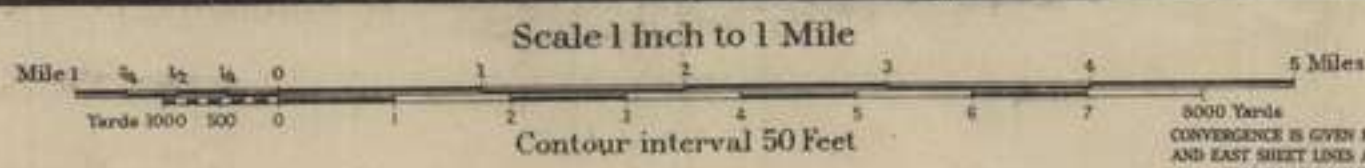

Voting for the Federal General Elections to be held on 21 Aug 45 in the area under the comd and adm of 2 Aust Corps will be carried out as follows :-

1. ELIGIBILITY TO VOTE

Members of the Defence Forces of AUSTRALIA will vote under the provisions of the Commonwealth Electoral (War Time) Act.

This Act provides that a member of the Defence Forces who -

- (a) is not under the age of 21 years; or
- (b) is under the age of 21 years and is serving or has served outside AUSTRALIA,

and who is an active service in the present War shall be entitled to vote at any general election for the Senate and House of Representatives as an elector of the Division in which, immediately prior to his appointment or enlistment as a member of the Forces, he was ordinarily resident, or, in the case of a member of the Forces appointed or enlisted prior to the outbreak of the War on 3 Sep 39, of the Division in which he was ordinarily resident immediately prior to that date.

Coys will be responsible for ensuring that only personnel entitled to vote under the above provision of the Commonwealth Electoral (War Time) Act attend to record their votes.

2. REGISTERING VOTES

The manner in which a member of the Forces will record his vote at a special polling place is as follows :-

- (a) A member of the Forces who is entitled to vote shall attend before the Presiding Officer or Assistant Presiding Officer and, in the presence of that officer, shall fill in the prescribed form of declaration which the Presiding Officer (or Assistant Presiding Officer) shall complete and attest.
Provided that if the voter is unable to state the Division in which he ordinarily resided immediately prior to appointment or enlistment as a member of the Forces (or immediately prior to the 3rd September 1939) as the case may be, the Presiding Officer or Assistant Presiding Officer shall, by reference to the alphabetical list of polling places supplied to him to determine the Division and insert the name thereof in the declaration.
- (b) The Presiding Officer or Assistant Presiding Officer shall then initial on the back and issue to the voter -
 - (i) A Senate ballot-paper for the State of which the voter's Division forms part on which has been printed the names of all the candidates in the order and grouped as required by the provisions of the Commonwealth Electoral Act; and
 - (ii) A House of Representatives Ballot-paper for the voter's Division (if the House of Representatives election in that Division is contested) on which he (the Presiding Officer or Assistant Presiding Officer) has written the name of the Division and, in alphabetical order, the names (but not the Party designations) of all the candidates for that Division as appearing in the list supplied, and shall direct the attention of the voter to the posted list of Candidates and

to the fact that the Parties represented by the respective Candidates may be ascertained therefrom;

(c) The voter shall, then and there, in private mark his vote on the ballot-paper (or ballot-papers) in the manner directed thereon and return it (or them) to the Presiding Officer (or Assistant Presiding Officer) so folded as to conceal his vote and to show clearly the initials of the Presiding Officer or Assistant Presiding Officer.

and

(d) The Presiding Officer or Assistant Presiding Officer shall then and there place the ballot-paper (or ballot-papers) marked by the voter in the envelope bearing the declaration of the voter, fasten the envelope, and retain it in safe custody pending its delivery pursuant to the next following instruction.

3. IDENTIFICATION

Each voter will be prepared to produce his paybook or identification discs for examination by the Presiding Officer or Assistant Presiding Officer when claiming his vote.

4. VOTERS ABSENT FROM UNITS

Voters who may be unavoidably prevented by duty from voting at the special polling booth appointed for their unit may report to any special polling booth in the 2 Aust Corps area and establish their right to a vote.

- (11) A House of Representatives Ballot-paper for the voter's Division (if the House of Representatives election in that Division is contested) on which he (the Presiding Officer or Assistant Presiding Officer) has written the name of the Division and, in alphabetical order, the names (but not the Party designations) of all the candidates for that Division as appearing in the list supplied, and shall direct the attention of the voter to the posted list of Candidates and

to the fact that the Parties represented by the respective Candidates may be ascertained therefrom;

(c) The voter shall, then and there, in private mark his vote on the ballot-paper (or ballot-papers) in the manner directed thereon and return it (or them) to the Presiding Officer (or Assistant Presiding Officer) so folded as to conceal his vote and to show clearly the initials of the Presiding Officer or Assistant Presiding Officer.

and
(d) The Presiding Officer or Assistant Presiding Officer shall then and there place the ballot-paper (or ballot-papers) marked by the voter in the envelope bearing the declaration of the voter, fasten the envelope, and retain it in safe custody pending its delivery pursuant to the next following instruction.

3. IDENTIFICATION

Each voter will be prepared to produce his paybook or identification discs for examination by the Presiding Officer or Assistant Presiding Officer when claiming his vote.

