

Subject: REPORT ON 67 AUST INF BN TOUR OF DUTY IN TOKYO

34 Aust Inf Bde

1. For the duration of its tour of duty in TOKYO, and to assist in guard duties, 67 Aust Inf Bn had under command RAA personnel to the strength of one infantry company from A Fd Bty, and RAF personnel, 2 officers and 50 ORs from British Commonwealth Air Group. 67 Aust Inf Bn itself furnished HQ staff and three rifle companies less one platoon.
2. The battalion completed its move to TOKYO on 4 Apr. On 3 Apr, at a ceremonial guard change on the Plaza outside the Japanese Imperial Palace, 1 Bn of MAHRATTAS LIGHT INFANTRY REGT was relieved of all guard duties. Guards were then mounted on ceremonial and non-ceremonial posts as ordered by British Commonwealth Sub-Area, TOKYO, until relieved.
3. The only occupation duties carried out other than mounting of guards were:
 - (a) Establishment of local patrols on May Day.
 - (b) Provision of guards for Japanese war crimes suspects, to KURE and IWAKUNI.
4. Ceremonial parades were held on 15 and 25 Apr. On 15 Apr a combined guard-mounting parade was held in conjunction with Honor Coy (coy E) 19 US Inf Regt. The guards were inspected by Maj Gen EM ALLMOND, Assistant Chief of Staff, GHQ SCAP, and Brig J W O'BRIEN, DSO, Australian head of the Scientific and Technical Division, Economic and Scientific Section, GHQ. On 25 Apr, Anzac Day, a dawn parade service was held at EBISU Camp. At 1100 hrs, a battalion parade was held on the Plaza. This was inspected and reviewed by the Bde Comd, Brig RNL HOPKINS, CBE. The battalion then marched past in close column.
5. Entertainments arranged for the battalion included an ORs' dance at the American ICHIBAN club, given by Brig and Mrs O'BRIEN, garden parties for ORs given at the British Embassy and Commonwealth House, and cocktail parties for officers at Commonwealth House, the residence of Mr and Mrs T W ECKERSLEY (Aust Political Liaison Office) and Empire House (by Col D T MAXWELL OBE, Comd BRICOSAT). The battalion in its turn arranged a number of entertainments, including a ball, where political and military representatives of many nations were our guests.
6. The battalion handed over its duties to 4 NZ Gd Bn on 3 May, and completed its return move by 5 May. A Fd Bty and BCAIR personnel ceased to be under command and rejoined their respective units.

1. Clothing & Necessaries

The clothing position is satisfactory generally, in a few cases suitable sizes cannot be supplied.

2. Equipment

An inspection of all rifles has been carried out by unit armourer, several were found to be in a semi unserviceable condition and changes will be effected. Certificates for replacement have been received for one $\frac{1}{4}$ ton truck and one 3 ton truck which were involved in accidents.

3. Stores Check

A check of unit stores was conducted over the period 15 May - 2 Jun and it was revealed that accountability for store is unsatisfactory and in some cases non-existent. It was hard to arrive at a figure representing the unit holdings and in some cases impossible, due to the lack of records.

4. Rationing

Rations have been satisfactory and in ample supply.


Considerable trouble and inconvenience is caused in maintaining the unit ration account due to lack of information regarding troop movements.

Razor blades have been off issue for approx one month.

5. Fuel

An issue of firewood was received during the month of May, and the majority is being kept as a winter reserve.

Coal is still in short supply but with controlled use, a reserve of 50 tons has accumulated over the month.







1. Inquiries have recently been made by HIROSHIMA Prefectural official reference the release of bags of coins located in the warehouse of KATO KAIUN Coy Ltd at UJINA.
2. These coins, together with metal bars and ingots of various types to a total weight of approx 250 tons, were unloaded from a Japanese ship at UJINA under instructions from this HQ early in Jun 46. The ship, which was owned by the KINZOKU HAIKYU Coy (Metal Distribution Coy) had no written authority to possess the materials, which they were about to take away, allegedly to SHIKOKU. On 8 Jun, all coins and metal were completely unloaded into the KATO warehouse, the warehouse locked, the key held at C Coy 67 Aust Inf Bn, UJINA, and 34 Aust Inf Bde HQ was informed. Later a target report was made out (target A 96).
3. On 28 Jun 46, HIROSHIMA Prefectural Office applied to this unit for the release of the articles to them. The matter was referred to HQ 34 Aust Inf Bde, then to HQ BCOF, which eventually granted release of all metals but NOT the coins. This release was effected early in Jul, and all metals have since been removed. The coins, which appear to be mainly if not completely CHINESE, are still in the warehouse.
4. Several times during the past few weeks, Japanese purporting to be government officials have attempted to remove the coins, and Prefectural representatives have approached this HQ on the matter of the release of the coins to the Home Ministry. A policy on this subject is requested.

