CORRECT CHANNEL OF COMPLAINTS AND COMMUNICATIONS ON SERVICE MATTERS
(Ref. GRO A.487/44)

1. The use of the correct channels of complaints, as prescribed by AMR & O 289, is to members' advantage, as those channels ensure that complaints are investigated, and are referred to the authority who has power to grant any necessary redress, by the most direct means. Complaints through other than the prescribed channels, on the other hand, start at the "wrong end" of the correct channel, so that they have to be referred down to units for investigation and then back to the appropriate authority for consideration as to whether any remedial action on the complaint is necessary. The result is that, in addition to the use of incorrect channels being prejudicial to discipline, a member using those channels causes unnecessary correspondence and delay in the consideration of his complaint.

2. Coy Comds will ensure that the provisions of AMR & O 289, together with the advantage of using the correct channels of complaints thereby prescribed, are explained to the members of all units on parade at frequent intervals. The attention of members will be drawn at the same time to the provisions of AMR & O 293 and 307 (1) and they will be warned that any member failing to observe these provisions will be liable to disciplinary action.

3. Any communications on service matters made by a member through channels other than those prescribed and received at a HQ will be forwarded to the member's unit for appropriate action by the C.O.

4. GRO A.108/1942 is cancelled.

PILFERING OF CANTEN AND AMENITIES SUPPLIES IN TRANSIT (Ref FAAO A301/44)

1. Considerable losses of canteen, amenities and philanthropic stores have resulted from pilfering at ports of loading and off-loading.

2. To reduce these losses within First Aust Army Area the Base Sub Area to Area Comd at the port of loading will supply a sufficient escort to guard such stores during loading, transit and off-loading. Where practicable such escorts may be detailed from personnel returning from leave X list etc, proceeding to such port of off-loading.

DISCHARGE OF PERSONNEL FOR UNIVERSITY STUDY YEAR 1945 (Ref FAAO A300/44).

War Cabinet has given approval for the discharge of personnel who desire to commence or resume University Courses in the 1945 University year, and whose discharge is recommended by the Manpower Directorate.

Necessary particulars will be furnished to personnel on application to this H.Q.

5. EFFECTS OF DECEASED JAPANESE SOLDIERS. (Ref FAAO A295/44).

1. ~~Attention is drawn to para 13 (a) and (b) of GRO A 299/44 set out hereunder:-~~
Attention is drawn to para 13 (a) and (b) of GRO A 299/44 set out hereunder:-

- "13. (a) Any member finding the body of a deceased member of the enemy forces will -
- (i) remove the identity disc (if any)
 - (ii) search the body and remove all documents and personal effects;
 - (iii) note any details which may assist identification, such as unit badges, badges of rank, markings on clothing and equipment, the exact spot where the body was found and the probable date of death; and
 - (iv) arrange immediately for the transmission of such identity disc, notes and all documents and personal effects to the nearest representative of the Field Security Service or the nearest Intelligence officer.

(b) After necessary examination, the identity disc and personal effects will be made up into a package, securely fastened, sealed and labelled with an AAF W12 (Deceased Enemy Effects) and forwarded to the Prisoner of War Information Bureau, LHQ Melbourne"

2. The importance of complying with these provisions promptly and strictly is stressed.

6. LOSS OF ARMY JEEPS IN NEW GUINEA (Ref FAAO A296/44).

In all cases in which jeeps are stolen or suspected of having been stolen, the unit concerned will immediately report the loss to the HQ of the relevant formation which will ensure that action to recover the vehicle is taken without delay.

7. IDENTITY DISCS - WEARING OF (Ref FAAO A310/44).

1. Instances have come to notice where personnel are not wearing identity discs.
2. Coy Comdrs will ensure that the provisions of GRO A700/43 Part IX are strictly observed.

