SUMMARY OF ENEMY MOVEMENTS

AND

SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN STRENGTHS

LAND

The enemy's position around SALAMUA has further deteriorated during the past week and a measure of enemy embarrassment was the very half hearted resistance against our move to gain the high ground running NE from BOBUBI towards KELA POINT. The loss of some of this vital ground, however, is unlikely to mean that enemy troops will not put up stiff resistance to the end. There is ample evidence that in mid-July at least he intended to hold out until reinforced. This apparently has not occurred on any appreciable scale, and his heavy losses may force him to withdraw what troops he can save for the defence of LAE.

An identification of part of a battalion of 238 Regt of 41 Div in the SALAMUA area was made during the week. Although it arrived on 8 Aug, it is thought that no considerable number of troops from this regt are at SALAMUA since they would have been used to bolster up the already depleted front line troops and there is no evidence to this effect. Whilst strength of identified units at LAE-SALAMUA after allowing for casualties has been lowered and assessed at 13,500, the actual figure may well be higher if all of 238 Regt has arrived in the area. An estimate of 15,000 for the area is therefore reasonable.

Building activity at FINSCHLAFEN suggests the increased use of this place as a staging point. Movement of troops down the RAI coast still continues.

SEA

Submarines sighted off NEW BRITAIN going south, probably to LAE, have increased during the past week, when six were observed. Little barge activity has been observed but activity probably continues, though on a reduced scale.

AIR

Heavy attacks have been continued on WEWAK airfields and the enemy has had additional heavy losses. The effect of these losses is probably reflected in the lack of effective enemy interception during a heavy attack on 24 Aug.

OPERATIONS

OWN & ENEMY (1) LAND

COASTAL AREA

HQ of an Aust Div took over command from another Aust Div at 734918.

On 25 Aug attacks by an Aust Inf Bn made no progress on enemy positions at 725958 (about 2,000 yds SE of the elbow of the FRANCISCO RIVER). Patrols are attempting to locate the flanks of the enemy position.

A US Inf Bgt patrol engaged enemy in dug out posns north of ROOSEVELT RIDGE. Six Japs were killed.

BOHDUBI Area

A composite force attacked enemy posns on KUNAI SPUR 710965 (about 800 yds SE of the elbow of the FRANCISCO RIVER; from the north. They encountered 2 parties of Japs, each about 50 strong, and inflicted heavy casualties. Another party is attacking the enemy from the west.

Another Aust Inf Bn took over responsibility for KUNAI SPUR area.

Our tps are now disposed East, South and West of enemy posns 710964 (about 900 yards SW of the elbow of the FRANCISCO RIVER).

Three organized attacks on enemy posns 500 yards north of this point were made. A party from an Aust Inf Bn attacked South across the river but were held at the SALAMATA track by MG fire from wired pillboxes. The Japs counterattacked westward but were repulsed with 47 killed for certain.

A n Aust Indep Coy and part of an Aust Inf Bn attacked SE but made no progress.

SALAMATA Area

Ambush posns at 704004 (1,500 yards West of SWAN'S CP) and 713008 (500 yards North of SWAN'S CP) were cleared.

Part of an Aust Inf Bn were attacking enemy in posns at 724994 (about 1,500 yds West of the south end of SALAMATA drome. The posn is being attacked from the South and also harassed from the north by a fighting patrol.

A party of 10/15 Japs who met an Aust Inf patrol at 720008 (about 500 yards north of SWAN'S CP) broke and fled.

A further patrol crossed the river in the vicinity of 728988 (approx 1,200 yds SE of SWAN'S CP) and set an ambush posn on the main SALAMATA track.

ENEMY (11) SEA

A t 0637K/26 a sub was sighted off CAPE GORDON north bound zigzagging.

Two gunboats, 2 freighters tot 5,500/7,000 tons, 1 freighter 1,500/2,500 tons, were sighted at 1320K/25 58 miles WNW MUSMAI IS, course east.

At 1425K/25, 1 freighter tot 2/4,800 tons, was sighted 43 miles north by west of MUSMAI IS course ESE.

At 1740K/25 7 barges were stationary near the BUMI River (3 miles South of FINSCHHAFEN) and 2 entering the mouth of MAFZ River (6 miles South of FINSCHHAFEN).

SUBMARINE ACTIVITY

On 19 Aug an enemy submarine ineffectively shelled and strafed Allied surface craft in NASSAU BAY.

Four North bound and six South bound submarines were sighted off the South coast of NEW BRITAIN during the week, and are considered to have been engaged in continuing supply to NEW GUINEA area. This is an increase on previous sightings.

BARGE ACTIVITY

Aircraft made a thorough search of hideout areas from WALD BAY to LANGEMAK BAY and from LANGEMAK BAY to SALLOR and made no sightings of barges. This may point either to a falling off of Japanese barge traffic following heavy losses, or the transport of some Japanese reinforcements and supplies by alternative overland routes, or more effective camouflage measures when barges are in hiding.

Evidence that barge traffic continues in some measure is given by the fact that four barges were sunk, and five damaged by our surface craft operating at night in the FINSCHHAFEN area.

ONE (111) AIR

On 25 Aug GASMATA dump area was bombed and strafed, and landing craft and barges strafed at GAROYE IS.

One 5,500/7,000 ton vessel was bombed approx 60 miles NW of MUSAU IS. Two direct hits were scored.

ENEMY (111) AIR

A steady flow of aircraft reinforcements and a conservative use of available air strength, brought the Japanese airforces in NE NEW GUINEA to a high numerical strength by mid-August. The building-up process had continued uninterrupted from May this year.

During the past week, however, Allied air attacks by day and night, have caused considerable damage to grounded aircraft on the WEWAK airfields, and although reinforcements are reaching the area, their numbers are insufficient to compensate for losses. Current enemy air strength in NE GUINEA is considered to be less than at any time since May last.

Our bombers during daylight raids were accompanied by fighters, for the first time in the WEWAK area, and the Japanese interceptors suffered heavy and disproportionate losses in combat. These losses are further reflected in the lack of enemy interception when WEWAK was again heavily raided on 24 Aug. It is possible that the provision of fighter cover for Allied bombers over WEWAK will eventually force upon enemy some modification of the disposition of his air forces in NE GUINEA.

DEVELOPMENT

There are indications of a possible float-plane base in course of construction in the WITU ISLANDS, off the North coast of NEW BRITAIN.

Air crews also report a possible landing strip near ANKENBERG (between KERAM and RAMU Rivers) forty miles South of NUBIA.

The CAPE GLOUCESTER strip shows signs of still further development.

PART IIENEMY (v) TACTICS

The Japanese admit that Allied artillery is a grave source of concern to them and in the NEW GUINEA operations, there have been three occasions when they have sent out patrols, not only to annihilate the crews, but to effectively put our guns out of action. Previously, during the SANANANDA operations, a forward gun position of an Australian troop was attacked on the night of 29 Dec, at 0115 hours by a party of 40 Japanese.

This technique has been again repeated on two other occasions recently. At 0400 hrs on the 16 Aug, a party of 30 Japanese attacked the gun positions of an Australian battery one and three quarter miles NW of LAKE SALUS and explosive charges were placed under the guns. Our troops, after driving off the enemy, were able to remove the explosives before any damage was done to the guns. However, three of our men were killed and seven others wounded in this encounter. The other instance occurred at 1100 hours on the same morning, presumably by the same patrol. This time a gun position of an American regiment was selected. However, the Americans were able to drive off the patrol without loss or damage to the guns. This Japanese patrol has been again sighted on the 19 Aug by a party of our Native Infantry, still in the same area. It can be expected that the enemy will continue to neutralize our artillery by direct patrol attack methods.

SECRET

The standard of Unit Censorship is normally reflected in the use or misuse of Green Envelopes within that unit. If Franking Officers are conversant with their duties troops will usually prefer to have their mail franked, rather than suffer the small delay caused by treatment of Green Envelopes by the Base Censor.

The unit, whose officers are ignorant or careless of the regulations, presents a different picture. If the troops believe that their mail is unduly delayed, or that officers discuss its contents, they will go to great pains to avoid such censorship. Green Envelopes will then be in great demand, and may even attain a monetary or barter-value in the eyes of some men.

Many troops using green Envelopes seem to be ignorant of the fact that the declaration on the envelope certifying the contents to consist of personal or family matter only, is as binding as a legal oath. Many recent cases show the open discussion of military matters that would not be passed if the letter was franked by an officer in the writer's unit. Applications for transfer to other units, requests to members of Parliament, "exposures" of grievances intended to be conveyed to the press, are some of the subjects seen in recent weeks.

Some cases have been noticed of officers using Green Envelopes, and not only is this an infringement of WFF EO 527/42, but it is unnecessary and further reduces the strictly limited supply available to the troops.

The recent improvement in Unit Censorship has been offset by the increase in considerable matter contained in Green Envelopes.

Whenever any considerable number of breaches of censorship occur in a unit, it is desirable for an investigation to be made, not only into the breach itself, but also the circumstances that lead to its commitment. It may then be found that an overhaul of franking arrangements in the unit will provide a permanent cure for the complaint.

COASTAL AREA

On Aug 23 and 24 the Japs attacked Allied positions on the NW end of ROOSEVELT RIDGE. The attacks were repulsed.

Fwd troops of a US Regt are now at 745957 (about 1200 yds NW of BUIAMBUN) and are making an attack on enemy posns at the NW end of ROOSEVELT RIDGE.

Jap guns in area 752958 (about 1,500 yds NW of LOKANU PEN) fired intermittently into area 745943 (about 1,000 yds SW of BUIAMBUN) during 23 and 24 Aug.

On PM 24 Aug our arty fired 1,000 rds into enemy posns on the NW end of ROOSEVELT RIDGE.

There are no Japs, except possible stragglers, south of a line from enemy posns on the NW end of ROOSEVELT RIDGE, at 748949, to the KOMIATUM track area 710965 (about 800 yds SE of the elbow of the FRANCISCO RIVER).

An Aust Inf Bn left TAMBU BAY and another Aust Inf Bn is concentrating at TAMBU BAY.

Ref map 1/25,000 KOMIATUM 3539. Form lines of feature sq 7295 are inaccurate. An Aust Inf Bn area has been amended to 723956 - 719942 - 720926.

