228. PREVALENCE OF THE OFFENCE OF ESCAPING: (Ref 1 Aust Div R/O Ser 26 No A171/44)

1. Attention is directed to the prevalence of the offence of escaping from detention barracks and field punishment centres.
2. Charges in respect of the offences mentioned in para 1 should be laid under M 22 and should normally be tried by court-martial.
3. The attention of all officers appointed as presidents and members of court-martial trying the offences mentioned in this order is directed to AMR & O 558(3) and MLL (Aust edition) page 64, para 82, which read as follows:-

AMR & O 558(3):

"When attention has been called in orders issued in the command to which the offender belongs to the unusual prevalence of the offence of which he has been found guilty, a court-martial should also have regard to the fact that such warning has been issued."

MLL (Aust Edition) page 64, para 82:

"Military offences must sometimes be considered in reference to circumstances other than those connected with the individual offender. When there is a general prevalence of offences or of offences of some particular kind, and example may be necessary, and on that account a severe punishment may properly be awarded for an offence which would otherwise receive a more lenient punishment. In such cases the punishment must be regarded more from the point of view of the effect which it will produce on the force to which the offender belongs than from that of the offender himself."

4. A sentence of imprisonment with or without hard labour may properly be imposed for the abovementioned offences.

229. INCOME TAX - LIABILITY OF MEMBERS OF THE FORCES AND COLLECTION OF TAX BY INSTALMENTS: (Ref GRO F. 233/44)

Members required to lodge tax returns.-

A member on full time military duty, the total of whose military and private income exceeds £250 during the year ending 30th June, 1944, must lodge an income tax return with the Deputy Commissioner for Taxation in the State in which the member enlisted. Such return need not be lodged by a member serving outside Australia unless his private income earned in Australia exceeds £250.

Preparation of returns.-

Income tax return forms, together with printed instructions, may be obtained from pay representatives. The forms should be completed to show full details of private income, military income and particulars of dependants and other items for which rebates are allowable.

Unless the member lodges a return and shows his military income in fullest detail, the Taxation authorities may not be able to grant the exemptions to which he is entitled. He should therefore, include with the return a separate statement setting out the following information:-

- (a) date of embarkation for service outside Australia;
- (b) date of return to Australia;
- (c) whether the reason for return was injury or illness;
- (d) if the member has served outside Australia, his military income for the year ended 30th June, 1944, should be shown under the following headings:-
 - (i) military income up to a date 90 days after his resumption of duty in Australia; and
 - (ii) military income after that date.

The completed return should be posted to the Deputy Commissioner of Taxation in the capital city of the member's state of enlistment so as to reach that address by 31st July, 1944. If the member is in doubt on any point, a letter setting out the full facts should accompany his return.

Special deduction/-

The following table sets out the special deduction allowed by the Income Tax Assessment Act to a member who is engaged on full time military duty:-

Amount of Income	Allowable Deductions
Not exceeding £250	The whole income.
£251 - £258	£146.
£259 - £300	£146 less £1 for every £1 by which the income exceeds £258.
£301 - £350	£104 less £1 for every £2 by which the income exceeds £300.
Exceeding £350	£79 less £1 for every £3 by which the income exceeds £300.

For the purpose of this table, "income" means net income (including private income) after making all allowable deductions.

232. POSSESSION AND CONSUMPTION OF INTOXICATING LIQUOR: (Ref Second Aust Army R/O A187/44)

1. Except as provided in para 2 hereof, no member of the Australian Military Forces, when in uniform, shall consume any intoxicating liquor:-

- (a) In any public place;
- (b) In any doorway or vestibule opening on to any public place;
- (c) On any highway or public road;
- (d) On any vacant land adjacent to a park or public reserve;
- (e) On any part of a park or public reserve; or
- (f) In any public conveyance.

2. Nothing in this order shall prevent the consumption or supply or possession of liquor on licensed premises or upon the premises of any Naval, Military or Air Force Institute, Mess, or Canteen in accordance with the regulations and orders applying to such Institute, Mess or Canteen.

3. COs will ensure that the above order is brought before the notice of all troops from time to time. It is the duty of COs to endeavour to inculcate in men under their command a respect for their uniform, the wearing of which should operate, not as a license to break the law, but as an obligation to set an example in complying with it.