116. VD CONTROL - TREATMENT BCOF CASES BY JAPANESE DOCTORS

1. It is known that personnel of 34 Aust Inf Bde have been receiving treatment for VD (particularly gonorrhoea) from JAPANESE doctors. This action will cease forthwith and offenders are liable to disciplinary action.

2. The following facts are brought to the notice of all ranks: -

- (a) Diagnosis of VD by JAPANESE doctors is not always accurate.
- (b) The standard of training of JAPANESE doctors is far below that of BCOF Medical Officers.
- (c) Drugs used by JAPANESE doctors are inferior in quality to drugs available to BCOF medical authorities. In many cases Japanese drugs are useless.
- (d) The necessary after-treatment period of surveillance is neglected and the danger of latent syphilis continuing to be undetected is greatly increased. The resultant effect on the soldier's happiness and health in later life need hardly be mentioned.

3. Personnel having treatment from JAPANESE doctors are adding to the already considerable hazards surrounding VD contracted in JAPAN.

4. JAPANESE doctors have been ordered not to treat BCOF personnel for VD or for any other disease, but only to give First Aid in an emergency. eg a road accident.

118. PAYMENT OF CHARGES FOR CABLES

1. On the introduction of BAHSV on 6 May 47, all cables will be lodged through BCOF Post Offices or postal orderlies and charges will be paid in BAHSV.

2. In the case of isolated detachments or in other special circumstances, in which it is not possible to clear cables through a BCOF Post Office within 24 hrs, the procedure in para 2 will be varied as follows: -

- (a) Cables may be lodged at a JAPANESE Post Office.
- (b) Payment for these cables will be made in Yen, which will be obtained from a paying officer in exchange for BAHSV.
- (c) BAHSV will on NO account be paid to a Japanese Post Office.

3. Detailed instructions will be issued later to BCOF Post Offices on the conversion of BAHSV to yen for transmission through JAPANESE Post Offices.

121. INELIGIBILITY TO SERVICE BENEFITS ON DISCHARGE OF A SOLDIER OR TERMINATION OF AN OFFICER'S APPOINTMENT ON CONTINUOUS FULL-TIME DUTY
(GRO 65 of 15 Feb 46)

1. A soldier who is or has been discharged or an officer whose appointment on continuous full-time duty is or has been terminated for any of the reasons stated in para 2 of this order will, in the case of a soldier, be deemed to be dishonourably discharged, and, in the case of an officer, to have had his services dishonourably terminated and will not be eligible for any of the following service benefits: -

- (i) Leave - GRO A.343/1945, Part XXV.
- (ii) Pay in lieu of leave - GRO A.343/1945, Part XXVI.
- (iii) War service leave - GRO A.343/1945, Part XIV.
- (iv) Re-establishment leave - GRO A.343/1945, Part XXIII.
- (v) Issue of clothing ration coupons (except to the extent provided for disciplinary cases) - GRO F.130/1945.
- (vi) Issue of civilian clothing (except to the extent provided for disciplinary cases) - GRO 61/1946.
- (vii) Retention of issue of clothing (except to the extent provided for disciplinary cases) - GRO O.421/1944.
- (viii) Returned from Active Service Badge - MB memo 79394 of 29th November 1940 and LHQ memo 82513 of 27th July 1942.
- (ix) General Service Badge - MB memo 79394 of 29th November 1940 and LHQ memo 82513 of 27th July 1942; and instructions to be issued if and when resumption of issue of badge is approved.

