	29 Mar (Contd)		<p>HM evacuated to 2/2 AGH.</p> <p>The morale of the tps in this Bde is fairly high in spite of the fact that the majority have suffered considerable disappointment due to no home leave having been granted during the year spent in this area.</p> <p>Generally the tps have felt more contented since being warned to prepare for tropical service, because they now realise that their period of inactivity is almost over, and that there is little or no chance of being granted home leave prior to embarkation.</p> <p>There has been an increasing number of applications for compassionate leave. This is probably due to the knowledge that normal home leave will not be granted. Practically all applications for compassionate leave or release etc are forwarded to L of C for investigation.</p> <p>It has been noticed, in most cases, from the confidential investigator's report received, that the circumstances are such as to warrant a favourable recommendation by the investigating officer. But, the L of C letter covering the report, in most cases disagrees with the report of the investigating officer.</p> <p>There are some cases where it would appear that outside influence has been successful in obtaining the release from the army of soldiers whose grounds for release are not as strong as those of soldiers whose applications have been refused.</p> <p>This has led to a belief amongst many soldiers that handling of such applications by L of C and Manpower authorities is inconsistent and often unfair.</p>

	31 Mar		<p>Second Cholera inoculation given to all personnel of Bde HQ.</p> <p>It is interesting to note that there has been recent evidence of a Political Party using the army as a field in which to plant its doctrine.</p> <p>An example is the petition for six shillings per day battle bonus for all tps, which was circulated by the Communist party in conjunction with the Queensland Trades and Labour Council. The petition was circulated in this Bde by soldiers associated with the abovementioned organisations.</p> <p>It is not known what number of soldiers signed the petition and it is noteworthy that officers were not asked to sign it and not informed of it.</p> <p>A notice was published by units of the Bde and displayed on sub-unit notice boards. As a result of this notice it is known that many soldiers refrained from signing the petition (Copy of notice attached). <i>pwd with Feb dets</i></p> <p>However, there is no evidence, within this Bde, that political influence or activities has had any subversive effect on discipline.</p>