8. BREAKING DOWN OF SERVICE OR ENEMY AMMUNITION. (Ref FAAO A310/44).

1. Accidents have occurred due to unauthorised breaking down of enemy ammunition.
2. Attention is direct to GRO 51/44 part X paras 139-142 inclusive, which will be promulgated in Unit Routine Orders.

9. EMPTY INSECT REPELLENT BOTTLES (Ref FAAO 0324/44.).

As from 1 Jan 45 empty Insect Repellent Bottles will be treated as returnable containers and returned to AASC supply depots.

10. INCOME TAX - MEMBERS WITH DEPENDENTS RESIDENT OVERSEAS (REF GRO F477).

- The Income Tax Assessment Act provides for rebates of income tax in respect of a Taxpayer's dependents resident in Australia.
2. Where a member of the AMF has married while serving overseas, rebates may be claimed in respect of his wife, and of any children of the marriage, even if they are residing overseas. Such persons are for this purpose, deemed to be domiciled in Australia.
 2. No rebate will be allowed in respect of other dependents residing outside Australia.
 4. GRO F477/1944 is cancelled.

11. SUBMISSION OF SUGGESTIONS FOR IMPROVEMENTS IN ARMY ADMINISTRATION AND FOR ECONOMIES IN MAN POWER AND MATERIALS (Ref GRO Adm 449).

1. The submission by members of written suggestions for improvements in the system of Army administration and for economies in man power and materials is to be encouraged.

2. All ranks will be informed that -

(a) the submission of any suggestion is invited by

(b) every suggestion will be promptly and sympathetically considered;

(c) If a suggestion cannot be adopted, the maker of it will, wherever practicable, be given some explanation;

(d) If a suggestor so requests, his identity will not be divulged to higher authority by the officer who receives it initially in accordance with para 3 hereof.

3. (a) A suggestion made by a member of a HQ will be addressed to the head of the branch or service with which the member is serving at that HQ; such head will attach his comments, and will then be sent by the commander of the HQ direct to LHQ, suggestions.

(b) A suggestion made by a member who is not serving at a HQ will be addressed to his CO, who will forward it, together with his own comments, if any, direct to LHQ.

(c) A commander or CO may, at his discretion, send a copy of a suggestion and his own comments, if any, to his immediately superior authority.

(d) Each suggestion will be forwarded to LHQ promptly.

12. SERVICE CHEVRONS (Ref GRO 441).

1. Authority is granted for the wearing of blue service chevrons, subject to the provisions of this order. These chevrons are individual symbols denoting that a member has carried out operational service as a member of a force operating in a theatre of operations.

2. The persons who may qualify for the wearing of the chevrons are members of the AMF, approved representatives of philanthropic societies and civilians attached to the AMF in an official capacity.

3. For the purpose of this order, "theatres of operations" are

(a) from 3 Sept 1939 onwards - Europe (not including United Kingdom)

(b) From 7 Jan 1940 onwards - Middle East (including Mediterranean area) and North Africa.

(c) From 16 Jun 1940 onwards - United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

(d) From 8 Dec 1940 onwards - Burma and Assam, China, India, Mandated Territory of New Guinea, Nauru, New Caledonia, New Guinea, Netherlands East Indies, Ocean Islands, Solomon Islands, Territory of Papua, Timor,

(e) Dangerous waters (for ship's staff only) as defined in para 4.

(f) Any other place which the Commander in Chief declares to be a theatre of operations for the purpose of this order.

4. "Dangerous waters" referred to in para 3 are -

(a) From 3 Sept 39 - The Atlantic Ocean, including British Home waters and the North Sea, the Baltic, the Arctic Ocean between Greenland and ~~100°~~ longitude 70° and /that parts of the Indian Ocean lying south of 15° south and west of 55° east.

(b) From 1 Jun 40 - As in (a) with the addition of the Pacific Ocean and the rest of the Indian Ocean.

(c) From 10 Jun 40 - Anywhere at sea.

