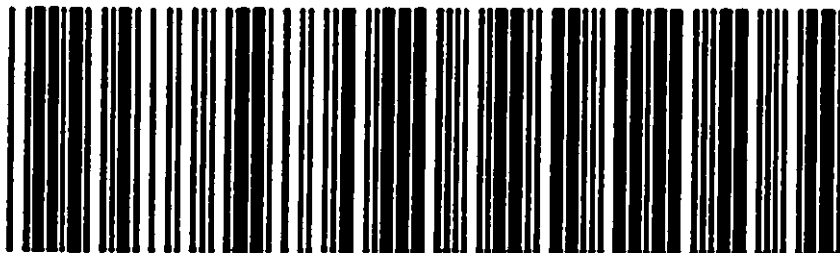

1 Attention is drawn to GRO 422/44 which states that as from 17 November 1944, British pattern battle dress or any similar type whether issued or purchased privately, will not be worn by members of the AMF, except by personnel of parachute units as working dress only

TOBACCO AND CIGARETTE RATION CARDS ISSUANCE

1 The following procedure will be adopted
Cards will be issued by Units, under supervision of a responsible officer, at pay parade every second pay day only, except in the case of personnel transferred from interstate or newly enlisted, who will be issued with cards during the month, back portion of card being cancelled

Each card will show

- (I) Date of issue.
- (II) Member's name and number
- (III) Unit stamp
- (IV) Issuing Officer's signature

Cards will not be issued to non smokers All unit controlled canteens will issue ration cards

2 Cards will be carried by personnel at all times When a member is transferred to a new Unit his ration card will accompany him and be shown on Mob 3, the old Unit stamp being over-stamped by the new Unit and the same card used until it expires

3 Members will purchase their supplies for the current week only, except when going on leave, when they may draw their forward supplies on presentation of leave pass with ration card where ration card expires before leave pass, the next issue of ration card will be made at the same time as issue of leave pass with such issues the new card will be dated the day following expiration of old card

4 Should a member's card be lost, a new card may be issued, at the discretion of the CO which will be valid for the unexpired portion of the current period

5 Ration cards will be collected from discharged personnel by GDD

6 Units will indent on Stationery Depot for ration cards

7 COs will ensure that adequate security arrangements are made for cards not issued

8. Personnel going on leave within the Military District in which they are stationed will draw their supplies of tobacco and cigarettes for the full leave period before leaving Camp

9. Ration Cards will be collected by Units from all personnel moving out of the MD to an interstate destination

10 Members of the Civilian Staff of the Department of the Army will also be issued with Tobacco and Cigarette ration cards and no sale will be made by the Canteen except on production of the ration card.

54 DESIGNS FOR AUSTRALIAN POSTAGE STAMPS

- 1 The Postmaster General invite suggestions in regard to the designs of Postage Stamps in Australia with the object of securing designs which will serve to advertise Australia in overseas countries
- 2 Entries are open to residents of Australia and members of the Australian Military Forces in the Pacific and Japan
- 3 The designs must be typically Australian, e.g., depicting local industries or activities, outstanding work or achievement, or any feature which will advertise Australia in overseas countries
- 4 The dimensions of the design should be in the proportion of 5 x 4 with a maximum of 25 inches by 20 inches
- 5 Each design must include the word "Australia" and "Postage". Provision should be made for the value of the stamp to be shown in Arabic figures
- 6 A special Board will adjudicate on the merits of the design submitted and will elect a maximum number of 12 designs
- 7 A premium of £50 will be paid to each design which is accepted by the Postmaster-General, after consideration by the Board
- 8 The selected designs will become the property of the Postmaster-General
- 9 The Recess Steel Engraved (Intaglio) method of printing postage stamps is observed in Australia
- 10 Each design must bear a nom-de-plume. If more than one design is submitted, a different nom-de-plume must be used in order to ensure that each design will be considered entirely on its own merits in respect of other entries by the same designer
- 11 The design must be accompanied by a communication giving the name and address of the person submitting it together with a brief description of each design which shall ensure identification
- 12 The object of this procedure is to permit the design being considered by the Board without an indication of the name of the designer
- 13 The design and communication must be enclosed in a sealed envelope cover, the outside of which must be marked "Design for Commonwealth Postage Stamp". This cover must be enclosed in a second sealed envelope addressed to the Director-General Posts and Telegraphs, Treasury Gardens, Melbourne, Australia
- 14 The completed article must be sent by prepaid registered post so as to reach the above-mentioned not later than Tuesday the 1st October 1946.

- 15 The Postmaster General does not bind himself to adopt any designs submitted
- 16 Designs not accepted by the Postmaster General will be returned by registered post if a request is made for their return
- 17 The Postmaster General or members of the Board do not accept any responsibility for the safe custody of any designs submitted, but all reasonable care will be taken in regard to the matter

PROVISION IN THE ISSUE OF PAY

1 The duty of making cash payment to individual soldiers rests primarily on the OC company, etc, but members detached from units may be paid by any officer who is an imprest holder or sub imprest holder, on his personal responsibility, if satisfied of the member's identity (FSR Vol 1, Chap XXI, Sec 195, p 22)

2 In order to prevent a member from drawing pay while "on" or in possession of an irregular leave pass or by procurement of a forged pay book or by impersonation of another member an officer will, before paying a member or before authorising him to draw pay at cash office, satisfy himself of the member's identity and of his entitlement to draw pay, by making such inquiries as he considers necessary and by inspecting such documentary evidence as may be available, such as Record of Service Book (B 85) photograph and specimen signature in pay book, identity disc, or movement order

Applications for temporary appointment as Diplomatic Staff Cadet are invited from British Subjects (male or female) who on 1st January 1947, will have reached the 17th but not the 27th anniversary of their birth

Applicant must have matriculated or hold the leaving or Senior Public Certificate or a University degree in Arts, Commerce, Law or Economics or be eligible but not essential

Applicants will be required to undergo a competitive examination in the following subjects

English Essay, Logic, Current Australian and international affairs, and General Knowledge on questions of history,

Geography, Economics, Social Questions and Politics

Success at the examinations which will be conducted on Saturday 4th January 1947, does not confer the right to temporary engagement (or temporary transfer in the case of an officer of the Commonwealth Public Service), selection being made following personal interview of a determined number of successful applicants at the examination.

In the final selection for engagement, the preference provisions in the Re Establishment and Employment Act 1945 will apply.
