1. Approval has been given for the issue of pay in lieu of war service leave, recreation leave accrued to 30th June 1947, and re-establishment leave to members who were serving on 30th June 1947, and who have since continued to serve, in accordance with the following :-

(i) War Service Leave:

Payment will be made at the rates of pay payable on 1st January 1947, or 30th June 1947, whichever were the higher.

(ii) Recreation Leave:

Payment will be made for all recreation leave frozen in accordance with para 33(c) of MBI 114/1947 at the rates of pay payable on 1st January 1947, or 30th June 1947, whichever were the higher.

(iii) Re-establishment Leave:

- (a) Members of the Regular Army on 30th June 1947, who were contributors to the Commonwealth Superannuation Fund at that date, will be paid at the rates of pay payable on 1st January 1947, or 30th June 1947, whichever were the higher.

- (b) Members transferring or transferred to the Regular Army after 30th June 1947, will be paid at the rates of pay payable on the day prior to the date of attestation in the Regular Army.
- (c) In all other cases than those specified in (a) and (b) above, pay in lieu of re-establishment leave will not be made until discharge and at the rates of pay then applicable.

2. Basis of calculating payments in respect of pay in lieu of leave :-

Payments to members:

- (a) Where payments to members are based on the special force rates of pay in operation up to 30th June 1947, pay in lieu of leave will be paid at the rates payable on 1st January 1947, or 30th June 1947, whichever were the higher and will comprise :-
 - (i) Pay for rank or trade grouping, including proficiency pay, less any allotment or allotments in force in respect of which dependant's allowance was being paid.
 - (ii) Deferred pay.
 - (iii) Responsibility allowance.
 - (iv) Subsistence at the rate of 3s. per day.
- (b) Where payments of re-establishment leave to members are based on rates under the new pay code, which operated from 1st July 1947, pay in lieu of leave will be paid at the rates of pay and allowances on the date of eligibility to payment and will comprise :-
 - (i) Pay for rank or grading, including, where eligible, good conduct pay, marriage allowance and separation allowance or provision allowance, less the whole of any allotment or allotments in force on which marriage allowance, separation or provision allowance or non-reduction allowance is contingent.
 - (ii) Non-reduction allowance.
 - (iii) Living-out allowance at the rate of 4s.6d. per day in the case of a member who is not in receipt of marriage allowance.

Payments to allottees:

- (c) (i) Where payments are based on the special force rates of pay in operation on 1st January 1947, or 30th June 1947, vide sub-para (a) above, payments will only be made to allottees who were in receipt of dependant's allowance on the relevant date at the rates of allotment and dependant's allowance then in force. All other allotments will be paid to the member.
- (ii) Where payments in respect of re-establishment leave are based on the new pay code rates operating from 1st July 1947, payment of allotments at the rates in force on the date of eligibility for payment will be made to allottees who, on such date, were receiving an allotment of such a nature as to qualify the member for marriage allowance or non-reduction allowance under MBI 114/1947. All such allotments will be paid to the member.
- (d) Should any case arise where a member considers that an allotment, which would normally be paid to his allottee under sub-para (c) above, should be paid to him or to any other person, he may apply in writing, setting out the full circumstances and the reasons for wishing the payment to be diverted from the allottee. His application will be attached to his Bank Authorization Form (WF 92) and the case will be reviewed by the prescribed Authority in the relevant District Accounts Office.

Overpayments:

- (e) Payment in lieu of war service leave and recreation leave to a member will be subject to the deduction of any amount standing to the debit of his pay account.
- (f) Such payments to allottees will similarly be subject to the deduction of any amounts overpaid to allottees.
- (g) Pay in lieu of re-establishment leave will not be subject to offset of debits unless the overpayment was occasioned by the fraud of the member.

3. Authority for payment:-

- (a) Payments will be made to member's bank accounts and, in order that payment may be made as soon as practicable, members entitled to receive payment will be required to complete a Bank Authorization Form (WF 92) in duplicate. Such forms will be witnessed by a commissioned officer.
- (b) Payments will not be made to bank accounts in Japan. Members of BCOF will, therefore, be requested to name banks in Australia to which they desire payment to be made. Should a member of BCOF wish all or part of the payment to be sent to him in Japan, he should arrange with his nominated bank for the amount required to be remitted to the credit of his pay book, through the
- /District

District Finance Officer.

