148. INCOME TAX - EXTRACTS FROM GRO 154/45

Part II - Taxation 1944/1945.

Members required to lodge tax returns:-

A member on full time Military duty, the total of ~~whose Military~~  
and private income exceeds £250 during the year ending 30th June  
1945, must lodge an income tax return with the Deputy Commissioner  
for Taxation in the state in which the member is listed. Such a return  
need not be lodged by a member serving outside Australia unless his  
private income earned in Australia exceeds £250.

Military income for the year ending 30th June 1945, means  
the total of a member's :-

- (a) active pay (excluding deferred pay) calculated at the  
rate shown on page two of the member's paybook. This will  
include field, command, responsibility and special  
allowances and any allowance under WFR 9;
- (b) Subsistence allowance; and
- (c) value of rations and quarters at the rate of 2s 5d per day  
for the period he was rationed and quartered by the Army.

A member on whose behalf contributions are being paid by the  
Commonwealth to the Commonwealth Superannuation Fund will show the  
amount of such payments as income and should claim in his return  
for a concessional rebate in respect thereof.

Preparation of returns.-

Income tax return forms, together with printed instructions,  
may be obtained from pay representatives. The forms should be  
completed to show full details of private income, military income  
and particulars of dependants and other items for which rebates are  
allowable. Particulars of items for which rebates are allowable  
are indicated on the form.

Unless the member lodges a return and shows his military income  
in fullest detail, the taxation authorities may not be able to grant  
the exemptions to which he is entitled. He should therefore, include  
with his return a separate statement setting out the following  
information :-

- (a) date of embarkation for service outside Australia;
- (b) date of return to Australia;
- (c) whether the reason for return was injury or illness;
- (d) If the member has served outside Australia, his military  
income for the year ended 30th June 1945, should be  
shown under the following headings:-
  - (i) Military income up to a date 90 days after his  
resumption of duty in Australia; and
  - (ii) military income after that date.

The completed return is to be forwarded to the Deputy Commissioner of Taxation in the capital city of the member's State of enlistment. It should be posted so as to reach that address by 31st July, 1945. If the member is in doubt on any point, a letter setting out the full facts should accompany his return.

NOTE:- Other parts of this order dealing with, Deductions, Taxation 1945/46, and Taxation subsequent to Discharge, may be viewed by members concerned at their respective orderly rooms.

GRO A.596/1943 is amended by omitting sub-paras (b) and (c) of para 10 and inserting in their stead the following subparagraphs:-

- "(b) A member proceeding on leave (except when released on local leave or to a leave destination in the vicinity of his unit location) will carry messing gear, water bottle and blankets and such articles of clothing, necessaries and personal equipment on issue to him (except arms, ammunition, helmet (steel) and respirator) as are required to meet his needs under the climate or other conditions likely to be encountered.
- (c) A member proceeding on leave will not carry arms, helmet (steel) or respirator, except in the following circumstances:
- (i) If the member will not return to the unit after leave (e.g. personnel of units being disbanded are in some cases granted leave and are required to report to another unit on completion of leave);
  - (ii) if the member is granted leave during movement of his unit;
  - (iii) if the member is granted leave on completion of which he will report to another unit on transfer or for attachment;
  - (iv) if the member is granted leave from a school or course which he has been attending and will not return to the school or course on completion of leave;
  - (v) if adequate arrangements for safeguarding the member's arms, helmet (steel) and respirator cannot be made in accordance with sub-para (c) of this paragraph;
  - (vi) If, for any other reason, the member's CO or the officer commanding the unit responsible for his administration considers it essential.
- (d) A member proceeding on leave will not carry ammunition except when required to carry out a specific Military duty for which ammunition is allotted. Such ammunition will be withdrawn from the member immediately the specific duty is completed.
- (e) (i) A unit will arrange to store items of clothing, necessaries and personal equipment not taken by a member proceeding on leave. A record of all items lodged will be maintained by the unit in AAB 71 or other suitable record.
- (ii) In some cases (e.g. when an entire unit proceeds on leave) it may be impossible to make adequate arrangements within the unit to safeguard the items. In such cases, the matter will be referred to the appropriate formation etc HQ for assistance and directions.
- (f)(i) A member proceeding on leave with his arms, helmet (steel) or respirator, in accordance with this order will deposit them for safe custody at the Aust Army Cloak Room attached to the last LTD or Staging Camp through which he passes before proceeding on leave.
- (ii) Deposits will be accepted by Aust Army Cloak Room for the duration of the members leave only, and will be collected by him before commencing the journey to the next place of reporting.
  - (iii) Aust Army Cloak Rooms under the control of Aust Kit Stores are located at or adjacent to Central Railway Stations in all capital cities in Australia (except HOBART) and proper facilities for the security of arms and equipment are provided therein. Similar facilities will shortly be available at certain LTDs and RRAGDDs.
  - (iv) Arms and equipment will not be taken to the home of a member when their deposit at an Aust Army Cloak Room is practicable.



