Reference Map.-Route Map---Seymour - Bonegilla.

This instruction deals with preliminary essentials to enable adequate preparations to be made concerning this Unit's move to Bonegilla.

Final detailed instructions will be issued at Camp Site 29 at 1500 hrs 16 Sep.40. Attached Units will attend.

2. DRESS FOR THE MARCH.

Battle order, ground sheets, hats felt fur. K.W.D. will be worn by N.C O's and men. Officers will wear battle dress or when weather necessitates, K.W.D if available. Badges of rank will be worn. Details re respirators will be given later. Cut lunches will be carried for midday meal on 17 Sep.40.

3. KITS, BLANKETS, AND PERSONAL GEAR.

Troops will take 4 blankets which will be rolled in a palliase, and clearly marked with regimental number and Rank together with Kit bags and packs, (if haversacks are not available), and stacked at SOUTH END of Coy lines by 0800 hrs 17 Sep.40. As a distinguishing mark each Coy will attach tape of the following colors to every article to be transported:-

A - Blue (light)	H.Q. - White
B - Green	B.H.Q. - Red & white
C - Red	23 A/T. - Light Brown.
D - Black.	

Discs approx. 12" x 6" of the same colors will be obtained by Coys to mark Coy and platoon dumps.

Personal messing gear to be carried to be carried will consist of Knife, fork spoon, pannikin, mess tin, 1 plate-tin, Disposal of other gear as detailed in Appendices A & B.

4. TENT FLYS.

Each Rifle Coy will obtain, fold, and stack at the SOUTH END of the lines by 0800 hrs 17 Sep.40. 20 tent flys. H.Q. Coy will obtain 50 tent flys.

5. LOADING PARTIES.

Each Coy will detail daily 4 men to each 30 cwt truck allotted to act as loading parties and guides at bivouac areas.

6. SANITATION.

Pioneer platoon will be responsible for erection of latrine screens and to provide latrine facilities at bivouac areas, closing these down before leaving and appropriately mark the ground

Hygiene section will be responsible for maintenance.

7. COMPANY OFFICE EQUIPMENT.

Coy's are to take an adequate supply of message forms, parade states, charge reports, sick reports, platoon and Coy roll books etc. to maintain Coy.H.Q.

Bn.H.Q. will not issue stationery during the march but normal organisation will be maintained throughout, e.g. Casualty returns, daily strength states, etc. will be submitted.

8. COOKS EQUIPMENT.

Sgt Cooks will arrange for necessary messing gear to include bread-cutters, tables, 15 Fewlers, 50 hot boxes, Dixies, knives, carving, 5 Tubs washing, ladles, hand bowls buckets, axes, tin opener, spades, picks, 10 ration dishes, butchers gear and unexpired portion of days ration to be loaded on the four 30 cwt. trucks provided by 1030 hrs. each day.

9. DISCIPLINE AND DUTIES IN BIVOUAC AREAS.

Coy Comds will inspect Coy Areas before entering and before leaving, noting any damage to tent flies etc. Areas will be left clean. Coys will be responsible for their own security and discipline and the roster of duty Coys will be continued to provide fatigues, town piquets, guards, water piquets etc. as may be necessary. Daily routine will be the same as in camp, except that on days when no marching is undertaken in afternoon, morning calls will be advanced half hour.

10. A.A. PROTECTION.

During the whole move normal protection will be carried out throughout the column and by B Echelon.

11. REAR PARTY.

The Rear Party will consist of R.Q.M.S., two storemen (R.Q.), one storeman per Coy., salvage section, Pay Sgt. and clerk, No. 2 Sgt. Clerk, five O.Rs. from each Rifle Coy. and one N.C.O. and ten men from H.Q. Coy., one cook and one cooks' asst. This party will load training and war equipment and Unit stores onto rail and will then move, less a security party, to BONEGILLA and act as an advance party. Date of departure will be advised later. Coys. will submit nominal roll of rear party personnel immediately.

12. PAY.

Pay will be drawn from ALBURY Paymaster and will be available upon arrival at BONEGILLA.

13. STRAW.

Palliasess will be emptied in top mess hut under supervision of Cpl. POWELL at the following times:-

14. MEDICAL.

The medical section will move at rear of column. Pl. comds. are reminded of their responsibilities to their men in regard to care of feet, underclothing, etc.