4. VOTERS ABSENT FROM UNITS

Voters who may be unavoidably prevented by duty from voting at the special polling booth appointed for their unit may report to any special polling booth in the 2 Aust Corps area and establish their right to a vote.

NOTES for PRESIDING and ASSISTANT PRESIDING OFFICERS

Presiding Officers (PO's) duty to ensure smooth running of polling in his locality.

Assistant Presiding Officers (APO's) duty to collect votes from voters who present themselves.

Early thought and methodical action should eliminate annoying hindrances and waste of time.

PO's should contact all units in area to arrange the following and any other items which will help :-

If possible, obtain names of personnel to be appointed APO's and have a talk with them.

See units or APO's re timesaving action e.g. Division of voters into parties to ensure steady flow at polling booth, and not peak and trough periods.

Preliminary thought and action so that voters know the Electoral Division for which they have to vote. Become acquainted with lists of polling places and, as far as possible, the names of candidates in main Divisions. Much can be done in this respect before polling day.

In case of large units, suggest voters from different states poll at different tables or at different times - avoid having an unholy mixture of voters all day through.

APO's must be clear as to procedure to be followed and action to be taken with voters who DO NOT know the Electoral Division for which they should vote.

Be ready to check photograph in paybook and also identification disc of unknown voter.

Question any young men who may NOT be eligible.

Be ready for emergency. The most likely will be a shortage of Senate Ballot Papers for a particular State. This must be anticipated, if possible, and supply obtained from 2 Aust Corps Electoral Officer.

POLLING BOOTHS

See to arrangements - Tables - Pens - Blotting Paper - Indelible Pencils - Voters' Table or such-like - Mailbag for ballot box - Display of Posters with Names of Candidates, etc. - Placing of unused Senate and House of Representatives ballot papers and voters' declarations in stacks so all are to hand and will not get mixed up, and can be easily checked - Save spoilt ballot papers and declarations - Lights for after dark.

When polling booth closes, all inside at 2000 hrs have right to vote, even if this takes until midnight.

WHEN POLL IS COMPLETED

Check votes lodged i.e. count up declaration envelopes.

Check unused ballot papers and declaration envelopes.

Make up APO's return.

Pack lodged votes in a parcel and mark with name of booth, e.g. "BARRINE 1 - VOTES LODGED".

Pack unused ballot papers and envelopes - lists of polling places and all other papers and a second package and mark this, e.g. "BARRINE 1 - SURPLUS PAPERS."

Hand over to PO for locality, obtain a receipt for votes and spare papers, etc.

PO makes out his report when he has collected from all polling booths in his locality and then hands over in bulk to Camp Electoral Officer at Town Major's Office, ATHERTON, from whom he will obtain receipt.

FEDERAL GENERAL ELECTIONS - 21 AUG 43

1. Attached for information and necessary action is copy of 2 Aust Corps Special Instruction A10903 of 23 Jul 43.
2. Special Polling Places will be established in the area as indicated in Appendix "A" attached hereto.
3. The unit required to provide the Asst P.O's will forthwith inform this HQ of the name of the member appointed as Senior Asst. P.O.
4. Major W.G.A.BAINES, HQ 6 Aust Div, has been appointed Presiding Officer for this Area.
5. APO's Conferences.

(a) A conference of senior Asst P.O's as notified in para 3, will be held in Education Tent, this HQ at 1400 hrs on 13 Aug 43.

(b) A final conference of ALL Asst P.O's will be held at the same time and place on 19 Aug 43. At the conclusion of this conference Senr Asst. P.O's will collect mail bags and ballot papers from the Presiding Officer for this area.

Mail bags will be returned to Presiding Officer at HQ 6 Aust Div between 0930 and 1200 hrs on 23 Aug 43.

6. Eligibility of Voters

(a) Attention is drawn to Para 1 of above 2 Aust Corps Special Instruction.

(b) All queries must be addressed in the first instance to one of the Asst P.O. for the polling place at which the enquirer is required to vote. If still unsolved, to the P.O.

7. ROUTINE ORDERS

The following will be repeated in Unit Routine Orders copies of which will be rendered to this HQ.

(a) A Federal General Election will be held on 21 Aug 43.

(b) The 2 Aug 43 issue of "SALT" will be devoted mainly to this Election and will contain particulars of electorates, candidates eligibility to vote, and the policy speeches of the Leaders of the Government and opposition.

(c) A Special Polling Place for this Unit will be in the
and polling hours will be from 0800 to 2000 hrs.

(d) Personnel leaving camp on 21 Aug 43 after 0800 hrs who do not expect to return before 1400 hrs should report to the Special Polling Booth before departure and they will then be given an opportunity to vote.

(e) Voters who may be unavoidably prevented by duty from voting at the Special Polling Booth appointed for their unit may report to any special polling booth in the 2 Aust Corps Area and establish their right to a vote.

(f) Personnel on leave or otherwise unable to vote at a Military establishment throughout the hours of polling may vote at a civil polling booth, but this should be avoided if possible.

(g) Personnel who will be travelling during the hours of polling in such manner as to render it unlikely that they will be able

to record their vote by any of these means may apply to be sent to the P.O. for the purpose of recording his vote before departure.

