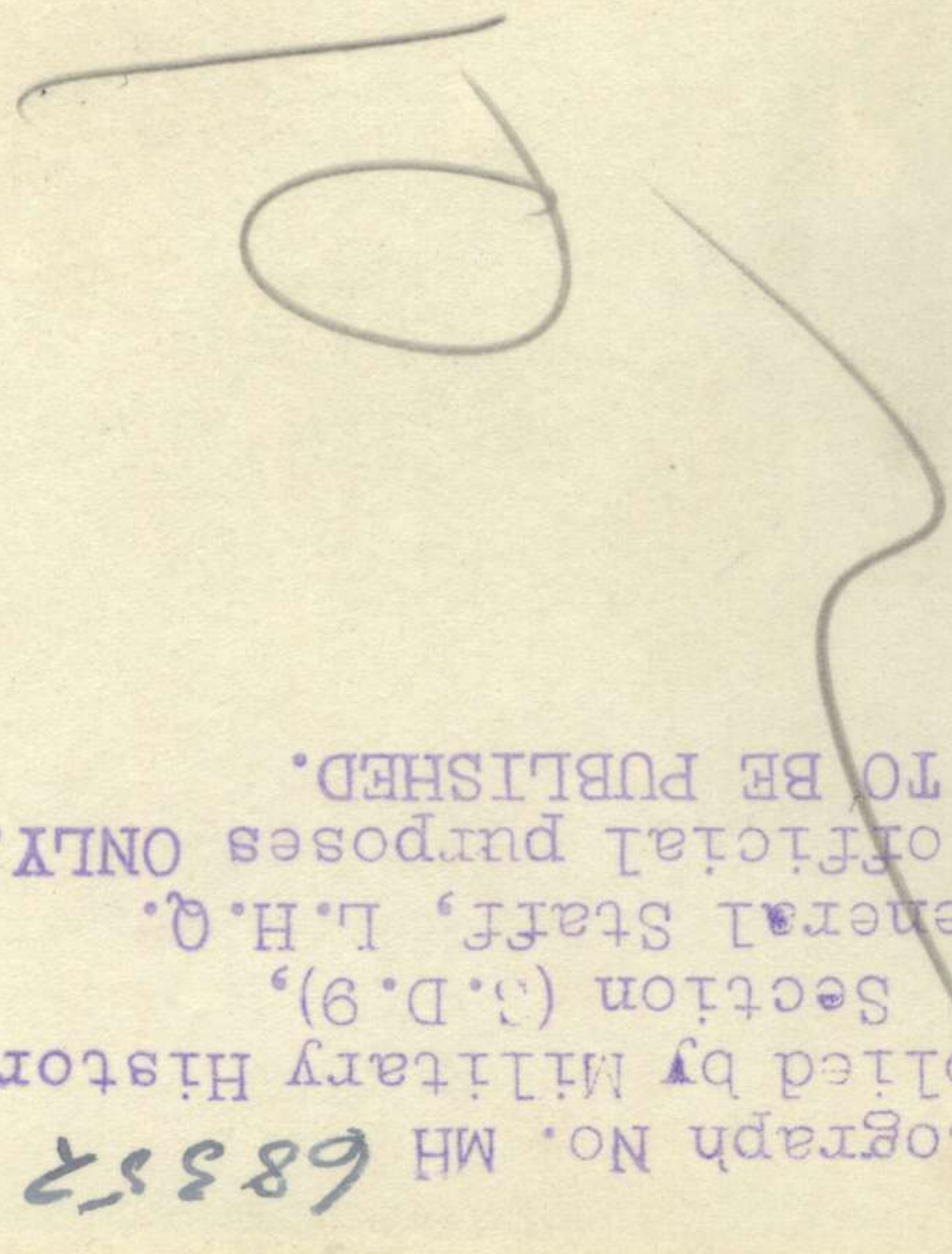

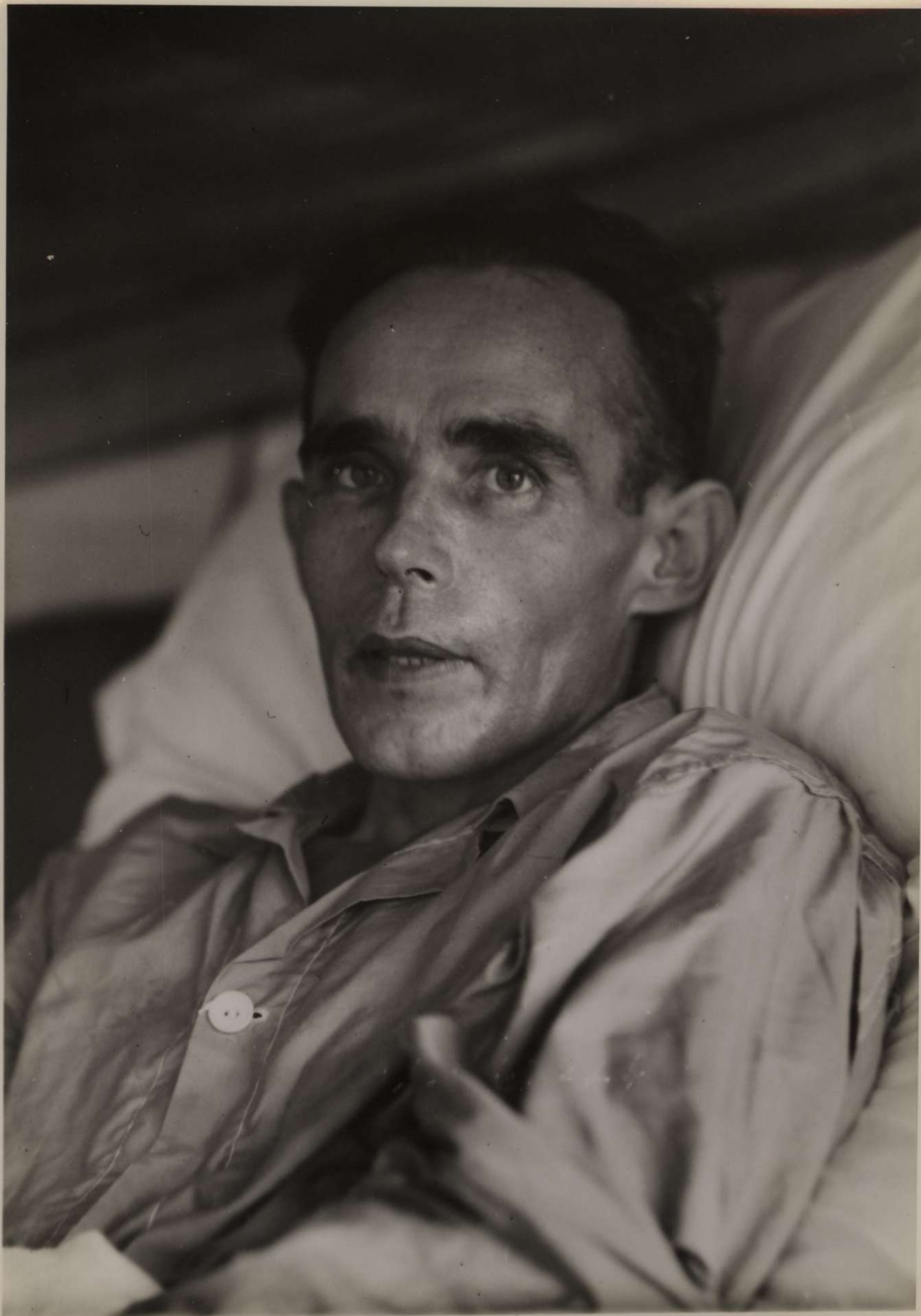

Petrie	8 contd.		<p>39 Offrs. & 648 OR's. of the Bn. marched. 179 original members were among them. Four of the Offrs. marched in from schls. to participate. The bn. Band (16 strong) was detached to L.T.D. Brisbane for duty & though they marched they did not lead the Bn.</p> <p>Maj. Bob Stuart, former 2I/C. of the Bn. visited us at the assembly area & found many friends among the older members of the unit.</p> <p>The public turned out in strength to watch the march & gave the men a wonderful reception. People were running along beside the column giving the boys fruit, cigarettes & money. Some of the more sympathetic onlookers were offering drinks of beer etc.</p> <p>Sections of the route were almost over-run by enthusiastic well wishers. The column was forced to narrow its front from 6 to about 5 with the result that it became somewhat ragged. But nobody seemed to mind—least of all the spectators.</p> <p>Pte. Kelliher V.C. marched with his coy. 
Further pl and coy training was continued. The syllabus covering a period of 6 hours a day 6 days a week.

(ii) Sequence of orders and movements in march past Saluting Base.

(iii) Marching at 110 paces to the minute and wheeling in sixes.

MESSING ARRANGEMENTS.

7. (a) Personnel will carry cut lunches. Paper bags for this purpose are available at FSD and units will indent for these in the normal manner.