4. Second Aust Army RO 139/42 is cancelled.

5. Attention is directed to GRO 789/43, which prohibits the carrying or possession, or consumption (except in a dining car) by a member of the forces of any intoxicating liquor on a train.

At the end of the course, applicants will be further examined, and, if the result is satisfactory, will receive temporary appointment to the Department of External Affairs. The question of permanent appointment to the Commonwealth Public Service (if not an officer of that Service) will receive consideration at a later date. If a permanent officer of the Service, promotion or transfer to an appropriate vacancy in the Department will be effected under section 50 of the Public Service Act.



4. One case was evacuated on suspicion of V.D.
5. Tinea of feet and crutch variable. Most infected at some time or other.
6. General cleanliness of troops not as good as should be.
7. Camp hygiene and sanitation could be improved upon. Shortage of trademen has retarded some necessary improvements.



M.T. REVIEW FOR THE MONTH ENDED 31 July '44

1. Vehicle strength remains the same as for last period, total strength being fifty vehicles.
2. Personnel strength has not altered to any extent this period, but the fact that Y.S. drivers are unable to drive unless accompanied by the holder of an A.A.F. G 11 makes the driver position very difficult.
3. Two accidents were reported this period. However neither was of a serious ~~nature~~ nature. In one case Unit vehicle collided with another Unit vehicle. Damage in both cases was only slight. Again other case reported was in connection with two vehicles from this Unit. A Y.S. Driver backed his vehicle into a parked vehicle. Damage was very slight.
4. Maintenance has been very satisfactory during this month, there being not one vehicle grounded through any mechanical fault on Unit Lines. A supply of paint became available and all vehicles are being painted. The scheme of evacuating vehicles to LAD 250 for inspection has been ⁱⁿ operation during this month and has been very successful. 17 Vehicles have been classified.
5. POL consumption has not changed to any extent and tyres have been renewed in all cases where necessary.

SUBJECT : REPORT ON RUMOURS

During the past 36 hours rumours relating to the movement of 1 Aust Inf Bde have been prevalent among personnel of this Bn. Captain Mc Kendry states, that while returning from PYMBLE to the camp at 2400 hrs 21/22 Jul he heard a remark to the effect that the unit would be soon moving to the Singleton area.

The bus was crowded and Capt Mc Kendry was unable to identify the person or persons responsible for these remarks.

(1100 hrs 22 JUL →) The Adjt, Capt Keesing reports that while speaking to Capt Fisher AAMC he was told by Capt Fisher of a movement of the Bde to the Singleton area. Capt Fisher stated that this information was passed onto him by his truck driver and in such a manner that he (Capt Fisher) did not attach any importance as regards security to this information. DIV TRUCK DRIVER

From reports of other Officers it appears that anticipated movements of the Bde to various destinations e.g. Singleton, Muswellbrook, Maitland, and French's Forest is freely discussed among the troops.

Intelligence Sjt reports that the conversation in the Sjt's mess on 221230k centered on movement of the unit to many and various destinations.

From the number of various destinations spoken of it appears that these discussions among the troops are wild rumours and have not been based on any definite information.

APPENDIX "D" - GUARD DUTIES OF 41/3 AUST INF BN(AIF)

All previous Bn Guard Duties Orders are cancelled and the following orders are inserted in their stead:-

1. Guard to be constituted as follows:-

- (a) Retreat to 0800 hrs - 1 Sjt, 1 Cpl, 6 O.R's.
- (b) 0800 hrs to Retreat - 1 Cpl, 4 O.R's.

2. An additional 2 O.R's will be supplied as required, when pay is at Bn HQ.

3. Tour of duty from 1645 hrs day of mounting until 1645 hrs following day.

4. From 0800 hrs to retreat one sentry will mount at entrance to compound; beat will be around compound.

5. From retreat to 0800 hrs sentries will mount as follows:-

- (a) One at entrance to compound.
- (b) One at NORTH-EASTERN corner of compound.

6. When there is NOT any prisoner in compound, a guard will NOT mount, but Duty Coy will make arrangements for a guard to be on call, if required.

7. Dress, unless otherwise ordered by C.O. or Adjt, will be Battle Order, less steel helmets.

8. Sentries to pay correct compliments at all times, and guard comd to ensure sentries are conversant with correct compliments.

