CHANGES OF LOCATION

1. Advance party 67 Aust Inf Bn departed OKAYAMA 3016551 for TOKYO. Party comprised 6 officers and 32 other ranks. Transport section departed OKAYAMA 3007301. Advance party arrived 3110001 at EBISU Camp TOKYO 67494150.

OPERATIONS

2. At the request of OKAYAMA Military Government Team, this unit sent out four patrols from 15 to 17 Jan 48 inclusive, to police Japanese fish shops in the prefecture. The operation was successful. A full report on this matter has already been forwarded. One officer and one corporal are detached to OKAYAMA Military Government Team for three months, on permanent surveillance duties.

DISCOVERY OF TARGET

3. (a) On 23 Jan 48, a report was received by this unit from the BCOF Liaison Officer with OKAYAMA Military Government Team, to the effect that a quantity of warlike stores had been found at KATSUMADA 91203371. On 24 Jan 48, one officer and one serjeant were sent to the area to inspect the site and report on the discovery.

- (b) From information learned by this party, and from what was passed on to this unit through the OKAYAMA Military Government Liaison Officer, the following is evident; -
- (i) portion of the buried ex-Japanese military materials was first discovered by one TAKATA Matsuo of OAZA HATAYA, KATSUMADA-Cho, KATSUTA-Gun, on his farmland on or about 15 Jan 48.
  - (ii) the matter was reported through the Japanese Police to Allied Military Government OKAYAMA.
  - (iii) the area was formerly occupied by the KUMAMOTO Military Officers' Training School, (it is situated due EAST of the former Japanese Army Divisional Training Area at NIPPOMBARA 91433463).
  - (iv) these materials are believed to have been buried at or about the time of the surrender.
  - (v) Japanese authorities in the area have been aware of the presence of these stores since the surrender.
- (c) A considerable amount of interrogation was necessary before any concrete information was forthcoming from the Japanese authorities at KATSUMADA. It was learned that extensive training with heavy machine guns were carried out in the area during the war. Likely JUKI sites were therefore selected, and in this way two additional dumps were uncovered. The stores were committed to the custody of the Japanese Police, and the area roped off.
- (d) A signal giving all available information, and requesting further necessary action was sent to Brit Com Base KURE (Copy to 34 Aust Inf Bde) on 25 Jan 48. The matter was also reported to 904 (Br) FSS and 152 Section SIB OKAYAMA. The last named <sup>made</sup> further enquiries and more stores were discovered.
- (e) It is considered likely that many more such dumps are yet to be found in the locality.

- (f) On 30 Jan 48, Lt LAWSON of Brit Com Base KURE arrived at 67 Aust Inf Bn to investigate, and complete Specialist's Report on the target.
- (g) Lt LAWSON's report is not yet to hand.
- (h) Attached as appendix "A" is the list of stores found in KATSUMADA area to this date.



84. FROST PRECAUTIONS - WATER COOLED ENGINES WHEN ANTI FREEZE NOT AVAILABLE

On completion of days duty or when vehicles or equipment will not be required for a considerable time, drain the cooling system by opening all drain taps.

NOTE: The opening of radiator drain taps is NOT in all cases a sufficient warranty that the cooling system is completely drained certain engines, eg GMC and CVT, are fitted with drain taps in the cylinder blocks. If these are not opened some water will remain in the block. There is a possibility of this water freezing and cracking the engine block. After draining, a "NO WATER" sign will be secured to the vehicle in a conspicuous position.

TO ASSIST EASY ENGINE STARTING

- (i) If the engine is stiff, crank it by hand before using the self starter.
- (ii) Apply the choke lever to its fullest extent and set the hand throttle for a fast idle.
- (iii) Disengage clutch and operate self starter.
- (iv) When engine starts adjust the choke and throttle to obtain even engine running. DO NOT RACE THE ENGINE.

- (v) Maintain the specific gravity of the battery at 1.250 when fully charged. When it is necessary to add distilled water, it should be added just prior to running the engine to ensure a quick mixing of water and acid.

FISH AND VEGETABLE SHOPS SURVEILLANCE SOP

1. To deal legally in fresh fish and vegetables a retailer must: -
  - (a) obtain a list of at least fifty (50) families who agree to trade exclusively with him;
  - (b) present this list (in form of a petition) and be licensed by the Prefecture;
  - (c) maintain full records on display, to include: -
    - (i) price list
    - (ii) receipt from wholesaler
    - (iii) license from Prefecture, bearing Governor's own han
    - (iv) record of sales.
2. In exercising surveillance, shops should be checked for the records listed in para 1(c) above. In the event that any of these are lacking, or are not displayed, or in the event that there is any indication that "under-the-counter" or "backdoor" sales are taking place, the police will be called and the matter explained to them. NOTE: Toward the end of the selling day, retailers are permitted to place fish and vegetables on sale without ration as to quantity sold to an individual. However, a notice must be posted on the shop to this effect, and controlled prices will prevail.
3. Surveillance is solely for the purpose of calling violations to the attention of the police.

