160. EXECUTION OF WILLS - MEMBERS OF THE AMF

Hereunder MBI 121 of 21 Nov 47 published for necessary action: -

1. AMR & O 1410A provides (inter alia) that every member of the AMF on war service who has attained the age of 21 years and every member of the AMF on war service who is under the age of 21 years but who is in actual military service, that is, he had taken some step towards joining the forces in the field during the existence of a state of war, shall make a valid will within three months of the date of enlistment or if he has already made a will which is in existence and valid, certify as to the whereabouts of that will.

2. Normally, a will should be signed by the person making the will in the presence of two witnesses, but a valid disposition of property may be made without such formalities by any member who, at the time of making the will, is in actual military service.

3. However, in such a case, it is often difficult after the death of the member to prove that he was in actual military service at the time, and to avoid such legal difficulties arising it is desirable that all members should make wills properly witnessed by two witnesses.

4. Should any member entertain any doubt as to whether or not a will made by him has been validly made and witnessed, a new will attested by two witnesses should be made by him.

5. Any new will so made shall either be lodged with the member's CO for forwarding to the Army Records Office of his State of enlistment or be lodged elsewhere and a certificate as to its whereabouts forwarded to his CO for forwarding to the appropriate Army Records Office.
6. A new will may be made, and any certificate shall be made, on the approved form (AAF A130) and in every case the will or certificate, as the case may be, shall be enclosed in the envelope provided for the purpose (AAF A131).
7. When a new will is made and forwarded to the appropriate Army Records Office, such Army Records Office shall, at the request of a member, return the original will to the member's unit for delivery to him."

21	Sep	Festival of the Autumnal Equinox
17	Oct	Harvest Thanksgiving Day
3	Nov	Anniversary of Emperor Meiji's Birth
23	Nov	Harvest Festival
25	Dec	Anniversary of Emperor Taisho's Death.

(b) Occupation Force Personnel will in no circumstances interfere in any way with the flying of the flag on these days.

169. MARRIAGE IN JAPAN

(a) Members of the BCOF (including Women's Service) shall not marry without the written authority of one of the following Officer.

Commander-in-Chief, BCOF (The authority of the C in C BCOF may be exercised by the Principal administrative Officer).

Air Officer Commanding, British Commonwealth Air Group.

Commander, 34 Australian Infantry Brigade Group.

Commander, Second New Zealand Expeditionary Force (Japan).

Commander, U K Army Component.

Approval will not be given for a marriage between a member of the BCOF and a Japanese National by any authority other than the Commander-in-Chief.

- (b) In the event of an unapproved marriage being carried out by a chaplain, civilian clergyman, secular official or under Japanese civil law, all ranks are informed that :-
- (i) Disciplinary action will be taken.
 - (ii) Dependants and marriage allowance may be withheld and logistic support of the wife and family may not be accepted.
 - (iii) Australian Ministry of Immigration will not permit the entry of Japanese women into Australia either as wives or as fiancées.
- (c) A civil marriage in Japan is merely an agreement between participants :- neither a license nor a ceremony being required for its completion. It becomes legally effective upon notification by the participants to the Japanese Registrar who makes appropriate entries in the census rolls of the ward village. Japanese law does not require the issuance of a marriage certificate. It does, however, require the support of witnesses in the notification to the Registrar, and in certain cases parental consent. Japanese registrars have been forbidden to accept a notification or make any entry in a register of marriages in respect of any member of the British Commonwealth Occupation Force unless the registrar first gives thirty days notice to Headquarters, British Commonwealth Occupation Force through Military Government channels, and within that period receives, in writing, the authority of the Commander-in-Chief, BCOF.

100. VENEREAL DISEASE - CONTROL

- (a) BCOF servicemen and male civilians attached to or accompanying the Force are to attend a PAC for prophylactic treatment as soon as possible after having illicit sexual intercourse.

Arrangements are to be made at all PAC to record attendances confidentially.

- (b) A member who contracts Venereal Disease or who suspects that he is infected with Venereal Disease is to report sick forthwith to the Unit RAP. Treatment for VD is to be carried out only by BCOF Medical Units.

Self treatment, private treatment by BCOF, Japanese or other doctors or personnel is prohibited.

- (c) Disciplinary action is to be taken in all cases where it is evident that this order has not been obeyed. Medical Officers will carefully check all cases which come under their notice and will initiate disciplinary action where disobedience is apparent.

171. CONTROL OF BLACK MARKET ACTIVITIES

- (a) Members of the British Commonwealth Occupation Force and their dependants, and persons attached to, accompanying, or employed by the Force shall not, except as prescribed in para (b) of this Order, carry or cause to be carried any rations, foodstuffs, cigarettes, tobacco, liquor or other commodities originating in or obtained from any Canteen, service, organisation or establishment of the British Commonwealth Occupation Force.

