

## 76. BREAKING DOWN OF ENEMY OR SERVICE AMMUNITION

1. The breaking-down of service or enemy ammunition in any way, other than that authorised by training publications, hand books, regulations in existence or instructions issued from L.H.Q., is strictly forbidden.
2. The breaking-down of any service or enemy ammunition by unauthorised persons is prohibited.
3. If information is required on the internal construction of any type of service ammunition, reference can be made to inspecting Ordnance Officers posted to H.Q. of Corps or L. of C. Areas.
4. Enemy ammunition will normally be broken down or demolished by R.E. units (preferably bomb disposal units) under instructions from formation etc. headquarters.

## 77. IGNITER SETS - GRENADES No.36H - SUSCEPTIBILITY TO MOISTURE.

1. The .22 R.F. cartridge cap, as used in the igniter sets for grenades No. 36H, is highly susceptible to moisture.
2. Personnel handling igniter set containers will observe strictly the following procedure :-
  - (a) Igniter sets are always issued in soldered cylinders. Should a cylinder be opened and the whole of the contents not expended, the cylinder will be reclosed by adhesive tape or shellac binding.
  - (b) Detonators which show visible signs of corrosion or verdigris on the caps will be treated as suspect, as these are liable to produce blinds. Units will refer such detonators to an inspecting Ordnance Officer for determination of condition.
3. Units will keep the number of "ready use" grenades to a minimum, consistent with operational needs, and in tropical areas this number will not exceed four days requirements in advance.

For this purpose G.D.D. BRISBANE will be considered the appropriate G.D.D. for N.G. Force and G.D.D. ADELAIDE for N.T. Force. (b) Before concurring in any such action the Formation etc. Commander will ensure.

84. CONSERVATION OF MAN POWER1. MA NPPOWER CHECK:

On account of the acute man power position which exists, all addressees will carefully examine and check the duties of all personnel on WEs of units under command or control to ensure that they are -

- (a) Essential for the successful functioning of the unit concerned;
- (b) Fully employed to capacity.

2. REPORTS BY 28 JUNE 43:

A review of the situation, including recommendations for suggested re-organization and comments by all concerned are required to reach this Headquarters by 28 June, 43.

3. RE-ALLOCATION OF PERSONNEL:

In the meantime, if it is found that personnel can be dispensed with, they should be shown on the W309 return submitted to Records by the units concerned as being surplus to requirements, and Records will ensure that the personnel shown thus are allocated to fill other vacancies where they can be most suitably employed and are most urgently required. Where personnel found to be surplus to requirements have not been psychology tested, arrangements will be made through this Headquarters to have these personnel drafted to RRD for the necessary tests and re-allocation.

4. EMPLOYMENT OF A W A S PERSONNEL:

Wherever possible, A W A S personnel will be employed to replace "A" Class personnel or to fill vacancies required to be filled on existing WEs, and in this connection a statement of requirements as at 28 June 43 will also be submitted to this Headquarters. In the meantime, the allocation of A W A S personnel to replace "A" Class personnel or to fill vacancies will continue as a function of Vic L of C Area Records Office.

5. SAVING OF MANPOWER:

This matter will receive the urgent and careful consideration of all concerned as it is apparent at the present time that many personnel employed in units in Vic L of C Area are not being fully employed, nor are they required for the essential functioning of the unit.

6. ABSENTEES:

The absentee problem needs to be dealt with with vigour and determination, and no effort is being spared by Hqs Vic L of C Area and by the Man Power Authorities to ensure that all personnel are either fully employed in the Army or doing an essential job in industry to further the war effort.

7. RELEASE OF PERSONNEL FROM THE ARMY:

Personnel released from the Army are being placed in industry and other personnel are being released by the Man power authorities as quickly as possible in exchange.

8. INSPECTION AND REVIEW:

Following submissions by addressees, it is proposed to conduct an extensive review of units in Vic L of C Area, and no excuse will be entertained where it is found that man power is being wasted. All COs and Officers will become "man power minded" and to impressed with the importance of prompt action, notwithstanding that numbers of personnel are provided for on W Es.

