
Civilian Disturbance




176. STORAGE OF FURNITURE

1. It is advised that Treasury approval has been given for the cost of packing, removal to store and storage of the furniture and effects of married personnel whose families join them in JAPAN to be made a charge against public expense.

2. On reutrn of such families to AUSTRALIA, the cost of removal from store to residence will be likewise borne by the Commonwealth provided the town of residence is the same as that from which the furniture was originally taken to store, or a town no further than the orginal town of residence.

3. The storage chargeable to public expense in any one case will not exceed 8/- per week.

177. WASHING OF HOSETOPS

The practice of boiling hoesetops in persil will cease as it causes fading. Faded hoesetops will NOT be worn.

178. EMBARKATION

1. A senior offr of 34 Aust Inf Bde will be present at the gangway of all ships embarking Australian personnel, and this offr has executive powers covering the embarkation of personnel who are under the influence of alcohol.

2. His powers include prevention of embarkation of such personnel and returning them to their unit lines, reception camp or central police station.

180 CONTROL OF WATER CRAFT OPERATIONS.

1. It is the responsibility of Formation and Unit Commanders to ensure that all craft under their control are checked "OUT" and "IN" operations.
2. Crews operating small craft will be classified as qualified operators by the Transportation Service this HQ, or under Formation arrangements.
3. The sub-paras of this paragraph will be entered on all worksheets and copy maintained, so that a controlled search can be carried out for overdue craft.

- (a) Craft Number
- (b) Name of Coxswain



- (c) Destination.
- (d) Route and ETA.
- (e) ETA of return journey.
- (f) Authority to move.

4. Craft will not operate outside the range indicated by craft Operating Licence unless by a specific order of the Formation Commander and /or Tn Directorate HQ BCOF "Pool" craft.
5. Craft will not operate during the hours of darkness, unless in an emergency. In Formation areas authority for night operations will be given by the Formation Commander and by Tn Directorate, HQ BCOF in the case of "Pool" Craft. All craft operating at night must be fitted with correct navigational lights as per Navigational Laws for ships at sea.
6. Provost have been instructed to check all craft that do not carry a registration number and report details through normal channels to Tn Directorate, HQ BCOF.
7. All craft are liable to check at any time to ensure that the conditions of the Craft Operating Licence are being complied with.

181. CURRENCY

1. Personnel of the British Commonwealth Occupation Force and civilians attached to or accompanying the Force are prohibited from possessing any currency other than Military Occupation Currency, or Japanese Yen.
2. Adequate facilities exist for the exchange of acceptable non-Japanese currency on arrival in Japan either by sea or air, and it is the responsibility of all persons, to effect this exchange as soon as possible after arrival.
3. The Chief Paymaster, HQ, BCOF, is responsible for the issue of Military Occupation and Japanese Yen currency to the Supply Officers, Paymasters, and Accountant Officers.
4. The exchange of currencies will be effected only by Supply Officers, Paymasters, Accountant Officers, or licensed British Banks. Personnel of the British Commonwealth Occupation Force, and civilians attached to or accompanying the Force, are prohibited from effecting the exchange of any currency into any other currency except through these agencies.
5. Exchange will not be made of any currency for which an official rate of exchange has not been promulgated. Such currency will be surrendered to the Paymaster for safe custody. The Paymaster will issue a receipt to the owner who may reclaim the currency on re-embarkation.



182. DISCIPLINE ON FERRIES

Any officer WO or NCO, travelling by Army Ferry, being aware of any breach of discipline, will take any action considered necessary, and will assist the Ferry Supervisor if requested to do so.

183. DRESS

(a) Many instances are occurring of personnel entering the men's mess hall incorrectly dressed.

(b) Disciplinary action will be taken against personnel incorrectly dressed for mess.

184. ROUTINE

Disciplinary action will be taken against personnel attending mess parades at incorrect times.

(b) Attention is directed to 67 Bn RO 95 of 4 Apr 47, and QM amendment - Evening meal first setting 1700 hrs.