This Bn is attacking enemy posns 724956 (about 2 miles W of LOKANU Pen) with arty support.

Rear HQ of an Aust Div has opened up at NASSAU BAY.

BOBEUBI AREA

Thirty Japs moving NE from contained enemy posns at 710955 (800 yds SE of the elbow of the FRANCISCO RIVER) were dispersed by part of an Aust Indep Coy on track 800 yds to the NE. The enemy attempted to encircle our posns but were driven back.

HQ of an Aust Inf Bn is complete at 708944 (about 500 yds SE of the elbow of the FRANCISCO RIVER).

Enemy were engaged at 710965 by portion of two Aust Inf Bns with harassing fire during night 23/24 Aug.

Elements of an Aust Inf Bn are at 708952 and 709937 along the KOMIATUM track; the remainder are at 707919 (rear MT TAMBU).

SALAMUA AREA

A party from an Aust Inf Bn crossed to the South of the FRANCISCO River at 728988 (about 800 yds WSW of the South end of SALAMUA drome) and patrolled to 1,000 yds north.

Enemy posns to the North of 725995 (about 2,000 yds West of LOGUI) were engaged by mortar fire.

A det of an Aust Inf Bn were forced to withdraw from 707007 (3,000 yds North of OLD BOBDUBI) where the Japs are digging in.

A det at 717007 (1,000 yds East of previous posn) report no contact but found 36 huts completed and under construction in the area.

HENA HENA AREA

A recce patrol at USINI (ref STRAT MAP RAMU WO 2588) was attacked by Japs and withdrew.

ENEMY (ii) SEA

At 1045K/24 one 1,500 ton, and one 500 ton vessel, also several small luggers and barges were sighted at WEWAK Harbour.

At 1240K/24 several small harbour craft were stationary off MUSCHU IS (10 miles NW of WEWAK), and 3 cargo vessels 500/1,000 tons, and three small vessels were sighted proceeding on a course of 120 degrees in MUSCHU STRAITS.

At 0900K/25 three vessels of 80/90 ft, heavily laden, left SALAWANA towards LAE apparently towing barges.

OWN & ENEMY (iii) AIR

On 25 Aug 48 heavy and 53 medium bombers bombed and strafed the HANSA BAY area, first, bivouac areas in AWAR and NUBIA plantations, second, AA emplacements and dumps in vicinity CONDON PT NUBIA, third, shipping and barges in HANSA BAY. Two vessels, one 1,000/1,500 tons, and the other 500/1,000 tons, many barges, and several luggers were destroyed.

OWN & ENEMY (i) LAND

COASTAL Areas

An Aust Inf Bn has arrived at TAMEU BAY from area 693903.

A patrol from a US Regt reports 6 Jap pillboxes extending from 744962 to 746958, (about 1,000 yards W of LOKANU Pen.)

GWAIBALON Area

An Aust Inf Bde HQ has been established at 708948 (about 1,000 yards East of GWAIBALON).

An Aust Inf Bn is in area 705913-707926 (South of KOMIATUM).

OSBORNE CK Area

An attack was made on Jap posns at 711913 (about 500 yards SE of the elbow of the FRANCISCO River). The enemy was attacked from 3 sides by portions of two Aust Inf Bns on the afternoon of 23 Aug. A footing was obtained in enemy posns but our tps were forced to withdraw. The attack is continuing.

A portion of an Aust Indep Coy moved to and held track 714968 (about 1,000 yds East of the elbow of the FRANCISCO R), and pushed back a party of 30 Japs moving from NE along the SALAMAUA track.

SALAMAUA Area

On the morning of 23 Aug a portion of an Aust Inf Bn gained an objective at 725994 (about 1,200 yds West of the South end of SALAMAUA drome) and consolidated their position. Patrols are now operating to the NE and West. The Japs fled down the track to the East, abandoning all their equipment.

A party moving North to 722007 (about 2,500 yards SE of CHINATOWN) repulsed an attack by Japs and are now clearing a pocket to the East.

A party at 705006 (about a mile West of previous posns) dispersed a party of Japs, capturing a MAG. The enemy are reported to be digging in in the vicinity.

All equipment captured in both actions appeared new.

A standing patrol from an Aust Inf Bn has been established at 680030 (about 1,000 yards South of OLD WAMASQ).

WAMPIT Area

During 23 Aug an enemy motor launch made 28 crossings carrying 105 personnel to the South, and 156 personnel to the North Bank of the MARKHAM River, in the vicinity of NEW LABU IS (about 6 miles from the mouth).

HENA HENA Area

A recce patrol to BOROAI (about 15 miles South of BOGAJIM) was forced to return to RAMU River.

ENEMY (ii) SEA

At 0015K/22 one merchant vessel of approx 2,500 tons was sighted 42 miles East by South of WEWAK on a course of 130.

On 23 Aug numerous wrecked barges, some repairable, were sighted in MAPLE River and off the coast of LANGEMAK BAY (about 5 miles South of ALEXISHAVEN).

One destroyer and one 7,000 ton merchant vessel were sighted 61 miles WSW of Cape MATANALEM (Western point of NEW HANOVER IS) proceeding on a course SE.

At 0819K/23 a sub was sighted going North off Cape ORFORD, and at 1440K/24 another sub was seen going South with deck cargo.

OWN & ENEMY (iii) AIR

Six aircraft bombed dumps and strafed AA posns in the GASMATA area on 23 Aug.

One MITCHELL strafed a surfaced sub at approx 56 miles ESE of SALAMAU. Nil hits registered.

In the FINSCHHAFEN area six MITCHELLS bombed a wooden wharf and strafed two houses.

WEWAK town area and airfield was bombed on 23 Aug by 37 LIBERATORS. Many buildings were destroyed, but observation of results was limited owing to clouds. One LIBERATOR crash landed at BULOLO strip but the crew are safe. One enemy fighter is believed to have been destroyed.

On 21 Aug the airfields at BUT and DAGUA were bombed and strafed by 18 medium bombers, and fires started.

Ten to fifteen enemy fighters attempted interception, and three were shot down.

Bridges on the BOGADJIM-RAMU road were bombed by 11 heavy bombers. Nil hits scored.

On 19 Aug a PIB patrol at 773898 reported a well used Jap track to the beach north of feature 1500 square 7889.

On 20 Aug a patrol from a US Regt demolished a large enemy amm dump in the LOKANU peninsula.

A Jap cemetery found at BUIAMBUN contained at least 100 Jap graves.

A patrol from this regt located an enemy posn of unknown strength at 735955 (1½ miles W of DOT INLET).

MT TAMBU Area

Coy C of 1 Bn of a US Regt occupied MT TAMBU on 20 Aug. Enemy resistance in this area is broken and only a few stragglers remain.

Approx 250 Japs were found buried in this area. It is believed that these casualties are the result of our arty and mortar fire.

B Coy of an Aust Inf Bn occupied the track at 722922 (600 yards North of MT TAMBU). This coy is in contact with 1 Bn of the US Regt mentioned above.

At 718927 (1,000 yards east of KOMIATUM) the same coy ambushed 12 Japs, killing all.

GOODVIEW JUNCTION-KOMIATUM Area

On the morning of 19 Aug B coy of an Aust Inf Bn found an unoccupied Jap posn at 701911 (1½ miles SW of MT TAMBU). The coy moved to the track junction at 707919 where much equipment was found.

A Coy of this Bn passed through to contact another Aust Inf Bn. Two HMG and one mountain gun were captured. A Coy of the latter Bn reached 707939 (1 mile east of ORODUBI) without opposition, and is patrolling to 706946.

One of these patrols discovered a six foot track east of KOMIATUM which appeared to be well-used on the night of 17/18 Aug.

The patrol engaged approx 50 Japs, inflicting some casualties.

KOMIATUM-ORODUBI Area

After 30 minutes mortar and LMG fire C Coy of an Aust Inf Bn attacked the village of ORODUBI, and by 1430K/19 completed its capture.

On the morning of 19 Aug D Coy of this Bn established ambush positions on the main KOMIATUM track at 706957.

On 20 Aug A Coy of an Aust Inf Bn contacted D Coy of another Aust Inf Bn at 707926.

Mopping up proceeds east of KOMIATUM RIDGE.

C Coy of an Aust Inf Bn on 20 Aug occupied a knoll at 694937 (near NAMLING). No opposition was encountered.

At 1730K/19 a patrol from A Coy of an Aust Inf Bn reported 697943 (500 yards N of ORODUBI) to be clear of enemy.

D Coy of this Bn at 1400K/19 occupied 702946 (approx 800 yards NE of ORODUBI).

A patrol from D Coy of another Aust Inf Bn contacted an enemy ambush at 682035.

ENEMY (11) SEA

At 0925K/20 nine enemy barges were sighted in LAE Harbour.

OWN & ENEMY (111) AIR

On 19 Aug 3 Jap barges were strafed at BROWN IS (WIDE BAY). Two were left burning.

On the same day allied aircraft bombed the dump area at the ANWEK River mouth.

In the WEWAK area on 20 Aug 20 of our heavy bombers attacked BORAM airfield. Five grounded aircraft were destroyed. Further results were not observed.

Of the intercepting enemy fighters, our bombers destroyed seven, and six probables.

CAPE BORAM was also bombed on 20 Aug and one large explosion was observed.

A preliminary report by escorting fighters over BORAM gives enemy losses as 13 fighters destroyed, 1 probably destroyed. One Allied fighter is unaccounted for.

In the SALAMAU area dumps at KENNEDY'S CROSSING and LOGHI NO 2 were bombed and strafed.

On the night 17/18 Aug the enemy unsuccessfully counter attacked our positions in the OSBORNE CK Area. Patrolling continues.

During this action portion of D Coy of an Aust Inf Bn became isolated. Patrol action on the 18 Aug contacted some but 17 personnel are still missing.

At 1145H/18 the enemy unsuccessfully attacked our positions about 400 yards north of OSBORNE CK, at 704967.

On the same day a patrol from an Aust Inf Bn was engaged by 70 Japs in the same area, at 706967. The patrol withdrew south.

KOMIATULI Area

On the evening of 17 Aug the enemy made five more attacks against our positions south of KOMIATULI RIDGE. All were repulsed.

Advanced HQ of an Aust Inf Bn was established at HODGES KNOLL on the morning of 18 Aug.