85. UNIT ADMINISTRATION - TRANSFER OR DETACHMENT OF PERSONNEL

1. PREVIOUS CORRESPONDENCE:

It is desired to refer to Vic L of C Area circular instructions 30252 of 24 Feb 43 (Transfer and Detachment of Personnel), 21557 of 8 Feb 43 (Movement of "X" List and other personnel) and 38266 of 11 Mar 43 (Personnel attending Schools and Courses). The following instructions are issued to emphasise the necessity for close co-operation and to clarify the position in regard to responsibility and other matters not mentioned in the above circular instructions.

2. The instructions issued with Vic L of C Area 30252 of 24 Feb 43 are supplemented by the following instructions which will also be read in conjunction with the other two names referred to above, regarding "X" list personnel, including those attending schools and courses.

3. Wherever personnel are being transferred from one unit to another, or detached to another unit, including a medical unit or school, the following matters will receive attention by all concerned -

- (a) Personal documents
- (b) Hob 3 Rolls
- (c) Casualty Returns
- (d) Pay Books
- (e) Leave record

4. PERSONAL DOCUMENTS.

(a) The following personal documents will in all cases be supplied by the unit drafting personnel out :-

- (i) Leave Card (F-10)
- (ii) Pay Card (N 10)
- (iii) Dental Card (10033)
- (iv) Rostal Conduct Sheet (HL22)
- (v) Personal Record Card (A140)
- (vi) Statement of Leave due under GRO4559.

(b) The above documents will be in charge of a DCO or DCDO if one is appointed, otherwise as in the case of individual transfers of personnel, the documents will be forwarded by first available registered post to the unit concerned.

5. HOB 3 ROLLS

(a) Hob 3 Rolls will include the following information -

- (i) Reason for transfer or detachment.
- (ii) Authority for transfer or detachment.
- (iii) Medical category of personnel.
- (iv) Draft priority of personnel (stating Trg and Admin D P separately)
- (v) Statement - "Paybooks in possession of personnel."
- (vi) Future action to be taken in regard to bursarisation.
- (vii) Where Rail travel is involved, statement as to whether single or return warrant has been issued.

(b) Hob 3 Rolls will be signed by the CO of the unit or by the Lieutenant commanding in the absence of his CO.

- (c) Interstate Transfer of Personnel. Where interstate transfer or drafting of personnel to NEW GUINEA is concerned, eight copies of Mob 3 rolls will be prepared and will be disposed of as follows : -

Vic L of C Area Records Office - 5 copies (two of these copies to be passed to DFO)

1 copy to be retained by unit drafting personnel cut.

2 copies to accompany the personnel on draft, one of which will be returned received to the unit which drafted the personnel out.  
(Plus extra copies if required by Formations).

- (d) Inter-Unit transfers or Detachments in Vic L of C Area : In these cases Mob 3 rolls will be prepared in triplicate; one copy being retained by the unit drafting the personnel, two copies being forwarded with the personnel, one of the two copies being received and returned to the unit from which personnel marched out, the third copy being retained by the unit to which personnel marched in.

#### 6. CASUALTY RETURNS

- (a) Casualty returns are the basis of Army administration in regard to personnel and it is desired to emphasize the importance of submitting these returns direct from units to Vic L of C Area Records Office in connection with any matter affecting the movement, posting, status, rank, pay or dependants' allowances of personnel.
- (b) Casualty returns will be submitted by units concerned immediately any action is involved as referred to in sub-paras (a) above.
- (c) Where transfer or detachment of personnel is involved between units, both units will submit a casualty return to Vic L of C Area Records Office, and unit marching the personnel out and the other unit taking them on strength. Personnel in transit from one unit to another are deemed to belong to the unit from which personnel are being marched out until such time as they are taken on strength of the other unit and signed for on a copy of Mob 3.
- (d) As a result of the receipt of casualty returns at Vic L of C Area Records Office, Part II Orders are published. Units will NOT publish Part II Orders; but may make an extract from Vic L of C Area Records Part II where-ever necessary for insertion in unit Part I Orders.