8. Return of Voters

- (a) All units will submit estimate of number of voters entitled to vote according to state for which entitled to vote, NOT according to state of enlistment (vide para 1 of attached Corps Instruction) as at 0600 hrs on the 12 and 18 Aug to reach this HQ by 1100 hrs the same day.
- (b) These returns should be as accurate as possible otherwise there may be a shortage of ballot papers for some particular state, at the same time over-ordering must not be attempted as allowance for last minute variation will be made by higher authority, and paper must be conserved.
- (c) Return should include all personnel on strength, including attached, and should agree with ration state. Attached units will not furnish return direct to this HQ, but to the unit to which attached.
- (d) Units will maintain a record of daily alteration by states so as to be able to supply the current figures on 2 hrs notice if such should be required.
- (e) On such return units will advise of any changes expected by 21 Aug 43.
- (f) In the event of the figures for any state varying by more than 10% from the return list submitted, this HQ will be advised accordingly.
- (g) Personnel of Northern Territory and of other Federal Territories will be shown separately.

9. Units will arrange for all personnel to be addressed by the Senr A.P.O. as soon as possible after 10 Aug 43, in groups not greater than a coy or equivalent, and for A.P.O.'s to be available thereafter at specified times to answer queries.

10. Booths' Etc

On polling day units will supply suitable accommodation for polling booths, tables, blotting paper, indelible pencils, pens and ink, and will make every endeavour to ensure secrecy of voting.

11. A.P.O's

- (a) Two copies of notes for Presiding and Asst P.O.'s are forwarded herewith, and for the use of A.P.O.
- (b) A.P.O.'s need not be officers, but the Senr A.P.O. should be.
- (c) A.P.O.'s should as far as possible be selected by state of residence proportionally to electors to vote at Special Polling Place.

12. Separate arrangements have been made for the casting of votes by members of 16 Aust Inf Bde Gp.

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONFEDERAL GENERAL ELECTIONS - AUG 43

Voting for the Federal General Elections to be held on 21 AUG 43 in the area under comd and adm of 2 Aust Corps will be carried out as follows :-

1. ELIGIBILITY TO VOTE

Members of the Defence Forces of AUSTRALIA will vote under the provisions of the Commonwealth Electoral (War Time) Act.

This Act provides that a member of the Defence Forces who -

- (a) is not under the age of 21 years; or
- (b) is under the age of 21 years and is serving or has served outside AUSTRALIA,

and who is on active service in the present War shall be entitled to vote at any general election for the Senate and House of Representatives as an elector of the Division in which, immediately prior to his appointment or enlistment as a member of the Forces, he was ordinarily resident, or, in the case of a member of the Forces appointed or enlisted prior to the outbreak of the War on the 3 Sep 39, of the Division in which he was ordinarily resident immediately prior to that date.

Note.- A member of the Defence Forces includes a woman serving in any of the Women's Auxiliary Defence Services.

Units will be responsible for ensuring that only personnel entitled to vote under the above provision of the Commonwealth Electoral (War Time) Act attend to record their votes.

2. SPECIAL POLLING PLACES

The localities indicated below will be declared Special Polling Places :-

BARRINE - MAREEBA - ROCKY CREEK - TOLGA - KAIRI - ATHERTON -
WONGABEL - WONDECLA - RAVENSHOE - MILLAA MILLAA - MALANDA -
YUNGABURRA.

A Presiding Officer will be appointed for each special polling place (or locality) by 2 Aust Corps, or Div HQ in a Divisional area, and will have his headquarters at the chief polling booth in that area.

Assistant Presiding Officers will be appointed in a similar manner so that there is one Assistant Presiding Officer to each 200 voters. Additional Assistant Presiding Officers may be appointed if required.

The appointments of Presiding Officers and Assistant Presiding Officers will be ratified by the Federal Electoral authorities.

e.g. BARRINE will be declared a Special Polling Place. According to the number and location of troops in the BARRINE area, a number of special polling booths will be established. These special polling booths will be designated BARRINE 1 (the central booth) BARRINE 2, 3, 4 and so on. One Presiding Officer will be appointed for the locality and a sufficient number of Assistant Presiding Officers to man the several special polling booths.

No poll clerks will be appointed.

Special polling places will be open from 0800 to 2000 hrs.

An appendix will be issued later to indicate the location of the special polling booths and the units which will vote at them, respectively.

3. REGISTERING VOTES

The manner in which a member of the Forces will record his vote at a special polling place shall be as follows :-

- (a) A member of the Forces who is entitled to vote shall attend before the Presiding Officer or an Assistant Presiding Officer and, in the presence of that officer, shall fill in the prescribed form of declaration which the Presiding Officer (or Assistant Presiding Officer) shall then complete and attest.

Provided that if the voter is unable to state the Division in which he ordinarily resided immediately prior to appointment or enlistment as a member of the Forces (or immediately prior to the 3rd September 1939) as the case may be, the Presiding Officer or Assistant Presiding Officer shall, by reference to the alphabetical list of polling places supplied to him determine the Division and insert the name thereof in the declaration.

