The conduct of the operations in Northern Bougainville is far from satisfactory. The Bn has been here for over 4 weeks and has not made any forward movement, due to policy laid down by 2 Corps. In that time, our casualties have been:-

Our L of C from 'B' Ech at 307693 to forward coys at RURI BAY 315714 and 306712 had been a difficult thing to handle, as the Jap had virtually been conceded the initiative, knew the country intimately, and had freedom of movement, onto our long exposed L of C. He has used in the main only small parties of 3 to 5. In two instances, on the newly cut track from 'A' Coy to RURI BAY did he use parties of 10 - 12.

The Bde Comd, submitted to 2 Aust Corps on 9 July a plan for a drive up Middle Track with 27 Bn, sp by arty, tanks, air etc. His appreciation was that the harassing tactics of the Jap would immediately cease, and that in all probability, with initial success in the drive, the Jap would withdraw to the line TARBUT - PORTON.

His objective was PORTON - CHABAI. With the est of a beachhead on PORTON - CHABAI, a drive across the narrow neck of the peninsula would have been simple, and the holding of that line, easier than the previous line. This plot met with general approval and all agreed with the assumptions made.

The plan did not meet with the approval of 2 Aust Corps. It ruled out any question of making any advance on broad lines, and laid down a policy for a contraction of dispositions, and for penetrating and harassing patrols. In effect, the 2 Bns would concentrate in the RATSUA area - covering a front of 4000 yards, and leaving 4000 yards to RURI BAY open. By patrolling, the force is to contain the Jap forces. The Brig read into this; sufficient latitude to enable him to make a series of advances along Tasui Track, by use of fighting patrols of not more than one pl strength, sp by tanks, plus patrols to NE sp by tanks. This could quite possibly have had the same effect as the earlier plan, and left us with hope for some real action and gains.

In consequence, re-disposition of the force was made. It provided for the security of the RATSUA Area, and the implementation of the patrolling policy. It envisaged the prior capture of COMMO RIDGE by 8 Bn, after which 27 Bn would take over the ridge as a F.D.L. Bn HQ in each case, were sited forward for easier control. One Coy of each Bn was to spend a period of rest on SORAKEN Peninsula, in rotation.

The new dispositions were adopted by Wednesday 18 July. The taking of COMMO RIDGE was planned for Sunday 22 July. Thereafter, 27 Bn was to occupy COMMO RIDGE with one Company.

REMARKS 21 JULY 45

WAR DIARY

On Friday 20 July in the afternoon, BGS 2 Corps arrived at Bde HQ and interviewed the Brig. Apparently the GOC was in the main, in accord with the appreciation, but not with the plan. The upshot of it is, that dispositions, as indicated by GOC personally, will be adopted by the Bns. This involved the re-disposition of a company in each case, to a rear area, and each Bn HQ back at RATSUA. Patrol bases to be formed to N and NE, in the country we have recently vacated, and penetrating patrols into enemy territory. No consideration apparently has been given to the lengthened L of C, to overcome which, the initial re-dispositions were made, nor to the gaps between company areas, nor effect of momale of units which have been promised a fight for so long and are still to be confined to patrolling for nothing more than harassing. The most astounding feature however, is that Bde and Bn comds are denied the right of disposing of their own comds, in order to carry out the task allotted them.

It is impossible to understand why this policy of conducting this op is adopted. With the force we have, which incl one bty 25 pounders, tp 3.7, 2 pls 4.2 mortars, 2 pls 3" mortars, a tp of tanks, we outnumber the Jap, who has little if any sp arms, and the taking of the Peninsula would be an accomplished fact in a matter of 2 weeks. We are likely to be here for months.

> 2. A member proceeding on Leave will not carry arms, helmet (steel) or respirator, except in the following oircumstances -

- (1) if the member will not return to the unit after . leave leage personnel of units being disbanded are in some cases granted leave and are required to report to enother unit on completion of icevo);
- if the member is granted Leave during movement of his unit;
- (111) if the member is granted leave on completion of which he will report to another unit on transfer or for attachment;
- if the member is granted leave from a school or (iv) course which he has been attending and will not return to the school or course on completion of the leave:
- if adequate arrangements for safeguarding the (v) member's arms, helmot (steel) and respirator cannot be made in accordance with sub-para (o) of this paragraph;
- if, for any other reason, the member's CO or the (vi) officer commending the unit responsible for his administration considers it essential.
- A member proceeding on leave will not carry ammunition except when required to carry out a specific military duty for which ammunition is allotted. Such ammunition will bo withdrawn from the member immediately the specific duty is commeleted.

