372. DEFENCE FORCES RETIREMENT BENEFITS

Published hereunder is AMF Component Instruction 80 of 30 Jul 48.

1. As a result of enquiries received on certain aspects of the above, the following rulings have been received from Army Headquarters MELBOURNE.
2. Although State superannuation contributors (under MB 23693 of 15 Jul 47 sub para 2(o) are permitted to transfer contributions to the Commonwealth Superannuation Fund they are NOT eligible to transfer State superannuation contributions to the Defence Forces Retirement Benefits Fund.
3. Only those contributors under the Superannuation Act who are employees of the Departments of Navy, Army or Air are eligible to have the reserve value of contributions to the Commonwealth Superannuation Fund transferred to the Defence Forces Retirement Benefits Fund.

Employees of other Commonwealth departments who were contributors under the Superannuation Act are NOT so eligible.

373. FLYPROOFING MESSSES AND KITCHENS

1. The provision of flyproof screens, windows and doors for messes and kitchens in the unit, is proving partly ineffective because:-
 - (a) Many frames and screens are ill fitting or damaged.
 - (b) Screens are removed and doors and windows so screened are left open,
2. It is strictly forbidden to remove or have removed flyscreening except for repair cleaning of windows etc, and then for as short a period as possible, Flyproof doors will be kept closed as much as possible.

- Record of Service Books (AAB 83) will be checked on or about 20th of every second month, i.e., 20 Feb, Apr, Jun, Aug, Oct and 15 Dec and a list prepared of all who will require inoculations by the end of the succeeding month, i.e., end of Mar, May, Jul, Sep, Nov and Jan. In the case of Dec, arrangements should commence about 15th so that inoculations may be completed before Christmas.
- Units whether or NOT carrying out their own inoculations will forward a list showing members requiring each separate inoculation or vaccination before 25 of each month or before 20 Dec to the Officer in medical charge who will place the necessary requisitions with 20 Aust Pd Amb, between 20 and 25 of every

second month, or, in the case of Dec, 15-20.

3. Medical Officers have been instructed to carry out inoculations during the last week of Feb, Apr, Jun, Aug, Oct and between 20 and 25 Dec. Personnel will be paraded to them at these dates, the exact time being arranged by each unit with the medical officer concerned.
4. No other routine inoculations or vaccinations whatever will be given except as in para 3 whether for drafts, reinforcements or otherwise unless specifically authorised by SMO or by direction of DDMS BCOF.
5. The unit clerical staff will enter up dates, types of inoculations and doses of personnel requiring them in accordance with para 1 and the following schedule :-

(a) Refresher (booster) doses

Smallpox vaccinations. A certified successful vaccination within 12 months or three successive certified negatives. In order to assess the result, the site of vaccination will be inspected by a medical officer on the second, fourth and sixth days following revaccination. A member showing a negative result will be re-vaccinated at least twice to ascertain whether a successful result can be obtained. The type of reaction (negative, immediate, accelerated or classical) to be entered and signed by MO. An entry without a signed result will be disregarded.

TT - 1 cc at end of first year only

Typhus - - 1 cc annually

Cholera - - 1 cc no routine dose; only when ordered by DDMS

(b) Initial Courses (Recruits are mainly concerned)

381. MT- USE OF GEARS AS BRAKES

1. Attention is drawn to British Commonwealth Occupation Force Routine Order No 112/48.

The practice of using gears to decelerate, whilst travelling at high speeds is too prevalent.

This produces excessive engine speeds, undue strain on transmissions, and is a contributing factor to rapid tyre wear.

Drivers, when reducing speed, will do so gradually, applying brakes if necessary before engaging a lower gear.

382. NON REDUCTION ALLOWANCE - PERSONNEL PROCEEDING ON LEAVE

1. The question has been raised as to whether non-reduction allowance should be deducted from the amount of living out allowance payable to a member not in receipt of marriage allowance under the terms of sub-para 16 (b) (ii) of MBI 114/47, when such member proceeds on leave.

