MONTHLY SUMMARY

NOVEMBER 45

Although reports of impending trouble have been received, the ~~px~~ past month has been clear of rioting and general disturbances. Numerous Japs have been apprehended and the curtailment of their "French Leave" has undoubtedly helped considerably towards maintaining peace in Makassar. Vigorous~~xx~~ patrolling has had a visible effect on the natives and NO longer are knives, spears, waddies etc carried.

As a result of the quiet existing at present, social activities have gained momentum. Sport, socials and movies, run and controlled by us, proved most popular among the populace. The general air of oppression which was som~~xx~~ apparent among the civilians when we landed here has now completely disappeared.

The wedding of Cpl & Mrs Elliot, nee Miss G Oosterhoot, proved to be a very popular match and provided a fitting climax to our succesful social month.

With peace declared and so many soldiers receiving discharges to civilian~~xx~~ life, the deaths of Ptes Doherty and Parker were keenly felt by all member s of the Battalion.

Four Officers and 165 ORs were released during November under the Five Year, Occupational and general demobilisation plans. Ten Officers and 177 ORs mostly low priority personnel, marched in to reinforce our establishment.

A further 1 Offr and 18 ORs marched out to the 65 Aust Inf Bde in preparation for the Australian Occupation of JAPAN.

So ends November in Makassar, a month devoid of strife. Thoroughly reconciled to the fact that we will NOT be home for Christmas, we now look forward to making the Festive Season in the Celebes, as bright and enjoyabl~~xx~~-e as possible.

Although the situation remains quiet, our Patrols are still on the alert, and there is little possibility of surprise. It was reported today that natives were seen carrying arms and ammunition into quarters off Strand Weg. This area is honeycombed with hovels, and a large raiding party would be necessary to block all exits.

Alertness of sentries sometimes bears results, as today's example demonstrates. An Indonesian approached a Japanese Liaison Officer outside the Jap HQ and handed him a piece of paper. The sentry immediately intervened, and the Jap and native were escorted to HQs. The Jap translated the message, saying that two of his countrymen were requiring transport from GALESONG a few kilos from LIMBOENG. ATIS checked this but the true story was found to be a little different. These two Nipponese had travelled by prahu from PRINRANG to GALESONG (WSW of LIMBOENG) and sent the native with the message to "RED & WHITE" HQs. Unfortunately for all concerned our friend the courier took the note to friends at DJONGAJA (Market Place in Goa Weg). Friends could not read Jap hieroglyphics, so off went the courier to Jap HQs, only to be caught in the act. Consequently transport was provided for the two Jap FIM collaborators but at the expense of the AIF.

This incident gave us conclusive proof that our ex-enemy is still behind the Red & White Movement, and unless we can rid the Indies of this Jap influence, then they will have won a major political victory.

Patrol had nothing to report today: our sharp reprisals on Monday appear to have had the desired effect.

Aftermath of the GALESONG incident was that a note arrived by native from the son of the Regent of that village, intimating that he had captured 7 Japanese in the district, who were living as Indonesians. Three local girls and one Nippon-Indonesian child comprised the remainder of the party. The 2/16 Bn was informed, and in due course they took charge of the miscreants.

The CO and Major Sims moved to LIMBOENG to personally supervise the movement of Jap Guards from this area. We are glad to see the last of these guards, as their behaviour has roused suspicion on several occasions and their influence is noticeable in the district. The Jap party of 21 strong was embarked on the HARUOKA MARU, bound for MALIMPOENG concentration area.

During the morning information was received that a Jap was inciting natives to kill all Dutch people, so a Patrol investigated. There was no sign of a Jap in the house indicated, but seeing NO Dutch have been murdered in their beds we conclude that the Jap either did not exist, or that he was a particularly ^{GOOD} orator. ^{NOT}

Early in the night the line from HQs to B Coy (Patrol Coy) was out, so the Emergency Patrol stood to at HQs.

An extra picquet was placed on the YMCA whilst an Army Dance was in progress as a report was received that a crowd was gathering outside. Natives were cleared from the area and there was no trouble. Perhaps the gathering was there for the sole purpose of studying Australian technique.

Our Patrols answered several Emergency Calls but in each case they found everything in order.

A message from Makforce suggested that trouble could be expected on the 4th or 5th Nov.

The CO inspected dumps with a view to relieving Jap Guards.

Another quiet day! The rumoured attacks on Australians and Dutch did not eventuate and Sunday really took on the atmosphere of the Sabbath-rarity during Overseas Service.

Patrol in 'S' Area answered a call to the Weaving Factory, but on arrival found that native guards had repelled an attack by 20 odd natives. This is truly remarkable, for on previous raids the guards have politely handed over their weapons with little persuasion.

Church Service was held in the Dutch Reform Church, the Service was attended by many Dutch people. Padre Drydens address was taken from " The Sermon on The Mount " - ' I am The Light(-

The CO made inquiries re the Japs guarding Dumps in the MAROS RD Area. To date about 80 have been relieved of their duties.

The CO held a Coy Comd conference at 1530 I- which dealt with the following. Changes in the Postings of Officers: a. Captain MacDonald from 2 ic D Coy to 21 Bde Transport Officer. b. Lt Mac Pherson from Bn IO to 21 Bde HQs as Senior LO. c. Lt Norris from D Coy to Bn IO. d. Captain Langsford from Bn Adjutant to OC C Coy. e. Lt Frost from A/Adjutant to Adjutant.

A group of Officers from 18 Bde at Balikpapan are expected here shortly. They are to be posted to various Companies in the Battalion.

Three Dutch Companies under Command of 2/27 Aust Inf Bn.

The CO also discussed General Hygiene within the Battalion.

Our Japanese "guest" states by interrogation, that his name is YOSHIZUMI and that he came from MALIMPOENG Compound to Makassar, without permission, to visit a Chinese friend. Even though we do not like his company, his stay must of a necessity be prolonged.

The rain season is expected to start here within the next two weeks. At present we are experiencing fine sunny mornings and a rain storm each afternoon.

The C⁰ inspected dumps in the MAROS area.

We received information that notices are beginning to appear on boards which are situated at various points in the area. Our interpreter brought back a notice full of propaganda which these ~~people~~ people have absorbed from the JAP during their occupation. See Appx G 31

We shall continue to collect these communiques, they may make interesting reading.

Patrols brought in 3 JAP grenades and a native. The later was sent to NICA Police HQ for questioning.

The keenness of our personnel on patrol has extended to the Postal and Band Sgts. Acting without delay on information they received, they apprehended two JAPS in a house at ref.449318 and escorted them to Bn HQ. A patrol sent out brought back the native householder. It appeared that the two JAPS cycled from near PARE PARE to MAKASSAR in order to rejoin their native wives. So sorry to spoil honourable (?) reunion but the two Nips will be required for further enquiries. See Appx G 32 for further details.

Lt W Macpherson returned from Bde HQ. He expects to return to Aussie in the near future(long service discharge) we wish him luck.

As usual the morning was fine with heavy rain during the afternoon.

Received official notification of the award of the MM to VX 117306, Pte BLIGHT M P of "A" Coy. Pte BLIGHT was No 2 Bren Gunner in 7 Pls action on BALE feature, BALIKPAPAN. Moving forward 7 Platoon came under heavy enemy fire. The No 1 Bren Gunner (Pte McCulloch) being mortally wounded, Pte Blight immediately took over and brought effective fire to bear on the enemy. Having obtained necessary information 7 Platoon withdrew. Pte Blight remained to the last, supplying covering fire and ascertained that Pte Mc Culloch was dead before leaving his position. Pte Blight displayed coolness and devotion to duty of a very high standard.

