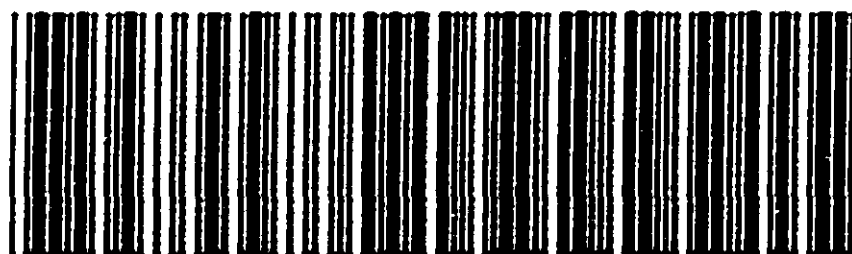

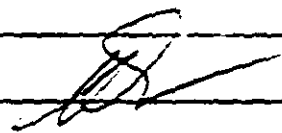

TRAINING OF PERSONNEL TO COMBAT FIRES ETC., CAUSED BY

E.A. INCENDIARY.

1. Any loss of stores or petrol is a very serious matter to AUSTRALIA, and particularly so in N.T. Force. Difficulty of transport and handling makes it imperative that losses are kept to a minimum.

2. The danger of fire by E.A. Incendiary is considerably increased by the dry grass and scrub surrounding dumps and installations. It is the duty and responsibility of all concerned to see that the areas immediately surrounding dumps and stores are cleared, but even this does not wholly remove the threat.

3. Subjoined are some details of Japanese Incendiary Bombs and methods of dealing with them. Units Comds will ensure that their personnel are instructed on these details, and also that the simple provisions necessary are made.

4. Remember, and impress on the men, that unexploded bombs are the responsibility of Bomb Disposal Units, who are trained to deal with them; but all men must know how to combat fire after it has occurred.

METHODS OF DEALING WITH EXPLODED JAPANESE INCENDIARY BOMBS.

5. Up to date, the Japanese have mainly used 50 KG Inc., 60 KG (HE and Inc) and 80 KG Inc. Larger Inc bombs have been used but the main filling is generally the same. THERMIT. Smaller bombs in greater number may be used. The "HE and Inc Bombs" are generally filled with rubber bungs impregnated with phosphorous dissolved in carbon disulphide. These bombs have been largely used about air fields and installations owing to their dual purpose.

6. The one essential to incendiary components is oxygen. Without it, they will not burn. In some cases, water temporarily quells the burning agent, but when it dries will again burst into flame. Therefore sand (in the absence of special foam appliances) is the easiest and most practical thing to use to smother and prevent oxygen getting to the incendiary agent.

7. 50 KG. INCENDIARY BOMB - THERMIT TYPE - (JAPANESE). This bomb is similar in outward design and size to the Japanese 50 Kg HE bomb. The body of the bomb and the conical-shaped portion with fins attached are painted light grey. The tail fin supports at the end of the fins are painted red.

The overall length is 3ft 4 in., and the diameter of the body is 7½ inches.

The main filling of the bomb is Thermit contained in four electron inserts.

On impact the fuze system ignites the Thermit in the electron inserts and a black powder charge in the bomb is exploded, thus bursting the bomb casing and throwing the ignited inserts in all directions. It might sometimes happen that the bomb casing has not burst open sufficiently to allow the inserts to be expelled. In this case they would burn within the casing and would be difficult to reach because of intense heat. A major fire would result if the bomb has fallen in a building.

METHOD OF DEALING WITH AN EXPLODED BOMB. - Each insert may quickly cause a major fire unless dealt with at once. In many instances it will be possible for personnel to reach the insert early and deal with it by means of the stirrup pump, (if available), or smother it with sand as it lies, or rake it clear of materials which will burn, and then smother with sand. It may often be the case, however, that these inserts will not be reached early enough to be dealt with as above, with the result that a major fire will ensue.

UNEXPLODED BOMB - ACTION TO BE TAKEN. - The incident should be reported and temporary measures should be taken to cover the bomb with earth or sandbags not less than 2 ft deep, taking great care not to touch or put pressure on the fuze. A danger notice must be placed at the site of the incident. The disposal of an unexploded bomb of this type is the duty of the Bomb Disposal Unit.

8. 60 Kg. DUAL PURPOSE BOMB (H.E. & INCENDIARY) - (JAPANESE). - This bomb is similar in outward design and size to the Japanese 60 Kg. H.E. Bomb. The body of the bomb, the conical-shaped tail portion, and the fins are painted grey. Around the body at the point of balance is painted a white band. The overall length of the bomb is 3 ft 4½ in., and the diameter of the body is 7½ inches. The bomb is filled with a large number of rubber bungs or pellets impregnated with phosphorus dissolved in carbon disulphide. In addition, there is a picric powder (H.E.) charge in the nose and core of the bomb.

INCENDIARY ACTION. - The H.E. charge is sufficient to cause fragmentation of metal up to 80 yds, and scatter the rubber bungs over an area up to a distance of 50 yards.

The rubber bungs, when first expelled from the bomb, are in a sticky condition and will adhere to vertical surfaces. The moisture content will penetrate soft surfaces which may burst into flame after a bung has been removed. The bung will burst into flame upon the rapid evaporation of the moisture content. Even after being wetted or submerged in water, it will again burst into flame upon drying out. A bung will normally burn for about two hours.