4. Despatch of documents:-


(a) Commanding Officers will despatch Bank Authorization Forms (WF 92), in duplicate, direct to the District Finance Officer of the District of Enlistment. It will be ensured that the original and duplicate are securely fastened and care will be exercised to ensure that the forms do not become detached prior to despatch or during transit.

(b) Units located in BCOF will forward Bank Authorization Forms (WF 92) to the Chief Paymaster, BCOF, for onward transmission to the relative District Finance Officer.

5. Advice of payment:- When payment has been effected to bank accounts nominated by members, the details of such payments will be advised to them by DFOs at the address shown on the Bank Authorization Form.

6. Taxation:- The Treasurer has approved that, in the case of members of the forces who were serving on the 30th June 1947 and who continued to serve beyond that date, any income tax or social services contribution legally payable in respect of payments in lieu of recreation leave or re-establishment leave accrued up to that date is to be remitted.

Pay in lieu of war service leave is similarly exempt from taxation and no tax deductions will be made by DFOs from pay in lieu of leave.



295. HOSPITAL EVACUATIONS

Attention is drawn to 67 Aust Inf Bn A322 of 2 Jun 48 which is published hereunder :

1. The following instructions will be placed on the RAP notice board and before any man is evacuated to hospital the detail contained herein will be read to him.

2. "BEFORE BEING EVACUATED TO HOSPITAL"

Before being evacuated you will :-

- (a) return to your quarters and pack your gear.
- (b) hand all gear NOT required at hospital into your company Q Store.
- (c) your gear will be checked, item by item by the QMS or storeman and a complete inventory will be made out and you will receive a copy as a receipt.
- (d) you will report back to the RAP within one hour of receiving these instructions.

3. ON RETURN FROM HOSPITAL

On return from hospital you will :-

- (a) produce the inventory and receive your gear in return.

(b) sign the company's copy as to the correct receipt of articles."

4. If a man is incapable due to the nature of his illness or injury to carry out the above instructions the PFC or his representative will contact the soldier's Company Commander who will ensure that the soldier's gear is packed in his footlocker and other containers, locked and immediately placed under lock and key.
5. The gear will NOT be checked if the soldier is not present, but all precautions will be taken to ensure that everything is carefully locked away.
6. When the gear is checked in the soldier's presence the CQMS will obtain the soldier's signature on the file copy of the inventory."

296. PNR TOOLS

Under no circumstances will tools be issued to Japanese reporting to pnr store requesting them. It is an offence to send Japanese employees to the store with any such request..

297. HYGIENE

- (b) Until such practices cease customs officials will make a detailed examination of every article.
- (c) Articles found to contain dutiable contents and to be incorrectly described on cover will be confiscated.

309. CONTROL OF BLACK MARKET ACTIVITIES

1. Members of the British Commonwealth Occupation Force and their dependants, and persons attached to, accompanying, or employed by the Force shall not, except as prescribed in para 2 of this Order, carry or cause to be carried any rations, foodstuffs, cigarettes, tobacco, liquor or other commodities originating in or obtained from any Canteen, service, organization or establishment of the British Commonwealth Occupation Force.
2. This Order does not prohibit :
 - (a) The carriage of any goods specified in para 1 of this Order by personnel in the course of their duties.