#### 7. PAY BOOKS

- (a) Pay Books will at all times be in possession of their owners except on such occasions when they are required for pay or credit purposes, when the soldier concerned will be issued with an official receipt, indicating the reason for retention of the pay book.

- (b) All entries in pay books will be complete as follows : -

- (i) Medical Category. If such medical category is not already inserted in pay books, signed and dated by a HQ CO concerned will cause enquiries to be made at Vic L of C Area Records Office, as a result of which they themselves will sign and date the medical category to be inserted in the pay book.
- (ii) Photograph
- (iii) Blood Grouping
- (iv) Result of X-ray. Where this is not already entered in the paybook and signed by a member of the X-ray staff or Medical Officer, COs will obtain information from Vic L of C Area Records Office, and will themselves sign the entry "Passed X-ray" and date.
- (v) Statement that Will has been lodged indicating where :-  
Entry to be signed by COs
- (vi) Record of Training. Schools. Courses. etc.
- (vii) Vaccination and inoculations - Entries to be signed by Medical Officers concerned.

(viii) Number, rank, name and date of attestation.

(ix) Age on enlistment, and if under 20 years of age at date of enlistment, date of birth.

**8. LEAVE RECORD**

(a) In future casualty returns will not be submitted to Vic L of C Area Records office in respect of leave granted under GRO A559

(b) Units will maintain a leave register and when transfer of personnel takes place, a statement showing leave due will accompany the other personal documents of the soldier concerned.

**9. DRAFT PRIORITY**

Before personnel are moved from Vic L of C Areas to other L of C Areas, they must be DPL in respect of all "A" matters - that is, those matters referred to in the foregoing. In regard to training, personnel will be of such a Draft Priority as is directed according to the circumstances.

**86. SAFE CUSTODY OF CASH ADVANCES**

It has been suggested that in cases where cash advances and stamps cannot be placed in an office safe for safe custody, arrangements may be made with the nearest Postmaster or Bank Manager for a sealed envelope or locked cash box to be deposited there for safe keeping each night and collected on the following morning.

Advice regarding the practicability of instituting such an arrangement in each area office and Unit holding cash and stamps is to reach this HQs by 13 Jun 43.

87. COURTS OF INQUIRY

Attention is specially directed to GRO A392/43, which sets out revised methods of conducting military investigations. It is directed that all officers will make themselves familiar with the GRO, so that they will be competent to carry out investigations when called upon. A course of lectures on military law with special reference to the subject contained in the GRO is now being prepared, and will be delivered soon to all officers of units within the sub-area. Copy of GRO 392/43 is appended. A limited number of further copies is available at this HQ, and will be sent to units on application by the CO.

A392. REVIEWED METHODS OF CONDUCTING MILITARY INVESTIGATIONS

PART I - GENERAL

1. Courts of Inquiry under AIR 276 as to illegal absence -

Steps are being taken to obtain an amendment of the AMRs to remove the necessity of holding a court of inquiry in the case of illegal absences and to substitute therefor a simplified procedure. Pending the gazetting of the necessary statutory rule, the present procedure will continue.

2. Courts of Inquiry convened other than under AIR 276 -

Courts of Inquiry to investigate loss or damage to Government property, or loss or damage involving claims for compensation against the Commonwealth, or injuries to members of the forces will not be held, unless specifically directed by superior authority. In lieu thereof, the appropriate procedure set out in the following parts will be used :-

Part II - Loss or damage to Government property.

Part III - Loss, damage or injury involving claims for compensation by the public against the Commonwealth.

Part IV - Injuries to members of the forces.