3. GENERAL

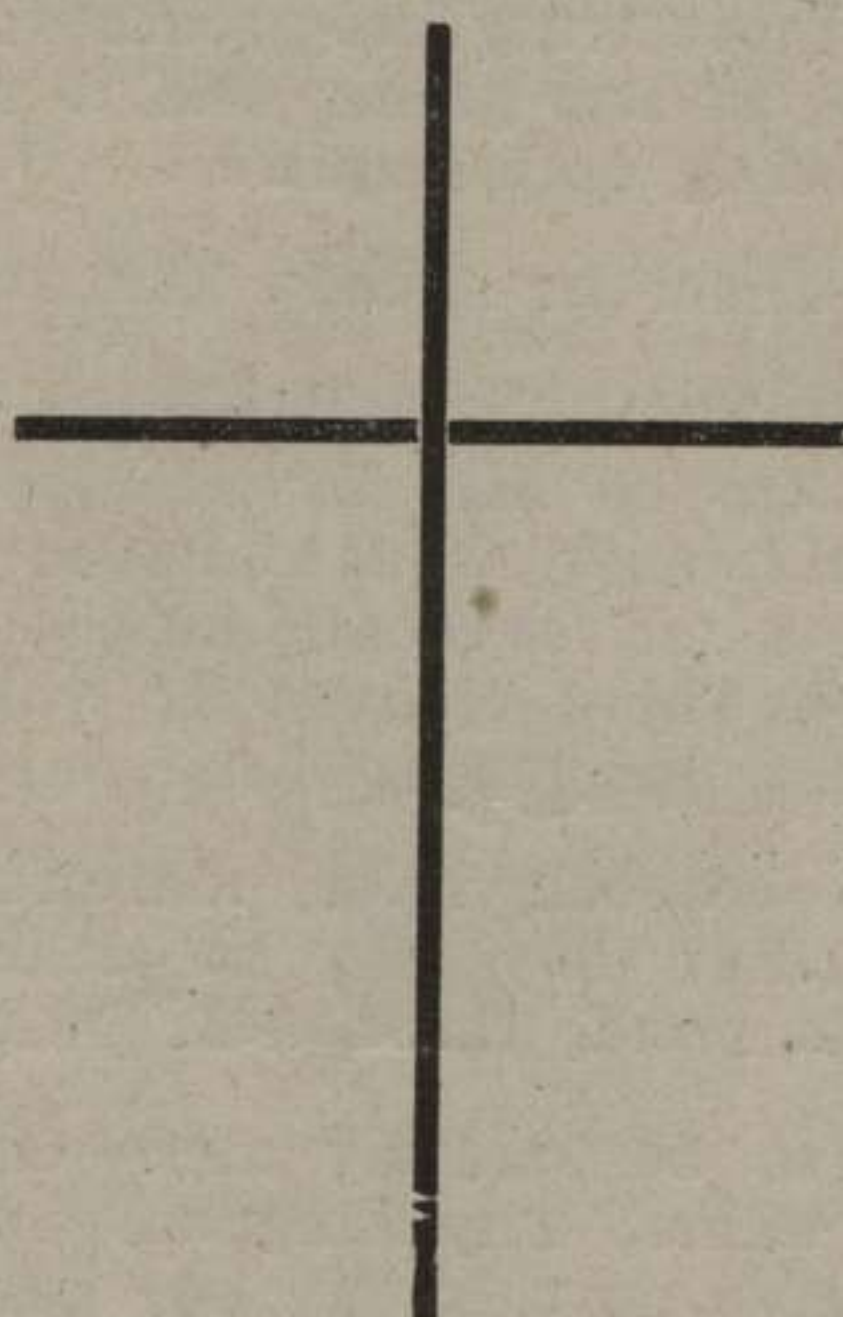

ORDER OF SERVICE

HYMN—

When I survey the wondrous Cross
On which the Prince of Glory died,
My richest gain I count but loss,
And pour contempt on all my pride.

All the vain things that charm me most
I sacrifice them to His blood.

See from His head, His hands, His feet,
Sorrow and love flow mingled down;
Did e'er such love and sorrow meet,
Or thorns compose so rich a crown?

Were the whole realm of nature mine,
That were an offering far too small,
Love so amazing, so Divine,
Demands my soul, my life, my all.

SENTENCES.—"Is it nothing to you all ye that pass by? Behold and see if there be any sorrow like unto my sorrow."

"God commendeth His love towards us, and that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us."

EXHORTATION.—Beloved, we are come together in the presence of Almighty God and of the whole company of heaven to offer unto Him through our Lord Jesus Christ our worship and praise and thanksgiving; to make confession of our sins; to pray, as well for others as for ourselves, that we may know more truly the greatness of God's love and show forth in our lives the fruits of His grace; and to ask on behalf of all men such things as their well-being doth require.

Wherefore let us kneel in silence and remember God's presence with us now.

GENERAL CONFESSION (to be said by ALL).—O God, our Father, we have sinned against Thee in thought, word and deed; we have not loved Thee with all our heart; we have not loved our neighbours as ourselves. Have mercy upon us, we beseech Thee; cleanse us from our sins; and help us to overcome our faults; through Jesus Christ our Lord, AMEN.

ABSOLUTION.—Grant we beseech Thee, merciful Lord, to Thy faithful people pardon and peace, that they may be cleansed from all their sins, and serve Thee with a quiet mind; through Jesus Christ our Lord.—AMEN.

THE LORD'S PRAYER (to be said by all).—Our Father, which art in heaven, Hallowed be Thy name; Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done in earth as it is in heaven, give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive them that trespass against us, and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil; for Thine is the Kingdom, the power, and the glory, for ever and ever.—AMEN.

HYMN—

There is a green hill far away,
Without a city wall,
Where the dear Lord was crucified,
Who died to save us all.

We may not know, we cannot tell
What pains He had to bear,
But we believe it was for us
He hung and suffered there.