- (b) The bona fide carriage of such goods by personnel from the place of purchase, or issue, directly to their living quarters, messes or barracks.
 - (c) Personnel from carrying, within their Camp area, or living quarters, a reasonable quantity of foodstuffs, cigarettes and tobacco for their own bona fide use and consumption from time to time.
 - (d) Personnel who are proceeding outside their Camp area; barracks, or living quarters on leave or duty; and are in possession of a leave or duty pass, as the case may be, from carrying a reasonable quantity of food, cigarettes and tobacco for their own bona fide use and consumption during the period of their authorized leave or duty. Personnel proceeding on leave or duty outside their Camp area, barracks or quarters for period of less than 48 hours shall not carry in excess of 50 cigarettes, or 2 oz of tobacco.
3. Military and Service Police are authorised to stop and search personnel found committing or reasonably suspected of committing an offence against this Order, and the vehicles in which such personnel are travelling. In the case of Air Force personnel the provisions of K R and A C I para 827 must be observed. Military and Service Police will make surprise checks from time to time of personnel travelling on ferries, trains, and buses and at suitable places.
4. Military and Service Police are authorised to impound any articles carried by personnel in quantities in excess of those allowed by this Order. In doubtful case goods may be impounded pending the production of proof that such goods are intended for bona fide purposes. In all cases a receipt for the goods impounded will be given.

310. SPECIAL LEAVE FOR RECOVERED PRISONERS OF WAR

1. The following extract is quoted from AHQ MELBOURNE memo 12812 of 13 May 48 :-
- "(a) With reference to part V of GRO 343/45, it is advised that approval is given, in the case of ex-prisoners of war who continued to serve in the AMF after less than 60 days' leave, for payment in lieu thereof for the period whereby the leave taken fell short of 60 days. Such payment to be granted irrespective of whether the date of disembarkation was before or after 9 Nov 44.
 - (b) The provisions of GRO 343/45 will still be observed in respect of deductions for leave in the United Kingdom.
 - (c) In the case of members still serving or discharged on or after 1 Jul 47 any balance of special leave

for recovered prisoners of war will be dealt with in the same manner as recreation leave accrued to 30 Jun 47 in accordance with MBI 114/47 para 34, or MBI 59/48 para 1 (ii), whichever is appropriate.

(d) No provision is made for the granting of pay in lieu of the special leave for prisoners of war in the case of those who returned to AUSTRALIA prior to 9 Nov 44 and who were discharged without resuming duty."

2. Companies will submit to this HQ by 3 Jul 48 a nominal roll showing personnel claiming special leave as a result of this instruction.



PAYMENT FOR MEALS ON TRAINS

GENERAL

1. With effect from 21 June 48, all persons travelling by rail under BCOF Movement Orders who are not entitled to free meals at BCOF expense (i.e. all persons other than those specified at paragraph 2 below), will be required to pay in advance for their meals on trains by means of BCOF rail Travel Coupons.

PERSONS ENTITLED TO FREE MEALS

2. The only categories of persons who are entitled to free meals on trains at BCOF's expense are as follows :-
 - (a) BCOF service personnel travelling on duty.
 - (b) BCOF service personnel travelling on leave except members who are in receipt of Provision or Ration Allowance.
 - (c) Civilians serving with BCOF who are normally entitled to free rations and who are travelling on duty or on leave.
 - (d) Non-BCOF civilians visiting JAPAN at special request of a national service department for temporary work on BCOF's behalf, and for whom HQ BCOF has issued a specific direction that they are entitled to free rations during their stay in JAPAN.

MOVEMENT ORDERS

3.
 - (a) Officers issuing Movement Orders in respect of persons who are not included in the categories in paragraph 2 above will clearly endorse it "MEALS ON PREPAYMENT" irrespective of whether the traveller intends having meals on the train or not. The ages of any children travelling will also be endorsed.
 - (b) Officers issuing Movement Orders should note that it does not automatically follow, if a Movement Order is marked "TDN" and no charge is therefore made for rail travel, that the traveller is also entitled to free meals on the train. Certain persons (e.g. civilians serving with BCOF who are not entitled to free rations at BCOF's expense; officials of British Commonwealth Missions travelling on duty, etc) may be entitled to free rail travel on duty but not to free meals at BCOF's expense.