Battalion Soccer Team played a Chinese Representative Team today, resulting in a win for China - scores being 3 - 2.

Fine and sunny weather was experienced throughout the day.

A NICA policeman apprehended a JAP in GOTON WEG, MAKASSAR. The JAP resisted arrest and was subsequently shot in the leg. He was brought to our HQ's, sent on to M.D.S for medical treatment and interrogation by Bde.HQ's interpreter.

Padre Dryden conducted a Church Service in the Dutch Reform Church. The attendance of troops and Dutch civilians is increasing each week.

Natives reported to this HQ that 6 JAPS had landed by prahu on the Island of SAMALONA, 4 miles WEST of MAKASSAR ref map Sheet No 74B. An emergency patrol from B Coy was sent by barge to apprehend them. The patrol returned with 6 unarmed JAPS and one native. They are being held in custody pending interrogation by 21 Inf Bde HQ interpreter.

Organised fishing and swimming excursions to GREAT LAELAE ISLAND started to-day. Available personnel from HQ Coy spent a most enjoyable day. These trips will be held 5 times weekly on a roster system throughout the Coys.

Eight of our JAPANESE "guests" were moved from custody for movement to the concentration area at MALIMPOENG ref map SW CELEBES. The above total includes the six JAPS arrested on the 12 Nov 45 and 2 apprehended on the 7 Nov 45. Interrogation of the six JAPS brought in yesterday revealed that they were headed for the concentration area at the time of arrest. Movement was facilitated.

A JAPANESE was sent to us to-day by MAKFORCE HQ to be held for interrogation.

Surface activities of the FIM members in this area have ceased at present.

Acting on information received from MAKFORCE HQ patrols were despatched to apprehend three JAPS reported to be at different points in the area. Patrols made a thorough investigation and reported NO signs of the JAPS.

Our night patrols, " Vigilantes ", patrolled very keenly throughout the night. Discipline was enforced with a capital "D".

The CO investigated a report that American personnel aboard the Liberty Ship " DOLLY MADISON " were selling pistols to the Natives. He Contacted Second Mate Leonard and instructed him that:-

1. Firearms will NOT be sold to Natives,
2. Unauthorised natives will NOT board the Ship.
3. Policemen will NOT be hindered in any way whilst searching the natives.
4. Captain of the vessel to be notified on his return to the ship.

Another Japanese was brought in from Makforce HQ to be held in custody awaiting interrogation by their interpreter. At present we have five " guests" undergoing interrogation. Namely YOSHIKUMA, HIGASHI KAWA, IRIYE, AKIGMO, TARUYA HIROSHI.

Life in Makassar is proceeding normally at the present time. Chinese are re-building bombed out area, native coolies are demolishing air raid shelters and generally cleaning up.

NO Red & White Flags were displayed today. Copies of statements made by two of our Nippon prisoners, namely HIGASHIKAWA and IRIE, were forwarded to us from Makforce HQ today. See Appx G 97. It is quite evident that elements of our former enemy are still as treacherous as we previously experienced. The Japanese influence in the F I M is obvious.

The CO attended VX 83052 Pte Doherty's funeral at 1100 hrs this morning. Padre O'Halloran of the 2/16 Bn conducted the service at the School of the Teaching Brothers. At 1130 hrs the Ceremonial Burial with full military honours took place at Maros Road Cemetery ref sheet 74B 484324.

1. To investigate the problem of the evacuation of Japanese together with their stocks of food POL Tpt and Ordnance stores from SE CELEBES Peninsular to the main concentration area at MALIMPONG.
2. To obtain accurate strength states of Japanese in this area showing separately Army Navy and Civilians and their location.
3. To supervise dumping of all arms and ammunition into the sea.
4. To investigate condition of KENDARI airfield.
5. To ship swords pistols and optical instruments back to MAKASSAR.
6. To investigate stocks of food under Jap and native control.
7. To investigate and report on all transport.
8. To investigate ordnance stocks.
9. To investigate civil adm. problems and condition of natives.
10. To investigate medical and hygiene arrangements.
11. To arrest and ship to MAKASSAR 5 suspected Jap war criminals.
12. To confiscate currency as per ANF order No 12 to the Jap Army.

ANSWERS: (Accurate and detailed information will comprise Part II of this report. This will be submitted as soon as completed and not later than 041200 I)

1. Evacuation could not take place at present without at least ten days notice owing to wide dispersal of troops and stores, and the very limited amount of transport available.

Grand total of Japanese in whole area 2562.
Statement showing Unit, location, strength and commitments will appear in Part II.
3. All arms and amm in the dumps at KENDARI, POMELAA, ANBESIA were dumped into the sea under supervision with the exception of the allowed 5% rifles, essential duty pistols and requisite amount of ammunition. All bomb fuses still in area were dumped. Torpedo warheads were dumped. All heavy guns were rendered useless. Bombs at POMELAA were dumped. Bombs at ANBESIA were burned. No bombs at KENDARI were destroyed owing to lack of time and huge quantities involved.
4. Airfield could be put in working order within 2 or 3 weeks by using 100 natives to clear overgrowth and fill in craters. To make a good job of it, bitumen would be required for repair work. Undamaged surface is bitumen in fair order. Length 1 1/2

5. All swords pistols and optical instruments were collected from dumps and shipped to MAKASSAR with the exception of the allowed duty pistols and a small quantity of amm, and also a quantity of ruined optical instruments.
6. There is sufficient food in the area to meet all requirements if properly administered and controlled.
7. Transport of all kinds is in extremely poor condition. Tyres are almost run out with no spares available. Usable transport. 40 trucks (30cwt and 3 ton), 10 cars, 2 motorcycles and 3 breakdown vans. Repairs by cannibalising. I recommend that in the event of the evacuation of the Japs from the area, that all transport be handed over to the new administrators.
8. Civil administration is more or less satisfactory. Several discrepancies were put in order.
9. Medical and Hygiene arrangements were unsatisfactory. Major ROSE drew up a reform program.
- XII, 8. Ordnance stocks overall are in the last stages of disrepair and unservicability. I recommend that in the event of the evacuation of the Japanese forces from this area that all Ordnance stocks be dumped in one salvage heap and turned over to the new administrators.
11. The five war criminals listed were arrested and brought back to MAKASSAR with the exception of TOKUDA. In his place I arrested FUJIDA, also of the Special Police. He may however be the wrong man.
12. All moneys were confiscated (approx one and a quarter million guilders) with the exception of the allowed percentage for administrative purposes.

2. ASSESSMENT

Prisoner admitted to coming to MAKASSAR contrary to the orders of the Australian Army and 2 Jap Army. For this he duly apologized, saying that he now realised his mistake. His story appears to be probable although he confused several of the details which he later clarified, with apologies.