Our patrols have made contact with an Aust Inf Bn at KOMIATULI.

Patrolling in this area continues.

COASTAL Area

On the morning of 16 Aug Coys I and K of a US Inf Regt attacked enemy positions on the NW end of ROOSEVELT RIDGE, but heavy MG and mortar fire prevented any gain.

HQ D Coy of an Aust Inf Bn is at 792888 (about 1 mile N along the track from SALUS).

A PIB patrol reports enemy at 770895 on a saddle a mile NW of LAKE SALUS.

On 18 Aug a patrol from a US Regt destroyed 87 rounds of Jap mortar ammo at 748955 (DOT INLET).

A composite party from HQ Coy of this Regt has relieved Coy G at the eastern end of ROOSEVELT RIDGE. Coy G is now at 745935, (TAMBU BAY).

Two of our guns at 768900 are temporarily out of action, due to enemy 75 mm shelling.

HQ MASSAU BAY defence has been established at 833798 BADEN BAY.

GOODVIEW JUNCTION Area

An Aust Inf Bn unsuccessfully attacked Jap posns NE of GOODVIEW JUNCTION.

B Coy of this Bn is in close contact astride the main KOMLATUM track at 70I9I0.

OWN (111) AIR

On 18 Aug one 2,000/4,500 ton tpt was bombed 6 miles SE of CAPE ST GEORGE. Nil hits reported.

SUMMARY OF ENEMY MOVEMENTS

AND

SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN STRENGTHS

LAND

It is becoming evident that Japanese military responsibilities in the NE Sector are undergoing a large scale re-organisation, and as previously suggested, it is possible that WEWAK is destined to become the "RABAU" of NEW GUINEA.

It is probable that, to meet increasing commitments in the SOLOMONS and NEW BRITAIN, the enemy may relieve HQ 8 Army Group at RABAU of that area in NEW GUINEA which was previously a part of their responsibility. As it is possible that additional troops will be moved into NEW GUINEA in the near future, it is likely that a HQ similar to 8 Army Group will be established - perhaps at WEWAK. Known moves of senior officers, the recent strengthening of air power in this region and the considerable shipping coming into this area all point to this conclusion.

There are indications that Japanese resources at SALAMAU and in forward areas are being rapidly depleted and no doubt the timely interception of barge traffic by Allied aircraft has aggravated this position. The continuous use of badly depleted units suggests that fresh troops are not available.

An identification of KAWA 3565 - SUZUKI TAI - has been received from ROOSEVELT RIDGE. It is thought that KAWA 3565 refers to 41 Div Cavalry Regiment. A Major SUZUKI of this unit was known to be attached to 41 Div staff in Apr 42.

As there is no other evidence of fresh troops in this area and as the enemy has failed to hold ROOSEVELT RIDGE, it is considered that this identification should be taken to indicate possible future arrival rather than the presence now of any large number of troops from this division.

SEA

Sightings have disclosed increased shipping movement in the direction of RABAU from the north. Over 100,000 tons of merchant shipping was included in the reports.

AIR

The reinforcement of enemy air strength in the SWPA still continues. For the first time it is estimated that the enemy had over 1,000 aircraft in this area.

On 17 Aug Allied air attacks against the four airfields near WEWAK are reported to have destroyed between eighty and ninety enemy aircraft.

OWN & ENEMY (i) LAND :-

COASTAL AREA

On the morning of 16 Aug one of our patrols found unoccupied enemy positions and a well used Japanese track on the high feature at 720948 (west of ROCSEVELT RIDGE).

BOBDUBI AREA

On the morning of 17 Aug the enemy abandoned the SOUTH COCONUTS which is now occupied by A Coy of an Aust Inf Bn.

On the morning of 17 Aug an attack was made by an Aust Independent Coy against Japanese positions in the OSBORNE CREEK SALLAMAUA-BOBDUBI track area. As a result this Coy now commands the Japanese L of C to the middle spur 699966.

This Coy, assisted by D Coy of an Aust Inf Bn, is continuing operations in this area.

On the afternoon of 17 Aug the enemy unsuccessfully attacked B Coy of an Aust Inf Bn in position at 704958 (about 2 miles south of OLD BOBDUBI).

As a result of these operations we now control all the high ground from OLD BOBDUBI to NAMLING, including all the high tactical ground of the COCONUTS and OLD VICKERS positions.

GOODVIEW JUNG - KOMIATUM AREA

On the afternoon of 17 Aug a portion of an Aust Inf Bn occupied HODGES KNOLL at 693906 and pillboxes at 698907.

At 1800K/17 14 pl of this Bn occupied a position at the junction of STEPHENS and MULE tracks at 700913.

An Aust Inf Bn continued patrolling north along KOMIATUM RIDGE, supported by artillery and MG fire from another Aust Inf Bn.

In the ORODUBI - ERSKINE CREEK area patrolling is being carried out by an Aust Inf Bn.

ENEMY (ii) SEA :-

At 0856K/18 a submarine was sighted going north at 0530S 15215E (off CAPE ORFORD) and at 1305K/18 another submarine carrying deck cargo was sighted in the same position.

At 1033K/18 four destroyers or light cruisers were sighted approx ninety miles SE of RABAU on a course of 207 degrees and speed 12 knots.

OWN (iii) AIR :-

On 17 Aug six barges at DOVE POINT (on mainland west of KARKAR ISLAND) were bombed and strafed, three being destroyed.

On 18 Aug WEWAK area was again heavily attacked by our aircraft. The MISSION and TOWN areas and five 500/1,000 ton vessels in the harbour were the main targets.

BUT airfield and dumps at BORAM and MUSCHU IS were also attacked.

At WEMAK fires were started in all the target areas. One vessel was directly hit, two barges were destroyed and buildings demolished.

Large numbers of enemy fighters intercepted this attacking force. Our bombers claim fifteen fighters shot down and seven probables. Our escort of ninety nine fighters destroyed fourteen enemy fighters and three probables.

Allied losses were one bomber destroyed, one missing and five damaged and one fighter missing.

Three 5,500/7,000 ton transports and two torpedo boats were bombed approx 20 miles north MUSAU IS with nil results.

Twenty empty barges near the MALAHANG wreck were bombed. Nil hits obtained.

PART II

GENERAL

Japanese Morale

In the past three months there has been ample evidence that the legend of "invincibility" and "fanatical sacrifice" that the Japanese have so painstakingly tried to build up has cracked badly under the strain of battle reverses.

On 17 May, Lt-Gen NAKANO, comd 51 DIV, expressed his disgust at the total lack of martial spirit displayed by both officers and men of his comd. He enjoined all concerned to remember that "the safety of the nation depended on 51 DIV" and to "strive to raise the fighting spirit of the division".

A distribution of "bowler hats" of all comds of 102 Inf Regt on 22 May lent emphasis to his "profound concern" over the situation.

The hoped-for effect failed to materialize. A fortnight later, the comd 66 Inf Regt gave an extraordinary demonstration of panic at MUBO. An order issued by him was rescinded an hour later only to be put into effect within the next 48 hours. He was obviously incapable of deciding whether to hold his position at MUBO or retreat to KOMIATUM.

The DIV comd himself appears to have been affected by the general inability to reach a clear-cut decision.

His removal of 1 Bn 66 Inf Regt to attack BOBDUBI assisted in the loss of MUBO, and this unit had to be hurriedly returned to assist 2 Bn at MT TAMBU. His misplaced appreciation of our intentions caused him to scatter 115 Inf Regt to provide a force in MARKHAM VALLEY. The arrival of a small patrol at BUANG RIVER mouth caused immediate apprehension of a full scale threat, and a sizeable force was despatched.

As a result of changing plans before they could be fully implemented, small detachments were scattered about the area, with no unit complete.

Under the circumstances the morale of the rank and file could hardly be expected to be at its best; nevertheless, it is

surprising to find such phrases as "the garrison is in the depths of misery" emanating from the supposedly countless sons of NIPPON, whose desire to die for the Emperor does not appear to be quite as boundless as the Japanese would have us believe.

OPERATIONS

OWN & ENEMY (i) LAND :-

COASTAL AREA

On 16/17 Aug patrols from 2 Bn of a US Regt were operating north and west of DOT INLET. These patrols, moving north from BULAMBUN, reported no enemy in the re-entrants at 719954 and 751958.

At 0100K/16 approx thirty Japanese with explosives attacked a gun position at 788900. Although charges were placed under the guns the enemy were driven off before the charges exploded. Two Japanese officers were killed. Our casualties were three killed, seven wounded.

At 1000K/16 a Japanese patrol attacked a US artillery position at 795895 but were driven off. Our casualties were nil.

At 1700K/16 the enemy unsuccessfully attacked I Coy of a US Regt on the NW end of ROOSEVELT RIDGE. Twenty one Japanese were killed.

Other small enemy attacks on this area were all driven off.

KOMIATUM AREA

On the afternoon of 16 Aug the enemy twice counter attacked A and D Coys of an Aust Inf Bn. Both attacks were repulsed.

At 0100K/17 the enemy advanced to attack our position at 707924 from the south. The attack was broken up.

BOEDUBI AREA

A patrol from an Aust Inf Coy, moving north of 701958, overran an enemy post, killing five Japanese. Further north the patrol came under fire from enemy at 706967. The patrol then returned to 701958 (about 1 1/2 miles south of OLD BOEDUBI).

OWN (iii) AIR :-

On the early morning of 17 Aug the airfields at BORAM, DAGUA, WENAK and BUT were bombed by B24s and B17s. Following this attack B25s bombed and strafed the same areas.

Preliminary reports of this attack indicate that a minimum of 80/90 enemy aircraft were destroyed or damaged beyond repair on the ground. One enemy fighter was also shot down. Fuel and other stores were set on fire.

Our losses were two B24s which collided over the target and one B24 which force-landed but has since been located.

On 17 Aug four to five wrecked barges were destroyed between KELA and MISSION POINTS.

On the same day KELA POINT, QUARRY on the Isthmus and LETTU village were bombed and strafed.

ODEA's and MACDONALD's JUNCTIONS were also strafed. One allied aircraft was lost but the crew is safe.

