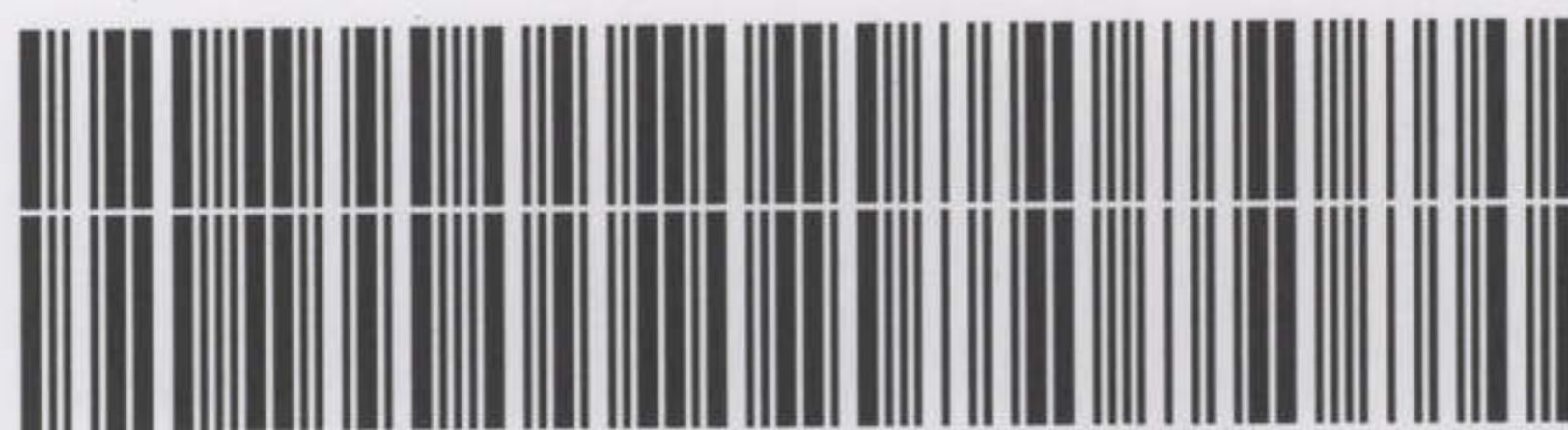

CAMP STANDING ORDERS.

BY

CAPT. D.G.M. MATHESON., M.C., M.M., COMMANDING NO. 3. INDEPENDENT COMPANY. NO. 7. I.T.C.

1. FAMILIARITY WITH ORDERS. It is the duty of ALL RANKS to make themselves familiar with Camp Standing Orders.
2. DUTIES. The following duties will be detailed daily :-
(a) Orderly Officer.) Details of duties
(b) Orderly N.C.O.'s.) available at Orderly
(c) Guard N.C.O. and other ranks.) Room.

All duties will change over at 1730 hrs.
Dress for duty details will be working dress.
3. UNIFORM. Dress for Coy Parade will be hats down and shirts and shorts or K.W.D. GAITERS WILL BE WORN WITH BOTH TYPES OF DRESS..
4. SMOKING. Smoking at Mess and in Kitchens is forbidden. Cooks and assistants and Mess Orderlies are NOT to smoke when preparing food for cooking, or serving food to troops.
5. LIGHTS. The use of wax matches, candles or naked lights of any description is forbidden.
Lights are not permitted in tents after LIGHTS OUT.
6. INTOXICATING LIQUOR. It is an offence for personnel to have Spirit bottles, beer or soft drink bottles in tents or lines, whether empty or otherwise. All drinks must be consumed at properly constituted Messes or Canteens under Unit control. Messes are not to sell bottled drinks to individuals to take away.
7. HIDING ON M.T. No Military or Civilian personnel, other than the driver of the vehicle, is allowed to travel on Military Transport carrying stores without the written permission of the Q.M.
8. UNIT. M.T. Motor Transport will conform to the M.B.I.'s and various authorities governing transport and WILL NOT be used for other than Military purposes.
9. HYGIENE. The Camp Area must be kept clean and free from refuse. All refuse must be deposited in the receptacles or places provided. Particular care is to be taken of the cleanliness of grease traps and drains. No solids are to be placed therein, and they are to be thoroughly cleaned at least once daily.
10. KITCHENS. No person, other than the Cook's staff, is allowed to be in the Cookhouse. Kitchens must at all times be kept clean and tidy. Firewood is to be neatly stacked in the rear of kitchens. The surrounding areas are not to be polluted by emptying kitchen waste, etc. Refuse will be placed in receptacles set apart for the various types.
11. FOOD. All food and foodstuffs are to be protected from flies by the use of suitable lids and coverings.
12. ABLUTION. On no account are men to wash in or near the lines. All ablutions are to be carried out at places set aside for the purpose.
13. LATRINES. Indiscriminate defecation and urination will not be permitted. Offenders will be severely dealt with.