(b) Hot tea is to be provided in assembly areas prior to commencement of march, under arrangements Qld L of C Area.

(c) Pannikins for officers are to be provided in assembly areas by Qld L of C. All other personnel will carry pannikins. After lunch has been partaken each soldier will place his pannikin in a corn sack provided. Sacks will be labelled with the corresponding number to the "vehicle serial number" of the vehicle the soldier travelled in. These sacks are to be collected from assembly areas by vehicles provided for that purpose by Qld L of C Area and returned to the appropriate troop carrying vehicle.

(d) Pannikins will be placed in the sacks beforehand and carried to assembly areas in the appropriate vehicle.

MEDICAL.

8. (a) Evacuation of casualties between camp sites and assembly areas, will be arranged by ADMS 7 AUST DIV.

(b) Ambulance Car Posts - (See Appx "G" attached), are to be provided by Qld L of C Area.

(c) RAP - located in area GOLF LINKS, opposite 18 Aust Inf Bde assembly area (See Appx "G" attached), under arrangements Qld L of C Area.

ASSEMBLY AREAS.

9. (a) Unit assembly areas are shown in sketch map attached as Appx "D".

(b) Representatives of Bdes and units will make recces and necessary arrangements within areas allotted

(c) Layouts of assembly areas for Div Tps, 2/1 Aust MG Bn and Services are as shown in Appendices "D1" and "D2" attached.

(d) Bdes etc areas will be signposted under arrangements HQ 7 AUST DIV.