METHOD OF DEALING WITH AN EXPLODED BOMB. - If the bomb has exploded on impact, numerous subsidiary fires may link up to form an extensive area of conflagration if the bungs are not quickly gathered up and plunged, and kept submerged in water; they can later be taken to a safe place and allowed to burn out harmlessly.

Smothering with damp or dry sand is another safe way of dealing with these incendiary agents. A close watch must be kept on contaminated materials for some time after a bung has been removed, for reasons above stated. A solution of copper sulphate sprayed on will neutralize incendiary action in any part so affected if removal or demolishing is impracticable.

When using the stirrup pump, care is to be taken that these bungs are not driven by the force of the water into inaccessible places.

Extreme care must be taken not to allow a bung to touch any part of the skin, as a very severe burn will result which will be difficult to heal. Care must also be taken not to allow clothing to come into contact with the moist bung. A first aid measure for skin contamination is by washing in a copper sulphate solution or carbon tetrachloride and then seeking medical treatment.

If the bomb bursts in a confined space (e.g., the room of a building) and the H.E. charge has been insufficient to cause scattering of the bungs beyond a limited radius, a major fire will result.

UNEXPLODED BOMB - ACTION TO BE TAKEN. - Because of the high H.E. content, an unexploded bomb of this type must be regarded as the equivalent of an unexploded H.E. bomb, and precautions taken accordingly.

On encountering an unexploded bomb of this type, action should be taken to report the incident and to enforce Safety Distances as for H.E. bombs, BURIED or UNBURIED, as the case may be. The disposal of the bomb is the responsibility of the Bomb Disposal Unit.

9. 50 Kg INCENDIARY BOMB - PARAFFIN WAX & THERMIT TYPE - (JAPANESE). This bomb has the outline appearance of a 60 Kg H.E. Bomb. The body of the bomb, the conical-shaped tail portion, and the fins are painted grey. A red band is painted around the end of the tail fins, and a thin red line is painted on the body of the bomb from the nose to the end of the tail portion. The overall length of the bomb is 3 ft 6½ in., and the diameter of the body is 7½ inches.

The main filling of the bomb is paraffin wax mixed with kerosene and contained in six (6) steel compartments. A tube filled with Thermit runs through the centre of the bomb as a core.

On impact a small charge in the nose of the bomb initiates incendiary action, bursts the bomb casing, and the Thermit and paraffin wax burn as a compact mass.

METHOD OF DEALING WITH AN EXPLODED BOMB. - Generally an ignited bomb will cause a major fire unless dealt with at once. An attempt should be made to extinguish with sand or foam. Sand should be thrown on lightly. If a stream of water is used to saturate the surrounding parts, care must be taken not to spread or flow the burning mass further afield.

UNEXPLODED BOMB - ACTION TO BE TAKEN. - The incident should be reported and temporary measures should be taken to cover the bomb with earth or sandbags not less than 2 ft deep, taking great care not to touch or put pressure on the fuze. A Danger notice must be placed at the site of the incident. The disposal of an unexploded bomb of this type is the responsibility of a Bomb Disposal Unit.

10. INCENDIARY DISCS OR LEAVES. Incendiary discs may be used by the enemy to fire crops, woods, &c. The discs may be oval or oblong in shape, varying from 4 in x 3 in to 9 in x 6 in., and about $\frac{3}{8}$ inch in thickness. They may be made of a sponge rubber, coloured light yellow, and with one side coated with white phosphorus. When dry these discs catch fire spontaneously.

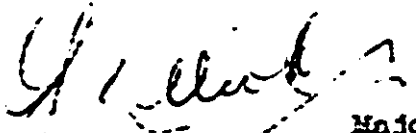
METHODS OF DISPOSAL. - Discs should be wetted and moved, without touching the heads, to a place where they can be allowed to burn themselves out. There are no explosive risks if the discs are kept in small quantities. The discs should not be dropped in the sea or inland waters where they may be washed up against vulnerable objects. When the disc is extinguished with water before it is completely burned out, a small area around the disc should be cleared in order to allow the scattered phosphorus to burn away with safety when it dries up. Alternatively, earth round the disc can be scooped up and transferred to a place where the phosphorus can burn away safely. The discs may land on surfaces which cannot be treated in this way and any phosphorus which still adheres to such surfaces should be burnt away with a blow lamp after the disc has been removed. Phosphorus is poisonous when eaten and causes burns on coming into contact with the skin. Live stock should be removed from any area in which incendiary discs are known to be present.

11. FIRE COMBAT.

(a) When shovels are used to remove burning agents, make sure that sand is on the shovel.

(b) With big incendiary bombs, it is not possible to extinguish as a rule, but it may be possible to isolate or localize.

(c) Remember and plan for known methods of "breaking" and "burning back" to prevent spread.

- " 12 To Darwin with O.O. 11 L of C Sub Area Ord. Depot who was on visit from Alice Springs. General Ordnance matters discussed. Procedure of Shipping outlined to the visiting Officer.
- " 14 With Lieut. Palmer, Officer in charge of N.T. Recce Unit Auxillary Ketch "AROETTA" assisting in preparation of E2a Extracts covering Equipment on charge.
- " 16 Checked over Equipment returned by A.K. "AROETTA" which was forwarded to Vestey's Transit Store.
- " 17 Completed E2a Extracts for "AROETTA". Had forms signed by Lieut. Palmer. Then Forwarded to ADCS for Approval.
