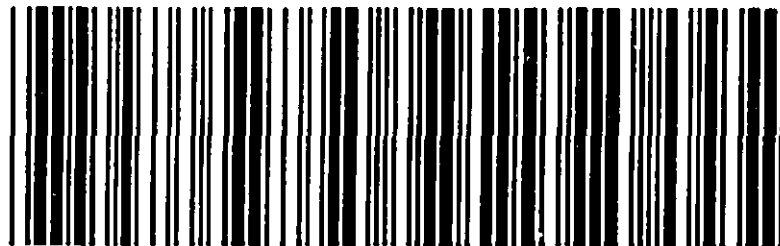





REPORT OF L.H.A. REPORT NO. 94 to CGCI GMT - 2 NOVEMBER 1942.

(SUMMARY).

1. N.S.I. On 31 Oct. it was reported that many Japanese were engaged repairing a road block at POINT BUNAO, (previously reported biggest 238). On 29 Oct. Allied patrols ambushed an enemy party near PAVU KARIKOLI (3 miles South of BILILI) but no details are to hand.
2. WATERBURY BATTERY - New BATHURST: At 1740 GMT on 31 Oct. enemy A/C attacked Point WATERBURY. Bombs fell in the Harbour and North-west of WATERBURY BATTERY. There was no damage or casualties.
At 1800 GMT on 31 Oct. Allied A/C attacked the LEE BATTERY. Bombs fell on the strip, dispersal and dump areas and a fire was started. On the same date at 2100 GMT Allied A/C bound to attack LEE were intercepted by 20-25 enemy A/C resulting in three a/c hit and probably destroyed.
At 0700 GMT on 31 Oct. Allied forward troops were advancing forward from BILILI and overlooking HOKOLEI. No contact was made with the enemy. At 0950 GMT on 1 Nov. Allied Recce. A/C attacked seven enemy fighters approx. 20 miles North-west of BILILI, but results were not observed.

Colonies: Between 1521 and 1730 GMT on 31 Oct. Allied A.C made two attacks on enemy shipping in the BUNIN-FAISI-TOYOLEI AREA. A direct hit was scored on a transport, 1 probable hit and 2 near misses on an unidentified warship, 1 possible hit on a destroyer, a near miss on a medium transport and near misses on other vessels.

3. ENEMY SIGHTINGS:- On 1 Nov. approx. 20 bombers and 20 fighters either processed or airborns were sighted on the LEE BATTERY DURING THE DAY.
At 2155 GMT on 31 Oct. 1 cruiser, 2 large cargo vessels were sighted approx. 115 miles west by North of ABAUL, travelling on a South-westerly course. On 1 Nov. at least thirty enemy vessels were sighted in ABAUL HARBOUR.
At 0600 GMT on 1 Nov. two heavy cruisers, four light cruisers, 15 destroyers, 6 gunboats, 3 probable seaplane tenders, 15 cargo vessels, 1 tanker and 3 submarines (making a total of 49 ships) were sighted in the BUNIN-FAISI AREA. At 0600 GMT on 1 Nov. 1 destroyer probably damaged was sighted zig-zagging approx. 23 miles West-South-west of HOKOLEI ISLAND.
At 1749 GMT on 31 Oct. 1 submarine was sighted approx. 140 miles West South-west of HOKOLEI.

(THURSDAY)

1. N.S.I. On 3 Nov. at 2046Z Allied A/C attacked MOABISSE and at 2350Z BI LI MOABISSE AND AILEU. Bombs fell in the target areas and buildings were demolished. No activity was observed at MOABISSE. On 4 Nov. it was reliably reported that the Japanese have constructed a fortress at MATARO LAND (27 miles North of BI LI) and have evicted the local chief of post from the Island. On the same date the enemy were reported in occupation of CINI SUBAC (5 miles West of MATARU) and METI HANO (19 miles West of MATARU). Natives are reported to be very impressed by recent Allied bombings.

2. AUSTRIAIA TETIO - New Guinea Area: On 3 Nov, between 1115 and 1300Z Allied A/C detailed to attack shipping at LME reported no sightings but bombed the wharf area and aerodrome. On the same date at 2315Z Allied A/C attacked the LAMBUA BATHS, but bombs fell wide of the target. At 0310Z on 4 Nov. Allied A/C attacked LAMBUA TOMINIE. Bombs fell in the target area and an explosion was heard and fires were started.