He died that we might be forgiven,
He died to make us good,

LESSON: Luke 23; 13—26, 32—3.—And Pilate, when he had called together the chief priests and the rulers and the people, said unto them: "Ye have brought this man unto me, as one that perverteth the people: and behold, I, having examined him before you, have found no fault in this man

touching those things whereof ye accuse him: no, nor yet Herod: for I sent you to him; and lo, nothing worthy of death is done unto him. I will therefore chastise him and release him." (For of necessity he must release one unto them at the feast).

And they cried out all at once, saying "Away with this man, and release unto us Barabbas": (who, for a certain sedition made in the city, and for murder, was cast into prison).

Pilate therefore, willing to release Jesus, spake again to them.

But they cried saying, "Crucify him, Crucify him."

And he said unto them the third time: "Why, what evil hath he done? I have found no cause of death in him: I will therefore chastise him, and let him go."

And they were instant with loud voices, requiring that he might be crucified. And the voices of them and of the chief priests prevailed. And Pilate gave sentence that it should be as they required. And he released unto them him that for sedition and murder was cast into prison, whom they had desired; but he delivered Jesus to their will.

And as they led him away, they laid hold upon one Simon, a Cyrenian, coming out of the country, and on him they laid the cross, that he might bear it after Jesus.

And there were also two other, malefactors, led with him to be put to death. And when they were come to the place, which is called Calvary, THERE THEY CRUCIFIED HIM, and the malefactors, one on the right hand, and the other on the left.

APOSTLES CREED (to be said by ALL): I believe in God the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth: And in Jesus Christ his only son our Lord, Who was conceived by the Holy Ghost, Born of the Virgin Mary, Suffered under Pontius Pilate, Was crucified, dead, and buried; He descended in Hell; The third day he rose again from the dead; He ascended into Heaven, And sitteth on the right hand of God the Father Almighty; From thence He shall come to judge the quick and the dead. I believe in the Holy Ghost; The Holy Catholic Church; The Communion of Saints; The Forgiveness of sins; The Resurrection of the body; And the Life Everlasting.—AMEN.

PRAYERS:

Almighty God, we beseech Thee graciously to behold this Thy family, for which our Lord Jesus Christ was contented to be betrayed, and given up into the hands of wicked men, and to suffer death upon the cross, who now liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Ghost, ever one God, world without end.—AMEN.

O Merciful God, Who hast made all men, and hatest nothing that Thou hast made, nor wouldst the death of a sinner, but rather that he should be converted and live: Have mercy upon Thine ancient people the Jews, and upon all who have not known Thee, or who deny the faith of Christ crucified; take from them all ignorance, hardness of heart, and contempt of Thy word; and so fetch them home, blessed Lord, to Thy fold, that they may be made one flock under one shepherd, Jesus Christ our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Spirit, one God, world without end.—AMEN.

LET US PRAY FOR THE KING:

O Lord, we beseech Thee to save Thy servant our Most Gracious Sovereign Lord, King George who putteth his trust in Thee. Send him

help from Thy holy place and evermore mightily defend him. Be unto him a tower of strength from the face of his enemies. O Lord, hear our prayer, and let our cry come unto Thee.—AMEN.

LET US PRAY FOR ABSENT FRIENDS AND LOVED ONES :

O Lord our God, who art in every place; from Whom no space or distance can ever separate us; we know that those who are absent from each other are still present with Thee. Defend, O Loving Father, those friends and dear ones of ours from whom we are separated. Keep them in body and soul; and grant that both they and we, by drawing nearer to Thee may draw nearer to one another; bound together in the unseen chain of Thy love, in the communion of Thy Spirit, and in the holy fellowship of Thy Church: That, whether or not we meet together here on earth, we may surely be re-united in Thy perfected heavenly kingdom; through Jesus Christ our Lord.—AMEN.

LET US PRAY FOR THE PEACE OF THE WORLD :

1. The cooking school at present being held at Bde Hq affords an opportunity not only for increasing the efficiency of unit cooks, but also demonstrates the variety of dishes which may be obtained from ordinary MPA rations.

