ATEBRIN

1. GENERAL.

Atebrin is the basis of malaria control.

If after the issue of this instruction any points are NOT covered in the inst - it will be the responsibility of the individual to report immediately to the Adjt.

In order that full protection is obtained by every member of this Unit, the following instructions covering the administration of ATEBRIN will take effect forthwith:-

2. ATEBRIN PARADES.

(a) Coys will conduct after breakfast each morning, muster parade of all personnel as set out in para 6 of this instruction. All personnel will parade with individual water bottles.

(b) Parades will be held in Coy area.

(c) All Officers will be present and will take ATEBRIN at the same time, in the same manner as OR, in front of parade.

(d) After parade has been fallen in ATEBRIN roll, as issued, will be called, by the senior NCO of platoon or sub unit. As name is called, person will step forward and officer will issue one Atebrin tablet. The person will swallow the atebtrin tablet, at the same time taking a drink of water. It is the officer's responsibility to ensure that the Atebrin tablet is actually swallowed.

(e) After the tablet has been swallowed, the person will call out his name which will be ticked off against the Atebrin roll.

(f) At the conclusion of the parade, officer and senior FCO will make a separate individual check of rolls to ensure that NO person is absent. Certificate to this effect will be completed daily in Atebrin Book.

3. RECORDS.

(a) Atebrin rolls, on basis of one per pl, will be issued from Bn HQ's. They will be a clear and permanent record of the adm of Atebrin within the pl/sub unit. When filled, they will be returned to Bn HQ's and forwarded to Echelon 3 Records for production in any subsequent Court Martial proceedings.

(b) Coy Comd will keep in a book to be provided from this HQ, a permanent daily record certifying that, subject to operational necessity, he has personally supervised the adm of Atebrin within his Coy and attached tys. This will cover a check of all pl Atebrin books. Filled books will be returned to and replenished by Bn HQ as per para 2 (a).

(c) A report on any deficiencies, for any reason whatsoever, will be forwarded to Bn HQ's by quickest possible means, and a permanent record entered in Atebrin books.

(d) These books will be inspected periodically by Bn HQ.

4. SUPPLY AND ACCOUNTING.

(a) Supplies of Atebrin will be replenished under arrangements QM, who will record signatures for same.

(b) Daily after Atebrin parades, Coy comds will record the following information in Atebrin books:-

5. DUTIES, ABSENTEES.

(a) Except as ordered by Bn HQ ALL duty personnel less security guards, sentries, picquets and essential signal personnel will be present at ATEBRIN muster parade.

(b) Coy Orderly Officer and a senior NCO will arrange administration of ATEBRIN to duty sigs and to reliefs of security guards, sentries and picquets.

(c) Disciplinary action will be taken against all absentees.

6. RESPONSIBILITY FOR ADM OF ATEBRIN

(a) Rifle Coys - all personnel, incl att, on ration strength.

(b) HC Coy - all personnel, incl att, on ration strength.

(c) Bn HQ )

(d) RAP incl Padre - RIO

(e) Attached personnel incl supporting arms on ration strength, will conform to the above instrs.

(f) Detachments from HQ Coy will receive Atebrin from Coys to which temporarily attached.

(g) Senior officers of personnel moving out on duty covering more than one day will ensure that necessary supplies of Atebrin are obtained.

7. OUTFITS INDIVIDUAL FIRST AID.

Personnel will be notified that the 32 Atebrin Tablets in the above will only be used in emergency and then only on instrs of senior officer/NCO present.

8. DELEGATION OF RESPONSIBILITY.

(a) The supervision of Atebrin is the personal responsibility of every Officer. On NO account, except with express permission from this HQ or in case of dire operational necessity, will this responsibility be delegated, to a WO, NCO or OR.

(b) For compliance with these instrs, as with all related Anti-malarial instrs, will be dealt with by Court Martial.

(c) Every primary case of Malaria will be the subject of a searching investigation.

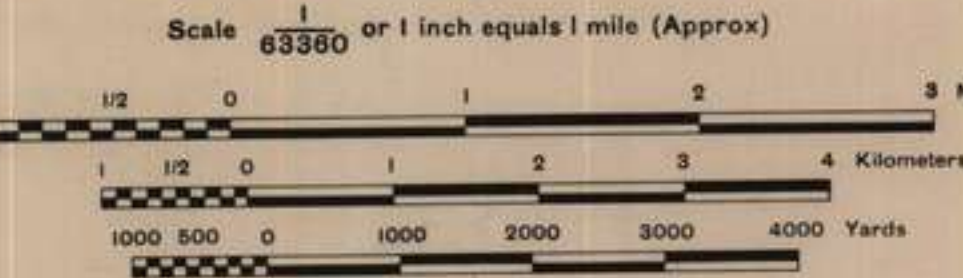