9. During tour of duty, guard will NOT leave guard tent without permission of guard comd, and then only one at a time.

10. Sentries at all times will march in a soldierly manner on the beat, and only stand at ease at Sentry Post at entrance to compound and Sentry Post at NORTH-EASTERN corner of compound.

11. Sentries will challenge at all times anyone approaching compound, and no one is to enter or remove prisoner without proper authority.

12. Eating utensils of prisoner to be kept in Guard Tent, any knives, razors, smokes and matches or any equipment, to be taken from prisoner's.

13. During tour of duty guard will NOT remove any clothing, but will be ready at any time to turn out.

14. Guard tents and surroundings to be kept clean and tidy and tent ready for inspection by 0815 hrs each morning.

15. Guard will NOT converse with anyone during tour of duty, and guard comd will insist on strict discipline.

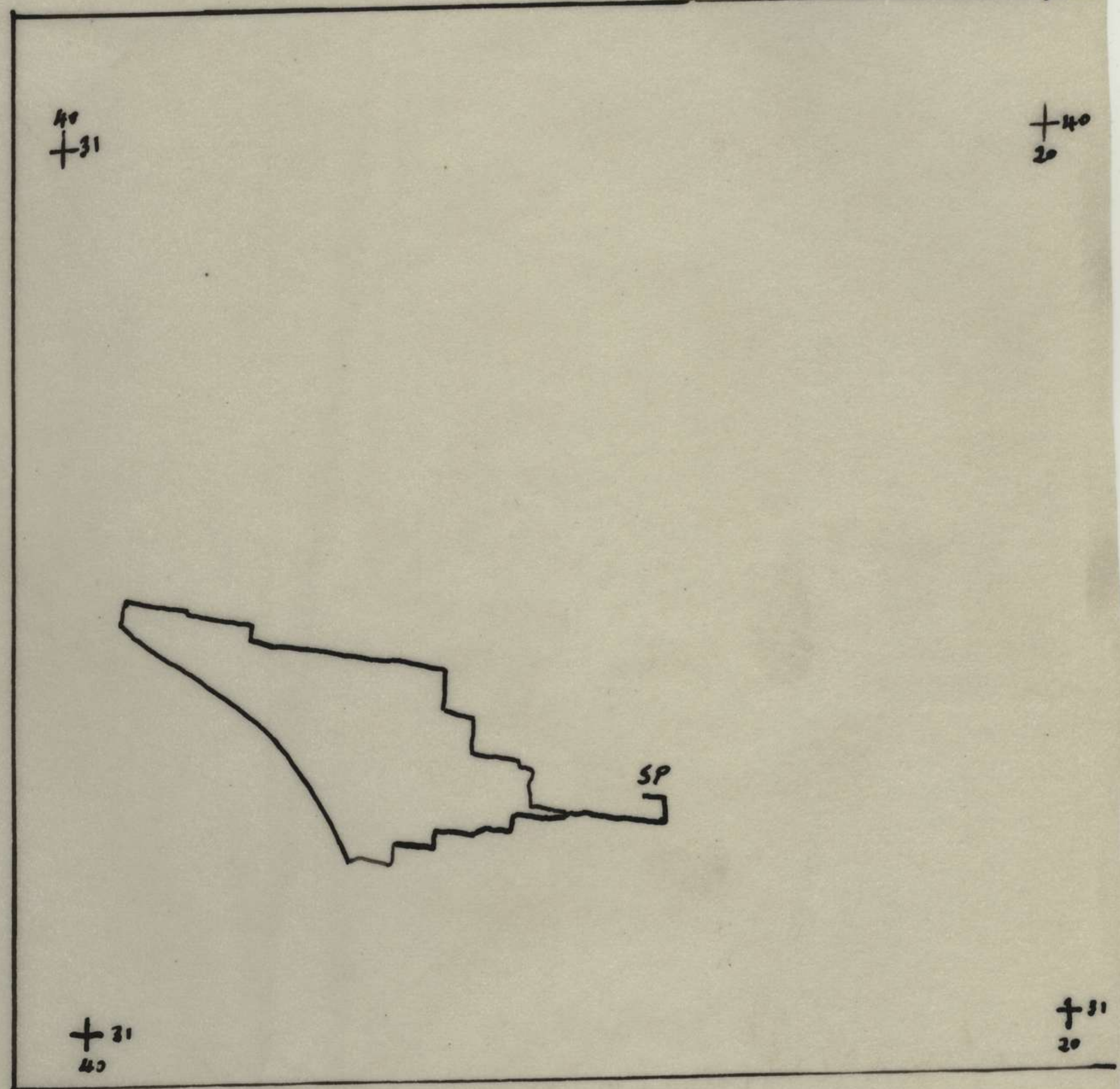
16. During tour of duty, guard comd will visit sentry at different times and question him as to his duties, etc.
17. Guard comd to ensure guard are conversant with procedure of turning out of guard and changing of the guard.
18. All meals to be eaten in guard tent and dishes to be returned to kitchen.
19. No sentry will leave his beat under any circumstances without being relieved.
20. Guard comd to furnish a written report on completion of tour of duty and hand to Orderly Officer.
21. Guard will turn out at Retreat each night and Present Arms.
22. Prisoner to be given 1 hr exercise in morning and 1 hr exercise in afternoon.
23. Cpl will accompany escort when prisoners are being marched anywhere in Camp Area, latrines, Bn Ord Room, Coy Ord Room, etc.
24. Sjt or Cpl to change all reliefs during tour of duty.
25. Copy of A4 (Charge Report) to be kept by NCO i/c of Guard, for each prisoner in his charge.
26. No fires will be allowed either in compound, guard tent, or for sentries.
27. Guard comd to take over and sign for stores as per inventory.