2. In this connection it is advised that deduction of non-reduction allowance should be made in all such cases, with retrospective effect from 1st July 1947.

3. It is desired that when adapted forms WF241 are received in future indicating that credits have been entered in paybooks at the full rate of living out allowance without any deduction being made for non-reduction allowance, a debit note and debit advice be prepared for the adjustment to be effected with retrospective effect where applicable, and the unit advised of the correct interpretation of MRI 114/47 for future guidance.

388. BOOT REPAIR

1. AHQ MELBOURNE advise that our recommendations for a reduction in charges for boot and shoe repairs were NOT approved by the Department of the Treasury.
2. An investigation into the existing prices for repairs in VICTORIA showed that the existing approved prices for civilian repairs are substantially higher than army charges and are as follows:-

3. It has been decided by Army Headquarters, following an investigation into costs to increase the rates in MBI 153/47 in respect of repairs for male personnel. This increase will notwithstanding, apply to BCOF.
4. The effect of this decision is, therefore, that although the requested reduction in charges is NOT approved, BCOF will benefit from the decision that the higher rates, which it is now proposed to introduce, will NOT be applied to BCOF.

389. VENEREAL DISEASE - CONTROL

1. BCOF servicemen and male civilians attached to or accompanying the Force are to attend a PAC for prophylactic treatment as soon as possible after having illicit sexual intercourse.

Arrangements are to be made at all PAC to record attendances confidentially.

2. A member who contracts Venereal Disease or who suspects that he is infected with Venereal Disease is to report sick forthwith to the Unit RAP. Treatment for VD is to be carried out only by BCOF Medical Units.

Self treatment, private treatment by BCOF, Japanese or other doctors or personnel is prohibited.

3. Disciplinary action is to be taken in all cases where it is evident that this order has not been obeyed. Medical Officers will carefully check all cases which come under their notice and will initiate disciplinary action where disobedience is apparent.

4. This order is to be adapted to local conditions and promulgated to all members periodically.

390. RESTRICTIONS AFTER VD TREATMENT

- (a) Any soldier who has contracted VD and rejoined his unit or discharge from treatment will NOT be granted leave of any description for a period of 15 days from date of discharge from hospital. He will be subjected to frequent medical examinations during this period.
- (b) No member who has contracted VD will be granted leave to a BCOF holiday hostel within a period of 180 days after discharge from treatment.
- (c) No member who has contracted VD will consume any alcohol for a period of 15 days from the date of discharge from hospital.

393. DISCIPLINE MT DRIVERS

 - (d) locate seat of fire and endeavour to put it out with eqpt immediately available
 - (e) keep all doors and windows shut
 - (f) remove if necessary all valuables, records monies etc
2. The Battalion fire Brigade will man the fire engine and endeavour to isolate and extinguish the fire.

NOTE No person will interfere with the actions of the fire brigade members unless assistance is requested by the fire marshal or duty offr.

3. The Bn Orderly Offr, on the event of fire will:

- (a) ring fire stas as follows:-

- (b) inform the unit fire marshal and the Adjt
- (c) ensure the safety of
 - (i) Regt Colour (CO's office)
 - (ii) Gloucester Cap

 - (iv) Orderly Room records and where time permits all public and unit property.
- (f) ensure your tele remains manned
- (g) m v to scene of fire with quarter gd (if deemed necessary) and in the absence of the unit fire marshal (Capt EMMETT) will take control of fire fighting activities.

GENERAL

4. All ranks are warned that it is in their own interest to ensure that the infm contained herein is fully understood. Fires in Japan are prevalent and may cause loss of life and loss of personal kit.

