

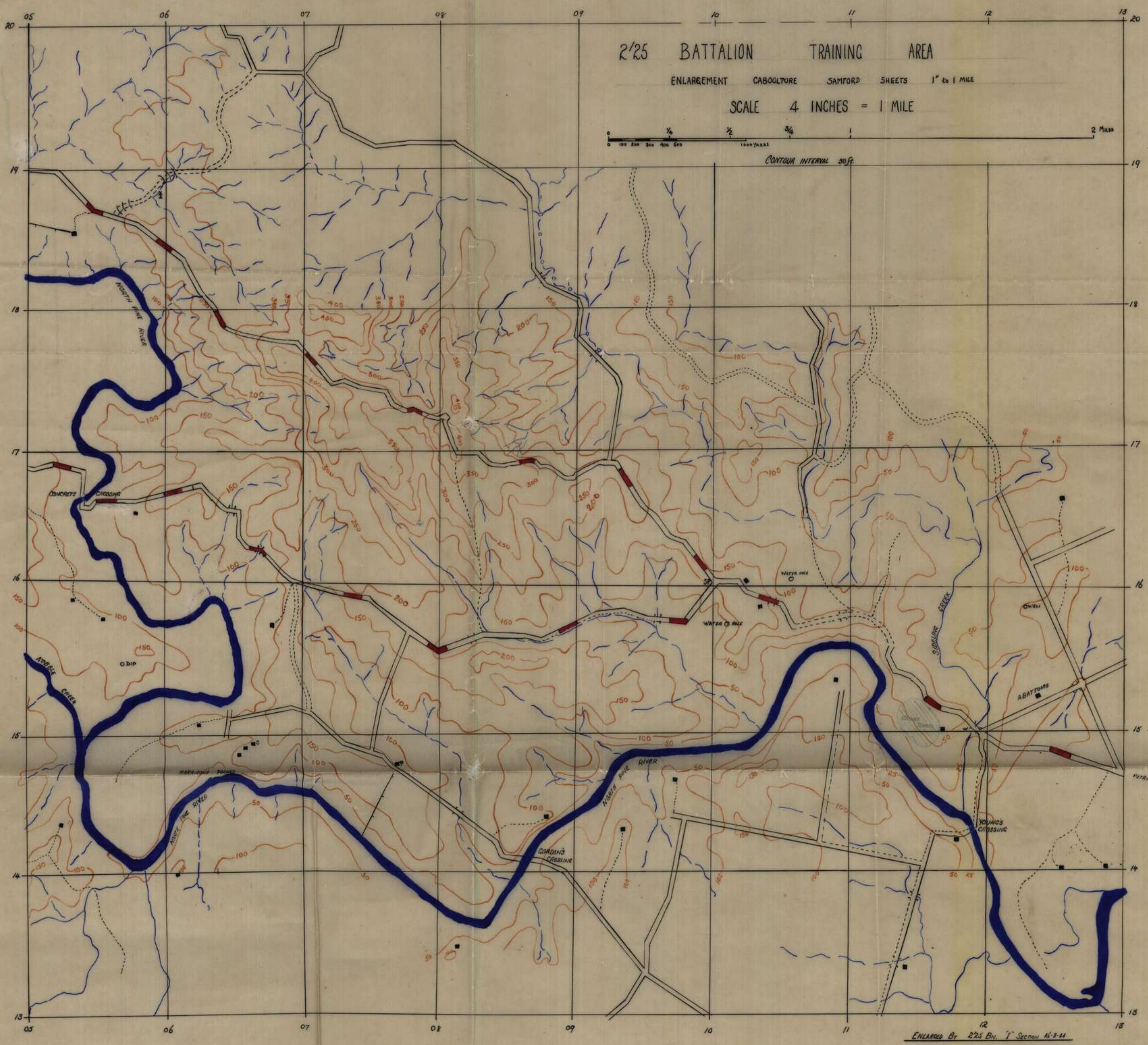

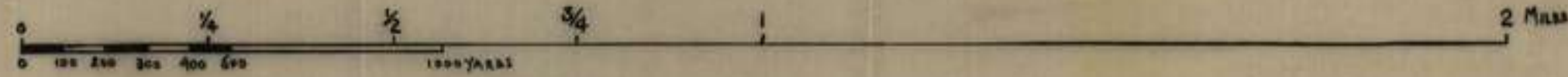




2/25 BATTALION TRAINING AREA





COs ADDRESS TO BN 19 JUL 44

Officers, NCOs and Men of the Bn.

It is with the greatest regret that I am not able to be here this morning to carry out an inspection, to personally give this talk and to share the rest of this day with you but as duty has called me away I have asked Major O'BRYEN to deputise for me.

To-day we celebrate the fourth anniversary of the formation of this Bn and those here to-day who were in that first group who assembled at GROVELLY on 15 July 1940 and who first started to call themselves the 2/25 Bn, will remember that day as vividly as I do.

From then on we grew rapidly, men coming from half a dozen different depots including a large draft of 300 from CALOUNDRA.