Where one occurrence involves an investigation under more than one of the above-mentioned Parts, the procedure will be amalgamated and one set of proceedings only will be necessary, unless, for some special reason, superior authority, as hereinafter defined, otherwise directs. For example, if both vehicles are

damaged in a collision between an Army and non-army vehicle, the requirements of both Parts II and III will be covered by one report.

3. For the purposes of this order -

"Superior authority" means the Commander-in-Chief, the Commander of an Army, Corps, Division, L of C Area, L of C Sub-Area, or brigade group;

"Formation etc. commander" means the commander of a division or brigade group or a commander L of C area;

"Writing-off authority" means any of the following authorities:-

The Minister for the Army, the Commander-in-Chief, the Lieutenant-General i/c Administration, the Quartermaster-General, the Master-General of the Ordnance, a Deputy Quartermaster-General, an Army Commander, a Corps Commander, a Commander L of C Area, a Divisional Commander, the Director of Ordnance Services and any other authority from time to time authorised to write off departmental charge any loss or damage to Government property.

4. The provisions contained in AIR & C Pt IV, Division 20, which authorise the convening and holding of Courts of Inquiry, other than courts dealing with illegal absences, have not been repealed. In relation to the type of cases specified in Parts II, III and IV of this order, however, Courts will not be held pursuant to those provisions except in the following cases :-

- (a) Upon the death of a member of the forces (but not when death has been caused by wounds or injuries sustained in action)
- (b) When superior authority is of the opinion that there are exceptional circumstances justifying departure from the normal procedure prescribed by this order, e.g., when a member's military reputation is involved.

Nothing in Parts II, III, or IV hereof shall limit the right of superior authority, after he has considered the report of an investigating officer appointed by the CO of a unit, to order further inquiry either by the same or by another investigating officer or by a court of inquiry appointed by that superior authority.

Nothing in this order shall affect the operation of ~~AMO Q273/1341~~.

5. (a) It is the duty of an investigating officer appointed under the provisions of this order to obtain a statement from any member of the forces, who, in his opinion, may be able to give material information and whose evidence can be reasonably procured.

(b) A member of the forces, who is interviewed by an officer conducting an investigation hereunder, may be required to answer any question or to produce any document except such as he could legally refuse to answer or produce if the investigation were a judicial proceeding. Impemissible grounds for such a refusal are set out in the Manual of Military Law (Australian Edition), pp. 166-107.

(c) An investigating officer, if he deems it necessary, may require that any statement made to him be embodied in a statutory declaration.

(d) An investigating officer will have, at any stage of his investigation, the right of direct access to any available member of the Australian Army Legal Corps for advice or guidance relative to the inquiry.

F.R.P. II - LOSS OR DAMAGE TO GOVERNMENT PROPERTY

Section 1 - Loss or damage not occasioned by enemy action or fire.

6. AMR & O 691 and 692 and MFR L I 618, 619, 620, and 622 are hereby cancelled.

7. In the event of loss or damage occurring to Government property (except loss or damage due to fire or enemy action) the CO of the unit concerned will forthwith -

- (a) upon notice of the loss or damage, take such steps as are necessary to secure prompt replacement or repairs, as the case may be, of any property affected. Execution of such repairs to or replacements of any property affected will not be delayed pending a determination of any responsibility for such loss or damage;
- (b) appoint an officer to investigate the circumstances surrounding the loss or damage and to report thereon in writing;
- (c) if the loss is suspected to be due to theft, notify the civil and military police immediately.

8. The officer appointed to investigate will, as far as is practicable -

- (a) ascertain and report the cause and extent of the loss or damage;
- (b) ascertain and report the values of the property affected before and after the occurrence;
- (c) obtain a signed statement from any person or persons able to give information in relation to the circumstances under which the loss or damage was sustained;
- (d) ascertain and report whether, in his opinion, any member of the forces is responsible for the loss or damage and the reasons for such opinion;
- (e) ensure, in the case of accidents to mechanical vehicles, that AAF 34 (Inspection Report) and AAF 613 (Accident Report and Summary) are properly completed;
- (f) attach to his report any written statements which he has thought it necessary to obtain and any relevant documents relating to the matter.