TRAFFIC CONTROL.

10. (a) 7 AUST DIV PRO COY will be responsible for:-

(i) Traffic control from camp sites, area STRATHPINE, to inclusive Marshalling Posts at Starting Points (TRAFFIC CHECK POST and CASH'S CROSSING).

(ii) Marshalling duties at GILCHRIST AVE, incl entrances and exit, and GREGORY TERRACE.

(iii) Corner BRUNSWICK ST and GREGORY TERRACE - in conjunction with L of C.

(b) Qld L of C Area Pro are to provide

(i) Traffic control along routes from Starting Points to assembly areas.

(ii) Approach march to Saluting Base and to dispersal points on march route.

LATRINES.

-4-

11. (a) Latrine facilities are to be provided in assembly areas under arrangements Qld L of C.
- (b) Facilities are necessarily limited; units will ensure that personnel avail themselves of latrine facilities before leaving camp.

RECOVERY.

12. (a) CEME 7 AUST DIV will provide recovery posts at points along routes as follows:-
- (i) Route Serials 1 - 9 Rd Bend 148998.
- (ii) Route Serials 10-24 Rd Junct 198990.
- (b) Non runners will NOT attempt to rejoin columns, and will when repaired, return to camp after convoy has passed.

REMOVAL OF ROAD BARRIERS.

13. (a) Units will remove, temporarily, before 1200K 7 Aug, all barriers across roads in STRATHPINE area.
- (b) 7 Aust Div Pro will be responsible for checking removal of barriers in AA units area (HOWZE RD).

CAR DS TRAFFIC.

14. (a) Senior officers travelling by Car DS will NOT attempt to pass convoys, but will wait until tail of column has cleared RODE RD before proceeding on.
- (b) It is anticipated tail of column will clear RODE RD at approx 1030K.

MOVEMENT.

16. The move from STRATHPINE to BRISBANE, March and return to STRATHPINE, is divided into four phases:

- Phase 1. Camp site to vehicle marshalling area.
- Phase 2. Vehicle marshalling area to assembly area.
- Phase 3. March from assembly area through BRISBANE and return to embussing areas.
- Phase 4. Return to camp site.

PHASE 1.

17. Phase 1 will be carried out in accordance with Movement Table attached as Appx "A".

UNIT FORMING UP AREAS.

18. (a) Where a unit's forming up area is on the route to the vehicle marshalling area, that unit will form up with its vehicles on the near side of the roadway, leaving sufficient space for oncoming traffic to pass.
- (b) Where a unit's forming up area is off the route to the vehicle marshalling area, that unit will move to the SP (shown in coln (h) of Appx "A") at the time specified and take up its place in the column when the last vehicle of the preceding serial has passed.
- (c) Vehicles will move from unit lines in unit groups at the time specified and will be grouped in accordance with Movement Table at vehicle marshalling area.
- (d) Units will provide guides at SPs to assist in the marrying-up of serials in the coln.

VEHICLE LOADINGS.

19. Vehicle loadings are:-
- (a) 2½ ton vehicles 20 personnel
- (b) 3 ton vehicles 20 personnel
- (c) 7 ton vehicles 50 personnel
- (d) 7 ton vehicles 40 personnel.
(supplied by RAE)
- (e) Sub units etc will be embussed in accordance with correct sequence in marching column.
- (f) An officer will ride in the leading and rear vehicle of each unit group.

VEHICLE MARKINGS.

20. (a) Vehicles will be clearly marked in chalk on both sides with the name of unit and vehicle serial number as shown in Movement Table. The Last vehicle of each unit will be marked with 18" lettering, "LAST VEHICLE" (e.g. LAST VEHICLE 2/33 Bn .404).
- (b) In order to assist Serials to join the coln from side roads within STRATHPINE camp area, the last vehicle of each unit will, in addition to markings as per sub-para (a) above, carry a white flag on the near side mudguard in such a position as to be clearly seen by the driver of the leading vehicle of the Serial joining the coln.
- (c) This flag is only to assist movement in the camp area and will be removed at the vehicle marshalling area.

PHASE 2.

21. Phase 2 will be carried out in accordance with Movement Table attached as Appx "A".

VEHICLE MARSHALLING AREAS.

22. (a) Vehicles will move from vehicle marshalling areas in blocks as per Movement Table, under direction of representatives HQ 7 AUST DIV.
- (b) The officer in the leading vehicle of each block will be IC of that particular block.
- (c) Vehicles in blocks will NOT close up if halted by road or rail traffic unless directed by Div Control Staff or Provost.

DEBUSSING AT ASSEMBLY AREAS.

23. (a) (i) Serials 1 - 9 will debus in GILCHRIST AVE (See Appx "D" attached) and move to assembly areas allotted.
- (ii) When troops have debussed vehicles will be moved via route shown in Appx "F" and reformed for embussing under arrangements Control Staff HQ 7 AUST DIV.
- (b) (i) Serials 10 - 24 will debus at GREGORY TERRACE (See Appx "D" attached) and move via SUBWAY to assembly areas allotted. Serials 10 - 20 and 24, after passing through SUBWAY, will move via Western limit of 25 Aust Inf Bde assembly area and GILCHRIST AVE.
- (ii) When troops have debussed vehicles will be moved via route shown in Appx "F" and reformed for embussing under arrangements Control Staff HQ 7 AUST DIV.
- (c) Rigid control by officer IC units is necessary at debussing areas to ensure a smooth movement to assembly areas. This can only be achieved by units rehearsing their roles beforehand.