On 3 Nov. Allied forward troops were advancing. The right flank contacted and engaged an enemy post with at least 2 LMGs on a prominent spur South of the main track approx. 1500 yards East of the track junction at FIVIVI (5 miles South-east of KOKODA) and the main KOKODA CIVIL TRACK. At 2215 Z Allied A/C bombed and strafed enemy positions in the CIVIL LOCALITY. On the morning of 4 Nov. Allied troops attacked and drove the Japanese from the spur and were advancing towards CIVIL against stiffening opposition. At 0200Z on 4 Nov. an allied encircling movement was developing along the KOBARI ILEMO TRACK. An unconfirmed native report states that no enemy activity is evident in the YODA VALLEY and that many Japanese left KOKODA on 23 Oct.

Solomons: Reference Digest 294 it is now reported that enemy personnel evacuated the TOKIN BICKRAGE and VIRU HARBOR on 1 Nov.

The enemy shipping in the BUIN FLEET area on 3 Nov. totalled:- 2 heavy cruisers, 2 light cruisers, 14 destroyers, 1 probable seaplane tender, 2 tankers, 1 sloop and eight supply vessels, making in all a total of 30 ships.

SIGHTS OF ENEMY AIRCRAFT IN THE 93 to 0001 ZONE - 3 Nov. 42.

(SECRET)

1. N.I.I. It was reliably reported that Japanese personnel were moving from MASU to MIMII on 31 Oct. The natives were told these Japanese would return to WIL. DE WIL. (40 miles east of MASU) in one to three weeks time. Here it is suspected that 400 natives are constructing an Aerodrome. On 1 Nov. it was reported that 300 natives were ordered to repair the road from WIL. DE WIL. (23 miles east North east of MASU) to WIL. DE WIL. At 0319Z on 1 Nov. Allied A/C bombed and strafed MASU. Bombs fell on the building area and fires were started.
2. NEW BRITAIN (NEW GUINEA) AREA: At 0300Z on 1 Nov. Allied A/C strafed enemy installations at MUKUA and MUA. Buildings at MUA, POINA and MUA. MUA. ITHAUA were hit. Three trucks, 2 barges and huts containing stores were destroyed. A/A guns were silenced at MUA. MUA. On 3 Nov. Allied troops were advancing in the direction of MUA. SHIPPING PROCEDURE AS RELATING TO SERVICE CARGO.

1. In order to adopt a standard practice in Shipping procedure for use by the various Services and Units shipping from Brisbane, the following instructions are issued :--

2. APPLICATION FOR SPACE -

Applications for Shipping Space are to be submitted to 3 Aust Movt Control Group, Victoria Barracks, on Form T.58 in triplicate. Applications for Space to different ports must not be submitted on the same Form.

3. DELIVERY TO WHARF -

On 3 Aust Movt Control Group advising time of delivery of cargo to the wharf, Services will make out two copies of Wharf Delivery docket or Convoy Note, which will accompany the stores to the wharf. On receipts being obtained, one copy of the docket is retained by the Shipping Company and one copy retained by the Services from which subsequently their Bills/Lading are compiled.

4. BILLS/LADING -

Immediately deliveries have been completed Bills of Lading will be delivered to Shipping Companies for signature accompanied by copies of wharf delivery dockets. All items appearing on any one Delivery Docket must be shown on the one Bill of Lading. Weights and/or measurement must be shown.

All copies of Bills of Lading will be signed by the Shipping Company and one copy retained by them and the remainder returned to the shipper, who will hand 5 copies to the Movement Control Officer on the wharf. It is imperative that these 5 copies be delivered to the M.C.O. prior to the ship's departure as certain copies have to be placed on the vessel before sailing.

5. MARKING OF CARGO -

-/- In addition to the ordinary address and in order that the various categories of stores may be given block stowage in the holds of vessels, and to ensure organised sorting and delivery on arrival, Services must arrange for packages to be marked in accordance with Appendix 'A' attached. These identification marks will be stencilled in a conspicuous place on one end and one side of each package.

6. BLOCK STOWAGE -

In order that block stowage of cargo can be obtained, it is most essential that Services deliver their cargo as soon as called forward by Movement Control and not delivered piece meal, the ideal to be aimed at is for all cargo to be delivered at the wharf before loading operations commence.

7. CALLING FORWARD CARGO -

Docks Service will make available an officer whose duty it will be to supervise the reception of Services cargo to be shipped, and for such cargo to be stacked on the wharf in the respective Areas allotted for that purpose, in consultation with the wharf management. Where possible, it will be stacked abreast of the hatch to which it has been allotted.

8. STOWAGE CHECKERS -

Docks Service will provide one N.C.O. or O/R for duty in each Hatch as stowage checkers, who will report for duty at the commencement of loading and will :--

- (a) assist stevedore implementing stowage in accordance with an agreed plan
- (b) record in Hatch Book particulars of stores and stowage
- (c) Hand over Hatch Book to Freight Conducting Officer on completion of loading.

