





Two outbreaks of Diarrhoea occurred . One in D Coy (23 cases) - due to bad meat. The meat had been left overnight in an 'Hot Box'. Now all meat is to be cooked or partially cooked on the day of its arrival.

The outbreak in B Coy (5 cases) was probably due to the increase in flies in this area.

  Anopheline mosquitoes scarce.
- Occas ional Mokha bites are still being reported. 5 OR'S have developed septic ulcers from infected Mokha bites.

  In order to overcome these minor infections, we have requisitioned for antiseptic pencils so that each individual can attend to minor cuts and bites, which normally are not reported to the R A P or C A P.
- Hygiene has reached a satisfactory standard. A Coy kitchen has been moved to a new site. Previously it was situated on low lying ground which quickly developed into a floor of sour smelling sticky mud. Horrock's test (water test) has been carried out at all water points.
- 4. GENERAL

  TAB and TT injections are still continuing; of 150 personnel already injected only one has developed a reaction which necessitated moduties. 7 cases were evacuated during the week. 5 of these were PUO's and 2 were for dental treatment.

  URTIO: The incidence of URTI has increased. Many new arrivals to the area have been suffering with URTI and have probably brought the infection to the Bn. Since it is a droplet infection, we are segregating the personnel suffering with URTI, within their own lines.

  Tinea: The number of timea cases have increased. These are almost all confined to the feet. These personnel have all been on patrol duties when theirfeet are constantly wet.

An amply supply of foot powder is available.

An extra pair of dry socks is being issued to these cases. They are to be worn only at night, so that their feet are dry for 10 hours Daily A drying room is working successfully in C Coy area.

Diarrhoea: The number of cases have declined. The 17 cases were scattered throughout the companies.