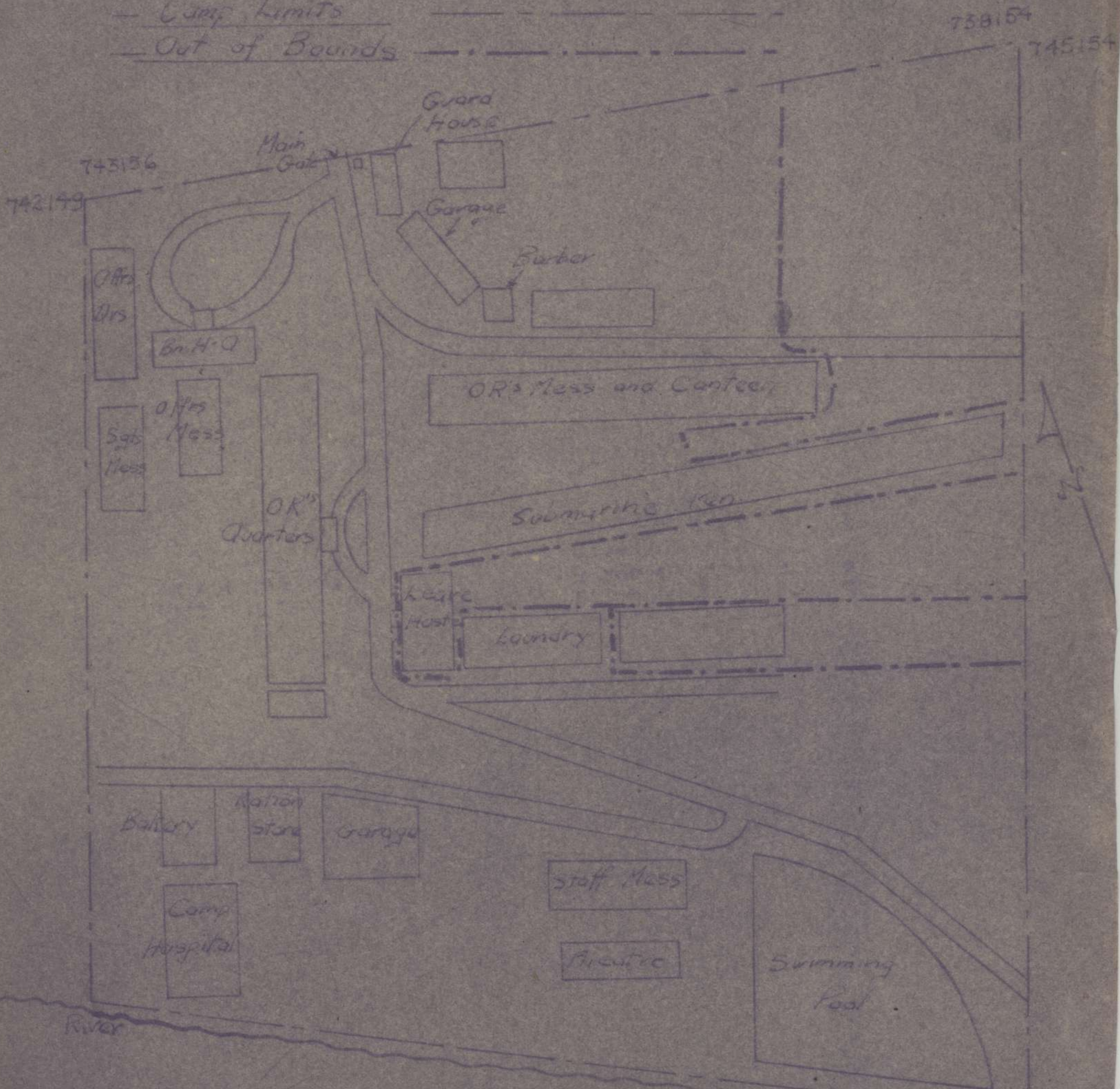

126. VENEREAL DISEASE

It is necessary to remind all personnel of the following points in connection with venereal disease :-

- (i) individual prophylaxis by correct use of blue light outfit and PAC treatment is practically 100% effective
- (ii) PAC treatment is compulsory and should be sought immediately after intercourse. Failure to attend a PAC after intercourse is an offence and will result in disciplinary action.
- (iii) on first suspicion of venereal disease, a sore or discharge - individuals must report to the RAP. Concealment of VD is a serious offence as it delays cure and is a menace to your comrades.
- (iv) adequate treatment in Japan is provided only in military hospitals. Any other treatment usually involves the use of drugs which are inadequate and such treatment is always dangerous. Treatment at the hands of a Japanese or other practitioner is a serious military offence liable to heavy punishment.