2. The preparation of food into succulent meals, particularly during ops, ranks high as a morale factor. Too often has it been found that some cooks are content to prepare meals without introducing any ingenuity or variety. The Bde Comd accordingly desires that unit officers and WO caterers visit the school at meal times to see the dishes prepared from ordinary rations. In this regard it is suggested that Lt and Coy 2 Bde particularly attend, so that they may know the standard which may reasonably be expected of coy cooks.

9 Aust Div was concentrating in the MT GARNET area, but the concentration was proceeding slowly. However by 3 Mar 26 Aust Inf Bde Gp was complete and part of 20 Aust Inf Bde Gp had arrived.

26 Aust Inf Bde Gp was complete and had occupied a posn vicinity JENSENVILLE 406009 controlling the rd from ATHERTON. Some enemy recon elements having moved by MT had made contact with fwd posts of 26 Aust Inf Bde.

2/13 Aust Inf Bn with under comd 2/12 Aust Cav Gp and a sp arms had been moved ahead of the rest of 20 Aust Inf Bde Gp with a view to securing the high ground near MILLAA MILLAA, 5597.

It had reached the BEATRICE RIVER at 549927 with its fwd inf on the high ground NORTH of the river and some cav patrols as far fwd as MILLAA MILLAA. These patrols had made contact with enemy recon parties which had withdrawn when fired on.

As the result of the delay in assembly at MT GARNET a shortage of tp carrying vehs and washaways on the rd the rest of 20 Aust Inf Bde Gp would be unable to reach the area BEATRICE RIVER before late afternoon 7 Mar.

and

Tac R/infm from reliable agents and VDC shewed that the enemy was preparing to adv on RAVENSHOE in two cols, one through YUNGABURRA - MALANDA - MILLAA MILLAA, the other through ATHERTON by the EVELYN HIGHWAY.

Comd 9 Aust Div appreciated that the enemy could have approx one regt gp at MILLAA MILLAA by 8/9 Mar.

In the circumstances, it was decided to modify the Div plan as follows: -

26 Aust Inf Bde Gp to adjust its disposns near TRACEY'S CORNER to cover also the junc of the OLD GERALDTON RD and the EVELYN HIGHWAY 438972.

20 Aust Inf Bde Gp to take up a def posn in the area BEATRICE RIVER - MULLIN'S RD 5695, 5594.

Comd 20 Aust Inf Bde (who had himself been delayed) spoke to comd 2/13 Aust Inf En on the tele on night 6/7 Mar. After explaining the situation, he said:

"The Bde will take up a def posn. Somewhere on the high ground near MULLIN'S RD seems suitable from the map. I want you to take up disposns to-morrow morning to cover the occupation. I shall be at your HQ at 1100 hrs. The rest of the Bde will probably not get to where you are before late afternoon but recee gps from the other two bns will be with me.

Time will be short. I want you to recee the posn from a bde pt of view and let me know when I arrive what disposns you suggest for the Bde Gp."



Tournament completed this month. It is not intended to begin another tournament just yet.


(c) Unit Amenities.



1. Your signal AG6997 of 21 Feb 45 reads :-

"Landforces A12330 of 191400K approves discharge NK18326 Pte McGRATH F 2/17 Aust Inf Bn AMR 184A (i)(j). Request march out soldier and advise date of departure."

2. The soldier was marched out to 9 Aust Div Reception Camp on 25 Feb 45 and your HQ notified by signal.

3. It is desired to invite attention to the circumstances of this discharge which is to be effected under AMR 184A (i)(j).

4. The ground for discharge under AMR & O 184A (i)(j) is :

"At his own request on compassionate grounds."

5. No request by the soldier for discharge on compassionate grounds was forwarded to LHQ through normal channels.

6. (a) By civil occupation the soldier is a horse trainer. His father is an owner of race horses.