"HQ" LOY ROUTE MARCH 14 JUL 44

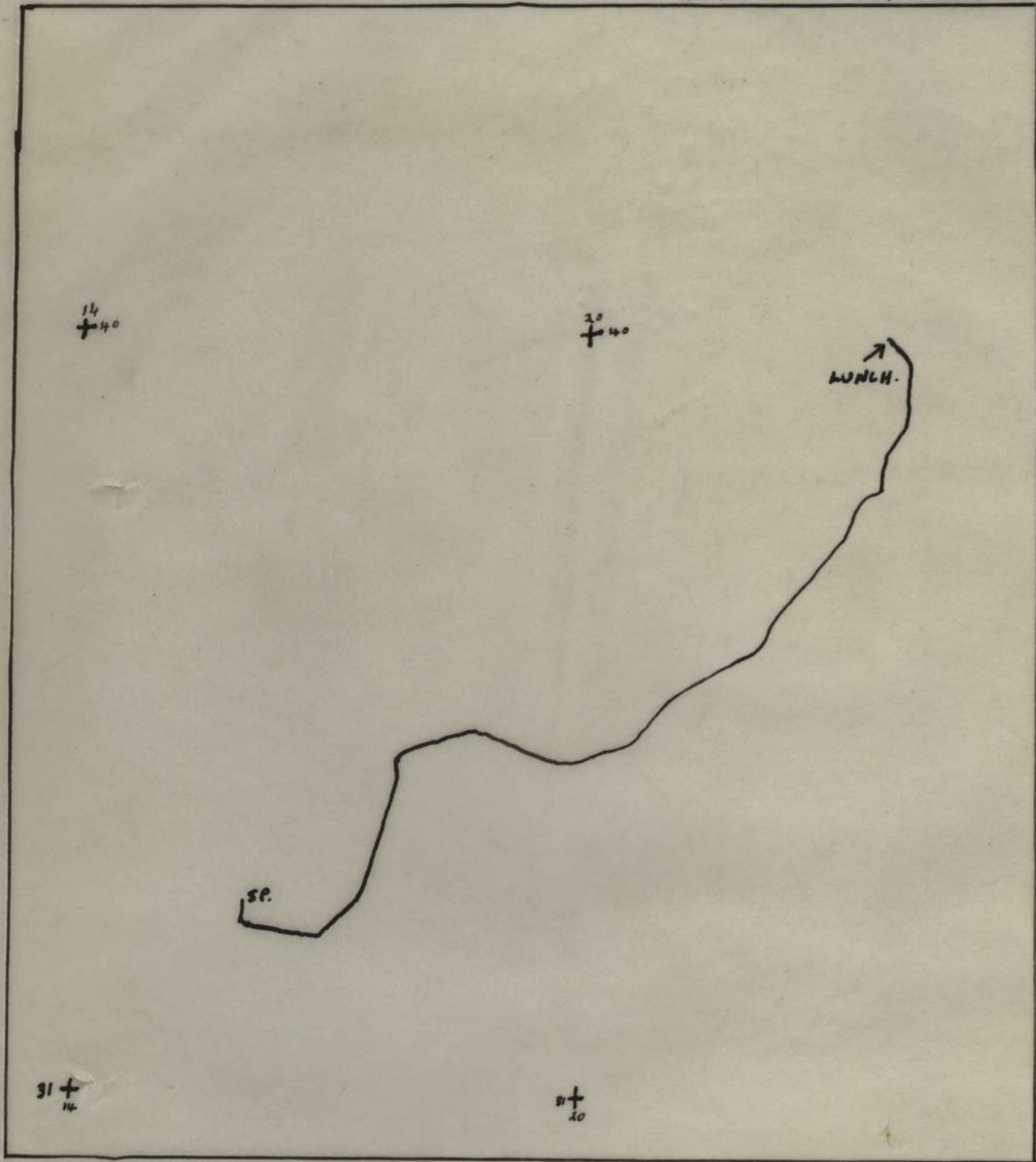
REF MAP BROKEN BAY I"

