

1. **AA & QMG:** Reported incidence Aust Tps at US 31 Salvage Unit - to insert in next Routine Order instructions placing this Unit Area OUT OF BOUNDS. Disciplinary action will be taken against offenders. AQ reported that Col Youndt, HQ US Service Comd willing to provide refig space as long as sufficient advice of any AUST refig cargo was given before arrival. All efforts would be made to make space available. Permanent allotment of space is not possible.
2. **DAAG:** 16 and 38 Works Coys finalised. Sites for Hosp Laundry units yet to be determined. AQ and DADMS to report on same.
3. **DADST:** GII reported an Aust Signal Service would be in operation from 0800 L tomorrow. Signal Office at JAN and operator branch for transmission and receipt of all outgoing and incoming signals. D R Service to units to be arranged by G Brn.

DADST arranging for Transport Offr to be on duty at beachhead. LO from Base HQ to act as Director of Labour at beachhead.

REPORTS

1. AA & QMG : In future pre fabricated huts erected for storage purposes will not be constructed with timber floors - as these floors more suitable.
Movement Control pre fabricated hut at beaching - erection held up temporarily owing to lack of transport this difficulty expected to be overcome today.
Decided not to erect pre fabricated hut for Movements in Base HQs area - construction of hut with temporary earthen floor to be commenced in line by Engineer timber flooring to be put in upon arrival of supplies.
A/CRE reported that at 1500L yesterday 8000 super ft of timber was produced by mill few days - US Forces still drawing supplies from Mill. Construction programme not held up by lack of timber at moment.
A/CRE reported that desired site for 2 Mob Idy & Fwd Docn Unit NOT available - DADOS to accompany A/CRE this morning to select another suitable site.
100 CCS - A/CRE advised that CCS in possession of 20 Hesp extending tents which they will not require - DADMS to contact CO of unit and arrange return to A/CRE for use by 15 Nov.
Dental Centre expected to be ready to function within next few days.
2. GSO II: NIL to report.

4. DJMG: Unloading of "LEW WALLACE" discontinued during repairs to boilers which are expected to take a fortnight.



REPORTS:

1. AA & QMG: Reported that he is now in accord with necessity for a beachhead transit area at which representative of each service will operate. Very concerned for early discharge of shipping of Engr Stores in "HENRY GAVIS" particularly roofing and wire netting and wire meshing. Asked that Mvts endeavour to expedite this. On receipt of those Engrs are to proceed immediately with roofing of BSD, and Canton. Also commence today provision of Liquor security shed. Site 113 AGT almost complete. Would like DADST to submit area to MAC and latter to move in. Engrs to proceed with provision to units now arriving of prefab kitchens and latrine seats.
2. GSO II: NIL to report
3. DAGC: Report Attached.
4. DAGC: Reported that situation regarding Transport and Labour is now satisfactory. 16 Works Coy were supplying labour at beachhead. Maj Munro, CO that unit, is Officer in Charge of labour and will act in conjunction with Mvts. Labour for use in installations would be supplied by DADST as required. Transit Camp was at present nearly cleared both of Unit personnel and equipment.
5. DADDS: Report Attached.
6. DADDS: Reported that explosive outbreak of diarrhoea in Transit area had been investigated by Lt Col Sengster, OC Med Div of AGH and report submitted this HQ. All suggested improvement to Sanitation and hygiene had been or were in process of being implemented. Investigation seems to show that outbreak started on "JOE HARRIS" and owing to poor state of sanitation in Transit Camp, this rapidly spread. Now on wane. Spoison rate amongst native children almost 100% and it is pointed out that native lines being in centre of camp provides best possible reservoir of infection. Move of the native camp should be considered as an urgent necessity.
7. DADOS: Report Attached.
8. 5 AUST CRE (WKS): Reports vehicle position satisfactory working of unit now improving with arrival of transport.
9. D/LIE: Reports that he had observed widespread breach of dress regulations in units. DAGC drew attention to necessity for and means of enforcing.
10. MOVEMENTS: Lt Col McPHEE reported having taken over 200 mts into and out of this area. Docks Coy working satisfactorily. Approach to it and Port Dct must be through mts. Liaison with Branch satisfactory. Security aspect of discharge of cargo attracts attention particularly with regard to mixed consignments and arrangements necessary with Q Branch for provision of breaking up and Provost supervision is yet to be arranged. Docks Coy seems to know its procedure well. 8 ships in harbour. We are working 3 of them today. Yesterday figures discharged - 1st HENRY GAVIS 330 tons in 17 LCT's. 2nd JOE HARRIS 780 tons. 1713 ton ships were used. 19 officers & 133 CRE disembarked.





VACANCIES FOR OFFICERS IN THE AMF

- (e) Vacancy for which nominated
- (f) If the transfer is desired by the officer, or not.

4. Where necessary LHQ will arrange for officers to be interviewed by a representative of the Arm or Service to which transfer is proposed.

5. Any necessary conversion training of officers who are selected for transfer and their subsequent posting will be arranged at LHQ.

6. Before selecting officers for transfer, LHQ will consider the requirements of the Unit in which the officer is serving and the claims of the unit to which transfer is proposed.

7. Suitable replacements for the officers who are selected for transfer will be arranged by the Military Secretary's Branch at LHQ or at 2nd Echelon LHQ as applicable from officers of disbanded units or from those already allotted as general reinforcements.

8. Appendix A attached hereto sets out the vacancies which exist at present together with the qualifications required.

9. Units will take appropriate action forthwith in accordance with para 2 above, and submit nominations to this Headquarters by 0900 hrs on 20 Oct 44.

Units situated in zones 1, 2, and 3, will ensure that all sick personnel are waiting by the roadside to stop the ambulance. Each party will be accompanied by one NCO.
4. On completion of the sick parade, the ambulance will make the return journey and convey personnel to their respective units.
5. Personnel requiring hospital treatment will be admitted to 100 Aust CCS, and must be accompanied by AAF W3113. Patients must arrive at the Clearing Station no later than 1030 hrs each day.
6. The provisions of GRO A65/44 and 4 Aust Base Sub Area RO A30/44 will be strictly adhered to.
7. 4 Aust Base Sub Area RO A12/44 is cancelled.

A.49 FIRE ORDERS

1. In order to obtain uniformity throughout this area, all units will draw up Fire Orders in accordance with appendix "B".
2. Amendments necessary to provide for unit domestic requirements may be made to these Fire Orders, but they will be adhered to as closely as possible.

A.50 AREAS OUT OF BOUNDS

All US Army Salvage Dumps and all RVNAP areas and installations are out of bounds to Australian troops. Disciplinary action will be taken against all personnel who disregard this order.

A51. GROs - UNIT REQUIREMENTS

1. A return will be submitted by all units to reach TQ 4 Aust Base Sub Area by 23 Oct 44 showing what copies of GROs are required in order to complete unit files.
2. Incoming units will submit this return within 7 days of arrival.

A.52 UNIT EDUCATION OFFICERS

1. In accordance with the provisions of GRO A197/43 all units will appoint a Unit Education Officer or NCO, and particulars of the Army No., Name and Rank of the officer or NCO selected will be submitted to TQ 4 Aust Base Sub Area by 30 Oct 44.
2. Advice in connection with the appointment of a suitable officer or NCO may be obtained from the Education Officer TQ 4 Aust Base Sub Area (Capt C.A. PTVOT).

A.53 CORRESPONDENCE COURSES

1. Units will submit a return to Branch HQ 4 Aust Base Sub Area by 30 Oct 44 showing the following details of personnel who are taking Correspondence Courses which have been arranged through the Aust Army Education Service:

- (a) Army No., Rank, Name
- (b) Name of Course and date of commencement
- (c) Institution providing Course
- (d) Progress made in course

2. Application forms for personnel who desire to take the Correspondence Courses available may be obtained from the Education Officer HQ 4 Aust Base Sub Area.

A.54 LIBRARIES

1. A library is maintained by the Education Officer HQ 4 Aust Base Sub Area, and books may be obtained on loan for a period of two weeks.