9. CONTACT WITH SHIPPING COMPANIES -

Representatives of Services and Units must not approach the ships' officer or Shipping Company's Staff except through the Movement Control Officer responsible for the working of the ship. Instances have been reported, mainly in the cases of Units shipping vehicles, where officers are constantly worrying the ships' Officers and stevedores regarding loading of their vehicles.

10. UNIT EQUIPMENT AND VEHICLES -

When Units are warned for movement they will immediately submit to 3 Aust Movt Control Group a table showing particulars of measurements and weights of vehicles and Unit Equipment for shipment.

Units moving vehicles by ship will arrange for vehicles to be weighed prior to delivery to wharf and a "vehicle card" prepared giving particulars of the vehicles' gross weight, type, vehicle number, and the Unit to which it belongs. These cards will be supplied in duplicate and one copy handed to M.C.O. at time of shipment. These cards must be signed by a responsible officer.

11. LEAKING PETROL DRUMS -

In order to obviate the risk of fire on the wharf, S. & T. have arranged that Leaking Drums will be removed from all wharves twice a day. Arrangements are being made with the Shipping Company to roll leaking drums to pre-arranged points in the wharf yard for removal to B.I.P.O.D.

12. SHIPPING DOCUMENTS -

Immediately loading has been completed, Shipping Companies will make available to 3 Aust Movt Control Group the following documents :--

Stowage Plan	-	5 copies.
Manifest	-	5 "
Hatch Lists	-	5 "
Tally Sheet	-	1 copy

13. MILITARY LABOUR AT DOCKS -

Under arrangements with H.Q. Q'land L. of C. Area, Military Labour at the Docks will be requisitioned for by 3 Aust Movt Control Group and not by the Services direct. Whilst at the docks labour will come under the control of the Movement Control Officer.



















OFFICE OF I.M. NO 99 to 30013 - 7 Nov. 1942.

(SUMMARY)

1. N.E.I. At 0900 Z on 5 Nov. it was reported that a large enemy vessel arrived at BIRAI from the North-west.

2. WESTERN CAMPAIGN, New Guinea Area. On 5 Nov. there was much H.P. activity carrying stores in the vicinity of Mt. BIRAI.

On 6 Nov. Allied forces were making steady progress. The enemy forces, estimated at 1 Bn. were resisting strongly in well prepared positions on the high ground at OVI. An outflanking movement is developing on both flanks. The enemy were employing Inf. mortar, A/Tk and numerous LMGs. Some Japanese personnel were located at HORND. (18 miles SSE of BIRAI).

New Ireland: At 0610 Z on 6 Nov. Allied A/C sighted and attacked one enemy destroyer and 2 medium cargo vessels ten miles SE of OVAI PT. OVAI PT. bearing one near miss on a destroyer.

Solomons: On 6 Nov. a double row of enemy tents were sighted on the east coast of HONORUM ISLAND (Southern end of VELLA LAVELLE ISLAND).

3. SEA AREA: Analysis of shipping at HONORUM on 5 Nov. reported in sig at 200 is now revealed as one converted A/C carrier, four destroyers, one possible LMG carrier, 5 mine layers, 3 large merchant vessels, 12 medium merchant vessels, eight small merchant vessels, 8 unidentified vessels and 37 small craft in the area (making a total of 74 ships). Six float planes were sighted in the harbour, three medium bombers on HONORUM Island and 18 medium bombers on VELLA LAVELLE ISLAND.

At 2015 Z on the 5 Nov. six destroyers were sighted approx. 15 miles North by West of HONORUM (BIRAI POINT - WEST & SE of VELLA LAVELLE ISLAND - NE of OVAI PT.). Another force of 10 destroyers were sighted approx. 15 miles South-east of HONORUM. Both these forces were travelling on a westerly course. At 1500 Z on 6 Nov. 2 destroyers were sighted approx. 10 miles North-east of HONORUM but no course was given.

DIGEST OF A.M. J. MESSAGE NO.100 to 00014 - 8 Nov. 42.

(SUNDAY)

1. N.S.I. Reference large vessel which arrived at DILLI on 5 Nov. (mentioned in Digest 296) it is now reported that the vessel departed Northwards at 0710Z on 5 Nov. At 0005Z on 7 Nov. 1/6000 ton tanker arrived at DILLI.
2. AUSTRALIAN STATION - New Guinea Area: At 2359Z on 6 Nov. Allied A/C in the LAM BARRACK AREA attacked two enemy floatplanes at the eastern tip of LASANGA ISLAND (20 miles South South-east of LAUNGA) but no hits were registered. Photos disclosed one large enemy trench dug with a field of fire cleared near the track in the vicinity of MERY'S PLANTATION (near LAS).