185. BARRACK ROOM DISCIPLINE

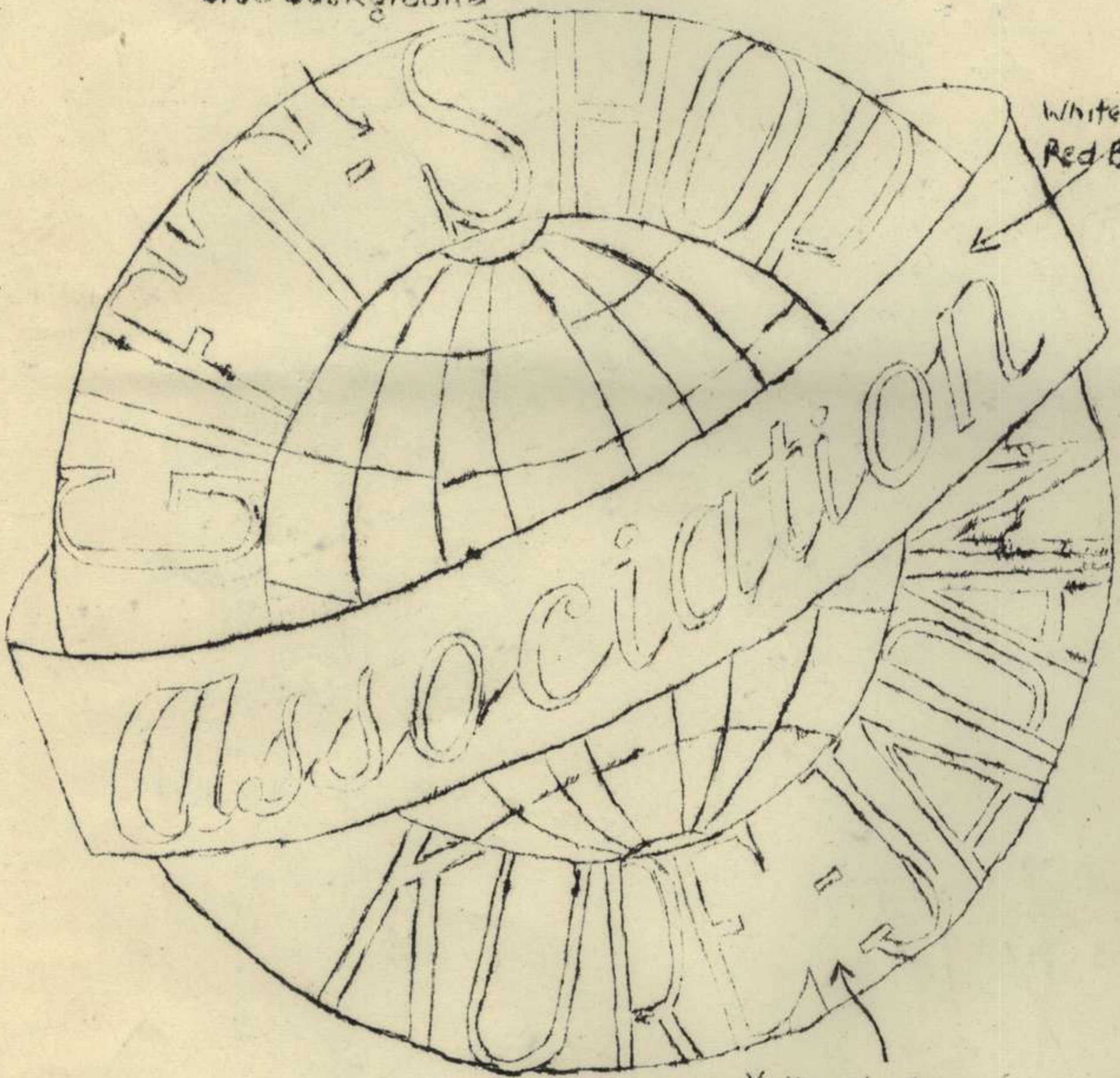
196. PRICE CONTROL - GIFT SHOPS







197. LAUNDRY FACILITIES - BCOF HOLIDAY HOSTELS

- (a) All personnel proceeding on leave to BCOF Holiday Hostels will be warned that laundry facilities at these institutions are limited.
- (b) The procurement demand for laundry facilities covers only hotel linen and the personal needs of the staff.
- (c) Where possible, therefore, personnel proceeding on leave will take sufficient clothing with them and so avoid large demands on the limited laundry facilities.