PRECAUTIONS

5. Fires will NOT be lit except in prepared places except where authorised by the Bn 2 IC to destroy rubbish vegetation. Open fires will NOT be left unattended.
6. All inflammable liquids, (petrol etc) will be stored in a separate enclosure. Smoking will NOT be permitted within 30 yards of any such building.
7. All lights radiators and irons will be switched off prior to personnel leaving building.
8. Matches and cigarette butts will be extinguished and placed in the receptacles provided.
9. Electric wiring and fuses will be examined weekly by the Sig Offr to ensure that they are in good order.
10. Smoking in bed and under mosquito nets is forbidden.

FIRE FIGHTING APPLIANCES

SWIMMING AT UNAUTHORIZED BEACHES

1. At 1430 hours / 1 August 1948, a Japanese national was killed while swimming in the Inland Sea. Apparently he was attacked by a shark although the accident was not observed. The doctor who attended the individual bases his belief on the teeth marks and the severe bite on the left thigh which caused death by bleeding. The man was swimming in the Inland Sea of JAPAN about 200 yards off shore between NAGAHANA and KOTSUBO, near HIRO, KURE, HIROSHIMA Prefecture.

All personnel are warned against swimming at other than authorized bathing beaches.

SUMMER REST CAMP

2. In order to parallel the Brigade Ski Chalet at DOGOYAMA used in winter months it had been hoped to open SHIMOTSUI near OKAYAMA as a rest centre during this summer.

The plan has had to be abandoned as sea transport, the only possible method of moving personnel and supplies, cannot operate in that part of the Inland Sea owing to danger from minefields.

An alternative has now been arranged. 34 Bde has been allotted 25 vacancies each week for ORs at MINO POINT and these are being distributed to units. The object is to give men a 3-day break of swimming and boating during the heat of the summer.

DISTINGUISHED VISITORS

3. Before departing for AUSTRALIA, Air Marshal G. JONES CB, CBE, DFC, Chief of the Aust Air Staff, told the C-in-C that he was more impressed with 34 Aust Inf Bde than with any other part of his visit.

The smartness of his Guard of Honour provided by the Bde was exceptional and he had had opportunities of seeing members of the Brigade both on and off duty in TOKYO. He was obviously impressed also with the smart compliments paid by individuals and groups throughout the area as his car passed. These points, small in themselves, give a very clear indication to visitors of the high standard being maintained.

All members of the Parliamentary Delegation expressed to Bde Comd their pleasure and appreciation at being with 34 Bde on 9 and part 10 Aug, and with all they saw. Five of the seven members are ex-servicemen themselves and therefore particularly well qualified to judge. The Delegation were unanimous in their praise of the high morale and fine quality of our troops and our work.

TALENT QUEST SCENERY

4. As a consequence of the varied and very professional stage settings for the Talent Quest at the EMPIRE Theatre, one of the most amazing rumours yet encountered is in circulation.

The rumourmongers regret that so much valuable air freight-space was occupied by our Bde Amenities Service in wantonly and extravagantly having stage scenery sent by air to JAPAN for such little use.

This fantastic story is, of course, quite untrue. It is mentioned here firstly to kill the rumour and encourage people to use their commonsense and question the authenticity of similar stories without spreading them; secondly, to give a well deserved pat on the back to Amenities whose initiative, good taste and resourcefulness resulted in a number of excellent stage scenes devised for our enjoyment mainly out of old packing cases, newspaper and skilful painting.

There is nothing we can't do if we get down to it!

FRESH VEGETABLES

Owing to continued bad seasons in AUSTRALIA, the supply target for issue of quick-freeze vegetables on six days per week has had to be reduced to four days per week. It is anticipated that this scale will be maintained.

Subject : CLIMBING MOUNT FUJI

AN ARTICLE BY CAPT R H KENIHAN - RMO 3 Bn Aust Regt

Almost every visitor to JAPAN has, at the back of his mind, an ambition to climb Mount FUJI, or, as the Japanese affectionately call it, FUJISAN. For that reason, I was easily persuaded to accompany two officers from BCOF Signals Regiment, who had made a special trip to TOKYO from KURE in order to attempt the climb.

