Capt FAULKNER stated high officials all hoped Bn would be home for Christmas.



REPORT ON PW COMPOUND, CAPE LOBANG AREA.

2/13 Aust Inf Bn  
24 JUL 45.

LOCATION: LOAK BAY SE, 1:25000, ref 398812.

NARRATIVE:

The above compound was located on 17 JUL 45. The area was searched and a considerable quantity of personal eqpt and many small private oddments found. Burnt letters found in the ashes provided a number of identifications of PW and numerous addresses of relatives and friends of PW.

A further search of the area was made on 18 JUL and an inventory taken of all personal items and eqpt found.

On 20 JUL a more extensive search was made, the ashes and earthen floor of compound being thoroughly investigated. Resulting from this search further badges and portion of letters were found. A search of the general area in the vicinity of the compound revealed what appeared to be a large shallow grave, in which was found remains of at least one body.

On 22 JUL, a party investigated this grave and found three (3) bodies. Bodies could not be identified as EUROPEANS or otherwise. They had probably been buried for a period of two (2) months.

DETAILED REPORT.

Description of Compound:

The compound appears to have consisted of a building of native material approx 30 ft by 60 ft with a barbed wire fence approx 7 ft high. Outside the wire and some 5 yds distant is a native built shed without a floor and which was probably used by the guards on duty. A further 50 yds distant is another similar building, which appears to have been used for sleeping quarters for the guards. From the fact that many of the posts of the wire compound have been completely burnt out it would appear that the compound was deliberately soaked in petrol before being lit. The area was out of bounds to all natives and it cannot therefore be established when the cage was occupied or when it was burnt down.

GRAVES.

The graves were located about 30 yds on NORTH side of compound. There were two (2) graves adjoining one another in an area cleared of top soil approx 6 ft by 6 ft. One grave was six (6) ft long by two (2) ft wide with one body buried in it. The other grave was six (6) ft long, three (3) ft wide and contained two (2) bodies. A narrow ledge of soil one (1) ft wide separated the graves.

The bodies were partly clothed in army clothing. No identity disc or any items of identification were found in graves.

The body in the single grave was approx six (6) ft tall. The hair was hard to identify, but it definitely was NOT black. Full top denture found with body. Only item of clothing one pair of army socks.

The bodies in the other grave were approx five (5) ft eight (8) inches tall, one skull having one gold plated tooth. Only items of clothing, two (2) army sweaters.

From the size of the grave it seems most unlikely that <sup>all</sup> the PWs have been buried here. This would suggest that only PW who were sick or otherwise unfit to carry loads were killed here and that the fit have been taken down the RIAM RD. The finding of pack containing effects of Pte BRITTON on RESIDENCY RIDGE indicates the track along the ridge being the route taken to RIAM RD.

120. VENEREAL DISEASES

- (a) On return to units from hospital of personnel who have been suffering from VD, action will be taken by units to confine all such pers to unit lines for a period of four weeks. 118. USE OF EXPLOSIVES IN WATERS OF BRITISH BORNEO

1. Attention is drawn to 9 Aust Div Routine Order 178 of 20 Jun 45 which reads as follows:-

" Personnel at all times will take such action as is possible, in accordance with operational necessities, to conserve sources of native food supplies and to prevent destruction of native property. The native population has suffered considerably under Japanese rule. Little food was provided for them and in many cases their gardens and paddyfields have been destroyed and their stock confiscated and killed. In order that the natives may become self-supporting in the shortest possible time when practicable they are being returned to their villages. Where this is not practicable they are to be given employment as labourers from compounds under arrangements BECAU. Owing to the shortage of food and to conserve the remaining livestock in this area neither food nor livestock will be purchased from natives. GOC 9 Aust Div feels sure that he will have the full co-operation of all ranks in this matter which will materially assist in the rehabilitation of the native population in British North Borneo".

2. One of the principal sources of food for natives in British Borneo in the coastal area is fish, and in many localities fishing is the main industry.
3. The use of explosives of any kind for the purpose of obtaining fish has serious effects, often of a permanent nature, owing to the destruction of large numbers of small fish and the fact that normal feeding and breeding grounds are abandoned.



4. All ranks will appreciate the serious effects that will result as far as the native population is concerned if the use of explosives to obtain fish is permitted. Therefore the use of explosives of any description whatsoever is prohibited for the purposes of obtaining fish, or for any purpose whatever other than actual action with enemy, in the waters and streams of British Borneo.