OWN & ENEMY (I) LAND

KOMIATUM AREA

At 0725K/16 A and D Coys of an Aust Inf Bn moved forward and occupied posns astride the western end of KOMIATUM RIDGE in the general area of 707926 to 707922. C Coy of this Bn less one pl are in a position from astride the MULE TRACK to the WEST of this area.

Another Aust Inf Bn is in position on the ridge parallel to and east of KOMIATUM RIDGE, thus encircling approximately 700 Japanese in the MT TAMBU - GOODVIEW JUNC area.

No reports have been received as to the activity in other areas.

ENEMY (II) SEA

An aircraft in flight sighted at 0820K/16 three freighters and two destroyers in posn 0130N 14915E (approx 200 miles north of MUSSAU IS) on a course of 180 degrees.

OWN (III) AIR

On 15 Aug the GASMATA and WIDE BAY areas were attacked by our aircraft. A dump area on the AWIT R was bombed and explosions resulted. A 150 ton vessel was attacked and left awash off MALMAL plantation. A thirty foot barge was attacked in WIDE BAY.

A 5,500/7,000 ton transport was bombed by our aircraft approx 30 miles NW of MUSSAU IS. Nil hits were observed.

ENEMY (III) AIR

At 0050K/16 one unidentified aircraft flew south over TSILI TSILI and at 0130K/16 an unidentified aircraft circled this area for 10 minutes.

At 0055K/16 eight unidentified aircraft flew west over SALAMAU.

An unidentified aircraft was over BULOLO at 0138K/16.

On 16 Aug our fighters again intercepted a force of enemy dive bombers and fighters over the MARILIMAN area. Twelve enemy aircraft were destroyed and two probably destroyed with the loss of only one Allied aircraft.

One enemy aircraft was over GAROKA at 1126K/16.

At 1340K/16 one enemy aircraft was over KAINANTU.

OPERATIONS

OWN & ENEMY (i) LAND :-

COASTAL AREA

On the night 12/13 Aug and on the morning of 14 Aug enemy artillery shelled the TAMBU BAY area. One 25 pdr was damaged and there were no casualties.

The attack on ROOSEVELT RIDGE was continued on 14 Aug. Our troops now occupy this ridge from 738946 to the coast.

As a result of recent air and ground attacks on ROOSEVELT RIDGE Japanese casualties are known to exceed 200.

KOMIATUM - MT TAMBU AREA

At 1900K/14 HQ of an Aust Inf Bn was reported about 2 miles east of MT TAMBU at 736919.

A company of this Bn was in position 724917.

One platoon of A Coy of another Aust Inf Bn has moved to a knoll about 1½ miles NE of KOMIATUM at 720942.

C Coy of the same Bn is approx ¾ miles north of MT TAMBU at 718929.

On 13 Aug C Coy of another Aust Inf Bn was in position in the valley about ¾ miles east of MT TAMBU at 733917 not at 715930 as reported in Intelligence Summary No 211.

On 14 Aug portion of this Coy was reported at the junction of the track BOISI - MT TAMBU at 727936.

BOBDUBI AREA

Following a successful attack B Coy of an Aust Inf Bn had, by 1450K/14, occupied the NORTH and CENTRE of the COCONUTS position. No estimate of enemy casualties have yet been received. The enemy still hold pillbox positions in the SOUTH COCONUTS.

A platoon of an Aust Indep Coy in an ambush position 704970 on the track south of OLD BOBDUBI killed 5 Japanese.

MARKHAM AREA

At 1300K/14 a PIB OP was established about 3 miles south of NADZAB.

Nine Japanese were observed about ½ mile east of NADZAB.

ENEMY (ii) SEA :-

At 1316K/15 an aircraft in flight sighted a seven ship convoy about 90 miles SE of RABUL. The course was not stated.

OWN (111) AIR :-

On 15 Aug KOMIATUM was bombed by two of our aircraft.

At SALAMAUA on the same day the ISTHMUS, KELA town, MACDONALDS JUNC and the airfield were bombed.

On 14 Aug PALMALMAL plantation (in the vicinity of JAQUINOT BAY) and a small barge in VANSEEL Harbour were bombed.

A preliminary report of .. interception on 15 Aug in the MARILIMAN area (ref MARKHAM Strat LR 0322) indicates the enemy losses to be eleven bombers and three fighters destroyed. Four Allied aircraft were lost but two of the pilots are safe.

OPERATIONSOWN & ENEMY (i) LAND :-COASTAL AREA

On the night 12/13 Aug an enemy attack from the west on a US coy position on ROOSEVELT RIDGE 739946 was repulsed.

On 13 Aug a bn of a US regt successfully attacked the western end of ROOSEVELT RIDGE. High knolls at 744944 and 739946 were occupied commanding enemy positions in pill boxes and dugouts along the crest of the RIDGE. Combat engineers demolished seven of these pillboxes.

The enemy still occupies the NW portion of the RIDGE from 739946 to 738949.

Excluding the occupants of the demolished pillboxes enemy casualties in this action were thirty eight. Our casualties were five killed and twenty wounded.

MT TAMBU - KOMIATUM AREA

On 13 Aug the enemy was contacted at 723920 by a patrol from an Aust Inf Bn.

One company of an Aust Inf Bn is at 715930.

BUANG RIVER

At 174CK/12 a fighting patrol from LEGA (210520) reached the coast where it was engaged by the enemy. No details.

MARKHAM RIVER

A patrol from a coy of the PIB moving west in canoes along the river were fired on in the vicinity of NARAKAPOR.

ENEMY (ii) SEA :-

At 1457K/14 an unidentified enemy vessel was sighted proceeding south about 160 miles south of RABAU.

At 0730K/14 an aircraft in flight sighted one destroyer, one 5,500/7,000 ton transport, two 2,000/4,500 ton transports proceeding on a course of 110 degrees about 187 miles NW of KAVIENO.

OWN (iii) AIR :-

Enemy positions on ROOSEVELT RIDGE were accurately bombed and strafed on 14 Aug.

On the same day enemy positions in the COCONUTS (BOBDUBI RIDGE) were heavily bombed.

SALAMAU AREA

The airfield, targets on the Isthmus, KELA village and LOGUI NO 1 were bombed and fires started.

Eleven barges were attacked at TALASEA and REIN BAY. Seven were destroyed.

A submarine 20 miles SE of CAPE GLOUCESTER was bombed with nil hits.

ENEMY (iii) AIR :

From 1900 to 1915K/13 six enemy aircraft bombed 3,000 yards SW of one of our artillery positions in the SALUS area.

Another US Coy has moved into positions on ROOSEVELT RIDGE at 739946 (1 mi NW of BOISI).

The enemy positions were found at 735945.

MT TAMBU AREA

At 1200K/12 a US patrol located an enemy patrol moving SE along the re-entrant at 732910. Later an ambush party killed 2 and wounded 1 Jap at 727912.

On the night 11/12 Aug our arty continued harassing fire on SALAMAUA, KOMIATUM and GOODVIEW JUNCTION areas, and on the night 12/13 Aug on SALAMAUA and MT TAMBU.

On 12 Aug active patrolling continued in all areas.

BENA FORCE

Our troops at WESA (20 miles NE of BENA BENA) were attacked at 0230K/12 by enemy of strength estimated at one platoon. This attack, and five other attacks from 1130K/12 onward, were repulsed with heavy casualties inflicted on the enemy. Our casualties were one killed and one wounded.

ENEMY (ii) SEA

At 0615K/13 a submarine was sighted moving NORTH at 0530S 15215E (off CAPE ORFORD).

SUMMARY OF ENEMY MOVEMENTS

AND

SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN STRENGTH

LAND

From evidence available it appears that, during the past two months, troops reaching SALAMAU have been moved quickly to forward areas.

Although these arrivals have at least maintained the enemy's numerical strength in each area, the fact that some units have been committed piecemeal may indicate that no reserve for offensive operations is at present available.

SEA

Reconnaissance north of ADMIRALTY ISLANDS on 7 and 8 Aug disclosed large scale shipping movement in the direction of RABAU. It comprised at least 40,000 tons of merchant shipping, together with a force of escorting warships.

Under cover of the bad weather conditions prevailing it may be that shipping also reached the NE coast of NEW GUINEA.

AIR

Anxiety over recent losses coupled with apprehension as to future Allied moves, appears to be causing the enemy to husband his resources of aircraft.

Although his air strength continues to be built up, activity has been on a negligible scale.

OPERATIONS

OWN & ENEMY (1) LAND :-

COASTAL AREA

The HQ of the Aust Inf Bde which landed at NASSAU BAY has now moved to DUALI. One of the bns of this Bde has also moved from TAMBU BAY and is now at 724926.

BOBDUBI AREA

At 1020K/11 an Aust coy attacked enemy positions SE of the OLD VICKERS posn. As a result of the enemy counter attack, this coy is now at 701959.

During 11 Aug our artillery continued harassing fire in the vicinity of MT TAMBU, ORODUBI and SALAMAU. One of our 25 pdr guns was put out of action by heavy enemy counter battery fire.

BENA BENA AREA:

No further report has been received of the personnel at WH 5917 to where they moved after the enemy overran the OP at ATTELE.

MT HAGEN

Native rumours that a party of "different type Europeans" was located approximately twenty miles south of MT HAGEN are being investigated. Results to date indicate that an area in the vicinity had been cleared of bush and that burning off was in progress.

(NGF Weekly Intelligence Summary No 134)

ENEMY (ii) SEA :-

There are indications that the enemy is sending reinforcements and supplies to RABAU on a considerable scale.

A convoy apparently heading for RABAU was reported one hundred miles NNW of MUSSAU ISLAND at 1240 hrs 7 Aug. It consisted of six merchant vessels totalling approximately 22,000 tons and was accompanied by a covering force of two heavy and three light cruisers.

On 8 Aug at 0905 hrs another convoy was sighted further east (212 miles NNE of MUSSAU ISLAND). Visual sightings gave the composition as three merchant vessels (totalling 14,000 tons) and three escort vessels. Photographs showed the total tonnage of the merchant vessels to have been 17,500 tons. The vessels were on a southerly course.

On destroyer and one merchant vessel of approximately 5,000 tons were twice sighted on the morning of 7 Aug. The second sighting, which was made some miles south of the first, was at a point forty miles NE of TABAR ISLAND.

A six ship convoy was sighted 15 miles south of MUSSAU ISLAND at 1220K/11. This convoy was attacked by our aircraft and one transport was sunk.