5. The following provisions apply to "operational" service" under this order:-

(a) "Operational Service" means service during the present war as an individual member of a unit in a Naval, Military or Airforce of the British Empire or its Allies or attached thereto under the terms of sub para (g) in a theatre of operations, or as a prisoner of war anywhere.

(b) Operational service commences on the day of departure for a theatre of operations from the final port of call in Australia for service in such theatre, or the commencing date of specified in para 3, whichever

is the later.

(c) unless the several conditions laid down in this order are fulfilled departure from Australia for duty overseas will not itself confer eligibility for a service chevron.

(d) Operational service need not be continuous.

(e) The following service will not constitute operational service;

(i) voyage only, escort or draft conducting duties (whether related to a theatre of operations or not).

(ii) travelling through a theatre of operations en route for duty in a non-operational area.

(f) Visits to a theatre of operations do not count as operational service unless:-

(i) They are specified as attachments and come within provisions of sub-para (g)

(ii) they are made under instructions from LHQ and are continuous for a period of 30 days or more, or

(iii) they are frequent visits made by individuals in the normal course of duty, in which case the qualifying period of 30 days need not be continuous but each case will be submitted for approval to LHQ.

(g) Attachments of an individual not a member of an attached unit or sub unit in a theatre of operations merely for the purpose of accommodation and rations do not in themselves count as operational service. Subject to sub para (f) attachments of an individual not a member of an attached unit or sub unit in a theatre of operations will count as operational service only when LHQ records clearly indicate that the member was appointed or posted to a force operating in a theatre of operations for the express purpose of taking part in the operations as a member of a unit or attached thereto. Such members will not wear chevrons solely on account of attachments until their entitlement to do so has been verified by LHQ Records.

(h) The following will be excluded in calculating the length of operational service -

(i) periods of absence without leave;

(ii) periods spent in prison or detention;

(iii) periods spent in hospital due to misconduct and

(iv) periods of absence from a theatre of operations for any reason (e.g. at a school, on leave, etc in a non-operational area).

6. One chevron is awarded to denote first commencement of operational service.

7. On additional chevron is awarded to denote completion of each 12 months of operational service.

8. The following provisions will apply to chevrons authorized to be worn under this order:-

(a) They will be of blue worsted embroidery $\frac{1}{2}$ in in width with arms $1\frac{1}{4}$ in long.

(b) They will be worn centrally on the outer side of the right sleeve with the centre point upwards

(c) They may be worn by officers and other ranks on uniforms and Safari jackets having long sleeves, greatcoats and cloth and drill jackets but may not be worn on any other article of clothing

(d) On the officer's pattern jacket, the apex of the lowest chevron will be 1" above the upper point of the cuff. In other cases, the apex of the lowest chevron will be 4" above the bottom of the cuff.

9. No chevron will be worn by a member of the AIF UNLESS the above conditions are fulfilled and the award thereof is verified by an entry in the member's Record of Service Book, duly indicated under para 19 (iii) of GRO A739/43. Where any doubt exists, the case will be referred to superior authority for determination.

10. Commanding Officers will check the wearing of Service Chevrons and will take disciplinary action against any member who wears a chevron to which he is not entitled.

11. GROs A45/43, A153/43, A283/43 and A346/43 are cancelled.

13. SUPERANNUATION ACT 1922 - 23: MEDICAL EXAMINATIONS OF MEMBERS OF AMF
(Ref GRO A438).

1. The provisions of sections 4B and 13 of Superannuation Act 1922-23 require that members, on increasing their number of units in order to take up neglected units be medically examined by a Commonwealth Medical Officer.
2. Up to the present, in cases where a Commonwealth medical officer considered that any member should also be examined by a specialist he has instructed such member to report to a civilian specialist for further medical examination accordingly, the expense of this additional examination being borne by the member concerned.
3. The Superannuation Board has now agreed that, in the case of members of the AMF on full time duty who are contributors to the Commonwealth Superannuation Fund, such specialist examinations may be carried out by the Army, thus relieving the member concerned of any financial liability.
4. This order will be brought to the notice of all members of the AMF and of members of the CMF on full time duty who belong to the Commonwealth Public Forces.

