INFORM.

1. Enemy. As for sitreps already issued.

2. Own Tps.

(a) The following tps are in sp 15 Aust Inf Bde:-

B Sqn 2/4 Aust Armd Regt
2 Pd Regt less one tp
U Hy Bty
15 Aust Inf Bde Flammethrower Pl.

(b) 15 Aust Inf Bde is to attack and capture the HATAI track junc area on 17 Apr, with a view to opening up the lateral track to HATAI.

(c) 24 Aust Inf Bn with in sp two tp tks, 2 Pd Regt less one tp, U Hy Bty, and 15 Aust Inf Bde Flammethrower Pl, is to capture the garden area 892461, North along line LAWE creek to track junc 903472, with one coy to be astride track junc to reorganize east of the line of LAWE creek to incl garden area at 894464. On capture of objective 24 Aust Inf Bn is to patrol fwd to KINDARA, HIRU HIRU and OLD TOKINOTU, and if necessary to exploit fwd with tks against any enemy localities harassing its reorganization posn. 24 Aust Inf Bn is to be prepared to exploit fwd on 18 Apr to SINDOU creek.

(d) NG IB is to patrol to UMANU creek area sq 9044 and SINDOU creek area sq 8945.

(e) Twenty 25 pdrs and four 155 mm guns are to fire concentrations on known enemy localities in HATAI track junc area lifting to HIRU HIRU OLD TOKINOTU area, 895455 to 900460, as arranged by CO 24 Aust Inf Bn with Arty. Timings will be advised to patrols.

INTENTION.

3. 58/59 Aust Inf Bn with in sp one tp tks will adv in rear of 24 Aust Inf Bn and occupy 24 Aust Inf Bn present area along line of SHINRU creek, with responsibility of def from SHINRU creek NW to incl SLATERS KNOLL.

METHOD.4. Fwd Tps.

(a) RIGHT: B Coy, with in sp one det mortars, one sec MMGs, one det Tk/A.

(b) LEFT: A Coy, with in sp one det mortars.

(c) Posns will be occ as already recd by Coy Comds.

5. BnHQ, HQ Coy Group plus B Tp 2/4 Armd Regt, will occ posns already recd via present 24 Aust Inf Bn BnHQ and HQ Coy sites.

6. Res.

D Coy with in sp one det mortars will occ present posn north of KERO creek with coy less one pl. One pl will relieve pl B Coy at present at SLATERS KNOLL at 173730L.

7. B Coy remains present posns DANARA and BARNES Xing.

 - A Coy - On track 100 yds NW of 24 Aust Inf Bn B Ech area.
 - B Coy - On track 200 yds NW of A Coy.

12. HQ Coy Pls.

Task: cover frontage fwd of A, B Coys along line SHINRU creek.
 - (ii) one sec sited on either side of main track rear of HQ Coy posn,
Task: cover fwd along flanks HQ Coy and BnHQ.
 - (c) Mortars.
 - (i) one det in sp each of A, B, C, D Coys.
 - (ii) Bty four mortars will be sited two on each side of track in posns already recced by mortar offr south of BnHQ,
Task: DF tasks in accordance with trace attached as Appx "A".
 - (d) Tk/A.
 - (i) One det in sp B Coy,
Task: Tk/A protection along main track.
 - (ii) Pl less one det rear of HQ Coy area,
Task: protection of S tp 2/4 Armd Regt.
 - (e) Pnrs.
 - (i) Occ posns for def BnHQ as already recced.
 - (ii) Continue work on corduroying main track under direction 15 Aust Fd Coy.
13. Tks.
 - (a) S tp 2/4 Armd Regt will move with HQ Coy group into area already recced rear of HQ Coy.
 - (b) Tasks:
 - (i) be prepared to clear track fwd to 24 Aust Inf Bn or rear to D Coy should L of C be cut by enemy,
 - (ii) in def to protect rear and flanks of HQ Coy locality,
 - (c) One disabled tk from tp in sp 24 Aust Inf Bn will remain in A Coy area for approx four days - A Coy will be responsible for its protection whilst A Coy is in area.
14. Consolidation.

Will consist of improvements to existing 24 Aust Inf Bn posn, and wiring in the following priority:-

 - (a) three strand cattle fence,
 - (b) trip wire fwd of cattle fence,
 - (c) development to single apron fence criv on orders from this HQ.