2. Unit Education Officers may obtain up to 15 books for loan within their units.

A.55 DISCUSSIONS - CURRENT AFFAIRS BULLETIN

Discussions on the contents of the Current Affairs Bulletin (vide GPO AC25/44) will be commenced by all units not later than 1 Nov 44.

2. The times of these discussions will be notified to the Education Officer HQ 4 Aust Base Sub Area

A.56 CRAPPS AND TOBBIES

1. As soon as possible units which have hobby stores on issue from the AA Education Service, or stores which have been purchased with unit funds, will furnish full details of these stores to the Education Officer HQ 4 Aust Base Sub Area.

2. Units which have personnel who have been trained as craft leaders will notify the Education Officer HQ 4 Aust Base Sub Area, and give details of the nature of their training.

3. Indents may be submitted for garden tools and seeds.

4. A further instruction on this subject will be issued at a later date.

A.57 DRESS

1. Attention is drawn to 4 Aust Base Sub Area RO A 7/44 para 2 (c).

2. Personnel are permitted to remove their shirts only when ACTUALLY ENGAGED in heavy manual labour. Immediately such manual labour ceases, for any period whatsoever, personnel will again put on their shirts.

3. Personnel will NOT remove their shirts whilst riding in vehicles, nor whilst driving.

A.58 REQUISITIONS FOR MEDICAL STORES

1. All requisitions for the supply of medical stores will be submitted on AAF D50 to DADMS HQ 4 Aust Base Sub Area for approval.
2. Units are forbidden to endeavour to obtain medical stores without this prior approval.

A.59 SPEED LIMITS

Attention is directed to 4 Aust Base Sub Area RO A5/44 in connection with speed limits. Non-compliance with this order will result in severe disciplinary action against offenders.

A.60 HYGIENE AND SANITATION

1. The following measures to control fly-borne diseases at their source will be taken:

(a) Latrines

- (i) Human excreta must at all times be protected from flies.
- (ii) Deep trench latrines, if possible at least 10 ft. deep, will be used with a fly-proof superstructure, and will be sited not less than 40 yds from any source of water supply.
- (iii) When filled to within three feet of the surface, latrines will be sealed off with oil soaked canvas, hessian or paper, covered with earth, and the site clearly marked.
- (iv) Fly-traps of an approved design will be attached to the superstructure of each deep trench latrine. These will be maintained in good order at all times.
- (v) No other system of disposal of human excreta will be used unless with the written approval of the Senior Medical Officer of the Formation.
- (vi) Latrine seats will be scrubbed daily with an antiseptic solution.
- (vii) Bottles containing an antiseptic solution will be provided in each latrine, and personnel instructed in their use.

(b) ALL personnel suffering from diarrhoea will report immediately to the RAP.

(c) Personnel who have had typhoid fever or dysentery, or who are being treated for diarrhoea, MPTI or venereal disease, will not be employed handling food until certified free from infection.

(d) Units will provide separate and adequate sanitary facilities for native working parties in their employ.

2. The following measures to prevent fly-breeding and to destroy adult flies will be taken:

(a) All waste matter or refuse in which flies may harbour or breed will be completely incinerated.

(b) All tins and cans will be thoroughly burnt and disposed of in such a way that they will not hold water in which mosquitoes may breed.

NOTE: The only exceptions to the above two instructions are:

- (i) When kitchen refuse is disposed of to contractors for use as pig food.

- (ii) Where waste matter, refuse, tins, and cans are effectively dumped at sea.
- (iii) When the responsibility for the disposal of any part of unit refuse is undertaken by Salvage.

(c) Dumping of unit refuse outside unit lines is prohibited unless with the written approval of the Senior Medical Officer of the Formation.

(d) All sullage water from kitchens, showers, ablution benches etc., will be passed through a strainer to remove food particles and debris; then through a grease trap and finally disposed of into a soakage system or an absorption pit in such a way that natural water courses are not polluted.

(e) Flies are to be destroyed in messes, cook houses and unit lines by fly traps, poison bait and swatting.

3. The following measures to prevent contamination of food will be taken:

(a) All food will be examined to determine its suitability for human consumption. If any evidence of deterioration or contamination is found, the food will be dealt with in accordance with GRO 2105/43. Illnesses suspected to be due to unwholesome food will be dealt with in accordance with GRO 2745/43.

(b) At all times during transport, preparation, storage and on mess tables, food will be protected from dust, dirt, flies and other pests.

(c) DIDs and bakeries will not issue uncanned foodstuffs, unless provision is made for protection of foodstuffs during transport in unit vehicles.

(d) Food preparation and storage rooms, kitchens and mess rooms will be screened with fly wire as soon as possible in the above order of priority.

(e) All ranks will be instructed in the necessity for cleanliness in the care of their messing gear; and facilities will be provided for cleaning and sterilization of all messing and cooking utensils before and after meals. Mess gear will be protected from dust between meals.

(f) Before every meal, personnel will wash their hands with soap and water.

4. The following measures regarding water supplies will be taken:

(a) All water for drinking and all water used in the preparation of uncooked food will be sterilized by boiling, superchlorination or chloramination.

(b) Sources of water supply will be protected from pollution.

(c) Water collected from Tonne iron roofs or water stored in Tonne plate containers will not be used for drinking, or in the preparation of food. Any such water will be labelled "Unfit for drinking".

(d) The attention of COs is drawn to GRO 573/43 (Water Supplies in the Field).

5. To control the high incidence of skin diseases occurring among the troops in New Guinea the following steps will be taken when possible:

- (a) Camps will be sited in the open out of the jungle to allow for thorough ventilation.
- (b) Facilities will be provided for boiling clothing particularly underclothing.
- (c) Daily hot baths or showers of sterilized water will be provided for all personnel and soap used freely.
- (d) All personnel should be instructed in the necessity for:
 - (i) Careful and thorough drying of the skin, particularly under the arms and between the legs and toes.
 - (ii) The application of talc powder to the above areas.
 - (iii) The removal of all water from the ears by careful drying.
 - (iv) Reporting all skin abnormalities as soon as they appear.
- (e) Frequent inspections of all personnel should be made by RMOs to detect any early skin diseases.

6. The following sanitary rules for cookhouses will take effect forthwith:

- (a) Personnel suffering from diarrhoea will report sick at once.
- (b) Personnel who have had typhoid fever or dysentery, or who are being treated for diarrhoea, URTI or VD, will not be employed in handling food until certified free from infection.
- (c) A diet sheet for the week shall be hung up for reference in the cookhouse.
- (d) Each cook and man employed in the handling of food will be provided with sufficient washable overalls and caps to ensure cleanliness at all times. These will be worn when men are at work, and changed when dirty.
- (e) A basin of clean water, soap, nail brush and clean towel, will be provided in each cookhouse to be used by personnel before handling food.
- (f) No personal property or clothing of men employed will be kept in the cookhouse.
- (g) No cookhouse or mess buildings will be used as sleeping accommodation for personnel.
- (h) No unauthorized personnel will be permitted to remain in the cookhouse.
- (i) No smoking will be permitted in the cookhouses.
- (j) The cookhouses and accessories, and all utensils used in the preparation of food will be kept clean and tidy at all times, and when not in use, accessories and utensils will be stored on racks.
- (k) Food will be protected from flies, pests, dust and dirt at all times.
- (l) Food will not be issued to personnel presenting dirty messing gear.

A.61 STRENGTH RETURNS

The following strength returns will be submitted by all units:

- (a) AP W3006 (Strength State) will be compiled as at 0600 hrs each Saturday and one copy submitted to VG Adv 2 Ech and one copy to HQ 4 Aust Base Sub Area.

- (b) AF W3008 (Field Return of Officers) will be compiled by all units and detachments commanded by an officer to show the WO and posted strength as at 0600 hrs each Saturday and two copies submitted to WG Adv 2 Ech and one copy to HQ 4 Aust Base Sub Area.
- (c) AF W3009 (Field Return of ORs) will be compiled as for AF W3008 and one copy submitted to WG Adv 2 Ech and one copy to HQ 4 Aust Base Sub Area.

2. 4 Aust Base Sub Area RO A13/44 is cancelled.