- (b) The Presiding Officer or Assistant Presiding Officer shall then initial on the back and issue to the voter -

(i) A Senate ballot-paper for the State of which the voter's Division forms part on which has been printed the names of all the candidates in the order and grouped as required by the provisions of the Commonwealth Electoral Act; and

(ii) A House of Representatives Ballot-paper for the voter's Division (if the House of Representatives election in that Division is contested) on which he (the Presiding Officer or Assistant Presiding Officer) has written the name of the Division and, in alphabetical order, the names (but not the Party designations) of all the candidates for that Division as appearing in the list supplied, and shall direct the attention of the voter to the posted list of Candidates and to the fact that the Parties represented by the respective Candidates may be ascertained therefrom;

- (c) The voter shall, then and there, in private mark his vote on the ballot-paper (or ballot-papers) in the manner directed thereon, and return it (or them) to the Presiding Officer or Assistant Presiding Officer so folded as to conceal his vote and to show clearly the initials of the Presiding Officer or Assistant Presiding Officer.

and

- (d) The Presiding Officer or Assistant Presiding Officer shall then and there place the ballot-paper (or ballot-papers) marked by the voter in the envelope bearing the declaration of the voter, fasten the envelope, and retain it in safe custody pending its delivery pursuant to the next following instruction.

4. IDENTIFICATION

Each voter will be prepared to produce his pay-book or identification disc for examination by the Presiding Officer or Assistant Presiding Officer when claiming his vote.

5. VOTERS ABSENT FROM UNITS

Voters who may be unavoidably prevented by duty from voting at the special polling booth appointed for their unit may report to any special polling booth in the 2 Aust Corps area and establish their right to a vote.

6. VOTERS ON LEAVE

Personnel who are on leave in the 2 Aust Corps area from units outside that area may vote at any special polling place appointed as set out in this instruction.

7. PROCEDURE AT SPECIAL POLLING PLACES

Each special polling place will be conducted in accordance with a circular, "Instructions to Presiding Officers and Assistant Presiding Officers", a copy of which will be issued to each Presiding or Assistant Presiding Officer.