- (b) The figures quoted in above Appx for sub-units are based on expected strengths on day of march; however, figures allotted will only be altered in order to ensure that complete ranks of six may be obtained. There will be NO blank files.
- (c) In the event of units being unable to fill the quota allotted and provided that the lower figure of personnel which will be marching is NOT less than 90 per cent of the original allotment, arrangements may be made to spread the reduced numbers over the vehicles allotted, without further reference to this HQ.

- (d) Parade States for march will be submitted by all units giving marching strengths in officers and ORs to reach Div HQ NOT later than 1700 hours 7 Aug.

- (e) Distances between formations, units etc will be calculated from rear personnel of column ahead to leading personnel of following column. See also Appendices "H", "J" and "K" attached.
- (f) Diagrammatic layout. See Appendices "H", "J" and "K" attached. See also MTP 18 and 18 A.
- (g) Movement of marching columns along tram lines - See Appx "L" attached.
- (h) Rate of march - 110 paces per minute.
- (j) Road leading past Saluting Base to ADELAIDE ST, the corners at junctions ADELAIDE-GEORGE, and GEORGE-QUEEN STS, are to be marked to guide marching columns during wheels.

SIZING.

28. (a) It is essential that tps return to STRATHPINE in the same vehicles in which they arrived at assembly areas.
- (b) It IS MOST IMPORTANT that all columns of troops are sized in respective camp areas before embussing, and that every effort is made to ensure that there is NO alteration after debussing and in assembly areas.

CHANGING ARMS.

- 31. (a) Unit Comds will order the changing of arms, in succession etc, only at points along route indicated in Appx "G".
Large white letters "CHANGE ARMS" are to be painted on road at these points.
- (b) Personnel carrying sub-machine guns will NOT change arms during march.
- (c) 2/1 Aust MG Bn and Services will commence march from assembly area with rifles on right shoulder - all other units will commence with rifles on left shoulder.

GENERAL.

32. Brigades, Units etc, will shorten distances as Brigades etc move out from assembly areas, in order to ensure that correct distances will be maintained past the Saluting Base and to allow for some slight opening out as units move from assembly areas to Saluting Base. This procedure, therefore, is designed to prevent the opening-out of columns in the initial stages of the march. Some slowing down and possibly halts may be anticipated, therefore, between assembly areas and Control Post - ROMA ST STATION.
The correct distances as laid down in para 27 and Appendices "J", "K", and "L" will be adjusted at Control Post - ROMA ST STATION.

PHASE 4.

33. Phase 4 will be carried out in accordance with Movement Table attached as Appx "A".

EMBUSSING. See Appx "F" attached.

- 34. (a) Serials 1 - 9 will embus in GILCHRIST AVE. Vehicles will be lined up in correct order facing Westward, with the leading vehicle of serial 1 at WESTERN end of GILCHRIST AVE.
- (b) Serials 21-22 will embus in LOWER GREGORY TERRACE. Vehicles will be lined up in correct order with leading vehicle at CAMPBELL ST.
- (c) Serials 10 - 20, 23 and 24 will embus in UPPER GREGORY TERRACE. Vehicles will be lined up in correct order with leading vehicle facing Westward.

- (d) 7 Aust Div Provost in conjunction with Qld L of C Provost will be responsible for controlling movement and marshalling of vehicles in accordance with procedure laid down in Sub Paras (a) to (c) above.

CONDUCTING OF VEHICLES TO UNIT LINES.