A.62 DENTAL SERVICES

Urgent dental cases may be treated at the 109 Aust CCS.

Q.63 RNZAF SUPPLIES AND EQUIPMENT

1. Certain units have approached representatives of the RNZAF to obtain quantities of supplies and equipment for their own use.
2. This unauthorised practice will cease forthwith. All requisitions for supplies (including canteen goods) and equipment from other Dominion and Allied Forces in this area will be submitted to HQ 4 Aust Base Sub Area.

Q.64 SCALE "A" ACCOMMODATION

All indents for Scale "A" accommodation will be submitted to HQ 4 Aust Base Sub Area for approval prior to presentation at 5 Aust CRE (Wks).

Q.65 REQUISITIONS FOR TRANSPORT

All requisitions for transport will be submitted to Staff Captain (C) HQ 4 Aust Base Sub Area.

Q.66 COOKING OF FRESH FOOD

In units which lack refrigeration facilities, all fresh meat and vegetables will be cooked as soon as issued, and will be eaten at the next meal. Any cooked food remaining after a meal will be destroyed.

Q.67 SUBMISSION OF AAFs G52

1. All units and detachments which have not already done so, will immediately prepare AAFs G52 (M Casualty Return) and forward 2 copies to DADOS HQ 4 Aust Base Sub Area.
2. It is essential that all possible information be furnished on this return in order that AAFs G51 (Veh Card) may be kept current and accurate.
3. Incoming units will submit this return within 24 hours after arrival in this area.

Q.68 CENSUS OF MECHANICAL VEHICLES

1. All units having a WE entitlement to mechanical vehicles, and all units having such vehicles in their possession, will compile Unit Return Slips (AAF ES-9A) as at 1400hrs on the 20th day of each month and submit them immediately to DADOS HQ 4 Aust Base Sub Area, in duplicate. All the information required on the form, including the WE serial number, will be clearly shown.
2. Complete accuracy is essential in the preparation of this return, which will be checked in detail prior to signature by the Commanding Officer of the unit.
3. Detachments of units will prepare this return as set out above, and forward it to DADOS HQ 4 Aust Base Sub Area. An additional copy will also be prepared and forwarded to the parent HQ, of the detachment concerned, for information.
4. Where a unit has a detachment operating under the command of a different formation or Base Sub Area, details of the vehicles operated by such detachment will not be included in the unit return.

Q.69 MONTHLY CENSUS OF WARLIKE STORES - TECHNICAL STORES

1. As at 1400 hrs on the 20th day of each month, units will prepare a Monthly Census of Warlike Stores (Technical Stores) on the revised schedule (AAF ES-1a) and will forward it in triplicate by the fastest means to DADOS HQ 4 Aust Base Sub Area.
2. The return will be checked by DADOS, and amended where necessary. The No.2 copy will then be returned to the unit with the amendments clearly marked.
3. Particular care will be taken to ensure accuracy, and in this connection, attention is drawn to the following points, which must be shown at all times:
 - (a) Unit Name and OOR serial number.
 - (b) Formation
 - (c) Date prepared
 - (d) Correct WE and WET
 - (e) Strength of officers and other ranks
 - (f) Latest GRO which has amended AAF ES-1
4. Attention is drawn to the provisions of GRO 0195/44.

Q.70 STORES DISCHARGED AT TOROKINA

All units will submit a return by 20 Oct 44 giving full details of deficiencies noted and surpluses held in respect of stores discharged at the Port of TOROKINA.

Q.71 SUPPLY OF ENGINEER STORES

1. Units which require engineer stores will submit AAF S18 in duplicate to 5 Aust CRE (Tks) giving a description of the items, quantities and the purpose for which they are required. In cases where a building of any kind is to be erected, the approval of "Q" Branch HQ 4 Aust Base Sub Area must first be obtained. Demands for timber must be submitted on separate AAFs S18.

2. Except in cases of emergency or operational necessity, AAFs S1B will only be approved at 5 Aust CRG (Vks) from 0730 hrs to 0930 hrs daily from Monday to Saturday inclusive, and issues will be made from the Engineer Dump only from 0730 hrs to 1130 hrs and 1300 hrs to 1400 hrs from Monday to Saturday inclusive.

Q.72 CENSUS OF COVERS WATERPROOF (TARPAULINE)

In order to provide a record of all covers waterproof held by units under command, a return will be submitted to HQ 4 Aust Base Sub Area by 20 Oct 44, showing:

- (a) Numbers held, and sizes
- (b) Whether "in use" or "surplus".
- (c) Brief explanation as to employment of those in use.

Para 5 of 4 Aust Base Sub Area RO Q23/44 is amended by deleting all words and figures from "Personnel" to "excl Sundays".



NOTE: THESE ORDERS WILL BE DISPLAYED IN A PROMINENT POSITION IN EACH BUILDING AND ON THE UNIT NOTICE BOARD. IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE SENIOR WO OR NCO IN EACH SECTION TO ENSURE THAT THESE ORDERS ARE KNOWN TO AND UNDERSTOOD BY ALL OR'S UNDER THEIR CONTROL

These orders are divided into two parts:-

Part 1. Precautions to be taken against fire.

Part 2. Procedure on occurrence of a fire.

PART 1. PRECAUTIONS TO BE TAKEN AGAINST FIRE

Smoking:

1. Smoking is absolutely prohibited in all workshops, petrol depots or dumps and in buildings etc in which smoking is prohibited notices will be displayed prominently, and the prohibition rigidly enforced.
2. In buildings and tents care will be taken in emptying ash trays, knocking pipe ashes or throwing cigarette ends or used matches into waste paper baskets or open rubbish bins.
3. Care will be taken to see that cigarette ends, pipe ashes or glowing matches are not discarded from moving vehicles or in the vicinity of tents or in any place where there is any danger of fire.

ELECTRIC FITTINGS AND INSTALLATIONS

4. Electric fittings will be kept in good repair, and if any chafing of wires, heating, or other damage is noticed, supply will be cut off at once until repairs are effected.

Inflammable Liquid

5. Petrol and inflammable oil for use by MT, will be stored in a safe place at sufficient distance from vehicles and buildings to ensure safety in case of fire.
6. Inflammable liquid will not be stored in buildings used as workshops or storage shed for non inflammable stores.
7. Storage of paraffin, kerosene etc in ordinary stores is prohibited.
8. Spilled petrol should be at once wiped up, on no account will petrol be allowed to run into drains.

9. Caps of petrol cans will be firmly screwed down and never left open.
10. Petrol tins empty or full will not on any account be kept in tents, buildings or any unauthorised place.
11. In all places where inflammable liquid is stored a bucket of sand or dry earth will be placed, to be thrown at once on any inflammable liquid that has become ignited. Water will NOT be used.
12. Great care will be exercised when the tanks of vehicles are being replenished. Engines will be stopped and any petrol spilled will be immediately wiped up or covered with sand.
13. Naked lights or hurricane type lamps will on no account be taken into or used in the vicinity of an inflammable liquid or material store, nor will the use of such lamps be permitted when filling petrol tanks at night.

Oil Lamps

14. Lamps will not be filled while burning, they should not be permitted to become dry or empty, and should be filled at regular intervals. Lamps in regular use will be examined daily. Receptacles containing oil should not be filled to overflowing point, but only to a point that will permit an air space above the oil.
15. Oil lamps will not be permitted to burn indefinitely in huts or at places that are not constantly under supervision. Under no circumstances will lamps be left-burning in tents during the absence of the occupants.
16. Where other than electric lamps are used in tents or buildings they will not be placed within 24 inches of any combustible material.
17. Cracked chimneys or lamp glasses will be replaced with new ones. Paper or cloth must not be gummed over cracks in chimneys or lamp glasses.

Store Huts and Tents

18. Storemen will not sleep in store huts or tents unless permission has first been obtained from the OC.
19. The Camp Orderly Officer will arrange that all stores in which men are allowed to sleep are visited periodically, to ensure that all fire precaution regulations are being complied with.
20. A notice prohibiting smoking will be exhibited in all stores.