5. Severe disciplinary action will be taken for breaches of this order.

114. POLICY FOR RETENTION OF SOUVENIRS BY TROOPS

Following extract from 9 Aust DIV RO

1. Items such as Jap helmets, respirators, bugles or other items which are NOT lethal and have NOT commercial or military value may be authorised for retention by COs of units. Final decision regarding disposal of swords NOT yet available from LHQ. GRC 209 paragraph 31 should be consulted for guidance re items other than those specified above which may also be authorised. Also see GRC 209 paragraph 29 for items which may NOT be authorised.
2. Allotment and obtaining of souvenirs must be strictly controlled by COs under direction of force commanders. On NO account are troops to be permitted to help themselves from Jap stores and dumps guarded by Allied or Jap guards. Force commanders should take action to segregate from Jap stores and dumps items authorised as souvenirs. These items may then be issued under proper supervision to those who desire them. Before this is done all dumps and stores should be examined by FS (EE) Secs. Any such items NOT required as souvenirs should be destroyed.
3. When the issue or retention of a souvenir is authorised a written authority for the soldier to retain it will be signed by a unit officer. Where it appears the item may have INT value it must be referred to the unit or formation IO for examination prior to issue of written authority.



4. Soldiers will NOT be permitted to retain enemy equipment for which they have NO written authority.

5. The policy outlined above will be promulgated to all ranks.

107. POST-DISCHARGE MALARIA

1. (a) The Repatriation Commission will accept responsibility for providing any treatment necessary in respect of the first attack of malaria suffered by an ex-member of the AMF after his discharge from the Army.

(b) During such treatment, the Commission will institute inquiries as to eligibility or otherwise for the treatment of any subsequent attacks of malaria.

2. On the first occasion after his discharge that any ex-member becomes ill with malaria, he should -

(i) if resident in a captial city - report to the Repatriation Department's branch office or general hospital, either in person or by telephone, when immediate examination and treatment will be arranged;

(ii) if resident in the country - report to and request treatment from the nearest Repatriation local medical officer who will send a report to the Repatriation Department. It will be necessary for the ex-member to identify himself by production of his discharge certificate.

3. (a) If it is not possible so to report, the ex-member should consult and request treatment from his local civilian doctor, and, provided prompt advice is sent by the doctor or the ex-member to the Repatriation Department, the Commission will assume full responsibility for the payment of medical fees, hospital fees and the cost of drugs.

(b) Arrangements for any further treatment will be notified to the ex-member by the Repatriation Commission as soon as possible.

4. Information regarding the treatment of malaria, with particular reference to ex-service personnel, has been sent by the Commonwealth Department of Health to civil medical practitioners.

5. In view of the foregoing, it is unnecessary for any member to be examined by a final medical board at the time of his discharge merely on account of a history of malaria. If the member has had an attack during his service, it will be on record in his medical history. Whether or not the member has had an attack during his service, he will be cared for by the Repatriation Commission should he develop an attack of malaria after his discharge.

(c) Bn Int Sjt

- (i) Responsible for org and supervision of office routine.
- (ii) Opens all correspondence and reads all inward messages. He is responsible to see that messages are initialled by all Int pers concerned and necessary action taken.
- (iii) Holds maps and is responsible for their issue.
- (iv) He will ensure that all records and maps are kept up to date.
- (v) He will be responsible that infm is distributed up, down and to flanks.
- (vi) Details duties and arranges for reliefs in the sec.
- (vii) Generally understudies IO and acts as IO in his absence.

(d) Cpl

- (i) Assists sjt in supervision of office routine
- (ii) Supervises and assist draughtsman and recorder in their duties
- (iii) Enemy OOB.

(e) Cpl

- (i) Works with IO in the fd
- (ii) Org OPS
- (iii) Topography - track, beach, river crossing recces.

(f) Draughtsman

- (i) Keep sitmaps up to date
- (ii) Prepare necessary traces, sketches and enlargements.

(g) Recorder

- (i) Maintain action log as basis for War Diary.
- (ii) Move with comd gp
- (iii) Log and despatch all messages.



(h) Spare Pers

- (i) Assist in the performance of the above duties.
- (ii) Carry out special recces
- (iii) Man OPs
- (iv) Interpretation aerial photos
- (v) Relief in office and duty in comd post.