"C" COY ROUTE MARCH 16 JUL. 44

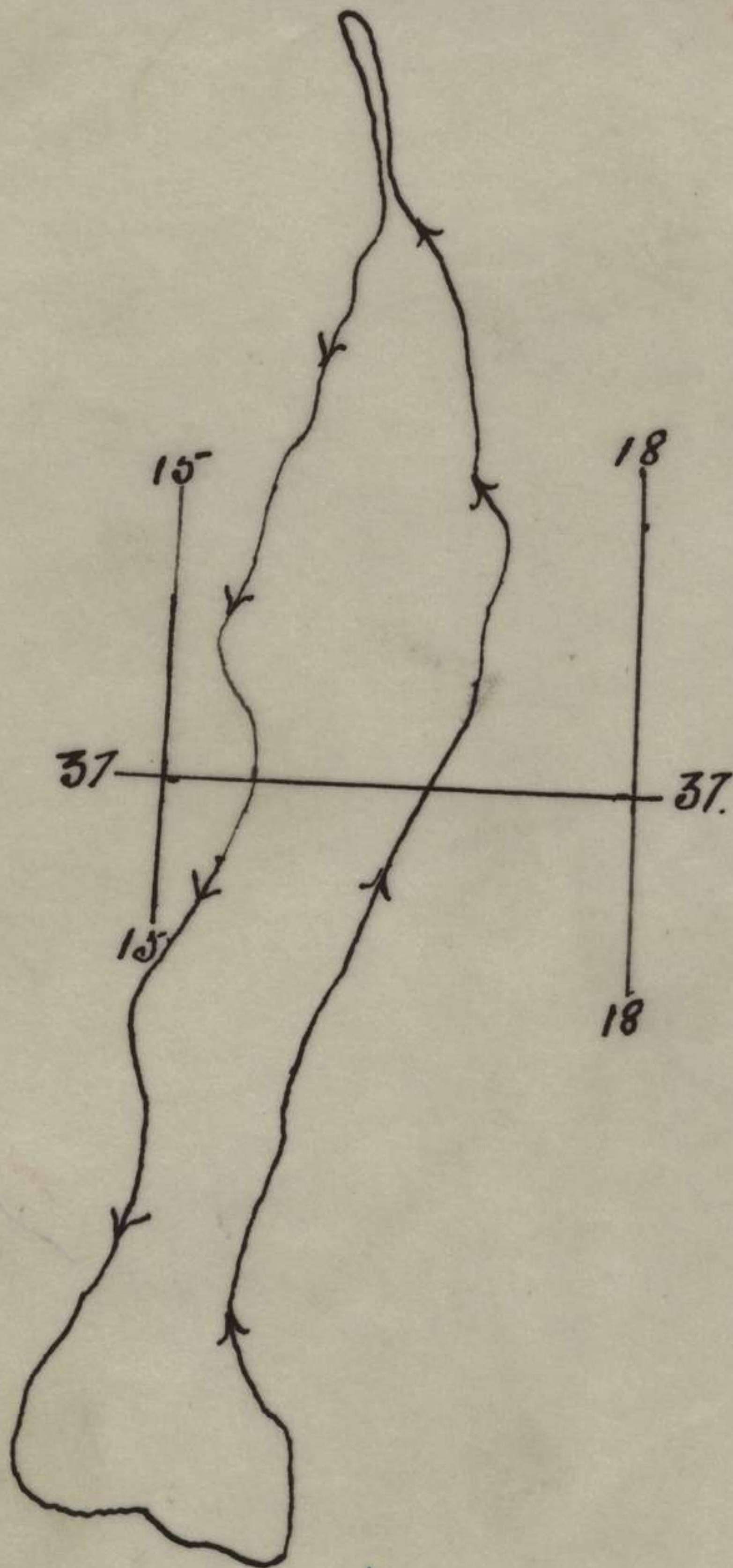
RAF MAP. BROKEN BAY. 1" = 1 MILE

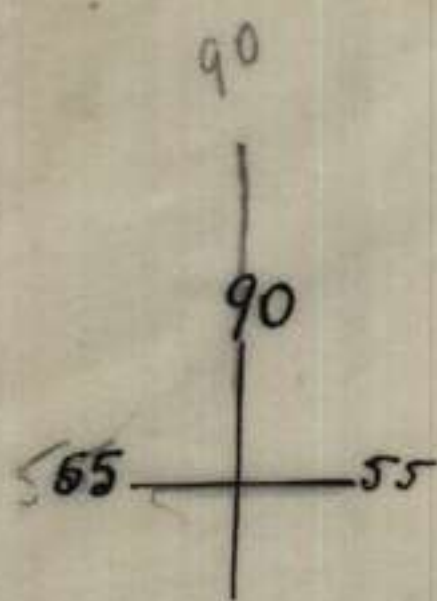
NCO'S SCHOOL ROUTE MARCH 25 JUL 44.



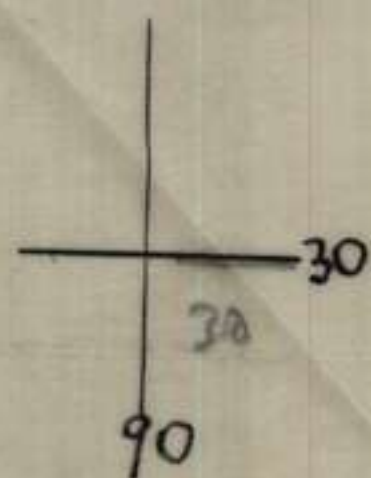

 - (ii) Such slip or stamp to be in paybook or AAB83. If in paybook relevant blood gp to be written in space provided in AAB83. Do not remove slip from paybook if already there. New slips will be pasted in AAB83.
- (c) Place of Enlistment:
Town where enlisted not required. District of enlistment shown on page, is completed by paybook issuing authorities and refers to military district, i.e. 2 M.D. etc.
- (d) Will:
Record of lodgment of will to be endorsed on N.O.K. page (at bottom) AAB83. I of G Area where lodged - date (if available) and signed by an officer.
- (e) Record of Dentures:
Transcribed into AAB83 from I5033 and signed by an Officer.
- (f) Medical Class:
Necessary in AAB83 only to be signed by Medical Officer and taken from A255.
If entry already made, signature of officer (not necessary medical) is accepted.
- (g) Gas Slip:
To be pasted in AAB83. Strike out reference to respirator details and fitting. "P" or "F" indicating pass or fail, to be shown for each test.
- (h) W.F.40:
No longer required as a document.
- (i) Page 6 AAB83:
Not necessary to complete details as to training, date of DP3, etc. Only information as to Small Arms Courses necessary. Note that qualifications for rifle and Bren are as follows:-

INSTRUCTIONS FOR ENTRAINING AND DETRAINING.

1. Ref 1 Aust Inf Bde Movement Order 1 of 26 Aug 44.

2. The following instns will be complied with by all units and sub-units moving by train.

(a) PREPARATION :

- (i) Tps will be organised into carriage or compartment groups and OsC groups appointed.
- (ii) Tps to be instructed and drilled in entraining and detraining, rifles at the short trail.
- (iii) Pack and Blanket will not exceed 18" in width.