4. (i) A member proceeding on leave with his arms, helmet (steel) or respirator, in accordance with this order, will deposit them for safe oustedy at the Aust Army clockroom attached to the last LTD or staging camp through which he passes before proceeding on leave.

(ii) Deposits will be accepted by Aust Army cloakrooms for the duration of the member's leave only, and will be collected by him before commencing

(iii) Aust Army cleakrooms, under the control of Aust Kit Stores, are located at or adjacent to central railway stations in all capital cities in Australia (except Hobart) and proper facilities for the security of arms and equipment are provided therein. Similar facilities will shortly be available at certain LTDs and RR & GDDs.

(iv) Arms and equipment will not be taken to the home

(v) Arms and equipment will not be deposited by a member in a cloakroom other than an Aust Army cloakroom, for will they be left unattended in a hotel, restaurant, cafe or similar place.

## 32. MALARIA PREGLUTIONS

2 Aust Corps RO Al56/

- 1. Records show that over the last three weeks the number of malaria cases in the BOUGAINVILLE area is increasing.
- 2. This increase is directly related to failure of discipline and laxity in precautionary measures.
- 3. All units will immediately survey the implementation of the malaria code and correct any faults appearing.

## 33. MEDICAL AND DISTRICT THEATH OF MANBERS OF THE AMF

Appx A to GRO 155/45

- NOTE: This is merely a summary of GRO 155/45. All members are responsible for acquainting themsolves with the full provisions of that GRO.
- 1. (a) Subject to certain conditions and exceptions act out in GRO 155/45, a member is entitled to receive medical treatment and to be supplied with medical requisites necessary to hender and maintain him fit for military service and to restore him to normal health, A copy of GRO 155/45 is available for inspection in the unit orderly room.
  - (b) Mombers on occupational LWOP are entitled to medical treatment in accordance with the provisions of LHQ Mamo 168085 of 4th December 1944.

#### Medical treatment

2. Except as provided in para 3 below or in GRO 155/45 or in IMQ Memo 168085 of 4 Dec 44 (dealing with medical treatment of members on occupational LWOP), a member requiring medical treatment at army expense will obtain it from an army medical unit, and will not obtain or attempt to obtain medical treatment at army expense from an area medical officer, or a civilian doctor or a public, intermediate or private hospital.

# Application for medical treatment

3. (a) A member requiring medical treatment at army expense will apply for it to:-

(ii) the unit by which he is being administered or (ii) if that is not practicable, to the nearest army medical unit; or

(iii) if that is not practicable, to the nearest RAN or RAAF medical units or

(iv) if that is not practicable, to the nearest area medical officer; or

(v) if that is not practicable, to a repatriation hospital; or

(vi) if that is not practicable, to a public hospital; or (vii) if that is not practicable, to a civilian doctor.

(b) 4 claim for expense incurred in obtaining modical treatment from a civilian dector will be rejected unless it is established to the satisfaction of the DDMS or 4DM3 of the relevant command or 1 of 0 area that it was impracticable for the member to obtain such treatment from any of the abevementioned service units, from an area medical officer, or from a repatriction or public bospital.

## Admission to hospitalk-

4. A member requiring to be comitted to hespital will be admitted:-

(a) to an army hospital,
(b) if that is not practicable, to a RAN or RAAF hospital;

(c) if that is not practicable, to a repatriation hospital

(d) if that is not practicable, to a public hospital.

5. Under special eircumstances, a member may be admitted to a private or intermediate hospital.

6. Modical treatment and hespitalization obtained in accordance with para S(a) or in the proper hospital is free. All other treatment is not free and must be paid for by the member.

# Medical cortificatos:-

7. A member unable, because of sickness or injury, to return from loave on the due date will send a medical certificate to the unit which released him on leave. The certificate should reach the latter unit before the expiry of the leave.

8. The certificate, signed and dated by the doctor, must in-

(c) the diagnosis of the member's condition;

(b) the treatment given and/or prescribed:
the time during which it is estimated by the doctor that the member will be unable to travel.

9. A member unable to travel on the estimated date will forward a further medical certificate on or prior to that date to the unit which released him on leave.

10. Failure to forward the certificates, in accordance with paras 7 and 9, may result in the member being posted AWL and payment of allotment and dependent's allowance being suspended.

11. A member on leave who obtains treatment from a civilian doctor who is not an area medical officer will send to his unit on the conclusion of the treatment a medical certificate containing the following particulars:

(a) the diagnosis of the momber's condition; (b) the treatment given to and/or prescribed for the member.