(b) He last year applied in his unit for a discharge so that he might manage, or assist in managing his father's racing stable. In support of his application he stated that for some time his father's eyesight had been failing, that he was unable to give sufficient attention to his racing business, and that there had been a loss of prize money etc.

7. The soldier being 28 years of age was not eligible for discharge to industry under the conditions of GRO A736 of 1943.

8. His CO considered his application but did not forward it because

(a) Such compassionate circumstances as were suggested viz the father's failing sight had been existing for some time.

(b) He considered the loss of profits from racing was not a ground on which he could recommend discharge when the applications of other soldiers for discharge based on the deterioration of farms and other productive businesses had been rejected by higher authority.

(c) The soldier had told a senior officer of the unit that the grounds he alleged were not genuinely the reasons for which he desired a discharge.

9. The soldier was informed his application had been rejected. He did not prefer any complaint or request under Div I of Part IV MR & O and nothing more was heard of his application until the LHQ direction came that he be discharged at his own request.

10. It is believed in the unit that some outside influence has been exerted. Such comment is inevitable. It makes members feel that influence is more effective than merit. It makes it difficult for commanders to enforce the provisions of GRO A487 of 1944 and to ensure that applications are made through proper channels and with an assurance to the men that all receive uniform consideration.

11. The soldier was medically A1. He enlisted on 21 May 40 served with his unit in the Middle East and New Guinea and was an experienced and efficient soldier.

1. DUTIES

2. DRESS

1. The following dress will be worn by all members of 9 Aust Div :-

- (a) Trousers and Shirts KD or JG.
- (b) Hats, Khaki fur, with puggaree.
Thin straps if issued will be worn neatly adjusted over the brim of the back of the hat.
Dvrs MT may wear caps SD in lieu of hats.
- (c) Belts web.
- (d) Boots with anklets web, or gaiters SD or American Pattern or puttees short.

2. Between the hours of sunset and sunrise shirt will be worn with long sleeves buttoned at the wrists and buttoned in all respects except at the collar where the button may be left undone.

3. In respect of the period between the hours of sunrise and sunset (which hours will be taken until further orders as 0600 hrs and 1900 hrs respectively), Comd Offrs may at their discretion, permit members of authorised working parties, whilst actually engaged in strenuous work, to work with the upper portion of the body bare.

Members permitted to work with the upper portion of the body bare will wear shirts when proceeding to and returning from the actual place of work. No general permission will be given by COs pursuant to the above orders. A specific direction must be given by COs on each occasion.

4. Cooks may wear singlets in lieu of shirt KD or JG whilst working in the immediate vicinity of the kitchen.

5. Whilst participating in organised sport the appropriate uniform will be worn, which will include a covering for the upper portion of the body except when swimming.

6. COs may authorise sunbathing in the vicinity of tents or quarters during specified hours.

7. Special provisions regarding offrs

- (a) Offrs (and warrant offrs) when not on parade with other ranks may wear, in lieu of hats, caps, offr pattern.
- (b) Safari jackets may be worn.
- (c) Anklets web or gaiters SD need not be worn by offrs when wearing offrs' pattern uniform.

Severe disciplinary action will be taken against soldiers contravening this order.

3. THIRD VICTORY LOAN

1. The Third Victory Loan of £100,000,000 cash will close not later than 27th April 1945.

2. Arrangements have been made for paymasters to accept applications for Commonwealth Government Inscribed Stock or Treasury Bonds from members of the AEF who desire to invest their savings in the loan.

Particulars of Loan:-

3. Loan applications may be made for an amount of £10 or a multiple of £10.

4. Inscribed Stock may be purchased at par for amounts of £100 or multiples of £10 above £100.

5. Treasury Bonds ^{are} payable to bearer and are issued at par for £10, £50, £100, £500 and £1,000.

6. Interest is payable at $2\frac{1}{2}\%$ per annum if invested for five years and at $3\frac{1}{2}\%$ per annum if invested for sixteen years, and will be credited half-yearly to a member's savings bank account or current account, if desired.

