1 TRAIN TRAVELLING - INTOXICATING LIQUOR

No member of the forces, when in uniform, will carry, or cause to be carried, on to any train on which he is travelling or about to travel, or have in his possession or control or consume whilst travelling in any train, any intoxicating liquor unless it is consumed by him as part of a meal supplied in a dining car in the train in which he is travelling.

2 LOSS OF PAY BOOKS

1. Members of the AMF who wilfully destroy or lose by neglect their pay books will be charged under AA 24(1), AA 24(2) or AA40, whichever is appropriate in the particular circumstances.
2. Members making false statements in declarations regarding the loss of their pay books will be charged under AA25(1).

3 DEPOSITS TO PAY BOOKS AND CASH REMITTANCES

1. The attention of all members is drawn to the necessity for obtaining official receipts for all moneys paid to members of the AAPC.
2. The official receipts issued by AAPC personnel are of two kinds, viz :-
  - (i) Pay Sergeants' Receipts (WF176) - issued by pay sergeants and personnel carrying out pay duties within units;
  - (ii) Commonwealth of Australia Official Receipts (as used in all Commonwealth Government Departments) - issued by paymasters of formations and depot cash offices.
3. Deposits to pay books. - Credits arising from cash deposits appearing in members' pay books are only accepted as bona fide in cash offices if one of the above receipts for the amount of the credit is affixed to the back of the pay book. Unless this credit entry is so supported, no portion thereof can be drawn until confirmation is obtained.
4. Cash remittances. - Upon completion of a Cash Remittance (Form WF131A) the remitter must receive from the member of the AAPC concerned one of the above receipts for the amount paid by him, the number of which should be quoted in any inquiry relative to same.
5. It is the responsibility of all members to obtain receipts for all moneys paid to members of the AAPC.

6. NEI CURRENCY

Deposits to paybook will be limited to amount of NEI Currency drawn whilst in NEI, under no circumstances will larger deposits or cash remittances be made.

7. REDEMPTION OF GUILDER CURRENCY FROM AMF.

Redemption of guilders from AMF personnel either in NEI by way of cash payment for remissions to Australia or elsewhere or on return to Australia to be limited in any one case to amount drawn by member in guilders as pay during service in NEI. Amount redeemable on return to Australia will be the amount of pay drawn in guilders less remittances and less credits to pay books.

Redemption of Guilders to be made only by service paymasters. The Commonwealth Bank will cease to purchase guilders from troops. Members returning to Australia with Guilders are to declare and produce at Port of disembarkation (at the same time as redemption in accordance with part 1 is made) guilder holdings in excess of those redeemed by paymasters. Lists showing names addresses and excess holdings declared to be forwarded by paymasters to NEI authorities in BRISBANE SYDNEY or MELBOURNE. NEI authorities will consider whether redemption of excess holdings limited to the amount declared and listed will be made in full or in part when total liability for redemption is known in due course.

FORCE INSTRUCTIONS

Second Japanese Army

GENERAL

1. This instruction is a consolidation and amendment of MAKASSAR FORCE Instructions No 2 and 6 concerning the concentration of Japanese Forces.

2. MAKASSAR FORCE Instructions Nos 2 and 6 and MAKASSAR FORCE Administrative No 1 except in so far as it relates to purchases for December are hereby cancelled.

CONCENTRATION

3. The main concentration area is at MALIMPOENG. Boundaries of this area are shown on sketch attached as appendix "A".

4. All Japanese Naval and Army personnel and civilians, with the exception of those authorised as per appendices "B" and "C", will be concentrated in the main concentration area at MALIMPOENG by 15 January 46.

5. All personnel remaining as <sup>per</sup> appendix "C" will be concentrated by 28 Feb 46.

PERSONNEL AUTHORISED TO REMAIN OUTSIDE MALIMPOENG CONCENTRATION AREA

6. Permanently

The personnel shown in appendix "B" may be stationed permanently in the areas specified for the purposes shown therein. This however, is subject to periodical review.

7. Temporarily

The personnel shown in appendix "C" may remain in the areas specified, as guards until stores have been cleared from dumps, but, in any case NOT later than 28 Feb 46. In the meantime this will be subject to periodical review.