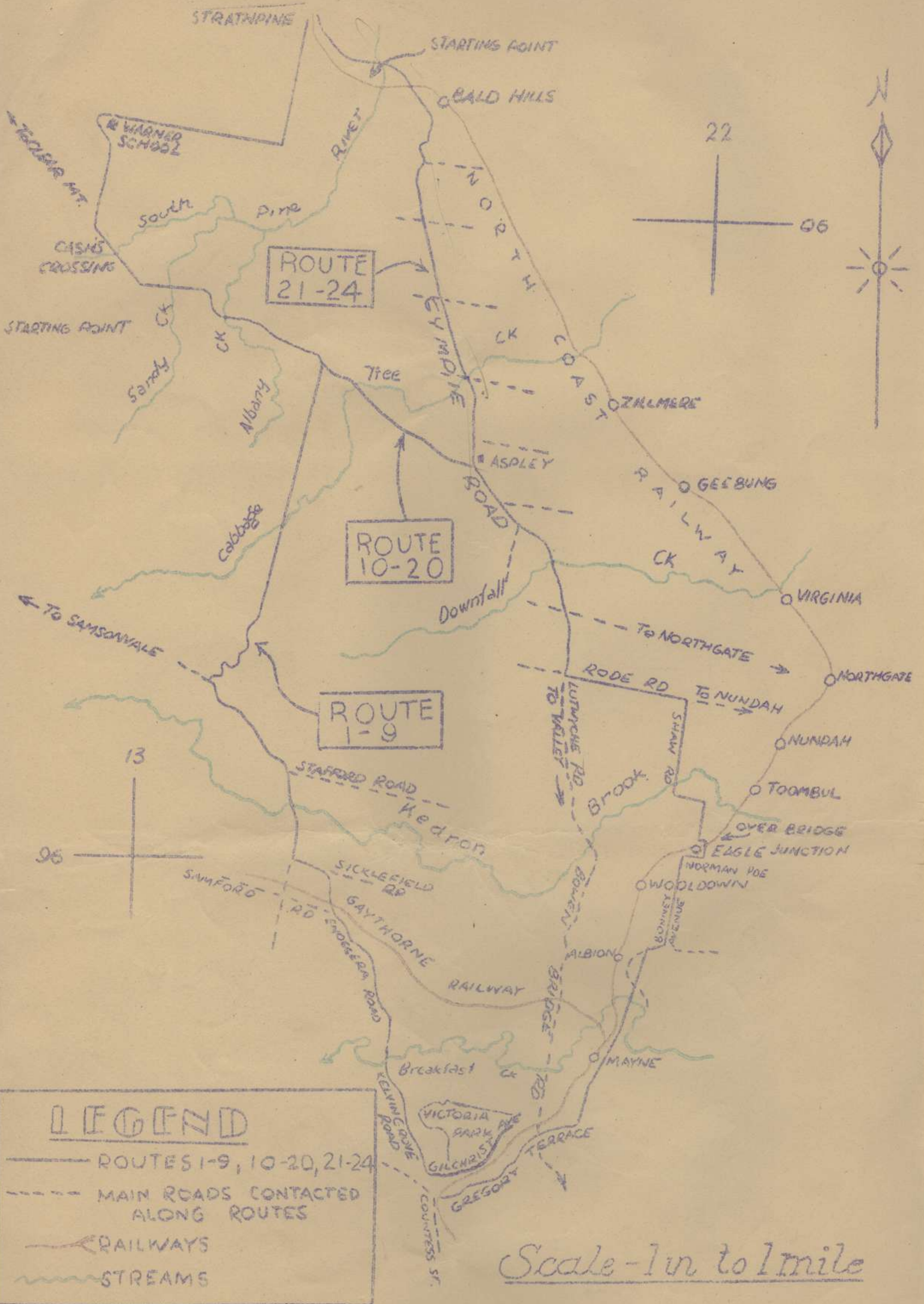

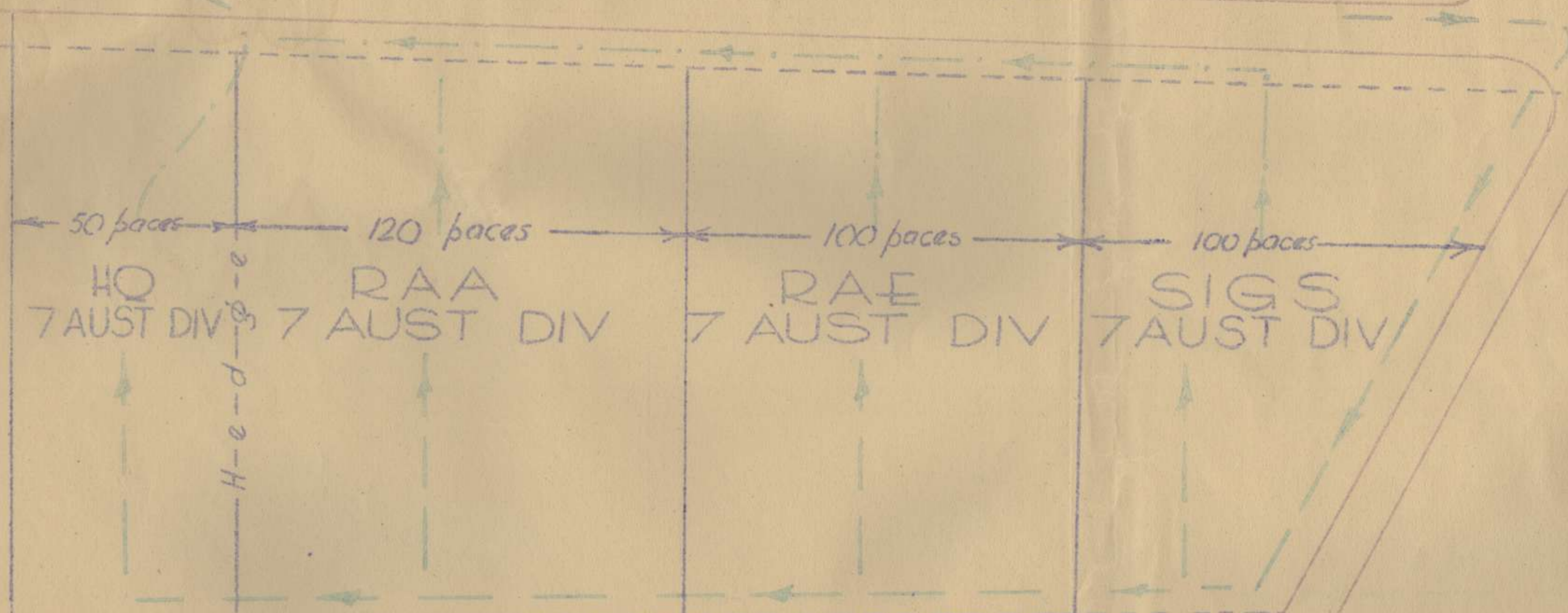