This convoy apparently turned west and at 0750K/12 an aircraft in flight sighted in position 0122S 14825E (approx 90 miles west of MUSSAU ISLAND) a convoy reported as two destroyers, two 7,000/10,300 ton transports, two 7,000/8,500 ton transports and one 1,500/2,500 ton transport.

At 0959K/12 our aircraft attacked a 7,000/8,500 ton transport approximately 90 miles NNE of LORENGAU with nil results.

Barge and Submarine Supply

There is evidence that the supply of LAE - SALAMAU by barge and submarine continues.

Development of barge hide-outs and work on the coastal road in the CAPE CUNNINGHAM and CAPE BEECHY areas is in progress.

It is unlikely that the barge route along the south coast of NEW BRITAIN is in general use at this period of the year. It is quite feasible that the enemy contemplates use of this route during the NW season from Nov to Feb

OWN (iii) AIR :-

BOGADJIN

On 12 Aug bridges over the KOFEBI RIVER and nearby camps were attacked by our aircraft. Hits were obtained on the road.

ENEMY (iii) AIR :-

One enemy aircraft was over the MILNE BAY area at 1100K/11.

At 0856K/12 one unidentified aircraft was over MT HAGEN.

PART II

1. ENEMY OOB - LAND

SALAMAU

Confirmation of the presence of elements 20 DIV has been obtained. A preliminary examination of available information reveals that between 2 and 6 Jul portion of 1 Bn 80 Inf Regt arrived from LAE. Although not decisive, the presence of B echelon and some regimental troops suggest that 1 Battalion was complete and that the remainder of the regiment may have been en route at that time.

In anticipation of its arrival, enemy strength estimate at SALAMAU has been increased by 1,000.

One company of 1 Bn 80 Inf Regt was sent to BOBDUBI on 5 Jul and later portion left to join 3 Bn 102 Inf Regt retreating from NASSAU BAY. These are considered to represent the force now holding ROOSEVELT RIDGE.

It is believed that 29 Fd Pom Coy has moved from LAE to SALAMAU; also that 3 Bn 14 Fd Arty is now in the same area. Strength estimates have been adjusted accordingly.

KOMIATUM

In the light of the above, it is thought unlikely that three coys of 80 Inf Regt, 20 DIV, were committed at KOMIATUM on the date suggested last week. On the other hand, portion of 80 Inf Regt may be expected to appear in this area. It is considered that the enemy strength for the time being remains around 1,600.

BOBDUBI

It is estimated that enemy strength does not exceed 300. The responsibility for a perimeter extending from here northwards across the FRANCISCO RIVER to MALOLO probably rests with 115 Inf Regt, reinforced from 1 Bn 80 Inf Regt.

LAE

Additional small miscellaneous units are now known to be in the LAE area, but no further information has been obtained regarding either a HQ or field troops. The figure of 2,500 placed at LAE to meet tactical requirements therefore remains unaltered.

COASTAL AREA

HQ COANE FORCE is now at 738925.

MT TAMBU AREA

The enemy is still in occupation of the pill boxes at 698906.

Considerable enemy activity is reported on the southern slopes of the spur at 701911.

A standing patrol has been established at 719908.

BOBDUBI AREA

On 9 Aug standing patrols were established at 704984 and 702994. On the morning of 10 Aug the latter of these patrols established an ambush at 701993 from which it attacked a party of Japanese, killing three.

Japanese positions are located at 702968 and 703964.

On the afternoon 10 Aug our artillery effectively engaged pill boxes in the COCONUTS area.

ASINI

At 1220K/11 a six ship convoy was sighted fifteen miles south of MUSSAU Island, course 120 degrees, by an aircraft in flight. This convoy was bombed and preliminary reports indicate that one 1,000/1,500 ton transport was sunk.

OWN (111) AIR :-

On 10 Aug 12 B25s and six A20s attacked barges in the MAPE RIVER mouth and LABU area. One barge was destroyed. A square sterned boat off STATION POINT and machine gun positions in BORGAN BAY were attacked.

On 11 Aug six A20s searched for barges from HOPOI to LANGEAK BAY. No barges were located, but one aircraft strafed a red roofed building at FINSCHHAFEN.

On 10 Aug a B24 bombed and strafed a lugger in KAMBOTOROSCH Harbour, also a 500/1,000 and a 1,500/2,000 ton transport one mile west of LAMASSA Island (fifteen miles NW of CAPE ST GEORGE).

A light enemy cruiser was bombed 20 miles west of NEW HANOVER with nil results.

COASTAL AREA

The HQ of an Aust Inf Bde and one bn have landed at NASSAU BAY and are dispersed in this area.

At 1800K/10 one of the bns of this Bde was dispersed in the TAMBU BAY area with one coy of another bn along the track from 727934 to 725925.

Two US Bns are regrouping in this area. One US coy is in position at 736947.

NAMLING AREA

An enemy position on PRICES KNOLL was engaged by our mortars on the morning of 9 Aug. A patrol from an Aust coy engaged this position and caused some casualties.

On 9 Aug thirty B25s took off to carry out a search for barges along the RAI coast, and from HOPOI - WALD BAY to BORDEN BAY. A total of six barges were located and attacked near NATAMO and on the beach 40 miles SE of SAIDOR. Two bridges over the KOFEBI River, nearby camps and four to six AA machine gun positions at BORDEN BAY were also attacked. Reports indicate that the bridges were damaged and several huts were destroyed or set on fire in the camp areas. One machine gun position was destroyed.

On 10 Aug twenty-five B24s attacked ASINI and KELA villages and O'DEA's house on the SALAMAUA ISTHMUS. O'DEA's and several huts and buildings at ASINI and KELA villages were destroyed.

On 9 Aug one B24 on recce bombed the TERRACE area at LAE.

On 10 Aug a B25 on recce bombed and strafed a barge at SIASSI Is.

ENEMY (iii) AIR :-

Sixteen enemy aircraft flew over 306482 (MARKHAM RIVER area) on 9 Aug.

On 10 Aug one unidentified aircraft passed over BENA BENA, GAROKA and MATAHAUSA.

An enemy gun in the vicinity of KELA fired twenty five rounds into the area 756924 (south end TAMBUBAY) on 8 Aug.

At 1130K/8 ten shells landed in area 702946. No damage was sustained.

Patrolling was continued in the BOBDJBI area while, on night 7/8 Aug, our artillery harassed targets on KOMIATUM RIDGE and, on night 8/9 Aug, harassed targets in the vicinity of KOMIATUM RIDGE, MT TAMBUBAY and GOODVIEW JUNC.

SALAMAUA

It appears from photographs that the beach track from LABU to SALAMAUA is in use again.

OWN (III) AIR :-

On 9 Aug, forty heavy bombers bombed NUK NUK and KELA Villages and a dump area just east of KENNEDY'S CROSSING. Results were largely unobserved but three fires were seen after the attack.

During the afternoon of 9 Aug, two squadrons of B25s carried out a large sweep from FINSCHHAFEN to BOGADJIM. Bridges over the KOFEBI RIVER and a nearby camp were bombed. Huts were destroyed.

On 9 Aug one B25 on weather recce bombed and strafed the south shore of SAMOA Harbour and the bridge over the FRANCISCO RIVER at SALAMAUA.

On 9 Aug a B24 was intercepted by nine enemy fighters two miles east of TALASEA. One enemy fighter was destroyed and three were damaged. Our aircraft was slightly damaged.

ENEMY (III) AIR :-

A twin-engined enemy bomber passed over MT HAGEN on 9 Aug, flying south.

Our artillery, on night 6/7 Aug, destroyed portion of the footbridge across the mouth of the FRANCISCO RIVER and, on 7 Aug, fires were started in the vicinity of the airfield.

Six large calibre enemy shells, believed 155 mm, landed at 755925 and 762923 on 6 Aug. Several others fell in the sea.

Though the instrument mechanics in this formation are not good, a good deal of time has been spent by them now on treatment of fungus infected instruments; their replacement would not be acceptable unless fully skilled men of undoubted capacity could be found to take their place. Binoculars and telescopes sighting can be dealt with fairly quickly by them now; it would be a long time before they would however be capable of quick stripping of say dial-sights.
3. An increase of a third instrument mechanic in 2nd Ech Workshops is advisable, but to cover this increase men should first be carefully selected, trained, and given at least three (3) months experience on instruments in Australian L of C Workshops before being allowed into the field.
4. Comments on each man working on instruments (inclusive of 109 Aust Ede Workshop) are att.
5. It appears preferable to handle the large number of insts affected by returning most of them to Australia for repair, keeping a certain number coming fwd each week for replacement purposes. OPERATIONS

OWN & ENEMY (i) LAND :-

Adv HQ 3 Aust Div opened at HOUSE MANGO 668807 at 2400K/6.

COASTAL AREA

The enemy were observed constructing defences at 744955 on 6 Aug and were engaged by our artillery. Casualties sustained by the enemy are believed to be heavy.

Our artillery and mortars also fired on Japanese positions on ROOSEVELT RIDGE.

BOBDUBI AREA

The enemy position at 696969 (ref Intelligence Summary No 204), estimated to have held 200, contained a quantity of equipment, ammunition and documents.

Patrolling still continues from OLD VICKERS position towards the COCONUTS area. A standing patrol is now located at 701971. The enemy are still in position on the spur at 699965.

The total Japanese casualties suffered in the OLD VICKERS posn area since 1 Aug are reported to be 62.

SALAMAUA

It is known that elements of a bn (probably 3 Bn) 80 Inf Regt 20 DIV arrived at SALAMAUA between 2 and 6 Jul. The Bn Comdr Capt KANNO and one company moved to BOBDUBI. Portion of the bn went to join 3 Bn 102 Inf Regt retreating from NASSAU BAY and is considered part of the force now on ROOSEVELT RIDGE.

ENEMY (ii) SEA :-

At 1515K/7 a submarine, with deck cargo, was sighted at 0530S 15215E (off CAPE ORFORD) proceeding south.

OWN (iii) AIR :-

On 7 Aug twenty five B24s attacked SALAMAUA - LOGUI No 1, KELA town area, McDONALD's JUNCTION and personnel and dump areas on the bank of the FRANCISCO River were bombed. A large storehouse and two other buildings were destroyed at KELA; bombs fell on McDONALD's JUNCTION and hits were claimed on AA positions. A fire was started at LOGUI and a large, possibly fuel, fire started on the FRANCISCO River bank.