We set out from EBISU Camp on Friday 20th of August armed with the minimum of luggage, and a plentiful supply of chocolate for use during the climb.

At SHINJUKU we boarded a train which took us to OTSUKI, and from there we caught another train to FUJIYOSHIDA, a little village almost at the foot of the mountain. The moment we stepped off the train we were surrounded by a mob of Japanese children, between the ages of 6 and 12, all yelling excitedly, and all anxious to act as our guides during the journey. Picking at random, we chose our guide; purchased our "FUJI" sticks (wooden staves 5 feet long, for which support we were to be very thankful later, and looked around for the bus, in which we hoped to travel the 6 miles to the first station at the foot of the mountain.

After waiting an hour, hope for a bus was abandoned, and we began the first leg of our hike, the guides carrying our small packs and walking easily in front. It was not until midnight that we reached station 1 (our train had left SHINJUKU at 1630 hrs) and the actual ascent had not yet commenced. After a short breather and some chocolate, the long climb began.

By 0230 hrs we had reached Station 5 and wiser councils prevailed, so it was decided to spend the remainder of the night at that Station, and push on again later in the morning. The ascent up to that point had been gradual, and the rocky path wound through quite thick vegetation. At each station, Japanese were waiting to burn a stamp onto our sticks, and also to provide us with green tea, for a small fee. Even green tea tasted good to us after our exertions. We spent the night between soft thick rugs, had a frugal breakfast of chocolate and green tea, and commenced climbing again at 0800 hours. All signs of vegetation ceased after the 6th Station, and we climbed over volcanic ash and stone, surrounded by thick misty clouds which reduced the visibility considerably. At the 7th Station, (9000) feet we emerged from the clouds into brilliant sunshine. We could then see the top of FUJIYAMA an immense distance away - or so it seemed to us. The sides of the mountain were bare of vegetation with the little Japanese houses situated at the various Stations standing out prominently. To our right, stretching down from the top of the mountain, was an immense scree composed of loose volcanic matter, and although we did not realize it at the time, travelling, or rather sliding, down that scree was the quickest way to the bottom.

After a rest at Station 7 - More green tea - we pushed on, depending more and more on our "FUJI" sticks as the slope became steeper. Our young guides, even though carrying out packs, seemed to find the climb easy, and were continually having to wait until we caught up. The clouds below us gradually thinned out, and from time to time we stopped to examine the wonderful view - lakes, small villages and forests seen between masses of fleecy white clouds.

At 1500 hours - after 9½ hours actual climbing time - we reached the top, had our sticks stamped with the most important (to us) stamp, and inspected the crater. It is just over 700 feet deep with smooth rock sides and a saucer like base. A path winds round the sides and leads to the bottom, but we did not venture down. The top of the mountain itself is actually a plateau, about one sixth of a mile wide, with the crater occupying the middle half of the area.

The climb seemed almost worth while as we looked down the steep sides of the Mountain, and away into the distance. Small patches of soft cloud moved slowly across the sky, and and far below we could see lakes shimmering in the sun, miniature villages, wide areas covered by trees and an almost regular pattern formed by rows of inevitable "paddy-fields". We could see most of the route we had followed, and if we had known it was to be so far, I doubt whether we would have attempted the climb at all. But we were there and were glad. Then a drink of cool water, some photographs and we commenced the descent.

It was relatively easy once we managed to reach the scree which I mentioned before, and by 1900 hours we had scrambled to the bottom. After walking about 2 miles towards FUJI-YOSHIDA, we thankfully accepted a lift from an American, who was driving a rather late modelled car, and were carried to within 20 miles of EBISU. It was great to sit down in comfort once more after spending the previous 12 hours walking continuously.

A short train trip to SHINJUKU, followed by a jeep ride to EBISU Camp completed our journey. We returned at 0130 hours on Sunday 22nd of August, too tired and too thirsty to feel pleased with our success, but with the realization that we had accomplished our aim, and would never have to think of climbing FUJIYAMA again.

