War Diary

1. It is proposed to hold a 3 week Training Cadre for potential NCO's commencing 19 Jun.
2. Object of the Cadre
To train selected privates within the unit with a view to their eventual promotion to NCO rank. In order that the object of the Cadre may be fully obtained, it is essential that the student material provided be the best available.
3. Vacancies
(a) Vacancies are allotted as follows:-
Squad Rifle Coy 5
B Coy (2 from each of 2, 3, 4, 5 Pls) 8
(b) Nominal rolls (in duplicate) of students to attend the Cadre are required at this HQ by 171200K.
4. Instructors
The following will be required as instructors:-
C.I. Lt P. B. NINK
Cadre C. Sjt PARROT N.G.
Instructors A Sjt TURNER H.E.
Cpl IFFEMAN D.J.
Cpl CROME O.W.
Cpl FREENE J.
Cpl PHILLIPS E.C.
Instructors will report to Lt NINK at 160930K in 'B' Coy area.
5. Weapons and Equipment
All students will be armed with a rifle and bayonet, will have a complete set of webbing equipment in good order and will be provided with a second pair of boots.
Q.M. will arrange necessary issues on requisition from coys, and will provide such stores and equipment as are required by the C.I. for the conducting of the Cadre. If necessary, stores may be withdrawn from companies.
6. Messing and General Administration
Students will remain under Coy arrangements for messing and routine administration.
7. Time of Reporting
Students will report, dressed in drill order, to Cadre SM at Cadre Parade Ground at 190800K.
8. Training Area
Cadre Parade Ground is located on west side of camp road, immediately in rear of the Sergeants' mess. This area will be out of bounds to all other personnel for the duration of the Cadre.
C.I. will liaise with Coy Comds regarding training areas for field exercises and the use of Coy mess huts for lectures and training in wet weather.
9. Attendance at Battalion Parades
The Cadre will attend all Bn parades as a sub-unit, with the exception of the parade on 19 Jun. RSM will arrange with C.I. regarding location of Cadre on Bn parade ground.

The following notes are to be read in conjunction with first week training programme, and are to be the basis of preparation and execution of all subjects.

1. OBJECT.
- (a) To smarten up, and raise the standard of discipline within the unit by :-
- i. Regular inspections by sec and pl comds.
 - ii. Raising the standard of man management.
 - iii. Smartening up of drill and handling of weapons on daily pl and coy parades.
 - iv. Providing greater scope and encouragement for all NCOs in exercising power of command, by increased instruction, correction of faults, and leading of discussions on TEWTs and exercises.
- (b) To inculcate in all ranks a greater spirit of offensive action by :-
- i. Training in more determined and vigorous use of the bayonet, over obstacle course.
 - ii. Training in a bolder and more skilful use of ground for attaining fire superiority.
 - iii. Attaining a standard of deadly accuracy with all weapons, by organised coaching and regular range practices.
- (c) To teach, practice and exercise all phases of battle procedure and battle drill from the leading scout to the rear man in the pl, by :-
- i. TEWTs for sec and pl comds.
 - ii. Teaching, demonstrating, practising and exercising each individual, sec and pl, in all phases of battle drill within the pl.

2. SUBJECTS
- (a) Bren - adv handling. ALL personnel to be taught and exercised in handling of and movement with bren on jungle trails and in open country. Selection and use of ground. Refs. F.C. and B.D. Sec.3.3.
- Bayonet Trg - Revision, and exercise of all personnel over obstacle course. Attention to be paid to individual physical peculiarities during off the course periods.
- Map Reading and Compass - ALL personnel MUST become proficient in these subjects. I.O. will co-operate with coy and pl comds in teaching and exercising. Standard test to be prepared by I.O. To be conducted in conjunction with TsOEP.
- TsOEP - To be conducted each week until 100% standard is attained.

- (b) 30 yd Range -
- i. A team of 8 experienced coaches under Capt BLACKBURN, will be available to all Coys for range practices.
 - ii. Practices will be progressive from trained soldier deliberate practices, to accurate engagement of opportunity and fleeting jungle targets and training of sec snipers.
 - iii. A course for coaches will be held on 13-14 Jun.