- (b) This Order does not prohibit:

- (i) The carriage of any goods specified in para 1 of this Order by personnel in the course of their duties.
- (ii) The bona fide carriage of such goods by personnel from the place of purchase, or issue, directly to their living quarters, messes or barracks.
- (iii) Personnel from carrying, within their Camp area, or living quarters, a reasonable quantity of foodstuffs, cigarettes and tobacco for their own bona fide use and consumption from time to time.
- (iv) Personnel who are proceeding outside their Camp area, barracks, or living quarters on leave or duty, and are in possession of a leave or duty pass as the case may be, from carrying a reasonable quantity of food, cigarettes and tobacco for their own bona fide use and consumption during the period of their authorised leave or duty. Personnel proceeding on leave or duty outside their Camp area, barracks or quarters for periods of less than 48 hours shall not carry more than 50 cigarettes, or 2 oz of tobacco.

(c) Military and Service Police are authorised to stop and search personnel found committing or reasonably suspected of committing an offence against this Order, and the vehicles in which such personnel are travelling. In the case of air force personnel the provisions of A.C.I. and A.C.I. para 237 must be observed. Military and Service Police will make surprise checks from time to time of personnel travelling on ferries, trains, and buses and at suitable places.

(d) Military and Service Police are authorised to impound any articles carried by personnel in quantities in excess of those allowed by this Order. In doubtful cases goods may be impounded pending the production of proof that such goods are intended for bona-fide purposes. In all cases a receipt for the goods impounded will be given.

172. INCREASE IN PRICE OF BEER

The price of beer from Japanese breweries has recently been raised and the raise has been authorised by G.I. It is therefore necessary to raise the price of beer from canteen issue points to one shilling sterling per bottle as from 15 Mar 48.

(1) Letters - ½d for first oz, 1d for each succeeding oz.

(ii) Post cards - 1d.

(iii) Printed papers - ½d per 2 ozs.

(iv) Parcels - up to 3 lbs - 1/3
 3 lbs to 7 lbs - 2/3
 7 lbs to 11 lbs - 3/6
 11 lbs to 22 lbs - 5/6.

(c) Postage rates on letters, post cards, and parcels sent by sea from UK to members of the forces overseas will also be increased.

178. VD CONTROL - TREATMENT BCOF CASES BY JAPANESE DOCTORS

- (a) It is known that certain personnel of 34 Aust Inf Bde have been receiving treatment for VD (particularly gonorrhoea) from Japanese doctors. This action will cease forthwith and offenders are liable to disciplinary actions.
- (b) The following facts are brought to the notice of all ranks :-
 - (i) Diagnosis of VD by Japanese doctors is not always accurate.
 - (ii) The standard of training of Japanese doctors is far below that of BCOF medical officers.
 - (iii) Drugs used by Japanese doctors are inferior in quality to drugs available to BCOF medical authorities. In many cases Japanese drugs are useless.
 - (iv) The necessary after-treatment period of surveillance is neglected and the danger of latent syphilis continuing to be undetected is greatly increased. The resultant effect on the soldier's happiness and health in later life need hardly be mentioned.
- (c) Personnel having treatment from Japanese doctors are adding to the already considerable hazards surrounding VD contracted in JAPAN.

- (d) Japanese doctors have been ordered not to treat BCOF personnel for VD or any other disease, but only to give First Aid in an emergency. eg a road accident.

179. MEDICAL - CONTROL OF VENEREAL DISEASE

Members of BCOF who contract Venereal Disease will report sick forthwith to unit RAP for treatment by official BCOF Medical Units.