On 7 Aug nine B25s attacked two barges at LAGUNEN POINT (10 miles SW of CAPE GLOUCESTER).

An unknown number of enemy fighters intercepted, and one was shot down without loss to our aircraft. One B25 on weather reconnaissance strafed four barges in the MAPE RIVER.

OWN & ENEMY (1) LAND :-

COASTAL AREA :

Increased artillery and patrol activity continues in all areas.

BOBDUBI AREA :

All enemy attempts to regain the OLD VICKERS position on 4 Aug were unsuccessful. Our troops are now occupying knoll 696969 where the Japanese had been constructing positions. Patrols of an Aust Bn operated from this position during 5 Aug to the east and in the COCONUTS area.

Troops report that the knoll at 696969 evacuated by the enemy was supplied by an L of C via centre COCONUTS and along north slopes of the feature.

A patrol in this area saw evidence of enemy casualties from our mortars and found eleven enemy rifles and a quantity of equipment.

SALAMAUVA AREA :

The section of the footbridge across the mouth of the FRANCISCO RIVER destroyed on 1 Aug was repaired on the night of 4/5 Aug.

ENEMY (11) SEA :-

At 1535K/6 a large submarine with deck cargo was sighted off the south coast of NEW BRITAIN, course south.

OWN (111) AIR :-

At 1000 hrs 5 Aug one B24 bombed and strafed a 500/1000 ton cargo vessel approximately 100 miles WNW of KAVIENG.

SUMMARY OF ENEMY MOVEMENTS

AND

SIGNIFICANT CHANGES OF STRENGTH

LAND

With the enemy in strongly defended positions, which have been well chosen to make best use of natural features, progress by our troops has been negligible during the week. This, despite increased use of artillery and attention by our bombers, shows that the Japanese has lost none of his tenacity or ingenuity in the construction of earth and log defences.

Enemy positions on MOUNT TAMBU are particularly strong and are occupied by at least two companies, thought to be at full strength, with more than twenty machine guns. Pillboxes and weapon pits, joined by crawl trenches, have been constructed and approaches are covered by well concealed MMGs and by mobile IMGs and rifles on the flank. On the steep slopes of the ridges which they occupy the enemy have adopted the novel procedure of creating a false crest by piling up cut branches, foliage and earth.

Use of artillery on a scale not previously possible in NEW GUINEA has been a feature of operations in this sector as well as in the MOUNT TAMBU area. On 31 Jul alone more than 1,500 rounds were fired by our guns in the coastal sector in supporting, harassing and counter-battery fire. Enemy guns to the north of DOT INLET, the footbridge over the mouth of the FRANCISCO, the SALAMAU strip and positions on the ISTHMUS were among targets successfully engaged.

Meanwhile the Japanese have made more use of artillery, shelling our troops and gun positions. A direct hit was scored on one of our guns on the morning of 30 Jul and five of the crew were killed.

Our repeated efforts to dislodge the enemy from the strongly defended OLD VICKERS position at last met with success on the afternoon of 28 Jul after a company attack. The position was found to consist of a network of pillboxes, foxholes and trenches with three feet thick cover overhead. Equipment captured included four MGs, many rifles and a 70 mm gun, while twenty Japanese were killed.

There had been signs that the enemy had withdrawn some of his troops north towards the COCONUTS, and all attacks on this position proved unsuccessful.

The development of WEWAK and MADANG as main bases in NE NEW GUINEA continues. Present indications suggest that they are incorporated in the planning for future large scale operations. It is possible therefore that, to facilitate control, 18 Army HQ or an equivalent formation may soon be located in NEW GUINEA.

Reports indicate that one object of the Japanese activity inland between MADANG and LAE has been to prevent our patrols reaching the coast and gaining information concerning this barge traffic. It is important to determine how much of this traffic is required for supplies and how much therefore is

available for the carrying of reinforcements. It is believed that the enemy garrison at LAE and SALAMAU is approximately 3,000. This garrison would require for its maintenance between a quarter and half a ton per man per month, i.e., between 3,000 and 6,000 tons. Probably 600 tons per month is still brought in by submarine, leaving a considerable tonnage to be carried by barge. Most of the barges sighted are undoubtedly required for the transport of this tonnage, but it must be assumed that there is space for carrying several hundred troops per week into LAE. Our light surface craft and aircraft are making numerous attacks on the enemy barges with some success.

The overland route from MADANG to LAE has also been used for reinforcing the HUON GULF area. A document recently captured indicates that, in May, a battalion of the 21 Regt moved by this route, taking some 30 days for the journey.

SEA

The first photographic reconnaissance of RABUL Harbour since 25 Jun was made on 2 Aug. Comparison of sightings is given below :-

Convoys of small vessels and sea-going barges have been noted moving to the SOLOMONS area and the coasters and sea-trucks photographed at RABUL are possibly engaged in this work.

SOLOMONS

No further naval engagement has taken place between Allied and enemy units in the SOLOMONS. However, Allied aircraft have attacked with success, a force of four destroyers and a seaplane tender which was observed off CAPE FRIENDSHIP on 22 Jul. The seaplane tender was sunk and a destroyer hit. At approximately the same time, a cruiser or destroyer leader and two destroyers were sighted and attacked in the vicinity of OEMA ISLAND. Results were unobserved.

The enemy has continued to use destroyers extensively to bring supplies and reinforcements to his forces at MUNDA. Daily sightings have been made of vessels plying between BUIN FAISI and KOLOMBANGARA (from whence supplies are taken to the MUNDA area by barge) whilst information has been received which indicates that some supplies and reinforcements have been shipped direct from RABUL to KOLOMBANGARA and NEW GEORGIA.

The enemy has also been more active in the REKATA BAY area. Two vessels (alternatively reported as three probably destroyers) were reported to have visited this bay during the night of 26 Jul whilst vessels have been observed in BART SOUND (opposite REKATA BAY).

The greatest number of units in the BUIN FAISI area during the week was noted on 26 Jul. when photographs revealed the following :-

- 2 large ships off MOILA POINT
- 5 cargo vessels 20 small vessels KAHILI - ERVENTA ISLAND area
- 1 cargo vessel several barges off PUPUKUNA POINT
- 19 boats (40 feet long) heading towards BALLALE.

AIR

SOUPAC estimates that 350 Japanese aircraft have been destroyed in the SOLOMONS during Jul.

GENERAL

It is becoming increasingly evident that the enemy has not available here the resources in air and shipping, and possibly in certain vital supplies to stage an offensive in this area; but it is equally evident that he is becoming more and more determined to resist our advance both in the SOLOMONS and NEW GUINEA.

SICILY

Two interesting points arise from a report received on the German Order of Battle in SICILY.

At the commencement of operations, they had two Divisions with about 200 tanks. However, what is most interesting, from a point of view of morale, is that these divisions were the 15 Panzer Division and the "Hermann Goering" Division, both of which had been seriously mauled in TUNISIA. War Officer considers their revival was mainly for reasons of prestige.

COASTAL AREA :

On 4 Aug a US patrol raided the enemy position at 740954 killing seven Japanese, destroying two HMGs and capturing a third.

MT TAMBU AREA :

The enemy are reported to be constructing pillboxes and defences in the area of 726927.

GOODVIEW JUNG AREA :

On the morning of 4 Aug portion of one of our bns commenced an attack just south of GOODVIEW JUNG. Small gains were made. HQ of a company were at 699905, one platoon at 699907 with two platoons endeavouring to link up with this platoon. The enemy were in position on the southern slopes of the knoll at 699906. At 1800K/4 the enemy counter-attacked the platoon at 699907, forcing it to withdraw. Our three platoons are now in position at 692909.

BOEDUBI AREA :

During 4 Aug the enemy made further determined efforts to regain the OLD VICKERS position. All attacks were repulsed with heavy losses to the enemy.

As a result of our attack, the enemy was driven from his position on the knoll at 696969. Our troops are now in occupation and are mopping up the remnants of the enemy force in this area.

On the morning of 4 Aug one of our platoons reached a position between NORTH and CENTRE COCONUTS but were forced to withdraw owing to MG and mortar fire.

Other patrols are active in this area.

At 1630K/4 one of our companies attacked and succeeded in driving the enemy from his position along the kunai spur from 698964 to 698967, killing twenty.

OWN (111) AIR :-

Attacks on Barges 5 Aug

Eleven B25s bombed and strafed suspected barge hideouts and islands in the MADANG area. Of seven barges seen, two were destroyed. Concentrated AA fire was encountered and one B25 was lost.

Nine B25s took off to attack barges in the BOGADJIM area. No barges were sighted but BOGADJIM Village, the bridge over the NURU River and a jetty at BALAMA were attacked. A direct hit was scored on the jetty.

Twelve B25s attacked fifteen to twenty barges and three picket boats in BOSTREM Bay and along the west coast of ADMOSIN Island (vicinity of ALEXISHAFEN). A small boat in an inlet one mile east of AMRON Inlet was set on fire.

On 4 Aug one Catalina bombed GASHATA.

On 5 Aug aircraft on recce bombed FINSCHHAFEN, destroying a building, and buildings on KARRA-MATEA Island (not shown on aeronautical map), one of the VITU Islands.

ENEMY (111) AIR :-

At 1535K/4 twelve Japanese aircraft patrolled LAE and south to the BUANG River.

PART II

1. ENEMY OOB - LAND

LAE - SALAMAU

Further evidence of the presence of "Regt Reinforcement TAIS" in SALAMAU area is provided by a native statement that a party of forty Japanese who reached SALAMAU during the night 25/26 Jul were "66 Regt Reinforcements", also references to the "Reinforced 115 Infantry", and the fact that 115 Inf Regt has apparently been strengthened.

During Jan 43, 3 Bn 21 Inf Regt moved from MADANG via the RAMU and MARKHAM Valleys to LAE area, where it was engaged on road construction during Feb. It is now known that in May it was carrying supplies in KOMLATUM area, and is considered to be still under command 51 DIV.