- (c) TEWTs - TEWT 1. Each Coy comd will prepare cloth model exercise.

OBJECT To teach pl comds and all NCOs within the Coy, battle procedure and drill, during the advance to contact and preparation for battle.

- LESSONS - (a) Time is a vital factor in battle and every device should be used to shorten the period of recce and preparation, and to make it effective. (IT Chap viii 37)
- (b) To shorten the period of preparation without omitting any essential requirement, the activities preceding an attack should be simultaneous in all grades of command rather than consecutive. (FSR 11 Chap vi Sec 56)

TEXT 11 Each Coy Comd will prepare an exercise on the ground.

OBJECT To exercise Pl Comds and all NCOs within the Coy in battle procedure and drill, during the advance to contact and preparation for battle.

- LESSONS
- (c) As for TEXT 1 2 (a) and (b)
- (c) "A chain is needed, as near foolproof as possible by which infm will be carried from front to rear, and by which orders, when necessary can go from rear to front. (INT ch xi)
- (d) Team work and co-operation on the part of all ranks within the sec pl and coy to pass back as accurately and speedily as possible. (INT ch xi)
- (e) The signal from the leading scout will be the signal for battle procedure and drill to automatically function within the sec pl coy and bn.

TEXT 111 Mor pl comd will prepare a cloth model exercise.

OBJECT To teach all members of the mor pl, battle procedure and drill during the approach to contact and preparation for battle, as a detachment in support of a rifle coy.

- LESSONS 1. Practically all success in battle, which is won by the proper co-operation of all arms, must in the end be confirmed by infantry, which, by closing with the enemy, compels his withdrawal, destruction or surrender, and holds objectives which have been secured or the points of importance which have to be protected as a base for further action. (FSR 11 Sec. 4.1.
2. The sec pl and coy, are teams in themselves, but are also members of the larger battalion team, and must at all times be ready to co-operate with other sub-units. The chance to assist sub-units who may be in difficulties on right or left must always be watched for, and advantages provided by Mors and MMGs must always be available. (INT Ch 1V, 13)

TEXT 1V MMG Pl comd to prepare cloth model exercise.

OBJECT AND LESSONS As for TEXT 11 applied to MMG Pl.

TEXT V Sig Offr to prepare cloth model exercise.

OBJECT To teach all members of signal pl battle procedure and drill for sigs, during preparation for battle and setting up of BnHQ.

OBJECT To exercise each rifle pl in battle drill and procedure during advance to contact and preparation for battle.

LESSON: As for ITEMS 1 and 11 and Battle Drill - Sec. One copy of each exercise to be submitted for vetting by C.O. before being typed, three days prior to exercise.

(f) PATROL BRIEFING. I.O. will prepare brief for a pl patrol task and will brief each pl comd. Pl Comds will brief pl and explain task, issue necessary preparatory orders. Sec Comds will issue their orders in turn.(g) POTENTIAL NCO's. A Cadre of three weeks duration under Lt NINK as C.I. and 4 instructors will commence on 19 Jun. S't PARROT will carry out duties of Cadre S.M. and relief instructor. These instructors will be selected by BnHQ. Coys will select the most outstanding personnel having the necessary attributes for leadership, Coy Comds being prepared to recommend such potential NCOs for promotion when necessary.

19. TELEGRAMS

Many cases have recently been reported by Censorship of senders of telegrams including name of unit on back of telegram forms. Censorship instructions lay down that number and name only will be shown and Franking Officers will take particular care to ensure that this instruction is carried out.

20. CENSORSHIP, SOUVENIRS OF ENEMY ORIGIN DANGEROUS DRUGS AND EXPLOSIVES

- (a) Censorship reports have shown that large numbers of parcels contain explosive and/or dangerous drugs. The despatch of such material is forbidden.
- (b) Where it is desired to include specimen of enemy ammunition in parcels, such ammunition must be -
 - i. Rendered harmless by qualified personnel by the removal of all explosive and the firing of all detonators.
 - ii. Certified as being of no further use for Intelligence purposes, by the holder of a War Souvenir Stamp.
- (c) War Souvenir Stamps are held by GS of formations.
- (d) Drugs of enemy origin are not permissible souvenirs.
- (e) It is the duty of every franking officer to ensure that no articles of these types are included in parcels.