Troops, other than loading parties etc., will not ride on M.T. except with the express permission of the R.M.O.

In the event of a Pl. Comds. being of the opinion that a troop is unfit to continue the march he will contact the R.M.O. before detaching the troop, if possible.

Sick parades will be held in Coy. Areas at a time to be notified each morning. R.M.O. or Orderly will visit each Coy. Area each morning.

16. SUPPLIES.

Sgt. Cook will indent daily for expense stores for column including pl. remounts. Attached Units will immediately advise these H.Q. exact number of personnel coming under Comd. of C.O. 2/22 Bn. Attached Units will, however, prepare separate indents for expense stores required in BONEGILLA. Provision will also be made for rear party remaining at Camp site 29 by Sgt. Cook. Petrol will be supplied daily under instructions to be issued by A.D.S.M.T. Sth. Comd. Firewood will be delivered daily with rations.

17. WATER.

Hygiene section is responsible for marking and supervision of water areas,

18. CANTEENS.

Arrangements are being made for the services of a mobile canteen. Care is to be taken by O.Cs. columns that this canteen does not unreasonably interfere with the business of the townspeople en route.

19. LIAISON.

If possible bicycles will be obtained for liaison between Coys. and B.H.Q.

20. OFFICERS' PERSONAL GEAR.

Such gear not required on the march will be sent to BONEGILLA with Bn. stores by rail. Pack, valise, or suitcase may be taken on march; but such baggage must be reduced to a minimum. Officers will obtain knife, fork, spoon, plate, mess-tin and pack.

21. Issue of Equipment.

Coy Comds will see that rifle slings, water bottle carriers and other essential equipment is issued immediately and will also obtain 10 fire beaters per Coy for distribution throughout the column.

Coy's. are advised that the following articles of personal issues will be carried in the various containers as shown below.

(a) To be carried in Haversack:

- 1) Knife, Fork, Spoon, Plate.
- 2) Waterproof Sheet.
- 3) Cardigan.
- 4) Holdall. (Shaving gear, Tooth brush, paste, hairbrush, comb, soap.)
- 5) Towel.
- 6) 1 pair Socks.
- 7) 1 pair Mittens or Gloves.

(b) To be carried in Pack:

- 1) Greatcoat.
  - 2) Boot cleaning gear.
  - 3) 1 pair socks.
  - 4) 1 set Underclothing.
  - 5) 1 Towel.
  - 6) 1 pair sand or light shoes.

### ADMINISTRATIVE INSTRUCTION NO. 8

Ref Map: ROUTE MAP, SEYLOUR - BONEGILLA.

This instruction covering final admn. details is to be read with Admn Instn No. 5.

2. Dress and Personal Gear: Respirators will be worn at the slung posn. Haversacks will be issued and worn. Disposal of gear will be as shown in Appx "B", except that knife, fork, spoon, plate, soap and towel will be carried in haversack.

3. Duty Coy will detail each day 1 N.C.O. and 2 O.Rs. to proceed by M/T to next bivouac area, reaching that point at 0830 hrs to take over tent flies, etc., from "A" Coln, time and place of leaving will be decided by T/O and Duty Coy Comd daily. Cut lunch will be carried.

4. One Pl Comd in each Coy will be detailed to make a report on boots for the information of Ede to cover the following:-

(a) Make of boots (b) Condition of boots at beginning of march (c) Number of days worn or number of miles marched for each pair (d) Condition at end of march (e) General comments. Such report is to be submitted within four days from conclusion of march. One hundred pairs of boots part worn will be available to coln for emergency use during march. Any issues made by Q.I. from this stock are to be retained only until original issues are repaired.

5. Transport: All Tpt will be under control of T/O and no allotment to Coys will be made. Tpt will move in convoys with density on good roads of about 10 V.P.M., and on dusty roads with density not greater than 5 V.P.M.

6. Hooks are to be sewn on all greatcoats in the usual manner.

7. Protection of Property: Care will be taken at all times that no public or private property is damaged. Particular attention will be paid to gates, fences, etc.