2. Reasons constituting ineligibility. - Reasons for cessation of employment on continuous full-time duty which will be deemed to be a dishonourable termination of service or dishonourable discharge, rendering a member ineligible for any of the benefits mentioned in para 1 of this order, are: -

- (i) in the case of an officer -

- (a) he is or has been, by sentence of court-martial, cashiered or dismissed from His Majesty's Service or from the Defence Force;
 - (b) his commission is or has been cancelled; or
 - (c) he is or has been retired and such retirement is or has been, and is or has been recorded in his record of service as being, on account of an offence or misconduct of any kind during his service;
- (ii) in the case of a soldier -
- (a) he is or has been, by sentence of court-martial, discharged with ignominy from His Majesty's Service or discharged from the Defence Force;
 - (b) he is or has been discharged for any of the following reasons, i.e. -
 - that, by reason of numerous convictions, he is deemed to be incorrigible; (1)
 - that, he is or has been sentenced during his service to penal servitude or imprisonment by a civil court or court-martial;
 - that, he has been sentenced by a court-martial to detention for a period of six months or more; (2) or that, he has been guilty of misconduct; (3) or that, he has made a false answer on attestation; (4)
 - (c) he is or has been discharged for any of the following reasons and such discharge is or has been, and is or has been recorded in his record of service as being, on account of misconduct during his service or discreditable service, i.e. -
 - that, he is considered unfit for the duties of his corps; (3)
 - that, it is considered that his services are no longer required; (3)
 - because his services, for any reason considered sufficient by the Military Board, are no longer required; (5)
 - that, he has been found to be not suitable for any military service; (6)

that, he was considered to be unsuitable for any further military service. (1)

3. War Service Leave - Additional reasons constituting ineligibility. - Irrespective of whether a member ceased to be employed on continuous full-time duty or not on his return from overseas service, a member is not eligible for war service leave, if he has an entry in his record of service that he has been returned for disciplinary reasons or because his services overseas are no longer required on the grounds of misconduct during his service or discreditable service.

Discharge for reasons mentioned in para 2(i)(c) and (ii)(c) of this order. -

4. (a) The decision whether or not an officer's retirement has been or is on account of an offence or misconduct of any kind during service (para 2(i)(c)) will be made at HQ AMF and will be conveyed to HQ Western Command or L of C area. HQ Western Command or L of C area will advise the 2nd Echelon component in the area where the officer's services are terminated of the decision on the officer's record of service.

(b) Authorising authorities under AMR 185(2)(a) and Military Forces (Women's Services) Regulations 24(1)(a) will decide and specify whether or not any discharge for any reason mentioned in para 2(ii)(c) is on account of misconduct during service or discreditable service.

(c) HQ Western Command or L of C area will advise the 2nd Echelon component in the area in which the member is discharged of a decision under sub-para (b) of this paragraph and the 2nd Echelon component will enter the decision on the member's record of service.

5. (a) 2nd Echelon components will furnish HQ Western Command or L of C areas with nominal roll, in duplicate, of all other ranks discharged in their areas prior to 11 December 1944 for any of the reasons in para 2(ii)(c) for the decision of an authorising authority under para 4(b).

(b) Authorising officers will -

(i) endorse each decision on the nominal roll furnished by the relevant 2nd Echelon component under sub-paragraph (a) of this paragraph, and

(ii) return one copy of such nominal roll to the relevant 2nd Echelon component.

(c) 2nd Echelon components, upon receipt of the copies of nominal rolls under sub-para (b) of this paragraph, will enter the decisions of the authorising officers in the soldiers' records of service.

6. The following are examples of the entry to be made on the records of service of soldiers in appropriate cases: -

(i) Discharged under AMR 189(1)(e) on account of misconduct during service.

(ii) Discharged under AMR 184A(1)(e) on account of discreditable service.

7. (a) A member will be ineligible for benefits pursuant to this order in respect of only that period of continuous full-time service which ceases or has ceased for any of the reasons mentioned in para 2.

(b) A member who, before 11th December 1944, ceased to be employed on continuous full-time duty for any of the reasons mentioned in para 2, will be ineligible only for such benefits as he has not already received, except that if he has already received the Returned from Active Service Badge or the General Service Badge he will be ineligible to retain such badge, the property of which remains in the Commonwealth.

8. The GROs and instructions referred to in para 1 will be read and applied in accordance with this order.

9. The numerals after certain grounds for discharge mentioned in para 2(ii)(b) and (c) indicate that those grounds are only applicable as follows: -

- (1) applicable only after 30th September 1943
- (2) applicable only after 18th January 1945
- (3) applicable only prior to 30th September 1943
- (4) applicable except between 30th September 1943 and 26th October 1944
- (5) applicable only after 26th October 1944
- (6) applicable only between 30th July 1942 and 30th September 1943.

