SPECIAL ORDER - MARCH THROUGH SYDNEY ON 4 OCT 40.

In pursuance of E. Comd instruction 62758 of 26 Sep 40, all units of the 2nd A.I.F. at present in Camp at INGLEBURN and LIVERPOOL will march through the streets of SYDNEY on 4 Oct 40.

1. STARTING POINTS.

- (A) Centre Gate, Chalmers St Entrance, Prince Alfred Park, for train serials 1 to 7.
- (B) Intersection of Hay St and Castlereagh St for train serials 8 to 10.

2. STARTING TIME.

The head of the column will pass Starting Point A at 1135-hrs. Units assembled in Belmore Park will join the column at the intersection of Hay St and Castlereagh St (Starting Point B).

To facilitate the above, action will be taken to ensure that troops in trains Nos. 8 to 10 incl do not form part of units in trains Nos. 1 to 7 incl.

An appendix showing allocations of units to trains will be issued later.

3. ROUTE.

Chalmers St - Elizabeth St - Hay St - Castlereagh St - Hunter St - Pitt St - Martin Place - George St - Campbell St - Pitt St - Tram and Vehicle Ramp to Central Station.

4. COMMAND.

Brig. C.A. Callaghan, C.M.G., D.S.O., V.D. - C.R.A.
8 Aust Div, will command the parade.

6. FORMATION ON ROUTE.

The column will pass the starting points and march six (6) abreast.

7. INTERVALS ON THE MARCH.

40 paces between units and 10 paces between batteries, companies or equivalent sub-units.

8. SALUTING BASES.

(a) Genotaph.

The column will pass the Genotaph on the left hand side. On passing the Genotaph, Unit Comdres will give the order, "In Succession - Eyes Right".

Bands will not play in Martin Place.

(b) Town Hall.

His Excellency the Governor-General of Australia will take the salute at the Sydney Town Hall at 1215 hrs and the same procedure will be followed as in sub-para (a). Bands marching with the column will cease playing at Market St - George St intersection and recommence playing at Liverpool St.

(c) General.

All officers will salute with the hand.

9. DRESS.

Service Dress - drill order. All ranks will wear felt hats. Officers will carry sticks - no gloves. Bayonets will be fixed before leaving assembly areas and unfixed prior to entraining for return journey.

10. All ranks will be dismounted.

11. ADMINISTRATIVE ARRANGEMENTS.

12. MOVEMENT CONTROL.

(a) Entraining at INGLEBURN.

22 Inf Bde will detail one Capt and two Lieuts to act as Entraining Officers at INGLEBURN. Owing to short time during which each train will be at the Station, an inspection of the trains will not be possible. Entraining Officers will ensure that train loads are in accordance with those shown in Appendix A, and that the trains depart on time. Each train is composed of 10 carriages which carry approximately 550 each. The three Entraining Officers will join the last train to leave INGLEBURN (10th) and rejoin their unit on arrival at Central. As this train arrives simultaneously with the start of the column from Prince Alfred Park, these Officers should be detailed from units assembling in Belmore Park.

(b) Detraining at INGLEBURN.

1 AA Regt will detail one Capt and two Lieuts to act as Movement Control Officers for the detraining of the whole of the INGLEBURN group.

(c) Detraining and Entraining at CENTRAL.

The senior Officer of each train will report to DAQMG 8 Aust Div or his representative, who will be wearing a red armband, at the platform on arrival, and will hand in a train parade state giving number of Officers and O/Rs travelling on his train.

13. ASSEMBLY.

Major W.S. Kent-Hughes, DAQMG 8 Aust Div, will be responsible for the direction, assembling and movement of troops until they pass the intersection of Hay St and Castlereagh St, and on the return journey when units reach Hay St.

Capt W.A. Miller, DAPM 8 Aust Div, will instruct 8 Div Pro Coy to supply the necessary number of guides and traffic controls from Central Railway Station to the assembly points and also in assembly areas. He will report to DAQMG 8 Aust Div at RTO's Office, Central Station, at 0930 hrs on 4 Oct 40.

