Note .- The limit of one parcel per annum no longer applies. (b) Tobacco, scent or liquor (wine, spirits, etc), even though the value does not exceed ten shillings, will be subject to duty at the current high rates. (c) The concession in sub-para (a) above is conditional on the centents of each parcel being fully and honestly declared as a gift. The doclaration should be made on Army Form W5128 for a parcel posted at a service post office or on the appropriate civil post office declaration form in other cases. Concession labels (Army Form W5192) are now obsolete and must not be used. Any remaining stocks should be destroyed. (d) Personnel are warned that mis-declaration of the contents or value of a parsel and misuse of the concession, e.g., as a means of importing non-lifts or goods int nded for re-sal, will render the parcel liable to conficcation by HM Customs and action may be taken against the offender. SITUATION REGARDING WAR ABSENCE HEAVE AND PAYMENT IN LIEU OF WAR SERVICE LEAVE, RE-ESTABLISHMENT LEAVE AND RECREATIONAL LEAVE

Payment in lieu of War Service leave, re-establishment leave and recreational leave, and the incidence of taxation thereon, has been the subject of correspondence over a considerable period between Department of the Army, Department of the Treasury and Department of Taxation. The situation has now been clarified and is summarized in the following paragraphs for the information of all AMF Component personnel concerned. It should be noted that complete details are not being included in all cases in this summary. Individuals requiring any specific additional information should forward written request through unit commander to EG 34 Aust Inf Ede or await the issue of a Military Board Instruction on the subject.

LEAVE ENTITLEMENTS

2. The present situation regarding certain leave entitlements it as follows:-

(a) Accrued Recreational Leave

This has been frezen (except pertion carried forward to 1947/48) antil details regarding payment in lieu are finalise (MBI 114/47).

Considerable discrepancies in records of recreational leave have been disclosed and new personal leave cards are in cours of proparation. The question of taxation has been settled in principle (paragraph 3(b) below) but payments will NOT be immediately available until discrepancies are adjusted and taxation details settled (see paragraph 7 below).

(b) War Absence Luave

For members of PMF only. Leave to be taken prior to 30 Jun 48 if member serving in AUSTHALIA; decision under consideration but NOT yet announced, for members serving abroad after that date. Payment in liou of War Absence Leave is NOT being made (Army MELBOULNE 6678AG 8858 of 17 Sep 47) (See also MBI 114/4

(c) War Service Leave

Available to personnel who have had overseas war service.
Payment in lieu of War Service Leave will be made as soon as details have been finalised.

(MBI 114/47). In view of decision regarding taxation (para 3(a) below) it is presumed that payments may now be finalised.

(d) Re-Establishment Loave

Payment in lieu of Re-Establishment Leave is normally available on discharge of member from the forces.
(MBI 114/47).
As regards members of PMF and members of the Interim or

Special Forces who enlisted prior to 1 Jul 47 and who are discharged in order to onlist in the PMF, payment in lieu of Re-Establishment Leave has been approved.

In view of decision regarding taxation (see paragraphs 4 - 6 below) it is presumed that payments may now be finalised.

INCIDENCE OF TAXATION

The decision of the Commissioner of Taxation may be summarized as follows:-

(a) War Service Leave

All War Service Loave is exempt from taxation argo: pective of when payment inllied is made.

- (b) Recreation Leave (For general conditions see GKO 343/45)
 - (i) If accrued during any period in which the pay and allowances of the member were exempt by reason of service outside AUSTRALIA, pay in lieu thereof will be exempt also from taxation irrespective of when the payment in lieu is made.
 - (ii) If any recreation leave entitlement prior to 30 Jun 47 accrued during any poriod in which the pay and allow-ances of the member were NOT exempt from taxation (member NOT serving abroad) the payment in lieu of that leave will to:

exempt if the payment is made on the actual discharge of the member from the AMF, or

taxable if the payment is made other than on discharge. In this case the payment would be considered as assessable income in the year in which it accrued and not assessable income in the year in which it would be paid. The deferred pay and dependant's allowance elements of such payment would be exempt. Finalization of such cases is dependent on further decisions. (see paragraph 7 below).

(c) Re-Establishment Leave

If payment in lieu is made on actual discharge the payment would be exempt from taxation. Conditions for members continuing to serve are given in paragraphs 4 - 6 below.

NOTES ON THE INCIDENCE OF TAXATION AS REGARDS RE-ESTABLISHMENT LEAVE

4. Memloers of PMF

Payments in lieu of Re-Establishment Leave to members of the PMF will be treated as income derived on 30 Jun 47. Consequently the portions of such payments representing dependants allowance and deformed pay will, in effect, be regarded as exempt income. The balance will be assessable or exempt according to whether ordinary pay and allowances received by the member on that date would be assessable or exempt.

5. Fersonnel Enlisting in FMF

In the case of a member of the Interim or Special Forces who enlisted prior to 1 Jul 47 and who is discharged from either of these forces in order to enlist in the FMF, that member is to be regarded as a member of the FMF for the purpose of assessment of tax on any amount paid in lieu of re-establishment leave on his transfer.

6. Members of Interim or Special Forces

As regards members of the Interim and Special Forces who enlisted with these forces prior to 1 Jul 47, the Re-Establishment Leave to which they become entitled on actual discharge from the Defence Forces shall be regarded as having accrued in the year ended 30 Jun 47 prespective of date of actual discharge. These payments will be regarded as being wholly free from tax.