178. CUSTOMS PROCEDURE ON DISEMBARKATION IN AUSTRALIA

- (a) New Customs Regulations which came into force in AUSTRALIA on 15 Aug 47 require the following action:-
  - (I) OC Troops certificate covering the baggage of embarked troops will no longer be accepted.
  - (II) A new type Customs form will be completed by each soldier embarking.
  - (III) Such form to show the value of all goods purchased in JAPAN which the soldier is taking to AUSTRALIA with him.
  - (IV) Additionally, the value of goods despatched by him to addresses in AUSTRALIA during the previous twelve months must be shown.
  - (V) Upon disembarkation each soldier must carry the Customs form duly completed.
  - (VI) The form will be given up to Customs Officers at the foot of the gangway.
  - (VII) If, in the opinion of these officers, the soldier has exceeded the amount of duty free goods allowed him under Customs Regulations, the soldier will be directed to the shed for examination and payment of duty.



- (VIII) Should the Customs Officers deem that no duty is payable the soldier will embus for the Transit Camp.
- (IX) Should the Customs form be incomplete or incorrectly made out, the soldier will be directed to the shed for examination.

NOTES

- (a) New type Customs forms available on board the Transport will be distributed during the voyage to AUSTRALIA.
- (b) It must be realised by all concerned that trading with JAPAN and Japanese is at present restricted. However, in the case of members of the Forces, a special duty free allowance is made. This allowance is made on goods to the value of £10 sterling per period of twelve months. All parcels sent by post are examined by Customs and a register kept of the amount of goods despatched to AUSTRALIA by any member during a period of twelve months. The Customs forms made out on board will be compared with the register and any false declaration disclosed by this comparison will lead to a prosecution against the member concerned. It is emphasised that all goods purchased in JAPAN must be declared, irrespective of their value. The Customs Officials will determine the allowable value.
- (c) Irrespective of whether the completed forms show that Customs Duty is due or not the Customs Officers may direct any member of disembarking personnel to the shed for a taken examination.
- (d) The allowance of duty free tobacco and cigarettes, viz. 200 cigarettes (or tobacco equivalent) for each week of leave due, up to four weeks will be continued.
- (b) The concession at present allowed to service personnel is that, in the case of goods not intended for sale exchange or trade, they are permitted to send or take to AUSTRALIA, free of Customs duty, such goods (with the exception of cigars, cigarettes, tobacco or spirituous liquors) to the value of £10 sterling in any twelve months period. Personnel taking or sending goods into AUSTRALIA in excess of the value of £10 sterling will be called upon to pay Customs duty in accordance with normal Customs Regulations. The Dept of Trade and Customs has become seriously alarmed in regard to the practice which has developed, of many servicemen's sending substantial quantities of goods by post and then, when returning to AUSTRALIA on duty or leave or for discharge, bringing further quantities of such goods with them and making a claim for exemption from Customs duty.
- (c) This information will be promulgated to all ranks in order that personnel returning to AUSTRALIA may be familiar with current Customs procedure.



179. TRADING IN BCOF GOODS

- (a) Members of the British Commonwealth Occupation Force and their Dependants, persons attached to or accompanying the Force and persons employed by the Force, shall not -
- (I) Sell, exchange, barter, give or in any way dispose of to the Japanese articles, merchandise, material or equipment originating in or obtained from any Canteen, Canteen Service, Amenities Service, Welfare Association or Organization, or any Service, Branch, Unit or Establishment whatsoever of the British Commonwealth Navy, Army or Air Forces in Japan.
- (II) Without the written approval of his Commanding Officer obtained, sell, exchange, barter, give or in any way dispose of any article, merchandise, material or equipment specified in para (a) above, to any other person in such a manner as to derive from the transaction any profit or advantage.
- (b) All articles, merchandise, material or equipment sold, exchanged, bartered, given or disposed of in violation of this order are subject to confiscation, and may be seized and held by proper Naval, Military, or Air Force Authority. In cases of seizure involving transactions under para 1 (b) of this order the person from whom the article, merchandise, material or equipment is taken, or to whom the property belongs, shall have a period of sixty (60) days from such seizure to lodge with the appropriate Formation Commander written reasons, if any, why such property should be returned. Upon receipt of the reasons and request for the return of the said property or at the expiration of sixty (60) days, whichever is the sooner, the property shall be disposed of as directed by the Formation Commander concerned.
- (c) This Order will be published, and repeated quarterly, in all Formation and Unit Orders, and will be clearly promulgated to all persons concerned.
- (d) 67. Aust Inf Bn. Routine Order 52 Para 1 of 3 Sep 46 is cancelled.