7. Interest will be subject to Commonwealth taxation but not to any income tax under the law of a State. During the period of uniform taxation, a rebate of 2/- in the pound on interest will be allowed to cover freedom from State taxation.

8. Any bank nominated by a member will, if requested, hold the bond in safe custody.

Procedure for lodging applications:-

9. Application forms will be available from paymasters and unit pay representatives and are required to be completed in duplicate. An applicant's signature will be witnessed by an officer.

10. Sufficient credit must be available in the member's pay book to cover the amount he or she desires to invest in the loan. The amount subscribed will be debited in the pay book.

11. Cash may be accepted in payment of a loan subscription, in which case the amount tendered will be entered in the pay book to establish the necessary credit and a pay sergeant's or cash office receipt issued and pasted in the pay book.

12. Deposits on account of loan subscriptions will not be accepted. Where members desire to subscribe by instalments, the procedure set out in GRO F303/1944 will be observed. Supplies of "Bank Advice of Service Allotment" forms (vide appendix to GRO F303/1944) will be available from paymasters.

General:-

14. Both Treasury Bonds and Inscribed Stock are readily realised and may be sold at any time. Any bank will arrange this for a member, if desired.

4. APPOINTMENT, PROMOTION, REVERSION AND REDUCTION OF MOs AND NOOs

1. Confirmation of Acting Rank

Whenever a member is appointed to acting warrant or non-commissioned rank, such acting rank will be either confirmed as substantive rank or be terminated not later than three months from the date of appointment.

4. (contd)

Retention of Acting Warrant or Non-Commissioned Rank :-

- 2. (a) Unless reverted as punishment for an offence, a member holding acting warrant or non-commissioned rank will retain that rank whilst he is --
 - (i) posted as missing;
 - (ii) a prisoner of war or, if a protected person, in enemy custody;
 - (iii) under treatment for sickness, wounds or injuries not involving his posting to the X list (special provisions relating to those wounded in action against the enemy are contained in the provisos to para 3(a) (iii) of this order);
 - (iv) attending a school or course of instruction as a student;
 - (v) on leave which does not involve posting to the X list.
- (b) A member holding acting warrant or non-commissioned rank may be permitted to retain that rank when --
 - (i) marched out of his unit on temporary detachment; or
 - (ii) transferred in his acting rank to another unit in the UE of which a vacancy exists for that rank.
- (c) Except as provided in sub-para (a) and (b) of this paragraph, a member who is holding acting warrant or non-commissioned rank will be reverted to his substantive rank on being marched out of his unit.
- (d) His CO will be responsible for notifying the member and ensuring that the necessary casualty return is submitted and the necessary entry is made in the member's pay book before he is marched out.

3. Automatic reversion from Acting Warrant or Non-Commissioned Rank :-

- (a) The grant of acting warrant or non-commissioned rank or of a lance appointment is subject in all cases to the condition that the holder will be automatically reverted to his substantive rank on the happening of any one of the following events --
 - (i) if he is declared an illegal absentee by a court of inquiry held under AIR & O 445 or by an investigating officer appointed under AIR & O 448A - as from the date of the declaration;
 - (ii) if he is sentenced to penal servitude, imprisonment, detention or field punishment by a civil court or court-martial - as from the date of the sentence;
 - (iii) if he is evacuated on medical grounds beyond a field ambulance or camp hospital or retained in a field ambulance or camp hospital for a longer period than seven days - as from the date of evacuation beyond the field ambulance or camp hospital or as from the eighth day in the field ambulance or camp hospital;

provided that a member who is holding acting warrant or non-commissioned rank on the date on which he becomes a battle casualty (i.e. is wounded or injured in consequence of action by or against the enemy) shall.

4. (contd)

retain such acting rank until returned to his former unit or posted to a new unit; and

provided further that, when the member is returned to his former unit or posted to a new unit, he will continue to hold his acting rank if an appropriate vacancy exists within unit /E. In such cases, his acting rank will be confirmed as a substantive rank, or terminated in accordance with para 1 of this order, not later than three months from the date of his return or posting.