General

21. Grass will be kept short to within 20 feet distance of the outside of all buildings and tents. The senior WO or WCC in each building and senior WO, WCC or OR in each tent is responsible for ensuring that this precaution is carried into effect.
22. Fires will not be lit for any purpose whatsoever in proximity of tents or huts except with the authority of a commissioned officer. That officer will ensure that such fires are subsequently extinguished. The possibility of change of wind and wind-borne sparks will not be overlooked.

23. Mess kitchens and other buildings in which fires or lights other than electric have been used, will be swept out before being closed for the night.

24. Naked lights in tents will be kept carefully shielded, candles, if used, will be placed in approved holders.

Maintenance of Fire Fighting Appliances

25. Sand and water buckets will be kept filled in each hut. It is the responsibility for the senior WO or WCO i/c of office staff or section to maintain these fire fighting appliances in an efficient condition, and to ensure that water buckets are kept filled and free from refuse. Water buckets will be emptied and refilled at least once every seven days.

26. Fire fighting appliances will not be removed from their fixed location except in cases of emergency.

PART 2. PROCEDURE ON OCCURRENCE OF FIRE

1. By person discovering the Fire :

The person discovering will:-

- (a) Immediately give the alarm by calling F I R E loudly.
- (b) Call out the fire picquet (which will be detailed daily)
- (c) Warn personnel in building or tent affected.
- (d) Put the fire extinguisher or fire buckets into operation at once.

2. By Personnel Within Sound Of the Alarm.

Personnel within sound of the alarm will:

- (a) Pick up fire fighting appliances convenient.
- (b) Proceed to scene of the fire and assist in extinguishing.

By Senior Officer, WO or WCO at Scene Of Fire:

3. Organise the personnel available into:-

- (a) Fire Fighting party
- (b) Water carrying party
- (c) Security party to remove documents and salvage eqpt.

4. In A Tent

Man first on the scene will immediately strike the tent by the quickest possible means, attempting if possible, to throw it clear of the contents of the tent. Other tents in the vicinity will be struck if there is any danger that they will catch fire.

5. General

The whole and first duty of fire fighting party is to try to isolate, limit and extinguish the fire by all means available.







A report was received from GPO 15 Aust AD that a quantity of twelve (12) Bombs in 5-in Mortar Phos, ignited on 19 Oct. The outbreak was quickly controlled and no damage was done to Tarpeulins.

The reason for the outbreak was caused by the exudation of the phos on to the augmenting Charges of the Mortar Bombs due to extremely hot conditions of storage.

All Phosphorous shell etc have been further segregated from the remainder of the amm and a greater building priority granted to try and expedite the erection of buildings capable of giving correct storage conditions.

2. In addition six (6) Amm Bays have been allotted by the UG forces. This brings the total number allotted to 17 and will leave only one (1) further bay necessary to allow the initial building programme of 18 Bays to be constructed.

3. The roofing of the transit shed at the stores depot is about three parts complete, and it is hoped that additional iron will be made available. The frameworks of two 120 x 40 sheds have been completed.





A.102. SECOND VICTORY LOAN

1. The Commonwealth Government has authorised the raising of a Second Victory Loan of £120,000,000, subscriptions for which close on 31 Oct 44. At the request of the Government, approval has been given for members of the Forces to be given the opportunity of subscribing to this loan.

2. A member may subscribe to the loan by presenting his paybook to the Unit Pay Sergeant and completing the necessary application forms which will be supplied by the Pay Sergeant. The usual civil facilities for subscribing to the loan are also open to members who desire to invest moneys held on the mainland.

3. Unit Commanders will appoint a Unit Loan Officer who will be responsible for approaching all members of his unit with a view to obtaining subscriptions to the loan, and will be allowed sufficient time from normal duties to carry out this work efficiently.

4. The results of the First Victory Loan campaign indicated that in some cases, commanders had not facilitated the approach of Loan Officers to the troops under their command. Subscriptions from members of the Forces are invited as a business proposition and not as a matter of honour or patriotism, and while it is not desired that commanders should exert pressure on their troops to subscribe, they will ensure that all reasonable facilities are made available for the circulation of information concerning the loan.

5. Information concerning the loan is as follows :-

- (a) Subscriptions may be for any multiple of £10, with a minimum of £10.
- (b) Allotments of pay may be made to the Commonwealth Bank of Australia, for the purpose of accumulating funds for investment in War Loans. Details of the procedure to be followed may be obtained from Unit Pay Sergeants.

- (c) Short term bonds (5 years) or long term bonds (16 years) may be purchased, the interest rates being 2½ per cent per annum and 3½ per cent per annum, respectively. As the bonds may be sold at any time, it is advantageous to purchase the longer term bonds and thus receive the higher rate of interest.
- (d) The Commonwealth Bank of Australia assists in the sale of bonds, without making any charge for its services. The sales are made through the agency of stockbrokers, whose charges are 1/- for a £10 bond and 5/- per cent for larger amounts.
- (e) Although subscriptions to the loan close on 31 Oct 44, applications from remotely situated personnel will be accepted subsequent to that date. However, every effort should be made to expedite the lodgment of applications so that they may be received prior to the closing date.
- (f) Arrangements may be made with the Commonwealth Bank of Australia for the safe custody of bonds, free of charge. In the case of customers of trading banks, similar facilities are available with their bankers.
- (g) Interest on bonds is payable to the credit of any bank account, as indicated by the subscriber on the application form. If a Savings Bank account is nominated, the pass book number must be quoted.
- (h) If preferred, personnel desirous of investing £100 or more may purchase Inscribed stock in lieu of bonds. Inscribed stock is represented by an entry in registers kept at the Commonwealth Bank of Australia, which issues a receipt and Notice of Inscription. Safe custody provisions are not necessary in the case of Inscribed Stock, but directions are required for the payment of interest to the credit of bank accounts.
- (i) Where servicemen desire to subscribe to the loan, ~~but have transferred their pay book credits to Savings Banks or other accessible savings deposits, they should instruct their representatives to make the necessary investment for them in their home cities or towns.~~ Where a serviceman is in possession of his Savings Bank pass book, it should be forwarded to the correct branch of his Savings Bank, accompanied by a completed loan application form and Savings Bank withdrawal form.

6. Lieut. D.D. McCALLUM has been appointed Loan Liaison Officer at HQ 4 Aust Base Sub Area and may be contacted by Unit Loan Officers for further information concerning the Loan.

7. This HQ will be advised by 1200 hours 29 Oct 44 of the total amounts subscribed within units. This advice will be forwarded by signal message.

PRESENT: MAJ & HQ 4 Aust Base Sub Area - Lt-col H WALKER
All Service Heads 4 Aust Base Sub Area.
All COs and CCOs Units under comd 4 Aust Base Sub Area.

Lt-col H WALKER opened the conference at 1400 hrs with an address in which he stated that the conference was NOT to be taken as in the nature of a condemnation of the efforts of the Base Units but rather that his remarks on the various matters he would mention would be taken as admonitions.

He ran through the circumstances of the inauguration of the Base and the difficulties that had been and were being experienced. He referred to the deficiencies of the original recon and to the fact that realisation of promises and statements made had far from reached expectations and in effect the Base had had to largely carve its own way. It boils down now he stated that the Staff will have of necessity to make severe demands on the man power resources of the various units despite their commitments within the unit. These demands may be most unpalatable to the individual units but must be regarded as given for the greater good.

The particular matters following were then referred to by Lt-col WALKER.

Deficiencies in Unit Part

Difficulties of the individual units as regards their unit expt was fully realised by the Base HQ but a position had been reached that a vast amount of 3 Aust Div expt and materials incl Controlled Stores consigned to 3 Aust Div here was missing from its shipments and was obviously in hands other than the correct ones. GOC 3 Aust Div takes a most serious view of this and has ordered that a detailed survey of all expt and stores in an endeavour to clear up the losses. "A" Branch will furnish all units with a copy of the list of missing articles.

By 0600 hrs 26 Oct all units will complete a survey of their holdings and render a report there on. Everything surplus including items NOT on the 3 Aust Div list supplied will be returned to a special dump to be established by 16 NOV. At the expiration of the time given a Committee comprising Maj SPRING of this HQ and a Maj of 3 Aust Div will visit units and conduct a check of entitlements and holdings.