21. PROHIBITION OF SALE OF LOTTERY OR ART UNION TICKETS.

- (a) A member of the Military Forces shall not act as a vendor of, or as an agent to sell or to receive applications for, any tickets or shares in tickets in any lottery or art union.
- (b) A member of the Military Forces shall not purchase from, or apply to purchase through, any vendor or agent situated in NEW GUINEA any ticket or share in a ticket in any lottery or art union.

22. UNIT CENSORSHIP

Personnel may include in their correspondence general statements such as "I am near (or on) the coast", but are NOT permitted to mention specific areas in which they are or have been located. Similarly, unless otherwise specifically advised by this HQ, NO mention may be made of campaign or action in which units have been or are taking part.

1.

23. 30 YARD RANGE - SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

The following safety precautions will apply for all range practices held on the unit 30 yds range. Responsibility for ensuring that these precautions are taken will rest with the commander of the sub-unit using the range.

- (a) A sentry will be stationed on foreshore in A Coy area, and will, by means of phone communication with the range, give warning of the approach of any water craft which appear likely to move close to the range area. O.C. range, on receipt of the warning, will give the order to cease fire. Firing will be resumed when the sentry advises that the water craft has passed the range area.
- (b) A sentry will be posted at the junction of the track into the range and the main road and will warn all personnel moving to the range that firing practice is in progress.
- (c) A sign stating "Range practice in progress - no movement on east side of road" will be placed on each approach on the main road to the range. These signs will be erected prior to commencement of the range practice and will be taken down at the conclusion of the practice. Signs may be obtained from the R.P. Sjt.

"AQ"

24. REQUEST HOUR

- (a) GPO 492/43 provides for the institution of a weekly "Request Hour" a period during which an Officer is available for informal consultation, by all ranks. The objects of the "Request Hour" are -
 - i. To create a closer understanding between Officers and men.
 - ii. To reduce the number of letters written to obtain redress of grievances through unauthorised or improper channels.
 - iii. To assist the soldier in the solution of his family Welfare problems.
 - iv. To give Officers the opportunity to appreciate the incidence on a soldier's personal service of his domestic background.
 - v. To provide an "off the record" information bureau.
- (b) Coys will forthwith institute a "Request Hour" which is to be held between 1100 hrs and 1200 hrs each Saturday. The objects of the "Request Hour" are to be explained to all ranks on a parade and every encouragement is to be afforded any member who wishes to avail himself of advice.
- (c) These provisions are in no way intended to act as a substitute for the normal channels of complaint laid down in AMP & C 289.
- (d) A report on the "Request Hour" will be submitted to this HQ by 1 Jul 44. Reports should be brief, but will indicate the extent to which the troops have availed themselves of the "Request Hour" and an analysis of the subject matter brought forward.

25. CLOTHING RATION COUPONS

- (a) The maintenance issue of Clothing Coupons issued for the coupon year 1943/44 cannot now be expended.
- (b) Coupons for the year 1944/45 are not yet available, but it is expected that their issue will be effected towards the end of June.

26. NATIVE VILLAGES

All native villages and including Chinese Settlements and gardens are OUT OF BOUNDS to all ranks with the exception of those members who on account of their special duties, require to visit or pass through such areas.