Since the establishment of 51 DIV in SALAMAU it has been

evident that LAE was lacking in both a HQ and field troops. The presence of two or three companies of 20 DIV at KOMIATUM on 4 Jul suggests that the gap may have been filled by 20 DIV. In this regard, a mention of anticipated relief for 51 DIV in Aug 43 possibly has significance.

The estimate of enemy strengths and locations for LAE - SALAMAU area is dealt with in detail in Appendix "A".

From present enemy barge activity, it is known that troop movement into the area continues.

HANSA BAY

It has not been possible to determine the number of troops possibly disembarked from the convoy on 25 Jul. The estimated tonnage could have transported a regiment. This would offset the possible movement of a regiment of 20 DIV out of the area, leaving strength unchanged.

4. ORGANIZATION

115 Inf Regt

Further details regarding this formation make it apparent that identifications from all three bns may be encountered. The assumption that 115 Inf Regt survivors from the BISMARCK SEA action were allocated to 102 Inf Regt appears to be correct.

Latest information is that 115 Inf Regt at BOBDUBI Ridge was under comd of Col MATSUI, while 9 Coy was commanded by Lieut OGAWA. Both of these officers are from 102 Inf Regt.

There has been a reference to "the reinforced 115 Inf". This appears to be borne out by the fact that it was apparently 831 strong at the end of Jun, whereas estimated casualties would have reduced the original 800 to 435 at that time. It is possible that the addition may be explained by the balance of the 1,200 survivors, but it is hardly probable that these would be first line troops. The more likely inference would be the inclusion of 115 Regt Reinft TAI.

PART I

OPERATIONS

OWN & ENEMY (i) LAND :-

BOBDUBI AREA :

An Aust patrol moving towards the COCONUTS discovered a newly constructed but unoccupied position 300 yards from the OLD VICKERS position.

After making an unsuccessful attack on the OLD VICKERS position at 2115K/3 the enemy moved into positions at 698967. Our counter attack at 0615K/4 was also unsuccessful. The enemy were found to be dug in also at 696969.

Other operations have been mainly confined to increased artillery activity over the whole area.

MT TAMBU AREA :

The enemy is engaged in building defensive positions from GOODVIEW JUNCTION to 711917 and on the southern FDLs of MT TAMBU area.

SEPIK AREA :

The patrol of 83 which occupied YESCHAN on 27 Jul have transport canoes and are well armed with rifles and MGs. They are constructing air raid shelters.

ENEMY (ii) SEA :-

At 1432K/4 a submarine carrying deck cargo was sighted at 0530S 15215E (off the south east coast of NEW BRITAIN), course south.

OWN (iii) AIR :-

On 4 Aug nine B25s carried out a search for barges between LANGEMAK Bay - BORGEN Bay and Cape BUSHING. No serviceable barges were located but a row of drums on the east bank of the ITNI River was bombed.

At 2255K/2 a Catalina bombed a destroyer approx 60 miles SE of GASMATA. Hits were scored. A second vessel, sighted at the same time, escaped.

On early morning of 4 Aug one Catalina bombed one of two unidentified vessels approx 20 miles west of CAPE GLOUCESTER. Two large explosions were observed after the attack.

On 4 Aug one B24 bombed CAPE GLOUCESTER. Four fires and one explosion were observed west of the airfield.

ENEMY (iii) AIR :-

One aircraft made a reconnaissance of the BENA BENA - GAROKA area.

PART V

SECURITY

FIELD SECURITY IN OPERATIONS

For the period ending 23 Mar 43, 2,100 prisoners, both German and Italians, were searched and identified for intelligence purposes by FS personnel. The officers were first separated from the men and then the senior NCOs were requested to reform the rank into their various units. By convincing the prisoners that this course was necessary in the ordinary sequence in passing them through, they gave every assistance. The proceedings were conducted in drill formation, and correct orders for marching and counting were insisted upon. Each separate unit fell in on its own marker in order before counting. The result was complete identification being ensured for the Intelligence Officer's information. A further precaution to avoid mistakes was to request the senior enemy NCOs to write down the numbers with the correct name, number, etc of units concerned, plus branch of service.

In this way the prisoners, particularly the GERMANS, gave all necessary information as a matter of routine without their suspicions being aroused as to the subsequent intelligence value of their co-operation.

(Information received to 0900 hrs 4 Aug 43)

OPERATIONS

OWN & ENEMY (1) LAND :-

COASTAL AREA :

At 0630K/2 one of our US bns, supported by artillery, made a further attack on the western end of ROOSEVELT RIDGE, destroyed some MG positions and withdrew to original positions.

The enemy occupies a position at 730947.

On 2 Aug our artillery continued its activity on targets on MT TAMBU, and neutralized enemy AA guns at the SW end of the ISTHMUS during our air attack on SALAMAU.

On 3 Aug an enemy gun in the vicinity of NUK NUK was observed firing towards TAMBU BAY.

One coy of an Aust inf bn has landed at NASSAU BAY.

BOBDUBI AREA :

A party of Japs at 698967 was engaged with two inch mortar fire on the afternoon of 2 Aug and twenty five were killed. Our casualties were 2 wounded.

One of our coys has reached a point just north of OLD VICKERS position.

Our patrols on the north and south banks of the FRANCISCO RIVER at 702976 and 703980 were fired on.

Patrolling continues in other areas.

BENA BENA AREA :

It is now estimated that there are thirty Japs at SNOOKS HOUSE while, at 1200K/2, a further ninety enemy moved down the RAMU RIVER to join them.

ENEMY (11) SEA :-

A submarine was sighted off the SE coast of NEW BRITAIN at 1522K/2 headed south. Another was seen going north at 0915K/3.

Ref Intelligence Summary No 200, the sighting at RABAU is cancelled. Photo interpretation of the Sightings there on 2 Aug reveals :-

2 heavy cruisers
1 light cruiser
3 destroyers
6 light craft
13 merchant vessels
totalling 62,00 tons
and 1 merchant vessel of
2,500 tons at RAPOPO.

Thirty two barges or harbour craft were sighted at HANSA BAY on 3 Aug.

OWN (111) AIR :-

On 2 Aug 6 A20s and five Beaufighters, with eighteen Kittyhawks, attacked GASMATA area and MONTAGU Harbour, RANO Plantation and CAPE DAMPIER, and a barge in ATU BAY. One barge was destroyed and the jetty was hit in MONTAGU Harbour while barges were damaged at CAPE DAMPIER and ATU BAY.

Further information of the attack by our medium bombers on barges between LAE and FINSCHHAFEN reveals that thirteen barges and one picket boat were destroyed or probably destroyed. Two of our bombers collided and one crashed while one enemy fighter was shot down.

Preliminary reports on a search made by eighteen B25s on 3 Aug indicate that twenty-eight barges and one launch were destroyed in the MAPE River, MASAWENG River, MARIEN Harbour, REIN BAY, BORGEN BAY and at CAPE BUSCHING.

On 3 Aug nine B25s bombed buildings on SALAMAUA ISTHMUS.

On 3 Aug twenty three heavy bombers attacked enemy road and bridge constructions and nearby camps in the DAUMOINA area. Bombing is reported accurate and two buildings were destroyed. Three enemy fighters intercepted, two fighters being destroyed and one Bl7 crashed in the sea.

On 3 Aug a small village in MARIEN Harbour was bombed by an aircraft on recon.

Reports from ground troops confirm the success of our air attack on LAE Harbour and installations (Ref Summary No 200).

ENEMY (111) AIR :-

At 1135K/2 one enemy DINAH was over TIAORA (ref MARKHAM Strat LQ 4082), flying south.

At 1057K/3 an enemy aircraft was over GAROKA.

(Information received to 0900 hrs 3 Aug 43)

OPERATIONS

OWN & ENEMY (1) LAND :-

COASTAL AREA :

With reference to the attack on the western end of ROOSEVELT RIDGE on 31 Jul, it is now reported that this attack was made by two coys which, at 1800 hrs, returned to their position at 742944. Six Japs were killed.

Our artillery increased its activity on 1 Aug on targets at DOT INLET, LOKANU and ridges to the north of ROOSEVELT RIDGE. Twenty yards of the footbridge at the mouth of the FRANCISCO RIVER were destroyed. A direct hit was scored on a Jap aircraft on SALAMAUJA airfield.

KOMIATUM AND MT TAMBU AREA :

A patrol discovered a track branching SW from MULE track at 702915. Defensive positions had been cleared and booby traps laid along the track.

Enemy guns shelled EUGARCANE RIDGE area three times on 1 Aug.

On 1 Aug the mountain bty scored direct hits on Jap pill boxes on MT TAMBU.

One of our platoons occupied positions vacated by the enemy at 724926. The enemy are in position at 723921.

Further patrolling continues at GOODVIEW JUNC.

BOBDUBI AREA :

On the morning 1 Aug two of our secs were attacked in the vicinity of 705962 and withdrew. Two pla are now in position at 704958. At 1530 hrs 1 Aug seven of a party of 20 Japs ambushed on KOMIATUM track were killed. One of our coys is now occupying a position near the junction of GRIFFS and bench cut tracks. An enemy attack on OLD VICKERS position was repulsed on morning 1 Aug and again on the morning 2 Aug.

BENA BENA AREA :

Our detachment at KATAHAUSA was again fired on by hostile natives on 31 Jul.

On 1 Aug a Jap armed patrol visited WOKANTINO (approx 5 miles NE of KAINANTU) and a party of 20 Japs moved towards SNOOKS HOUSE (approx 7 miles NE by E of KAINANTU).

ENEMY (11) SEA :-

At 1030K/2 aircraft in flight reported 6 to 8 cruisers or destroyers manoeuvring in ST GEORGE CHANNEL and one probable battleship and one probable aircraft carrier in the vicinity of RABAU.

A submarine was sighted off CAPE ORFORD at 1522K/2, course south.

OWN (iii) AIR :-

Nine A20s bombed and strafed LOKANU No 1 and BUIAMBUI and one barge SE of LAE. Several huts were destroyed at LOKANU; the barge was damaged.

Twenty five of our heavy bombers bombed NUK NUK and LOGUI villages in the SALAMAU area. Several buildings at NUK NUK were destroyed, and many small fires were started.

Eleven B24s bombed VOCO PT and the harbour area at LAE. There was one large explosion and many fires were started.

Our medium bombers attacked barges between LAE and FINSCHHAFEN. Seven barges and one picket boat were destroyed.