Units at present domiciled in the Transit Camp

The Unit Comd is only a subaltern in rank but is the Unit Comd and his orders will be carried out by inmates of his camp. He has issued orders on Malarial Control, Hygiene, Cleanliness and General Discipline and report indicates that there has been a serious lack of co-operation by comds of Units lodged in his camp and disregard of his unit orders. I insist that the utmost co-operation must be given the Transit Camp Comd. The fact that the area generally is free of sickness does NOT mean that we may slack up. It is up to units to ensure that Malarial Control Regulations are carried out and unit comds will be held personally responsible for the accuracy of the certificates they are directed to render in that regard.

Returns

Units are NOT co-operating adequately in the rendering of returns punctually to the time given them. The staff gives units the longest possible time within which to render these returns but in the main units are still NOT able to fulfil their obligations. Higher policy is in many cases involved and Base itself required to render collated returns ~~xxx~~ to Army. Base will take any kicks attributable to its own neglect but units must do their part and the kick will be passed to the unit whose neglect has occasioned the delay to Base.

Inter Allied Co-operation

Relations between units of both forces appears to be on a very good basis and that between higher formations can be said to be helpful. This is a state of affairs very necessary to the successful working of our undertaking and its continuance much to be desired. It will not continue if certain situations are not checked. Yesterday 14 reports were received here from the American Authorities of breaches of discipline by Aust Personnel. The offences were mostly speeding and dangerous driving. Speed limits have been laid down and are strictly adhered to by the Americans. We will conform to the very letter of regulations and every breach will be sternly dealt with.

Working Parties

Everyone one knows how distasteful it is to have to supply constant labour parties. A vast amount of work is required to be done and the staff has little man power available. The staff may ~~be~~ in extremity have to take from you even your essential camp maintenance personnel and you will be expected to take such demands on the chin.

Scrounging

As applied by the Aust Army this attribute has some excuses but in this area scrounging from the American forces must in NO circumstances take place. Their units will be moving out of the area from time to time and buildings and installations will in some cases be left behind. NOT a stick of that must be touched and as it is impossible for Base to maintain a guard the responsibility devolves on adjoining or replacing Aust units. The reason for this is twofold. Some of the structures may be earmarked for the incoming Australian Units. Second an agreement unknown to you will probably have been reached between the American Authorities and this HQ covering a particular structure. In add a lease land officer will be inspecting structures taken over and he must find everything in order. As regards ships damage this is an Engr responsibility solely. \$5,000 it will be kept on hand by Engrs. Any balance is in their disposal. Units settling in are reasonably comfortable and as further damage is available they will be supplied to enable the tents to be floored.

Censorship

Base receives a weekly report on Censorship activities. Latest reports indicate that Franking officers are allowing far too much latitude in the censoring of material with a tendency to the lowering of morale. Censorship regs lay down definite limits as regards criticism and other matters and unit franking officers ~~xxx~~ will ensure that these limits are adhered to.

Messages

Units are directing messages and signals straight to services. This procedure is incorrect and all communications must be addressed by units to Base HQ. It will then be passed through G Branch to the appropriate service within one hour of receipt in Message Centre

Major Jodging DAME Next addressed the Conference on the question of labour and transport and proceeded. It is necessary to appreciate the present difficulties under which the Base is operating when considering this problem. First there is not and will not be for some considerable time any native labour available. Base has 1 DOCKS OF COY on beach and the landing barges are being operated by the Wks Coy. The normal function of the Wks Coy is to assist the Docks Coy. Have much trouble handling of ships cargoes. We need twice the skilled labour we have and perforce must use both Docks and Wks Coy on beach. This situation means that we have neither natives nor Wks Coy for work in the Base installations and Army has laid down that units must supply this labour. Our requirements are not less than 300 - 400 men daily. DAME then touched on late arrival of labour parties at jobs are to a great extent to failures in transport. Drivers do not know camps and sites. Transport when called for will always be on time. Parties have at times had to wait for transport for up to 1/2 of an hour. By 1800 hrs daily units requiring labour and transport will have lodged their requisition with this HQ. Units have been upset by delays at beach head while awaiting discharge of cargoes. Many factors out of HQ control occasion this and we must meet the requirements of the authorities controlling discharge of cargo even if they fail to keep us occupied. On the question of tentage certain units are holding tentage other than their own. At present Base is depending on safe arrival of unit tentage at its destination to enable it to return to the American authorities tentage it has borrowed from them and which is urgently required. The utmost co-operation on this point is essential.

Maj Burden DAME next addressed the conference on question of transport and drew attention to the vital necessity with extreme demands on transport for units to ensure that daily maintenance is effected and that at least one day per week off the road is given for weekly maintenance. One LAD only and still without it's heavy equipment is operating in area and at present able to do little to assist.



A.77 LEAVE RETURN

A Leave Return will be submitted to HQ 4 Aust Base Sub Area by the 18th day of each month, in accordance with the pro-forma attached here as Appendix "A".

A.78 UNIT ROUTINE ORDERS

The attention of all units is directed to the necessity for promptly republishing in Unit Routine Orders any GRO, Administrative Standing Order or Base Sub Area Routine Order which, by its terms, is required to be repeated in Unit Routine Orders.

2. In order that disciplinary action may be taken following disobedience of Routine Orders, units which have not already done so will immediately promulgate in Unit Routine Orders, GROs and Base Sub Area Routine Orders which have specified that they are for republication in Unit Routine Orders.

3. Where any order is required to be republished at certain intervals, action will be taken to ensure that this is done regularly. Any order of this nature will be brought to the notice of personnel who join a unit subsequent to the publication thereof.

A.79 DERELICT OR LOOTED ARTICLES

1. The following articles are classified as derelict or looted, and if they are intercepted by any censorship authority, Customs Officer or officer of the AMF, in a baggage of a member of the AMF, they will be forwarded through normal channels to HQ FIRST AUST ARMY:

(a) Any article from premises which have been damaged by war operations or vacated by reason of attack by the enemy or in consequence of any authorised directions given for the purpose of meeting or hindering any actual or apprehended attack by the enemy or of protecting persons and property from the dangers involved in any such attack.

(b) Any article which has been left exposed or unprotected as a consequence of war operations.

(c) Any property of a member of any of the armed forces of the enemy or which formed part of the arms, clothing or equipment of such a member, or any missile or part of a missile discharged by a member of any armed force.

(d) Any article which has been used or was intended for use by any armed force or upon any vessel of war, or vessel defensively armed or equipped, or by a member of any such force, or of the crew of any vessel, and which has been lost, abandoned or intentionally released or relinquished by any such member or force or from any such vessel.

2. Apart from any disciplinary action which may be taken, the article or articles may be forfeited for the use of the Commonwealth Government.

(To be republished in Unit ROs every three months)

A.80 TRAFFIC IN CIGARETTES, TOBACCO AND CIGARETTE PAPERS

1. A member of the AMF will not, except to the extent that his duty requires him to do so, sell, exchange or part with the possession of any cigarettes, tobacco or cigarette paper for money or alcoholic liquor, or for any goods, articles or things whatsoever.

2. A member of the AMF will not, except in the course of his duty or where he has been given specific authority by his CO personally, be aboard any ship, vessel or water craft of any kind, between 1700 hrs and 0800 hrs.

(To be republished in Unit ROs every three months)

A.81 AREAS OUT OF BOUNDS

The following are out of bounds to all ranks unless on duty, or in the case of AAMC units, during the approved visiting hours:

- (a) ANGAU HQ and all native compounds
- (b) All native villages
- (c) Hospitals and CCSs
- (d) Canteen Bulk Store
- (e) Airstrips and administrative offices attached thereto.
- (f) Such other places as are indicated to be out of bounds by notices or signposts, or published in Routine Orders.