3. MOVEMENTS

Prisoner was residing in a village 17 kilometres from PINRANG. Having previously agreed to buy a leather bag from KI HO RYU, a Chinese merchant in MAKASSAR, he asked permission of Lt FUKUDA at PINRANG to go to MAKASSAR. Prisoner was informed that his request was contrary to all orders and that permission was impossible. Realising this, he deliberately set out for MAKASSAR, met the Chinese merchant. The latter had no bags available. Prisoner had intended to obtain the necessary money for the purchase - 500 yen - from Ensign TOYA at the Liaison Office. Unable to find a Japanese friend called HIGASHIKAWA, prisoner wrote him a letter and gave it to one of the natives who was captured with him. Having no further business in MAKASSAR, prisoner was about to return to PINRANG by prahu when captured by a patrol at Seaplane Base, on evening of 5 Nov 45.

a prahu, writing a letter for delivery to HIGASHIKAWA on 3

A prahu having been obtained, prisoner was arrested at 2000 hrs

REPORT ON INTERROBATION OF NATIVE, ARZAH and CHINESE
QUE A POK CAPTURED 5 NOV 45 WITH YOSHIKUMI, TERUE.

QUE A POK. - felt himself to be under a debt of gratitude to the JAPANESE for giving medical assistance to his wife when wounded during the bombing. Therefore he felt bound to help any JAPANESE who come his way. He went to the seaplane Base to help YOSHIKUMI get away in a prahu.

QUE A POK (KWAA BUTSU in Japanese) had in his possession the letter written by YOSHIKUMI to HIGASHIKUMI asking for a ring. QUE A POK was to give the letter to ARZAH to attempt to deliver it to HIGASHIKAWA but this was impossible, as HIGASHIKAWA was now at LANGA.

ARZAH. said to have been a meter driver for the Japanese, and went to the seaplane Base to help YOSHIKUMI get on board the prahu.

PRISONERS REMARKS ON CONTENTS OF LETTER FOUND IN POSSESSION
OF QUE A POK

1. "The trouble this house is in".
This referred to the capture of OMI and OKUMURA, of which news was brought to QUE A POK's house by an unarmed Indonesian woman.
2. "The house you made a request about".
HIGASHIKAWA had enquired of YOSHIKUMI about a house for himself in LANGA.
3. "The master of this house".
This was QUE A POK (in Japanese KWA A BUTSU).
4. ARUSHIYA. - a native who had been driver for the KEIRIBU.
5. "I request you to get a message to ARUSHIYAI".
This letter was written on 3 Nov 45, before HIGASHIKAWA left MAKASSAR.

TRANSLATION OF LETTER FOUND IN POSSESSION OF QUE A POK.

Brother (Mr) HIGASHIKAWA.

I urgently request news from you. I have received news that OMI and OKUMURA and one other were detained two or three days ago. Hearing about the trouble this house is in, I intend to leave it as soon as possible. With regard to the house you made a request about, the person concerned has not yet returned, and so I can do nothing about your request. I beg you to understand the position and excuse me.

Further, I am in difficulties about travelling expenses, if you are willing please buy the ring you were wearing the other day at the present market value of 1,000 yen. I make this request to you urgently. If you are not using it, please return it to me. This morning I asked the master of this house to ask ARUSHIYA about getting a prahu, and if he had time, to come here. As I did not see him in the end, I again asked him to come. I request you to get a message to ARUSHIYA to find a prahu as quickly as possible.

I send this message in haste.

Receipt was given on 20 sep 45 by ABE, GOZO of JAPANESE BUSINESSMENS ASSOCIATION, for money handed over by HIGASHIKAWA, to be used for the sake of preparing "group livelihood".

Receipt in turn was given to YOSHIKUMI to take to Intendance at PINRANG on 30-31 Oct 45.

73. HYGIENE:

The only latrines to be used within the Japanese Barrack Area are "HOT SQUATS". All other latrines will be sealed. Disciplinary action will be taken against any person forcing open the doors of latrines once they have been sealed, or using any other latrine except "HOT SQUATS".

74. DEMOBILIZATION - REHABILITATION FULL TIME TRAINING COURSES:

General: Arrangements have been completed for the consideration of applications for accelerated discharge of members both male and female who, before enlistment or where on service had completed at least the entire first year of a course at a University, Teaching College, Technical College or similar public institution.

Personnel Eligible: Eligible members are:

- (a) Those who as a result of their studies through army education have passed at least the entire first year of a course which they desire to continue after discharge as full time studies under CRTS, and who are in approved categories under the scheme.
- (b) ^{Who} Those immediately prior to enlistment interrupted their course at a University, Teachers College, Technical College, or similar public institution, and who are in approved categories under CRTS, and who wish to apply thereunder.
 - (i) Such members must have passed at least the entire first year of a course either by full time or part time study and must wish to resume the same interrupted course as full time study.
 - (ii) In cases of abovementioned members who completed the first year by part time study, applications will be considered in the light of the particular circumstances of each case.
- (c) In cases of doubt whether member's course of study with AAES or otherwise complies with the above requirements or whether there is in existence a full time course for the particular subject desired for study, enquiries may be made to AAES representatives.

Applications: Applications by eligible members will be completed on Forms CRTS 1A and forwarded to Bn HQ as soon as forms completed. Applications will NOT be received after 23 Nov 45.

CRTS 1A FORMS:

- (a) CRTS 1A Forms apply to all eligible serving members who desire to resume their studies at the commencement of the 1946 training year.
- (b) Forms will be distributed immediately on arrival.

Retention and availability of members:

Consideration will be given to each application regarding availability for early discharge or necessity for retention.

Releases to commence courses:

No special releases are being considered at present for members desiring to commence full time courses.

(HQ Makassar Force AG 344 of 1 Nov 45)

74. FINAL MEDICAL BOARDS AND APPLICATIONS FOR TREATMENT OR PENSION FROM REPATRIATION COMMISSION:

1. There appears to be misapprehension as to the time at which a members of the forces must apply for a final medical board where a disability associated with war service is claimed.
2. Any potential applicant for an immediate war pension should make known at the earliest stage of demobilization, and that is at his unit, the disabilities on which he will base his application. Arrangements can then be made for specialist opinion to be obtained, if necessary, so that medical boarding will be expedited when he reaches the dispersal centre. This is the standard procedure; it will make for smooth running and will hasten releases to civilian life.
3. When a member is made available for dispersal, he will be given a complete medical examination in accordance with Demobilization Order 150 (a), before being finalised. The results of these examinations, including the result of chest X-ray, are recorded on AAF D2(a) (Medical Examination Prior to Discharge) and becomes part of the permanent record of the member's service life.
4. Many member's are requesting a final medical board only because they believe that failure to do so at the time of demobilization may jeopardise any post-discharge claim for treatment of for pension.
5. It should be clearly realised by all members that there is no time limit for application to the Repatriation Commission for treatment or for pension for any war disability. At any time after discharge, such an application may be made to the Repatriation Commission, which will then arrange full medical examination. The record of the medical examination prior to discharge and all other medical records and X-ray films are available to the Repatriation Commission at any time during the member's lifetime and are obtained by the Commission when a claim for treatment or pension is lodged.
6. The right of a member to claim treatment or pension after discharge never lapses.

7. These provisions of the policy of the Repatriation Commission will be brought to the notice of all members and repeated in all unit routine orders so that unnecessary final medical board procedure, as distinct from medical examination on demobilization may be obviated. If members claim a final medical board for inadequate reasons, their demobilization will be unnecessarily delayed.

Nationalistic Greetings!!!!

All over the world of to-day people are uniting. Everywhere the people of this world, that up till this present day have been subdued by others, take up their weapons and fight for their freedom and independence.

We, Indonesians, we too want to unite, we too want freedom and we too shall fight for it. We do not want to stay behind. We too shall fight for a new a free and an independent Indonesia, even if we have to bleed for it, even if some of us must die for this noble cause. All of us, old and young will fight for our cause.

