MECHANICAL VEHICLES - CAMOUFLAGE ~~DISRUPTIVE~~ ~~DESCRIPTIVE~~ ~~PAINTING~~

1. Mechanical vehicles as follows will be painted in ^{disruptive} ~~descriptive~~ camouflage in accordance with designs held by CEHE 3 Aust Div.
 - (a) Vehicles not already camouflaged
(excluding vehicles bearing Geneva Cross)
 - (b) New vehicles
 - (c) Maintenance painting as it becomes due.
2. Motor Cycles will not be camouflaged.
3. Procedure in painting vehicles is outlined below:-
 - (a) Units will arrange through LADS for "master" vehicle of each type to be camouflaged, to be chalked in outline at 115 Aust Bde Workshops.
 - (b) All fittings such as tool boxes, spare wheel carriers (but NOT spare wheels) will be embraced in the descriptive scheme.
 - (c) Spare wheels, including spokes and hubs, will be painted in the darkest tone. Tyres will not be painted.
 - (d) Nuts screwing, disc wheel, of the divided type must remain red.
 - (e) One coat only will be applied, keeping colours within the chalked boundary line. Where the painting is by hand, all edges of pattern will be kept sharp. When application is by spray, diffused colour boundaries will be permitted.
 - (f) Care will be exercised to avoid uneven or double coating on canvas parts, because such coatings result in cracking and deterioration of canvas.
 - (g) If difficulty is experienced with adhesion of paint to canvas, soft soap mixed with paint, in proportion determined by test, may be of assistance.
 - (h) If paint applied by brush develops a sheen, it may be textured with fine grit in proportion of grit to paint 30% by volume.

PREVENTION AND CONTROL OF MALARIA

1. As an example of what practical measures can be undertaken for individual protection during operations in highly malarious areas, a copy of an administrative instruction issued by an Inf Bn which has had considerable service in NEW GUINEA is attached hereto as Appendix "A". This Inf Bn, which has been in NEW GUINEA for approx 11 months, had only a total of 112 cases of malaria for the period May to Nov, both inclusive. For a considerable portion of this period, the Unit was operating in areas where larval control etc had not been instituted.
2. The effect of malaria on units engaged in operations where the unit discipline was not of such a high standard as in the Inf Bn referred to above is clearly demonstrated in the cases following:

"A" Inf Bn which has been engaged in operations during the period 4-Sep to 3-Dec, in a similar highly malarious area, has had 650 casualties.

"B" Inf Bn which has been engaged for a similar period but in not so highly malarious an area, has had 250 casualties.
3. This instruction will be brought to the notice of all ranks, who will be suitably impressed with the necessity for rigid malaria discipline when in any malarious area.

ADMINISTRATION INSTRUCTION IS RE-PRINTED BELOW WITH RELEVANT
AMENDMENTS

1. Daily after evening meal or at 1900 hrs a muster parade of HQs Pls and personnel in staging camps will be held. As each name is called by the Pl Comd the soldier will step forward and receive and swallow one atechin tablet. Mosquito lotion will then be applied. Finally the Pl Comd will inspect the Pl and ensure that gaiters are worn, sleeves rolled down, and clothing is not torn. An attendance roll will be marked and be available for inspection by this HQ.
 2. The Pl Comd will then inspect the guards and sentries whose tour of duty will be between 1900 hrs and 0700 hrs the following day. Such personnel must be in possession of gloves and headnet and mosquito lotion.
 3. The Pl Comd will then inspect his men in the area who were absent on duty during the muster parade.
 4. The Pl Comd will then report compliance to the Coy Comd.
 5. All Coy Offrs and one BHQ officer will be present during these parades. Coy HQ will be inspected by Coy 2 i/c or Coy Comd, or attached to a Pl for parade.
 6. If for operational reasons it is impracticable, e.g., because of distances involved, for Pl Comds to inspect their troops, then the senior NCO present will act. But if for other than operational reasons, even in operations, if possible, another officer will take the Pl.
- THIS IS AN OFFICER'S RESPONSIBILITY,
- and will not be delegated to NCOs except as abovementioned.
7. The CO will apply for a Court Martial of any officer or det comd failing to obey these orders.
 8. Evidence given by patients to hospitals admitting non-compliance with these orders will be used against the soldier's Pl etc Comd.
 9. THIS MATTER IS MORE SERIOUS THAN JAP BULLETS.
 10. Coy Comd and BHQ offr will report personally to the CO either in person or by phone or signal, whichever is the most practicable, certifying that compliance has been made with these orders. Coy Comds under Comd other units will report thereto.
 11. On Sundays atechin will not be taken but in all other respects compliance will be made with these orders.
 12. At 2200 hrs daily Pl duty officer will notify all Coys and Staging Camps that it is time to re-apply lotion, by phone, signal or runner.
 13. Between 2200 hrs and time of retiring daily, Pl etc Comds will inspect the beds of all personnel under their comd and ensure that all personnel are in bed, under nets, with net properly tucked in and free of mosquitoes; they will check that hut has been sprayed immediately prior to their inspection (usually). If personnel through duty or recreation are not in bed at 2200 hrs or later, if Pl etc Comd inspection was after that time, Pl etc Comd will delegate duty NCO in charge of flying squad to make the inspection.