1. SECURITY:

The information contained herein will be confined to as few persons as is practicable and recipients of this Instruction will be personally responsible for the above restriction of its contents.

2. INFORMATION:

- (a) Japanese Ps.W. (Ps.W.J.) are to be transferred from 12 P.W. Group COWRA.
- (b) Ps.W.J. concerned are of two classes:
Class 'B' - NCOs down to and including L/Cpls.
Class 'C' - Pte soldiers of all grades.
- (c) Destination of Class 'B' personnel is P.W. Group MURCHISON, Victoria, and Class 'C' personnel P.W. Group HAY.
- (d) Movement to both destinations will be by road and will involve three separate movements to each destination.
- (e) Movements by M.T. to MURCHISON will involve overnight staging of Ps.W.J. and A.M.F. personnel at R.A.E.T.C. Kapooka by arrangement with Second Aust Army. Second night A.M.F. personnel stage at MURCHISON by arrangement with Vic L of C Area and third night at R.A.E.T.C. Kapooka.
- (f) Movements by M.T. to HAY will be completed in daylight on same day. A.M.F. personnel will stage overnight at HAY and return to COWRA on following day.

Provost Personnel . . . will carry pistols and be issued with 20 rounds of ammunition per man.

11. MOVEMENT:

Movement will commence ex 12 P.W. Group COWRA at 0700 hrs on 'D' Day and will continue in terms of Movement Table, Appendix 'A' attached, until task is completed. Date of 'D' Day will be notified separately. ?

12. ROUTES:

Movement from COWRA to MURCHISON will be by No.1 Route and from COWRA to HAY by No.2 Route set out in Movement Table.

13. MOVEMENT FROM COMPOUND AND EMBUSSING:

Group Comd 12 P.W. Group COWRA, is responsible for the movement from compound and embussing of Ps.W.J. He will be furnished with troops as required for this purpose by 1 Aust Inf Bde.

In the event of refusal of Ps.W.J. to carry out orders for movement from compound or embussing, he will authorise the use of such physical force as may be necessary to have his orders for movement and embussing carried out.

If considered necessary, Comd 12 P.W. Gp COWRA will request additional troops from 1 Aust Inf Bde to supplement or replace Camp Guard on Ps.W.J.

The provisions relating to the powers of guards, as set out in GRO A648/43, are to be complied with.

Attention is drawn to the fact that guards of enemy prisoners of war may fire upon an enemy prisoner of war attempting to escape, but a previous summons to surrender will be given if possible.

The use of fire arms may also be made in an urgent case as self defence, or to prevent an immediate threat to life where other means of prevention are not practicable.

Prior to embussing, Group Comd P.W. Group COWRA, will be responsible that every P.W.J. is completely searched and will satisfy himself that such search as is carried out will preclude the possession by the P.W. of any article which could be used as a weapon.

14. ADDITIONAL GUARDS:

By arrangement with Second Aust Army, guards as are considered necessary by Second Aust Army will be provided outside perimeter of 12 P.W. Group COWRA to prevent the escape of or dispersal of escaped prisoners.

15. P.O.L:

A.Q. M.G. will arrange for:

(a) Convoy on No.1 Route to carry P.O.L. requirements for forward journey to KAPOOKA for refueling at Kapooka and carriage of P.O.L. requirements to MURCHISON and for return trip.

(b) Convoy on No.2 Route to carry P.O.L. requirements for movement to HAY for refueling at HAY and for requirements for return to COWRA.

16. MAINTENANCE OF VEHICLES:

D.D.M.S. will provide for A.A.M.C. personnel as under to report to 12 P.W. Group COWRA during 28 Aug 44:

One Medical Officer and two Medical Orderlies will accompany each convoy throughout movement.

X 19. PROVOST:

A.P.M. will arrange for the following personnel to report to H.Q. 12 P.W. Group COWRA during 28 Aug 44 for traffic and escort duties under direction O i/c Escort, in connection with convoy movements. Transport will be provided.