What are we fighting for? Who are we fighting for? We shall fight for a free Indonesia, our own and we shall fight for all true Indonesians. We shall fight for this country, that we love so much. We shall fight for a rightful place under the sun, for a place amongst the people of this earth, with who we want to live in peace and freedom.

It is therefor that we, the younger generation of Indonesians, instruct you, Indonesians the following:

- 1: support the new Indonesian Republic.
- 2: don't work against the Indonesian Republic.
- 3: don't let yourself be bribed and bought by the Nica, in doing that you will be a traitor to your country.
- 4: You will also be considered a traitor if you accept money from the Nica

General outlines of the Malay notices taken from two notice-boards situated at the Schijfbergweg.

- 1: this notice was dated: 7th of November 1945 and contained the news about the conference held in Java between Lt.Gouv-Gen. Dr.van Mook and the leader of the F.I.M., Ir.Soekarno. It is stated that the proposals of the Dutch Government have been rejected by Ir.Soekarno because of the fact that several members of the F.I.M. were accused by the Dutch officials of having coöperated with the Japs during the Jap occupation of Java.

- 2: This pamphlet was issued by the education-department of the F.I.M. in Makassar. It informs the Indonesian people that the general policy in the Dutch schools is one of teaching the art of subueing, of overruling the majority by a minority. So far there are no Indonesian schools equal to the official Dutch schools but very shortly there will be established a primary-school, a secondary-school and a higher grade school, for Indonesians only, with pure Indonesian teachers, in which schools only the Indonesian language will be used. These schools will be opened at the DATOEMOESINGWEG Nr. 8 and all Indonesian certified schoolteachers are invited to offer their services. They must apply to the future headmaster, Mr. Sitoemorang, address: Goaweg Nr. 38.

- 3: This pamphlet is an old one, dated the 2nd. of November 1945. Contents all the news about a conference held by 5 Indonesian leaders of the F.I.M. and 4 British officers and two interpretors. It is stated in this notice that the Allied are not the enemies of the Indonesian people. The Allies have come to Java and the other islands only to maintain peace and order, to disarm the Japanese and to protect the POW's and civilian internees. So the Indonesian people is cautioned not to take any action against the Allied troops.
The real enemy of the Indonesian people is the Nica! Nica! Nica!

General outlines of the notices, tore down from various notice boards in MAKASSAR during the night of 10/11 November 45, handed over to BHQ 2/27 Bn I section.

1. Originating from SOENGGOEEMINASSA, dated November 45. Contents:- All Indonesians are ready to fight for their freedom. Who is their enemy? NICA is and everybody that co-operates with NICA, or workes for NICA will be considered a trator to his country and dealt with accordingly. This means that they will be killed. Remember this that you who are Indonesians by birth but commit treachery by accepting money from NICA for your services. Long live Free Indonesia, all traitors will be killed. Freedom!

2. All indonesians in Java are already fighting for their freedom. But the young Indonesians here do not fight, they are frightened and nervxous. What is the reason for their cowardly behaviour? Because one of the leaders have capitulated and works now for NICA.

The and dies because of too much sugar

The leaderx will die because he has accepted money from
NICA.

When the Japs came here, all Dutchmen were imprisoned
Now thw Dutch have come back, they will subdue the Indo-
nesians.

Now be happy, you NADJAMOEDDIN with your NICA money.

3. Beware! Everybody that tears down our proclamations will be killed by us. Look out we are spying on you.
4. This is just a bit of propaganda, explaining to the Indonesians why the Dutch are the enemies of the Indonesian people. Wherever you go in the Dutch quarters, you'll find beautiful houses with plenty of lights, chairs and all.sorts of commodities. When, however, you go and visit andIndonesian "kampong" you'll find only poor, half starved people, living in slumps This difference is the work of the Dutch. But it won't happen again, for now all Indonesians are prepared to fight for better living conditions. It is rumoured that Mr.Manai Sophiaan has turned round and is now working for NICA. But do not believe this story, it is only invented by NICA to confuse you.
5. You Indonesians, Hearken! Zero-hour has come at last and you must be prepared to fight. You will have to kill. Do you know that you are to kill? Wipe out the NICA! Kill the Ambonese and Euresian soldiers and then your Indonesia will be free.

You, Indonesian women, change your skirts for trousers, take up your arms and fight with us, for Indonesia is also your country, the country that NICA is trying to steal from you

2/27 Aust Inf Bn13 Nov 4576. UNLAWFUL POSSESSION OR DISPOSAL OF ARMS, EQUIPMENT AND EXPLOSIVES:

1. In this order, unless the contrary intention appears, "arms" includes firearms and weapons of any kind; "explosives" includes bombs, shells and live ammunition.
2. Attention is directed to -
 - (i) The number of AMF, allied and enemy arms which are passing into the hands of civilians, particularly of the criminal class;
 - (ii) The fact that instances of unauthorised disposal and receipt, by barter and otherwise, of AMF and allied arms and equipment by and to members of the AMF and allied forces have been detected;
 - (iii) The fact that members of the public have been killed or seriously injured as the result of the handling of explosives which have been taken or sent home as souvenirs by members or which have negligently been left in places to which the public have access.
3. Arms, equipment and explosives captured from the enemy are Commonwealth property and their possession by any member is unlawful unless authorised under paras 29 and 30 of GRO 209/1945 which are
 - (a) Personnel are permitted to possess or send to their nominated addresses, but not to Aust Kit Stores, as war souvenirs, items of enemy equipment and documents which are of no value to Intelligence or Ordnance, but they are not permitted to possess or return the following:-
 - pistols
 - rifles and bayonets
 - SMGs, LMGs and HMGs
 - grenade dischargers
 - mortars
 - field, mountain, A tk and AA artillery
 - sights, technical equipment and parts
 - grenades and ammunition
 - explosives
 - mines
 - flamethrowers
 - rangefinders
 - or any original item (unless authorised by intelligence)

(b) Personnel desirous of retaining or returning to their nominated addresses items of enemy equipment (other than those specified in sub para (a) of this order), as souvenirs, will present such material to Intelligence officer for inspection. Such officer is authorised to issue and sign a certificate, a copy of which is reproduced hereunder, certifying that the item is of no value to Intelligence or Ordnance and releasing it as a war souvenir if it complies with postal regulations. The certificate must accompany the item, otherwise the article will be liable to confiscation by censorship authorities.

This article.....has been examined by me and is not required for Intelligence or Ordnance purposes.

- 4. A high degree of care will be exercised by members in respect of arms, equipment and explosives in their possession.
- 7. Except when acting in the course of his military duties when authorised under paras 29 and 30 of GPO 209/1945, a member will not have in his possession, or deliver or transmit, or acquire in any way from, or attempt to deliver or transmit to, or acquire in any way from, any other person (whether a civilian or a member of another Australian or Allied service) any arms or explosives.
- 8. The kit and baggage of every member will be inspected thoroughly prior to his marching out from Coy for return to Australia.
- 9.
 - (a) A member will not take his arms or equipment to his home unless it is impracticable to deposit them at an Aust Army Canteen.
 - (b) A member will not deposit his arms or equipment in any canteen or establishment other than an Aust Army Canteen, nor will he leave them unattended in an hotel, restaurant, cafe, theatre or any other such place.
- 10. When any member is charged with an offence in respect of any act, conduct or omission forbidden by this order, the CO will direct that a summary of evidence be taken and will make application to superior authority for direction whether the member will be tried by court-martial.