Coy Int Pers

- (i) He is the link between IO and coy comd and is at coy comd's disposal to assist on all int matters. Assists Coy comd in maintenance of direction and general problems of orientation.
- (ii) Keeps the coy sitmap up to date
- (iii) Prepares coy fire plan overlay immediately coy takes up a def posn and sends to IO. Scale will be laid down by IO.
- (iv) Reports on trs and topography generally as coy advances - illustrate with fd sketches etc.
- (v) Keep a coy action log. This need only take the form of jotting down notes of events and times to assist IO in compilation of War Diary. This does not mean that the Coy Int man will act as a recorder cum extra clerk at Coy HQ nor will it interfere with his other duties as Coy Int man.
- (vi) Keep the tps in the picture. If infm is slow coming down ask for it and pass it on.
- (vii) Go after infm on your Coy front and get it back to the IO as quickly as possible.
- (viii) Make the tps Int minded and encourage them to give you any scraps of infm at any time. Never ~~reject~~ <sup>reject</sup> infm however worthless it may appear or next time you may not get the chance.
- (ix) Report changes in Coy and pl locations
- (x) Assist with Coy OPs, panoramas, range scales etc.
- (xi) Ensure that all reports are sent to bn correctly fully and clearly compiled. This will save further questions and consequent cluttering up of inter-comm
- (xii) He must keep a close check of enemy cas and enemy eqpt captured. There is always a tendency to overestimate or count bodies twice and reports of enemy weapons captured often err on the side of optimism. Infm on these matters is worthless if it is not accurate as it is upon these reports that I (a) base estimates of enemy OOB.

2. MAPS AND TRACES

- (a) The following maps will be maintained in int office:-
  - (i) CO's sitmap
  - (ii) Int Office Sitmap  
As occasion arises these will be exchanged to enable the CO's map to be brought up to date.
  - (iii) In static posns small scale orientation maps may be kept in Int Office to show the broader picture. Enemy OOB will be shown on this map.
- (b) The following overlays will be kept:-
  - (i) Shelling overlay
  - (ii) Bombing overlay
  - (iii) Patrol overlay
  - (iv) Fireplan overlay
  - (v) Topographical and track overlay
  - (vi) Engineering wks and minefds overlay
  - (vii) Gas overlay
- (c) The following colours will be used for map marking:-
  - (i) Red : Own tps
  - (ii) Blue : Enemy tps
  - (iii) Black: Edys
  - (iv) Yellow: Gas
  - (v) Green : Engineering wks.



### 3. COLLATION FILES

The following pro formas will be used for recording infm in Int Office:-

### 4. PROJECTED PATROLS

- (a) Patrols will be numbered serially from 1 to 999. This does NOT incl purely protective patrols close to own FDLs.
- (b) Record of projected patrols will be kept on pro forma as per Appx "A".
- (c) One copy of pro forma will be kept by Adjnt and one by Int Sec. When a patrol is ordered the Adjnt will send his copy to Int Office to be logged on Int Sec copy.
- (d) Particulars of projected patrols will be 'phoned to bde immediately on receipt of advice from Adjnt.

### 5. BRIEFING OF PATROLS

- (a) On receipt of this advice Int Sec will prepare all relevant infm for briefing of patrol comd. This should incl:-
  - (i) Other patrols out ( route, time etc.)
  - (ii) Infm from previous patrols over same area.
  - (iii) Full details of route ( to incl terrain, tracks, rds, obstacles, landmarks and any spec reference to assist, such as flares, tracer etc.).
  - (iv) Time out and in
  - (v) Route out and in
  - (vi) Liaison - advice to Bde and flanking units. Possibly RV with other patrols out.
  - (vii) Password
  - (viii) Time of moonrise and moonset.  
Time of sunrise and sunset, as necessary.
  - (ix) Comms : Reporting times.
  - (x) Reports required at ..... by ..... hrs.

When time permits a sketch map of route will be prepared giving distances and bearings. For security reasons no map references will be shown.

- (b) Patrol comd will, when time and terrain permit, be briefed verbally by IO at Bn HQ. He should, where possible, be accompanied by his 2 i/c and coy Int man. Failing this he will be briefed by IO through LT.