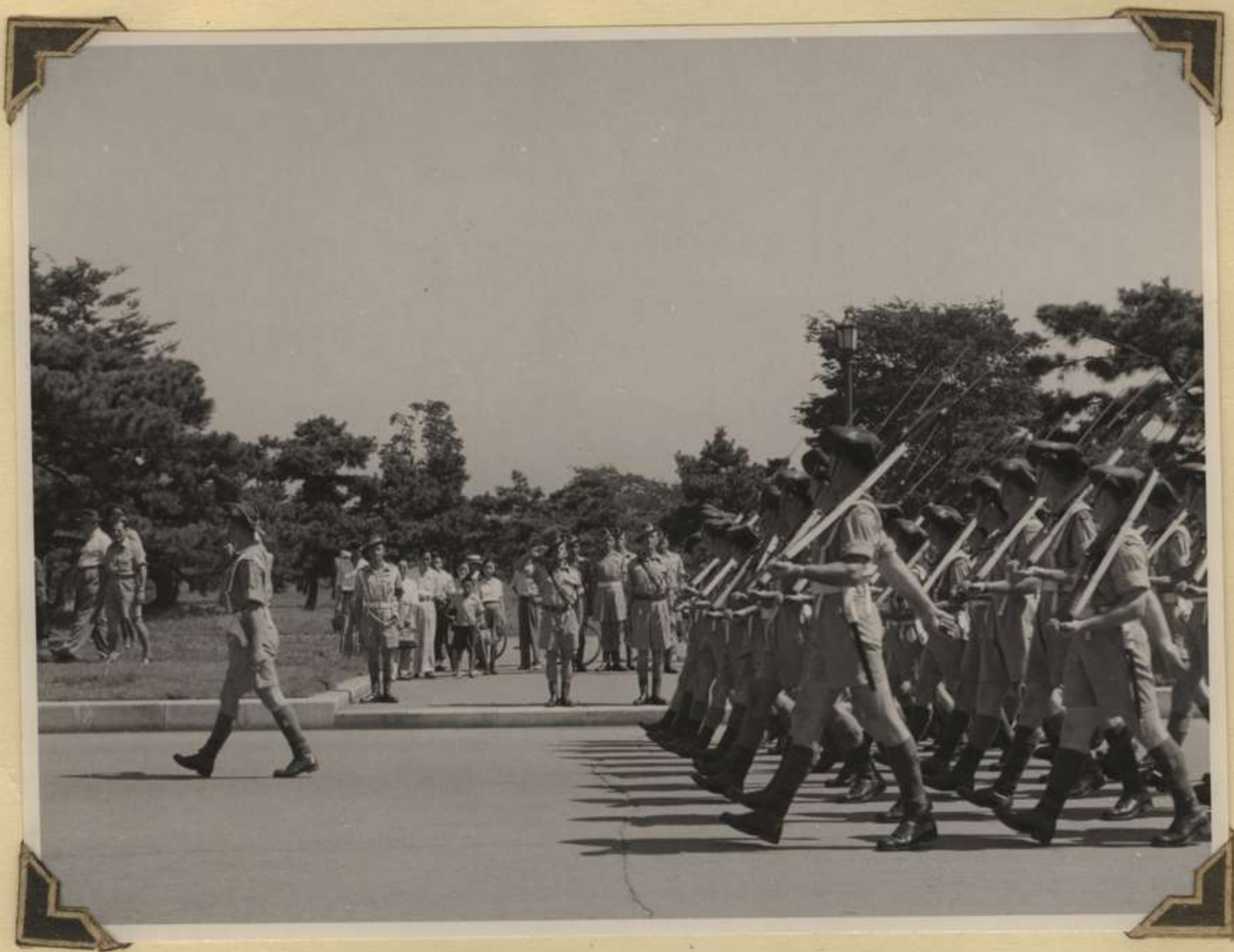