77. DISCIPLINE:

Attention is drawn to the fact that all property in the South West CELEBES, including all property previously owned by the Japanese Government or Japanese Civilians, whether guarded or unguarded, in dumps or in private houses, is owned by either the Commonwealth of Australia, the Dutch Government or by local civilians. The term property includes among other things, arms, equipment, goods, cloth, furniture, chattels, jewellery, and personal effects of all kinds.

The appropriating or taking away of any such property by any unauthorised ^{person} is at law, theft.

The maximum punishment which may be imposed for offences of this nature are:

For simple stealing, penal servitude for 5 years; stealing from the person, penal servitude for 14 years, and stealing in a dwelling house, penal servitude for 14 years. For armed robbery or robbery with violence, penal servitude for life may be imposed.

78. CREDIT ENTRIES IN PAYBOOKS:

Subject: information received re 3 (three) Japanese reported to be Kampong Tabo-Tabo near Pangkadjene.

In the above-mentioned kampong, in the house of one PAMNGOMIE, live 3 Japanese, armed with handgrenades and revolvers. These Japanese are in the possession of: 5 trunks containing cloth and clothes

- 2 sewingmachines
- 2 carts

1 buffet. This stuff is hidden in the house of one ANDI MAPPE.

In this house are also living Anid Mappe's son by the name of NAPING and one ANDI KANNA. The latter is one of the leaders of the Red/white movement and has before the war been interned by the Dutch Government on account of his being pro-Jap.

In the house of one PALAGOE Dg TIRO are hidden two motorbikes (Japanese type) It is stated that this man has collaborated with the Japs and has received from the Japs during the Jap occupation gold in exchange for cloth and chalk, which he had stolen from the town-storehouses.

Another Indonesian that has been collaborating with the Japs is one BALLATJO DG. PAROEMPA, who was during Jap occupation employed with the KOONAN GUNI at Pangkadjene.

Two other persons, viz. PALABOEROE and ATJA are reported to have sent food and liquor to Japs at LANGGA-PINRANG by means of sailing-prahu.

The above-mentioned BALLATJO DG. PAROEMPA is an active propagandist for the Red/White Movement, proclaims the new Dutch currency non-valid and he has repeatedly said that he'd like to go to Japan as soon as possible.

It is reported that police-man BADOLO, living at Pangkadjene liaises with the Japs and warns them of Australian movements. Badolo if captured could lead to ANDI MAPPE and also the 3 Japanese.

Andi Mappe is stated to be living at Kpg. TARAWANG, 4 Kilometers from Pangkadjene. Jeepable road from Pangkadjene to Kpg. Tarawang.

Name: B.J.Schmidt, living Macassar,

Goaweg Nr. 11.

NOTE.- In answering the latter questions the prisoner was shifty and evasive, and in one case at least, he read a date written in English upside down which the Interrogator was writing.

2. ASSESSMENT.

Prisoner was very hesitant and evasive in his answers, was selfcontradicted and some of his statements directly contradicted facts proven from other sources of information. In giving his personal record he was vague, hesitant and evasive.

3. STATEMENT.

1941. - On leaving school, entered his father's business - house bldg.

1 Jan

1944. - Volunteered for service as a Naval Civilian and left Japan. No Military Trg.

About

13 Feb

1944 - SINGAPORE.

7 Mar - Left SINGAPORE.

10 Mar- Arrived SOERABAYA, worked in the Intendence Dept as accountant & teller.

About

10 Jun

1945 - Left SOERABAYA by plane and landed at MAROS (Tpt Plane). When asked the reason for travelling by plane when they were so scarce, he said ships were loaded with goods, and therefore he was sent by plane. On arrival in MAKASSAR he entered the Intendence Dept there.

(Note:- Date of arrival from SOERABAYA agrees with YOSHIZUMI's statement).

When the other Intendence Dept personnel were moved out, he remained as an official of the Liaison Office (AMC), arranging the business of the rear personnel, were AMC armband.

(Note:- This agrees with YOSHIZUMI's statement).

About

10 Oct

1945 - Went to LANGA via FARE FARE.

17 Oct- Arrived at LANGA

20 Oct- Left LANGA with the permission of Lt TAKAMI to come to MAKASSAR, because his work was not yet finished.

(Comment :- Has a little story been connected with TAKAMI to justify HIGASHIKAWA's unauthorised presence in MAKASSAR?)

Prisoner further stated that the Administration Offr TANIGUCHI of the Liaison Office challenged him with being here without permission 無許可 when he reported on 13 th, and he replied to them that Lt TAKAMI had given

him permission - (Comment :- Lt TAKAMI - if this is true - is acting independently of the Liaison Office).

24 Oct 45 - Arrived MAKASSAR and came to Liaison Office. Stayed one day at the Liaison Office, at a time when there was a change of quarters. Prisoner worked at the Liaison Office, and lived on the MAROS Weg with a native called ARZAH, who had been driver for the KEIRIEU. Came backwards and forwards to work. Prisoner stated that the Liaison office gave him permission to live at ARZAH's house, but he could not remember who gave him the permission, though he was sure that it was an officer. Prisoner stated that he lived at ARZAH's house till yesterday and never left the house at any time except to go to work.

When challenged with the statement that ARZAH himself told the interrogator that HIGASHIKAWA left for LANGA on 4 Nov 45, and that his friend YOSHIZUMI independently corroborated this evidence, prisoner denied that he was lying.

Prisoner stated that he knew FUJITA, who was employed by the Intendence Dept, but said that he saw him last on 10 Sep. He knew AKIBA only by name as an employee of the KEIRIEU, but he had not seen him at all.

Prisoner said that he did not know OMI, but knew YOSHIZUMI.

Prisoner was then asked whether he knew HOSHI, OKUMURA, NAGAYAMA, KAJIMOTO, FUJIMOTO, TOYAMA and AKIBA, and he said that he saw them all at LANGA on 14 Oct.

Note:- This statement on AKIBA, contradicts the former one, and to make sure, prisoner was again asked their names in a list and he said he saw all of them at LANGA.

YOSHIZUMI.

Prisoner saw him at the house of ARZAH about 20 Oct, when YOSHIZUMI came to see HIGASHIKAWA 'on business' to pay for some shoes which YOSHIZUMI had bought from the KEIRIEU.

He said he had borrowed a ring from YOSHIZUMI because the latter had two, he returned this ring to YOSHIZUMI on 15 Oct. (Comment - This contradicts YOSHIZUMI's letter).

Questioned regarding his money affairs, he said he was not rich, but had received a sum of money from Lt TSUCHIYA, of the Liaison Committee of the GUNJUBU before he, HIGASHIKAWA, left MAKASSAR to pay a Chinaman (DOUBIKONSU) - living in the MAROS Weg - for tpt of personnel and goods north by prehu northwards. He gave this money to Lt TAKAMI. KWA A BUTSU (QUE A POK) :- prisoner did not know this man.

IRIE.

When questioned as to knowledge of this man, prisoner took a long time to answer, but said he knew him about 16 Oct at LANGA, and that he was an employee of the Intendence Dept. (Comment :- Prisoner at this stage was very confused and hesitant) He did not know why IRIE left LANGA.

HAYASHI.

Questioned on this subject, prisoner first said he knew HAYASHI. There, pressed for details, he said he only knew the name. Then, pressed again, he said he knew HAYASHI was an employee of the TOKKEI TAI. He knew no more than this.

