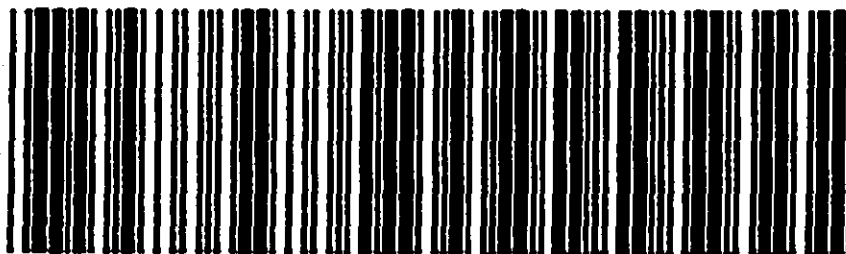

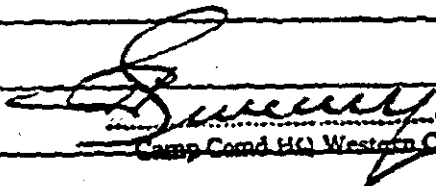

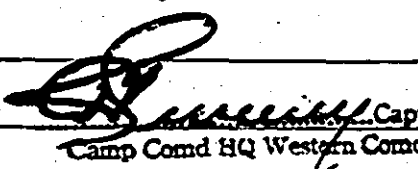

52. HOURS OF DUTY - STAFF - HQ WESTERN COMMAND (CR.159/1/32)

- (1) The hours of duty for personnel on HQ Western Command are:

0845 hrs to 1706 hrs Monday to Friday
with one hour break for lunch

- (2) Heads of Branches and Services will check the times of duty of all their personnel and take necessary action to ensure these times are adhered to.

- (3) All personnel will use the appropriate entrances from Francis Street. The entrance through Staff Corps Mess is out of bounds to all except mess staff.

- (4) Where circumstances warrant any departure of a permanent nature from these hours, heads of Branches etc will obtain approval from the AAG.

53. FIRE PRECAUTIONS - SWAN BARRACKS (CR.30/2/5)

- (1) Fires will not be left burning in offices when offices are vacated for the day.

- (2) Electric lights and heating appliances will be turned off, when vacating offices for the day, to minimise the fire risk and prevent wastage of current.

54. PREPARATION AND SIGNING OF CORRESPONDENCE (CR.35/1/348)

- (1) The name of the writer of official correspondence will be typed below his (her) signature in correspondence addressed to members of the public (including other Commonwealth and State Departments), but not otherwise.

- (2) Paper with printed headings is to be used only when addressing -

- (a) Members of the public (including Commonwealth and State Departments).

- (b) Formations, Units, Branches and Services of the Army NOT located in Western Command.

55. SAVING OF PAPER (CR.214/1/46)

- (1) Certain types of office paper are still in short supply in all parts of the world. Stocks must therefore be conserved just as carefully now as during the actual war period, in order that the increasing demands for non-military use can be met.

(2) In cases where a circular memorandum needs to be given a wide distribution, particular attention is required to ensure that not more than the necessary number of copies is produced, and that each addressee will receive no more than the number actually needed to enable sufficient internal distribution.

(3) It frequently occurs that the distribution list will occupy a greater depth of paper than the actual text of the circular; it is appreciated, that in many instances this is unavoidable, but, by careful spacing of the names of addressees, the surface of the paper can be economically employed.

(4) Quarto or octavo paper will be used for brief communications or for a follow-up page which contains less typing than would fill another foolscap page.

Cadet - Officers desirous of qualifying for Cadetships should note that, except as provided in respect of officers granted leave of absence for war service, eligibility ceases on the date next before the 24th anniversary of birth, if it has not expired earlier.

57. (Contd) The conditions under which officers may acquire eligibility for transfer or promotion to office of Cadet were published in Gazette No. 114 dated 12 JUN 41.

Application to attend the examination must be forwarded to reach the Secretary, Commonwealth Public Service Board, Canberra, A.C.F., not later than 7 Aug 46. 92. SECOND SECURITY LOAN. (M.B.I 113/46)

1. The Second "Security Loan" of £90,000,000 will open for subscription on 15 October 1946 and close not later than 15th November 1946.

2. Arrangements have been made for paymasters and unit pay representatives to accept applications for Commonwealth Government Inscribed Stock or Treasury Bonds from members of the AMF who desire to invest their savings in the Loan, or who desire to allot portion of their future daily rate of pay for investment in the Loan.

Particulars of Loan.-

3. Loan applications may be made for an amount of £10 or a multiple of £10.

4. Treasury bonds are payable to bearer and are issued at par for £10, £50, £100, £500 and £1000.

5. Inscribed stock may be purchased at par for amounts of £100 or multiples of £10 above £100.

6. Interest is payable at 3½% per annum if invested for 12 years and at 2% per annum if invested for 3 years, and will be credited half yearly to a member's savings bank account or current account, if desired.

7. Interest will be subject to Commonwealth taxation but not to any income tax under the law of a state. During the period of uniform taxation, a rebate of 2/- in the pound on interest will be allowed to cover freedom from State taxation.

8. Any bank nominated by a member will, if requested, hold the bonds in safe custody.

Procedure for lodging applications.-

9. Application forms will be available from paymasters and unit pay representatives, and are required to be completed in duplicate. An applicant's signature will be witnessed by an officer.