8. CONFERENCE

2 Aust Corps will call a Conference between the Corps Electoral Officer and Presiding Officers at a date to be notified.

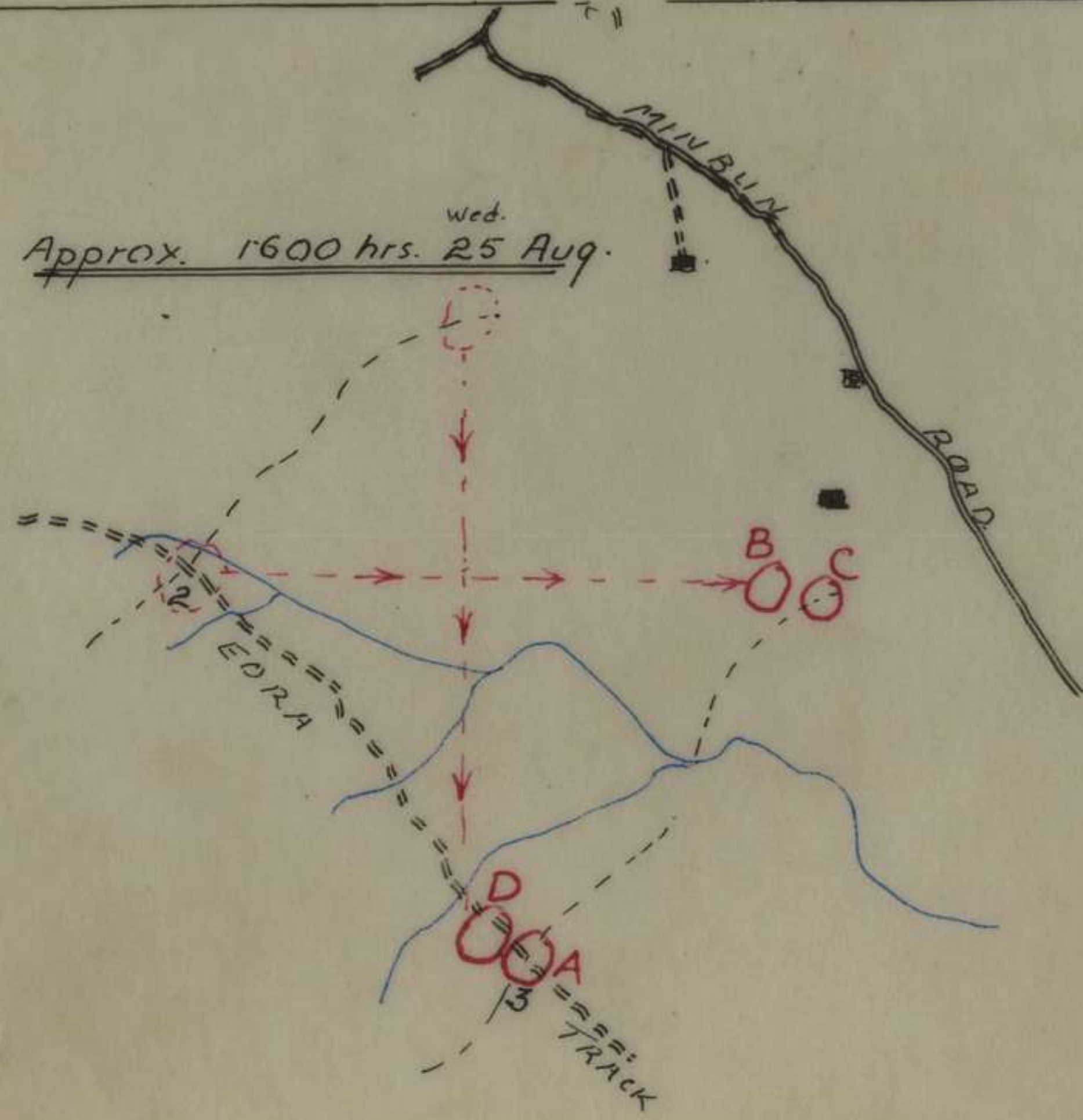

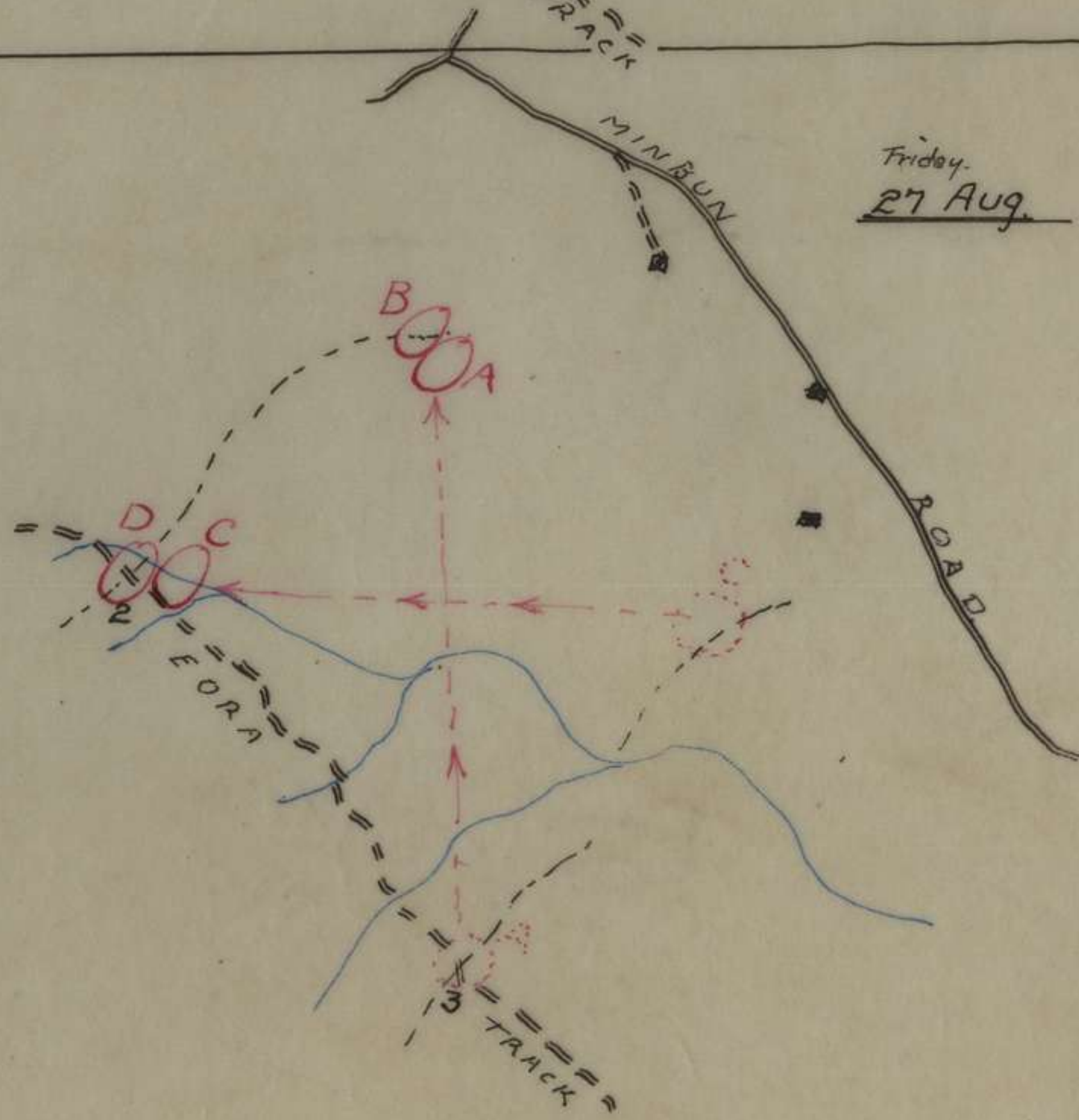

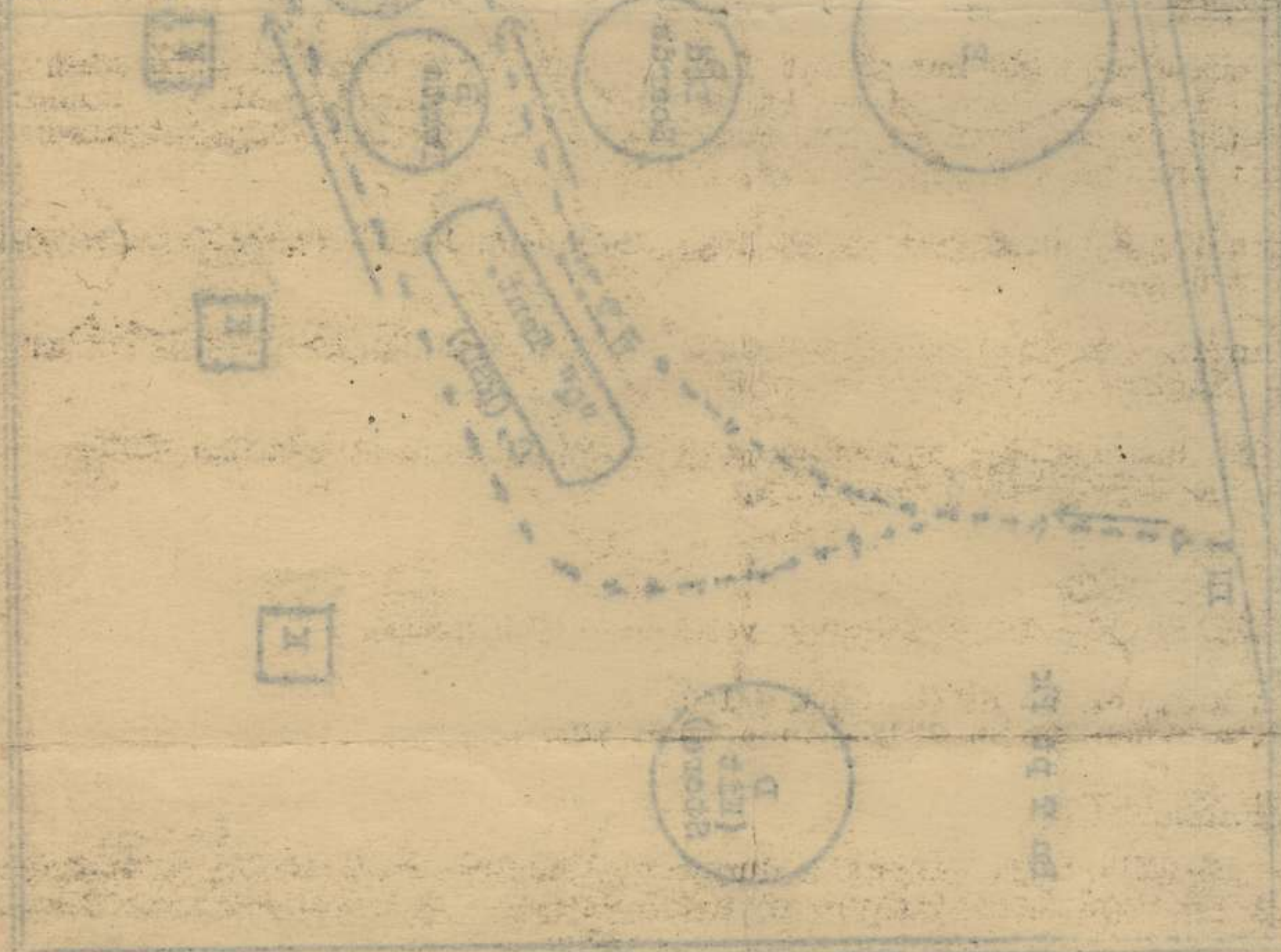

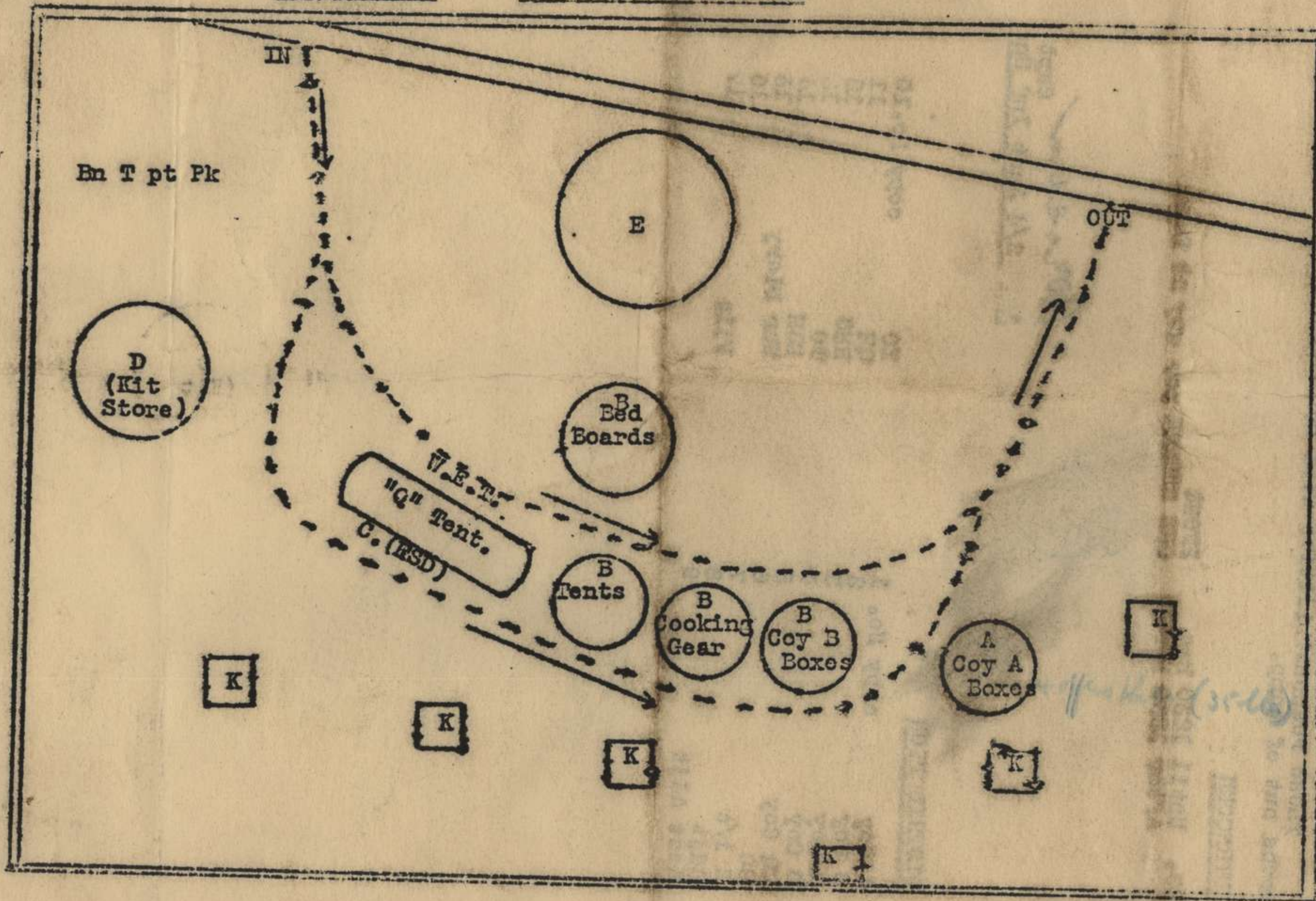

APPX "C"INDICES

Malaria - All personal anti-malarial measures will be strictly observed. All Mosquito Repellent will be applied to all exposed parts of the body by personnel whose duties necessitate their exposure during the hours betw sun sunset and sunrise. Application of Mosquito Repellent will be carried out every three hours and the Repellent will always be kept easily accessible in boots for use by troops prior to landing.

Scrub Typhus - (a) Strict use of and proper application of Mite Repellent lotion (Betty) will be carried out. (b) Method of Application-

i. Turn shirts and trousers inside out. Spread garments flat. Take enough lotion to make light film on hands - rub hands together, then rub hands quickly over the garments, covering a square foot or so with each smear. If film on hands is very light it may be necessary to cover each article two or three times. Aim is to cover evenly without over treated patches. Full treatment may take 15 minutes. With SOX heavier smears may be used. Lotion should be worked into wool from top to instep by rubbing and washing action at the rate of nearly one-teaspoonful to each pair.