180. PACKING MATERIALS

- (a) In order to comply with Department of Health Regulations the practice of using straw for the packing of parcels for transport to Australia by land or sea is to be discontinued.
- (b) If straw is used as packing material, it must be destroyed on arrival in Australia at the importers expense under the direction or supervision of a quarantine Officer or the package must be placed in bond for ninety days.
- (c) Where packing of fragile parcels is necessary paper or clean wood wool or suitable substitutes will be used.



181. RABIES CONTROL

- (a) All privately owned dogs are to be provided with collars and tags showing name and address of owner.
- (b) Unit registers of dog owners are to be kept by Camp Orderly Rooms.
- (c) Numbers of dogs needing inoculation against rabies will be notified by Unit Commanders to SMO Formation, who will arrange inoculations through the relevant Military Government Team.
- (d) After publication of this order, all dogs not wearing collars will be liable to destruction if found loose in unit lines or dependants living areas.

202. PREVENTION OF CRIME: USE OF FORCE BY JAPANESE

1. Instances have occurred where Japanese nationals have used force towards personnel of the Occupation Forces in order to restrain them from damaging or destroying Japanese property or from causing injuries to Japanese.
2. It is the policy of the BCOF that Japanese nationals shall not use force against Occupation Force personnel nor may Japanese officials formally arrest them. It is however reasonable for persons, Japanese or otherwise, to employ force to prevent the destruction of their property or injuries to their persons. No prosecutions will be initiated against Japanese in such case unless enquiry shows that the force used exceeded the minimum necessary to maintain order until the arrival of Military or other Service Police.

203 REGISTERED MAIL MATTER

- (a) Director Army Post UK notifies that letter packets only up to four pounds in weight may be registered.
- (b) No registration is henceforth available for ordinary parcels or packets for UNITED KINGDOM or destinations other than the Commonwealth of AUSTRALIA to which destination parcel registration is still available.

204 CINEMAS AND FILMS

As from Monday 13 Oct 47

- (a) A K C will cease to be responsible for exhibition and film distribution to individual units.
- (b) A K C will discharge all Japanese operators. They will be available, if required, for transfer to the military.



- (c) A K C will withdraw from service all mobile cinema vans. If required these can be run by the military under army arrangements.