92. SECOND SECURITY LOAN. (contd)

10. Sufficient credit must be available in the member's pay book to cover the amount he or she desires to invest in the loan. The amount subscribed will be debited in the pay book.

11. Cash may be accepted in payment of a loan subscription, in which case the amount tendered will be entered in the pay book to establish the necessary credit and a pay sergeant's or cash office receipt issued and pasted in the pay book.

12. Deposits on account of loan subscriptions will not be accepted.

13. The Commonwealth Bank will forward to a member an interim receipt for the amount subscribed.

14. Members who have funds to their credit held by Commonwealth or State Savings Banks may have such funds or any part of such funds invested in the Loan by the bank concerned. A special "Commonwealth Loan Withdrawal Form" which is acceptable to all Savings Banks, is available from paymasters and unit pay representatives. The form consists of two sections, of which the top section is a withdrawal authority and the lower section is an instruction to the bank concerned to enter a debit in the member's pay book and return it to the address or person designated by the depositor. In addition to the Withdrawal Form, the member must complete a Loan Application form in accordance with paragraph 9 above. The following action will then be taken :-

- (i) Where the passbook is held by the Serviceman, he may hand the withdrawal section, together with completed loan application forms, to the unit loan officer, or, alternatively, send them direct to the branch of the Savings Bank named in the passbook. In either event, the bottom portion of the form must be completed and despatched with the passbook to the bank for entry of the relevant transaction.
- (ii) Where the passbook is held by a relative or friend, the procedure outlined above will apply to disposal of the signed withdrawal form and completed application, while the bottom section of the withdrawal form should be detached and forwarded by the serviceman to the person holding the passbook, with a request that they present both the form and the passbook to the savings Bank branch named in the form.

It is imperative that the same Savings Bank branch shall be named both on the withdrawal authority and letter of advice.

15. Approval has been given for members of the AMF to subscribe to Commonwealth Loans by making an allotment of portion of their pay to the Commonwealth Bank. Amounts received by the bank under the allotment will be credited to a special account in the member's name and interest will be allowed thereon at the rate borne by the bonds selected for purchase by the member. As often as funds in the account accumulate to the extent of £10, the bank will purchase a £10 Commonwealth Treasury Bond on behalf of the member.

16. Bonds will be held by the Commonwealth Bank at the capital city of the member's state of enlistment for safe custody on behalf of the member.

92. SECOND SECURITY LOAN. (contd)

17. Where a member is discharged or cancels his allotment the special account will be closed and any balance remaining therein will be credited to the member's bank account, or paid to him, whichever he desires.

18. Both Treasury Bonds and Inscribed Stock are readily realisable and may be sold at any time. Any bank or stockbroker will arrange this for a member, if desired.

19. Further information on the Loan may be obtained by members from the liaison officers who have been appointed in each unit and formation headquarters.-

93. INCIDENTS AND PREVENTION OF VEHICLE ACCIDENTS. (MBI 114/46)

1. Recent inspections of workshops and motor transport records in commands and districts have revealed that, even though the number of army vehicles on the road have been reduced, the percentage of motor accidents involving army vehicles has greatly increased during the last six months.

2. These inspections also reveal that, although most of the serious accidents have been reported, many minor accidents, in the aggregate necessitating a large number of man hours for repairs, have not been reported. In addition, it is known that, in some cases, disciplinary action has not been taken where accidents have occurred as the result of negligent driving or speeding.

3. This high accident rate, combined with the general shortage of personnel, has placed so great a strain on repair facilities that it is barely possible to keep essential vehicles on the road.

4. It is known that comprehensive instructions exist in all formations and units to govern the use and maintenance of vehicles. It can only be assumed that responsible HQs are not adequately supervising the carrying out of these instructions.

5. It is the duty of every officer to report breaches of road discipline and careless driving, regardless of the formation or unit to which the vehicle or driver belongs.

6. Attention is directed to the provisions of MBI 51/46 concerning "~~Maximum Speed of Vehicles~~".

7. Officers concerned are responsible that existing regulations and instructions are enforced and will therefore ensure -

- (1) that each driver receive adequate instruction in the civil traffic regulations applicable in the area in which the unit is operating before he is detailed for driving duty in that area;
 - (11) that, before any driver is detailed to drive in an area where heavy road traffic can reasonably be anticipated, he has had adequate training for driving under such conditions, including experience under capable supervision;

- 4 -

93. INCIDENCE AND PREVENTION OF VEHICLE ACCIDENTS. (contd)

(iii) that the closest surveillance is maintained at all times on the conduct of all drivers of motor transport, on speeds and on the general manner in which vehicles are used, and that disciplinary action is taken against a driver exceeding the speed limit or driving in a dangerous manner or whilst under the influence of liquor.

(iv) that all accidents, even if of a minor nature are reported in accordance with para 13 of "Standing Orders for Drivers of Mechanical Vehicles - 1945". Officers commanding workshops and light aid detachments will ensure that, when repair is necessitated through unfair wear, damage or lack of unit maintenance in any way, a report is submitted in accordance with GRO 207/1945.

8. From the date of issue of this instruction, offences against orders for the use and maintenance of mechanical vehicles will be considered "unusually prevalent" and will be treated as such by formation commanders, commanding officers and courts-martial (vide AMR & O 558 (3)).

9. Para 8 above will not be cancelled until AHQ is satisfied that the vehicle accident figure is within reasonable bounds.