ii. If no table or similar board is available, shirt and trousers can be handled like sox with particular attention to legs, waist, neck and sleeves.

iii. If underclothes are worn they should be treated like sox and the required lotion left over should then be applied to the shoulders and sleeves of the shirts and the legs of the trousers. The object is to impregnate the clothing in contact with the skin with lotion at the dosage quoted.

iv. Use $\frac{5}{8}$ oz of lotion for shirt, trousers and two pairs of sox. This will be effective for more than 5 days in dry weather, will not easily be removed by rain, but in wet districts the first dosage tried should be 1 oz.

v. Washing the clothes with soap REMOVES the lotion.

vi. Proper application of Repellent repeated "BETTY" will be carried out prior to troops departing WOMBEE Area and application of Repellent repeated every 3 days.

73. MECHANICAL VEHICLES - LOADING OF PERSONNEL (Corps RO 163/43)

(A) Personnel

(i) Unless otherwise ordered in writing by an officer, the number of personnel carried in load carrying vehicles will not exceed :-

(ii) Where personnel are partly equipped, or where material is loaded in addition to personnel, the number of personnel must be adjusted accordingly.

(iii) An officer will not give an order to exceed the above figures except by endorsement on the Driver's AAF G2.

(iv) Such an order will not be given unless the exigencies of the service demand it. It is unlikely that such exigencies will arise except in operations, and the officer giving such order will be held responsible that this action is justified by the circumstances.

(v) Personnel must be seated wholly within the confines of the body, and will not ride on the canopy, cabin roof, sides, or tailboard of the vehicle.

(vi) Should this order be contravened, the driver will not move his vehicle until the contravention has been rectified and will report the matter on return to his unit.

(B) Materials

(i) Attention is directed to Standing Orders for Drivers of Mechanical Vehicles 1942" para 17 (c)

(ii) Drivers will not be ordered to exceed the authorised load for a vehicle except by an officer, in writing on the AAF G2, when the exigencies of the service demand it.

(iii) Units are responsible that drivers are fully conversant with the amount, which constitutes the authorised load for the vehicle concerned, of all materials which they are likely to transport.

The average weight of loose materials such as sand, gravel and earth is 112 lbs per cubic foot.

74. USE OF FPOs AND APOs AS A POSTAL ADDRESS (Corps RO 190/43)

- (i) Cases have recently come under notice where FPOs and APOs have been adopted as a Postal address for soldier's correspondence.
- (ii) FPO and APO addresses are on no account to be used by troops in this Corps area and, where such a practice is now in operation, immediate steps will be taken to have it discontinued.
- (iii) Officers performing censorship duties will scrutinise all addresses given, excise FPO addresses and inform the senders.