Four B17s bombed dump areas at HANSA BAY.

Sixteen P38s intercepted fourteen enemy fighters over SAIDOR area. Preliminary reports indicate eleven fighters destroyed and one probably destroyed. One Allied aircraft crashed on landing.

An aircraft on recce bombed FINSCHHAFEN airfield.

OPERATIONS

OWN & ENEMY (1) LAND :-

COASTAL AREA :

On the morning of 31 Jul a US coy moved through and attacked ROOSEVELT RIDGE from the WEST. The result of this attack is not yet reported.

MT TAMBU AREA :

It is estimated that 20 Japs were killed during the attack on MT TAMBU on 30 Jul. This does not include the casualties caused by our arty. Our casualties were 8 killed and 35 wounded.

GOODVIEW JUNG :

Strong enemy positions are reported to extend along the spur 707918 to GOODVIEW JUNG and along the ridge from 705914 to 707914.

The Jap mountain gun at 706936 is believed to have been destroyed on 31 Jul.

Patrolling by our troops is continuing in this area and also in the NAMLING-ORODUBI area.

BOEDUBI AREA :

An enemy attack on 31 Jul caused an Aust inf coy to withdraw to a position 150 yards south of SOUTH COCONUTS (ref Intelligence Summary 198).

An Aust pl ambushed a party of 40 Japs at 708959 at 1645K/1 killing 8.

At 1630K/1 our platoon at 704958 was attacked. No details are reported.

WATUT AREA :

One Aust inf section and two PIB sections are now at PESEN (LR 0345) while another PIB section is on the WAFFAR RIVER, NW of PESEN.

SALAMAUA AREA :

On 31 Jul 210 Japs moved south and 185 moved north along the SALAMAUA - KOMIATUM track.

RAMU AREA :

One of our patrols was fired on by hostile natives on 30 Jul at MATAHAUSA (ref map MADANG Strat WO 5848).

A section of an Independent Coy arrived at BENA BENA from MATAHAUSA on 31 Jul.

Hostile natives also destroyed a patrol base building and a store in the SIRINIBU area (WH 4639).

ENEMY (11) SEA :-

A submarine was sighted at 2320K/31 twenty miles ESE of GASMATA, course west.

Another submarine was sighted 70 miles SW of CAPE ST GEORGE course south, at 1540K/1.

At 0641K/1 nine barges were sighted in LAE Harbour.

OWN (111) AIR :-

On 31 Jul seven A20s attacked seven barges at CAPE GLOUCESTER. Five were destroyed.

These aircraft also bombed and strafed ANGALA and ULAMAINGA villages (about 4 miles WSW of CAPE GLOUCESTER).

On 1 Aug GASMATA IS government station was bombed.

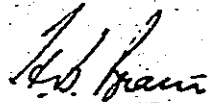

(Information received to 0900 hrs. 1 Aug 43)

HQ 5 Aust Div opened MURRAY BARRACKS at 1300K/31.

OPERATIONS

OWN & ENEMY (1) LAND :-

COASTAL AREA :

During the night 30/31 Jul a US coy moved from NASSAU BAY to TAMBU BAY.

At 0630K/31 US arty neutralized a Japanese mountain gun at 703940. Our arty registered three heavy AA guns reported at 745012; and also on heavy AA guns at 753018. Between 1500 and 1700 hrs a party of Japanese crossing the footbridge at the mouth of the FRANCISCO RIVER was engaged and scattered.

BOEDUBI AREA :-

During 30 Jul, an Aust Inf coy cut the main KOMIATUM track where it crosses OSBORNE CREEK. Another coy occupied positions on BENGH cut track up to its junction with BOEDUBI-SALAMAUA track. At 1430 hrs a third coy attacked COCONUTS from OLD VICKERS position but, owing to heavy opposition in SOUTH COCONUTS, were unable to make any further progress along the narrow track on the razor-back. The coy was reported to be in vacated Japanese positions within twenty yards of the enemy posts.

Enemy attacks from SOUTH COCONUTS at 0200 and 0430K/30 caused a slight withdrawal of the forward troops of this coy.

It is estimated that 60 Japs hold the SOUTH COCONUTS.

On 30 Jul Jap guns were reported to have fired from the vicinity of SCOUT HILL, Square 7296.

Confirmation has been received that part of 115 Inf Regt is in this area.

KOMIATUM AREA :

The enemy strength in position at 693935 is reported to be 40/50.

On 29 Jul a mountain gun fired 6 rounds into our positions at AMBUSH KNOLL and a further 26 on 30 Jul.

GOODVIEW JUNG AREA :

Active patrolling by our troops continues in this area. An Aust patrol now holds an unoccupied enemy position at 698907.

NAMLING AREA :

Our arty registered targets on SUGARCANE RIDGE.

MISSIM AREA :

At 1230 hrs an Aust patrol engaged a party of seven Japs at 552212.

SALAMAUA AREA :

During 30 Jul 181 Japanese were observed moving north across the footbridge at the mouth of the FRANCISCO RIVER.

BENA BENA AREA :

A sec of an Aust Indep Coy has established a patrol base at KUMAKA (LQ 2794).

ENEMY (ii) SEA :-

Between HANISCH HARBOUR and LANGEMAK BAY a total of 47 barges was sighted on 30 Jul.

Twelve barges were in LAE HARBOUR at 1630 hrs 29 Jul.

At 1812 hrs 30 Jul a large submarine with deck cargo was sighted in position 0530S 15215E (off south coast of NEW BRITAIN) on a southerly course.

At 1040K/31 three unidentified ships were sighted 23 miles SW of CAPE ST GEORGE, course North.

OWN (iii) AIR :-

On 30 Jul 6 B24s bombed MACDONALD's JUNC area and the SALAMAUA ISTHMUS.

On 30 Jul 6 B25s and 13 A20s attacked 22 to 24 barges at HANISCH HARBOUR, TIGEDU PT, MAPE R (LANGEMAK BAY) and CAPE DAMPIER. Six were destroyed.

RING RING Plantation (GASMATA) was bombed and two villages on ROOKE IS were strafed.

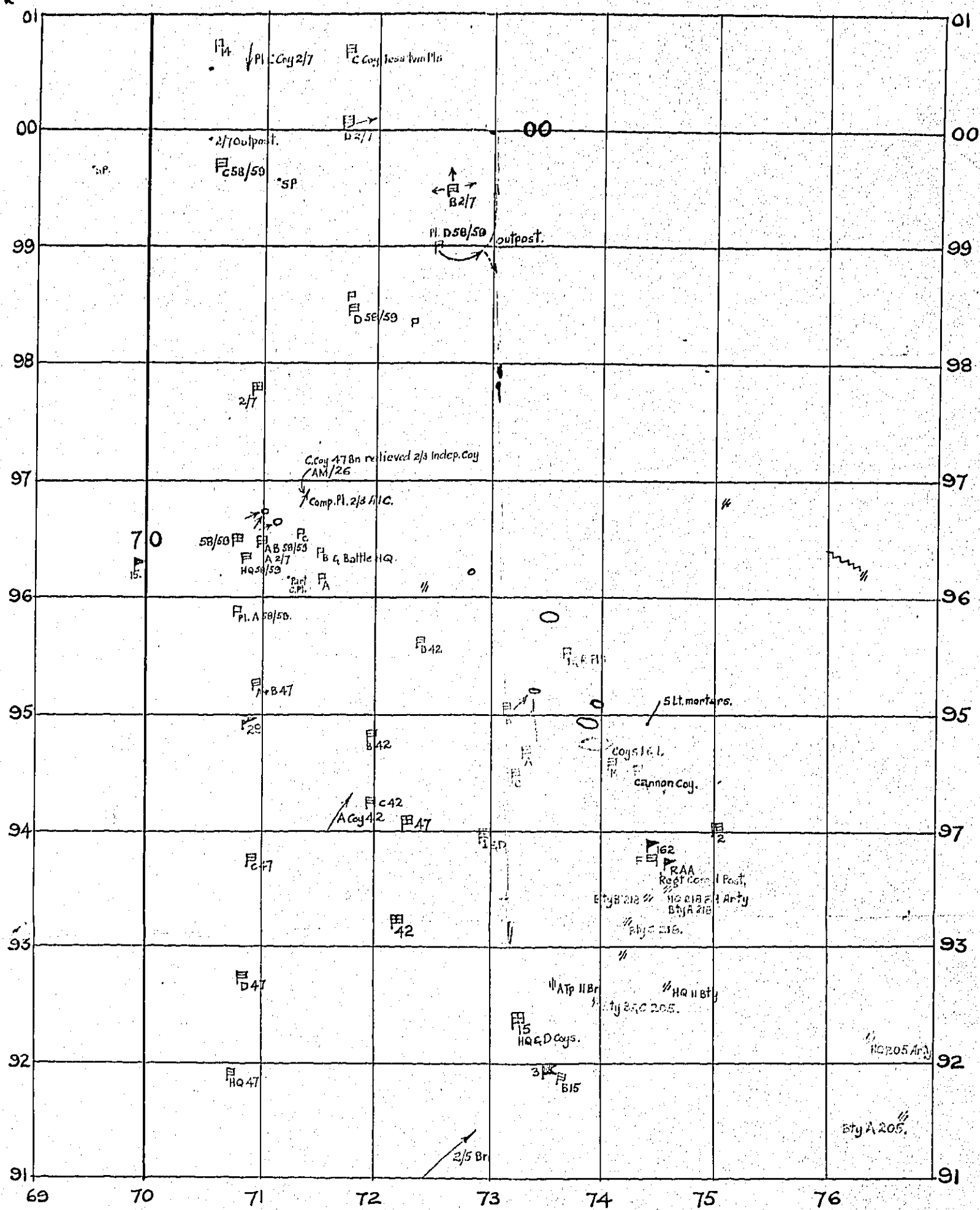

A and C Coys:

A and C Coys moved out from 731953 and northwards up the two tracks. The right coy encountered opposition at 730956 and left Coy at 726955. Officer in comd decided to bypass and moved both Coys. C Coy at 728957 is attacking enemy positions to the NORTH. A Coy 100 yds SE is preparing firm base for the night. Contact was made with B Coy 162 US Regt at 731953 and Bde Comd is enquiring about possibility of supplying our two coys through American L of C.