(To be republished in Unit ROs every three months)

A.82 UNLAWFUL DESTRUCTION OF NATIVE GARDENS OR FRUIT BEARING TREES OR PLANTS

A member of the AMF will not:

- (a) Damage a native garden except where the exigencies of the service so require
- (b) Remove any article from a native garden except for his preservation in an emergency
- (c) Destroy any tree or plant for the purpose of obtaining fruit therefrom

A.83 POSSESSION AND DISPOSAL OF FIREARMS

1. A member of the AMF will not have in his possession any pistol or other firearm not on authorised issue to him, except with the written permission of his CO, or if he be a CO, of superior military authority.

2. Except as provided by orders, permission to possess will be granted only where duties necessitate it. When such duties cease, the CO will ensure that the permission is cancelled.

3. Unit commanders will ensure that all pistols held by units are retained in unit armouries and adequately safeguarded. If for any reason a unit commander is unable to take adequate precautions, he will immediately notify HQ 4 Aust Base Sub Area in writing, stating the circumstances.

4. The absence of the usual facilities for safe guarding pistols imposes a greater responsibility on the unit commander to ensure that other adequate steps are taken for their safe custody.

5. Personnel who have pistols in their possession will keep such pistols in their immediate personal possession at all times. In any case where this is impracticable, the pistol will be delivered to the unit quartermaster for custody.

(To be republished in Unit ROs every three months)

A.84 UNAUTHORISED SUPPLY OF ARMS AMMUNITION OR EXPLOSIVES TO NATIVES

1. A member of the AMF will not supply or cause to be supplied, any arms ammunition or explosives to a native, other than a native authorised in writing by an ANGAU District Officer or Asat District Officer to be in possession thereof.
2. Where a native has been so authorised, arms, ammunition or explosives will not be supplied to him, other than as set out in the authority.
3. Unit commanders will ensure that an injury to a native under that unit's control, which resulted from the use of arms, ammunition or explosives, is reported to the nearest ANGAU representative without delay.

(To be republished in Unit ROs every three months)

A.85 DISCHARGE OF FIREARMS IN THE VICINITY OF NATIVE VILLAGES

It is forbidden to discharge firearms in the vicinity of native villages, except in the course of duty.

(To be republished in Unit ROs every three months)

A.86 FORWARDING ARTICLES TO THE MAINLAND

1. No member shall, except in the course of his duty, despatch, or cause to be despatched to Australia:
 - (a) any property issued, distributed, or sold by, or belonging to, the Commonwealth or any part of the Defence Force of the Commonwealth or any Allied Country or Force;
 - (b) any captured enemy document, equipment or property;
 - (c) any article sold, distributed or supplied by Australian Army Canteens Service or any Allied Force's Canteen or any similar institution, or any AMF recognized philanthropic organisation;
 - (d) any tobacco or cigarettes.
2. A member proceeding to Australia on leave or temporary duty will not take with him more tobacco or cigarettes than is reasonably required to meet his personal requirements during his period of absence from New Guinea.
3. Other members proceeding to Australia will not take with them more tobacco or cigarettes than is reasonably required to meet their personal requirements whilst in transit to the Mainland.
4. Tobacco or cigarettes intercepted in transit to Australia will be confiscated and, after disciplinary action has been completed, donated to the Red Cross Society.
5. The attention of franking officers is drawn to the pre-franking requisites in relation to parcels or packets, the detailed procedure for franking the same and the action to be taken in regard to prohibited articles (vide Appx "A" to LFG Field Censorship Instruction No. 4 and paras 5 (c) and 6 (b) of Appx "B" thereto).
6. The attention of Unit Censors is drawn to their duties in relation to censorship of parcels and packets as prescribed in para 9 (b) of the abovementioned instruction.

7. Disciplinary action will be taken where franking officers or Unit Censors offend against the provisions mentioned in paras 7 and 8 above.

A.87 MINING AND SALE OF GOLD

1. It is an offence against the laws of the Territory of Papua and New Guinea to:

- (a) Fossick for gold or otherwise engage in mining, without being in possession of a Miner's Right, or
- (b) Take or remove gold from the claim of another person, or
- (c) Be in possession of gold without lawful excuse, or
- (d) Export gold from those Territories without a license.

2. The above laws apply to, and will be observed by, all members of the AMF.

(To be republished in Unit ROs every three months)

A.88 ALCOHOLIC OR INTOXICATING LIQUOR

1. Members of the AMF are forbidden to take part in the manufacture of intoxicating or alcoholic liquor.

2. No member of the AMF in New Guinea, Papua or this Island will consume, carry or have in his possession any intoxicating or alcoholic liquor, except in authorised Military Canteens and such other places which have been authorised by a competent military authority.

(To be republished in Unit ROs every three months)

A.89 INTRODUCTION OF PLANT DISEASES TO AUSTRALIA

A member of the AMF will not send or take with him from New Guinea or this Island to the mainland any plant which grows in New Guinea, or any bulb, seed or cutting from such plant. Permission will be granted for the dispatch of such articles to herbaria or scientific bodies, as approved by the Director-General of Health (Quarantine Section-Plants, Canberra.)

(To be republished in Unit ROs every three months)

A.90 UNIT LIBRARIES

1. It is desired that the books held in Unit Libraries be available for circulation throughout 4 Aust Base Sub Area. With this end in view, arrangements may be made with the Education Officer HQ 4 Aust Base Sub Area to exchange unit libraries when so desired.

A.91 INSTRUCTION OF ILLITERATE, NEAR ILLITERATE AND EDUCATIONALLY BACKWARD PERSONNEL

1. Where a member's AAF A240 indicates that he is illiterate, near illiterate or educationally backward, the Education Officer HQ 4 Aust Base Sub Area will be notified, in order that suitable instruction may be arranged.

2. If a unit is not in possession of AAFs A240, duly completed, arrangements may be made with the Education Officer HQ 4 Aust Base Sub Area for standardised tests to be applied to personnel whose educational standard requires clarification.

A.92 AMENITIES REPORTS

Further to 4 Aust Base Sub Area RO A39/44 the monthly Amenities Report will be submitted in accordance with the proforma attached as Appendix "B".

A.93 RETURNS

1. Attention is drawn for the necessity of the prompt submission of returns by the dates and times laid down.

2. A list of periodical returns required from units is attached as Appendix "C". This list will be kept up to date by units, by inserting additional returns which may be required, and by making any necessary amendments. Details of additions and amendments will be published in 4 Aust Base Sub Area ROs.

A.94 PUBLICATION OF ROUTINE ORDERS

1. 4 Aust Base Sub Area Routine Orders will in future be published every Friday.

2. Matter for inclusion in Routine Orders will reach HQ 4 Aust Base Sub Area by 1200 hrs on the preceding Wednesday.

A.95 SAFE CUSTODY OF ARTICLES TAKEN FROM SOLDIERS ON ADMISSION TO BARRACK DETENTION ROOMS

1. AMR & O 659 has been amended to provide for the keeping of a property book and the safe custody of articles taken from members in Barrack Detention Rooms.

2. Particulars of the amendment are as follows -

(a) by inserting in para 1 thereof after the word "the" first occurring, the word "officer";

(b) by inserting after sub-para 11 (a) the following sub-para. -

"(aa) A property book will be kept in which an entry will be made (to be signed by the soldier under sentence or temporarily committed for safe keeping and attested by the appointed member of the staff of the barrack detention room) setting out the clothes, the amount of money and details of every other article found on the soldier.";

(c) by inserting after sub-para 12 the following sub-para-

"13. All property entered in the property book will be taken into the possession of the officer, provost sergeant or other WO or NCO in charge of the barrack detention room for safe custody and to be accounted for or returned to the soldier when releases from the barrack detention room together with any other money which may be received for such soldier."

3. The above amendments will be published in amendments to AMR & O.

Q.96 SUPPLY OF SAND

1. All requisitions for the supply of sand will be submitted to HQ 4 Aust Base Sub Area.
2. Units are prohibited from obtaining sand from the sand pits without the authority of HQ 4 Aust Base Sub Area.

Q.97 SUBMISSION OF AAFs S18

1. Units submitting AAFs S18 for the supply of engineer stores must state in the "Remarks" column the purpose for which the stores are required and any other relevant particulars.
2. Failure to supply the necessary information will result in AAFs S18 being NOT approved.