75. ELECTIONS AND POLITICAL ACTIVITIES OF MEMBERS OF THE FORCES (GRO 543/43)

1. The Commonwealth Government has made the following decisions relating to the abovementioned subjects:

- (i) That canvassing in Service establishments or munitions factories should be prohibited.
- (ii) That members of the forces on leave should not be prohibited from attending political meetings in uniform, but they should not be allowed to take part in political processions undertake canvassing on behalf of candidates or the distribution of literature or cards.
- (iii) That leave of absence should be granted to any member of the forces or munitions employee who is a bona fide candidate
2. Members of the AMF will not act in a manner contrary to decisions (i) and (ii) above. In so far as it relates to Army personnel, decision (iii) will be implemented in accordance with the provisions of GRO A.442/1943.

76. COMPLAINTS BY MEMBERS OF THE FORCES (Div RO 122/43)
Ref GRO 108/43.

1. The attention of all ranks will be directed to A.M.R. & O. 293(1), which provides as follows:-

"Officers and soldiers are forbidden to use any method of obtaining redress of real or supposed grievances other than those prescribed by A.M.R. & O. or authorised by these orders. Anonymous complaints or complaints through the press are forbidden."

2. The use of outside influence is forbidden by A.M.R. & O. 307 (1) which provides:-

"The use of outside influence to support complaints or applications for personal advantages, or in any matter affecting the position of an officer or a soldier, is contrary to discipline. The only proper course for an officer or a soldier is to apply through his CO or to complain in accordance with the A.M.R. and those orders. Any attempt to obtain favourable consideration of requests or grievances by other means is forbidden."

3. The provisions of Division 1 of Part IV of the A.M.R. & O. will be explained to all formed units on parade at least once in every three months, and to all members in training depots once every month. The consequences of failing to observe the provisions of that Division will be made clear.

4. All complaints or applications of the nature described in para 2 above received at any HQ through unauthorised channels will be forwarded to the Unit concerned, with a direction that the member will be paraded and informed of the Unit Order on this matter and that any further failure to observe its provisions will be dealt with as an offence.

77. ERECTION OF TENTS (Div RO 126)

Tentage will NOT be erected closer than twenty feet to any permanent camp building.

78. REQUEST HOUR (GRO 492/43)

(a) In each Coy from 1000 hrs to 1200 hrs every Sunday will be a period when an other rank may see an officer on any leave or personal matter, other than a formal complaint. Access to the officer must be direct, without the requirement of any previous notification or permission from a warrant or non-commissioned officer. The interview will not take place in the Coy Orderly Room and will be entirely informal.

(3)

(b) So far as is possible, the officer himself should deal with questions raised at Request Hour. If the matter is one which should be raised as a formal complaint (e.g. because it involves a complaint against another soldier or a superior) he should tell the soldier that it must be raised and, if necessary, explain the proper channel.

(c) The following are typical matters.

- (i) Considerations affecting the welfare of the soldier's family. Requests for leave to join his family to adjust difficulties will usually be associated with requests of this nature.
- (ii) Straight out applications for Compassionate Leave.
- (iii) Applications for a transfer to home state on compassionate grounds.
- (iv) Legal problems affecting the soldier's private affairs.

95. ISSUE OF FOOD COUPONS TO ARMY PERSONNEL (GRO Q.395/43)

Entitlement to food coupons - Specially printed food coupons, combining in one sheet separate coupons for each rationed commodity and representing a half-week's entitlement, will be issued to all ranks of the AMF, who are not rationed departmentally, viz:-

- (a) members living at home or on subsistence
- (b) members billeted.
- (c) members on leave, with or without pay, to whom the following scale will apply :-

<u>Period of leave</u>	<u>Coupon entitlement</u>
1 to 3 days	1 Sheet of combined coupons
4 to 7 days	2 sheets of combined coupons
8 to 10 days	3 " " " "
11 to 14 days	4 " " " "
15 to 17 days	5 " " " "
18 to 21 days	6 " " " "

..... and so on

Representatives of recognised philanthropic organizations on full time duty will be issued with coupons on the same basis as members of the AMF.

The quantitative entitlement of each service coupon on the combined coupon sheet will be one half that of the civilian ration entitlement for one week.

Issue of coupons to members - COs of units (camp commandants, in respect of personnel on HQ establishments) will be responsible for the issue of coupons as provided hereunder :-

- (a) Members living at home or on subsistence - In advance and in accordance with the current scale of issue to civilians.
- (b) Billeted personnel - In advance and in accordance with the current scale of issue to civilians.
- (c) Leave personnel - Members who are proceeding on leave will be issued with combined coupon sheets in accordance with the scale shown in para. 1. Any adjustments found necessary will be made when the member returns from leave.

In the case of members returning from New Guinea or other places outside Australia, coupons will be issued to them at the first LTD to which they report.

Leave passes will be endorsed with the particulars of issue.

96. SECURITY

Many members of the unit have rings set with unit colours. As this may be prejudicial to security at a later date, all ranks, will, in the event of a move, return rings with their other gear to Kit Store.