15. Patrolling.

(a) Policy: During the Arty concentration prior to the attack, during the 24 Aust Inf Bn adv, and throughout the day, - to patrol to both flanks to protect 24 Aust Inf Bn.

(b) Patrol 1: - A Coy.

Strength - One offr and one rifle pl.

Time Out - To be notified, be prepared to move 0715 hrs.

Route - SW from KERO creek along track blazed by A Coy patrol 16 Apr, to vicinity coconuts 868463, thence via track to clearing 885456.

Task - Patrol will clear the clearing east to end of clearing vicinity huts 887456, thence NE clearing area as it adv, and will contact one coy 24 Aust Inf Bn (coy and exact location to be advised later).

(c) Patrol 2: - D Coy.

Strength - one offr 12 ORs.

Time Out - To be notified, patrol will be prepared to move from D Coy area 0715L.

Route - SE along track to SHINRU creek, thence NE along SHINRU creek to track junc 890473, thence SE to cut the HATAI track vicinity 896489,

Task - To patrol NE and SW along either side of track to contact coys of 24 Aust Inf Bn (coys and locations to be advised later). Patrol will continue to keep area of track clear between those coys until advised by respective coy comds that they will take over responsibility.

(d) Patrol 3: - B Coy.

Strength - One offr and 12 ORs.

Time Out - To be advised, be prepared to move 0715 hrs.

Route - SE along track to SHINRU creek, thence NE to river bend 893476, due east via garden area at 896476 to vicinity garden 908477, thence SE to HATAI track KINDARA area.

Task - Investigate KINDARA area and patrol SW along either side of track to contact one coy 24 Aust Inf Bn vicinity 903472 - coy and exact location to be advised later. This patrol will continue patrolling vicinity track NE from that coy to incl KINDARA until advised by OC coy 24 Aust Inf Bn that he will take over responsibility. Return same route.

Guides - Two native guides from KINDARA will be provided by ANGAU to accompany this patrol - time of reporting to be advised.

(e) Patrol 4: - B Coy.

Strength - One offr and 12 ORs.

Time Out - To be advised, be prepared to move 0715 hrs.

Route - SE along track to SHINRU creek, SW along SHINRU creek 600 yds, thence SE to TOKINOTU 884463, thence continue SE via clearing and hut area Sq 8845, thence east to OLD TOKINOTU 896456, thence NW to contact coy 24 Aust Inf Bn (coy and location to be advised later).

Guides - Two guides familiar with OLD TOKINOTU will be provided from ANGAU, time of reporting to be advised.

(f) Recognition of Patrols by 24 Aust Inf Bn.

(i) Password for all patrols - TACK, countersign, HAMMER.

(ii) Patrols 1 to 4 will carry verve pistols and red flares - red flares will be fired when approaching 24 Aust Inf Bn coy locations. 24 Aust Inf Bn will identify themselves with green flares.

- (g) The policy and timings for patrols 1 to 4 will be such that they will be as far fwd as possible consistent with safety, prior to commencement of arty concentrations.
- (h) Points to which patrols are to proceed, and beyond which they will NOT proceed until after lifting of arty concentrations, will be advised later.

(1) Routine Patrols.

D Coy will provide patrols strength 1 NCO & ORs to move NE and east along FURIATA river and HUAI river. Routes, times out and in - as for similar patrols 16 Apr.

A and B Coys will send patrols strength 1 NCO and 6 ORs SA along main track north and south respectively, to contact rear of 24 Aust Inf Bn at following times :- 1000L, 1200L, 1400L, 1600L, 1800L.

C Coy same patrols as for 16 Apr.

- (a) 3 days SWP 1 day FOR will move fwd with coy groups.
- (b) Normal daily maintenance of fresh rations and SWP from DID GALVINS King via B Ech.

19. Eqpt.

- (a) Patrols moving out from present area prior to mov of bn will dump packs for mov fwd by jeep with coy stores.
- (b) Otherwise NO personal eqpt will be transported on jeeps.

20. Tpt.

(a) Allotment.

2 Jeeps and trailers will report Sig pl 0600 hrs to lift all sig stores fwd to 24 Aust Inf Bn.

4 Jeeps and trailers will report B Coy, 3 jeeps and trailers A Coy, at 0730 hrs, to lift all FI FQ stores, 4 days rations, amn, wire fwd to coy areas. Jeeps will remain under comd coys until all stores have moved to new areas, and then return to commence loading BnHQ and HQ Coy stores.