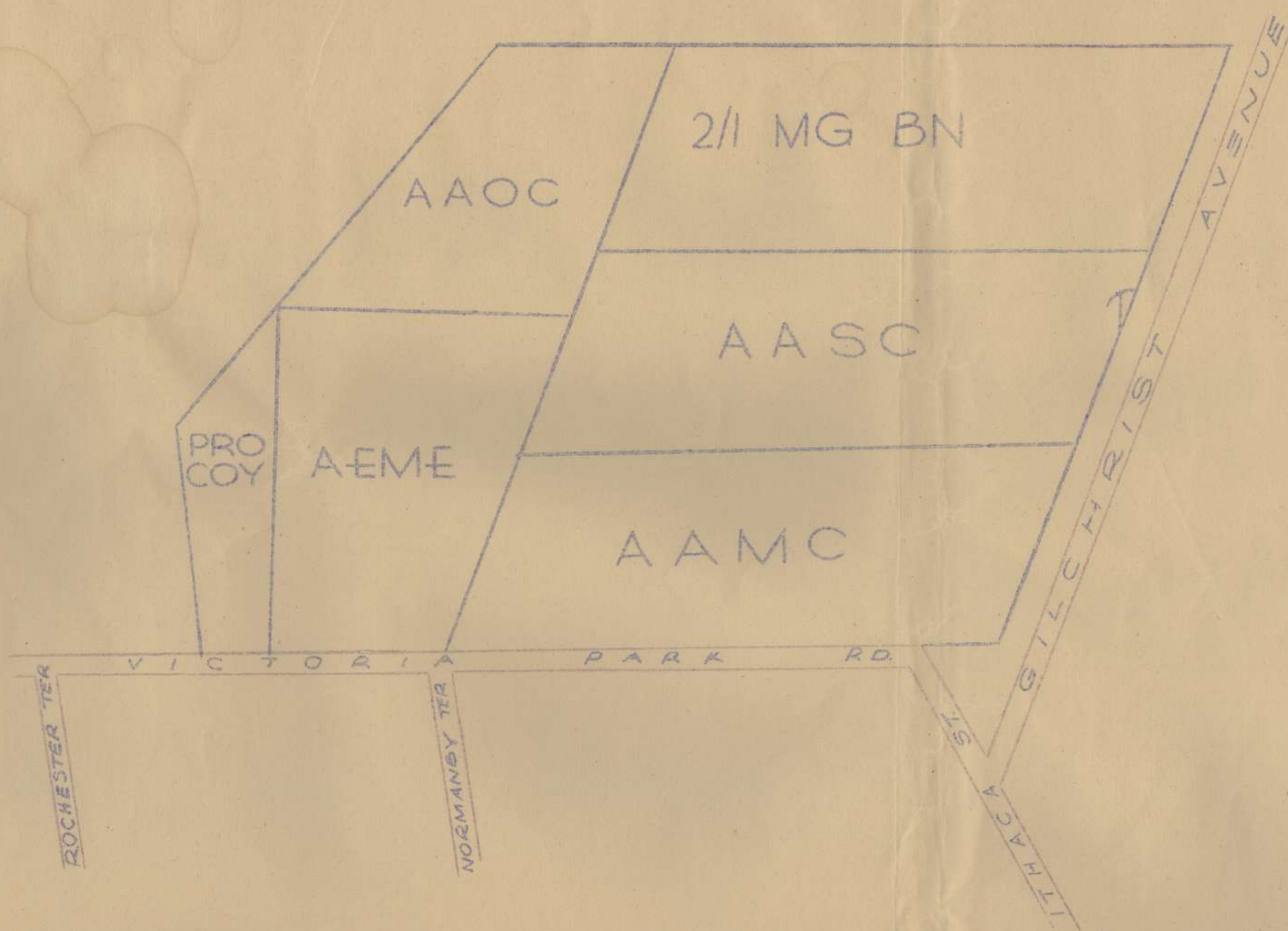