14. ASSEMBLY AREA.

On detraining, troops in trains Nos. 1 to 7 incl will move to assembly area, Prince Alfred Park (as shown on Appendix B) via vehicle ramp - Eddy Avenue - Chalmers St.

In moving to assembly areas, troops will keep to the footpath and, if necessary to move on road, will move on right hand side of road.

Remaining troops in trains 8 to 10 incl will move to assembly area, Belmore Park (see Appendix C).

15. RAIL WARRANTS.

Rail warrants will not be issued.

16. RETURN JOURNEY.

When the column returns to Central Railway Station, entraining for return journey will commence at the platforms shown in para 10.

19. LUNCH.

Under the direction of 22 Inf Bde, units will arrange:-

- (a) To provide refreshment for all units in trains 1 to 7 incl at Prince Alfred Park and for trains 8 to 10 incl at Belmore Park before the column moves off. Paper drinking cups will be supplied at assembly areas.
- (b) For fatigue parties to clean up assembly areas after troops have moved off, and instructions are to be issued that no vehicular traffic is to move across the lawns in these areas.

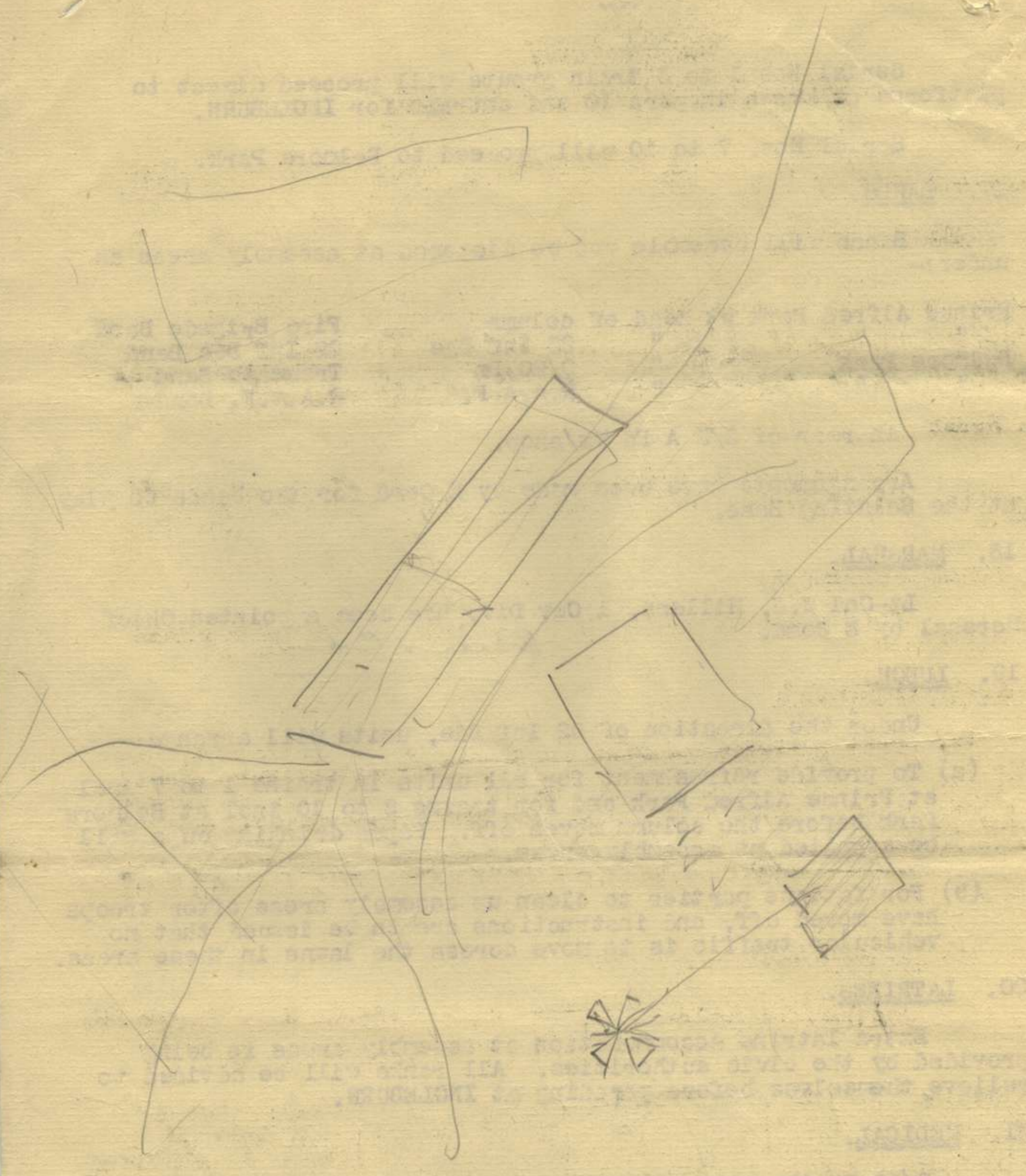

SPECIAL ORDER -

MARCH THROUGH SYDNEY, 4 OCT. 40.

This instruction to be read in conjunction with 8 Div. Circular 1684 of 1 Oct. 40.

1. Formation During Day.

From the time units leave their parade grounds at Ingleburn until they return, all movements will be six (6) abreast. Officers (except 2 i/c Coys.) will march at the head of Coys. - 2 i/cs. in rear. All N.C.O's., except W.O's. and S/Sgts., will be in the ranks, being at rear of each company etc.

2. Dress.

Sticks will be carried under the arm, where units are marching with rifles. All others will carry the stick at the trail.

3. Keeping Distance.

Particular attention is to be paid to the maintenance of distances.

4. Movement Control.

(a) S.P. - corner Ferguson and Aero Rds. Units will pass S.P. at times indicated in Appendix A. Control Officer, Lieut. R.E. Thomas, 2/19 Bn. will report at 0800 hrs. to corner Ferguson and Aero Rds. and will ensure that all units pass S.P. in correct order of march.

Control Officer will catch last train and rejoin unit at Assembly Area.

(b) Entraining at Ingleburn.

Entraining Officers - Capt. J.M. Hordern, H.Q. 22 Inf. Bde