5. LEAVE OR DUTY OUTSIDE 9 AUST DIV AREA - USE OF NON-OPERATIONAL TRANSPORT

1. When approval is given or has been given, for vehs to proceed outside 9 Aust Div Area, (WONDECLA Camp Trg Areas for 9 Aust Div units located at WONDECLA) such approval is given in all cases subject to non-operational tpt only being used by fms and/or units concerned.

2. This order particularly applies to those cases where a standing approval has been given for fms and/or units to send vehs weekly to the coastal area for the purpose of purchasing additional supplies.

3. When permission is requested for a trg exercise or for other move of a trg nature outside 9 Aust Div area, (WONDECLA Camp Trg Areas for 9 Aust Div units located at WONDECLA) a specific request will be made for approval for the use of any op tpt required.

4. Within 9 Aust Div Trg Area (WONDECLA Camp Trg Areas for 9 Aust Div units located at WONDECLA) op tpt will be used to the minimum extent possible.

6. MT GARNET RD

1. Movement by MT on MT GARNET rd through camp area will be restricted to essential vehs only.

2. If existing weather conditions prevail and deterioration of rd continues at present rate, repair and maintenance of the rd will be beyond the resources of RAL.

7. PREVENTION OF THEFT OR DAMAGE OF GOOD IN TRANSIT

1. It is brought to the notice of all ranks that any scrounging, pilfering, stealing, or wrongful possession of any goods or any attempt to scrounge, pilfer or steal such goods, or any person in any/aiding and abetting such acts, or doing anything which leads to the damage or destruction of such goods will be charged accordingly, and dealt with by Court-Martial. Any offr, W or NCO or OR having knowledge of any such wrongdoing and not immediately reporting same to higher authority will also be charged accordingly and tried by Court-Martial.

2. The offences mentioned above were responsible in the last campaign for the Division from time to time being short of tea, tobacco, Red Cross sups, and various other items with consequent hardship to all tps. It is intended to prevent and deter to the greatest possible extent such offences in the future, and the severest punishment will be meted out to offenders.

3. All tps must know that the sup of the required quantity of food and amenities, incl tobacco, is often difficult to maintain owing to the difficulties of transportation and in special cases owing to the commodities required being in short supply.

7. (contd)

4. In order that everyone, particularly the actual soldier at the front, may receive his full issue of rations, and that amenities and other goods should be available to all troops, it is essential that none of these are interfered with, damaged, destroyed or stolen at any time in transit.

5. Owing to the inherent nature of Army life and military operations, it is not practicable, without huge wastage of manpower, to place guards over all commodities and property, to prevent interference, damage, destruction, or theft thereto. It is therefore essential that all ranks of all arms and services take every precaution within their power to ensure protection of all such goods and commodities in order that everyone may receive the share to which he is justly entitled.

6. The GOC 9 Aust Div appeals to all ranks of the Division to take positive action to assist in the prevention of pilfering, damage or theft of goods.

INSTRUCTORS FOR INDUSTRIAL TRAINING DIVISION -
DEPARTMENT OF LABOUR AND NATIONAL SERVICE

A notice was published with SO Aust Inf Bde ROs of 27 Dec 44, advising members of the AIF that, in connection with the Commonwealth Reconstruction Training Scheme, the Department of Labour and National Service would require many additional trade instructors in technical schools and colleges and similar training organizations, particularly in the building trade.

It is now advised that instructors in art and applied art, science and applied science, mathematics, commerce, needlecraft and home management courses of various types will also be needed.

Applicants are required to be fully qualified in the branch of technical work for which application is made and should preferably have had some experience as instructors. Selected applicants without satisfactory teaching experience may be required to undergo a short intensive course of training during which the appropriate rates for instructors will be paid.

Successful applicants will be appointed as temporary instructors by the appropriate State Public Service authority.

Application forms and conditions of training and employment may be obtained from the Deputy Director of Industrial Training in the State in which appointment is desired.