On conclusion mov BnHQ and HQ Coy stores, 1 jeep and trailer will report D Coy to lift necessary stores to SLATERS KNOLL for pl occ posn there.

Remaining jeeps and trailers will revert CM for normal maintenance.

- (b) Coy 2 i/c's, A/Adjt, and CCMS HQ Coy will remain present areas until all respective stores have been cleared.
- (c) T.O. will report Bn S i/c 0700 hrs and will co-ordinate tot plan.

21. P.C.

- (a) 2 RPs will mov with B Coy to A,B Coy area, and keep track clear of tpt unloading stores.
- (b) 2 RPs will mov with BnHQ to control traffic in new BnHQ site.
- (c) 2 RPs will control traffic at BnHQ and HQ Coy loading points.

22. WPs.

Hygiene Sgt will est WP at SHINRU creek by 1000 hrs. Water bottles will only be drawn from this point.

23. B Ech. - Remains present posn.

24. Routine 17 Apr.

- (a) All tps will shave evening 16 Apr.
- (b) Stand-to 0530-0630 hrs.
- (c) Breakfast 0645 hrs.
- (d) Rifle coy stores ready to move 0745 hrs.

PART I

RECORD OF EVENTS

1. CHANGE IN DISPOSITIONS.

2. NATURE OF OPERATIONS.

Operations were confined to daily patrolling forward and to the flanks of Company positions, and development of the main BUIN Road and the HATAI track. One patrol contacted a strong enemy position vicinity 918474, and the action developed into a platoon attack and finally a Company attack, when the enemy withdrew. (vide Appx "A"). Throughout the period enemy patrols of a harrasing nature were encountered in the general area of squares 9147 and 9146.

PART II

LESSONS AND OPERATIONS

3. TERRAIN

The terrain encountered was uniformly flat, and vegetation comprised usual jungle with fairly thick secondary growth.

4. TACTICAL LESSONS - DEFENSIVE

(a) The ease with which fields of fire can be cleared was again brought out, together with the fact that positions occupied prior to clearing are often found to be too restricted after clearing has been completed. The answer is to be found in either pacing length and breadth of area to be occupied (it is considered that the normal area of a Company locality in this terrain will be 150 yards by 120 - 150 yards) or, where contact with the enemy is NOT imminent, in clearing prior to siting of pits.

4. TACTICAL LESSONS - DEFENSIVE. (Cont)

- (b) There has been observed a tendency to relax on protective precautions during the day, some platoon areas being deserted whilst platoons were engaged on road work or patrolling. Accordingly orders have been issued to the effect that at least one NCO and 4 ORs, with 1 LMC and 1 OSMG, will occupy each platoon position at all times during the day.

5. PATROLS.

- (a) In numerous clashes with the enemy, our patrols suffered a small number of casualties on nearly every occasion, due, it is considered that patrols have been moving too fast and too close to the track. Experiments have therefore been carried out, with the patrol moving 30 yards off the track, and one member 10 yards off the track. Moving silently, it has been found that NO patrol can move faster than 100 yards in ten minutes, or 600 yards per hour, if it is to accomplish this task without fear of ambush. On a basis of 9 hours being available for patrolling, one of which is devoted to rest, the maximum distance a patrol can cover in one day is therefore 4800 yards. To illustrate this - a B Coy patrol strength 1 Officer 13 ORs, moving in accordance with these instructions, approached and observed the dispositions of a 47 Inf Bn ambush at 913463 without the ambush being aware of its presence.
- (b) Patrols strength one NCO and six ORs have found it difficult to recover wounded and weapons should they suffer casualties; according minimum strength of patrols (excluding special recce patrols) will henceforth be one NCO and eight ORs.
- (c) A separate memorandum on patrolling tactics has been issued to all Officers and NCOs (Appx "B").

6. NAVIGATION.

Owing to Map inaccuracies traversing has become an integral part of all patrols, and by this means a reasonably accurate Map can be compiled and Coy Maps quickly amended.

7. ARTY SUPPORT.

- (a) The artillery support provided during the A Coy attack on the enemy position 913474 was extremely accurate, and caused the enemy to withdraw. The quick and effective Arty support (130 rounds were fired when the position was first encountered and 400 rounds prior to the attack on the following morning) employed against this position forcibly demonstrated the offensive use of Arty against enemy posts located by patrols.
- (b) The above action also brought out the value of Arty in establishing the exact location of the patrol.