14. ESCORTS. Escorts will be detailed as required.
15. FIRE ORDERS. Fire Orders will be posted on Camp Notice Boards and ALL RANKS must be familiar with these orders.
16. DEFICIENCIES. Deficiencies in clothing, equipment, technical and Camp Stores, or damage to same, must be promptly reported through the usual channels to Unit H.Q. where necessary action will be taken.
17. CUSTODY OF STORES. All ranks to whom articles of clothing, equipment and stores are issued will be held responsible for the care and safe custody of such stores.
18. SICKNESS. Personnel who contract a sickness will parade at the Sick Parade. In the case of urgency, report at once to the Officer or N.C.O. i/c party, who will make provision for the necessary medical attention. On the Sick Parade, the Orderly N.C.O. will make out A.A.P., A46 Sick Reports in triplicate. 1 Copy to be retained by the M.O. and 2 to be returned to H.Q. The orderly N.C.O. will ascertain the report of the M.O., and notify commanders accordingly.
19. INJURIES. In the case of injuries, treatment is to be immediately sought from the M.O. The matter will then be reported by the member's superior officer to H.Q. A full description of the accident will be made out, action taken, and names of witnesses. If the patient is evacuated from camp, the Orderly Sergeant will be responsible for the complete listing of all articles of clothing, equipment, (military and civilian) which may have been left by the patient. The articles will then be placed in care of H.Q. together with the inventory.
20. TELEPHONE. All Private Telephone Calls must be made through the Orderly Room. No Private Calls may be made between 0900 hrs and 1200 hrs and 1300 hrs and 1800 hrs. Calls must be booked where possible.
21. RETURNING FROM NIGHT DUTY. Personnel returning from any night duty are to proceed to their tents with as least possible noise and take every precaution to avoid disturbing their comrades. Any breach or departure from this observance is to be severely dealt with by N.C.O.'s. Despatch riders using motor cycles will proceed through the camp so as to cause the least possible inconvenience and noise.
22. COURTS OF INQUIRY. The following Officers will constitute a Court of Inquiry to enquire into and report any matters as directed by the O.C.
President.
Members. To be designated by the O.C.
23. PARADING OF MEN TO O.C. Any one desiring to be paraded to the O.C. must first be paraded to his own Pl. Comdr., and then, if necessary he is to be paraded to the 2 i/c by the C.S.M.
24. BLANKETS. No man is to take blankets out of Camp area without a written permission, which must be produced to the Picquet N.C.O. at place of exit.
25. EVACUATIONS TO HOSPITAL. Soldiers evacuated to Hospital must, in all cases, be accompanied by Pay Books.
26. SOLDIERS BECOMING ILL WHEN ABSENT FROM CAMP. Men on leave who take ill must immediately report back to camp. The only variation of this order will be in cases of dangerous sickness or accident. They must then, immediately notify H.Q. and a sick report from the Area Medical Officer must be forwarded within 3 days. Location of Area M.O. will be obtained from the nearest Recruiting Office.