20. ALARMS AND BREAKDOWNS:

In the event of any outbreak by Ps.W.J. en route for respective destinations, the alarm will be given by the firing of a verey cartridge (red) by Patrol observing same. Action will be taken as previously directed by Escort Comd.

In the event of mechanical breakdown of any vehicle, action will be taken as previously directed by Escort Comd.

21. INTER-COMMUNICATION ARRANGEMENTS:

Inter-communication on route 2 by Wireless Vehicles has been provided for. Such other inter-communication arrangements as are laid down by Escort Comd. will be made.

22. STAGING and RECEPTION:

On arrival at KAPOOKA, O.i/c Escort will arrange for transfer of Ps.W.J. from vehicles to compound provided and custody of Ps.W.J. will be the responsibility of Comd R.A.E.T.C. Guard Detachment provided by 1 Aust Inf Bde will come under Comd R.A.E.T.C. for this purpose.

Quartering and messing arrangements for Ps.W.J. and A.M.F. personnel will be arranged by H.Q. R.A.E.T.C.



 - (b) 667 PsW.J. ORs from COWRA to HAY.
 - (c) Additional Ps.W.J. now in hospital of above classes (73) will move with above if available, and subsequent movement of balance will be arranged by HQ NSW L of C Area.
2. Movement of PW vide para 1(a) and (b) above will be in three groups, each of 42 NCOs and approximately 223 ORs. Movement of first group will commence at 0700 hrs on 'D' Day with movement of subsequent groups at three day intervals. Date of 'D' Day will be notified separately.
3. Adm arrangements for embussing and movement of personnel will be in accordance with NSW L of C Area Adm Instr 1 of 26 Aug 44.
4. Second Aust Army will be responsible for provision of:-







266. CONSERVATION OF RUBBER-SYNTHETIC TYRES. (Ref 1 Div R/O 34/44)

1. This order will be read in conjunction with GRC 0167/1944.

2. The critical rubber situation and the necessity for obtaining the maximum service from tyres has been stressed from time to time. The further deterioration of the situation, necessitating the introduction of tyres of synthetic construction, renders it imperative that greater care than ever be exercised in the use and maintenance of all tyres, whether of synthetic or natural rubber construction.

3. Synthetic tyres are far more susceptible to failure through abuse than tyres constructed from natural rubber. All concerned will therefore -

- (a) exercise the utmost care to avoid -
overloading,
underinflation,
hard braking and fierce acceleration,
high speeds,
bumps and other causes of severe impact;
- (b) check wheel alignment frequently and correct irregularities promptly;
- (c) rotate tyres regularly;
- (d) remove stones and flint from tyres during unit maintenance;
- (e) submit tyres for replacement at the correct stages for recapping; and
- (f) submit damaged tyres for repair without delay.

4. Formations and units will ensure that prompt disciplinary action is taken where breaches of this order occur.

267. INJURIES TO MEMBERS - USE OF BREAD CUTTING MACHINES:

(Ref 1 Aust-Div R/O 38/42, 1 Aust Div R/O 34/44, 41/2 Bn R/O 29/44)

- (a) In order to avoid accidents to members of the Forces when using bread cutting machines, loaves of bread will NOT be pushed into the cutter by hand, but will be propelled by a piece of wood which will be of sufficient size to prevent any portion of the operator's hand coming in contact with the blade of the cutter. Every member detailed to operate a breadcutting machine is to be instructed accordingly by the member so detailing him.
- (b) In any future accidents arising from the use of breadcutting machines, inquiry is to be made as to whether the injured member has been advised in that direction. If he has been so advised, appropriate action is to be taken against him for disobeying orders. Should the operator not have been so advised, appropriate action is to be initiated against the member of the forces who detailed the operator for such duty without giving him proper instruction to conform with the direction herein contained.
- (c) All reports of accidents arising from the use of breadcutting machines will contain a statement of the action taken in accordance with the last preceding sub-para, and the appropriate particulars against whom such action was taken, and the result of such action.
- (d) Disciplinary action against the member operating the breadcutting machine, or the member detailing him for that duty, as the case may be, is to be taken under A.A. Sec II.

268. COMMONWEALTH WAR LOANS (Ref GRO F 303/44)

1. Approval has been given for members of the AMF to subscribe to Commonwealth Loans by making an allotment of portion of their pay to the Commonwealth Bank.