10. The classes of members disqualified for war gratuity and the reasons therefore are contained in "The Schedule" to the War Gratuity Act, No 16 of 1945.

122. MEDICAL - CONTROL OF VENEREAL DISEASE

1. Members of BCOF who contract Venereal Disease will report sick forthwith to Unit RAP, for treatment by official BCOF Medical Units.

2. Members will not in any circumstances receive treatment from Japanese doctors.

123. POSTAL - PROHIBITED ARTICLES, TRANSMISSION OF

1. The following articles are prohibited from transmission by post, and parcels containing such articles will not be accepted by BCOF Post Offices or, if detected while in transit, are liable to confiscation: -

126. CLEARANCE OF LEAVE PERSONNEL TO BRIT COM SUB AREA KOBE

1. When individuals wish to proceed on week end or other casual leave to the KOBE - KYOTO area and have arranged accomodation with a unit or with friends in that area, a request for approval will be submitted to this HQ at least 9 days prior to the day on which leave is required to commence, together with a written invitation from the unit supplying accommodation.

2. No casual leave which would involve the expenditure of dollars or the use of United States facilities or services will be approved.

3. This order does not affect the current procedure for despatching personnel to BCOF Holiday Hostels. Personnel on casual leave will not use any of the facilities provided by these Hostels.

127. VISITING HOURS 20 AUST FD AMB

1. Personnel visiting patients at 20 Aust Fd Amb will be limited to the following periods: -

1400 to 1600 hrs daily
1800 to 2000 hrs daily.

2. Patients suffering from VD and infectious diseases are NOT permitted visitors.

128. OUT OF BOUNDS : DEPENDENTS HOUSING AREAS

The dependents housing areas at NORTH CAMP and on the HIRO airfield are out of bounds to all personnel non-resident or not there on specific duty.

129. USE OF JAPANESE LAUNDRIES

1. Instances have occurred whereby personnel have sent clothing to Japanese laundries and have subsequently reported the clothing as having been lost whilst at the laundry.

2. All racks will be warned that in the future, clothing will only be laundered under unit arrangements.

3. Personnel who claim clothing was lost whilst at a Japanese laundry will be charged with the loss.

67 AUST INF BN STANDING ORDERS FOR PREVENTION OF FIRE

SCOPE OF ORDERS

1. These orders will have application to all personnel of 67 Aust Inf Bn and any other troops, or detachments, placed under command for discipline, rations and quarters.
2. The following orders detail the methods to be adopted for the prevention, and extinguishing, of fires which may occur within the unit area. Except where local conditions may vary methods to be used, these orders will apply to all detachments or subunits of the unit occupying independent barrack areas.

GENERAL

3. It is the responsibility of all company, subunit and detachment commanders to ensure that all ranks under their command are fully conversant with these orders and are made aware of their individual responsibilities both with regard to the prevention, and extinguishing, of fires.
4. All ranks will be warned that any breach of discipline or carelessness involving the risk of fire will result in severe disciplinary action against offenders.

PROMULGATION OF ORDERS

5. These orders will be promulgated as shown below:
 - (a) To all troops on the first parade after receipt and thereafter once per month.
 - (b) Displayed on notice boards at:
 - All company areas.
 - OR Mess
 - Sergeants Mess
 - Officers Mess
 - All kitchen areas
 - OR canteen
 - Recreation hut
 - Guard room
 - Q store
 - Transport park
 - Pioneer store
 - Ammunition store
 - Ration store
 - Cinema
 - Compound
 - Chapel
 - Officers quarters
 - Sergeants quarters (where separate)
 - Bn Orderly Room
 - All company orderly rooms
 - Boiler house
 - Such other places as may be detailed from time to time
 - (c) To all Japanese employees once per month by the NCC in charge of labour

6. Company, and as appropriate subunit or detachment, commanders will render a certificate of promulgation of "Standing Orders for Fire Prevention" on the last day of each month.
7. Intelligence section will arrange for the translation into Japanese of the revelant portions of these orders for the use of the labour NCO.

FIRE PRECAUTIONS

8. The following fire precautions will be enforced as from receipt of these orders.

- (a) BUILDINGS

No fires will be permitted in buildings unless the area is correctly fireproofed by the pioneer officer and inspected, and passed, by the Fire Marshal.