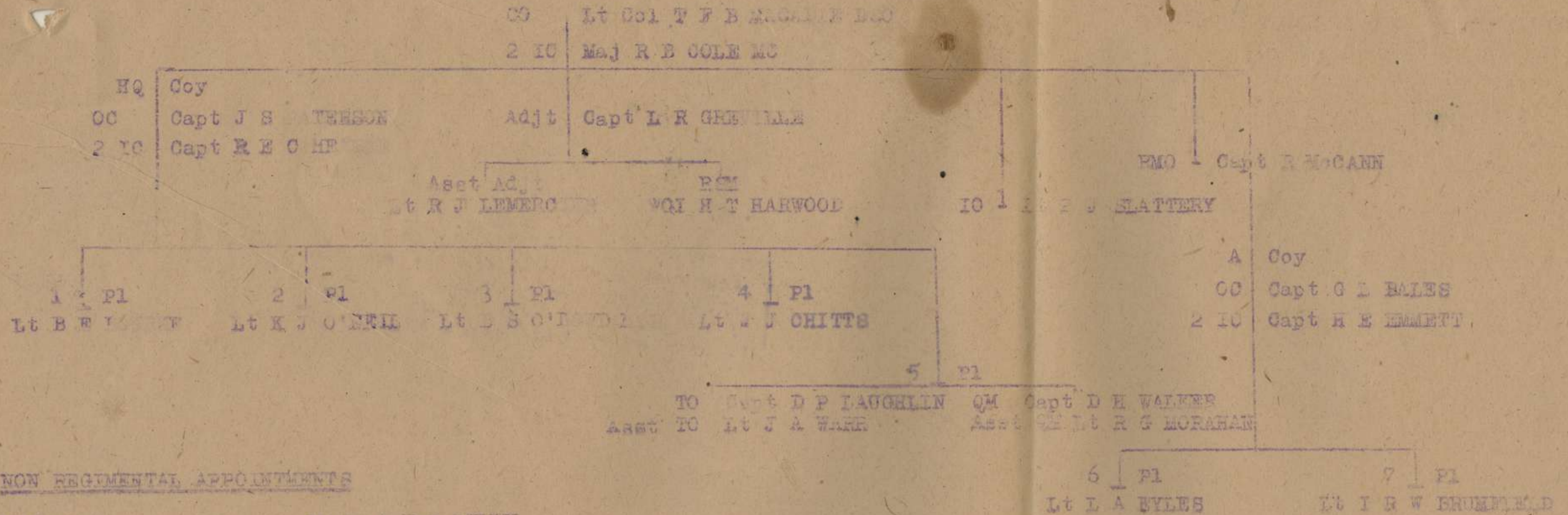

NOTICES

GIFT PARCELS FOR UK ADDRESSEES - DUTY FREE CONCESSION

1. Amendment has been to the conditions of the concession which were published in the notice appearing with MBIs dated 6th December 1946, and under which members of the AMF and of the British Army serving in AMF areas were permitted to send gift parcels duty free to their relatives and friends in the United Kingdom. The notice in question is therefore cancelled.

2. The following are the conditions now approved and are operative forthwith :-

(a) The undermentioned classes of gift parcels will be admitted without UK customs duty and/or purchase tax :-

(i) a gift parcel which contains foodstuffs only and does not weigh more than 22 lbs if posted in the BCOF area and does not weigh more than 11 lbs if posted in Australia or its territories.

(ii) a gift parcel containing other goods which does not exceed ten shillings in total value, provided that it does not include any tobacco, scent or liquor.

Note- The limit of one parcel per annum no longer applies.

(b) Tobacco, scent or liquor (wines, spirits, etc), even though the value does not exceed ten shillings, will be subject to duty at the current high rates.

(c) The concession in sub-para (a) above is conditional on the contents of each parcel being fully and honestly declared as a gift. The declaration should be made on Army Form W5128 for a parcel posted at a service post office or on the appropriate civil post office declaration form in other cases. Concession labels (Army Form W5192) are now obsolete and must not be used. Any remaining stocks should be destroyed.

(d) Personnel are warned that mis-declaration of the contents or value of a parcel and misuse of the concession, e.g., as a means of importing non-gifts or goods intended for re-sale, will render the parcel liable to confiscation by HM Customs and action may be taken against the offender.

207. RETURN OF FAMILIES TO AUSTRALIA

- (a) Approval for the return of members of dependant families to AUSTRALIA will only be given by HQ BCOF. Application will be submitted through normal channels in accordance with the form shown at Appx "A" attached.
- (b) When it is desired that a dependant be returned to AUSTRALIA for any reason other than the completion of the tour of duty in JAPAN by the head of the family, a full explanation must be given in justification. An application for a wife to return without the husband can only be considered on the application of both the husband and the wife, and on the certificate of an officer of field rank that he has interviewed the parties and is satisfied that the separation so caused is voluntary and acceptable and that no coercion had been used and that accommodation is available in AUST. This officer will also witness the signatures on the application.

- (c) (i) Normally, approval for dependants to return to AUSTRALIA without head of the family, will only be given for:-
- (a) Medical reasons properly certified.
 - (b) Compassionate reasons duly verified.
 - (c) After the completion of 24 months continuous residence in JAPAN.
- (ii) In cases (i)(a) and (b), a free return fare to JAPAN will not be approved and in (i)(c) it will only be approved if the head of the family is likely to serve in JAPAN for a further 12 months after the return of the dependant.
- (iii) Servicemen whose families return to AUSTRALIA under (i)(a) and (b) should apply for compassionate reposting or release if they desire to avoid separation from their families.
- (d) When approval is given for a serviceman and his family to return to AUSTRALIA the husband will, whenever possible, accompany his family. If this is not possible the family will precede or follow the husband, by the nearest available ship.
- (e) Accommodation of families, on arrival in AUSTRALIA, is the responsibility of the head of the family and not of the Commonwealth. Free accommodation will be arranged only at the port of disembarkation, pending the movement of the family to its home or other home nominated. Families will be granted free movement to:
- (i) The address from which they were originally moved to JAPAN
 - (ii) Any other address nominated, providing that the fare does not exceed the fare incurred under (i)
 - (iii) In the case of permanent forces, to the place where the serviceman is posted.
- (f) (f) Immediately prior to embarkation units will forward to this HQ a list of personnel to be embarked, giving the following particulars.
- (i) Name of ship and date of departure
 - (ii) No, Rank, Name and Unit of head of family
 - (iii) Whether or not accompanied by head of family.
 - (iv) Particulars of family (e.g. wife and number of children showing sex and ages)
 - (v) Destination in AUSTRALIA
 - (vi) If accommodation arranged and address.
 - (vii) Address for delivery of heavy baggage.
 - (viii) Reason for return.