NOTES IN REGARD TO TAXATION ON FARMENT IN BIEU OF RECREATION LEAVE

7. Where members have taken recreational leave at irregular intervals but still have a balance on 30 Jun 47, the Treasury has asked the Service Departments to evolve a uniform scheme for determining when the remaining leave credits became due.

GENERAL

BCOF CANTELINS SERVICE GIFT SHOP

- With effect from 1 Feb 48 the conditions of sale and the system of availability now operating in BCOF Canteen Scrvice Gift Shops will change as follow:
 - (a) The Lottery and rationing system will be replaced by a daily quota system.
 - Each will represent a daily quota for one month under the present trading hours. Each daily quota will to broken up and made available for uso at staggered intervals throughout the day.
 - (c) Stocks not sold at the end of each month under this quota system will be placed on sale, unrationed.
 - (d) Attractive items in short supply such as fountain pens will be restricted to one per purchaser at any one time.
 - (e) Purchases need not be restricted to any one Gift Shop.
- In view of the number of persons in all areas not ontitled to purchase from Gift Shops, ration cards must still be presented when making a purchase, for identification purpose.
- The above system will operate in respect to Gift Trains as from 27 Jan 48.

1. This instruction is designed to cover training for the period ending 30 Apr 48.

OBJECT OF TRAINING

- 2. (a) To train the individual seldier in elementary infantry work up to a standard which will permit section plat on and company training to commence.

TRAINING TO BE UNDERTAKEN

- 3. Drill
 - (a) Squad drill with and with out arms,

- (a) Elementary handling all weapons.





# 199. SOLDIERS UNDER SENTENCE, SCALE OF RATIONS (AMF COMPONENT ILLER 47 OF 23 DEC 47)

- 1. Soldiers under sentence or awaiting trial in 66 Aust Inf Bn Guard House will receive rations in accordance with the normal BCOF ration scale.
- 2. They will also be permitted to smoke in the corridor adjoining the cells between Reveille and Retreat.
- They will NOT be allowed to have matches or cigarette lighters in their possession but may obtain a light from one of the guards.

#### 290. PREVENTION OF CRIME AND VD

1. A large proportion of the offences being committed by Aust tps in JAPAN have been the result of over indulgence in alcoholic drinks.

Similarly a number ofpersonnel who contract VD admit that they were under the influence of alcohol at the time and were uncertain as to the circumstances. Both serious offences and VD remain at a high rate and are showing no reduction.

- 2. It is the duty of every officer and NCO to care for the welfare of the men under their command and therefore in order to protect the individual all officers and NCO's will ensure that any man who is obviously under the influence of alcohol, is returned to his unit lines for his own protection. Disciplinary action need not be taken against the member unless he commits an offence. Care should be taken to ensure that men under the influence of alcohol do not leave unit lines. Evasive action should be countered by surprise bed checks.
- 3. Provost will act similarly.
- 4. The purchase of alcoholic beverages other than through the BCOF Canteen Services is forbidden.

#### 201. OUT OF BOUNDS

The premises known as the "BERNBOROUGH GIFT SHOP" situated at 1 Cheme Hon Dori (ABLE ROAD) KUKE is OUT OF BOUNDS to all ranks, dependants and divilian employees of the PCOF.

#### 202. DRESS - PERSONNEL ADMITTED TO HOSPITAL

#### AIR MAILS - JAPAN TO AUSTRALIA

- Owing to the change of routing of the Lancastrian Air Mail Service between DARWIN and SYDNEY, MELBOURNE is now by-passed and mails for destinations other than SYDNEY are on-forwarded by air or rail according to the category of the mail air or surface.
- 2. Mails posted "free" are treated within Australia as surface mail, therefore where accelerated delivery to centres other than SYDNEY is required it is essential that the prescribed air mail fee be paid.

#### JOINT INTELLIGENCE ORGANIZATION STAFF

Herewith copy of AHQ 4079 dated 13 Feb 48 which is forwarded for information and action vide para 3 :-

- November, 1947, of detailed recommendations by the Defence Committee for the establishment of a Joint Intelligence Organisation, it is expected that advertising of a number of civilian positions in the new Organisation will begin in the Press and in the Commonwealth Gazette in the near future. While it is not possible to give precise details of duties, qualifications and salaries of positions before their formal publication, it is felt that prior circulation of general information might attract the attention of many potential applicants among former members of the Army or in the Interim Forces, who might otherwise everlock advertisements.
- 2. Subtended is a summary of general information available at this stage regarding positions in the Joint Intelligence Organisation:-

- 12 -

- 1. "The Commonwealth Government has approved of the formation of a Joint Intelligence Organisation to serve the requirements of the British Commonwealth in the Facific. It is expected that the advertising for staff to fill a number of positions in the new Organisation will begin in the Press and in the Commonwealth Gazette in the near future. Successful applicants from outside the Public Service will be appointed Permanent members of the Service subject to the usual probationary period.
  - The new Organisation should provide opportunities for interesting careers for applicants with various specialist or general qualifications. These include qualifications in civil engineering (e.g. in the study of road, railway, waterways, airfield, and port problems) in aconomics, geology, geography, languages, air photo interpretation, reference library work, draughting, etc. Eperience in the war-time application of special know-ledge or training will be required in many instances. In the more general field, opportunities should exist for those with a good Service intelligence background.
  - 3. Salary range will, of course, conform to the current standards in the Commonwealth Public Service. Precise details of duties, qualifications and salaries will not be available until the appearance of Public advertisements.
- It would be appreciated if addresses could bring this matter under the notice of those members who may be desirous of joining the Joint Intelligence Organisation.