14. PRIVATE COMMUNICATIONS CONCERNING CASUALTIES (Ref GRO A437).

1. Private cables and telegrams reporting battle or other casualties are prohibited. In letters, no reference is to be made to any such casualty until after a period of one month from the date of its occurrence.
2. The prohibition and restriction imposed by para 1 hereof are not applicable to communications sent by a member relative to a casualty sustained by himself.
3. This order has been dictated by motives of consideration for the feelings of the relatives of members of the forces, in many instances have been caused unnecessary suffering and suspense through information contained in private correspondence from operational areas and which, in some cases has proved to be inaccurate.

15. TRADE GROUPINGS - USE OF ARABIC NUMERALS INSTEAD OF ROMAN NUMERALS IN DESIGNATIONS (Ref 8 Bde RO A578/44)

In future all trade group classifications will be indicated by ARABIC numerals instead of Roman - i.e. TG2 instead of II etc.

16. AA AMENITIES SERVICE BROADCASTING STATIONS (Ref GROs 474-481 page 11).

1. A limited number of personnel with broadcasting experience will be required in the near future for army broadcasting stations, to be established in forward areas under the control of the Australian Army Amenities Service.
2. Applications are invited from qualified and experienced officers and other ranks for transfer to the Australian Army Amenities Service in appointments as stated hereunder:-

Programme Manager - Capt.
OO Stations - Lieut
Announcers - WO I Sgt.
Orderly Room Clerks - Sgts Cpl.
MT Drivers, Librarians, General Duties - Ptes.

3. Applications should include details of civilian experience in broadcasting.

17. OCCUPATIONAL LEAVE WITHOUT PAY - WEARING OF UNIFORM (Ref GAO RO A. 319/44)

1. GAO A.373/44 para 8 (b) states:

"Personnel released on LWOP will not return their uniforms or kit-bags, but will be instructed not to wear articles of uniform, except those issued for the purpose, when engaged in civilian occupation"

2. In view of the difficulties encountered by the Royal Commission in dealing with personnel on LWOP due to varying interpretations of the above sub-para, it is desirable to make it clear that members on leave without pay may wear military uniform during pleasure hours and that the words "when engaged in civil employment" means only the time during which the soldier is actually working at his civil occupation.

18. CANCELLATION OF 1942 GROs (Ref GRO Adm 484/44).

All GROs issued during the year 1942 are cancelled.

19. CORRECT CHANNEL OF COMPLAINTS AND COMMUNICATIONS ON SERVICE MATTERS (Ref GRO A.487/44)

1. The use of the correct channels of complaints, as prescribed by AMR & O 289, is to members' advantage, as those channels ensure that complaints are investigated, and are referred to the authority who has power to grant any necessary redress, by the most direct means. 20. SECURITY - GREEN ENVELOPES (Ref 8 Bde RO G.16/45).

1. Several cases have occurred recently within the Bde, whereby the use of green envelopes has been abused.

2. In most cases breached were a deliberate attempt to convey matter known to be censorable. Others where the writer, often in ignorance wrote of military matters far removed from personal and private matters.

3. It should be realised by users, that many matters which would be passed in normal regimental franking, when included in a green envelope constitute "misuse", because of the fact that the matter is not a private and family affair.

4. All troops using green envelopes sign the declaration on the outside of same to the effect that the contents refer to nothing but private and family matters. Troops obviously do not realise the full import of this declaration, and it must be explained to them.

5. In passing this matter to troops it is well to add, that the provision of a green envelope is a privilege, which if abused, may be withdrawn at any time, not only from the offender but also from his fellow troops.

DEPARTMENT OF LABOUR AND NATIONAL SERVICE.