### 6. INTERROGATION OF PATROL COMD

- (a) Patrol comd will answer first the questions asked which constitute the object of the patrol.
- (b) He should then give a narrative of events and obsns of enemy made incl enemy eqpt and docs found.
- (c) He should be questioned closely for topographical infm and corrections or additions to maps and terrain studies will be noted. It is preferable to make patrol comd mark route and tracks himself on map as verbal description often lends itself to exaggeration of distance
- (d) Where contact with the enemy has been made the following points should be brought out in interrogation:-
  - (i) Place of contact
  - (ii) Was enemy on the alert
  - (iii) What type of weapons did enemy use
  - (iv) How many weapons of each type
  - (v) What type and how many sp weapons did enemy use



- (vi) Estimate of enemy strength
- (vii) Indication of enemy role (sentry, patrol, def locality)
- (viii) Extent of locality
- (ix) Artificial obstacles and fd wks.
- (x) Mines and booby traps
- (xi) Enemy tactics on contact
- (xii) Terrain and vegetation of locality (incl landmarks)

In case of patrol of more than one day the report will incl infm on the following:-

- (i) March times along various secs of route
- (ii) Weather conditions
- (iii) Eqpt and loads carried by pers
- (iv) March conditions
- (v) Anti-malarial and other med precautions taken and infm of possible value to med services.
- (vi) Infm about water sup and river crossings.

#### 7. PATROL REPORTS

- (a) Summaries of patrol reports will be phoned to Bde immediately after interrogation. The following infm will be incl:-
  - (i) Sub-unit furnishing patrol and serial number
  - (ii) Any change from intended route
  - (iii) Precis of patrol narrative
  - (iv) Infm of immediate tactical importance
  - (v) Whether written report is following
- (b) When necessary a written report will be despatched to Bde as per pro forma in Appx "B". Report will be accompanied by patrol trace or sketch to illustrate
  - (i) Enemy disposns or wks, minefds etc
  - (ii) Topographical infm
  - (iii) Corrections to map
- (c) Long range patrol reports will be furnished as per Appx "C" and will be illustrated by a trace, sketch or marked map.

#### 8. MINEFIELDS (own)

- (a) Will be shown on minefds trace or, where scale of sitmap permits, on the sitmap itself.
- (b) Hastily laid minefds (to be in posn not more than 24 hrs) will be recorded as per Appx "D" and copy forwarded to Bde HQ
- (c) Minefds to be in posn for more than 24 hrs will be reported to Bde HQ with a trace showing pattern and type of wire fence used to mark the fd.

#### 9. BOOBY TRAPS FDS As for minefds.

#### 10. ENEMY MINEFDS

- (a) Enemy minefds will be shown on enemy OOB map unless it becomes too congested, when they will be shown on enemy minefds trace.
- (b) When located the following infm should be incl in enemy minefds report:-
  - (i) Location of fwd edge of fd.
  - (ii) Location of junc points of legs of minefds
  - (iii) Location, true bearings, length of legs of fwd edge of fd.
  - (iv) Does minefd extend beyond pts reconnoitred?
  - (v) Layout of minefd incl:
    - 1. Number of rows
    - 2. Distance between rows
    - 3. Spacing of mines in each row
    - 4. Method of staggering or otherwise
    - 5. Types of mines
    - 6. Marking of edges of minefd (ntoice boards, wire etc.)

8. Booby traps or trip wires found and their location in relation to minefd.
9. Whether any mines were devitalised.

Where possible report will be illustrated by a large scale sketch.

#### 11. SHELLING REPORTS

- (a) Shelling reports will be passed immediately through sigs from coysto Bn HQ and Bn to Bde using letters A to J shown in pro forma Appx "E"
- (b) A consolidated shelling report will be prepared daily in triplicate as per Appx "E". One copy will be despatched to Bde HQ and, if required, one direct to HQ RAA.

#### 12. EA SIGHTINGS

- (a) The following 9 Aust Div instr will be adhered to only if time and circumstances permit, otherwise it will be replaced by a brief message containing relevant infm to Bde HQ.
- (b) Air Flash Msgs will be sent by quickest possible means on msg form to Div HQ:-

The following infm is required:-

- (i) Time of sighting
  - (ii) Number of EA
  - (iii) Type of EA
  - (iv) Direction of approach, height
  - (v) Action taken by EA
  - (vi) Gen area
  - (vii) Direction of departure and height.
- (c) Air Flash Msg will be followed by a detailed report containing the following infm where appropriate:-
    - (i) Ref to Air Flash Msg
    - (ii) Details of target attacked or area reconnoitred
    - (iii) Number and type of bombs dropped
    - (iv) Cas and damage caused
    - (v) Method of attack and enemy tactics
    - (vi) Posn of fighter escort in relation to attacking planes
    - (vii) Distinctive markings of EA
    - (viii) Any ground or air sigs observed
    - (ix) Enemy losses from interception
    - (x) Own air losses
    - (xi) Enemy losses from ground fire.