8. Postal: A supply of telegraph forms is stamped with the Unit "Concession Postage" stamp and held at Bn.H.Q. Telephone calls may be made at concession rates from Post Offices en route by Soldiers in Uniform. Post Offices will be opened after hours for convenience of tps at EUROCA, BENALLA and WANGARATTA.

9. Pay: Acquittance Rolls and Pay Books have been made up by Pay Sgt and pay will be available at WANGARATTA on 29 Sep 40. Rear Party will be paid by Lieut. GOODLAN on 26 Sep 40.

Personnel of small detachments travelling by road with colns will carry paybooks and 2/11 Fd Regt and det of 7 A.G.H. will be paid at BONEGILLA on 26 Sep 40. 2/9 Fd Amb will be paid at SEYLOUR on 24 Sep 40, adv party personnel being paid at BONEGILLA.

3. RAIL TRAVEL:-

All members of the A.I.F. when travelling by rail on duty or on leave must be in possession of railway tickets or combined leave passes and rail tickets for the journey undertaken. In States where members of the A.I.F. on leave are granted free travel once a month from camps to their homes appropriate combined leave pass and railway ticket or free travel order issued by the Unit must be held before advantage can be taken of the concession; and any journeys not so covered must be paid for by the individuals themselves. Should a soldier lose his ticket the railway authorities have the right to insist upon payment from the soldier before permitting him to continue his journey; and the responsibility for obtaining the refund from the railways will rest with the soldier.

4. PRECAUTIONS

SNAKE BITE:-

Coy Comds will ensure that every Sec carries with it at all times at least four feet of fencing wire as a means of dealing with snakes which are prevalent in this area. R.M.O. will shortly issue instructions in relation to the treatment of snake bite.

5. CAMP HUTS:-

All personnel are advised that paint and chalk are not to be used on huts. This practice will cease immediately.

6. SUNBURN:-

Adequate precautions are to be taken against sunburn. Sunbathing parades may be held; but these are not to interfere with normal training parades. Sunbathing parades should at first be limited to short periods and increase slowly.

1. LOCAL LEAVE. Owing to the present unsatisfactory position regarding transport, local leave is to be restricted to 10% of Coy Strength and not 25% as previously sanctioned.

3. LOSS OF RAIL TICKET & PASS

Should a soldier lose his railway ticket or combined pass, the railway Authorities have the right to insist upon payment from the soldier before permitting him to continue his journey & the responsibility of instituting any action to obtain a refund for the Railway Authorities will rest with the soldier.

4. DRESS ON LEAVE

Troops are warned that disciplinary action will be taken against those who are not properly dressed while on leave. Jackets must be buttoned up to the neck. Collars & ties must not be worn by members other than officers and any other slovenliness in dress will not be allowed.

5. CAMP DUTIES.

The following alterations to Bde Camp Duties already detailed will take effect from 16 Oct 40:

(a) ALBURY TOWN PICQUET

(b) CAMP POST OFFICE GUARD

5. CAMP DUTIES (cont)(c) PAY OFFICE GUARD

An armed guard consisting of one corporal and six O.R. will be mounted at Camp Pay Office from 1100 hrs on Wednesday of each week until 1600 hrs on the Thursday of each week. Duty unit for Thursday will take over above duties at Retreat on the Wednesday.

(d) INLYING PICQUET

The Inlying Picquet consisting of two Sjts and 17 O.R. will be mounted on Sunday of each week. Detailed instructions as to duties and the time of mounting and dismounting of this picquet have already been issued to all units.

(e) CLEANLINESS OF CAMP

Duty unit will be responsible for the cleanliness of camp in the area in the vicinity of the Civic Centre. This has become necessary on account of the carelessness of troops who, after making purchases at the Canteen, insist on throwing paper all over this area. The Canteen Services are responsible for the immediate surroundings of the canteen buildings only.

(f) WORKING PARTY.

A party consisting of six O.R. will report to Supply Officer at Auxiliary H.T. Depot BONEGILLA at 0900 hrs daily. This party will be released for duty with own Unit at 1200 hrs of same day.

6. POSTAL ARRANGEMENTS

It has been found that a large number of incorrectly addressed letter are reaching the Camp Post Office. Members will advise correspondents to address letters giving Number, name, coy ending with 2/22 Bn BONEGILLA.