# Modicines and drossings:-

officer, an area medical officer and a civilian doctor may be obtained free from -

(a) an army dispensary; or a civilian chamist, if the madical officer of doctor endorses an authority on the prescription for purchase from a civilian chamist. Otherwise, the member will have to pay for them.

## Spectacles: -

- 13. Spectacles prescribed by an army medical officer or optometrist are supplied free.
- 14. Spectacles, whether supplied by the Army or not, worn by a member may be repaired without charge by an army optical unit.

# Artificial limbs and surgical did: -

- 15. Artificial limbs and surgical aids are supplied free, if prescribed by a medical officer.
- 16. Repairs of and adjustment to surgical aids and artificial limbs used by a member will be made without charge by the Army if authorized by a medical officer.

## Dental treatment:-

- 17. Subject to certain exceptions and conditions in certain cases, a member is entitled to dental treatment necessary to render or maintain him fit for military service.
- 18. Dental treatment cannot be obtained free from civilian dentists, except on the authority of a CO.
- 19. Under certain conditions, a member may be reimbursed for dental expenses incurred on leave, but only in accordance with the following scales-

# Maximum fee Extractions (limited to 2 toeth on each period of leave) (including the use of local anaesthetic) Temporary sedative fillings (limited to 2 fillings on each period of leave) Simple repairs to dentures (fracture of denture or replacement of tooth) 10/- maximum charge

# Ownership of spectacles, etcs-

20. Artificial limbs, surgical aids, spectacles and dentures, supplied by the Army, belong to it until the member is discharged or finalized, when they become the property of the member.

# Forfeiture of pay: -

21. If a member is absent from duty owing to illness, injury or wounds due to an action or conduct constituting an offence of

which he is convicted, his CO may authorize the forfeiture of pay for the period of his absence. (WFR 27).

22. If the CO authorizes such forfeiture, the cost for medical and hospital attention will also be debited to the pay account of the member at the following rates:-

Officers in hospital

14/- per day

Soldiers in hospital

12/- per day

Members in convalencent depots and convalencent homes

6/- per day

Mombers not in hospitals, convalescent depots or convalescent homes

2/9 per day.

# PART I

(a) No enemy posses in area though roving patrols operate throughout.

(b) No strong posns to engage by arty.

(c) Route can be followed by compass bearings and firm base located by digging.

(d) Engaged and harassed small enemy party at firm base.

(e) Ground could be used for future ops with tanks to firm base but would be unsuitable after heavy rains. Area north firm base could be negotiated by tanks with considerable difficulty, owing to heavy timber.

(f) No enemy posns contacted.

## PART II

## 1. TOPOGRAPHICAL

Corduroy track contacted 306712 (Old D Goy area). Footpad running east and west from old Aust posn 360715 on bearing 130°. This track swings direct east past firm base. Track running from Old Aust posn 300715 on bearing 60° to another Old Aust Posn 304716.

Well defined track at 300719 running at 2490 with enemy sig cable running along it.

Track at 301718 not located.

Numerous foot pads not too well defined were observed throughout patrol.

# 2. ACTION OWN

NARRATIVE

- (a) Sub Recce Patrol No 1:- Moved out from initial firm base 301714 at bearing of 324° for 300 yds hence on 212° for 400 yds, 74° for 350 yds. Area covered on either side of bearings 50 to 100 yds. Contacted Old Aust posn at 300 715.
- (b) Sub Recce Patrol No 2:- Moved from firm base 299716 on bearing 64° for 400 yds. Contacted Kunai 'C' and Old Aust posn at 304717. Moved around Kunai to area 303719 hence on bearing 214° to firm base. Area combed 50 to 100 yds of bearings.
- (c) Sub Recce Patrol No 3: On a bearing of 126 for 400 yds contacted Jap track with double sig cable. Cut cable and booky trapped track. Then followed track approx bearing 2490 for 200 yds. Chopping heard approx 200 yds north of 299719. Then on a zigzag course to general area 298718 then firing was heard from direction of firm base and then from area 297718 moved back on zigzag course to firm base. It was confirmed that first firing was own troops firing on a party of 5 Japs. Casualties Own NIL Enemy 5 killed.
- (d) Two small patrols went out one on bearing 800 for 250 yds and the other on bearing 940 for 250 yds. Nil sightings.

GENERAL


appeared that enemy movement was general throughout and after action at firm base, movement was heard west and north.

Patrol moved out from firm base on bearing 1230 crossing track throughout and followed track for 100 yds when mine exploded which appeared to be old contact mine, as no wires were observed. Casualties Own & killed Enemy NMS.

3. ENEMY ACTION

It appeared that enemy patrols roved area as movement was heard north of firm base between Ollooo and Olloo hrs.