On 6 Nov. Allied forces were employing 3 inch Mortars at short range and were maintaining constant pressure on the enemy, now estimated as 2 Bns, in prepared positions in depth astride the main track and extending three miles South of CIVI. On the afternoon of 6 Nov. Allied forces right flank captured two spurs South of CIVI. Enemy counter attack in this area was repulsed with heavy Japanese losses. Other Allied outflanking troops contacted enemy patrols in the vicinity of GORARI (approx. 4 miles East of CIVI). At 2335 Z on the same date Allied A/C bombed and strafed enemy L. of C. BUNA to CIVI with unobserved results. Heavy A/A fire was encountered from a known position on the BOJUTA BUNA TRACK. Native reports indicate some enemy movement in the direction of BUNA.

Solomons: On 7 Nov. it was reported that the enemy have a wireless post at MALVAGUE (approx 2 miles South west of S.A. ALEXANDER - NORTH WEST TIP CHOISEUL ISLAND).

3. ENEMY SIGHTINGS: At 2340Z on 6 Nov. 1 heavy cruiser, 1 light cruiser, 3 destroyers, 3 flying boats were sighted in KAVIENG HARBOR. At 2259Z on 6 Nov. 1 submarine was sighted off LUNGA BAY (GURDALCAI AL). At 2305 Z on the same date 11 destroyers were sighted approx. 87 miles North-east of S.A. CIRAUD (YASSEL I LAND) travelling on an Easterly course. On 7 Nov. at 0049Z 4 heavy cruisers, 2 light cruisers, 15 destroyers, 2 tankers and 10 supply ships were sighted in the BUIN BAI SI A AREA.

Late Report. At 0130Z on the (?) Nov. an enemy force estimated at 200 attacked a Dutch patrol at MISA. It is reported that one enemy party is moving South and another along the MOLA RIVER (13 miles West of MICO).

DIGEST OF L.H. REPORT NO. 101 TO OOOLE - 9 NOV. 42.

(MONDAY)

1. AUSTRALIA REGION - New Guinea Area: At 0500 Z on 7 Nov. there was no activity on the ALMADA DRIFT.

On 7 Nov. Allied air Recce. reported that the BUHA DROME appeared half covered with water and was unserviceable. Allied mortar fire (reported in Digest 297) proved successful. On 8 Nov. Allied troops right flank contacted the enemy South-east of GOARI. Enemy positions are being maintained at CIVI and stubborn resistance offered. At 0210Z on 8 Nov. Allied A/C attacked a W/T station at SAKAWANDA; huts possibly containing meteorological instruments at POKONSETTA; and huts at AMBOGA, and UNKETA. A fire was started at AMBOGA but other results were not observed. At 2250Z on 8 Nov. Allied A/C bombed and strafed enemy positions at CIVI, but results were not observed.

New Britain: On 8 Nov. Allied A/C strafed a possible W/T station at the Western end of GABETA but results have not been reported to date. At 0345Z on the same date Allied A/C attacked a stationary schooner at MERLO ISLAND (3 miles West of GABETA) but results were not observed.

2. NAVY SIGHTINGS: At 0010Z on 8 Nov. 1 light cruiser was sighted 30 miles East by South of KENNEL, course 270 degrees.

At 0001Z on 8 Nov. 1 merchant vessel or tanker from 6000 to 8000 tons, 1 cargo vessel (2-3000 ton) were stationary at KAVIANG HARBOUR.

At 1950Z on 7 Nov. 3 destroyers were sighted 25 miles North by East of TULAKORA POINT (SANTA YSABEL ISLAND) course 330 degrees. At 1950Z on the same date three floatplanes were observed in KAVIANG BAY. At 2245Z on 7 Nov. one 4 engine bomber was sighted 60 miles West by North of KENNEL ISLAND, course 260 degrees. At 2351Z on the same date 3 enemy ILC were sighted South of CAPE ESPERANCE (GUADALCANAL) and three West of TASS MARONG (12 miles S.E. of CAPE ESPERANCE). Enemy shipping in the BUIN TRISI AREA at 0150Z on 8 Nov. totalled:- 1 heavy cruiser, 2 light cruisers, 3 destroyers, 3 mine layers, 1 torpedo boat, 1 naval auxiliary vessel (10000 tons), 1 possible seaplane tender, 2 ILC Carriers, 13 merchant vessels comprising of, 1/2000 ton, 1/3000 ton, 5/5000 ton, 2/3000 ton, 1/9000 ton and 1/10000 ton. At 0630Z on 8 Nov. four light cruisers and five destroyers were sighted 72 miles North by East of TULAKORA POINT (SANTA YSABEL) course 130 degrees. On the same date at 0630Z 1 floatplane was sighted in the vicinity of MERDOVA ISLAND. At 0811Z on 8 Nov. an enemy midget submarine was observed off CAPE ESPERANCE (GUADALCANAL).