9. The CO will, as soon as practicable after receipt of the Investigating Officer's report, forward it, together with statements or other documents obtained and any recommendations the CO may think fit, to the appropriate superior authority. If the CO has taken any disciplinary action as a result of the report, he will inform the superior authority of that fact when forwarding the report of the investigating officer.

10. (a) In any case in which the superior authority considers that disciplinary action should be taken, he will direct the CO to take appropriate action, if that has not already been done.  
(b) If an offence is proved, the CO or court-martial disposing of the matter will consider the advisability of ordering a deduction under A 137 or 138, as the case may be.

11. If the superior authority is of the opinion that the amount of the loss or damage should be written off at public expense, and he himself is not a writing-off authority competent to act in the circumstances, he will forward the report and all relevant documents, including his own recommendation, to the appropriate writing-off authority.

12. Applications for approval to "write off" will be made to the appropriate writing-off authority whose powers for that purpose are set out in OP 200 P 411/1942, F 665/1942 and P 351/1943 as amended from time to time.

Section 2 - Loss or damage occasioned by fire not due to enemy action

13. AIR & O 1463 TROs Q 177/1942 and Q 158/1943 are cancelled.
14. (1) Immediately following a fire affecting Government property or property requisitioned by or leased to the Government (not being a fire due to enemy action), the camp commandant or the CC unit concerned will -
- (a) send a report direct to the appropriate superior authority by telegram or telephone if the estimated loss is over £100, or by memorandum if it is below that figure. This report will give the date, time and place of the fire, the estimated loss and the type of property involved.
  - (b) In cases where there is any suspicion that a fire has been caused deliberately, immediately communicate such suspicion and the grounds thereof confidentially to the police (both military and civil) for appropriate action.
- (2) The appropriate superior authority will thereupon appoint an officer to investigate the occurrence.
15. The investigating officer will, as far as is practicable, act in accordance with sub-paras (a), (b), (c), (d), and (f) of para 3 hereof and submit a report in the form of answers to the following questions :-
- (a) When was the fire first discovered?
  - (b) Who made the discovery?
  - (c) What immediate action was taken?
  - (d) When was the fire alarm sounded?
  - (e) What action was taken by -
    - (i) the fire party?
    - (ii) the fire parties?
    - (iii) the fire squad?
  - (f) Who was in charge of the fire fighting operations?
  - (g) Were the fire appliances and water supplies sufficient, sufficient, and readily available?
  - (h) When was the fire brigade called? When did it arrive? What was the extent of its assistance?
  - (i) When was the fire extinguished?
  - (j) What was the cause of the fire?
  - (k) Who was responsible for the outbreak?
  - (l) What was the extent of the damage -
    - (i) to persons?
    - (ii) to stores and equipment?
    - (iii) to property?
      - (a) Army?
      - (b) Requisitioned or leased?
      - (c) private?
  - (m) Were the unit fire orders correctly drawn up and published?
16. After receipt of the Investigating Officer's report by the superior authority, the provisions of paras 10 and 11 hereof will apply.

PART III - LOSS, DAMAGE OR INJURY INVOLVING CLAIMS FOR COMPENSATION BY THE PUBLIC AGAINST THE COMMONWEALTH

17. AIR & O 697, EBI Q 127/1941 (as amended by EBI Q 12/1942, GRO 221/42 & GRO 249/1942) and AIR & I 535 are cancelled.
18. (1) When any loss, damage or injury (other than injury to a member of the military forces) appears to have been caused by any member of the Military Forces or by any army property to any person, the CC of the unit concerned will appoint an officer to investigate all the relevant circumstances and report thereon in writing.

