Robertson handed over the unit to Lt. Col I.N. Dougherty. Lt. Col McCormick <sup>made</sup> <del>bid</del> the unit farewell and the Brig. in welcoming us back spoke of the excellent work done by the unit while at Haifa and Acre. Battalion then marched <del>past</del> the Brig. and continued on a Route march. One of the first jobs being to harden the troops once more. <sup>th-</sup> Col. Dougherty did not appear to be well at this morning parade and was later in the day <del>efacuated</del> to 1 A.GH with sandfly fever. G.O.C. Sir <sup>Thomas Blaney</sup> <del>Thomas Blaney</del> visited the unit at 1145 hrs. and carried out a quick inspection. In the evening 2 i/c Major Houston dined with the G.O.C. Div H.Q. T.C. Oates was badly injured and subsequently died from injuries yesterday. A party left the unit this morning to attend the funeral at Gaza War Cemetery. Included in the party was a firing party drawn from the transport section. This is the first casualty of the 2/4 Bn. since the unit has arrived overseas