8. TANK CO-OPERATION.

During the A Coy attack it was found that tanks can move practically anywhere in this type of country provided a rifle section moves ahead of them to guide and clear a path.

9. MAN-MANAGEMENT.

- (a) The tendency (noted earlier) to relax on Man-management once Coys have moved into the field has been overcome, and the incidence of skin and other controllable diseases has, if anything, dropped as compared with TOROKINA.
- (b) It has been found essential to lay down a time during which Platoon Commanders inspections - e.g., of dress, weapons and ~~grenades~~ - will be carried out. The period 0750 to 0815L daily is set aside for this purpose, Company Commanders inspecting Platoons in rotation.

Quarters

9. MAN-MANAGEMENT. (Cont)

- (c) To ensure that all troops have adequate opportunities for letter-writing, washing of clothes, etc, the basis of allocating tasks to Companies has been to have equivalent of one Platoon on patrolling, one on road works, and one resting in Company locality, providing sentries, improving localities, etc. Every man in unit receiving $\frac{1}{2}$ day rest every 3 days.

10. JEEP TRACK CONSTRUCTION.

- (a) A most important factor in operations during the week has been the ease with which Jeep tracks can be cut to Coys located at some distance from the main L of G.

A track 1000 yards long, and with temporary bridges over streams, can be cut by one rifle platoon plus a pioneer section in $\frac{1}{2}$ day.

Allowing six Jeeps and trailers to move to the position the first day, (with all Coy stores, rations, amm) and one Jeep and trailer each day thereafter (with maintenance rations and amm), the track will remain serviceable indefinitely.

- (b) During construction of main L of G there has been a notable tendency to leave uncorduroyed patches of road of apparently firm texture. This has invariably resulted in the road being badly cut about after wet weather, and has necessitated parties being subsequently sent back up to 3000 yards to corduroy lengths of road varying from 10 - 50 yards.

It is therefore considered that no matter how firm the road appears to be, and irrespective of engineer advice received the road should be completely corduroyed at the outset.

11. INTERCOMM.

A Company runner was wounded by enemy on an apparently "safe" track only 300 yards from BnHQ. It is obvious that runners must move in pairs even in rear areas, and in threes or fours in forward areas.

12. OUTSTANDING ACTS OF GALLANTRY.

During the 7 Platoon attack on the enemy position at 918474, the Platoon Commander, Platoon Sergeant and Senior Section Commander were all wounded, and a second Section Commander killed. The remaining Section Commander immediately took command of the Platoon, and, after reorganization under fire, withdrew the Platoon to a position from where the enemy could be fixed pending further aid. He showed extreme steadiness and outstanding leadership by reorganizing and holding the Platoon until the arrival of the remainder of his Company.

EQUIPMENT AND WEAPONS

13. TENTS SHELTER HALF.

The tents shelter half now on issue are NOT long enough to provide a waterproof shelter for two men, and it is recommended that any further design adopted should be at least two feet longer.

DESCRIPTION OF A COY ACTION AGAINST ENEMY LOCALITY 917474

1. At 0700 hrs on 24 April 7 Platoon moved out to establish contact with an enemy position located by B Coy patrol on the previous day. On reaching a creek at 917474 the Platoon was fired on and one member wounded, but the leading section established a fire position across the creek and fixed the enemy whilst the other two sections reconnoitred to the flanks. After 100 rounds of Arty fire had been brought down on the position these two sections attacked from the left flank, but the enemy position, which later proved to have contained at least 40 enemy in well camouflaged pill-boxes and fox-holes, was too strong and the attack halted after one section Commander had been killed, and the Platoon Commander, Platoon Sergeant and another section Commander wounded. The remaining section Commander reorganized the Platoon and withdrew to a fixing position pending the arrival of further support.
2. The remainder of the Company, with a troop of tanks in support, moved out at 1345L and during the afternoon further reconces were made of the enemy position, and Arty fire brought down on it, harrassing fire being continued throughout the night. After further contact AM 25 April reconce patrols reported the enemy position vacated at 1045L and the Company occupied it shortly afterwards.
3. The position was an extensive one containing over 40 well camouflaged pits, two large HQ pits, and Signal Cable. Arty fire had been particularly accurate, and a considerable quantity of weapons and equipment were abandoned by the enemy.
