- (c) Special issues in case of hardship
- A member who loses clothing as a result of active service conditions or in a private home or elsewhere as a result of bush fire or other accidental purposes, may apply through his unit for special issues of coupons. Such application will be referred by unit, with full explanations of the circumstances, to the formation etc commander or such officer as he may be have authorised for the purpose.
- (d) Members who set up new homes :
- A member claiming special clothing ration coupons, in order to purchase an initial supply of household linen on the occasion of setting up a home, will apply direct to the deputy Commissioner of rationing in the State of Residence.
- (e) Issue in replacement of lost clothing ration coupons
1. A member who has lost his clothing ration coupons will complete a declaration stating the date and circumstances of the loss and the number of coupons which had been used. A member who wilfully makes a false statement in a declaration is liable to imprisonment with hard labour.
  2. The CO of the unit may authorise the issue of additional clothing ration coupons if he is satisfied that the original coupons have been lost. The member would be entitled to receive :
    - (a) The number of coupons to which he is entitled under this order, less the number stated to have been used; or
    - (b) The number of coupons which would bear to the original entitlement the same proportion as the unexpired period of the clothing ration year bears to a full year
 whichever is the lesser.

# Spectacular and Inspiring Display

## SATURDAY'S ARMY PROCESSION AND SPORTS "BEST EVER"

Nothing more spectacular or inspiring has been seen in Singleton's history than the procession of Army personnel and floats on Saturday morning, preceding the sports gymkhana conducted on the showground, the latter fixture being acclaimed by the large gathering as the "best ever."

More than 2000 people attended the sports gathering.

Hundreds lined the streets as 4000 military personnel, with fixed bayonets, accompanied by three military bands, wended their way through George, Campbell and John Streets, to the showground. Following the troops came more than 20 floats, each the work of careful planning and hours of work.

Proceeds of the effort are for the Singleton branch of the Australian Comforts Fund and the W.V.S. Soldiers' Rest Room. Final proceeds are not known, but little expense is expected from the gate-takings of slightly more than £100.

Significant feature of the whole proceedings, from the commencement of the procession, and throughout the afternoon, was the clock-like precision with which everything was done. It is doubtful if even one minute elapsed before a listed event was in progress.

The floats in the procession were highly amusing, though first part of the vehicular traffic in the parade was devoted to war features.

When it was announced during the afternoon that the award of first prize had gone to the "Government Hoisting Scheme," there appeared to be unanimous approval. Second prize went to "Oh, Hell," and third to "Jungle Juice," whilst a special award for eccentric display went to the newly married "couple" in the wobbly sulky.

All demonstrations at the ground, from the opening with the "salvo" of guns, right down the list, were applauded. The demonstrations included massed companies display, under Brigadier F. A. Burrows, platoon drill demonstration, band marches, physical training, precision drill demonstration, unarmed combat, barbed wire crushing, motor cycle display, and "The Parade of the Wooden Soldiers."

The latter item was the one which probably received the greatest ovation.

Only complaint heard during the afternoon was that the lengthy programme had ended far too early.

Only events in which civilians were engaged were horse riding for boys and girls, Judith Aitwater taking first prize for girls under 12, and David Goodsir won the coveted trophy in the boys' section.

Local boys were the drivers in the billy goat display, which caused plenty of amusement.

It is safe to assume that if Army ever considered putting on a similar function there would be no lack of public support, and as one of Saturday's spectators announced, "there would be difficulty in getting people into the ground if there was ever another show like this."

CLOTHING.


The clothing position in the unit is very good with the exception of large sizes in S.D Trousers and small sizes in Worsted Shirts.