WEAPONS

8. The following weapons and ammunition may be retained, subject to further orders :-

9. You will submit to this HQ by 15 Jan 46 a return showing :-

(a) Allotment of rifles to each area specified in appendices "B" and "C" separately.

(b) A nominal roll of all officers authorised to carry pistol showing rank, name and location.



10. (c) All persons authorised to carry arms will be issued with a permit as specified in para 4 to MAKASSAR FORCE of letter G249 of 2 November 45.

VEHICLES

11. You may retain the following vehicles for use within the concentration area and between this area and subsidiary areas :-

12. All other transport will be controlled by 2/14 Aust Inf Bn, and will be used to concentrate Japanese stores.

13. The maximum continuous use will be made of all available vehicles for this purpose.

FOOD AND NECESSARIES

14. Rice

- (a) You are authorised to continue concentration of 1700 tons of rice, from dumps already under your control at RAPANG.
- (b) Issue of this rice in accordance with authorised scale will be controlled by 2/8 Aust Sup Depot Pl.
- (c) This rice is sufficient for your forces until approximately 30 Jun 46. After that date rice up to authorised scale, will be purchased through NICA, under arrangements between the Dutch and Japanese Governments.

15. Vegetables Etc

- (a) The cultivation areas already allotted has been increased by the addition of the emergency areas specified in appendix "B" to MAKASSAR FORCE Instruction No 6.
- (b) The present allotted areas are shown in appendix "A" attached.
- (c) By intensive cultivation of these areas and any suitable land within the concentration area, you will make yourselves self sufficient in vegetables by 28 Feb 46.
- (d) Until these areas are productive, but not after 28 Feb 46, you will be permitted to purchase locally these balancing items. This will only be effected, however, under arrangements this HQ. You will submit your requirements for investigation by this HQ and NICA, at least 14 days prior to the desired date of purchase.
- (e) Details as to method of purchasing these supplies will be issued by this HQ in the form of Administrative Instructions when required.

16. Other Necessaries to be Purchased Locally

Meat, edible oil, firewood, limestone and bark may be purchased up to the authorised scale, under similar arrangements to those applicable to vegetables.

17. Necessaries to be Purchased Within Concentration Area

Permission is given for the production of the following necessaries within the Concentration Area :-

- (a) Soy  
(b) Miso  
(c) Lince  
(d) Toilet Paper



18. Fishing

- (a) The fishing area and ports shown in sketch attached as appendix "D" are allotted for your use, subject to the following restrictions :-
- (i) No dynamite ammunition or other explosive of any kind will be used.
  - (ii) There will be absolutely no interference with Indonesian Fishermen. Whenever Japanese and Indonesian interests clash the Japanese will give way and move to another area.
  - (iii) Certain areas marked "Rajah's Private Ground - Fishing Prohibited" will be OUT OF BOUNDS to all Japanese.
- (b) The numbers of personnel allotted for fishing duties is shown in both appendices "B" and "D".

19. General

- (a) All Japanese are forbidden to attempt to make local individual purchases of food from natives, or to obtain food from any source other than through the authorised method of supply as set out above.
- (b) Any Japanese found engaged in this practice will be arrested.

CONTROL OF PERSONNEL

20. Each Japanese will be issued with a Pass, as per Pro-Forma attached as appendix "E" stating his name, area in which stationed, and in case of personnel on transport or communication duties the areas through which he must pass in carrying out such duties.

21. These Passes will be prepared by this HQ and passed on to you for completion of details by 15 Jan 46.

22. They will be carried by the Japanese at all times and will be produced on demand of any Officer or Other Rank of the Allied Services.

23. Movement of Japanese will be restricted to the areas and routes indicated on sketch as attached as appendix "F". Any Japanese found in any other area after 15 Jan 46 will be immediately arrested and may be shot on sight.

24. (a) Routes shown in BLUE may be used up till 28 Feb 46.  
(b) Routes shown in RED may be used permanently.

INTER COMMUNICATION

24. The only wireless communications which are authorised are those shown in Wireless Diagram attached as Appendix "G".



25. By 15 Jan 46 all other Japanese Wireless Stations will be closed down and the personnel moved to the concentration area. The equipment will be dismantled and handed over to the nearest AMF HQ.