PAYMENT AND CHARGES FOR MEALS

4. (a) Allied & Dixie Ltd: Before personnel sign the meal sheet the dining car steward will examine the Movement Order and if it is endorsed "MEALS ON PREPAYMENT", will collect rail coupons in payment at the following rates :-
- (i) Adults - 2 coupons per meal
 - (ii) Children under 12 yrs - 1 coupon per meal.
- (b) BCOF Leave Trains
- (i) Married BCOF Service Personnel in receipt of Provision Allowance.
(As detailed in 34 Aust Inf Bde AG3390 of 18 Jun 48)
 - (ii) Dependants and other persons not entitled to free rations
(As detailed in 34 Aust Inf Bde AG3389 of 18 Jun 48)
- (c) VIP Coaches. Payment will be made to the RTO before entraining at the rate of 1 coupon per meal for all adults and children 5 years of age and over. The RTO will make out MC Form P showing the number of coupons collected for meals. These will be shown separately to the coupons collected for rail fares.
- (d) BCOF Special Trains. Special trains or coaches attached to Japanese trains provided for embarkations or sporting functions. HQ Brit Com MC Gp will include in the Movement Control Order the number of meals that will be provided. Units issuing the movement order will be responsible for stamping the movement orders and warning people not entitled to free meals the number of coupons that will be required to be paid to the RTO before entraining.

MEAL SERVICE - ALLIED and DIXIE LTD

5. Meals will be served between the following times to passengers entitled to meals, entraining at any station before the one named on the Allied & Dixie Ltd trains. These are intended as a guide to travellers and may be changed by the dining car steward.

2. Personnel who desire to make application should contact the unit ARA Recruiting Officer (Lt SLATTERY).
3. Conditions for enlistment are as follows: -
 - (a) Age limits 18 and 54 years.
 - (b) British nationality.
 - (c) Satisfactory service record.
 - (d) Parental consent if minor.
4. Members of the ARASR will be enlisted for a period of 3 years, with the option of re-engaging for a further 6 years at the completion of that period. The compulsory age for discharge is 57 years.
5. The medical classification necessary for acceptance into the ARASR is any that will not necessitate discharge from the AMF.
6. Benefits available to members of the ARASR are: -
 - (a) Leave and pay as for ARA.
 - (b) Rehabilitation leave granted after 3 year engagement (30 days).
 - (c) Gratuity of 360 paid on:
 - (i) completion of 3 year engagement.
 - (ii) death of member during three year engagement.
 - (iii) discharge due to total invalidity of the member during 3 year engagement.
 - (iv) the above stated invalidity must NOT be due to misconduct.
7. Applicants are reminded that they are NOT eligible to contribute to the Defence Forces Retiring Scheme, but if they re-engage for 6 years in the ARA, service in the ARASR will count towards the qualifying period for the pension.

1. A Photographic History of 67 Aust Inf Bn is being compiled by the Intelligence Section of the Unit.
2. In view of the fact that this Battalion is one of the first regular Battalions of the Australian Army, and is as yet in its infancy, a detailed photographic record of personalities, locations and outstanding events to this stage, will be of untold value in the years to come.
3. The task, however, presents a certain number of difficulties. These difficulties are brought about, mainly by the fact, that an official photographer was not appointed until sometime after the Battalion arrived in JAPAN. We have, therefore, no source from which we can obtain photos of the formation of coys in the Islands, the concentration of the Unit on MOROTAI, and the "early days" after the arrival of the Force in JAPAN.
4. With this in view, members of the Battalion who hold photos, with the corresponding negatives, which deal with any phase of Unit life, and especially that prior to Sep 46, should contact the Unit Intelligence Officer as soon as possible, so that copies may be taken from the negatives, and the record completed in the very near future.
5. Serving members may also know of ex-unit members who have topical photographs. In this event, it would be appreciated if their names were notified to the Intelligence Officer, so that they can be contacted about this matter.
6. All members are urged to take a personal interest in the compilation of this Photographic Record.
7. Company Commanders will give this matter wide publicity.

