillin, sulphur drugs, narcotics and similar products, and saccharine and similar products are prohibited except upon the written authority of a BCOF medical officer in bona fide cases of illness and for the personal use in Japan of the person authorised to use the same.
- (iv) Radios and accessories, electrical equipment, watches, clocks, fountain pens, magazine pencils, binoculars and jewellery are prohibited except if reasonably required for the bona fide personal use in Japan of the person importing the same.
- (v) Cameras and accessories are prohibited except that each person may bring, import or introduce one still and one cine-camera for his own bona fide personal use.
- (vi) Firearms are prohibited other than sporting guns and rifles reasonably required for bona fide personal use in Japan.
- (vii) Perishable and consumable goods and merchandise, e.g. food-stuffs, soap and the like are prohibited except if reasonably required for the bona fide personal use of the person importing the same or his family.
- (viii) Clothing, male or female, including dress materials, suit lengths, woolen and cotton goods, knitting wool and the like are prohibited except if reasonably required for the bona fide personal use of the person importing the same or his family.
- (ix) Any other goods, merchandise or material whatever nature are prohibited except if reasonably required for the bona fide personal use in Japan of the person importing the same or his family.
- (c) Members of the British Commonwealth Occupation Force, their dependants, persons attached to or accompanying the Force shall not sell, barter or exchange any article, goods or merchandise imported, brought into or introduced into Japan under the authority of para (b) of this Order. This will not bar non-profit making sales or exchanges of personal items by and between members, dependants and other persons covered by para (b) and/or any other section of the Occupation Force.
- (d) This order does not prohibit the importation or introduction into Japan of goods, merchandise, material or equipment by any person acting in the course of his Official Duty.

- (e) The burden of establishing that any particular goods, merchandise, material sought to be imported into Japan is or are reasonably required for bona fide personal use or for official use or is otherwise legitimately being imported brought or introduced into Japan, shall always be upon the person importing or seeking to import the goods, merchandise or material.
- (f) Authority is given for persons duly appointed by Commanders at sea ports, air ports and other points of entry to carry out searches for goods brought or suspected of being introduced into Japan in violation of this order, and to require persons to declare at the time of their entry into Japan goods in their possession or control, and to seize and confiscate contraband goods or goods in excess of authorized import (including goods reasonably suspected of being contraband, or excessive in quantity) and/or the proceeds of any illegal transaction in such goods. In such cases of seizure, the person from whom any property is taken shall have the same rights in relation to the property as a person from whom property is seized under the provisions of FRO 152/47 and any seized property under this order will be disposed in the same manner provided for the disposition of seized property under paragraph 2 of FRO 152/47.


- (a) The BCOF Farm at Shimogahara is out of bounds to all ranks. Personnel may only visit the farm after applying in writing, at least four days prior to the intended visit, to the DDST HQ BCOF stating as follows : +
- (i) reason for the proposed visit
 - (ii) number in party
 - (iii) number of females in party.
- (b) Only in the case of visitors obtaining a personal invitation from a member of the Farm Units with the concurrence of the OC, will permission be granted by the DDST HQ BCOF, vide para (a), to stay overnight.

154. INCOME TAX AND SOCIAL SERVICES CONTRIBUTIONS - TAXATION YEAR 1947/48

- (a) It has been decided that the general procedure of issuing Group Certificates to individuals at the end of a taxation year will now be extended to members of the Army, and that this procedure will be adopted for the taxation year 1947/48.
- (b) As Group Certificates may not all be available to members until August or September, approval has been given by the Taxation Department for a general extension of time of lodgement of income tax returns for members of the Army until 30th September 1948.
- (c) It is essential that income tax returns be forwarded to the Deputy Commissioner for Taxation in the state in which the member's pay account is being maintained, and in this regard the DFO concerned will forward to units the correct income tax return form with the relevant Group Certificate. This action is necessary as income tax return forms for all States are not identical and it will obviate the necessity for individual members obtaining such forms.
- (d) It will be ensured that income tax returns are not forwarded by members to Deputy Commissioners for Taxation until the Group Certificates showing taxable emoluments are available. When Group certificates are received from DFOs, they will be distributed to members for attachment to completed income tax returns, which will be forwarded to the respective Deputy Commissioners for Taxation.
- (e) A further MBI will be issued on this subject in due course.

DISCIPLINE - RECENT COURTS MARTIALS

Two soldiers convicted of stealing 93 shirts and 15 pairs of trousers from a Japanese factory were sentenced to imprisonment for 12 months and 9 months respectively, each to be discharged from His Majesty's service.

A NCO found guilty of stealing a sum of money from a Japanese was reduced to the ranks and awarded detention for six months.

