In any case the application must reach the Divisional Returning Officer to whom it is ~~addressed~~ addressed prior to 6 p.m. on 20 Sep 40.

Electors who are within the State for which they are enrolled may vote on polling day at any polling place in that State.



2 SAFETY OF TROOPS ON NIGHT MARCHING

Whenever columns of troops are marching at night on unlighted streets or roadways, lights such as hurricane lamps will be carried. When marching in column a light will be carried in front and in rear. The lights will be swung on the approach of a motor or other vehicle.

3 RUBBISH BINS

Troops are reminded once again that lids MUST be replaced on rubbish bins.

4 LIQUOR

Troops are also reminded once again that the introduction of intoxicating liquor into the camp area is forbidden. Disciplinary action will be taken against any further infringement of this order.

5. LIGHT DUTIES

Light duty men must report to the Bn Orderly Officer at Bn HQ at 0900 hrs on the day they are placed on light duties by the R M O. Any personnel failing to do so in future will be regarded as absentees and dealt with accordingly.



All cigarettes packed for the Australian Comforts Fund bear the Red Star Brand on the outside of the packet as well as on the inner slide. The sale of any such goods is forbidden and any member purchasing goods so branded must immediately report the circumstances to this HQ. This also applies to goods branded in any form with the insignia of the Red Cross or similar institution.