- (v) Arms and equipment will not be deposited by a member in a Cloak Room other than an Aust Army Cloak Room nor will they be left unattended in a hotel, Resturant, Cafe or similar place.

154. MECHANICAL VEHICLES - USE OF GEARS AS BRAKES

Attention is directed to GRC 089/44 which is repeated hereunder.

"1. The practice of approaching at high speed and then changing down to a lower gear, while still at comparatively high speed, in order to obtain the necessary deceleration when slowing down for any purpose, e.g. stopping, entering gateways, negotiating corners etc., is still prevalent.

This practice, which is forbidden, produces excessive engine speed, causes unnecessary strain on the vehicle transmission system and is a contributing factor to rapid tyre wear.

2. The attention of all drivers will be drawn to Amendment No.1 to Standing Orders for Drivers Of Mechanical Vehicles (Revised 1942) and disciplinary action taken against offenders.

159. AMF PRISONERS OF WAR AND INTERNEES, ETC (GRO 157/45)

1. For the purposes of the order, a "recovered prisoner of war" means any member of the AMF who has been captured, detained or interned by the enemy and has subsequently been repatriated, exchanged or in any other way released, and includes escapees.

Duty to avoid capture.-

2. Every member of the AMF will, at all costs, endeavour to avoid falling into enemy hands. If, however, a member is taken prisoner he will obey the directions given in this order which are applicable to all ranks at all times and under all circumstances.

Duty during interrogation by the enemy

3. During interrogation, a member will supply his number, rank and name only. He will remain courteous and maintain a military bearing, indicating that the obligations of any soldier preclude his answering any other questions.

Indirect methods of obtaining information

4. Every prisoner of war, will at all times, be on guard against carelessness, over-confidence and enemy trickery. Such ruses as the use of agents as nurses or of other agents as bogus Red Cross Officials or prisoners of war will always be expected. Even in conversation with known and trusted friends extreme caution will be shown as the conversation may be overheard by eavesdroppers or concealed listening devices.

Broadcasts over enemy wireless and enemy propaganda.-

5. A member of the AMF who becomes a prisoner of war will not transmit messages over enemy wireless, except simple messages of the type permitted in correspondence: for example, messages relating to the health of the prisoner of war himself and greetings to family and friends. He will not in any way lend himself to enemy propaganda by taking part in wireless broadcasts (other than for the purpose of transmitting a message of the type described above) or in any other way whatsoever.

Parole.-

6.(a) A member of the AMF when taken prisoner of war or interned by an enemy or neutral power will not give his parole, except a parole of the limited nature described in para 7 of this order.

(b) The term "Parole" means an undertaking not to escape given in any form whatever or however described.

7.(a) Parole may properly be given to obtain temporary release from confinement for a few hours on odd occasions for specific purposes e.g., exercise, recreation or medical treatment. Parole so given will be clearly limited to the period of temporary release.

(b) Parole in respect of a warrant-officer, non-commissioned officer or other rank can be given only through a commissioned officer.

(c) The terms of any parole given will be observed with the greatest strictness for the period for which it is given.

Escape

8. It is the duty of every Australian Prisoner of war and internee to escape at the first opportunity, regardless of any instructions to the contrary issued by or in any prisoner of war or internment camp or by the detaining power and regardless of any reprisals which might be taken against the remaining prisoners of war and internees.

9(a) Except as provided in paras 10, 11 and 12 of this order, a recovered PW will not give any information in conversation, correspondence, or in any other way whatever to any person regarding the escape of himself or any other person from detention or internment, or about the means whereby he or any person avoided capture by the enemy.



(b) Such information would be useful to the enemy, would prejudice the chance of others in similar circumstances to escape and would endanger the lives of those who had given help at any stage.

(c) As soon as possible after recovery, every recovered PW will sign an undertaking in the form set out in para 13 of this order.

The officer responsible for the interrogation mentioned in para 10(a) of this order will ensure that this is done and will forward the signed undertaking to the nearest 2nd Echelon component for despatch to the home Records Office of the member where it will be filed in that member's personal dossier.

#### Interrogation.-

10.(a) A recovered PW will disclose all details of his escape, evasion or capture, release or recovery to interrogating officers authorised by the Director of Military Intelligence (DMI).