#### 13. CRASHED AIRCRAFT

Reports on Allied or enemy crashed aircraft will be sent immediately by coys to Bn and Bn to Bde and will contain the following infm:-

- (i) Location
- (ii) Date and time of crash
- (iii) Type and markings of aircraft
- (iv) Extent of damage to aircraft
- (v) Names of aircrew and their sqn and their condition (if Allied).
- (vi) Number of air crew, number of survivors and their condition (if Allied)
- (vii) Action taken with regard to :-
  - Allied Air Crew
  - PW
  - Enemy documents
  - Guarding Aircraft



#### 14. SITREPS

- (a) Coys will despatch a sitrep numbered serially to Bn HQ hourly or two hourly as ordered.
- (b) Where practicable a message form will be used. Where, however, time will NOT permit, sitreps will be phoned through to Bn Int Sec.
- (c) It is essential that sitreps be received on time.
- (d) Nil reports will be submitted where necessary by the word SITNOR.
- (e) Important infm will be sent back by the quickest possible means and incl in next sitrep.
- (f) The IO or, in his absence, the senior member of the Bn Int Sec will write sitrep for despatch to Bde HQ at such times as are laid down by Bde HQ.
- (g) All sitreps will be signed by IO and despatched with IMMEDIATE priority.
- (h) The sitrep is the CO's report to Bde Comd therefore, he should where practicable, see and approve it before its despatch. Int pers must, however, remember that the sitrep MUST go in on time.
- (j) In the last sitrep of the day the total of enemy cas during the day will be incl.

#### 15. LOCATION STATEMENTS

- (a) Coys will advise Bn Int Office of any change of location down to pls. Area held by pls will be indicated NOT only map ref of pl HQ.
- (b) Bn Int Sec will advise Adjt of such changes immediately on receipt of this infm.

#### 16. MAP REFS

In all reports to Bde HQ location or routes will be expressed as map refs on standard map in use - normally the largest scale map available.

#### 17. GAS REPORT

- (a) The initial report which should be sent to Bde immediately after Gas attack should be based on the following headings:-
    - (i) Date, time and map ref of reported use of gas.
    - (ii) Methods of use e.g. spray, aircraft, bomb, shell, cloud.
    - (iii) Any immediate effect on pers
    - (iv) Any characteristics known at time of report.
  - (b) The detailed report which follows should be based on the following heads:-
    - (i) All infm in initial report
    - (ii) Duration of gas emission and particulars of gas suspected or identified.
    - (iii) Weather conditions
    - (iv) Type and state of ground
    - (v) Posn and extent of areas contaminated by persistent gas if used, and methods used to mark areas
    - (vi) Duration of persistence when known.
    - (vii) Approx number of cas and details of effects on pers.
    - (viii) If aircraft bombs, gas shell or other projectiles employed ; approx number of rds used and target area.
      - (a) If air spray used, approx height of aircraft when spraying.
    - (ix) Location of any unexploded gas projectile.
- Note: If an unknown gas is used, one or more of our respirators, if penetrated, and samples of contaminated gas eqpt and detector papers, if affected, should be sent back immediately.

#### 18. PW

- (a) Capture of PW will be logged in Enemy Cas and PW files
- (b) Capture of PW will be reported immediately to Bde HQ
- (c) The following procedure will be adhered to on the capture of PW:-
  - (i) Offrs, NCOs and ORs will be segregated.
  - (ii) Air Force, paratp or air tp PW will be segregated from other PW.



- (iii) Deserters will also be segregated and their presence and identity will NOT be disclosed to other PW
- (iv) No conversation between PW will be allowed
- (v) PW will be tagged, showing place, time and date of capture, unit making capture and whether documents have been sent before or accompany PW.
- (vi) PW serial number will be marked on his tag.
- (vii) If PW are deserters or Air Force pers, paratp or air tp this fact will be marked on the tag.
- (viii) Each PW's documents and identity discs will be bundled separately, a duplicate PW tag att and will be carried by escort. Duplicate PW tag will be carried by escort if PW has no documents.
- (ix) If documents are of obvious tactical importance they will be sent back ahead of PW by quickest possible means.
- (x) Interrogation at unit will be confined to the following:-
  - Name
  - Rank
  - Number
  - Unit
  - Flanking unit
  - Units in res
  - Recent cas
  - Morale