27. RETURNING FROM HOSPITAL. Personnel returning from Hospital or Convalescent Leave must parade to the M.O. with the first Sick Parade, following their return.
28. VEHICLES. All private cars must STOP, and all others SLOW DOWN when entering Camp. When leaving camp all vehicles, including M.T. vehicles MUST STOP. Picquets will see that this order is strictly adhered to.
29. CONTROL OF VEHICLES.
1. Private cars and all vehicles other than M.T. vehicles on duty are to be excluded from Camp Lines.
2. Vehicles with supplies for Messes or Recreation Huts will enter and leave camp at prescribed places.
3. No M.T. vehicle is to be parked between tents & Huts.
30. SPORTS. Playing of Ball Games in and around Lines is strictly forbidden. Ample space will be provided for recreation.
31. PALLIASSES. All Palliasses must be returned to Store before personnel proceed on draft. These will be returned and reconditioned before re-issue.
32. DRYING ROOM. Drying Room will be available at all times (as per notice in Drying Room) On no account must clothes, towels, etc, be dried in kitchens.
33. STORAGE OF KIT. Personnel are notified that the Q.M. Store is available for the storage of blankets and kit. A receipt will be issued to each man and must be produced when kit is claimed. All blankets, kit, etc, are left entirely at owner's risk.
34. CIVILIAN ESCORT. All civilians entering camp, who are not in possession of a pass signed by the Camp Commandant, are to be supplied with an escort by Guard. Escort will accompany the civilian to the office required, wait until he has completed his business, and escort him to the gate.
35. ALARM. On the Alarm being sounded, all troops will turn out on the Parade Ground nearest their lines.
36. FIRE PRECAUTIONS. All ranks are personally responsible for knowing the situation of Fire Alarms and Water Buckets nearest their billets.
37. MEDICAL. Sick Parades will be under Orderly Corporal at 0615 hrs and 1720 hrs daily.
38. POSTAL FACILITIES. Camp P.O. is situated at Administrative Block where concession letters will be posted.
39. ELECTRICAL FITTINGS. All ranks are warned against tampering with electrical fittings. High voltage fittings pack a lethal punch and considerable danger lies in wait for the inquisitive. Faults in lighting systems should be immediately reported to the Orderly Officer.
40. GAME. It is forbidden to shoot or otherwise take Game on Wilsons Promontory. Anyone found contravening this regulation will be subject to disciplinary measures.
41. GENERAL. Routine and other orders and notices will be displayed on Notice Boards in Tent Lines and Messes. It is the duty of everyone to be acquainted with instructions, and ignorance of such when promulgated will not be accepted as an excuse.
- It is the duty of N.C.Os in charge of huts and tents to make all Inward Drafts acquainted with Standing Orders, Camp and Routine Orders.
- Movement orders to be read out when applicable.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CONDUCT OF THE KITCHEN.

1. No man suffering from diarrhoea or who has at any time suffered from typhoid fever or dysentery is allowed to work in any capacity in the cookhouse.
2. Every man employed in the handling of food will wear CLEAN white overalls at all times whilst on duty.
3. A basin of water will be kept in the cookhouse together with soap and nail brush for the use of men who have occasion at any time to handle food. This must be used before handling food; and all men so engaged will pay particular attention to the cleanliness of their nails, which must be kept cut short.
4. No personal gear belonging to men employed in the cookhouse will be kept in the cookhouse, and no toilet or private washing will be done in the cookhouse. All clothing removed before donning overalls will be kept in the room provided for that purpose.
5. Smoking in the cookhouse is forbidden, and smoking whilst actually handling food will merit punishment.
6. The cook is responsible that there be a sufficient supply of clean cloths available for washing and drying dishes and utensils. These clothes will be washed at the end of each day.
7. All pots and pans will be freed from grease, cleaned and dried each day after the last meal.
8. The cookhouse itself and all fittings will be kept spotlessly clean at all times, and utensils not actually in use kept tidily in their correct place.
9. The personal cleanliness of all cookhouse men will be insisted upon, and will be ~~xxxxxxxxxxxx~~ examined by the Orderly Officer each day.