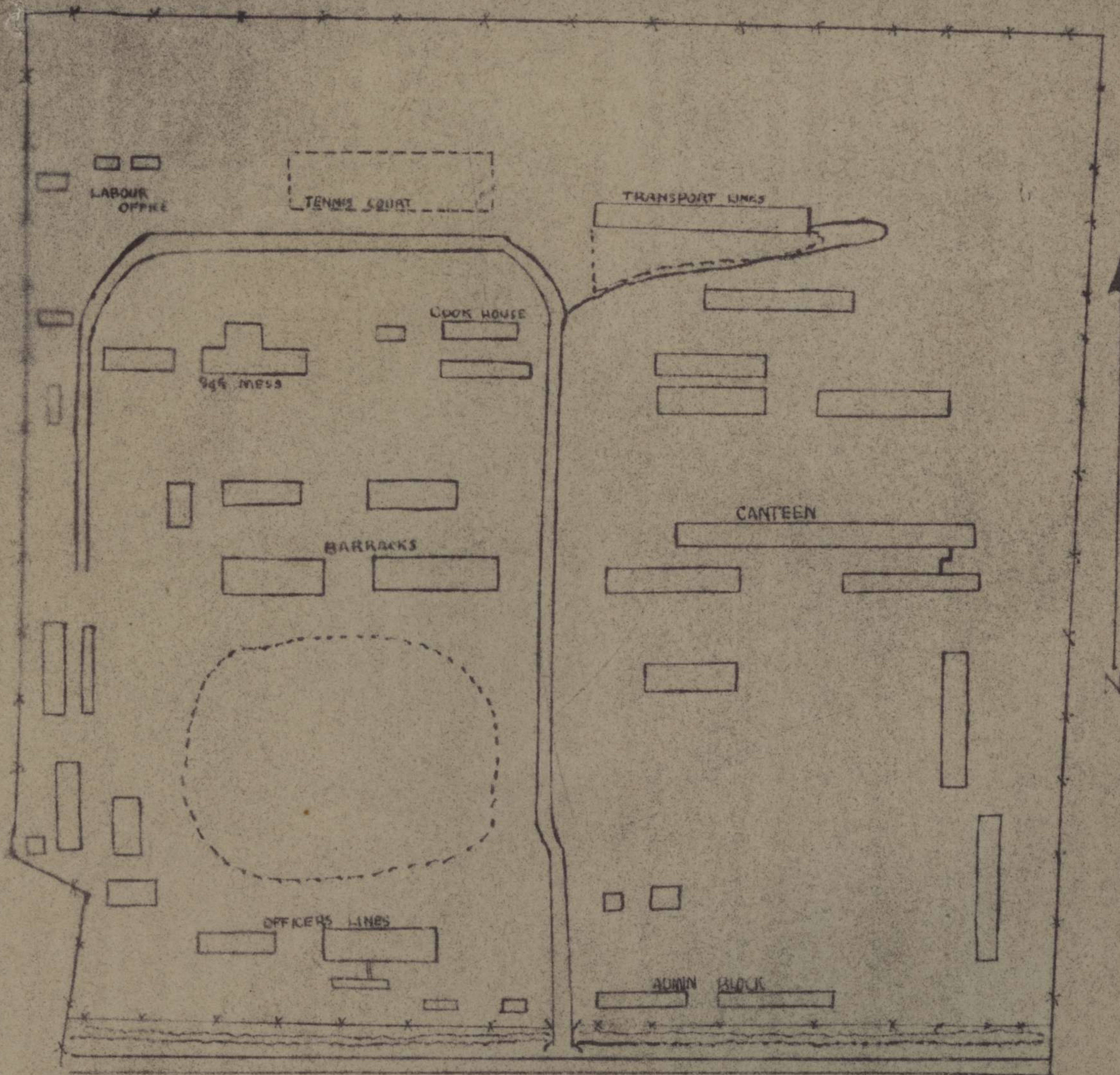



## PART II

The search of the designated area produced no results other than to deny the existence of any caves or tunnels, in spite of information received from Mil Gov pers that these were innumerable in the area. A logical deduction would be that any heavy material hidden in the area would have been placed in a remote part of the SUMITOMO MINE

This at first was strengthened by the presence of a fire which had been reported to have broken out in the mine 16 hrs previous to the arrival of the force, and in which it was alleged that the Mine Superintendent Mr KON Hajime, Chief of Mining Sec Mr UEGAKI Kenichi, Financial Mine Head Mr FUJITA Masao had been killed by gass as a result of overstaying the time allowed by the respirator's oxygen supply.

The chain of coincidences, ie first fire for 15 years, effective blocking of the search of the mine, two expert mine officials losing their lives by what appeared to be carelessness, the attitude of the mine officials etc, all helped to confirm the then held opinion that the fire was a ruse to prevent a search of the mine.

However this opinion changed after several visits to the limits possible to go into the mine. On the request of Brigadier R N L HOPKINS the service of Mr J Collins and Mr E Harrington of Natural Resources Section GHQ SCAP were obtained and the investigation on the first of October included an entry into the gaseous area - definitely established the presence of a fire in the 15 and 16 levels, caused probably by gas given off old timbering ignited by an electrical defect. Both gentlemen were of the opinion that at least two weeks must elapse before the area was cleared of smoke and carbon monoxide gas. Presence also of the bodies of the casualties is confirmed by the willingness of the officials to have had Mr Collins and Mr Harrington view them during the tour of the gaseous area, however owing to a defect in the respiratory equipment worn by Mr Collins this was left for a later date.

Both Mr Collins and Mr Harrington state that a complete search of all parts of the mine is a practical impossibility as many of the higher levels are waded in, which Mr Collins had found on a previous visit to the mine 12 months previously.

Investigation of mine employees, allegedly intensely hostile, to the management, resulted in their stating that it was impossible to have played any material in the mine without their knowledge, and that they were certain that there was nothing in the mine.

Therefore, I consider that -

- (a) the fire is genuine and the bodies present
- (b) a search of the mine cannot be effected before two weeks have elapsed
- (c) searching of the mine is a task outside the scope of infantry personnel

I respectfully suggest that more investigation is necessary to justify any further activities regarding this area.

Reference graves of PW reported, interrogation of Japanese reveals that several Allied prisoners were buried at the same time and that all bodies had been removed over a year ago.

In accordance with instructions received one officer and two ORs were left at the mine to observe activities and report when fire is quelled and bodies recovered.