Assistants, (1) - Lieut. W.G.N. Orr, A.S.C. 8 Div.
(2) - Lieut. E.W. Gaden, 2/20 Bn.

Entraining Officers to report to Bde. H.Q. at 0745 hrs. Each train will be composed of 10 cars, which carry approx. 60 each. Units will move the troops allotted to each train onto the platform by the gate nearest the level crossing and move to the northern end of the platform, forming up in carriage groups within the lines painted on the platform. On the whistle blast of the Entraining Officer, carriage groups will be marched into carriages by rear entrances only. Troops will be directed to move through the carriage and occupy seats from the front end. At least one officer will travel in each carriage occupied by troops.

(c) Detraining Central. Troops will detrain at Central on whistle blast of the O.C. Train by front entrance to carriages, forming up in sixes facing the exit of trains. Senior Officers will report in accordance with Para. 12 (c) of 8 Div. Circular 1684.

(d) Detraining at Ingleburn. Troops will detrain on whistle blast of O.C. Train and leave the Station by several gates and form up for return to Camp clear of the Station.

5. Movement to Assembly Area.

From Central to Assembly Areas, troops will move by "Train Groups", joining their own units at Assembly Areas.

6. Refreshments.

As the march will take place during lunch hour, no lunch will be provided before men march. A drink of water and two lumps of sugar will be issued to personnel of all units. 1 A.A. Regt. will be responsible for issue of water and sugar to all units with the exception of 3 A/Tk. Regt., at Prince Alfred Park. 3 A/Tk. Regt. will serve refreshments under unit arrangements. 2/20 Bn. will be responsible for issue to all units in Belmore Park with the exception of H.Q. 8 Div. A.S.C. and 8 Div. Sup. Coln.

7. Cleaning of Areas.

Persomel carrying out issue of refreshments will be responsible for cleaning of areas after troops move off.

Units returning to Belmore Park will be responsible for cleaning their own assembly areas before moving to entrain.

8. Medical.

Rifles and Equipment are to remain with personnel evacuated to Amb. Posts.

9. Synchronization.

C.O. 8 Div. Sigs. will broadcast official time at 0700 hrs.