DUTIES OF ORDERLY OFFICER.

1. The daily routine of the unit in camp will be supervised by the Orderly Officer of the day, who will be detailed in Routine Orders.
2. His tour of duty will be from Retreat to Retreat. (1730 hrs.)
3. The Orderly Officer will report to the C.O. at 0600 hrs, and receive any Special Instructions for the day. He will report to the 2 i/c at 0900 hrs for further instructions.
4. He will supervise morning P.T. parade.
5. He is responsible for Reveille and Lights Out, and for the punctuality of all parades.
6. He is responsible for the good order, discipline and cleanliness of the Camp.
7. He will receive all visitors and arrange for their quartering.
8. He is responsible for Canteen discipline.
9. He will report any unusual occurrence, of a sufficiently important nature to the 2 i/c at once.
10. He will attend all Mess Parades.
11. He will on no account leave the Unit Area except on duty, without the permission of the C.O., which case a relief will be arranged during his absence and the Orderly N.C.O. informed.
12. At the sounding of the FIRE ALARM, the Orderly Officer will take charge of operations and take all necessary steps to combat the fire.
13. He must be pattern of dress, drill, discipline and smartness at all times.
14. If for any reason he has been unable to carry out any of the duties allotted to him, same must be stated in his report, which will be read and initialled by the incoming Officer.
15. He will hand in his Orderly Officers' Report to the Orderly Room at the changing over of duties. i.e. 1799 hrs.

DUTIES OF ORDERLY SERGEANT.

1. Tour of duty will be from 1730 hrs to 1730 hrs.
 2. He will:-
 Report to C.O. at 0555 hrs.
 3. Be responsible for turning men out at Reveille.
 4. Make a complete inspection of the camp daily, and pay particular attention to the cleanliness of Latrines, Wash-houses etc.
 5. Immediately report any irregular occurrence to the Orderly Officer.
 6. He will not leave camp except on duty. If a substitute is procured both will parade before the C.O. for approval of the change.
 7. Conduct all Mess Parades.
 8. Hand over to his successor any relevant matter.
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DUTIES OF ORDERLY CORPORAL.

1. Tour of duty will be from 1730 hrs to 1730 hrs.
2. He will report to Orderly Officer at 0555 hrs.
3. He will conduct Sick Parades and obtain copy of Sick Report from C.M.O. for Coy. Orderly Room. He will notify Pl, Sig, and Engr Orderly Rooms of contents of Sick Report.
4. He is responsible that all orders, notices etc on Official Notice Boards are secure and tidy, and those damaged or soiled are replaced.
5. He will be responsible for the satisfactory administration of the Drying Room, including the checking of fires. He will keep the building locked. Clothes will be placed in, or removed from the building only under his supervision after Parade hours. Keys will be held in the Administration Orderly Room.
6. He will assist Orderly Sergeant on Mess Parades.
7. He will be on duty at the Wet Canteen between the hours of 1730 hrs to 1800 hrs and 1900 hrs to 2100 hrs; and will assist the Canteen Officer in whatever duties may be assigned to him.

FIRE ORDERS.

1. Fire Alarm will be a succession of short whistle blasts.
2. In the event of bush fires in the vicinity of training grounds or Camps troops will report to H.Q. Orderly Room as soon as possible.
3. In the event of a tent catching fire, nearest personnel will immediately cast off tent guys and pull tent into the open and endeavour to extinguish the fire.
4. Rapidity of action is essential.
5. Use of wax matches, candles and all uncovered lights is forbidden.
6. All troops are responsible for knowing location of all Fire Buckets and Extinguishers.
7. Water in Fire Buckets must NOT be used for any other purpose.
8. All ranks are warned of the danger of causing grass fires by carelessness in regard to use of matches, cigarettes, or bivouac fires, etc.