- (b) INFLAMMABLE LIQUIDS

Under no circumstances will inflammable liquids be stored in barrack areas occupied by troops. Where possible such liquids will be stored in a brick or concrete buildings at least 30 yards from any other building. Smoking will not be permitted within 20 yards of any building housing inflammable liquids.

- (c) AMMUNITION DUMPS

As for para 8 (b)

- (d) ELECTRICAL APPLIANCES

The installation, maintenance or condemnation or all electrical appliances, and fittings, will be the responsibility of the Signals Officer. All electrical appliances will be switched off prior to personnel leaving a room. The use in rooms of any electrical appliance or fitting not authorised by Signals Officer will not be tolerated.

The Signals Officer will inspect all electrical appliances in the area once per month and will render a report to the unit Fire Marshal as to servicability and general condition.

- (e) FUZE BOXES

After inspection by Signals Officer all fuze boxes will, where possible, be sealed by him and only the Signals Officer or his representative will be permitted to break such seals. Spare fuzes will be held by the Signals Officer and will where necessary be installed as required.

- (f) VEGETATION

All vegetation within a radius of 30 yards of any building will be cleared at regular intervals

- (g) OPEN FIRES

Open fires will not be permitted within the unit area unless authorized by the Fire Marshal or his deputy.

(h) NOTICEBOARDS

The Fire Marshal will ensure that adequate notice boards are affixed to buildings housing inflammable showing:-

(i) Contents of building

(ii) Smoking not permitted within 30 yards.

(i) LIGHTED CIGARETTES AND MATCHES

Suitable non inflammable containers will be provided by QM for all barrack and office rooms. Lighted cigarettes or matches will not be thrown out of windows or stubbed out on floor of barrack or office rooms. Smoking in bed is a punishable offence.

FIRE ESCAPES

9. Buildings of more than one storey will be equipped with either fire escape ladders or knotted ropes which will be suspended from the top storey in the scale of one ladder or knotted rope per twenty men.

FIRE ALARMS

10. Fire alarms will be installed in the unit area as follows:

(a) EMPTY SHELL CASES

Painted red and marked "FIRE ONLY" will be located at:

Bn HQ
Each company orderly room
Q store
Canteen
Recreation hut
Sergeants Mess

(b) BELL

A large bell will be erected in the vicinity of Bn HQ which will be rung on the outbreak of fire.

(c) ELECTRICAL ALARM

An electrical alarm is located in the office of the adjutant and is connected to all main barrack wings. This alarm will be sounded provided the electrical circuit is not affected by the outbreak.

(d) STEAM WHISTLE

A steam whistle has been fitted to the boiler room and this alarm will be used in the event of a breakdown of either subpara (a), (b) or (c).

UNIT FIRE MARSHAL

11. An officer will be appointed Unit Fire Marshal and be will be responsible for:

(a) All matters dealing with fire prevention

- (b) Training of fire fighting teams.
 - (c) Regular inspections and maintenance of unit fire precautions.
 - (d) Regular inspections barracks and installations.
 - (e) Supervision of frequent fire fighting exercises.
12. The Unit Fire Marshal will be assisted by one officer who will be designated assistant Fire Marshal. Either the Unit Fire Marshal or the Assistant Fire Marshal will be present in the barrack area at all times.
13. Companies or detachments occupying separate barracks will be responsible for the appointment of a Fire Marshal for their own area.
14. The Unit Fire Marshal will be responsible for the supervision of the work of fire marshals appointed to independent barrack areas.

FIRE PICQUET

15. Each company of the unit will train a fire picquet of one NCO and 6 OR. These fire picquets will mount when company is nominated as duty company and tour of duty will be from Retreat to Reveille.
16. The fire picquet will be responsible for: -
- (a) Patrolling of billets etc to detect outbreaks of fire.
 - (b) Sounding of appropriate fire alarm if an outbreak of fire is detected.
 - (c) Arousing the Bn Orderly Officer, Fire Marshal or his assistant and the guard commander.
 - (d) Attempt to extinguish any fire detected with facilities available in vicinity of fire.

UNIT FIRE FIGHTING TEAM

17. Each company will raise a fire fighting team of one NCO and 15 OR to form part of the Unit Fire Fighting Team. Companies are responsible to ensure that this team is kept at full strength at all times.
18. Responsibility for the training of this team will rest with the Unit Fire Marshal who will hold one training parade each week at a time to be laid down.
19. In the event of the fire alarm sounding all available personnel of the Unit Fire Fighting Team will report to predesignated areas and await orders from the Unit Fire Marshal.

