

Owing to extreme depletion of the unit, effective performance of these duties was very difficult.

The appearance of this track suggested that one hundred or more tps had used it Six stragglers were found and killed near our L of C having refused to surrender.

One was killed and one escaped. This proved to be the unit's last contact with the ENEMY during the PAPUAN CAMPAIGN.