(APPENDIX "A")

13. (a) Coy will detail a flying squad in charge of a NCO. These will work in shifts of two and during the hrs of darkness will inspect sleeping personnel and move away from nets any personnel whose bodies are touching nets. They will carry a torch and rifles and act as lines patrol as well. They may replace present patrols. This rule will NOT apply to outposts whose numbers preclude the provisions of this guard.
14. Coy orderly officers will inspect recreation huts at 2200 hrs to ensure re-application of lotion.
15. Shorts will NOT be worn by any member of this Bn at any time. Coys will ensure all shorts at present held are returned to the QM. Kit inspections will subsequently be held to ensure this. It will be an offence to be in possession of shorts. Officers with privately tailored shorts are only exception.
16. After blankets are folded and gear packed correctly for morning inspection, mosquito nets will be left with sides down for Coy and Pl Comd inspection. Duty NCO will accompany the offr and will fold sides of net onto top in a uniform manner as an indication that net has been inspected and passed. Nets requiring mending will be left down and inspected again during the afternoon to ensure that the nets have been mended.

NOTES

1. This rigid discipline was made necessary because of an outbreak of malaria whilst Bn and HQ Coy were at SUNSHINE. Over 20 cases occurred in one week in this area and about 50 for three weeks until the effect of strict compliance of discipline began to show.
2. From 1 May 45 until 1 Oct 45 unit was disposed as follows:
- (a) One Coy in MARKHAM AREA (highly malarious) Frontage 50 miles depth 10 miles. Two PIs of the Coy spread in section outposts about 5 miles apart, under comd of NCOs all doing daily patrols, all posts doing sentry duty each night and standing to for five months with only break when brought into reserve.
- One Pl, Coy HQ and Pl and Mortar detts in Reserve 10 miles from MARKHAM. Rest area with recreation huts. Staging Camps in area in charge of NCO. Coy was in active combat with enemy for whole period.
- (b) One Coy in PARTER III Area (not highly malarious). Coy HQ and Pls at PARTER III. Training, patrolling and digging defensive positions. Recreation huts. Staging camps. One Pl in SHAKE RIVER Area. Three section posts under NCOs. Later each Pl in Coy in turn was in active combat for three months on BUANG RIVER Area (malarious).
- (c) One Coy in MOIR-MESSIN Area for 6 months.
- (d) One Pl in BANALUA Area for one month. The Pls and Coy HQ MESSIN L of C for 6 months.
- (e) Bn and HQ Coy SUNSHINE Area (highly malarious) for five months.

3. (f) Five main Unit Staging Camps in whole area under unit NCO supervision.
- (g) All Coys and Bn in MADZAB Area since 2 OCT 45.
4. Owing to operations circumstances ANGAU compounds for native labour were in close proximity to units bivouac area in nearly every coy.
5. It will be seen that with tps so dispersed control was most difficult.

The whole Bn area, however, was linked up by telephone, (128 miles of cable being necessary).

Coy and Pl Comds exercised malarial control by phone, each outpost being compelled to report that malarial precaution had been taken.

Each Coy Comd daily signalled M P T (malarial precautions taken).

At 2100 hrs duty off rang each Coy and Staging Camp reminding them to re-apply lotion.

Thus a considerable volume of signal traffic was necessary in connection with malaria.