JAPANESE FIRE BRIGADE

20. Arrangements have been made for the Japanese Fire Brigade situated at MUKAINADA to assist in the quelling of any outbreaks of fire.

21. A direct line has been laid between the fire station and the HQ Company barracks and in the event of fire Japanese assistance may be obtained by ringing the switchboard in the Bn area or at HQ Company.
22. The Japanese Fire Brigade will work under the direct orders of Unit Fire Marshal.
23. The Intelligence Section will on, an outbreak of fire, contact the Japanese Fire Brigade at MUKAINADA through the normal civilian telephone exchange.

WATER SUPPLY

24. The main sources of water supply are shown on trace attached at Appendix "A"
25. One 44 gallon drums of water, one bucket of water and one bucket of sand will be located: -
- (a) At either end of each barrack wing on both floors.
 - (b) In centre of each barrack wing on both floors.
26. Company or subunit commanders are responsible that these containers are kept both clean and filled at all times.

ASSISTANCE BY COMPANIES

27. To assist the Unit Fire Marshal to quell a fire with the maximum number of trained personnel all companies will, in the event of an outbreak, be organised as follows: -
- (a) Coy HQ - Fire Control HQ
 - (b) One pl - Fire fighting duties
 - (c) One pl - Salvage
 - (d) One pl - Reserve and Rescue.
28. Company commanders, assisted as required by Unit Fire Marshal, Pioneer Officer and RMO, will be responsible for the training of these platoons.
29. Set out below are details of the work that may be required of these platoons: -
- (a) Fire Control HQ
Be prepared to act as the local HQ for the Unit Fire Marshal.
 - (b) Fire Fighting Platoons
 - (i) Be trained in the rapid assembly of company fire fighting resources.
 - (ii) Rapid formation of bucket chains.
 - (iii) Control of hoses from hydrants.
 - (iv) Be conversant with methods of extinguishing fires.
 - (c) Salvage Platoons
 - (i) Priority of removal of stores from barracks as laid down by company or subunit commander.
 - (ii) Closing of all doors and windows of buildings.
 - (iii) Such other duties as may be laid down by Unit Fire Marshal.

(d) Reserve and Rescue Platoon

- (i) Establishment of first aid post in conjunction with RAP.
- (ii) Reserve of personnel from burning or demolished buildings.
- (iii) First aid including resuscitation.
- (iv) Line of evacuation for injured personnel.
- (v) Conversant with duties of other platoons and be able to fulfil those duties if required.

30. For the purpose of control the company, or subunit commanders, required to carry out independent action in the event of fire are listed below: -

- (a) Each rifle company commander.
- (b) Headquarters company commander less No 5 Platoon.
- (c) Transport Platoon commander.
- (d) Quartermaster.
- (e) Assistant adjutant, or IO, for all detachments of Bn HQ less RAP.
- (f) RMO for the organisation of medical treatment and evacuation.

ACTION ON OUTBREAK OF FIRE

31. The person discovering the fire will: -

- (a) Shout "FIRE" in a loud voice.
- (b) Sound the nearest alarm.
- (c) Take immediate action with equipment available pending arrival of company fire fighting platoon or Unit Fire Fighting Team.

32. The unit guard will: -

- (a) Turn out immediately.
- (b) Await receipt of instructions from Unit Fire Marshal or his deputy.

33. Bn Orderly Officer will: -

- (a) Sound general alarm system.
- (b) Ensure Unit Fire Marshal is warned.
- (c) Summons Japanese Fire Brigade.
- (d) Assume command of guard and proceed to scene of fire.

34. Unit Fire Fighting Team will: -

- (a) Mann fire engine at chapel.
- (b) Prepare engine and hoses for action.
- (c) Await orders of Unit Fire Marshal or deputy.

35. Unit Fire Marshal is: -

Responsible for the direction of all fire fighting, salvage and rescue.

36. RMO will: -

- (a) Organise temporary RAP on tennis courts.
- (b) Be prepared to treat personnel for injuries arising out of the fire.