A soldier found guilty of assisting a person in custody to escape by supplying him with hack-saw blades was awarded detention for six months.

A NCO convicted of conspiracy to defeat the course of justice and other offences was sentenced to be reduced to the ranks and to detention for 2 years. This soldier conspired with two others to deny all knowledge of traffic accident in which he was involved and which resulted in the death of a Japanese national; he also made out a false report of the accident and improperly destroyed the G2.

A soldier was found guilty of conspiracy to obstruct the course of public justice in that he conspired with two others to persuade a Japanese national not to identify anyone as the person who drove a motor car which caused the death of a Japanese. He was sentenced to detention for 9 months and to be discharged from His Majesty's service.

For falsely representing himself to be a Military Policeman and thereby gaining access to a Japanese dwelling house for improper purposes, a soldier was sentenced to undergo detention for 12 months.

Found guilty of conspiring to represent themselves as Military Policemen and thereby obtain possession of Motor Tyres and of stealing, three soldiers were sentenced to detention, one for 15 months and others for 12 months.

The sentences have been confirmed and promulgated.

GENERAL

1. I, NX66629 Capt S W NESS took over comd of the Guard Det in TOKYO from Maj C A EAST 16 Jul 48.
2. Previous routine was maintained. Drill periods for RAAF personnel were lengthened but at the end of our tour of duty their drill was still only of fair standard. A high standard was achieved by the Bn personnel.
3. Owing to Honour Gd commitments, Gd mounting had to be delayed on 3 occasions from 2 - 6 hours. Guard duties for the individuals fell once in 3 days.

HONOUR GUARD INSPECTIONS AND CEREMONIAL PARADES

4. Haneda Air Port 18 Jul - 2 Offrs 50 ORs for C in C and Parliamentary Delegation
Haneda Air Port 24 Jul - 1 Offr 26 ORs (AMF)
1 Offr 24 ORs (RAAF) for CAM
YOKOHAMA Port Area 4 Aug - 4 Offrs 91 ORs for Gen EICHEBERGER.

All these Guards were commended for smartness in drill and dress. Gen EICHEBERGER was deeply impressed by AMF component of his Honour Guard.

INSPECTIONS

5. The Comd Brit Com Sub Area TOKYO, Col FOSTER twice inspected the guard at the ceremonial changing and on both occasions expressed his pleasure over the dress and smartness of the Guard.

DISCIPLINE

7. The behaviour of the troops in camp or on leave was very good at all times. Remarks from senior officers, both Aust and American, also civilians and members of the Pro Det confirmed this.

8. Only one offence of a serious nature was committed - Striking of a superior officer - and a few cases of absence from TATTOO.

9. Frequent snap bed checks were made with negative results.

MEDICAL

10. The Medical Officer's Report attached at Appx A deals with the health condition of the troops.

MESSING

11. Sgts Mess held several social functions and members of HMS LONDON were entertained during their visit to TOKYO.

12. A billiard table was installed in the mess and proved very popular.

ORs MESS

13. Members of the Gd Det used Camp ORs mess throughout tour of duty. Kitchens were staffed from EBISU Camp Staff. Guard Coy Orderly Officers supervised meals, meal parades and kitchen hygiene.

14. Standard of meals for the whole period was high. Quantity of food was sufficient. Few complaints were received and troops generally were well satisfied.

TRANSPORT

15. Transport Section continued to operate efficiently. Maintenance was of a high standard.

16. Mileage for this period increased considerably owing to the numerous trips to YOKOHAMA and HANEDA Air Port for funerals and Honour Guards.

17. No accidents occurred during this period. 2 trucks $\frac{1}{2}$ ton and 1 truck 15 cwt were evacuated to Wksps for minor repairs.

AMENITIES

18. Camp theatre was well patronized by the troops.

19. Beer Garden The establishment of a beer garden in the vicinity of the swimming pool was a feature much appreciated by the troops. The quantity of beer available and convenient trading hours induced sensible drinking and the privilege was in no way abused by troops of the Guard Coy.

20. KOOKABURRA Club and Camp Facilities The wet canteen was maintained in this club in addition to the beer garden. This club was well attended when the beer garden was closed through wet weather. The billiard room and library were constantly used and NOT abused. Tennis Courts and swimming pool were appreciated and regularly used by Officers and troops.

ORGANIZED TOURS

21. Notice of available tours was promulgated to troops early in tour of duty. Little advantage was taken of these because:-

- (a) Troops preferred to make their own arrangements and go where they could in their own time.
- (b) Regular Gd Duties together with special parades, Guards of Honour, funerals etc required that troops spend at least 2 - 3 hours daily preparing clothes and equipment, to keep high standard of dress which was maintained throughout whole of tour.
- (c) Use was made of week end trips to KAWANA Hotel