(b) The officer authorised by DMI are --

- (i) Any GSO grade I, on army or higher formation HQ.
- (ii) Any GSO not below grade II on corps or div HQ.
- (iii) GSO, Grade III (Intelligence), on div HQ.
- (iv) Any officer designated by the abovementioned general staff officers.

(c) Subsequent to interrogation pursuant to para 10(a) of this order, the Director of Prisoners of War and Internees or, in his absence, the senior 'A' branch officer on the spot acting on his behalf is authorised to interrogate on any matter other than those referred to in para 10(a) of this order.

(d) No member other than one of the officers listed in para 10(b) of this order will question any PW on any matter referred to in para 10(a) of this order. Nothing in this paragraph, will however, preclude any officer who is required in the course of his duty so to do from interrogating a recovered PW for information relating to missing and prisoner of war personnel and to the locations of any known burials.

(e) The interrogation procedure will conform to LHQ Intelligence Instruction No.22 dated 15th June 45.

#### Lectures.-

11.(a) If a recovered PW desires to lecture on his experiences he will not disclose any information about his own escape, evasion of capture, release or recovery, or that of any other person, unless the script of the proposed lecture is first approved by the DMI or his representative.

(b) A recovered PW, may however, lecture on personal matters connected with his detention or internment to War Relatives' Associations and the like, but must exercise the greatest care to ensure that his lecture does not disclose any information which could be useful to the enemy, would prejudice the chances of other prisoners of war escaping or would endanger the lives of those who helped the lecturer at any stage during his escape..

(c) It is considered desirable for service reasons that a recovered PW should lecture on the means employed by him in his escape, the decision as to the desirability will be made by the Director of Military Training or his representative and the text of the proposed lecture will be delivered to the DMI or his representative for approval and censorship.

#### Interviews with the Press.-

12. A recovered PW will not give an interview to any broadcasting station or newspaper, or broadcasting or newspaper correspondent or representative, until such time as the interrogations provided for under para 10 of this order are completed and unless such interview is conducted in the presence of a representative of the Director General of Public Relations. Similarly, a recovered PW will not submit for publication or broadcasting any article, letter or account dealing with his experiences unless it is first approved by a representative of the Director-General of Public Relations.



Form of undertaking.

13. The form referred to in para 9(c) of this order is as follows:-

"I have read and understand the provisions of GRO 157/1945 and I undertake to obey the instructions contained therein in all respects. I understand that any breach will render me liable to disciplinary action.

160 MEDICAL AND DENTAL TREATMENT OF MEMBERS OF AMF (GRO 155/45)

Note.- This is merely a summary of GRO 155/1945. All members are responsible for acquainting themselves with the full provisions of that GRO.

1. (a) Subject to certain conditions and exceptions set out in GRO 155/1945, a member is entitled to receive medical treatment in accordance with medical requisites necessary to render and maintain his fit for Military Service and to restore him to normal health. A copy of GRO 155/1945 is available for inspection in the unit orderly room.

(b) Members on occupational LWOP are entitled to medical treatment in accordance with the provisions of LHJ memo 168085 of 4th December 1944.

Medical Treatment.-

2. Except as provided in para 3 below or in GRO 155/1945 or in LHJ Memo 168085 of 4th December, 1944 (dealing with medical treatment of members on occupational LWOP), a member requiring medical treatment at Army expense will obtain it from an Army medical unit, and will not obtain or attempt to obtain medical treatment at Army expense from an area medical officer, or a civilian doctor or a public, intermediate or private hospital.

Application for Medical treatment.-

3. (a) A member requiring medical treatment at Army expense will apply for it to:-

- (i) the unit by which he is being administered; or
- (ii) if that is not practicable, to the nearest Army medical unit; or
- (iii) if that is not practicable, to the nearest RAN or RAAF medical unit; or
- (iv) if that is not practicable, to the nearest area medical officer; or
- (v) if that is not practicable, to a repatriation hospital, or
- (vi) if that is not practicable, to a public hospital, or
- (vii) if that is not practicable, to a civilian doctor.

(b) A claim for expense incurred in obtaining medical treatment from a civilian doctor will be rejected unless it is established to the satisfaction of the DDMS or ADMS of the relevant command or L of C Area that it was impracticable for the member to obtain such treatment from any of the abovementioned service units, from an area medical officer or from a repatriation or public hospital.

Medical Treatment.-

2. Except as provided in para 3 below or in GRO 155/1945 or in LHJ Memo 168085 of 4th December, 1944 (dealing with medical treatment of members on occupational LWOP), a member requiring medical treatment at Army expense will obtain it from an Army medical unit, and will not obtain or attempt to obtain medical treatment at Army expense from an area medical officer, or a civilian doctor or a public, intermediate or private hospital.