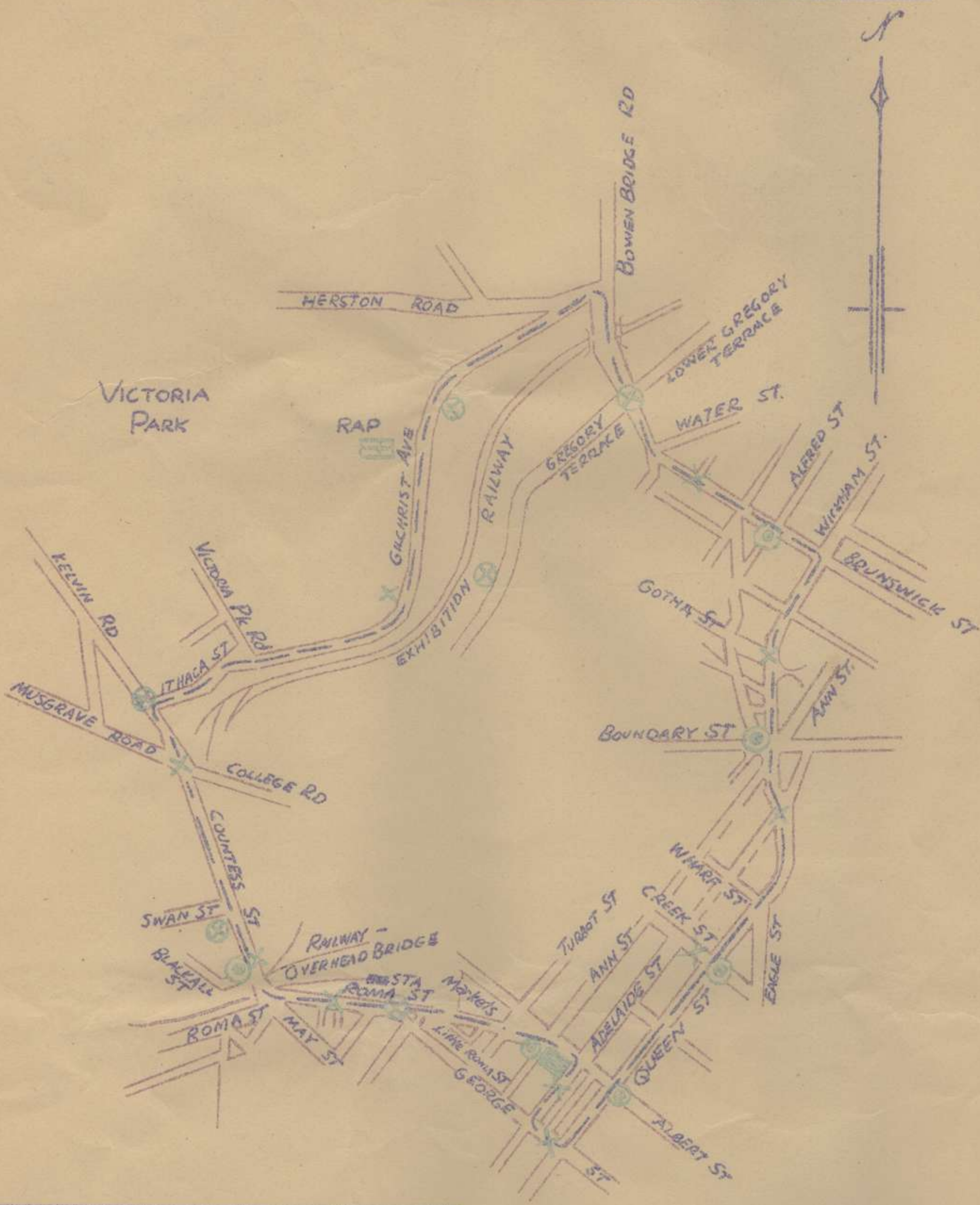