6. The main check, however, came from the Medical Staging Post at SUNSHINE; each malarial patient was interviewed by the CO in person usually, and a case history taken. A SHORT ACCOUNT OF MESSING IN ACTION UNDER JUNGLE CONDITIONS

Recent operations in New Guinea proved again that to adequately feed troops who are in the front line is one of our major problems. For supply we depended on air droppings. These were collected by an ASC Unit where they were broken down into boyloads not exceeding 35 lbs.

A three day ration for the battalion would require about 250 to 350 boyloads. The boylines were escorted to our "B" Echelon area. From here rations would be split into company or platoon lots and forwarded by our unit boys, together with ammunition, stores etc., daily if practicable.

The type of ration dropped consisted of Field Operational Rations and SWP. With the SWP rations commodities dropped depended greatly on their salvage recovery. Liquids and semi-liquids have poor salvage returns therefore right throughout the campaign we were deficient of tinned meat and vegetable, fish, tinned fruit, pork and beans etc. Tomato juice was the only exception and this was dropped by parachute.

Commodities in short supply included wheatmeal, rice condiments and at times sugar. Very often issues were badly balanced, for instance; dehydrated carrots were the only vegetables available and P. meat the only type of meat ration.

With the nature of the country being such as it is, combustible wood is most difficult to procure while water may be anything up to an hours carry. The above problems aggravated the position while it was proved that cooks who had been well trained were better able to cope with the demands made on them. Where native labour was available they were of great assistance to cooks for finding wood etc.

At the beginning of the operations, old type field operational rations were mostly used owing to the difficulty of supply. With an almost total lack of cooking gear available the problem arose as to the best method of handling SWP. Ration and field operation ration. Wherever possible solidified alcohol burners were issued and with an addition of bully beef, jam, cheese and milk powder, troops were able to prepare the ration in a more palatable form. Biscuit porridge and a pudding made from soaked biscuits and the fruit block steamed in a jam tin became popular.

However, troops quickly tired of the above and longed for something tasty. A field bakery was established in "B" Echelon area and extra flour and dribarm applied for. This was granted and from then on every man in the unit received a bun, or a rok cake, or a cheese scone, every day. This did a great deal to relieve the monotony of the Army biscuit. One cook who had had baking experience and one assistant handled the task.

For better use of the SWP ration we devised an oven from two, three inch mortar boxes. Cut down apple drums were used for the shell. The boxes were interlocked by removing the end of one and the lid of the other. Fired from below with provision made for a grate the flames curled around the oven and gave off sufficient heat for all cooking purposes. A small chimney was placed at the back of the stove and the whole supported by stones etc.

The advantages of this type over the Aldershot pattern were - that due to the extreme soginess of the ground and the dampness of the wood the Aldershot would not retain heat, and that the oven's portability was a great asset as kitchens were shifted frequently. Baking trays were improvised from four gallon dehydrated vegetable drums.

With the aid of the ovens appetising dishes such as the following were easily handled despite the fact that P. meat was the basis of large majority of the dishes. Dehydrated vegetables proved their worth and were always appreciated. P. meat fritters, baked rissoles, rice and P meat patties, P meat Bacon and onion flavoured with tomato juice, curry and rice, P meat rice, cheese, biscuit crumbs and roux and other dishes were always acceptable. Blue boiler peas were most welcome and nearly every issue gorminated satisfactorily. Unfortunately the issue was far from adequate.

Sweets were popular and dried fruit dishes were eagerly consumed. Among the sweets soaked biscuits used as for a trifle helped the rations frequently. Tomato juice was generally served as a scup, while part of the issue was used for flavouring. Very rarely were we able to gather natural food from the surrounding country.

Ingenuity on the part of the cook plays an important part as to the meal served. More foresight in the type of ration dropped would help considerably. Dehydrated vegetables especially potatoes were easy to handle and quite satisfying. The dried fruit issue could comfortably be doubled. More wheat-meal and unpolished rice are essential to retain men in a fit condition while the addition of cocoa would be beneficial. Condiments are essential.

To ensure that troops in forward areas will remain well nourished and able to withstand the privations they are called on to suffer, well trained cooks supplied with an adequate balanced ration are indispensable.