Q.98 REQUISITIONS FOR LABOUR

All requisitions for labour, including native labour, will be submitted to the Staff Captain Labour HQ 4 Aust Base Sub Area. On no account will installations, depots, etc. approach units or ANGAU direct.

Q.99 SUPPLIES OF POL - EMPTY DRUMS

1. As from 26 Oct 44, empty POL containers will be returned between the hours of 0800 and 1600 daily to the BIPOD Empty Drum Dump situated at the Eastern end of the US QM Empty Drum Lot, Service Rd.
2. Unloading and stacking will be carried out by unit personnel under the direction of the BIPOD representative who will issue a receipt for the containers delivered. This receipt will be tendered at BIPOD when demands are made for the supply of POL, as evidence of the return of empty containers.
3. All empty drums returned will be thoroughly drained and will be complete with bungs and washers.
4. No unit will retain for its own use unless otherwise instructed, empty 44 gal motor spirit drums.
5. Drums required for water containers will be requisitioned for in writing to the DAQMG.

Q.100 RETURN OF AMMUNITION EXAMINERS



1. G BRANCH: A/G II reported for the past two days the large volume of censorship breaches was easing off.
2. A BRANCH: NIL to report
3. MEDICAL: DADMS reported anti malarial instructions in officers lines HQ NOT being adhered to. About one third of nets not being put down correctly.
4. DENTAL: NIL to report
5. Q BRANCH: DAQMG reported Maj RENNIE Refrig expert from LHQ arrived to go into refrigeration problems.
Equipment Transit area opened last night for shipping ex SS NEWELL. 3 Cifrs of 106 CCS were used in checking equipment unloaded. Light s on and area will be floodlight for night operations. Conferred with Capt DENMAN yesterday on waterpoint problem at veh washing point in 12 Adv Wksp area. Propose interviewing Capt WALLER, Service Command on question of provision of a further point near Bakery. Salvage unit begins operations this morning with dunnage from SS NEWELL. Sal also evacuate Transit Area and move into own area today.
6. AEME: NIL to report
7. ORD: DADOS Dump site selected yesterday by AA & QMG. Building will commence at the end of this week.
8. S & T: DADST reported one more roof completed BSD. Bulldozer can now go into operation in DID site. Considerable trouble still being caused units by failure of reports of requirements of tpt and pers and cancellation of same to reach his service in adequate time. Instanced conflicting infm received last night and consequential upset particularly in 133 AGT Coy which he is trying to keep on the road despite heavy calls on it's manpower. Lt-col McPHEE explained difficulty as caused by sea swell upsetting off loading. Swell so serious that normal hour trip by Docks Op Coy operating off took instead 5 1/2 hours. Reports of change in situation kept coming thru and the labour party was kept on the beach in the reasonable hope of unloading eventually proceeding. The tpt waiting was dismissed once but had to be brought back when one LCT did arrive.
After discussion decided that walkie talkie wireless be installed in an endeavour to obtain early advices of situation to pass through Q to Services. Lt-col McPHEE emphasised that the proper channel of comm, viz through Q would be used in approaching Mvcs for infm.
9. NOV & TH: Lt-col McPHEE reported that 764 tons discharged yesterday. 17 barges were made available, 27 x 3 ton and 3 trailers were used. 9 ships in port, 2 expected, one of them ORMISTON with tps aboard. Col SHANNON, OC Ships Staff arrived by air and will call on AQ.

10. ENGRS: A/DCRE Wks reported serious nail shortage again and that nothing had eventuated out of recent requisitions to Aust Army. A report had been sent CE. Sufficient iron and roofing nails were on hand to proceed with necessary work on installations. Recce made and plan got out for drainage of Canteen site. Involved a 20' bridge 4' 6" deep, three days work would be required. Another bridge would be required over area washing away between Canteen Bulk store and issuing point. Lt-col McPHEE explained position of Regulating Offr as regards air priority of nails required. Would take up matter with Q Branch.

Regimental notepaper, hotel, ship or similar stationery is forbidden. Stationery issued by philanthropic institutions must not be used if it does not conform to security requirements.

(d) Para 15 - Codes, Ciphers and Shorthand

It is forbidden to use codes or symbols of any form or attempt to disguise information by innuendo or prearranged systems whereby hidden meanings are given to apparently harmless words.

(e) Para 16 - Advertisements, Circulars, "Pen-Pals"

No endeavour must be made, either by advertisement or otherwise, to enter into personal contact with strangers, nor must letters from strangers be answered. It is forbidden to correspond with "Pen Pals" except those sponsored by the following approved organisations :-

"Letters from Home" - Box 4, King Street, - PO SYDNEY
"Blots Club" - Town Hall, - MELBOURNE
"Letters from Home" - Box 1513 V GPO BRISBANE
"Correspondence Committee, Cheer Up Society- Railway Terr. ADELAIDE."

(f) Para 19 - Unit Publications

Articles and photographs for unit magazines and similar publications will be submitted to the formation DADPR prior to publication.

BRANCH OF THE ADJUTANT-GENERAL AND QUARTERMASTER-GENERAL

A.105. DISCIPLINE - SALUTING

1. The attention of unit commanders is drawn to the following extract from the pamphlet "The Officer and Fighting Efficiency", published in Feb 1941 :

- "1. Saluting is reputed to date from the days of armour, the salute representing the motions of a knight raising the vizor of his helmet with the open hand to the front, showing that, though raised, it contained no missile. The practice of giving "eyes right" originated from medieval days when it was the privilege of men at arms to look their superiors in the face, while others must pass with downcast eyes. The salute, therefore is no sign of subservience ; it is a recognition of a comradeship and mutual trust between men at arms. It is, at the same time, an acknowledgement of discipline, and a visible indication of the common obedience that all ranks owe to the Crown and its service. Saluting is thus another indication of the esprit de corps and discipline of a unit.
2. The officer saluted must understand that it is his duty not only to acknowledge the salute but to return it in a proper manner. He does so by saluting in the same way as the soldier, and not with a flick of a finger or the wave of his stick; nor will he return a salute with a cigarette in his mouth. When returning a salute he should look the man in the face so that the man gains the impression that his quality as a soldier is being appraised. He should also take a deliberate note of the badge the man is wearing.
3. It is the duty of every officer not only to return salutes but also to see that he is properly saluted by those who should do so. Failure to salute is often due to shyness or a man may think that he has not been noticed. An officer who salutes others, who is confident of being saluted himself, and who intends to return salutes properly will rarely find it necessary to check a man."

2. The object of republishing this extract is to improve the discipline of all ranks within this command.

3. It has been repeatedly noticed that junior officers fail to show the respect and pay the compliments due to officers of superior rank, and by so doing, set a bad example to the NCO's and men under their command. From the receipt of this order, it will be incumbent on all officers and NCO's to enforce the paying of appropriate compliments on all occasions.

A.106. REQUEST HOUR

4 Aust Base Sub-Area RO-A42/44 is amended by adding the following paragraph :-

Definite times for the unit Request Hour will be promulgated in unit Routine Orders, monthly.
Details of the times laid down will be included in the "Request Hour" report.

A.107. NIGHT LEAVE

1. Night leave for personnel will be limited to 25% of each unit's posted strength.
2. All ranks are forbidden to use MT vehicles to attend evening entertainments including picture centres.

A.108. AMENITIES

1. Action is being taken to establish six entertainment centres for Aust troops, and this number will eventually be increased to twelve. Units at which these centres are to be located will ensure that the site selected is located near the entrance to the unit camp, and is so placed that visiting personnel may enter and leave the area without having to pass through unit lines. Seating accommodation of a permanent type will be provided, and personnel will not use petrol drums, cases or other makeshift seating which leaves the area in an untidy condition.
2. In accordance with the provision of NGF Administrative Standing Orders, Chapter 12, para 2, each unit will appoint a unit Amenities Officer or NCO and particulars of the Army No., rank and name of the officer or NCO selected will be included in the monthly Amenities report.
3. Each unit will also appoint a Sports Officer or NCO and a Canteens Officer or NCO, and particulars of the Army No., rank and name of the personnel selected will be included in the monthly Amenities report.
4. Attention is drawn to the provisions of NGF A S O's, Chapter 12, para 6. A copy of the Auditors' Certificate of Correctness, or Auditors' report will be forwarded to HQ 4 Aust Base Sub Area, with the Amenities report, every second month, commencing on 2 Dec 44.
5. Attention is drawn to the provisions of NG Force A S O's, Chapter 12, para 4. A copy of unit Routine Orders in which the receipt of gifts of money or goods from philanthropic organisations or other sources is acknowledged. Where ACF goods are distributed by representatives of philanthropic organisations, the goods may be acknowledged as an "ACF - YLCA" or "ACF - Salvation Army" gift.