Prisoner was asked whether he has any other names himself, he then said his name in KANJI, could be read alternatively AZUMA GAWA. Pressed further, he denied that he had other names.

When shown the outside address of the letter addressed by him to FUJITA and AKIBA (which was intercepted outside the Liaison Office), prisoner became confused, and after a long wait, gave this explanation.

His wife in Tokyo was named HAYASHI (sic). She wrote him a letter,

addressed to HIGASHIKAWA, but signed by herself as HAYASHI (sac). He showed this letter to FUJITA and his friends, and therefore called him HAYASHI!! (Comment:- an obvious fabrication).

RATULANGI.

In answer to the question 'Do you know Mr RATULANGI', prisoner replied that he had never seen him.

Asked 'Who is TATULANGI' he replied ' An Indonesian. Asked what is his occupation', after much hesitation he replied 'Oh, a doctor'.

Challenged with the absurdity of this (everybody in MAKASSAR has heard about RATULANGI) he said he had heard nothing about the Red and White (FIM) till yesterday, when the Liaison Office told him yesterday that he was wanted in connection with contact with the Red and White Movement. He had seen a lot of people wearing Red and White badges before, but beyond that knew nothing of the Movement. It was Mr TANIGUCHI who questioned him, and he replied that he had come from LANGA with the permission of Lt TAKAMI.

Asked how he knew he was wanted and that he had to report to the Liaison Office, prisoner said he was a Christian, and went to church near the Peace Camp. When he came to church a JAPANESE priest called SEIYA told him that he was wanted by the Australians. He then reported to the Liaison Office, from the house of ARZAH where he was living. The Liaison Office had told SEIYA he was wanted.

When challenged with his own statement that the Liaison Office gave him permission to live with ARZAH, prisoner said he had not told them where ~~ARZAH'S house was.~~ ARZAH's house was. Asked why the Liaison Office could not enquire this, prisoner had no satisfactory explanation.

ARZAH.

Formerly a driver for the Intendence Dept, was a member of the Red & White and wore the badge.

Prisoner stated he knew no other YOSHIKUMI but the one in the KEIRBU, that he did not know KUBOTA? ARATAME, KONDO or Lt Comdr HANADA. He knew IKEYA of the Cement Coy.

Prisoner was untruthful, and was forced into an admission of lying at least once. He was not frank, and answered all questions, especially with regard to the dates of his most recent movements, reluctantly. His manner was sullen, and often most insolent. When captured, prisoner was wearing a clean, well laundered white suit, despite his statement that he had just sailed by prahu, all by himself, from GALESONG.

3. STATEMENT

Personal Record.

Apr 1940 : Entered BANYU SEIYAKU KABUSHIKI KAISHA (Universal Medicine Manufacturing Company) at OSAKA, worked as a salesman.
Nov 42: Returned home, and worked on OSAKA with his people as a rice merchant.
Sep 43 : Entered KURE Naval Intendance Dept and left Japan.
Early Oct: Arrived SOERABAYA
End Oct : Left SOERABAYA by ship
Nov 43 : Arrived MAKASSAR
Nov 43 - Aug 45: Worked in Naval Intendance Dept MAKASSAR on business, such as handling of messages.
10 Sep 45 : Left MAKASSAR on orders of Intendance Dept
17 Sep 45 : Arrived PINRANG
8 Oct 45 : Arrived LANGA ??
About beginning of Nov : Came to GALESONG (Prisoner was very vague and hesitant here)
12 Nov : Left GALESONG by ship for MAKASSAR. Would not state the name of owner. Stated that he found the prahu on the beach at GALESONG, and came alone to MAKASSAR and landed at YUWAI SANGYO. During his journey he saw no other Japanese. After landing he wandered a little in MAKASSAR, and then, because he had no money, he was on his way to the Liaison Office.
Prisoner gave no satisfactory explanation of the reason for his journey to MAKASSAR, but merely said he deserted because he had no money. He had no permission to come to MAKASSAR, and did not know that it was against the orders of the Australian HQ.

YOSHIZUMI. Knew this man as an employee of the KEIRIBU, and last saw him at LANGA in Oct 45. He knew no other person named YOSHIZUMI.

HIGASHIKAWA. A member of the KEIRIBU, saw him last at LANGA at end of Oct 45.

(Note: Prisoner was later shown the prisoner HIGASHIKAWA at a distance, and identified him as the same man)

HAYASHI. Did not know this man.

FUJITA. First denied knowledge of this man, but when challenged with the fact that FUJITA knew him, he admitted lying, and he said he last saw FUJITA with AKIBA at LANGA. They said they were coming to MAKASSAR, but prisoner professed not to know the reason.

SEKIGUCHI.

Saw him at LANGA.

OKUMURA.

A member of the KEIRIBU, saw him at LANGA at the end of Oct.

HOSHI. Ditto

NAGAYAMA. as for HOSHI.

FUJIMOTO.

A member of the KEIRIBU, saw him at LANGA on 20 Oct 45.

KAJIMOTO. Ditto

TOYAMA. ""

OMI. A member of the KEIRIBU, saw him at LANGA on 20 Oct 45.

Prisoner disclaimed any connection with the Red and White Movement. He said he had heard of Lt Comdr HANADA and the HANADA KIKAN, but knew only the names.

Prisoner did not know ARATAME, KUBOTA, IKEYA, or KONDO.

Name :- HIGASHIKAWA, Kazuo

(Other details as in para 1 Interrogator's report of 14 Nov 45)

2. ASSESSMENT.

Prisoner was told before the Interrogation that, through the many facts previously in our possession, we know that many of his statements are lies. He was warned that if he continued to lie he would perhaps suffer the fate of TOJO and YAMASHITA. However, if he told the truth his treatment might be more lenient.

Prisoner still showed a disregard for the truth, and admitted lying only when faced with incontrovertible evidence that he was.

3. STATEMENT.(a) FUJITA's and AKIBA's letter addressed to HIGASHIKAWA (intercepted outside the Liaison Office)

Confronted with this, and FUJITA's statements prisoner made the following explanation:-

- (i) He declared emphatically that he had never seen RATULANGI or, had any dealings with him.
 - (ii) FUJITA had been mistaken when he said that HIGASHIKAWA was a friend of RATULANGI.
 - (iii) The reason why FUJITA, AKIBA and YOSHIZUMI all tried to contact HIGASHIKAWA was that they knew that he was in MAKASSAR, and being a friend of theirs, could help them in their unauthorised journeys.
 - (iv) With reference to the statement "Please send over one or two men of the Red and White" he said that the Japanese had no connection with the Red and White Movt, but that the Japanese knew that the Red and White were favourable to them, and would help any Japanese in trouble.
- When challenged with the information that two Japanese dressed in native clothes, wearing Red and White badges, and armed with pistol had been terrorizing natives, and had been shot while resisting arrest, he offered no explanation.

(Note:- Shooting of Japanese was on 12 Nov)

When challenged with the fact that he had given no satisfactory reason for his presence in MAKASSAR, and that he had disappeared in the last fortnight, he said that he had not dared to come out because he had heard of the shooting of the Japanese.

Prisoner was then faced with the independent statements of his friends ARZAH and YOSHIZUMI and the fact that YOSHIZUMI's letter failed to be delivered because ARZAH could not find HIGASHIKAWA, the prisoner started to break into an explanation about being hidden in the back of ARZAH's house, but when the interrogator or laughed in his face, he confessed to lying about being in MAKASSAR all the time, and made the following statement.