ENEMY HANDS

1. It is the duty of any soldier, if captured by the enemy, to effect his escape at the earliest possible moment.
2. It is also his duty - any breach of which is a serious offence - not to communicate to unauthorised persons any information about the means employed by him or his companions to escape from enemy hands.
3. The disclosure of such information
 - (a) prejudices the chances of other escapees
 - (b) prevents other members of Australian or Allied forces from using the same or similar means of escape
 - (c) endangers the lives of those who may have assisted the escapees at any stage of their escape;therefore, except as provided in paras 4 and 5 below, an escaped prisoner of war is forbidden to disclose particulars of his escape directly or indirectly to any person whatever, either by word of mouth or in writing
4. An escaped prisoner of war will disclose full particulars of his escape only to officers authorised by the Director of Military Intelligence to interrogate such an escapee. No officers, except those authorised by the DMI, are permitted to interrogate any escapee on the circumstances of his escape.
5. Should it be considered desirable for an escaped prisoner of war to lecture on his experiences, the script of the proposed lecture will be submitted to the DMI for approval. No lecture will be arranged until approval of the DMI has been obtained.
6. GRO G.192/1943 is cancelled.

3. **MOVEMENT OF LEAVE PERSONNEL** 3 Aust Div Routine Order 435 of 5 JAN is amended by deleting the word "South" in para (1)(a) and by substituting in lieu thereof the word "North".

4. **OVERCROWDING PLACES OF ENTERTAINMENT AT FERTON** Attention is directed to 1 Aust Corps R O 4 of 4 JAN 44. Units will advise as soon as possible the approximate numbers of personnel attending these entertainments nightly, in order that this HQ may ensure that the quota is not exceeded.

5. **ANTI-MITE FLUID**

1. Anti-mite Fluid, which is to be used to protect troops on training exercises which may expose them to risk of typhus, is now available at Adv Sup Depot AT FERTON.
2. It is understood that in the past, mosquito lotion has been used for this purpose, but as this is now in short supply, it will be used only in malarious areas. Anti-mite Fluid will be used in all other areas.
3. The scale of issue will be 2 oz per man per month and Fluid may be obtained on indent through normal AASC channels.
4. The method of use is as follows:-
 - (a) Clothing should be treated every 14 days (treatment will withstand 7 washings in soap and cold water, half as many if the clothes are boiled).
 - (b) When men are fully exposed to risk, i.e. when they have to sit, lie or sleep in mite infested country, the method of treating the clothes is as follows:-
A man dips his fingers in the fluid, taking enough to smear the hands lightly. The clothing is rubbed and worked between the smeared hands at the rate of at least 4 smears per sock, 6 per trouser-bottom (to provide a band from above the gaiters to above the knees), and 5 about the fly. The shirt receives 6 smears about the waist, 4 to each complete sleeve, and 8 to the shoulders, collar and front. If the smears are light enough just over the hands, it will be found that the area will be treated by 1 oz or a little over, and should be gone over again until 1 oz is used up. The greater number of light smears ensures good cover. The job can be done in under 10 minutes per set, with practice.
 - (c) If they are only required to stand or walk in mite infested country, sock and trouser bottom need only be treated, and 1 oz of fluid will serve for 5 or 6 sets of clothes.
 - (d) Gaiters need not be treated. Sock and trousers are rather more easily treated on the body. The clothes need not be turned inside out.
 - (e) If socks are ^{not} worn, at least 4 smears inside the boots has been proved to correct.
 - (f) Where troops have to go on long expeditions, one pre-treated set of clothes should last three weeks.

Although suspended sentences are reconsidered by the appropriate Formation etc Commander every three months, there is no limit to the time during which a sentence may remain suspended; and the suspension may be revoked and the soldier recommitted to serve the balance of the sentence, at any time before the balance of the sentence has been remitted by the Formation etc Commander.

Soldiers released under suspended sentence should realise that any misconduct on their part will be reported to the Formation etc Commander and, as a result, they may be re-committed to serve the balance of the sentence.

2. When a soldier under a suspended sentence commits a further offence, the CO of the soldier should immediately inform the Formation etc Commander and forward him a copy of the soldier's conduct sheet, together with a comprehensive report on the soldier's conduct, and his recommendation regarding the suspended sentence.

3. If the conduct of a soldier under a suspended sentence warrants it, whether or not an offence has been committed, the CO may commit the soldier into military custody, pending reconsideration of the suspension by the Formation etc Commander.

When a soldier is so committed, the CO will forward to the Formation etc Commander, the information referred to in para 2 hereof.