37. Coy, or subunit commanders, will: -
- (a) Move troops for whom they are responsible clear of barracks.
 - (b) Direct salvage of essential documents etc from barracks to assembly areas in accordance with Appx "A" att.
 - (c) Conduct an immediate check of personnel of the company or subunit, to ensure that all are present.
 - (d) Post picquets at both ends of barrack blocks to prevent pilfering.
 - (e) Report to Unit Fire Marshal or his deputy.
38. Transport Officer will: -
- (a) Move all transport clear of transport park.
 - (b) Salvage all essential tools etc from transport park.
 - (c) Dispatch the Fire Jeep to report to Unit Fire Marshal at the scene of fire.
39. Personnel living in isolated areas such as canteen, Q Store etc will fall out outside their quarters under direction of the NCO or senior soldier and will ensure that: -
- (a) All possible steps are taken to extinguish the fire if it occurs in their area.
 - (b) All essential gear is salvaged.
 - (c) Report to Unit Fire Marshal at earliest convenience.
40. The staffs of both the Bn Orderly Room and Q Store will report to their respective offices and if possible, remove all essential documents and stores to a place of safe keeping.

ESSENTIAL STORES AND DOCUMENTS



OVERT ACTS (SERIAL 1)

1. At approx 2130 hrs on 4 Jun 47, a soldier of this unit was walking back to KAITAICHI from HIROSHIMA. At a point on the KAITAICHI side of the MUKAINADA bridge (74902606), a stone about 2 inches in diameter was thrown across the road, missing him by about two feet. Two Japanese then came out of an alley way on the EAST side of the road, asked him where he was going and what he was doing, and invited him into an adjoining building to drink some beer. The soldier, however, refused to go with them. He states that he gained the impression that there were more Japanese nearby, and that the ones to whom he was talking were of evil intent. On the approach of a vehicle, they ran away.



4. In an office building of the Repatriation Centre at DAIWA, a Japanese wireless set was located. Further investigation is being carried out.
5. The searching of NINOSHIMA was delayed considerably, as the work boat due at 0800 hrs to take additional troops to the island, did not arrive until 1100 hrs. over
6. Allied Military Government and US CIC officers were present during the operation, and were given complete freedom of investigation and interrogation of Japanese.
7. The battalion task was completed at 1715 hrs.



1. A check on items of war equipment revealed the following considered suitable for retention as museum pieces :-

- (a) Naval torpedo tubes in good working order, diameter 20 inches, overall length with hood 25 feet, overall height 6 feet, located at ex naval barracks OTAKE, and said to have been removed from the Japanese light cruiser YAHAGI in 1942.
- (b) An Army Model 98 (1938) 50 millimetre mortar. This is a smooth bore muzzle-loaded weapon, with 14 degree traverse and fixed elevation of 40 degrees. Markings - 1616 on the mortar and 1631 on the base plate. Found by MP at KAITAICHI in the home of an American speaking Japanese about Jun 46. This type of weapon is believed to have been used in the fighting in CHINA. The mortar is at present held at this unit.

Note (a) The introduction into Japan of tobacco and cigarettes is restricted to 3 lbs and 1000 cigarettes at any one time respectively.

Note (b) These items will only be imported on the authority of a BCOF Medical Officer.

Note (c) The maximum number of cameras which may be imported by any individual during his service with BCOF is one still and one cine-camera.

Note (d) Fire arms other than sporting guns and rifles and authorized equipment will NOT be imported into Japan.

Such goods will not be sold or bartered except with the written approval of a Formation Commander.

Authority is given for personnel duly appointed by commanders at ports, airports, and other points of entry, to carry out searches for goods and to require the declaration of goods brought by individuals entering Japan. In doubtful cases and where goods are found to be in excessive quantities, searches are empowered to impound goods pending the production of proof that such goods are intended for bonafide purpose. In all such cases a receipt for the goods impounded will be given.

122. CUSTOMS EXAMINATION - SERVICE PERSONNEL ENTERING AUSTRALIA

1. The quantity of cigarettes and tobacco which may be taken into Australia, duty free, by returning service personnel is limited to:

100 cigarettes or 4 ozs of tobacco.

Dependants of BCOF personnel will be subject to such Currency Control Regulations as are determined by HQ BCOF from time to time.

REMITTANCES TO AND FROM AUSTRALIA

3. Undrawn allotment and dependants allowance may be remitted to AUSTRALIA from JAPAN but in order that allotment posting media may be limited to normal payments, the remittance procedure will be as follows:-

- (a) An acquittance roll will be signed by the allottee for the amount to be remitted and the necessary entry made in paybook.
- (b) Form WF 131A (Remittance of Cash) will be completed in conjunction with the action in sub-para (a).
- (c) The Cash Office will issue an official receipt to the allottee for the amount shown on the acquittance roll and Form WF 131A

4. Remittances made from AUSTRALIA made through a District Accounts Office, will be transmitted to JAPAN by medium of credit advice note to paymasters. On receipt of the credit advice note by the paymaster the allottee's paybook will be called for through SSO and the credit entry made.