6. Requisitions for Amenities goods will normally be made on the monthly Amenities report, but goods may also be requisitioned by forwarding to HQ 4 Aust Base Sub Area AAF F59 or AAF TS111 duly completed. All unit requisitions for Amenities goods are sighted by the representatives of philanthropic bodies, and therefore units will not make direct approaches to such representatives.

7. The organisation of intra-unit sporting activities is a unit responsibility. Subject to the provision of adequate grounds, a conference of unit Sports Officers will be held with a view to arranging an Inter-Unit Competition in some or all of the following sports :

Cricket, Baseball, Softball, Volley Ball, Basketball, Tennis, Rugby, Aust Rules, Hockey and Soccer.

8. Intra-unit games may be played after 1600 hrs daily, subject to the exigencies of the service. Organised Inter-unit Competition games may be played on Sunday afternoons.

9. The results of inter-unit matches will be forwarded to HQ 4 Aust Base Sub Area by 1200 hrs on the day following the day of play.

A.109. CENSUS OF AACC PERSONNEL

1. A return of AACC personnel who are attached to units will be forwarded to reach HQ 4 Aust Base Sub Area by 30 Oct 44, in accordance with the following pro-forma :

A.110. GAMBLING

1. Members of the AAF stationed in the South West Pacific Area are forbidden to indulge in gambling.

2. No member within that area shall make, or have in his possession, any instrument of gaming.

A.111. LOSS OF ARTIFICIAL DENTURES

1. In the event of the loss by a member of the AMF of artificial dentures supplied to him at public expense, he is liable to a forfeiture of pay, within the provisions of GRO A28/43.
2. All ranks are to be instructed that they will not go swimming whilst wearing artificial dentures.

A.112. DESECRATION OF ENEMY GRAVES

The disinterment of buried Japanese remains by unauthorised personnel, or the desecration of enemy graves is forbidden.

1. By the first day of each month, all units will submit to HQ 4 Aust Base Sub Area a report on AAES activities during the preceding month.

A.114. CONSERVATION OF AMERICAN CURRENCY

The trading for, purchase, or despatch through the Post of American currency within this area is prohibited.

A.115. PROOF OF THE OFFENCE OF STEALING PETROL

1. It is advised that the provisions of sub-reg (9) of reg. 17 of the National Security (Supplementary) Regulations may be availed of in proceedings before Courts Martial or commanding officers. Reg. 17 reads :-

"(1). A person shall not, except in the course of his duties as a Commonwealth Officer or in pursuance of an agreement with the Commonwealth -

(a) have in his possession any motor spirit containing any nickel compound or aniline; or

(b) add to or mix with motor spirit any nickel compound or aniline

(2) A person shall not remove any nickel compound or aniline from any motor spirit to which or with which it has been added or mixed.

(3) In any prosecution for stealing motor spirit belonging to the Commonwealth or for receiving any such spirit knowing it to have been stolen or unlawfully obtained or for having in his possession any such spirit suspected of having been stolen or unlawfully obtained, proof that any motor spirit, the subject matter of the prosecution, contains or contained any nickel compound or aniline shall be prima facie evidence that the motor spirit belongs to the Commonwealth.

(4) In this regulation -

"Motor Spirit" means liquid petroleum products or similar hydrocarbons distilling completely below 225 deg C. and suitable for use as fuel in internal combustion engines and includes motor benzole and power alcohol.

"nickel compound" means nickel compound soluble in motor spirit.

2. Accordingly, where it is intended to rely on the presence of nickel compound, or aniline, as an ingredient of the offence of stealing petrol, and of kindred offences, charges should be laid in the following form :-

"First Charge
AA 18(4) When on active service, stealing public property in that he, at on , stole gallons or thereabouts of motor spirit the property of the Commonwealth of Australia.

Second Charge
AA 40
(alternative to first charge) When on active service, conduct to the prejudice in that he at , on contrary to National Security (Supplementary) Regulation 17 (1) had in his possession gallons or thereabouts of motor spirit containing aniline compound (or where it is intended to rely on the presence of nickel compound - nickel compound)

It will be noted that the basis of the alternative charge is not the presumption contained in sub-reg. (3) but the prohibition contained in sub-reg. (1) of reg 17 of the National Security (Supplementary) Regulations.

A.116. SPEED LIMITS

1. 4-Aust Base Sub Area RO A5/44 is amended by adding the following paragraph :

A notice, setting out the speed limit applicable to the particular vehicle will be displayed on the dashboard.

2. Details of the speed limits set out in the above-mentioned RO will be republished periodically in Unit RO's.

A.117. NOTICES ON ROADS OR IN CAMP AREAS

All personnel will strictly observe and treat as if embodied in these orders, notices of speed limits, bounds, or any other matters placed on roads or in camp areas, whether such notices are placed by Aust, US or Dominion authorities.

A.118. TRAFFIC THROUGH HOSPITAL LINES

Personnel will not attend any cinema show or other entertainment at an Aust General Hospital unless they are members of, attached to, or a patient in the hospital, or invited to attend by a member of the hospital staff.

A.119. TRAFFIC CONTROL POSTS

1. It is the duty of all ranks to co-operate with Provost personnel who are on duty at Traffic Control Posts.

2. When ordered to do so, all vehicles will stop at Traffic Control Posts, and the driver, or occupants of the vehicles, will give the Provost personnel the information they require.

3. Disciplinary action will be taken against the driver or senior occupant of the vehicle, in all cases where the provisions of this order have not been complied with.

(To be republished in Unit RO's)

A.120. VISITS TO NATIVE VILLAGES

Personnel who visit native villages on duty must first obtain a written pass from ANGAU.

(To be republished in Unit RO's)

A.121. USE OF EXPLOSIVES IN HARBOUR AREAS

The use of explosives in harbour areas is prohibited for a distance of one mile from high water mark, unless special authority is first obtained.

A.122 MANUFACTURE OF SOUVENIRS

1. The manufacture of souvenirs as a recreation is approved; but the work is not to be allowed to interfere with the due performance of military duties.
2. Under no circumstances will any arms, military equipment, ammunition, or other articles of government property be used in the manufacture of souvenirs.
3. The mutilation of coins in order to manufacture souvenirs is a criminal offence.

Q.123 UNIT GARDENS

1. As some time will elapse before Aust. ^{Farm} Units are in production, units of a static and semi-static nature will undertake crop cultivation as soon as possible.
2. Crops suitable for this area are French Beans, Snake Beans, tomatoes, cucumbers, Chinese cabbage, silver-beet, watermelons, sweet corn or maize, radishes and sweet potatoes.
3. Seeds may be purchased with Regimental Funds from the AA Canteens Service.

Q.124 ENGINE SPARES - IV7 FORD - 8 & 10 HP

1. All units holding the abovementioned equipments will furnish a return thereof, attached to the monthly Census of Warlike Stores, as at the 20th day of each month.
2. These engines comprise the component parts of Charging Sets, Generating Sets, Welding Plants etc.

Q.125 CARRYING OF WATCHES GS

1. All ranks having watches GS on issue will carry them by a lanyard attached either to clothing or looped around the neck.
2. When watches GS are not fitted with a ring, they will be forwarded to AEME 2nd Ech Workshops for the fitting of a holding device.

Nov monthly issue to officers (two bottles per officer per month) will be available during week commencing 6 Nov. Drawing days will be notified prior to this date. Owing to temporary shortage, ENTERTAINMENT ISSUE for officer's Messes CANNOT be made available.

6 PAYMENT

Goods will be purchased for CASH in Aust currency only.