27. COMPASSIONATE AND OTHER SPECIAL LEAVE

- (a) Instructions have been promulgated by LHQ to the effect that applications for compassionate, seasonal and occupational leave made by personnel serving in NEW GUINEA will be treated as if such applicant was in a far distant operational station such as in the MIDDLE EAST.
- (b) In certain cases the provisions of para 29 of GRO A598/43 are not being correctly observed in that applications are still being submitted purely on the basis of death or serious illness of certain relatives of the member.
- (c) It is pointed out that, in many cases of death or serious illness of one of the relatives referred to in the GRO, the presence of the soldier will not materially affect the situation. In cases where death may be the result of the illness, the death will not normally result from the member's failure to obtain leave, and the probability of death is therefore not a serious resultant consideration within the meaning of the abovementioned paragraph.
- (d) It is appreciated that each case must be decided on its merits. It is emphasised however, that either there must be serious consideration resulting if leave is not granted or the presence of the member must be able to affect the situation in question in some material manner. Leave under the paragraph referred to may not be granted unless one of these factors exist.
- (e) Coy Comds will fully investigate all applications before submission to this HQ, and will attach their recommendation and include the following information -
 - i. Home address of applicant.
 - ii. Address at which inquiries may be made.
 - iii. Relationship
 - iv. Previous Leave.
 - v. Service in NEW GUINEA.
 - vi. Whether applicant is willing to accept leave without pay.
 - vii. Address of applicant whilst on leave.
- (f) The substance of this order is to be promulgated to all ranks.

28. APPLICATIONS FOR DISCHARGE TO INDUSTRY

- (a) Personnel serving in units under command 5 Aust Div who are eligible for discharge under GRO 736/43 fall within the following categories.
 - i. Personnel who are "B" class.
 - ii. Personnel who are 35 years of age and over and who have completed three or more years continuous full time Military Service.
- (b) Applications submitted are to include all available facts and details, particularly -
 - i. Soldier's age
 - ii. Medical Classification
 - iii. Present posting
 - iv. Length of Service.
 - v. Ability and degree of usefulness to the unit
 - vi. Civil occupation.
 - vii. By whom soldier will be employed if discharge is approved.
 - viii. Coy Comds remarks and recommendation.
- (c) The limitations in para (a) of this order do not in any way affect applications for release from Military Service on compassionate grounds or on the grounds of financial hardship. However, with any such application, details enumerated in para (b) will be required.
- (d) The information contained in this order is to be passed on to all ranks.

29. PRE-SELECTION OF OFFICERS.

- (a) The scheme for pre-selection of Officers was instituted to ensure the best possible utilisation of the male personnel available for appointment as Officers of the AMF and also that the field of selection should be as wide as possible.
- (b) Any soldier who considers himself suitable for appointment to commissioned rank is entitled to submit an application to his

Coy Comd for interview by a local Officers Pre-selection Board.

(c) The substance of this order is to be promulgated to all ranks.

SAFEGUARDING OF WEAPONS AND UNIT STORES.

The responsibility of safeguarding weapons, equipment and stores from loss or theft is that of the individual or sub-unit to whom the stores etc have been issued. Under circumstances in which the exercise of proper measures to safeguard the stores etc is impracticable, it is then the individual's or sub-unit's responsibility to ensure that the stores are handed in to the relevant authority for safekeeping. The authority taking over custody of the stores will issue a receipt, and will then assume responsibility for their safe custody.

32.

USE OF PETROL & INFLAMMABLES.

In future no member (except MT personnel in the ordinary course of their duties) will use petrol or other inflammables for any purpose without the prior authority of an officer. The use of petrol in lighting or feeding fires is strictly forbidden.

33.

PETROL RATION TICKETS - ISSUE TO MEMBERS OF THE ARMY ON LEAVE

1. Petrol ration tickets may be issued by State Liquid Fuel Control Boards at their discretion to members of the Services, when on leave, to permit them to make business contacts or bona fide visits to relations. Such issues will be under the following conditions -
 - (a) Grants will not exceed one month's ration in Class 2 appropriate to the vehicle proposed to be used.
 - (b) The issue will be confined to a member of the Services during leave granted upon return to the mainland after service outside the limits of the mainland and (if unwounded and not invalided) after at least nine months absence from place of leave. In the case of wounded or invalided members, the above time limit not to apply.
 - (c) Members will produce leave passes with their applications for petrol ration tickets.
2. Members who are entitled to obtain petrol ration tickets under the concession provided for in para 1 above should make application direct to a State Liquid Fuel Control Board.