He left MAKASSAR by prahu on 3 Nov, from the seashore. He did not know who owned the prahu. He arrived at LANGA on 8 Nov 45, and there met IRIE and SEKIGUCHI. Hearing that they and others intended to desert, some to the mountains, some to MALINO, he decided to desert to MAKASSAR, where he had friends. On arrival in MAKASSAR, he remained at the house of ARZAH, till he had heard he was wanted.

Regarding YOSHIZUMI's letter, he said that 'the house he made the request about' referred to the fact that he had asked YOSHIZUMI who was friendly with many Chinese, to get him a house in MAKASSAR where he could stay, and so not bring trouble on ARZAH. He admitted that he had told a lie about the ring during the last interrogation. The facts were as stated by YOSHIZUMI.

RECEIPT.

RECEIPT-

HIGASHIKAWA was given this receipt by an official of the JBA, he did not remember whom, about 20 Sep 45 to give to Lt TAKAMI, but he failed to deliver the receipt, as he was busy in MAKASSAR, and could not go to LANGA. The receipt was given for money lent by the KEIRIBU to the JBA. Hearing that YOSHIKUMI was going NORTH he gave the receipt to him for delivery.

HAYASHI.

The interrogator, bluffing, told the prisoner that a hidden person had identified him as HAYASHI of the YOKKEI TAI, (Note:- this is not so). Prisoner hung his head, did not state that the alleged informant was lying or mistaken, but asserted that his name was HIGASHIKAWA, and that his explanation of his alternative name was correct.

(Note:- The interrogator was not sure that his attitude was due to guilt - i.e., that he really is HAYASHI, or dismay at being accused of being someone he was not.)

(b) CONNECTIONS WITH SECRET ORGANISATIONS.

Questioned concerning his activities when in SOERABAYA, he said he was working for the KEIRIBU, and denied any connection with any secret organisations such as HANADA KIKAN, JOHO KIKAN or TOKUMU KIKAN. He emphatically stated that he knew nothing of these.

He stated that he did not know ATATAME, KUBOTA, IKEYA or KONDO. He further said he did not know KANEKO, Keizo.

(Note;- This latter is probably untrue, as KANEKO was a businessmen wellknown to YOSHIKUMI and the KEIRIBU.)

The prisoner has not yet given satisfactory explanation of three vital points:-

- (1) Why he is also called HAYASHI
- (2) Why he was in MAKASSAR for so long
- (3) FUJITA's statement that he was a friend of RATULANGI's and was often at his house .

- (b) Attention is directed to RO 233/45 in regard to qualifications necessary and the method of obtaining approval in each individual case as in Section (11) and para 92 of Section (V).
- (c) Members who are clearly entitled to Stars will obtain the approval of their Commanding Officer on the appropriate pro form given in Section (V) and will not wear the ribbon until such written approval has been obtained. In the case of members whose eligibility partly or wholly depends on attachments for duty or visits etc., referred to in para 4 of Section (11), applications will be submitted to the Adjutant-General (DPS LH) through the usual channels, and these applications will be decided by the Commander-in Chief.

- (d) No member will wear a ribbon until written approval is given either by his Commanding Officer under Section (V) or by AG's Branch LH, on the decision of the Commander-in-Chief under sub-para 4 (b) and (c) of Section (11).

89. EXTERNAL QUARANTINE - ANIMALS - TROOPS RETURNING TO AUSTR.

Subtended is a copy of LHQ memo 136004 of 15 Oct 45 relating to the abovementioned matter for information and necessary action:-
"GRO 53/1945 and LHQ 110365 of 27 Aug 45 have been issued on the above subject and I require strict compliance with the orders in these two publications.

Articles have appeared in "Salt" explaining the reasons for these orders and the booklet entitled "Mascot Menace" is in course of publication for distribution to troops outside the mainland to impress on them the necessity for strict compliance with orders and instructions regarding animals etc. quarantine.

I cannot stress too highly the danger to Australian agriculture and to Australian health of disregard of these orders. The following diseases which do not occur in Australia exist in the Indies and Asiatic territories and as there were no quarantine restrictions observed by the Japanese during occupation of New Guinea and the Solomons, it must be assumed that such diseases are likely to exist there also. In some cases the recurrence of the diseases have been known in Australia. These have in most cases been traced to disregard of quarantine regulations and their spread has been obviated by action taken by the Health Department

Anthrax	Most animals	Transmitted by direct infection. A few cases have occurred in Australia
Glanders	Horses, donkeys etc	Method of transmission by direct infection. No cases in Australia.

All the above diseases are transmissible to human beings.

Dourine	Horses, donkeys etc.	Mode of transmission is by contact. Has not occurred in Australia.
Swine Fever	Pigs	Direct infection. Has not occurred in Australia.

Where the term "direct infection" is used in the "Remarks" Column it means disease is transmitted only by direct contact, but also by contamination materials such as horns, hides, meat, droppings etc..

In addition to the above diseases which do not present a complete list there are numerous ticks, insects, plant diseases and noxious weeds in the territories concerned which do not exist in Australia and against which Australian plants, animals and human beings have not acquired immunity.

The spread of the Rabbit, Lentana, Gorse, Briar and Prickly Pear in Australia are instances of what can happen after the introduction of animal or vegetable pests, even in small quantities.

All ranks are to be informed of the dangers involved in bringing back to Australia as curios or mascots any of the articles mentioned in the GRO and I desire that you impress on all Officers the necessity for the strictest policing of this GRO whenever embarkation or disembarkation of personnel under their control or command takes place."

(Makassar Force RO 97 of 17 Nov 45)

90. AREAS OUT OF BOUNDS - EMPRESS HOTEL

(a) The Empress Hotel is, at present, the only home for many Dutch people in MAKASSAR, and also for transient officials. Its accommodation is very limited and the large numbers of Australian personnel using the lounge daily, preclude its use by resident guests.

(b) For these reasons, the Empress Hotel is placed Out of Bounds to all ranks of RAN, AMF and RAAF on and from 20 November 1945.

(c) This order will be promulgated immediately to all ranks.

(Makassar Force AG527 of 19 Nov 45)

21. MOVEMENT OF ARMY PERSONNEL BY RAAF AIRCRAFT

(a) In order to provide air transport for the maximum number possible, it is essential that personnel proceeding by air to the mainland for release on long service and other grounds, travel as lightly equipped as possible.

(b) Accordingly, all surplus and unserviceable items such as arms, tools, respirators, steel helmets etc. will be withdrawn from all personnel travelling by air prior to their departure from units.

(c) Kits will be inspected by Coys prior to departure of members to ensure that unnecessary items and souvenirs which are unauthorised, are NOT included.