RECOVERY OF PROVISION ON RATION ALLOWANCE

1. Married personnel, who are in receipt of Provision Allowance, and holidaying with their dependants at BCOF Leave Hostels, will not be entitled to this allowance during any periods they are rationed and quartered at such hostels, or for any periods during which the individual is travelling to and from such hostels and is provided with meals on the journey. An amount of two shillings and five pence (2/5) BAFSV per day, covering the period of leave and the period of travel to and from the hostel, will be recovered from each member prior to departure from the hostel.
2. When such married personnel are embarked in ships with their dependants for return to AUSTRALIA they normally lose their entitlement to the allowance. On the receipt to notice of embarkation the CPM will advise the CFO of the date of embarkation in order that a Debit note may be raised or the paybook adjusted when the member assumes his new appointment.
3. These persons when in hospital or absent from their homes on duty are entitled to Separation Allowance in lieu of Provision Allowance and no adjustment is necessary.

CHARGES FOR MEALS ON BCOF LEAVE TRAINS

4. The following charges will be paid for each main meal served to dependants and/or non - BCOF personnel while travelling on BCOF leave trains to and from the hostel :-
 - (a) Adults and children over 5 1s 3d (BAFSV)
per main meal
 - (b) Children under 5 years Nil
 - (c) These charges for meals on BCOF leave trains will be recovered by the hostel prior to the dependants and for individuals departure.

SUMMARY OF RECENT AUST PRESS REPORTS

Prepared by Public Relations HQ BCOF 6 Jun 48

The Australian Army Minister (Mr CHAMBERS) has recently released two reports which great credit upon Australian members of BCOF in JAPAN.

Three Chaplains General of the Australian Military Forces said in their report that there was "widespread resentment at the irresponsible accusations so widely publicised in AUSTRALIA, which we discovered to have been grossly unjust and unfair".

The Chaplains General said also that the Character and conduct of the men serving in BCOF were equal to the tradition of the AIF at its best and that in BCOF AUSTRALIA had a force of which it might justly be proud.

An independent report, by Maj-Gen C E M LLOYD and Mr MASSEY STANLEY, stated the following conclusion :-

Living Conditions :- Living standards in barracks and in married quarters are uniformly high, in many cases luxurious, but perhaps expensive for married other ranks. Amenities and services are on a scale unprecedented in the British Services.

Housing :- No families of troops serving abroad are better housed. The decision to charge rent from the date of notification instead of the date of occupancy has removed all substance from complaints that houses were occupied on the understanding that no rent would be charged.

Discipline and Morale :- Morale is high and discipline good.

Venereal Disease :- The high incidence of VD in the civil population and their moral deterioration as the result of post-war economic and social conditions has meant a high VD rate in the Allied Occupation Force in JAPAN. BCOF incidence was very high in 1946 but has been materially reduced. Incidence is, however, still far too high. The Commander-in-Chief BCOF (Lt-Gen H C H ROBERTSON) has vigorously implemented all control measures known to current British practice, but the rate still persists.

Black Marketing :- Allegations of widespread black marketing by the troops are without foundation. It is very easy to unearth unsavoury individual cases in any military force serving abroad, particularly in Occupation Forces. The BCOF record is conspicuously clean, having regard to other occupation forces in the world today".

These reports received the fullest and widest publicity in the press throughout AUSTRALIA. They appeared under heading such as "Black Marketing claim 'unfounded'", "Reports exonerate JAPAN troops"; "BCOF troops vindicated", "Dis-service to BCOF troops", "Record is clean, report says".

Under the heading 'The good name of name of our forces in JAPAN' the MELBOURNE Age said in a leading article :-

"Exoneration of the Australian Troops in JAPAN from a number of unsavoury charges will be received with gratification, through not with surprise, by the people of Australia generally..... Most of the allegations made against them, according to the frank report by the Committee of Investigation, proved to be unwarranted. Those that had some foundation of fact were found to have been grossly exaggerated....."

The MELBOURNE Herald said in a leading article :-

"It is now clear that the charges of immorality which were made against Australian members of the BCOT in JAPAN have dwindled under independent investigation..... Unfortunately the publicity given to the charges derived from the fact that they received some backing from spokesmen in responsible positions. The Legion of Ex-service-men considered that there was enough substance in the allegations to justify such an inquiry and publicly identified itself with the matter. The lesson is that such bodies should exercise great caution on taking up charges of this kind....."
