4. BUILDINGS, (additions, &c.)

NO structural alterations are to be made to any building without the approval of the Camp Commandant.
NO timber, etc. (which is the property of the contractors) is to be removed from the vicinity of the Camp.

5. SANITATION.

Attention is drawn to Prov. Camp Standing Orders Par. 22, regarding sanitation and use of water.

6. PAY.

Pay will be issued fortnightly on Fridays commencing 7th June.

7. LEAVE.

- (a) Attention is directed to Prov. Camp Standing Orders pars. 10 and 11 regarding leave.
- (b) O.C. Coys. are authorised to issue late leave passes up to 20% of Strength - late leave terminates at 2300 hrs. (11 p.m.) except Sundays.
- (c) General leave may be granted from dismissal of Church Parade on Sunday for those not on Orderly, Piquet or other duties. General Leave terminates at 2300 hrs. (11 p.m.) NO leave pass is required.
- (d) Leave to remain out of Camp overnight will only be granted in exceptional circumstances. Passes for such leave will be issued by Bn. H.Q. only:-
- (i) Applications recommended by Coys. will be endorsed to the effect that suitable out of Camp accommodation is available.
- (ii) Will be submitted before Bn. O. Room. (1640)
- (e) Plain clothes will NOT be worn on leave without the C.O.'s approval. When such approval is given "Passes" will be suitably endorsed in red ink.