Our preliminary settling down, organisation and bull ring training completed we embarked in the middle of October 1940 for DARWIN where we relieved the 2/15 Bn of certain garrison and guard duties. This period, although not ideal from a training point of view had several important happenings which assured our future:-

(i) Being away from home and home distraction we were able to establish that esprit de corps, that comradeship, and that reliance on each other that is necessary in a unit.

(ii) The 24th Bde of which we were part was transferred from the 8th Div to the 9th Div.

(iii) The very length of our enforced stay in DARWIN caused us to miss the 24th Bde which went to TOBRUK and we eventually found ourselves in the 25th Bde in the 7th Div when we at last got to Egypt and I think you will agree with me that we were very lucky in deed not to have been in Malaya.

We returned from DARWIN in Feb 1941, had pre-embarkation leave, marched through BRISBANE with the visiting American Fleet and set sail in the Queen Mary early in April. Having arrived in Egypt in May we drew new weapons and equipment and proceeded up to MERSA MATRUH.

Here we had our first experience of being bombed and from there a quick move up to Syria put us into action just four weeks after leaving the Queen Mary.

Looking back on that campaign one has the feeling that they were the days of real sport; as well as being our baptism of fire it was the start of that tempering process necessary to make steel hard and necessary to make a Bn a fighting Bn: and what a school, for not only did we meet all types of French troops but we also met and bested the famed Foreign Legion.

It is a matter of history how events moved and how we eventually eventually found ourselves back here on this same railway line in June 1942 and preparing for an ordeal such as we are never likely to encounter again. We embarked for New Guinea on 1 Sep 42 and were in action on 15 Sep in the foothills of the Owen Stanleys. I will not trace the rigors of that campaign through till the 5 Dec when we were relieved at GONA but it will suffice to say that those who crossed that range will never forget it with its aftermath of undermined constitution from hardship and privation over which we had no control. Many good men were lost to us during this period due to disease and physical exhaustion in addition to enemy action.

It was in the early stages of that campaign that I assumed command and it was that campaign that brought home to me the absolute necessity of fitness of all ranks in mind and body but I will have more to say about that later.

Following this campaign we once again returned to Australia and having received some very good reinforcements and having done some very excellent training on the Tableland found ourselves once more embarking for New Guinea in Jul 43. It was with very mixed feelings that those of us who had been there before again sailed into PORT MORESBY harbour, but thanks to our own efforts and the help of our Allies those previous dread conditions had gone for good.

Once again we found ourselves starting out on a grand new adventure, this time by air and the thoroughness with which plans had been laid, the organisation which had been carried out, and the surprise element of the whole enterprise filled us with confidence.

Strangely enough the second week of September again found us in contact with the Jap and due entirely to the dash and vigour with which each company assisted by supporting arms carried out its allotted task we were in LAE six days after first contact. I don't want to minimise the work of other units of the Bde but I consider that this Bn did the lions share and the immediate award of a Victoria Cross and two Military Medals were particularly gratifying to us all. I would like to point out here that this was the first time 75 to 80% of the then Bn had been under fire and speaks volumes for our reinforcements.

The rest of that campaign was equally successful the Bn doing all that was asked of it.

And Now once again in July we find ourselves reorganising and training, for what theatre we know not but we do know that the Prime Minister Mr CURTIN has promised us another trip and let us go into it with that same spirit of high adventure that we had in 1940 and with the certain confidence that this next show will see the end of the war; may our next anniversary be a very happy one with the satisfaction of a job well done.

I would like now to mention the decorations which have been won by the Bn and which have been added to considerably in the last twelve months.

I want all those who were with me in the Papuan campaign to realise that the decoration which was awarded to me is as much theirs as mine as it was their resolution, endurance and success that made it possible.

I mentioned earlier that I would have more to say about training. It is this - it is going to be hard and it must be hard; seldom in our training can we reproduce the actual privations and hardships of war but if we can teach you endurance and the will to keep going and the comradeship of helping each other in addition to being experts with your weapons - well the battle is won. And remember malaria is no longer a matter of course in the field but can be controlled and suppressed; you will have a lot of knowledge imparted to you in regard to this in the next few weeks but I still must have your individual co-operation to get results.

There are still amongst us a few, whom I might term "weak sisters" by which I mean men who will go away with us and as soon as things look to be getting a bit tough will get themselves evacuated by one means or another and to them I say get out now and I will help you for you are a menace to your mates.

And Now men I want you all to make a resolution for the future to uphold these traditions which have been built up and keep before you the example of those good comrades of ours who have laid down their lives for their ~~loved ones~~ and country *and loved one.* and let us always be - "The right of the line, the fear of the foe, the salt of the earth, the fighting 2/25th".

I will now ask the Adjutant to read the Roll of Honour after which the Last Post and Reveille will be sounded.

"Resumption of duty" has been defined as meaning "disembarkation" except in cases where members are returned on account of sickness and are admitted to hospital.
- (d) Income Tax return forms may be obtained from the Bn Education Officer and members may consult this officer when in doubt about any matter concerning taxation.