RETURN OF ALLOTTEES TO AUSTRALIA

5. Form WF 76 adapted to provide for allotments and dependants allowances being paid at either a bank or post office in AUSTRALIA will be completed by allottees. The paybook will be withdrawn after the last payment in JAPAN has been made. Payment of allotment and dependants allowance in advance may be made immediately prior to embarkation from JAPAN. This payment should be sufficient to cover any allotment pay days which may occur during the voyage to AUSTRALIA.

3. Should any officer or other rank require to enter buildings etc, placed "Out of Bounds" by this order, he will obtain written authority from his CO or OC to do so.
4. 34 Aust Inf Bde Routine Order 518 of 13 Jun 47 is cancelled.

140. MOSQUITO PRECAUTIONS

1. Effective from 1 Jul 47 mosquito precautions will be observed as directed herein:-

(a) Dress

- (i) Service personnel will wear shirt or jacket with sleeves down between 1800 and 0600 hrs with trousers, socks and boots or shoes according to Standing Orders for Dress. Anklets web are optional unless worn as part of official dress when ordered.
- (ii) Civilian personnel will conform to precautions as far as practicable by wearing slacks, blouses or shirts with long sleeves. If unable to conform, then mosquito repellent should be used.

(b) Mosquito repellants will be issued to Service and Civilian personnel. When clothing precautions are taken, its use is optional by all but sentries, who will apply at last light and thereafter at 3 hourly intervals.

(c) Mosquito nets will be used by all service personnel of the BCOF and all civilians under control of the BCOF except where fully screened quarters are provided.

The following precautions will be observed:-

- (i) Nets will be regularly inspected for holes or other damage.
- (ii) Whilst in use, nets will be tucked in all round the bed.
- (iii) Nets will be suspended in such a manner that no portion touches the sleeper.
- (iv) Nets will be in position and tucked in before dusk.

In completely screened quarters, mosquito nets need not be used but spraying with insecticide is necessary.

(d) Swimming

Swimming will be forbidden in the hours during which mosquito precautions are taken.

(e) Prevention of Mosquito Breeding

- (i) Active measures will be taken by all HQ units and installations to discover and destroy mosquito breeding areas in the vicinity of troops areas.
- (ii) All breeding areas discovered will be reported to Hygiene sections.
- (iii) The collection and disposal of refuse and waste will be carefully supervised to ensure that water is not permitted to collect and thus provide breeding beds for mosquitos.
- (iv) A periodical inspection and treatment of water in cisterns, tanks, fire buckets, gutters, drains etc., in billets occupied by troops will be carried out by units.

(f) Spraying of quarters at last light by special detail where DDT has NOT been used, will be carried out.

141. TOKYO AMENITIES PURCHASE:

All personnel who have a claim on regimental funds will submit their name and amount in writing to their Coy HQ. Complete rolls from Coys will then be forwarded to Bn HQ.

142. MARRIAGES IN JAPAN

1. Owing to present shortage of accommodation for families and the necessity of calling forward families of members with higher priority points, the allocation of housing to couples marrying in JAPAN is not immediately practicable, and approval for future marriages in JAPAN will be deferred until housing for them is in sight.

2. Attention is directed to 34 Aust Inf Bde AG 7648 of 21 Feb 47, para 4, and all units are again reminded that application for housing should be made at the earliest opportunity to enable points to accumulate.

1. In view of the fact that a number of exercises on amphibious operations will be included in the period of bn training commencing on 1 Sep 47, it is essential that every member of the unit can swim and has complete confidence in his ability.
2. A unit swimming school will therefore be established at OTAKE, initially with a view to training all non-swimmers to the standard of swimming 200 yds fully clothed and 400 yds stripped. Later the scope of the school will be expanded to qualify the maximum number of personnel for Royal Life Saving Society medalions.
3. The school will open on 28 Jun 47 under Lt E H SMITH who will be assisted by a staff of four instructors. Each course will be of 10 days duration, during which time personnel attending will be free of all regimental duties.