The Investigating Officer will, as far as practicable -

- (a) obtain a signed statement from any person or persons able to give information in relation to the circumstances under which such loss, damage or injury was occasioned;
- (b) report the cause and extent of such loss, damage or injury;
- (c) report the approximate amount of such loss or damage, including the value of any property affected before and after the occurrence;
- (d) report whether the member or members concerned was or were on duty when the loss, damage or injury is alleged to have been occasioned;
- (e) report upon the nature of the duty being performed;
- (f) report whether the loss, damage or injury was occasioned by any wrongful act or negligence on the part of any member concerned and the nature of such wrongful act or negligence.

(2) In the event of the loss, damage or injury being caused by an Army vehicle, the following additional steps will be taken :-

- (a) the driver will notify his unit, or in the event of his inability to notify the unit, will notify the nearest I of C area, sub-area or formation headquarters.
  - (b) The Investigating Officer forthwith will inspect the scene of the accident and make the fullest inquiries from witnesses of the accident and obtain particulars of any injuries suffered by any persons or members of the forces and, where practicable, will view the property damaged (if any).
  - (c) The Investigating Officer will view the driver's licence and work ticket and report whether these documents are in order and ensure that this is completed in all detail.
19. Unless the Investigating Officer reports that no loss, damage, or injury has been suffered by any person, the CO of the unit will forward the report to superior authority. If the Investigating Officer reports that the loss, damage or injury was occasioned by any wrongful act or by negligence on the part of any member, the CO, when forwarding the Investigating Officer's report, will inform the superior authority -
- (a) as to what disciplinary action has or is proposed to be taken;
  - (b) if no disciplinary action has been taken or is intended, the reasons therefor.
20. When damage to civilian property or injury to a civilian is alleged to have been caused by a member of the forces on duty or damage to Departmental property or injury to a member of the forces on duty is alleged to have been caused by a civilian, the Investigating Officer's report and the proceedings of the Court of Inquiry (if any) regarding the matter will be submitted by superior authority to a Deputy Crown Solicitor or agent of the Crown Solicitor, as the case may be, for advice.

#### PART IV - INJURIES TO MEMBERS OF THE FORCE

21. Rule 20 Subs. 698A, 698L, and 69P are cancelled.
22. Whenever a member of the Forces is injured (except by wounds or injuries received in action) and irrespective of whether the injury was fatal or not, the CO of the unit will appoint an officer to make an investigation and report thereon in writing.
23. The Investigating Officer, as far as practicable, will -

- (a) investigate the whole of the circumstances connected with the injury and ascertain and report the cause and general nature of the injury sustained;
  - (b) report whether the member injured was, or was not, on duty or on leave or travelling on leave to or from his place of employment when the injury was sustained, and if on duty, the nature of such duty;
  - (c) report whether any and what neglect, misconduct, carelessness or failure to observe any act, regulation, order or instruction, on the part of the member suffering from the injury or of any other person or persons, caused or contributed to or aggravated the injury;
  - (d) obtain signed statements from the injured member (if possible) and such other persons as are able to give information, with full particulars of the time, date and place, and the circumstances in which the injury was sustained.
  - (e) report whether the member injured was enlisted or appointed for or was employed on active service outside Australia.
  - (f) report whether the member injured was appointed, enlisted or called up for continuous full time service for the duration of the war or for "part time service;"
  - (g) ensure that AAF DLL is submitted, as soon as possible, for completion by the NO who attended to the injured member.
24. That NO will complete the AAF DLL and will include therein a statement as to the nature and extent of the injury and whether in his opinion -
- (a) the injury will or is likely to cause permanent ill-effects;
  - (b) the injury will or is likely to impair the future efficiency of the member as an officer or a soldier; and
  - (c) the condition of the injured member is attributable wholly or partly to conditions of service, a pre-existent disability aggravated by conditions of service or a pre-existent disability independent of conditions of service.
25. The Investigating Officer will submit his report, together with the completed AAF DLL, to the CO of the unit for consideration and for endorsement by the CO of his opinion thereon.
26. The CO of the unit will forward the Investigating Officer's report, together with the AAF DLL to the superior authority with such recommendations as he may think fit.
27. Upon receipt of the report and the AAF DLL, superior authority will, in the case of death resulting from any injury, assemble a Court of Inquiry.
28. Superior authority will forward the report, AAF DLL and the proceedings of the Court of Inquiry (if held) to the appropriate DRO to hold pending any claim for compensation.