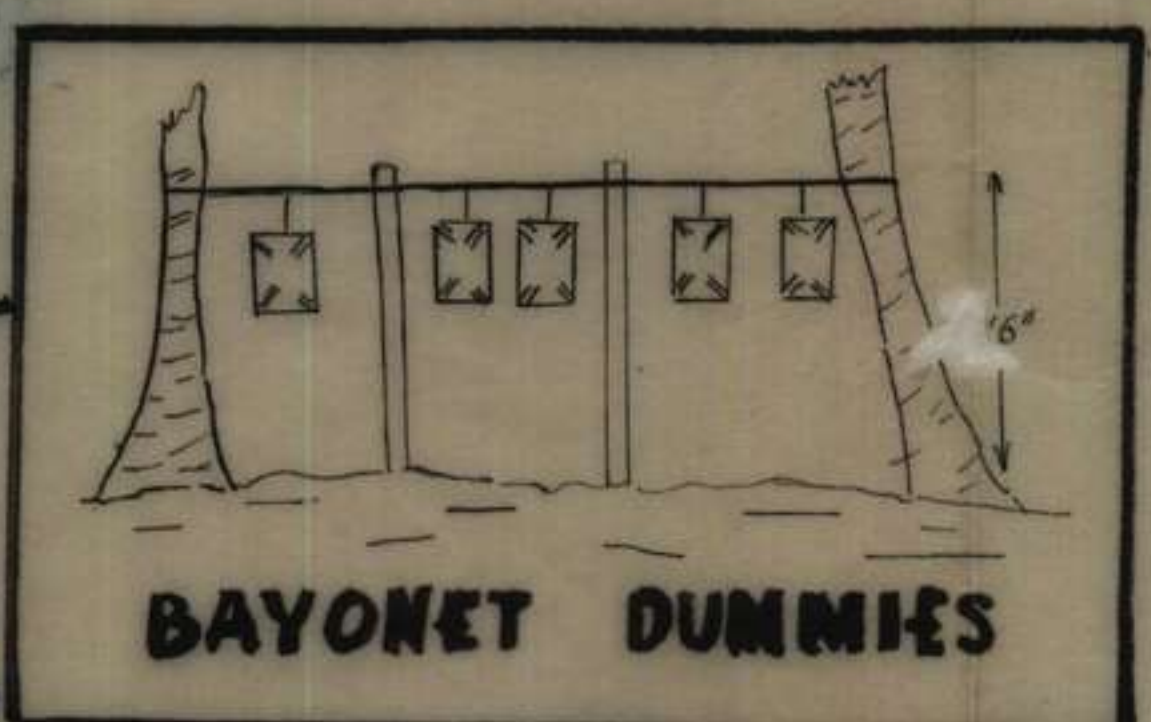

In this action Lt BERMAN by his display of outstanding leadership and devotion to duty, so inspired his men that severe casualties were inflicted on the enemy, without a casualty to his own pl. By the determination displayed by Lt BERMAN, the enemy were denied valuable ground, his attacks were broken up, and the determined stand made by Lt BERMAN and his pl, was instrumental in forcing the enemy from the strong positions held by him at YAULA.

During the move by Lt JACKSON, the Pl was heavily engaged by the enemy, using IMG, Rifles, Grenades and Light Mortar. Lt JACKSON manoeuvred his Pl toward the enemy rear and continued to advance up steep slopes until his Pl was in a position to engage the enemy with all weapons, from the flank and rear. This outflanking move completely disorganised the enemy, and inflicted severe casualties, with the result that the enemy was forced from his position, which was occupied by the remainder of the Coy without casualty.

The determined and outstanding leadership displayed by Lt JACKSON, so inspired his men that the attack was pushed home relentlessly and the enemy was driven from every commanding ground, which was the final defensive positions held by the enemy before BOGADJIM

The enemy strongly attacked Lt PASSLOW'S pl from the rear simultaneously with an attack on the forward pl. The enemy attacks continued fiercely throughout the night, during which time Lt PASSLOW continually moved around amongst his men, inspiring them by his determination, devotion to duty, and complete disregard for personal safety.