The Department of Labour and National Service has advised that, under the Commonwealth Reconstruction Training Scheme, many additional trade instructors will be needed in technical schools and colleges and similar training organisations, particularly in the building trade.

23: SAFARI JACKETS - MALE PERSONNEL, AMF. (Ref GRO 0.12/45)

1. Jackets, safari, may be worn only by officers and warrant officers, class I.
2. Such articles may be worn only when the wearing of summer dress is permitted.

24: UNIT MAINTENANCE INSPECTORS. (Ref GRO 0/11/45)

1. A serious threat to the mechanical efficiency of the AMF has arisen owing to the inability of military and civilian facilities to meet the growing demand for repairs and replacements with the limited man power available.
2. OCs will impress upon all ranks concerned the importance of the careful use and maintenance of mechanical equipment (to enable its continued availability to the Army), and will ensure that all instructions issued for that purpose are properly carried out.
3. (a) To assist in the supervision of and training in unit maintenance, staff officers, to be known as unit maintenance inspectors, will be attached to certain formations and areas.
(b) Their duties will include -
 - (i) advising and reporting on unit maintenance;
 - (ii) inspection of all types of electrical and mechanical equipment;
 - (iii) personally advising OCs on care and preservation of equipment;
 - (iv) "follow up" action after inspections; and
 - (v) assistance in preparation of formation and area commanders' reports to LHQ.

(c) They will be selected primarily for their knowledge of MT maintenance and may call on senior service representatives on formation or area headquarters for other technical assistance as required.

(d) They will not perform functions which are the responsibility of any service, e.g. technical inspection of equipment by LADs or inspectors MT, AASC, nor will they classify, sentence, repair or adjust equipment, but they may advise and instruct unit personnel.

(e) Unit maintenance inspectors will be carried on the WE of MGO Branch, but will be responsible to the formation or area commander concerned and will not correspond direct with MGO Branch.
4. Every effort must be made to keep equipment out of workshops and in service.

25: SALUTING. (Ref GRO A.6/45)

Officers of field rank and above -

1. (a) Officers of field rank and above will salute their superiors in rank at all times, whether on duty or parade or not, before and after addressing or being addressed by them and when passing or being passed by them.
(b) While on duty or parade, officers of field rank and above will salute their equals in rank who are senior to them before and after addressing or being addressed by them.

Officers below field rank.-

2. (a) Officers below field rank will salute all officers of field rank and above at all times, whether on duty or parade or not, before and after addressing or being addressed by them and when passing or being passed by them.
- (b) Before and after addressing them or being addressed by them when on duty or parade, lieutenants will salute captains, and both lieutenants and captains will salute their equals in rank who are senior to them.

Other Ranks.-

3. WOs, NCOs and private soldiers will salute officers at all times before and after addressing them or being addressed by them and when passing or being passed by them, except -
 - (i) in a crowded thoroughfare or assembly; or
 - (ii) during an exercise in the field; or
 - (iii) when on parade or performing duty under the immediate control of a superior; or
 - (iv) when precluded by the nature of their duties from so doing.
4. A salute made to an officer will be returned by him; when made to two or more officers together, it will be returned by the senior officer only.
5. Members will salute officers of His Majesty's Naval and Air Forces and of Allied Naval, Military and Air Forces in accordance with the principles set out above.
6. The attention of all members will be directed to AMR & Os 1153 and 1154 with regard to saluting when the National Anthem is played.

26: PERSONNEL REJOINING UNIT.

All ranks rejoining 4 Aust Inf Bn (AIF) from hospital, school, leave and detachment for duty will report to BN HQ prior to rejoining their respective coys.

27: AMMUNITION DUMP.

Bn Amn Dump and adjacent area is out of bounds to all ranks.

28: CIVILIANS - ENTRY INTO AUSTRALIAN MILITARY CAMP-SITES, Etc.