88. COURTS MARTIAL: Publication of results of Trials.

89. ISSUE OF LEAVE PASSES.

- (1) Considerable traffic has taken place recently with fictitious leave passes, and it has become difficult to apprehend personnel who are AWL on account of the fact that they can produce what appears to be a current leave pass.
- (2) On this account action will be taken forthwith to ensure that personnel are always in possession of pay books as a means of identification at all times. Particular care will be exercised also to ensure that leave passes issued are legibly written, serially numbered, that unit stamps are plainly embossed thereon, that every care is exercised in regard to the safety of leave pass books and that all passes issued are signed by a responsible officer whose name is legibly written and who may be contacted by the APM or other authority if any suspicion is entertained in regard to the validity of the pass produced.

90. LOSS OF FIELD SECURITY PASS.

A Field Security Pass No 79, pale blue in colour, issued to WX 19259, Sgt TENOUP, W.A. signed by Major N Simmons, Ib - Ic Adv LHQ, expiring 1 Mar 44, has been reported stolen. The pass was last sighted in the possession of the holder on the evening 14/15 May 43.

Appropriate steps will be taken to prevent the use of the above pass, apprehend anyone trying to do so, and advise this HQ immediately of any such attempt.

91. DISPOSAL OF "X" LIST PERSONNEL.(1) "X" List Personnel to be Returned Direct to Units:

It is desired to again emphasize the fact that "X" List personnel of units must be returned direct to their units with the minimum amount of delay possible, either direct from hospital, from detention, from schools, or via the GDD only when it becomes necessary that this Depot should be used for concentration and transit purposes.

(2) Incorrect Use of GDD:

Instances have come under notice recently where school personnel en route from one State to another passing through Vic L of C Area have been wrongly dealt with and have been delayed in reaching their destination, whereas in fact they should have been en route to their destination immediately upon

arrival in Vic L of C Area. As these personnel are being drafted through the State of Victoria there is no reason whatever for their admission to GDD, but rather, if staging becomes necessary, that LTD be used for the purpose. The GDD is only to be used in connection with the concentration for forward movement of personnel who have been attending schools in Vic L of C Area, and then only in such cases where they cannot be more conveniently despatched direct to their units.

(3) Adm Matters to be dealt with at GDD:

"X" List personnel who are received into the GDD for drafting to units will be checked over in regard to administrative requirements, and only those essential matters such as photograph, X-ray and blood grouping will be attended to at GDD, and on Mob 3 rolls will be noted the fact that personnel require further inoculations or vaccination. GDD will also ensure that all entries are complete in pay books of personnel.

92. MARRIAGES OF MEMBERS OF THE AMP.

1. The marriage ceremony of a member of the AMP will not be celebrated in any military camp, station or establishment, except in the case of a marriage in a chapel, church or other religious centre, in which case a Divisional or Force Commander, or Commander L of C Area not below the rank of brigadier, may authorise the ceremony.

Troop movements at Spencer Street Railway Station for the month of May 43.

1. Prisoners

The numbers of military prisoners under escort passing through Spencer Street Railway Stn; going to, or coming from interstate for May 43 would average 6 per day. A number which would be about the same as for previous months.

The number of arrests affected at the station has also remained constant (approx 2 in three days) and are mostly AWLs. The reason being that as a fairly close check on leave passes is continuously going on at the barriers, any soldier who is AWL whilst travelling by train will detrain prior to reaching Spencer St.

A complete check is impossible owing to lack of staff to attend the barriers when more than two trains arrive close together.