The outstanding leadership displayed by Lt PASSLOW during the action throughout the night, so inspired his men, that the continued enemy attacks were broken up with severe casualties to the enemy, no casualties being sustained by Lt PASSLOW'S pl. The determined stand made by Lt PASSLOW, denied valuable ground to the enemy, and was instrumental in forcing the enemy from the strong positions which he had held at YAULA.

For outstanding leadership, determination and devotion to duty in the operations which led to the capture of BOGADJIM and the clearing of the enemy from, and the occupation of MADANG.

On 22 Mar 44 Lt ATKINSON was ordered to lead a patrol to feature 3800 in the DAUMOINA area with the object of clearing the enemy from strongly prepared positions. Lt ATKINSON led his patrol up a steep razor back track and camped for the night within a short distance of the enemy positions. At first light on 23 Mar after working portion of his patrol into covering positions, Lt ATKINSON led the remainder against the enemy who were completely surprised. Four Japs were killed by the patrol and the determined action of Lt ATKINSON in pressing home the attack forced the enemy from 3800 feature and this proved instrumental in forcing the enemy from the DAIMOINA area which at that time he was holding strongly.

As continual pressure was maintained against the enemy towards BOGADJIM, Lt ATKINSON was again ordered to lead a patrol to clear the enemy from BOGADJIM and patrol to MADANG. Determined and skilful leadership by Lt ATKINSON led to the occupation of BOGADJIM on 13 Apr 44, and patrolling towards MADANG commenced. Pushing northwards the whole of the BOGADJIM area was cleared by Lt ATKINSON and his patrol until the GOGOL river was reached. This proved a most formidable obstacle, but Lt ATKINSON determinedly attempted to cross, in spite of the

PRESENCE OF CROCODILES in the river, two of which were destroyed in the efforts of the patrol to cross. The river was eventually crossed by rubber dinghy and Lt ATKINSON pushed on towards MADANG. About one mile SOUTH of this place the patrol was opposed by an unknown number of the enemy who fired upon the patrol, with rifles, automatic weapons, and mountain gun. By skilful manoeuvring and determined pressure Lt ATKINSON'S patrol forced the enemy from his positions and MADANG was entered on 24 Apr 44.

Throughout, Lt ATKINSON displayed rare determination, leadership and control of the highest degree and his disregard for personal safety and devotion to duty, proved of such inspirational value to all the men under his command, that the determined manner in which the enemy was opposed, forced him from successive strong positions, leading to the successful occupation of BOGADJIM and MADANG.

The Pl had worked around the enemy flank, and No 7 Section of which Pte HILLBERG was a Bren Gunner was ordered to work around to the enemy rear and out the track which led down the ridge to further enemy defences. Pte HILLBERG whilst under fire from the enemy on the ridge, crawled into a position on the track in the enemy rear and engaged the enemy with his Bren. Pte HILLBERG remained in an exposed position for over one hour and continued to use his Bren against the enemy, whilst the remainder of his Pl moved up against the enemy flank. During this time Pte HILLBERG was in such a position as to render himself liable to attack from his rear, by the enemy further down the ridge.

Pte HILLBERG, by his outstanding determination, devotion to duty, and disregard of personal safety, enabled the attack of 9 Pl to develop, inflict severe casualties on the enemy, and force the enemy from his last strong position before BOGADJIM.

- PROBE - To be conducted each week until 100% standard is attained.
- (b) 30 yd Range -
- i. A team of 8 experienced coaches under Capt BLACKBURN, will be available to all Coys for range practices.
 - ii. Practices will be progressive from trained soldier deliberate practices, to accurate engagement of opportunity and fleeting jungle targets and training of sec snipers.
 - iii. A course for coaches will be held on 13-14 Jun.
- (c) TEWTs - TEWT 1. Each Coy comd will prepare cloth model exercise.

OBJECT To teach pl comds and all NCOs within the Coy, battle procedure and drill, during the advance to contact and preparation for battle.