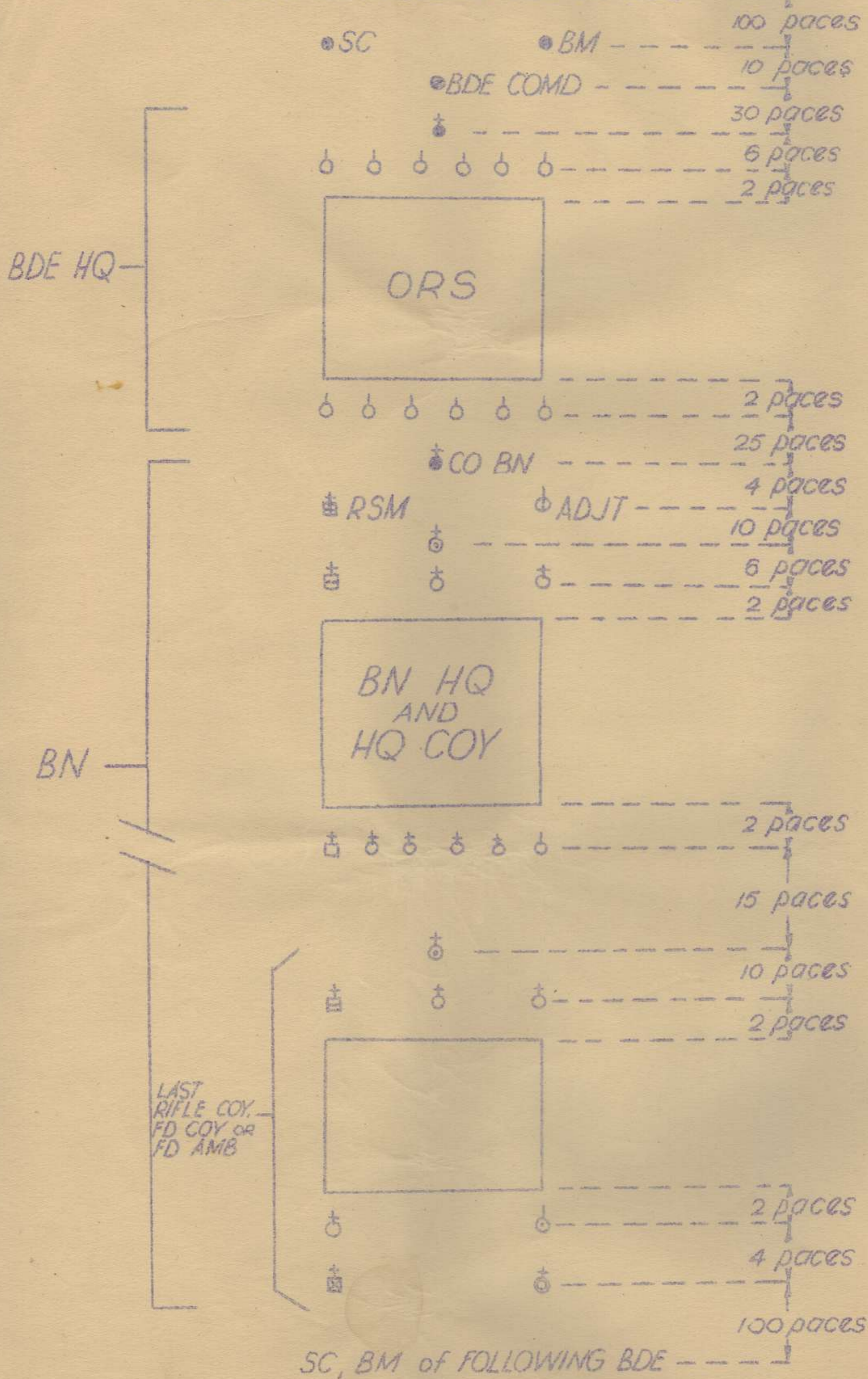

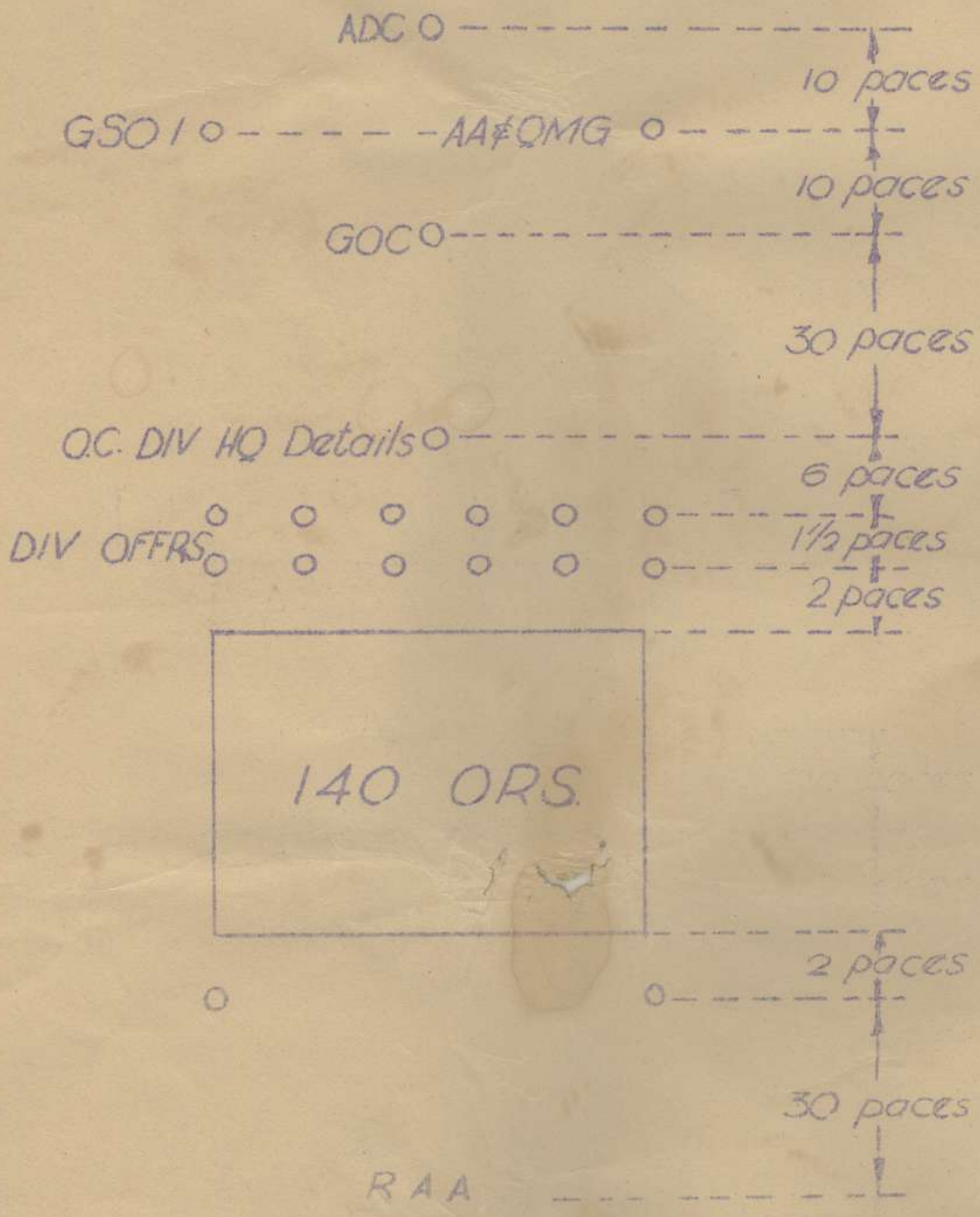