Admission to hospital.-

4. A member requiring to be admitted to hospital will be admitted -
  - (a) to any army hospital;
  - (b) if that is not practicable, to an RAN or RAAF hospital;
  - (c) if that is not practicable, to a repatriation hospital;
  - or
  - (d) if that is not practicable, to a public hospital.
5. Under special circumstances, a member may be admitted to a private or intermediate hospital.
6. Medical treatment and hospitalization obtained in accordance with para 3(a) or in the proper hospital is free. All other treatment is not free and must be paid for by the member.

Medical Certificates-

7. A member unable, because of sickness or injury, to return from leave on the due date will send a medical certificate to the unit which released him on leave. The certificate should reach the latter unit before the expiry of the leave.
8. The certificate, signed and dated by the doctor, must include -
  - (a) the diagnosis of the member's condition;
  - (b) the treatment given and/or prescribed;
  - (c) the time during which it is estimated by the doctor that the member will be unable to travel.
9. A member unable to travel on the estimated date will forward a further medical certificate on or prior to that date to the unit which released him on leave.
10. Failure to forward the certificates, in accordance with paras 7 and 9, may result in the member being posted L and payment of allotment and dependant's allowance being suspended.
11. A member on leave who obtains treatment from a civilian doctor who is not an area medical officer will send to his unit on the conclusion of the treatment a medical certificate containing the the following particulars :-
  - (a) diagnosis of the member's condition;
  - (b) the treatment given to and/or prescribed for the member.

Medicines and dressings.-

12. Medicines and dressings prescribed by a service medical officer, an area medical officer and a civilian doctor may be obtained free from -
  - (a) an army dispensary; or
  - (b) a civilian chemist, if the medical officer or doctor endorses an authority on the prescription for purchase from a civilian chemist. Otherwise the member will have to pay for them.

Spectacles.-

13. Spectacles prescribed by an army medical officer or optometrist are supplied free.
14. Spectacles, whether supplied by army or not, worn by a member may be repaired without charge by an army optical unit.

Artificial limbs and surgical aids.-

15. Artificial limbs and surgical aids are supplied free, if prescribed by a medical officer.
16. Repairs of and adjustments to surgical aids and artificial limbs used by a member will be made without charge by the army if authorised by a medical officer.

Dental treatment.-

17. Subject to certain exceptions and conditions in certain cases, a member is entitled to dental treatment necessary to render or maintain him fit for military duty.
18. Dental treatment cannot be obtained free from civilian dentists, except on the authority of a CO.



19. Under certain conditions a member may be reimbursed for dental expenses incurred on leave, but only in accordance with the following scale :-

<u>Nature of treatment</u>	<u>Maximum fee</u>
Extractions (limited to 2 teeth on each period of leave) (including the use of local anaesthetic).....	5/- each tooth
Temporary sedative fillings (limited to 2 fillings on each period of leave).....	5/- each filling
Simple repairs to dentures (fracture of denture or replacement of tooth.).....	10/- maximum charge.

Ownership of spectacles etc..

20. Artificial limbs, surgical aids, spectacles and dentures, supplied by the army, belong to it until the member is discharged or finalized, when they become the property of the member.

Forfeiture of pay.-

21. If a member is absent from duty owing to illness, injury or wounds due to an action or conduct constituting an offence of which he is convicted, his CO may authorise the forfeiture of pay for the period of his absence. (WER 27).

22. If the CO authorises such forfeiture, the cost for medical and hospital attention will also be debited to the pay account of the member at the following rates :-

Officers in hospital .....	14/- per day
Soldiers in hospital .....	12/- per day
Members in convalescent depots and convalescent homes .....	6/- per day
Members not in hospitals, convalescent depots or convalescent homes....	2/9 per day.

All clothing is issued from Bn Q and parades are still being held at night.


RATIONS.



1. Vehicle strength during the month was increased by the addition of 1 X 3 Ton Ford ex 3 A.O.V.P. Present strength is 27 Trucks , 3 Carriers 10 Motor Cycles including Combination 2.
2. Personnel strength was decreased to the extent of 3 Drivers and 1 Clerk . This decrease further prejudices the efficient working of transport within the Unit.
3. Maintenance for the period has been fairly good . Several vehicles were painted but this work has been postponed until the return of the Transport Sgt. from leave.
4. No accidents were reported during the month.
5. Petrol & oil consumption remained constant .Checking Staff found records and stock in Dump to be correct.
6. Tyres and Batteries were checked weekly and found to be in good order. Any replacements have been taken in hand.