- LESSONS - (a) Time is a vital factor in battle and every device should be used to shorten the period of recce and preparation, and to make it effective. (IT Chap viii 37)
- (b) To shorten the period of preparation without omitting any essential requirement, the activities preceding an attack should be simultaneous in all grades of command rather than consecutive. (FSR II Chap vi Sec 56)

CENSORSHIP

HQ 57/60 Aust Inf Bn

Jul '44

I GENERAL

Reports from Fd Censorship Detachments covering the past six weeks have revealed alarming gaps in the knowledge of many personnel, including officers, of their responsibility as regards censorship.

This condition exists despite the wide distribution that has been given to Fd Censorship Instructions No 4, the booklet, Censorship in NG, and NGF orders on the subject. All officers of this unit WILL make themselves familiar with the instructions above. If Coys are not in possession of same, they are available for perusal at the Int Office. Coy Comds will give this matter their personal attention to ensure that a high standard of censorship is maintained.

II PARTICULAR ATTENTION WILL BE PAID TO THE FOLLOWING:-

- (a) Letters, envelopes, telegrams and parcels must be franked with the officer's name and initials ONLY. Number, name, and ranks only of the sender to be shown on outside of parcel.
- (b) Contents of all parcels submitted for franking to be personally inspected by franking officers to ensure that none of the articles prohibited by NGF orders and no other censorable matter, are included.
- (c) The following is a list of prohibited articles:
- (i) Any property issued, distributed, or sold by or belonging to the Commonwealth or any part of the Defence Force of the Commonwealth or any Allied country or force.
 - (ii) Any captured documents, eqpt or property.
 - (iii) Any article sold, distributed or supplied by Aust Defence canteens, Services, or any similar institution, or any AMF recognised philanthropic organisation.
 - (iv) Tobacco or cigarettes.
 - (v) The sending of various other articles of NG origin such as bird-of-paradise, feathers, plants, seedlings, and certain stone antiques, is prohibited under customs and quarantine regs.
- (d) When the imprint of the unit censor stamp and/or the franking officers signature cannot be made legible on the wrapping of parcels, this will be placed on a slip of paper and pasted on the wrapping. The practise of attaching tags to parcels should be avoided whenever possible, tags are often torn off therefore leaving the parcel uncensored.
- (e) Excision will be made by cutting out the offending portion. Care must be taken to deface the letter as little as possible.
- (f) All captured enemy documents must be handed to Int for examination. If they are of no value to Int or after they have ceased to be of value (e.g. after the infm has been extracted) they will be stamped by the war souvenir stamp. Documents and eqpt so stamped and returned to the soldier then may be posted in the normal way and will be passed by censorship.

III The sole object of Censorship is to guard National Security

It is no part of the duty of the franking officer to act as a policeman or a censor of morals. Opinions (including political), criticisms and complaints, boastful or even lying stories, crudities of language or obscenities must NOT be deleted because they appear offensive. There are few complaints and criticisms which are likely to assist the enemy because of morale.

When the comm contains undesirable, as distinct from censorable matter, the franking officer will return it to the sender explaining the reason why the comm is considered undesirable and suggesting that the letter be re-written. Statements in letters indicating that a civil or military crime other than a breach of censorship has been committed, will NOT be used as evidence against a soldier in very serious cases.

Personnel are free to discuss camp conditions, food, scenery, recreation, films they have seen, punishment for individual offences etc. After being in W. for one month or more, a writer may say so, but is NOT permitted to give the location of his unit. There is no objection to a soldier stating that he has personally visited such areas as Lae, Salamaua, etc., as long as he does not indicate the unit is or has been in those areas.

The acid "test" of any letter should therefore be - Does this letter contain infm which could be of value to the enemy directly or indirectly.

Officers on NO account will discuss the contents of the mens' letters - comments written on letters by officers is most objectional and severe disciplinary action is to follow the detection of any of these practises.

IV Comm to PW and Internees in enemy countries

Here an "accommodation" address must be used. Full instructions are contained in GRO G750/1943. Letters are now to be addressed direct to the PW instead of C/- Aust Red Cross Society. They will be franked, but will NOT be marked with the unit censor stamp.

V Diaries and Note Books