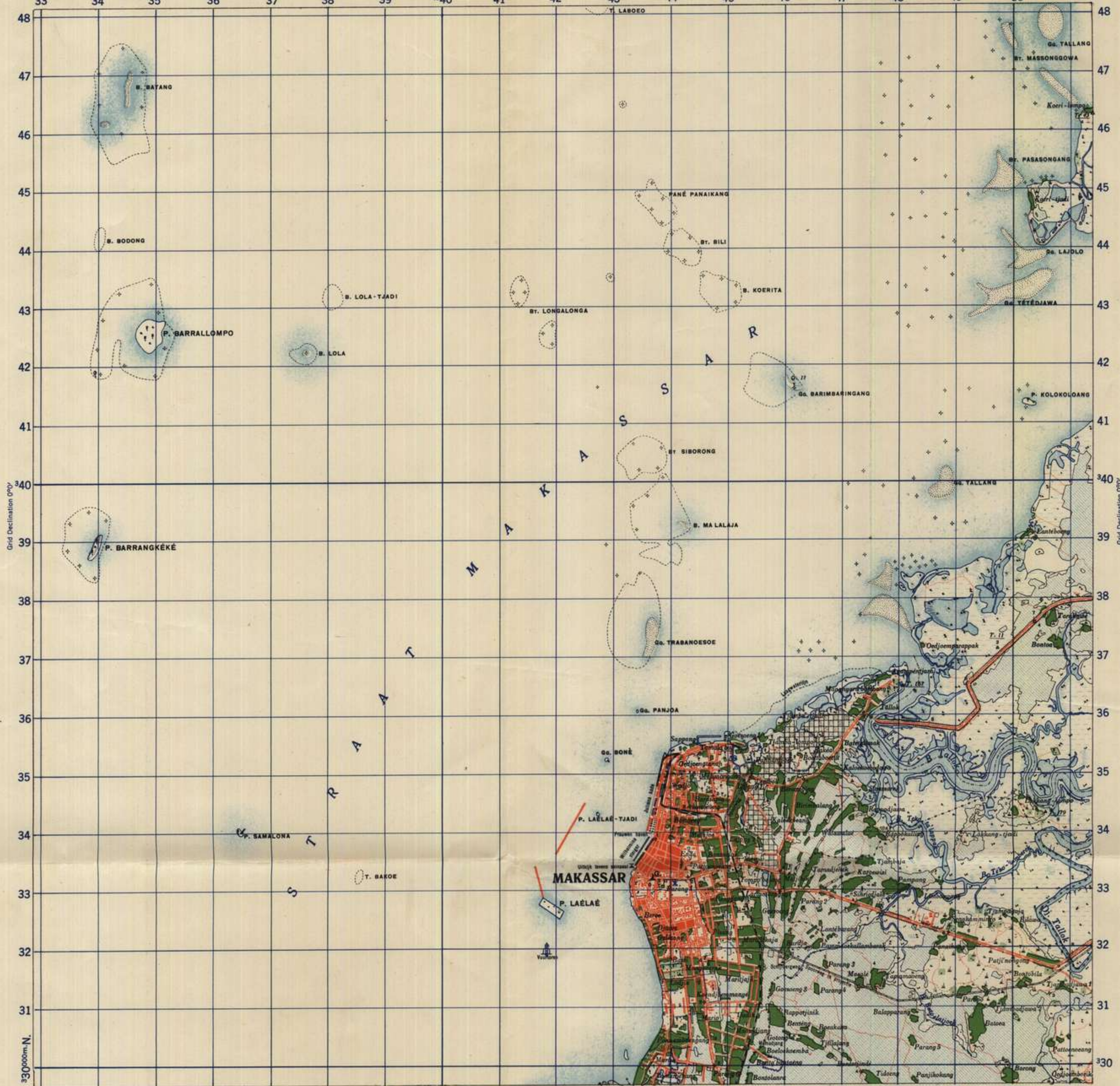

Concentration Suggest AIRFIELD as most suitable concentration area, building materials for Barracks etc will be required. No suitable areas in or near KENDARI town for 2,000 troops. Japanese have been instructed to concentrate at AIRFIELD for eventual movement out of CELEBES.

Health Japanese have sickness rate of approximately 4 percent. Very few in hospital. Malaria and stomach troubles main complaints. Japs are unable to obtain enough vegetables. Suggested Japs commence cultivation to provide their own vegetables.

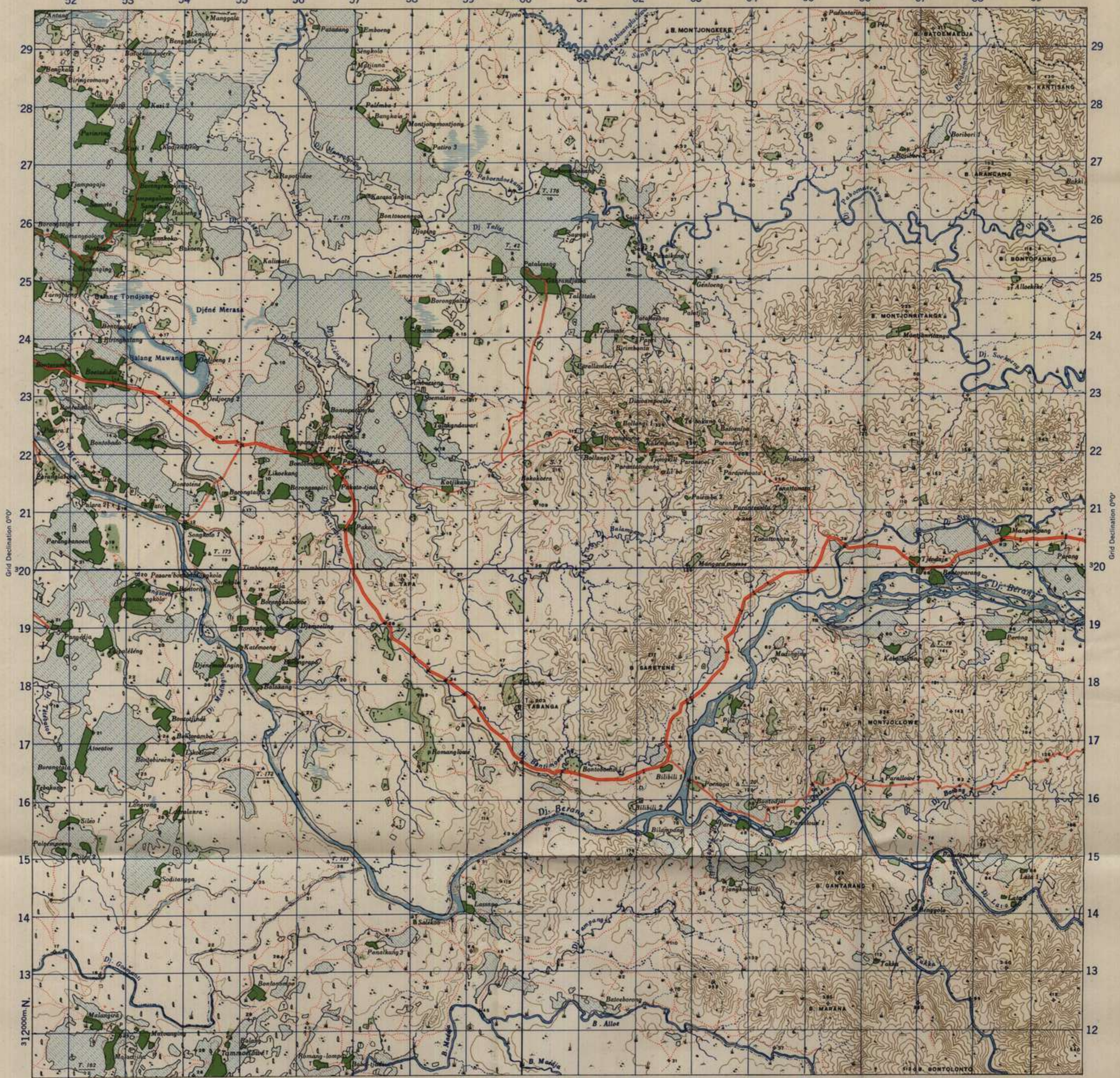
