2. If not checked, this practice, although generally inspired by idle curiosity, may lead to the disclosure of much information of value to the enemy and will facilitate the task of enemy spies.

3. All ranks will be instructed that, in addition to refusing to disclose information to civilians, they should endeavour to obtain the names and addresses of any questioners and report same to the appropriate officer of their unit.

4. Security Service have undertaken to investigate immediately the bona fides of any inquisitive civilians whose names and addresses are supplied.

PARA 598 REMITTANCES OF CASH AND UNDRAWN PAY(NT FORCE ADM INSTN NO. 97.) 1. It is anticipated that a very heavy demand for the remittance of cash or undrawn pay in the nature of Xmas gifts will occur this month. 2. Remittances of undrawn pay are now routed through the District Accounts Office of District of Enlistment and will consequently take longer/ reach the remittee than cash remittances.

3. It is anticipated that remittances of undrawn pay which reach the Distric Accounts Office, Northern Territory, through paymasters, by 14 Dec or, in the case of cash remittances, 19 Dec, will be in the hands of remittees before 25 Dec.

DUDS WON'T STOP THEM :

Popping planes, toppling tanks, or jarring Japs is an unhealthy past-time if ammunition fails to function. The old adage -- "Keep your powder dry" ---is as important today as it was at Waterloo, for no type of ammunition is completely dependable if neglected in transit or storage.

The problems of manufacture, packing and transport have been largely solved and ammunition is delivered to forward areas in first class condition, But neglect in unit storage is resulting in large quantities of anumunition being returned to ammunition depots for reconditioning, making heavy and unnecessary demands on valuable transport space and manpower.

The storage of ammunition in the tropics presents difficulties, but the need for care is so vital that very special attention must be paid to it.

"he fundamental rules are few:-

KEEP DRY -- well ventilated and as cool as you can.

KEEP OFF THE GROUND -- on a base of dunnage. KEEP "READY USE" to a minimum.

LEAVE THE FUSE COVERS ON.

KEEP STORED BY LOT NUMBERS OR BATCHES.

LOOK AFTER YOUR AITUNITION --- MEN'S LIVES DEPEND ON IT.

#### PARA 604 QUALIFYING EXAMINATIONS FOR PROFICIENCY PAY (G. R.O. G. 769/43)

1. GRO F. 660/43 provides that entitlement to proficiency pay depends, among other things, upon the passing of a prescribed examination. A soldier will be deemed to have passed the prescribed examination when he -

(a) has been certified by his 00 as being in all respects proficient

in performing the duties of his appointment, and

(b) has passed the tests applicable to soldiers of the category to which he belongs.

2. The tests for all categories include the Tests of Elementary Training for gas as specified in "Gas Training(Aust) 1942".

The following additional tests are prescribed for personnel of Inf Bos.—

(i) Small arms test with the rifle or light machine gum or medium machine gum or, in the case of personnel issued with the sub-machine gum or pistol as a personal weapon, the sub-machine gum or pistol. The standard required of the candidate is classification as a first class shot.

4. The following conditions will govern the conduct of the small arms tests,

referred to in para. 3 hereof:-

(a) All rifle, light machine gun and medium machine gun tests will be fired on open ranges.

(b) Classification Tables, Part II, for the respective weapons will be fired and the conditions of qualification will be as specified in SAT, Vol I, Pamphlet 14.

(c) One repetition only at each test will be permitted to count as qualification for proficiency pay.

5. Where practicable, personnel in receipt of proficiency pay will undergo the prescribed tests at six-monthly intervals.

#### PARA. 606. GARBAGE AT PICNIC GROUNDS (NT FORCE ADM INSTN NO. 102.)

l. Complaints are being received that personnel using certain beauty spots creeks, swimming holes for picnics in this area are not even taking elementary Hygiene precautions, resulting in the pollution and fouling of water, besides providing breeding ground for maggots fities and mosquitoes.

2. Notices will be installed wherever men gather for picnics reminding them of the elemantary precautions necessary before departure, and where available deep trench latrines and empty bitumen drums for rubbish will be installed. Rubbish will be burned in the drums and the residue buried.

3. It is not enough to deposit all refuse in the receptacles. It must take be burned and the residue buried. Thilst burning rubbish fire precautions will be strictly observed.

4. Where receptacles are not installed, troops will dig trenches for the burial of all tins, scraps of food and excreta.

It is evident that some units are not complying with instructions concerning garbage disposal. Before placing rubbish on dump ADELAIDE RIVER the following treatment must be carried out:-





PARA. 611. CORRECT USE OF LIGHTS THEN AFTROACHING ON COLING TRAFFIC. (GRO. Q. 824)

1. Accidents involving army vehicles have occurred due to lack of road courtesy of drivers who fail to dim their headlamps when approaching oncoming traffic.

2. In order that personnel in control of vehicles may appreciate their responsibility in this regard, the action to be taken is set out hereunder: -

(a) When approaching oncoming traffic, the driver of a vehicle will ensure that his headlights are dipped and will keep as near as practicable, having regard to all the circumstances, to the lefthand edge of the roadway.

(b) If the headlights cannot be dipped, they will be dimmed. If they can ot be dipped or dimmed, the driver will switch to his parking lights. In either case, he will reduce the speed of the vehicle so that he can stop within his lessened limits of vision.

3. The driver is responsible for checking the correct operation of all lights and for reporting immediately (on AAF G17) all defects which he is nit permitted to rectify.)

PARA. 612. LEAVE ITHOUT PAY

Cases are still occurring in which members, who have been granted leave without pay, afterwards claim that they were not aware of the full effect of the grant of such leave.

Paras 105 and 106 of GRO 598/43 state:-

"Attention is directed to the provisions of War Financial(Military Forces) Regulations, which provide, in effect, that all pay (including allotments) and pay allowances cease in respect of any period for which a member is granted leave( or an extension thereof without pay.

When leave (or an extension thereof) without pay is granted the following will not be payable during the period of such leave (or extension):-

(a) Pay(including deferred pay); (b) Field allowance; (f) Dependents allowance; (g) Travelling allowance; (h) Subsistence allowance;

The officer who first receives an application for leave without pay will, before dealing with the application, satisfy himself by personal interview with the member concerned that the member, understands the full effect of a grant of such leave.