208. VENEREAL DISEASE - CONTROL

1. BCOF servicemen and male civilians attached to or accompanying the Force are to attend a PAC for prophylactic treatment as soon as possible after having illicit sexual intercourse.

Arrangements are to be made at all PAC to record attendances confidentially.

2. A member who contracts Venereal Disease or who suspects that he is infected with Venereal Disease is to report sick forthwith to the Unit RAP. Treatment for VD is to be carried out only by BCOF Medical Units.

Self treatment, private treatment by BCOF, Japanese or other doctors or personnel is prohibited.

3. Disciplinary action is to be taken in all cases where it is evident that this order has not been obeyed. Medical Officers will carefully check all cases which come under their notice and will initiate disciplinary action where disobedience is apparent.

209. CONTROL OF BLACK MARKET ACTIVITIES

1. Members of the British Commonwealth Occupation Force and their dependants, and persons attached to, accompanying, or employed by the Force shall not, except as prescribed in para 2 of this Order, carry or cause to be carried any rations, foodstuffs, cigarettes, tobacco, liquor or other commodities originating in or obtained from any Canteen, service, organization or establishment of the British Commonwealth Occupation Force.

2. This Order does not prohibit:

- (a) The carriage of any goods specified in para 1 of this Order by personnel in the course of their duties.
- (b) The bona fide carriage of such goods by personnel from the place of purchase, or issue, directly to their living quarters, messes or barracks.
- (c) Personnel from carrying, within their Camp area, or living quarters, a reasonable quantity of foodstuffs, cigarettes and tobacco for their own bona fide use and consumption from time to time.
- (d) Personnel who are proceeding outside their Camp area, barracks, or living quarters on leave or duty, and are in possession of a leave or duty pass, as the case may be, from carrying a reasonable quantity of food, cigarettes and tobacco for their own bona fide use and consumption during the period of their authorized leave or duty. Personnel proceeding on leave or duty outside their Camp area, barracks or quarters for periods of less than 48 hours shall not carry in excess of 50 cigarettes, or 2 oz of tobacco.

3. Military and Service Police are authorized to stop and search personnel found committing or reasonably suspected of committing an offence against this Order, and the vehicles in which such personnel are travelling. In the case of Air Force personnel the provisions of K R and A C I para 827 must be observed. Military and Service Police will make surprise checks from time to time of personnel travelling on ferries, trains, and buses and at suitable places.

4. Military and Service Police are authorized to impound any articles carried by personnel in quantities in excess of those allowed by this Order. In doubtful case goods may be impounded pending the production of proof that such goods are intended for bona fide purposes. In all cases a receipt for the goods impound will be given.



 Shorts
 Boots AB
 Hose tops
 Garter tabs
 Puttees - rolled down
 Lanyards - right shoulder
 Tan browns - waist belt only.

OR - Hats khaki fur - sides turned up
 Shirts military khaki - sleeves rolled up
 Shorts
 Boots AB
 Hose tops
 Garter tabs
 Puttees rolled down.
 Lanyards left shoulder
 Belt WZ.

(b) By night

Officers - Cap
 Shirt military khaki or jacket safari
 Trousers KD
 Shoes or boots
 Lanyard
 Uniform - summer or winter may be worn.

OP - Hats khaki fur
 Shirts military khaki
 Trousers KD
 Boots AB (Shoes may be worn within camp limits only)
 Belts WZ (belts aust may be worn within camp limits only)
 Lanyard green.

In addition to the above, attention is directed to the following points: -

- (a) after 1800 hrs daily sleeves of safari jackets and shirts will be rolled down and trousers KD will be worn.
- (b) when jersey pullover is worn as an external garment officers will wear belts WE and NOT belts Sam Browne.
- (c) the orderly officer will wear Sam Browne and shoulder belt.
- (d) at all times when shorts are worn, garter tabs will be worn with hose tops.
- (e) NCOs' chevrons will be sewn on all outer garments - brassards will NOT be worn.
- (f) decorations and campaign ribbons will be worn on shirts and safari jackets.
- (g) personnel at present permitted to wear green working dress may continue to do so.