#### 19. CAPTURED DOCUMENTS AND EQPT

- (a) Units are responsible for searching for enemy documents (incl maps) and collecting and sending to Bde HQ all such documents as quickly as possible.
- (b) Units are responsible for sending back up to three specimens of each novel type of movable eqpt captured. While this will be primarily the responsibility of FS (EE) pers att all members of Int Sec must be conversant with duties of identification, collection and evac enemy eqpt required for Int purposes.
- (c) The location and gen description of immovable enemy eqpt and of enemy dumps will be reported to Bde.
- (d) All documents and all items of eqpt sent back will be tagged with a label showing :-
  - (i) Where captured (gen area)
  - (ii) Map ref
  - (iii) Time
  - (iv) Date
  - (v) Captured by ( Number, name, unit)
  - (vi) Remarks (taken from dead body or PW etc - service or arm believed to have used eqpt.)
- (e) If finder desires that documents or eqpt be sent to his nominee when of no further value to ~~unit~~ Int, the name and address will also be shown on the label.

#### 20. WAR SOUVENIR STAMP

- (a) Pers of FS (EE) with units will be in possession of a "War Souvenir" stamp which will be used to authorise the finder to possess and transmit through the post captured enemy eqpt which is NOT of value to Int. On NO account will this stamp be used to authorise the release of captured documents.
- (b) A "War Souvenir" stamp will normally be held at Div HQ to authorise the release of captured documents to be sent by post.
- (c) If such documents are received at Div HQ with the request that they be returned to the finder or his nominee the registered holder of the "War Souvenir" stamp will mark the certificate serial number ( see Appx "G" ) on the documents and append his signature. The label, documents and certificate will then be returned to the finder's unit where the label will be destroyed and the documents and certificate handed to the finder. Just prior to posting the finder will enter the name of his unit in the space provided on the certificate which he will then enclose with the documents



21 TRACK INFM

- (a) Track infm of tactical importance will be incl in sitreps or sent by sigs to Bde with priority IMPORTANT.
- (b) During mobile ops all topographical infm ( NOT tactically important) will be sent back to Bde as available and at least once daily. This will necessitate continual track recce of area passed over in the days adv.
- (c) Where applicable the following infm will be incl:-
  - (i) Width and condition of tracks and their suitability for mov of MT.
  - (ii) Possibility of improving foot tracks to jeep tracks
  - (iii) Alternative and branch tracks NOT shown on maps
  - (iv) Fordability of streams by tps and vehs.
  - (v) Estimated march times that a bn following up would take to move along the route followed in the days adv.
- (d) Where tracks differ from or are additional to those shown on existing maps a trace showing these will also be sent to Bde.
- (e) A topographical and track overlay will be kept continuously in ops. The following conventional signs will be used on these traces:-

- (f) March times of long range patrols will be recorded on maps traces or sketches. The route followed will be divided into sectors bounded by landmarks such as villages, streams or track juncs. Times will be shown beside the track in hrs and mins and the direction of travel will be shown by arrows in all cases

22. RIVER CROSSINGS

- (a) Infm on river crossings will be passed back to Bde as occasion arises. Wherever possible, infm on a likely river crossing will incl the following infm:-
  - (i) Location
  - (ii) Width between banks
  - (iii) Width of water
  - (iv) Depth of water
  - (v) Shelving of banks to two feet below water level
  - (vi) Nature of bottom ( mud, clay, sand etc)
  - (vii) Speed of current
  - (viii) Tidal influence, stating, if possible, height of high water level above water level at time of recce.
  - (ix) Liability to flooding ( incl height of any flood marks above present water level.)
  - (x) Height of near and far banks above water level.
  - (xi) Gradient of both banks
  - (xii) Type of soil on banks
  - (xiii) Approaches to both banks.

- (b) Where possible, a sketch in plan and a sketch in section of the crossing place will accompany the report. When sketches are NOT to scale, various dimensions above will be shown.

23. OP REPORTS

- (a) Where opportunity offers, OPs will always be manned.



- (b) OP log will be kept and any important infm will be reported to Int Office by quickest possible means.
- (c) When possible, range cards and panoramas will be prepared and used to indicate obsns.
- (d) OP logs will be consolidated by Bn Int Sec and an OP report sent to Bde daily. This report will incl only important obsns.
- (e) Liaison with Arty OP pays dividends and should be carried out whenever possible.

24. REQUESTS FOR AIR PHOTOGRAPHS

- (a) Normally there will be a Glll Air att to Bde HQ and requests for air photos will be made verbally to Bde IO or by marked map.
- (b) Should lack of comm render necessary the use of a formal request the pro forma in Appx "F" will be used. When requests are made by sig they will contain all the relevant infm.