2. Behaviour The behaviour of troops on the station is good for two reasons.

Troops (a) The rationing of draught beer and the shortage of bottled liquor has cut down the number of drunks by 60%. The amount of confiscated bottled liquor has also fallen considerably since April and the beginning of May because of the shortage and also the fact that the Services are getting to know that it will be confiscated.

(b) As most of the large military camps have shifted from Victoria there are fewer troops on local leave in the Metropolis.

Civilians Conduct good. Although if allowed to come in contact with military drafts which are waiting on the platform, they tend to provoke and abuse the provost when they are stopped from entering the military platform or are checked from handing their military friends bottled liquor.

This difficulty is overcome when possible by the provost erecting a barrier some distance away from No.7 and 8 Platform.

At irregular intervals, generally about twice monthly, the Civil Construction Corps send drafts of between 100 and 200 men interstate on the special military train at night. These drafts have been very disorderly. The men bring their wives and children to the station. About 15% including a small proportion of the women are drunk and quite a large minority are disorderly in their behaviour.

Their conversation and demeanour suggest that they are mostly conscripted labour, leaving their home state under compulsion, and are therefore looking for any excuse to miss the draft. Such being the case they resent being given directions as to not being allowed to bring liquor or friends onto the station platform, also not being able to leave the military platform when reserved for service trains.

3. Movements

Apart from normal trains there is a special service train arriving from interstate at No 7 Platform at about 1105 hrs daily. This train generally contains 40% each of Army and R.A.A.F. and 20% Naval personnel Approx 20% of all the services are on Victorian Home Leave or duty. The balance of the military personnel are entrained for Royal Park at 1125 hrs. The other services leave Spencer St. on foot. The next service special train is the 1325 hrs departure and consists mainly of leave personnel and drafts from CDD, LTD and R.A.A.F. with a small percentage on movements order.

On three or four nights a week there is the 1840 hrs and, or 1902 hrs Service Special consisting mainly of R.A.A.F. and R.A.N with a small percentage of soldiers. Although in March and the beginning of April the military predominated owing to the presence of the 9th Div and the breaking up of Watsonia Camp.

There is a military special leave train each Sunday evening to Seymour and Bacchus Marsh at about 2000 hrs but as the hotels are closed these trains are very orderly.

SUMMARY WAR DIARY - "A" BRANCH - 1st June to 21st July 43.

The activities of A Branch have been confined to routine correspondence, with the exception of the proposed reduction of Camp Staffs in the Sub Area and the finalization of HQ 7 Melb L of C Sub Area.

The whole of the camp staffs and Sub Area HQs were examined for tropical service, and those found fit have been transferred to forward bases.

The re-organisation of camp staffs was accomplished by making senior officers of static units the Camp Commanding Officer, and the QMs of the old organisations, Camp Adjutants and Camp QMs. The staff was reduced to approximately 6 OR's to be used as storemen clerks.

The finalising of HQ Melb Sub Area has reached the middle stage, wherein the files are being divided into two classes, i.e., those requiring further action or reference in the future, and those files that will be recommended for destruction as requiring no further action and no further reference.

The activities of Melbourne Sub Area have now ceased, and the administrative action necessary for control of personnel and camps has been assumed by HQ Vic L of C Area.

The remaining personnel, including officers and OR's, are being transferred to GDD Caulfield for re-allocation or other suitable action as dictated by the circumstances surrounding personnel concerned.

This will be the last summary of the War Diary submitted by the Staff Capt "A" of this HQs, who will be himself proceeding to other duties as instructed by the Senior formation.

Improvements could be shown in small posts and stations E.G. Searchlights. These posts are somewhat isolated and do not have a great deal of supervision.

Lack of transport precluded constant visits.

Inspections were carried out in most camps and advice and suggestions were given where necessary.

Later check-ups showed a lack of co-operation between units and this branch of the service.

Tests were carried out for Army Inspections Branch on Kieselguhr Filter Earth as used on Mollinite Water Filter Carts.