Camp Postal Orderlies will assist the Camp Postmaster in the sorting of incorrectly addressed letters.

7. INJURIES CAUSED BY BOTTLES THROWN FROM TRAINS. The Secretary for Railways recently drew attention to the danger of possible injury caused by bottles being thrown from passenger trains. Attention is directed to the fact that this practice is an offence against the Railway by-laws and a heavy penalty is provided. In addition the by-laws prohibit the throwing from trains of cigarette butts and matches which might cause destructive fires.

All troops travelling by train are required to refrain from throwing any articles out of the window.

8. WILLS OF MEMBERS OF A.I.F. The following copy of L.D. memo 61156 of 10 Sep 40 is published for the information of Victorian personnel of A I F units:

"The Public Trustee in Victoria has been authorised to act without charging his usual commission, in the following matters:-

(a) As Attorney under Power of Soldiers whose taxable income under the Victorian Income Tax Acts does not exceed £150 per annum; and

(b) As Executor of the wills of deceased soldiers, or as administrator of their estates where the gross value of the assets does not exceed £1000.

For this purpose, "Soldier" means any person serving outside the Commonwealth of Australia with His Majesty's Australian Forces."

9. ALTERATIONS TO HUTMENTS, FITMENTS OR SERVICES. No alterations are to be made to any huts, fitments or services without approval having first been obtained from the Assistant Director of Works, Southern Command. Written application for such approval will be made through the Garrison Engineer stationed in the Area, or the Military Foreman of Works where there is no Garrison Engineer, who will refer it to the A.D.W.  
If authority is given it will be issued through the G.E. or M.F.W. and the work will be done under his supervision.

9. ALTERATIONS TO HUTMENTS, FITMENTS OR SERVICES (cont).  
Any other officer who authorises alterations will be responsible for restoration at his own expense.
10. FREE RAIL TRAVEL N.S.W. Applications for Free Passes for N.S.W. must reach Bn H.Q. 24 hours prior to date of travel. No application will be considered that does not comply with this instruction.
11. ADDRESSING CORRESPONDENCE AND TELEGRAMS. Instances have occurred recently of Units addressing correspondence intended for Bde or Bn H.Q. to an individual or to an appointment on Bde or Bn staff. These letters are treated as personal and there is sometimes delay in opening them. A similar instance occurred recently with a telegram which was of some importance to Bde but was addressed to a member of the staff who was absent on leave. Correspondence must not be addressed personally to members of Bde or Bn Staff.
12. FIGHTING FORCES ATHLETIC CHAMPIONSHIP. Athletic track championships for the Australian Fighting Forces are to be held on M C C on Saturday 30 Nov 40 at 1400 hrs. Coys will submit to Bn H.Q. by 1400 hrs on Friday 8 Nov 40 the names of all members who desire to compete.

WATER SUPPLY Good throughout.

SANITATION Good. Better in those areas where field construction was undertaken by pioneer platoon than in those areas where partially dependent on local sanitary conveniences of the bivouac areas.

FOOD. The rations were of excellent quality and the cooking good, being of an even higher standard than that in camp - Fowler stoves and hot boxes proved excellent.

SICK PARADES Were light. The Platoon commanders shouldered their responsibilities in the routine care of the feet in an excellent manner and more involved cases only were seen on sick parade. Medically there was nothing of note except for an occasional diarrhoea of a non infective type and an outbreak of mild conjunctivitis. Towards the end of the march sprained ankles were a frequent occurrence and tenosynovitis of the skin tendons began to be seen.

2. ATTACK:- (a) Formations of Secs should be varied in Attack - not always Secs in line. Ground should be chosen to exemplify the use of different formations. Arrowhead is usually more preferable to Sec in line when going over open country.  
(b) Tps should be instructed that the job is not finished when a post is captured. The necessity for consolidation must be taught on the very first phases of "Attack" and "Exploitation" explained.  
(c) The use of the L.M.G. in "Attack" does not appear to be appreciated yet by tps. It should not be used in short bounds.
3. DEFENCE:- The functions of 1,2,3,4,5 & 6 should be explained to Lewis Gun Secs. L.M.G. defence will not normally occupy a defensive posn with all the men in line.
